US Capitol turns warzone

Ten hours that shook America

Washington, Jan 7: In an unprecedented attack on democracy, thousands of angry supporters of outgoing President Donald Trump stormed the US Capitol and clashed with police, resulting in multiple injuries and forcing a delay in the constitutional process to affirm Joe Biden's victory in the November presidential election.

The police, outnumbered by the protesters, had a tough time in managing the crowd, as hundreds of protesters made their way into the US Capitol, where members of the US Congress were going through the process of counting and certifying the Electoral College votes. Both the House and Senate and the entire Capitol were placed under a lockdown.

Members of the US Congress were asked to get hold of the gas masks under their seats as the police resorted to tear gas to disperse protestors. Multiple officers have been injured with at least one transported to the hospital, CNN reported, citing multiple sources. Four protesters, including a woman, were killed in police firing.

President Trump has called for his supporters to "remain peaceful".

"I am asking for everyone at the US Capitol to remain peaceful. No violence! Remember, WE are the Party of Law & Order - respect the Law and our great men and women in Blue. Thank you!" Trump said in a tweet. "Please support our Capital Police and Law Enforcement. They are truly on the side of our Country. Stay peaceful!" Trump said in another tweet.

President-elect Biden said he was shocked and sad to see the US "come to such a dark moment". "At this hour, our democracy's under unprecedented assault. Unlike anything we've seen in modern times. An assault on the citadel of liberty, the Capitol itself. An assault on the people's representatives and the Capitol Hill police, sworn to protect them. And the public servants who work at the heart of our Republic..." Biden said in an address to the nation.

"Let me be very clear: The scenes of chaos at the Capitol do not reflect a true America. Do not represent who we are. What we're seeing are a small number of extremists dedicated to lawlessness. This is not dissent. It's disorder. It's chaos. It borders on sedition. And it must end now," Biden said. He also urged Trump to address the nation to end the standoff.

Biden's win confirmed, Trump concedes defeat

Trump released a statement pledging an 'orderly transition' but suggested he would remain in frontline politics

WASHINGTON: Congress formally certified Joe Biden as the next US president Thursday, dealing a hammer blow to Donald Trump.

Lawmakers in the Senate and House of Representatives successfully beat back Republican efforts to deny Biden the electoral votes needed to win, prompting loud cheers when the

certification was announced.

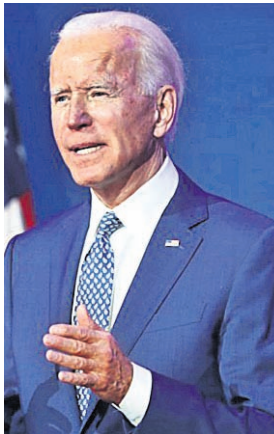
The affirmation of Biden's 306-232 victory over Trump in November essentially closes the door on the unparalleled and deeply controversial effort by Trump and his loyalists to overturn the results of the 2020 election.

The President immediately released a statement pledging an "orderly transition" but suggesting he would remain in frontline politics, amid speculation

that he may run again in 2024.

"Even though I totally disagree with the outcome of the election, and the facts bear me out, nevertheless there will be an orderly transition on January 20th," he said.

"I have always said we would continue our fight to ensure that only legal votes were counted. While this represents the end of the greatest first term in presidential history, it's only the beginning of our fight to Make America Great Again!"



'Beautiful sight': China mocks

BEIJING: China's Internet erupted in mirth at America's troubled democracy after supporters of President Donald Trump broke into the US Capitol, with Beijing criticising the "sharp contrast" between Washington's response to the chaos and the 2019 Hong Kong anti-government protests.

On Thursday morning, state media tabloid Global Times tweeted side-by-side photo comparisons of Hong Kong protesters occupying the city's Legislative Council Complex



in July 2019 with Wednesday's Washington riots.

"@SpeakerPelosi once referred to the Hong Kong riots as 'a beautiful sight to behold'," the *Global Times* said in the tweet, referring to Speaker of the House Nancy Pelosi's June 2019 comment about Hong

Kong's mass pro-democracy demonstrations, which at that time were mostly peaceful.

"It remains yet to be seen whether she will say the same about the recent developments in Capitol Hill." China's Communist Youth League also described the unrest as a "beautiful sight" on the Twitter-like Weibo platform. Beijing's Foreign Ministry echoed those sentiments, saying "the reaction of some people in the US, including that of some media outlets, is completely different."

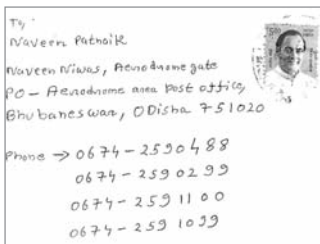

Anonymous letter claims threat to CM Naveen's life

Bhubaneswar, Jan 7: An anonymous letter mentioning about a conspiracy to kill Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik has been received by Naveen Niwas here. Subsequently, the Home department has asked the police to take steps to tighten the security of the Chief Minister.

The letter stated that some contract killers have been hired to murder the Chief Minister and they have been equipped with latest weapons like AK-47 rifles and semi-automatic pistols. It further said that these contract killers are professional criminals and they can kill the Chief Minister at any time. "These criminals can attack you any time. I want to warn you that you can be killed at any time. So please be aware that these contract killers are following you continuously. Their mastermind lives in Nagpur," read the handwritten letter. "The weapons which will be used to kill you have been brought



to Odisha," it said. The letter mentioned about a vehicle number registered with Maharashtra.

The anonymous letter listed 17 cars with registration numbers of Chhattisgarh, West Bengal, Punjab, Odisha, Delhi, Haryana, Sikkim and Maharashtra. Meanwhile, the state functionaries have been put on high alert after the letter was received at the CM's residence.

Home department special secretary Santosh Bala directed the DGP, Intelligence Director and the Bhubaneswar-Cuttack Police Commissioner to probe into the matter thoroughly and take appropriate actions as deemed necessary.

R-Day rehearsal: Farmers take out tractor march

New Delhi, Jan 7: Ahead of talks with the government, thousands of farmers Thursday took out tractor-march from protest sites of Singhu, Tikri and Ghazipur borders and Haryana's Rewasan against the three agriculture laws amid heavy police deployment.

According to the protesting farm unions, this is just a "rehearsal" for their proposed January 26 tractor parade that will be moved into the national capital from different parts of Haryana, Punjab and Uttar Pradesh.

Bharati Kisan Union (Ekta Ugrahan) chief Joginder Singh Ugrahan said that farmers participated in the march with over 3,500 tractors and trolleys.

Ugrahan, whose union is one of the largest farmer organisations in Punjab, said that they will not accept anything less than the repeal



of the three farm laws.

The eighth round of talks between protesting unions and the central government is scheduled to be held Friday.

The last meeting remained inconclusive Monday as farmer groups stuck to their demand for the repeal of the three laws, while the government listed out various benefits of the new acts for the growth of the country's agriculture sector.

On Thursday, farmers started the tractor march around 11 am

and moved towards Kundli-Manesar Palwal Expressway amid heavy deployment of Delhi Police personnel and their counterparts from Haryana and Uttar Pradesh.

Perched on their tractors, protesting farmers moved slowly through the protest sites, with speakers on their vehicles belting out music keeping their spirits high. Other protestors lined the path providing fellow farmers with all kinds of supplies, including peanuts, fritters, tea, and newspapers.

New Delhi, Jan 7: Petrol prices have breached all-time high levels in the new year as rising global oil prices pushed fuel marketing companies to raise the pump price of auto fuels for the second time this year Thursday.

Accordingly, petrol prices in Delhi increased by 23 paise a litre Thursday, the second successive day of fuel price rise, to ₹84.20 a litre from ₹83.97 on the previous day. This is the highest level of retail price of petrol in the national capital after October 4, 2018 when its price had risen to ₹84 a litre.

Diesel- ₹81.02/LTR (+₹0.28)

In other metros, though the price of petrol has not yet breached the all-time high levels, it has reached very close to that level and may cross it this week if fuel price increases further in coming days.

In Mumbai, petrol price increased to ₹90.83 a litre Thursday just 51 paise short of all-time high level of ₹91.34 reached October 4, 2018. In Chennai, the petrol price currently is ₹86.96 a litre.

Woman gangraped in Sambalpur

Sambalpur/Kuchinda, Jan 7: A woman was allegedly gangraped by two persons in a jungle under Kuchinda police limits in Sambalpur district while returning home alone, police said Thursday.

She lay unconscious for five hours following the act before she could regain her sense and manage to reach home with much difficulty. She narrated her ordeal before her family members following which the latter lodged a complaint with the police Wednesday.

Police rushed to the spot with a forensic team and started an investigation. Two persons have been arrested in this connection and medical examination of the victim and the accused was also conducted.

Reports said that the woman was returning home from her maternal uncle's house at around 10 am January 4. She decided to take a short-cut through the jungle route for home when two youths known to be her acquaintances accosted her and dragged her to an isolated place and raped her.

3 iron ore mines reserved for state PSUs

Bhubaneswar, Jan 7: The Centre has reserved three iron ore blocks in favour of two state PSUs—Odisha Mining Corporation (OMC) and Odisha Mineral Exploration Corporation Ltd (OMECL).

Union Coal and Mines Minister Pralhad Joshi informed this through his Twitter handle after meeting Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik at Naveen Niwas here, Thursday.

Proposals to allot two iron ore mining blocks to OMC and one block to OMECL have been approved. It will expedite iron ore production in Odisha, boost economy and employment opportunities in the state, Joshi said.

“In my meeting today with CM of Odisha, Shri @Naveen_Odisha ji, discussed about auction issues of various minerals in the State and also deliberated on facilitating forest clearances, operationalisation of closed mines & other issues to ensure smooth mining activities in Odisha,” the Union Minister further said.

According to sources, Jilling-Langlotta and Guali iron ore blocks in Keonjhar district have been reserved for OMC.

Covid toll mounts to 1,888 in state

Bhubaneswar, Jan 7: With 230 more people testing positive for the infection, state’s Covid-19 tally Thursday mounted to 3,31,151, while one more fatality pushed Odisha’s coronavirus death toll to 1,888, a senior Health and Family (H&FW) department official said.

The new cases were detected in 23 of the coastal state’s 30 districts with 134 reported from different quarantine centres and 96 from local contacts.

Sundargarh district recorded the highest of 30 new cases, followed by Angul (24) and Bolangir (18). The H&FW department said that one Covid-19 positive patient in Khurda succumbed to the infection Wednesday. Apart from 1,888 fatalities reported so far, 53 other Covid-19 patients also died due to comorbidities. Of the total 1,888 fatalities, Khurda district of which the state capital Bhubaneswar is a part, alone accounted for 327 deaths followed by Ganjam (247), Sundargarh (167), Cuttack (140) and Puri (117).

Twenty-five other districts reported less than 100 fatalities, said the official. Odisha has so far conducted over 70.86 lakh sample tests for Covid-19, including 21,652 Wednesday. The state’s positivity rate now stands at 4.67 per cent, the data released by the H&FW department said.

Second vaccine dry run today

The state government is all set to conduct its second dry run for Covid-19 vaccine Friday. Health and Family Welfare department has issued instructions to all the Collectors to ensure smooth administration of the vaccine to the selected health workers. The vaccination drive has been planned between 10 am to 12 pm at medical colleges, District Headquarter Hospitals and other setups.

Min reviews preparedness as schools reopen today

Bhubaneswar, Jan 7: School and Mass Education Minister Samir Ranjan Dash Thursday visited several schools in the state and reviewed the situation there as the institutions are set to reopen for Classes X and XII Friday.

The schools had remained closed for around 10 months due to Covid-19 pandemic.

The minister took stock of the arrangements that include sanitation of classrooms, offices and toilets, availability of hand wash and sanitisers in classrooms and bathrooms, temperature record equipment, sitting arrangement in classrooms and others.

As per guidelines issued by Health and Family Welfare department, hands of the children must be sanitised before entering the schools. A distance of 5 feet between the students would be maintained while sitting in classrooms. Parents will submit written consent for sending their wards to schools. If the child feels unwell, s/he won’t be asked to attend classes physically.

There will also be an isolation room in the school to meet emergency situations.

Dash said, “After the review of schools, we are assured that schools are ready with all safety measures for the students. Students must follow the guidelines and wear masks. If any student or teacher feels sick, he/she should avoid coming to the school.”

“A help desk with Mobile No 7440006709 has been established for citizens of Bhubaneswar by @dcpbbsr to provide assistance in cybercrime: please report to the helpdesk or dial 100,” said the official Twitter handle of Commissionerate Police.

Addressing the media about the initiative, Commissioner of Police Sudhashu Sarangi Thursday said, “The first one hour of the occurrence of crime is most crucial in cybercrime related incidents. So, please contact our officials through Sahayata helpline number: The officers in charge of the Sahayata desk will immediately help the victim.” He said that cops would block the phone number and bank account used by fraudsters if the victims inform the helpdesk about the cybercrime within the first hour of the occurrence of the crime. Sarangi stated that the cyber criminals have been getting away with the crime due to lack of proper coordination between victim and the police.

They have been duping several persons using a single sim card. The officers in charge of police stations have also been asked to seek

the help of the help desk on the receipt of any cybercrime related case as there is a dearth of trained police staffers at all the police stations here.

He also urged the citizens to inform the police about any suspicious URL address while searching for some helpline numbers of banks, financial institutions on popular search engine ‘Google’.

Upon receipt of information, the desk will try to ‘block the fraud cell number, track the involved money trail and freeze the last destination account. Make arrangements to block or delete fake cell number and URL from the search engine.”

He also said that women and children were often being harassed due to repeated phone calls from unknown numbers. He urged the victims to report the numbers so that police can block and deactivate the SIM card.

The desk comprising an official and seven assistants will function under the special squad of Commissionerate Police till the commencement of proposed cyber police station in the city.

Odisha first to constitute Food Commission: Merkap

In a letter to the PG council chairpersons and controllers of examinations of all public universities and principals to all degree colleges, officer-in-charge, Performance Tracking Cell, Mihir Kumar Das, said that the dates for document verification, payment of fees and the admission of selected candidates are January 21 and 22.

As per the guidelines, the candidates who had enrolled themselves in PG courses after their selection in the merit lists can participate in spot admissions if they want to change their streams and institutions.

Those who were unable to get themselves enrolled even after their selection in the merit lists can also participate in the spot admissions. Besides, candidates who had appeared for the Common PG Entrance Test (CPET-2020) but could not find a place in the 1st, 2nd & 3rd selection lists are also eligible for spot admissions. The candidates are advised to go through the university/college-wise vacant seat positions and cut-off mark details at SAMS website and give their options for spot admissions.

Panel formed for quota in MBBS, engg courses

The complainant has alleged that several government quarters have been illegally occupied by 308 retired government officers and other employees in different grades since 2009. The activist quoting data from the department of General Administration alleged that rent for the quarters to the tune of Rs 4, 28, 71,771 has been pending against the officials.

Purandeswari slams govt over Mahanga case

Bird flu scare: Govt forms teams, opens control room

Bhubaneswar, Jan 7: The state government has formed special supervisory teams and rapid response teams for active surveillance and monitoring of birds for any sign of suspected avian influenza.

The Fisheries and Animal Resources Development (F&ARD) department has formed nine special supervisory teams at state-level to immediately proceed to any suspected location of bird flu in the state. Further, all chief district veterinary officers (CDVOs) have been directed to constitute 10 to 15 Rapid Response Teams (RRT) at the district level for prompt response to any reports of suspected case of the disease, an officials said here Thursday.

Similarly, a state-level control room headed by the joint director, disease control (telephone no 0671 2414310) has started functioning at the directorate of Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Services, Cuttack. People can consume chicken meat, eggs and other poultry products produced in the state with proper cooking, he said.

Migratory birds are the carriers of the influenza and it spreads

through faecal droppings, shared feed and drinking water of the birds. The state government is vigilant and is continuously observing any unnatural deaths and behavior of birds at the places where there is concentration of migratory birds, said Bibhu Ranjan Das from directorate of Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Services. Animal Disease Research Institute (ADRI) at State level, Clinical Investigation Laboratory (CIL) and State Veterinary Laboratory (SVL) at regional level and District Diagnostic Laboratory (DDL) at district level has been geared up with full strength for collection and testing of the samples, he said.

The samples are also sent to the Regional Disease Diagnostic

Laboratory (RDDL) at Kolkata. Until now around 11,000 samples have been collected and tested during the current migratory season. So far all samples have been tested negative for avian influenza.

Asked about reports on death of birds in Govindpur village in Begunia block of Khorda district, the official said, “We have visited the place and found that around 120 poultry birds have been dead. Five of the dead birds have been taken to ADRI for laboratory investigation. All five samples have been tested negative for Avian Influenza virus.”

The birds died due to some other reason. The birds have not been provided food and water for last two days. That might be the reason, Das said.

NGT bans constructions on forest land in City

High-level SAIL panel to probe gas leak

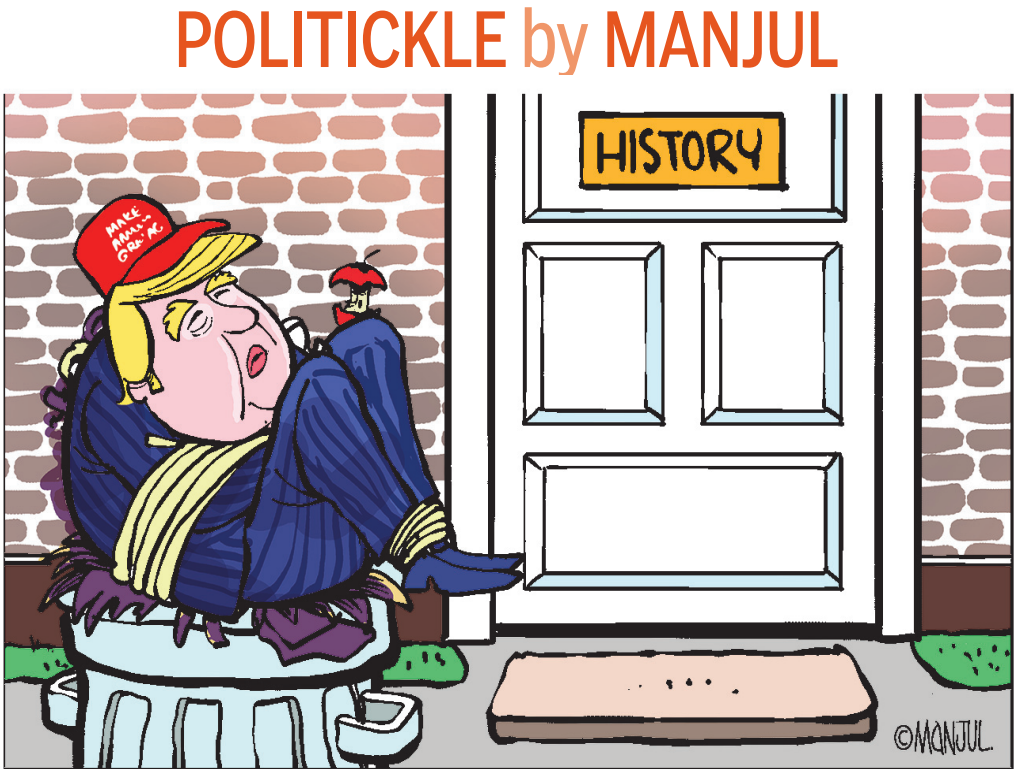
CEO Dipak Chattaraj released the suspension order against Sahu, Thursday. Meanwhile, two Deputy General Manager (DGM) rank officials -Gopabandhu Barik of EMD

Department and Nabendu Das of CCD Mechanical Department – have been suspended over the mishap.

A three member team appointed by the RSP has taken charge of investigation while a team from Factories and Boilers department launched a probe into the mishap. Stringent action will taken against persons found guilty for the mishap, RSP deputy director Bibhu Prasad said. Notably, at least four workers died while undergoing treatment at hospital and six others got severely intoxicated following a gas leakage at coal chemical department of the Rourkela Steel Plant (RSP).

The unfortunate incident occurred at around 9.45 am, Wednesday.

The four deceased were identified as Ganesh Pailo, Abhimanyu Saha, Babu Panda and Rabi Sahu of a construction company on the RSP premises.

Bird census starts in Hirakud reservoir

Sambalpur,Jan 7: The mid-winter waterfowl census started in Hirakud reservoir; Thursday morning. The head counting of the migratory birds started 6 am and will continue till 1 pm, official sources said.

In the bird census, 21 teams comprising forest staff of Samablpur, Hirakud and Jharsuguda divisions have been engaged in the exercise.

Jitendra Kumar Behera, assistant conservator of forest (ACF), Hirakud Wildlife Division informed, “The Hirakud reservoir has been divided into 18 sectors while the power channel has been divided into three sectors. 14 non-motorised boats, six motorised boats and one other vehicle have been deployed for the movement of the census team.”

Staff with designations like guards, ACFs, range officers, veterinary surgeons, ornithologists, wildlife enthusiasts and local bird club members are engaged in the census.

Students from Odisha University of Agriculture and Technology in Bhubaneswar have also been roped in for the drive. Behera said, “The teams have been provided with GPS, route charts, maps, binoculars and sophisticated cameras for counting the migratory birds at the reservoir.”

As per forest authorities, avian species started flocking to



Hirakud Dam towards mid-November 2020. The forest department made elaborate arrangements to protect the winged guests with regular patrolling on boats.

“Bird protection teams have been deployed at several places including Zero Point, Barakhandia, Parbatitong and Gobindpur around the reservoir to curb bird poaching,” informed the ACF.

In 2019, the wildlife teams spotted a total of 92 bird species and around 1,45,946 avian guests in Hirakud (WL) Division and forest divisions of Sambalpur & Jharsuguda during the annual census drive.

The birds mostly arrived from Caspian Sea, Aral Sea, Mongolia besides Central and South East Asia. Meanwhile in 2018, a total of 82 bird species and 1,36,835 migratory birds had been spotted in Hirakud reservoir. In comparison, the recently conducted census showed a marginal increase in the head count of avian species during the winter season.

Keonjhar Baldevjew temple to get facelift

32 yrs on, MCIP project yet to be completed

Kendrapara, Jan 7: Even as 32 years have passed since work started on the Mahanadi-Chitrotpala Island Irrigation Project (MCIP), the project is halfway through.

Work on the project had started in 1988-89 under the state plan and ₹45.81 crore was spent till 1995-96. The MCIP project was launched with an aim to providing irrigation facilities to over 19,542 hectares of farmland in Kendrapara and Jagatsinghpur districts.

The project had stirred hope among farmers of getting irrigation facilities in Garadpur, Marshaghai, Mahakalapara blocks of Kendrapara district and in Tirtol block of Jagatsinghpur.

The plan outlay was only ₹39.94 crore in 1989 which rose to ₹395.46 crore in 2012. The project work has stopped after the term of the lending



firm Asian Development Bank expired in 2019. Farmers and residents claimed lack of political will has delayed the project.

Sribatsha Samal, a farmer, of Marshaghai alleged that the construction of the canal to the left of the Paika river has stopped near Batira while the construction of the canal to the right of Chitrotpala river has stopped near Kalabuda. Irrigation for farm lands can happen only after construction of branch and sub-canal, he added.

Ganesh Chandra Samal, a

Zilla Parishad member, said the then Patkura MLA Bijaya Mohapatra had decided to provide irrigation facilities to their farmlands through construction of canals in 1989. The state government sanctioned ₹39.94 crore for the project the same year. The project work received a boost after Mohapatra became the irrigation minister.

Construction of siphon and bridges was constructed till Krishnandapur in Tirtol at an expenditure of ₹45.81 crore during the period. Later, the project stopped.

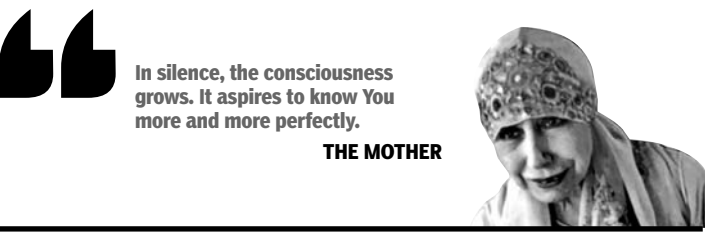

Reboot economy

The Cabinet Committee on Parliamentary Affairs (CCPA) has recommended that the budget session of Parliament commence from January 29 and the Union Budget is presented February 1. Unlike in the past, the coming Budget will test the nerves of the Central government. With negative economic growth and the Covid-19 playing havoc with people and their livelihood, the stakes are extraordinarily high for the government. There are too many challenges facing Union Finance Minister: With the coronavirus yet to be tamed, unemployment has come up as a huge challenge. Resources have fast thinned out. Jobs are gone. There is a drastic fall in public consumption. Demand is tepid. In this backdrop, expectations of people from the finance minister are sky high. Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman has already dropped hints that the coming Budget will be the most unusual Budget in the nation's history. The biggest challenge for the FM and her team of policy makers will be how to pull the economy out of the deep abyss it has found itself in and put it back on the growth trajectory. This would call for extraordinary efforts and resources. It would mean enhancing investment in infrastructure projects that generate employment and will have a domino effect on the economy. Health sector will be a big guzzler of resources given the vaccination drive and the allied expenses and the need to strengthen the health infrastructure in the country. Agriculture infrastructure including building up of scientific storage and cold-chain infrastructure will be another priority area for the government more so due to the ongoing farmer unrest. At any cost, the government will try to do whatever possible to redeem its image as farmer-friendly. The three new farm laws have come up as a thorn. Similarly, the allocations to rural job scheme such as MGN-REGA are also likely to be higher this time given massive unemployment scenario in rural India exacerbated by the Covid-19.

But where will the government find the resources to allow such big spend? Even a moderate increase in the expenditure will mean government has to think out of box to raise revenues. With growth getting deeper into negative territories, revenues have dried up. The current boom in the stock markets might push the government to sell stakes in PSUs. The proposed sale of Air India and other PSUs like Shipping Corporation and BPCL was thwarted this year due to coronavirus-related difficulties. The government may go in for aggressive disinvestment of some loss-making and a few profit-making PSUs such as Neelachal Ispat Nigam and Concor. The time may also be opportune to find good valuations for government assets. But this is not going to be an all end all option. Offloading government stake in PSUs has always faced with opposition and this time around this is not going to be different. Moreover, any attempt to offload stake in cash cows like LIC will not be easy. Another option for the government could be raising import duty in order to encourage domestic production. This will also not be a very prudent step as protections of domestic markets will kill efficiency. Further, public should not be deprived of the freedom of choice on what to buy and avail value for money. The pandemic must have already pushed the country's fiscal deficit beyond 7 per cent. And any rash decision on this score will further push the economic health to the brink. The FM must ensure that India's debt levels do not become unmanageable, failing which international rating agencies will further downgrade the ratings. Indian banks are not in the pink of health. The Covid-19 moratorium and the lending cut would have definitely dealt a blow to the books of banks whose NPA levels would have become unimaginable. While recapitalization of banks would be a challenge, a bigger challenge for the government will be finding private players to buy into these while elephants. The great dream of India achieving a 5 trillion dollar economy is contingent on the health and performance of its banks. Vaccination has come up as a massive challenge for the government. The government needs funds somewhere between ₹40,000 crore and ₹60,000 crore to vaccinate the world's second populous country. We will wait to see how Sitharaman is beating these challenges to reboot the economy.

■ Break-out space

Current management fashion involves at least partly reinventing the office. In such environments, workers no longer have their own desks and workspaces. Instead, in a technique called hot-desking, they are allocated a location each day according to their needs, storing working materials and personal belongings in portable lockers overnight. This vastly increases flexibility for the employer, who no longer needs to keep expensive office space available for rootless workers who may only be there part of the time, but it causes problems of rootlessness for staff whose territorial sense is well developed. Several jargon terms have been created for aspects of this new system; it is too soon to determine whether they will enter the lexicon. One such is lagoon, describing a group of workers all engaged on a common task. Another is break-out space, which is a quiet area away from the bustle of the workplace where informal meetings can be held (a common technique is to make participants stand up to stop sessions extending beyond need). The process is called breaking out.

But the European Union's decision last week to sign an investment accord with that country underscores the potential for serious discord. Even though the Biden camp cautioned the EU against moving ahead with the agreement, it nonetheless sealed the deal (pending ratification).

China's headstrong ways motivate the world's democracies to band together against it. Yet its growing geopolitical heft and the allure of Chinese trade and investment also tempt many countries to curry favour with its government. Accordingly, Biden should launch early in his presidency a concerted effort to forge a united democratic front on China guided by the following three principles

especially when it comes to Taiwan's autonomy and freedom of navigation in the Asia-Pacific. But the US and China should aim for shared leadership in the region – a strategic objective that would enjoy ample support among US allies already fearful of the escalating Sino-American rivalry. Second, the US and its key allies need to link arms to confront China on trade and investment. Economic decoupling is not in the offing; China is far too integrated into the global economy. Nonetheless, import competition from China and its unfair trade practices have cost the developed democracies millions of jobs over the past two decades. Pressing China to level the playing field can work to their economic advantage. America and its allies need to team up to maximize effectiveness. Acting unilaterally, as President Donald Trump did – and as the EU is now doing – only plays to China's strength by diluting the collective bargaining power of the world's democracies. Trump's tariffs have done little to liberalise China's market or bring down the US trade deficit. Instead, global pressure will be required to push back against China's harmful trade practices, including state subsidies and intellectual property theft. Though full-scale decoupling is not in the cards, the US should join with its democratic allies to pull back from China when it comes to sensitive technologies, such as semiconductors and artificial intelligence. The same holds for imposing new export controls, scrutinizing and regulating Chinese investment abroad, steering clear of Huawei when it comes to building 5G networks, and repatriating high-end production. These steps would align well with the domestic measures that the Biden administration and the governments of many other democracies are poised to take to generate more jobs and better pay for blue-collar workers. The goal must be to ensure that economic growth and gains from trade are more inclusive. Spending on infrastructure, education and retraining, research and development, and renewable energy can help the major democracies maintain their competitive edge over China. Finally, the US and its democratic partners should speak with a single voice when it comes to

standing up for human rights. Resolute condemnation of China's unwillingness to grant basic freedoms to its citizens will put China's leadership on the defensive in the court of international opinion. And it will help repair the erosion of America's moral authority under Trump. Democratic leaders can further raise the costs to China's rulers by imposing sanctions on those responsible for oppressing the Uighur minority in Xinjiang and cracking down on Hong Kong. When China resorts to economic coercion to punish countries for criticizing its human rights record, as it is doing with Australia, the world's democracies should respond in kind. Working to build a consensus around these three principles would not only signal the depth of the Biden administration's commitment to work with its partners. It would also play to America's strongest suit when it comes to handling China: its alliances. China has only one ally – North Korea – while the US has loyal partners worldwide. China's economy will be the world's largest by the end of the decade, but its GDP will remain roughly one-third the collective size of the world's major democracies. As long as they stand together and aggregate their geopolitical and economic heft, the main democracies will outclass China for the foreseeable future. Biden will need to summon all of his persuasive skills to forge a coordinated approach toward China. But his task is made easier by the fact that even as they eye the benefits of more commerce with China, democracies in Europe and Asia are anxious about China's intentions. They will welcome a US president who respects allies and appreciates the need for teamwork to deal with China.

starters, all rich countries should aim to achieve carbon neutrality on the consumption side, not just on the production side, no later than 2050. Those that can reach this target sooner should of course do so. Moreover, all of today's middle-income countries should aim to achieve carbon neutrality by 2060. Because the carbon intensity of developing countries' exports is often higher than that of their imports, a net-zero emissions pledge is a taller order on the production side than it is on the consumption side. The international community needs to provide technical and financial assistance to low- and lower-middle-income countries, conditioned on their efforts to achieve near-carbon neutrality by 2075. We can do better than relying just on national pledges and voluntary compliance.

Covaxin controversy

Sir, Covaxin and Covishield have both been authorized in India for restricted use in emergency situations. The Covishield vaccine is said to be the equivalent to the vaccine made by the Oxford University and the British-Swedish company Astra Zeneca. Its efficacy is said to be around 70%. AstraZenica had assigned the task of manufacturing this vaccine to Serum Institute of India, which is the largest serum manufacturing company in the world. So, this vaccine will be made in India. The second one is the Covaxin, which will be manufactured by the Indian pharma company Bharat Biotech. Now, scientists are raising questions about the approval of emergency use of Covaxin in India. According to some scientists, phase 1 and phase 2 of Covaxin trials are encouraging, but the phase 3 trial started in November and data regarding its results is not yet available. This raises questions about the efficacy of the vaccine. Members of the national Covid-19 task force have clarified that the clinical use of Covaxin will be on trial mode. Due to similar reasons, AIDAN or All India Drug Action Network, which is an independent network of several NGOs, has appealed to the government to reconsider the approval to this vaccine. The director of AIIMS, Dr Guleria said that vaccination with Covishield of the Serum Institute will begin soon. But Covaxin of Bharat Biotech will only be used under special circumstances. We may need this vaccine in case Covid cases start to increase suddenly. He said that when they consider a vaccine, the safety issue is of utmost importance. That is why the vaccine undergoes testing in various stages. Hence, it would be prudent to roll out Covaxin only after the results of its phase 3 trials are found satisfactory.

Before issuing safety permit to work on tanks where this hazardous gas may be present, testing of the atmosphere of tank is done. Proper exhaustion and fresh air injection is required to be done. Contractor workers are trained to safety work in such industries. The problem is contractors frequently change the workers with untrained or poorly-trained workers. This is a case of safety lapse.

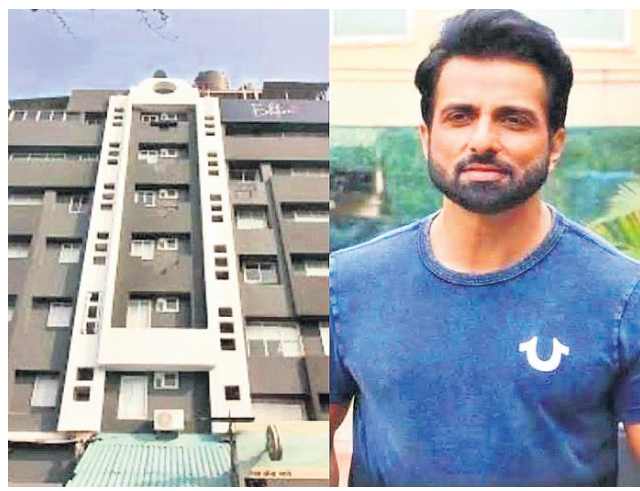
In the two-page complaint letter, the BMC alleged that the actor did not take any permission from the authorities before carrying out the structural changes in Shakti Sagar, a residential building on

Juhu's AB Nair Road.

"It was found that accused Mr Sonu Sood and Mrs Sonali Sonu Sood have instituted/completed/undertaken/carried out development or changed the user of land as detailed below: Unauthorised addition/alteration beyond approved plans and unauthorised change of user from residential to residential hotel building without taking technical sanction from competent authority," the BMC said in its complaint.

As per the complaint, the BMC had issued a notice to Sood in October last year in this connection.

"The land was one again inspected on Monday and it was found that the accused had not complied with the requisitions and was continuing to carry out unauthorised development even after the notice was served to him," the BMC said in the complaint.

Guv okays regulating inter-faith marriages

Bhopal, Jan 7: Governor Anandiben Patel Thursday signed an ordinance for its promulgation to regulate inter-faith marriages in Madhya Pradesh.

The ordinance provides for two to 10-year imprisonment and a fine up to Rs50,000 for anyone found guilty of "forcing women, minors, and people from Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes to undergo religious conversion".

According to the ordinance, conversion to embrace one's "ancestral religion" will not be considered a crime, as per the official.

An official said Patel has signed the drafts of all the 12 ordinances that the state cabinet approved and sent for her consent and promulgation on December 29. The ordinances were issued as the state assembly's winter session was postponed due to the Covid-19 pandemic. They include the one that provides for life imprisonment for those found guilty of adulteration of food and drugs.

The Madhya Pradesh Dharmik Swatantrata (Freedom of Religion) Ordinance defines ancestral religion as that of a person's father at the time of birth. It replaces the 1968 Madhya Pradesh Freedom of Religion Act and prohibits conversion and attempts on conversion done through "misrepresentation, allurements, threat, force, undue influence, coercion marriage, and any fraudulent means". "Conspiracy and abetment to religious conversion have been pro-

hibited too....," says the ordinance.

It provides for annulment of inter-faith marriages solemnised by "misrepresentation, allurements, threat, coercion, undue influence, and fraud". The ordinance seeks to provide parental property rights to children born out of such marriages and maintenance to the woman and children.

The cases registered under the ordinance are cognisable and non-bailable and sessions courts are authorised to hear them.

The ordinance has a provision for punishing organisations, which organise such conversions. A person embracing another religion voluntarily and the priest getting it done will have to inform the district magistrate at least 60 days prior to the scheduled date of conversion.

Over two dozen Muslim men have been arrested in neighbouring Uttar Pradesh since a similar ordinance was enacted there last month. Other Bharatiya Janata Party-ruled states like Haryana, Karnataka and Assam are planning to bring in similar anti-conversion laws that critics say are vague and being used to target inter-faith couples.

World's largest floating solar plant to come up in MP

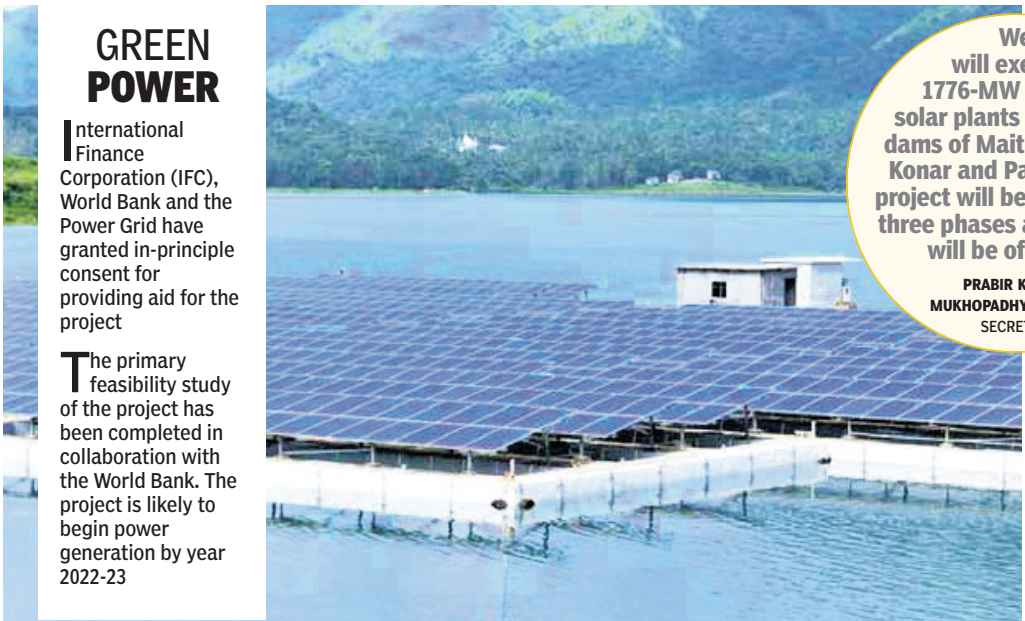

Centre writes to 4 states on new Covid-19 strain

New Delhi, Jan 7: Union Health Secretary Rajesh Bhushan has written to Maharashtra, Kerala, Chhattisgarh and West Bengal, urging them to take steps to curb the spike in coronavirus cases.

These states are reporting an upsurge in the number of daily new cases in the recent days, and comprise 59 per cent of the total active cases in the country. About 28.61 per cent cases are in Kerala, followed by 22.79 per cent in Maharashtra, 3.99 per cent in Chhattisgarh and 3.89 per cent in West Bengal.

These states have been advised to maintain strict vigil and to take steps to keep a check on the rising cases, especially in view of the new coronavirus strain observed in certain countries, which has also been reported in a few states in India.

The Health Secretary has drawn the attention of the states to their low and declining testing rates, stating that any laxity at this crucial juncture may squander the results of collective actions in containing the transmission.

They have been advised to analyze the surge at the district and sub-district levels to understand the reasons for this rise and plan adequate measures proactively to curb the same. Aggressively implementation of the 'Test-Track-Treat' strategy adopted by the country has been strongly advised now



more than ever by the Union Health Secretary. The health authorities in the states have also been advised to proactively promote wearing of mask and other Covid appropriate behaviors even while the vaccination drive is about to begin.

It is important to ensure that there is no complacency in the collective efforts in containment and management of Covid-19, the Health Secretary has strongly reiterated.

The states have been assured of all necessary support of the Health Ministry required to manage the pandemic. In view of the above, a high-level central team led by Dr S.K. Singh, Director, National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), has been rushed by the Central government to Kerala. The team will review the public health interventions in management of Covid-19 by the state government and support the state health authorities in these measures. 38 tribal women kidnapped from Raj by MP villagers

Kota, Jan 7: In a brazen case of mass kidnapping, a group of over 100 people belonging to a Madhya Pradesh village allegedly abducted 38 tribal women and children from Rajasthan on suspicion that their men were involved in stealing their bikes, police said on Thursday.

The Rajasthan police, however, managed to secure the release of the kidnapped women and children from Madhya Pradesh within hours of the offence and arrested six of the alleged kidnappers and seized their arms and ammunition and the car used for the abduction on Wednesday afternoon.

The brazen offence of interstate kidnapping of tribal women was committed in Unhel police station area of Jhalwar district in Rajasthan by the people of Kalasiya village under Alot police station of Ratlam district in Madhya Pradesh, Unhel police station's SHO Bhanwar Singh said.

Singh said several families of 'Kanjar' tribe community live in makeshift tents at the interstate border under his police station area.

These tribal people are often suspected to be involved in various crimes in the area by locals, he added.

The provocation for this daring offence of mass kidnapping was the theft of a motorbike of someone belonging to Kalasiya village in the neighbouring Ratlam district, he added.

Sonia slams govt over fuel price, farmer stir

New Delhi, Jan 7: Congress president Sonia Gandhi on Thursday attacked the Modi government over the ongoing farmer agitation and the hike in fuel prices, and said the country is today standing at the crossroads for the first time since Independence. On the hike in fuel prices, she accused the government of profiteering and said it is turning a disaster into an opportunity to fill its coffers.

She also alleged that the government is breaking the back of the poor, the farmers, and the middle class due to its "insensitivity".

"Demand from the government that the rates of excise duty on petrol and diesel be made similar to that during the UPA regime and provide immediate relief to the affected people. "I once again appeal to the government to repeal the three farm laws immediately and fulfil all the demands of farmers," she said in a statement.

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi also accused the government of "looting" the people by imposing heavy taxes on fuel and alleged that this is the reason it is not bringing them under the purview of the Goods and Services Tax (GST).

"There has been unprecedented 'development' in prices of petrol and diesel. The Modi government is looting the public by charging heavy taxes on fuel. This is the reason why the government is not willing to bring petrol-diesel under GST," he said in a tweet in Hindi. Sonia Gandhi said in the midst



of a collapsing economy due to the coronavirus pandemic, the Modi government is trying to turn the disaster as an opportunity to fill its coffers. She said while the price of crude oil is USD 50.96 per barrel - just Rs 23.43 per litre internationally - diesel is being sold for Rs 74.38 and petrol at Rs 84.20 per litre in the national capital.

This is the highest in the last 73 years, she alleged.

"The country is standing at the crossroads today for the first time in the history of independent India. On one hand, the country's 'anna-datta' is standing on the borders of Delhi for the last 44 days in support of their legitimate demands, while the country's autocratic, insensitive and ruthless BJP government is busy breaking the back of the poor, farmers and middle class," she said in a statement.

The Congress chief said despite lower international prices, the government has broken all records of profiteering by exorbitantly raising excise duty instead of passing on the benefits to common people.

In the last six-and-a-half years, the Modi government has increased excise duty to recover about Rs 19,00,000 crore from the pockets of common people, she said.

SC expresses concern over gatherings amid pandemic

New Delhi, Jan 7: The Supreme Court Thursday asked the Centre whether the farmers protesting against the new farm laws at Delhi borders are "protected" against the spread of COVID-19 and said that the guidelines to contain the virus should be followed.

The apex court was hearing a plea seeking various reliefs including CBI probe into the matter related to assembly of people at Anand Vihar Bus Terminal and the Tablighi Jamaat congregation at Nizamuddin Markaz in the national capital after the nationwide lockdown was announced last year to contain the pandemic.

"You must tell us what is happening. The same problem is going to arise in farmers' agitation. I do not know if farmers are protected from COVID. So, the same problem is going to arise. It is not that everything is over," said Chief Justice S A Bobde, who was heading the bench which also comprised Justices A S Bopanna and V Ramasubramanian.

The top court asked Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the Centre, whether protesting farmers are protected from COVID-19. Mehta replied, "Certainly not".

Mehta said that he will file a report within two weeks on what has been done and what needs to be done.

The plea, filed by advocate Supriya Pandita, has alleged that Delhi police had failed to control the gathering of people at Anand Vihar Bus Terminal last year during the lockdown. Advocate Om Prakash Parihar, appearing for the peti-

tioner, Thursday told the bench that the police has not said anything about the whereabouts of Nizamuddin Markaz chief Maulana Saad. The bench told Parihar, "Why are you interested in one person? We are on the issue of COVID. Why do you want controversy? We are interested that COVID guidelines should be followed".

The apex court said it is trying to ensure that COVID-19 does not spread and the guidelines are followed.

"Issue notice. In the meantime, respondents shall file their reply affidavit, if any," the bench said in its order. The Centre had June 5 last year told the top court that probe into assembly of people at Anand Vihar Bus Terminal in east Delhi during nationwide lockdown and the Tablighi Jamaat event is being conducted on a day-to-day basis by Delhi Police and there was no need for CBI investigation.

The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) had earlier given the details of steps taken by Delhi Police which is making all efforts to com-

plete the investigation within the time frame to submit the charge sheet in the trial court. It had told the top court that due to fake media reports and circulation of certain misinformation in the areas of Delhi, thousands of migrants gathered at Anand Vihar Bus terminal and Ghazipur border areas here March 28, last year.

On the steps taken by Delhi Police, the MHA in its affidavit had said that probe in Markaz matter is being conducted on a day-to-day basis, in accordance with the mandate of law and all efforts are being made to finalize investigation and submit a report under section 173 CrPC (charge sheet) before the trial court in a time bound manner.

The MHA had alleged that Maulana Saad and others had allowed a huge gathering to assemble inside a closed premise, over a protracted period of time, without any semblance of social distances or provision of masks and sanitizers and have caused a situation where a highly infectious disease such as COVID-19 may spread and threaten the lives of inmates.

NCW team visits Badaun gangrape victim's family

Badaun (UP), Jan 7: A two-member team of the National Commission for Women (NCW) Thursday met the family of the 50-year-old woman who was allegedly gang-raped and murdered in Badaun district January 3. The NCW team also visited the crime site.

Chandramukhi Devi, one of the members of the team, said that she was not satisfied with the role of the police in the incident. "If the police would have shown swiftness in the matter, perhaps they could have saved the victim," she said after her visit.

Before paying a visit to the victim's family, the team also had a meeting with the SSP of the area and went through the details of the incident.

Interestingly, even as the NCW team was at the house of the victim, the wife and daughter of one of the accused in the crime tried

to meet the visiting delegation.

The wife and daughter of the accused, Jashpal, demanded justice for themselves and claimed that he was innocent. "My husband got a call that there is a patient and went to do his job. He came to know about the case later," said Jaspal's wife, claiming that he is being framed. According to police, the 50-year-old woman, who was an Anganwadi worker, was gang-raped and murdered in the Ughaiti area of Badaun district when she had gone to a temple Sunday evening.

The post-mortem report of the deceased confirmed rape, injury in her private parts, and fracture in her legs.

An FIR was registered against three accused, including a priest, at the Ughaiti police station under Sections 376 (d) and 302 of the Indian Penal Code (IPC). Two of the accused persons have been arrested while the priest is still absconding.

Jallikattu is typically celebrated in the southern state of Tamil Nadu as part of the Pongal celebrations, on the Mattu Pongal day, which occurs annually during this month

Chennai, Jan 7: Over 50 doctors and people for the Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA) India appealed to the Tamil Nadu government to immediately withdraw the permission for the annual bull taming event - Jallikattu.

Over 50 doctors have signed a letter to the Tamil Nadu Chief Minister, Edappadi Palaniswami and Health Minister C. Vijayabaskar urging them to immediately withdraw the permission, which the doctors warn poses a grave risk to the general public because of the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic.

The appeal is in response to the Tamil Nadu government's recent order allowing the conduct of Jallikattu events with hundreds of people present, People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA) India has also asked the state government to stop Jallikattu

events. The letter signed by 50 doctors, states, "To prevent the rapid spread of Covid-19 and to protect public health, as well as to ease the pressure on the healthcare professionals, non-essential activities such as Jallikattu events, which lead to unnecessary gatherings of people, must not be allowed."

The letter also states, "Since the Tamil Nadu government legalised Jallikattu in 2017, at least 22 bulls and 57 humans have reportedly died, while 3,632 humans were injured in events organised throughout the state."

PETA India Research Associate Dr. Ankita Pandey further cautions that more people are expected to die this year, not only because of Jallikattu itself but also because of Covid-19.

"If Jallikattu events are not stopped, if huge crowds gather to torment bulls, society will be tormented, too," she urges the TN government.

All Guj villages to get day-time agri power supply by 2022-end

Ahmedabad, Jan 7: Farmers of all 18,000-odd villages in Gujarat will get power supply during the day time for agriculture purposes by the end of the year 2022, Chief Minister Vijay Rupani announced Thursday.

The BJP government in the state has allocated Rs 3,500 crore

to create the necessary infrastructure for this ambitious Kisan Suryodaya Yojna' (KSY), Rupani said addressing a gathering Tilakwada town in Narmada while launching the project for 39 villages of the district.

In October last year, Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched the scheme, aimed at providing electricity during the day time



to farmers for irrigation and farming purposes, for the entire state, and villages of different districts

are being covered in a phase-wise manner, Rupani said.

"Farmers have been demanding that they be given agricultural power supply during the day, as going to fields in the night to irrigate the crop is dangerous. That is why we have approved this scheme having a budget of Rs 3,500 crore," the Chief Minister said in his address.

'Air pollution linked to increased risk of pregnancy loss in India'

New Delhi, Jan 7: Pregnant women in India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, who are exposed to poor air quality, may be at higher risk of stillbirths and miscarriages, according to a modelling study published in The Lancet Planetary Health journal.

Researchers found that an estimated 349,681 pregnancy losses per year in south Asia were associated with exposure to PM2.5 concentrations that exceeded India's air quality standard of 40 microgrammes per cubic metre (µg/m3) of small particulate matter (PM2.5). These account for 7 per cent of annual pregnancy loss in the re-

gion from 2000-2016, they said. For air pollution above WHO air quality guideline of 10 µg/m3, exposure may have contributed to 29 per cent of pregnancy losses, according to the study.

"South Asia has the highest burden of pregnancy loss globally and is one of the most PM2.5 polluted regions in the world," said study lead author Tao Xue, from Peking University, China.

"Our findings suggest that poor air quality could be responsible for a considerable burden of pregnancy loss in the region, providing further justification for urgent action to tackle dangerous levels of pollution," Xue said. Tianjia Guan,

from the Chinese Academy of Medical Sciences said that losing

a pregnancy can have knock-on mental, physical and economic effects on women.

These, Guan said, include increased risk of postnatal depressive disorders, infant mortality during subsequent pregnancy, and increase the costs related to pregnancy, such as loss of labour. "Therefore, reducing pregnancy loss may also lead to knock-on improvements in gender equality," Guan, one of the authors of the study said.

The researchers noted that pregnancy loss associated with air pollution was more common in the Northern plains region in India and Pakistan. Although the total bur-

den of pregnancy loss was predominantly borne by rural women aged under 30 years old in recent years, the burden attributable to PM2.5 also affected older mothers, aged 30 years or over, in rural areas because of their high susceptibility to the adverse effects of pollution, they said.

The team combined data from household surveys on health from 1998-2016 and estimated exposure to PM2.5 during pregnancy through combining satellite with atmospheric modelling outputs. They created a model to calculate the risk of pregnancy loss for each 10 µg/m3 increase in PM2.5 after adjusting for maternal age, temperature and hu-

midity, seasonal variation, and long-term trends in pregnancy loss.

The researchers calculated the number of pregnancy losses that may have been caused by PM2.5 in the whole region for the period 2000-16 and looked at how many pregnancy losses might have been prevented under India's and WHO's air quality standard.

In the study, they included 34,197 women who had lost a pregnancy, including 27,480 miscarriages and 6,717 stillbirths, which were compared to livebirth controls. Of the pregnancy loss cases, 77 per cent were from India, 12 per cent from Pakistan, and 11 per cent from Bangladesh.

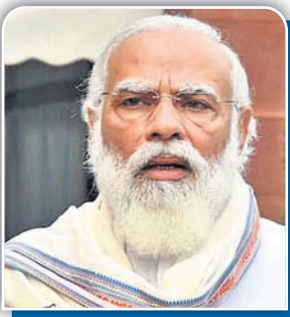

Can Trump be declared unfit for office?

Washington, Jan 7: Democratic Congress members are telling Vice President Pence that Trump cannot remain for full term as the latter is not 'mentally sound'.

Calls are growing in the United States for President Donald Trump to be removed from office after he failed to condemn his supporters for storming the US Capitol Building as members met to certify Joe Biden as the country's next president.

Broadcast network ABC News, citing multiple sources with direct knowledge of the move, reported that some members of Trump's cabinet were discussing an unprecedented move to invoke Section 4 of the 25th Amendment of the constitution, as several Democratic members of Congress urged Vice President Mike Pence to lead the charge in declaring Trump as "unfit" to remain as president.

"President Trump revealed that he is not mentally sound and is still unable to process and accept the results of the 2020 election," they wrote in a letter that was signed by all Democratic members of the House Judiciary Committee. "President Trump has shown time and again that he is unwilling to protect our Democracy and carry out the duties of the office."

The Washington Post newspaper's editorial board also called for Trump's removal, saying, "every second he retains the vast powers of the presidency is a threat to public order and national security". It was a view echoed by The Miami Herald newspaper: "His comments were no mere dog whistle to his marauding posse. This was a full-throated war cry," the paper said in an editorial. "With his un-American words and his anti-democratic acts, Trump led this insurrection every bit as much as if he were storming the Capitol himself."



WHAT DOES SEC 4 OF THE AMENDMENT SAY?

Whenever the Vice President and a majority of either the principal officers of the executive departments or of such other body as Congress may by law provide, transmit to the President pro tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives their written declaration that the President is unable to discharge the powers and duties of his office, the Vice President shall immediately assume the powers and duties of the office as Acting President. Thereafter, when the President transmits to the President pro tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives his written declaration that no inability exists, he shall resume the powers and duties of his office unless the Vice President and a majority of either the principal officers of the executive department or of such other body as Congress may by law provide, transmit within four days to the President pro tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives their written declaration that the President is unable to discharge the powers and duties of his office. Thereupon Congress shall decide the issue, assembling within forty-eight hours for that purpose if not in session. If the Congress within twenty-one days after receipt of the latter written declaration, or, if Congress is not in session within twenty-one days after Congress is required to assemble, determines by two-thirds vote of both Houses that the President is unable to discharge the powers and duties of his office, the Vice President shall continue to discharge the same as Acting President; otherwise, the President shall resume the powers and duties of his office.

A social media reckoning

FACEBOOK AND TWITTER INDEFINITELY BAR TRUMP

NEW YORK: All it took for social-media giants Twitter and Facebook to even temporarily bar President Donald Trump from addressing their vast audiences was a violent insurrection at the U.S. Capitol, fueled by years of false statements, conspiracy theories and violent rhetoric from the President.

Wednesday, in an unprecedented step, the two companies temporarily suspended Trump from posting to their platforms after a mob of his supporters stormed the house of Congress. It was the most aggressive action either company has yet taken against Trump, who more than a decade ago embraced the immediacy and scale of Twitter to rally loyalists, castigate enemies and spread false rumors.

Twitter locked Trump out of his account for 12 hours and said that future violations could result in a permanent suspension. The com-

pany required the removal of three of Trump's tweets, including a short video in which he urged those supporters to "go home" while also repeating falsehoods about the integrity of the presidential election. Trump's account deleted those posts, Twitter said; had they remained, Twitter had threatened to extend his suspension.

Facebook and Instagram, which Facebook owns, followed up in the evening, announcing that Trump wouldn't be able to post for 24 hours following two violations of its policies. The White House did not immediately offer a response to the actions.

While some cheered the platforms' actions, experts noted that the companies' actions follow years of hemming and hawing on Trump and his supporters spreading dangerous misinformation and encouraging violence that have contributed to Wednesday's violence.



Capitol has seen violence, but not like this

NEW YORK: In more than 220 years, the U.S. Capitol had seen nothing like it: a rolling mob, forcing its way past its majestic marble columns, disrupting the passage of power, desecrating the seat of the world's greatest democracy.

But this was far from the first time the Capitol has been

scarred by violence. Over the centuries, events have made a mockery of the inscription on the rostrum of the House chamber — "Union, Justice, Tolerance, Liberty, Peace." The building has been bombed several times. There have been shootings. One legislator almost killed another.

The most deadly attack on the Capitol occurred in



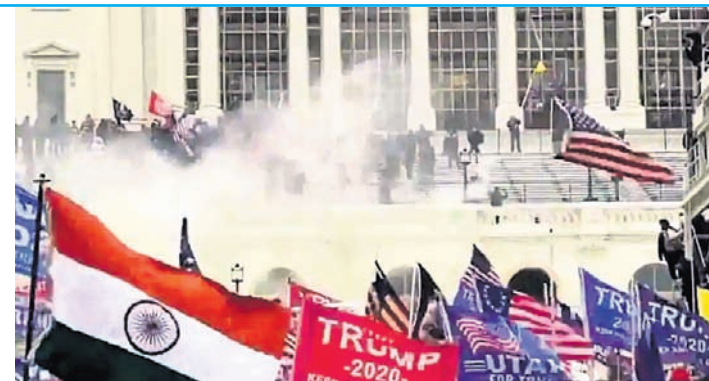
1998, when a mentally ill man fired at a checkpoint and killed two Capitol Police officers. One of the dying officers managed to wound the gunman, who was arrested and later institutionalised. A nearby statue of Vice President John C. Calhoun still bears a bullet mark from the incident.

- In 1856, Rep. Preston Brooks attacked abolitionist Senator Charles Sumner with his cane on the floor of the Senate after the Senator gave a speech criticising slavery

- In 1915, a German man planted three sticks of dynamite in the Senate reception room

A video which has been doing rounds on social media showed a person holding the Tricolour amid Trump supporters who were holding banners and waving the American flag. The person's identity or political affiliations is not known so far



NOT EVEN DURING CIVIL WAR

This is the first time in the USA's history that the Confederate flag has appeared inside the halls of the Capitol

The flag represented the seven southern Confederate States of America (CSA) that seceded from the union in 1861 after the election of Abraham Lincoln as President

Four more states joined them later; Lincoln was in favour of banning slavery in US territories which were not states. The southern states, heavily dependent on slave labour, saw this as a grander plan to abolish slavery completely and thereby an attack on their constitutional rights

Consequently, a four-year war ensued that lasted from 1861 to 1865 and ended with the defeat of the Confederate states

The Civil War is known to have been the costliest and the deadliest war in America, leading to the death of approximately 6,20,000 soldiers, and leaving millions more injured, with large parts of the South in ruins

Tata Power takes over power distribution in Odisha

New Delhi, Jan 7: Tata Power Thursday announced that it has taken over the management and operations of Odisha's power distribution utilities WESCO and SOUTHCO upon completion of the sale process.

With this, WESCO and SOUTHCO will operate under the company name as TP Western Odisha Distribution Ltd (TPWODL) and TP Southern Odisha Distribution Ltd (TPSODL) respectively.

As per order issued by the Odisha Electricity Regulatory Commission (OERC), Tata Power holds 51 per cent of equity with management control and the state-owned GRIDCO will have the remaining 49 per cent equity stake in the company.

WESCO, SOUTHCO

TPWODL is responsible for the distribution and retail supply of electricity in five circles of WESCO covering 2 million consumers with annual input energy of 7,520 MUs in Rourkela, Burla, Bhawanipatna, Bolangir and Bargarh areas, while TPSODL will be responsible for the distribution covering 2.3 million consumers with average energy input of 3,470 MUs and retail supply of electricity in six circles of SOUTHCO in areas of Ganjam city, Berhampur, Aska, Bhanjannagar, Jeypore and Rayagada.

With this takeover, the company's distribution circles will expand to the western (TPWODL) and southern part (TPSODL) of Odisha with geographical spread of more than 47,000 sq km each. It will manage a network of more than 100,000 CKT kms each for a license period of 25 years.

LIC begins campaign to revive customers' lapsed policies

Employment scenario worsens in December

New Delhi, Jan 7: The employment scenario in the country, which improved post the lifting of the lockdown, has worsened in December, according to data from the Centre for Monitoring Indian Economy (CMIE).

The unemployment rate in the country increased sharply to 9.1 per cent in December from 6.5 per cent in November, as per the data. The numbers indicate that the stress in the economy is far from over and the road to normalcy would be longer.

According to CMIE's MD and CEO Mahesh Vyas, the December number is the highest unemployment rate since the beginning of India's recovery from the lockdown in June. He noted that the rise in unemployment comes along with high inflation, which has been in the vicinity of 7 per cent in recent

The unemployment rate in the country increased sharply to 9.1% in December from 6.5% in November, according to data from the Centre for Monitoring Indian Economy

months, and has made the situation worse. He also raised concerns that the sharp increase in unemployment strengthens worries regarding the recovery process.

As per the think tank, the rise in unemployment in December is the result of a partial recovery of the labour participation rate (LPR). The LPR had fallen to 40 per cent in November from 40.7 per cent in the preceding two months.



RISING JOBLESSNESS

LPR is a measure of an economy's active workforce. It is calculated by dividing the labour force by the total working-age population.

In December, the LPR recovered partly, to 40.6 per cent. The influx of people looking for work swelled

and the labour force increased from an estimated 421 million in November to 427 million in December. But, labour markets were not ready for this six-million surge in labour, leaving them largely unemployed, Vyas said.

'Covid-hit GDP expected to contract 7.7% in FY21'

New Delhi, Jan 7: India's First Advance Estimate of national income Thursday showed a contraction of 7.7 per cent in real GDP for FY21. On a year-on-year basis, Asia's third largest economy had grown by 4.2 per cent in 2019-20.

"Real GDP or GDP at Constant Prices (2011-12) in the year 2020-21 is likely to attain a level of ₹134.40 lakh crore, as against the provisional estimate of GDP for the year 2019-20 of ₹145.66 lakh crore, released May 31, 2020," the First Advance Estimates of National Income for financial year 2020-21 said.

"The growth in real GDP during 2020-21 is estimated at -7.7 per cent as compared to the growth rate of 4.2 per cent in 2019-20," it added.

As per the estimate, real GVA at basic prices is estimated at ₹123.39 lakh crore in 2020-21, as against ₹133.01 lakh crore in 2019-20, showing a contraction of 7.2 per cent.

"With a view to contain the spread of the Covid-19 pandemic, certain restrictions were imposed

from March 25, 2020. Though the restrictions have been gradually lifted, there has been an impact on the economic activities as well as on the data collection mechanisms," the National Statistical Office (NSO) said.

In terms of sectors, the estimates showed that GVA at basic prices by economic activity at 2011-12 prices showed a contraction in trade, hotels, transport, communication and services related to broadcasting; financial, real estate and professional services; and public

administration, defence and other services at (-)21.4 per cent, (-)0.8 per cent and (-)3.7 per cent, respectively.

The growth in the agriculture, forestry and fishing; mining and quarrying; manufacturing and construction is estimated to be 3.4 per cent, (-)12.4 per cent, (-)9.4 per cent and (-)12.6 per cent, respectively.

The GVA at basic prices for 2019-20 from electricity, gas, water supply and other utility services sector is expected to grow by 2.7 per cent.

Revised mining policy likely to come up by Feb: Union Min

"The state government has promised to speed up the auction and also said that they will bring about 11-12 mines for auction immediately," he said.

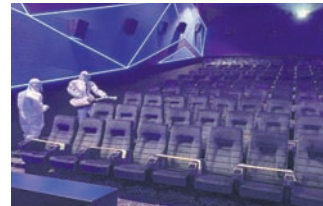

Sydney, Jan 7: In signs ominous for India and encouraging for Australia, the beleaguered Steve Smith looked dangerous and his understudy Marnus Labuschagne struck an unbeaten half century as the hosts reached 166 for two on a rain-marred opening day of the third Test here.

At stumps, Labuschagne was unbeaten on 67 and Smith, after his uncharacteristic run of low scores so far, seemed out of the woods with 31 confident runs, which included five authoritative boundaries. Labuschagne found the fence eight times.

This was after debutant Will Pucovski, riding on some luck, made 62 on debut to break the shackles for the under-fire side. Smith looked positive from the word go and was determined to not let the Indian bowlers dictate terms to him.

Having entered the match after registering scores of 1, 0 and 8 in his last three innings, Smith's first confident shot came against India's pace spearhead Jasprit Bumrah, who was nicely driven through the mid-on for his first boundary of the series.

His confidence up after dismissing Pucovski for his first Test wicket, debutant pacer Navdeep Saini got carried away and was guilty of bowling too full to Smith, who latched on to them with a couple of fours.

With Smith looking in fine fettle,

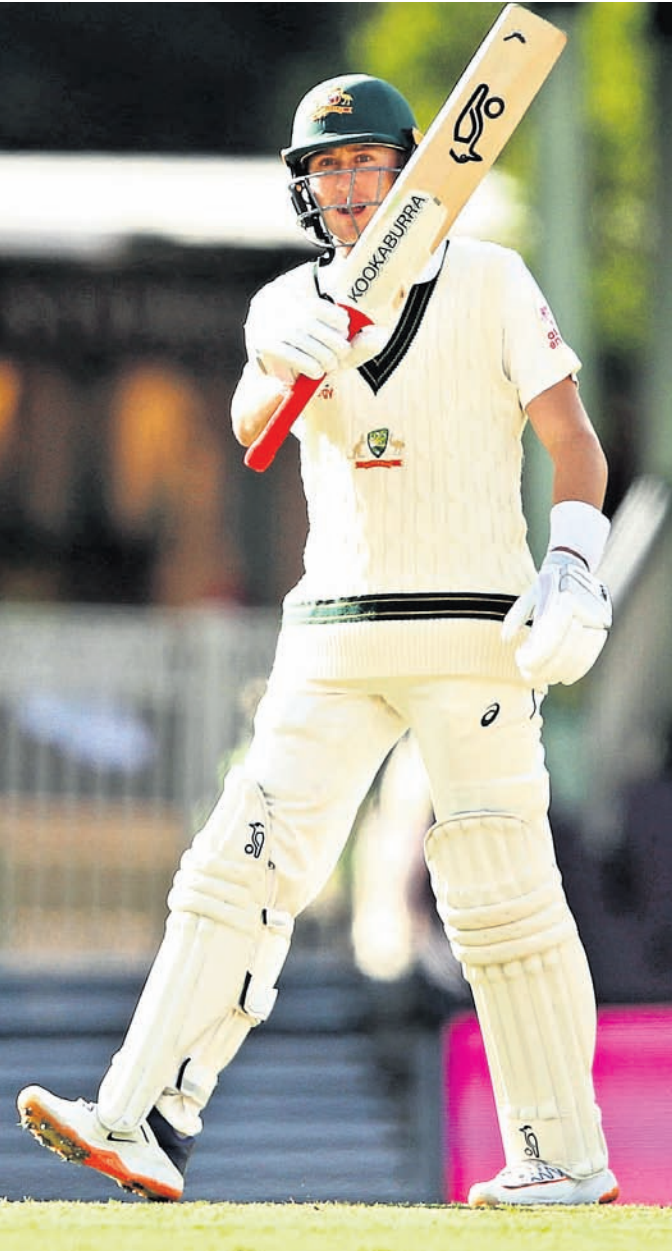
A 4-HOUR RAIN INTERRUPTION

The two added 60 runs for the third wicket after a 100-run association between Labuschagne and Pucovski, who was trapped in front of the wicket by Saini but not before starting his Test career with a solid knock.

Pucovski also had luck on his side as wicketkeeper Rishabh Pant dropped the opener twice before tea. Pucovski was on 54 and Marnus Labuschagne on 34 at the tea break after four hours of play were lost due to rain.

In between three reprieves, Pucovski played some impressive shots and also looked solid in defence after Mohammed Siraj had sent back the returning David Warner early.

Introduced into the attack after 13 overs in India's first bowling change, senior off-spinner Ashwin tempted Pucovski into a drive and the batsman only managed an edge after losing his balance, but Pant failed to hang on to the offering despite getting his gloves to it in the 22nd over.

Pant spilled one more chance and on that occasion the unlucky bowler was Siraj, whose fast and short delivery touched the batsman's gloves on his way to the keeper, who could not complete the task. Pant managed to take it on the second attempt, but the ball had hit the ground by then.

With luck on his side, Pucovski got to his fifty when he pulled another debutant, Navdeep Saini, through the wide mid-on region for a boundary.

It's the second year in a row that Atletico lost to a third-tier team in the cup competition, after a 1-2 defeat to Cultural Leonesa.

In the La Liga contest, Williams gave Marcelino Garcia Toral a perfect start to his debut match as Bilbao's new coach in the third

minute. The forward broke free down the left flank, cut back inside Clement Lenglet, and drilled a low shot under goalkeeper Marc Andre ter Stegen.

But once Messi and Pedri started to click, Barcelona dominated the game except for a lone goal by Iker Munian in the 90th minute after a poor pass by Messi.

Pedri equalised in the 14th when he headed in a ball knocked back by Frenkie de Jong after Messi had met his long run into the area with a precise lob from distance.

The 18-year-old Pedri then turned playmaker when he used a no-look pass by rolling the ball backwards to set up Messi in the 38th. Messi made it 3-1 in the 62nd by firing a pass from Antoine Griezmann off the underside of the bar and into the net.

Messi, who also hit the woodwork twice, tarnished his otherwise brilliant game when his poor pass was picked off by Bilbao near the area, allowing Munian to score.

Juventus end AC Milan's 27-game unbeaten run

Milan, Jan 7: AC Milan's 27-game unbeaten run in Serie A ended with a 1-3 loss to Juventus that gives the defending champion renewed hope of a 10th straight title.

Federico Chiesa scored twice for Juventus with American Weston McKennie adding the third goal as Milan lost in the league for the first time since March, a streak dating back to last season.

Davide Calabria had equalised shortly before halftime for Milan, which had been the last unbeaten team in any of Europe's top five leagues.

Milan still maintained their league lead, a point above city rival Inter Milan, who lost 1-2 at Sampdoria. Juventus moved into fourth, seven points behind Milan with a game in hand.

Both Milan and Juventus had players ruled out with the coronavirus while the home side was also missing several through injury, including key forward Zlatan Ibrahimovic.

Chiesa hit the post before opening the scoring in the 18th minute, stroking Paulo Dybala's back-heeled flick into the bottom left corner following a swift one-two with the Argentine.

Milan levelled four minutes before the break with a rapid counterattack that ended with Rafael Leao rolling the ball across for Calabria to place into the top right corner.

Chiesa restored Juve's lead in the 62nd minute but went off seconds later with an injury. His replacement, McKennie, scored in the 76th from close range after good work from Dejan Kulusevski down the right flank.
