## Covovax gets DCGI nod for children

New Delhi: Serum Institute of India's CEO Adar Poonawalla informed Wednesday that its vaccine Covovax has received emergency use authorisation (EUA) by the DCGI. The approval has been granted for the administration of the Covid-19 vaccine to adults and children aged above 12 years. It is the fourth vaccine to receive the regulator's nod for use among those below 18 years. Covovax can be also used for those in the age group of 12 to 17 years. Covovax in global trials has demonstrated more than 90 per cent efficacy, said Poonawalla. The DCGI had already approved Covovax for restricted use in emergency situations in adults December 28.



## First human milk bank in Odisha

Bhubaneswar: Odisha got its first human milk bank which was inaugurated in the paediatric unit of the Capital Hospital here Wednesday. This incidentally is the 34th Comprehensive Lactation Management Centre (CLMC) in India. The initiative by the National Health Mission (NHM) will cater to the needs of several newborns across Odisha. Director of Capital Hospital, Dr Laxmidhar Sahu said the facility will store mother's milk, which will be supplied to hospitals across Odisha, if the need arises. "Many mothers fail to breastfeed their newborn initially. This human milk bank will come as a great help for such mothers," Dr Sahu said.

## WILD ELEPHANTS FORCE NZP CLOSURE

Bhubaneswar, March 9: The Nandankanan Zoological Park (NZP) here was temporarily closed for visitors after two wild elephants entered the zoo premises officials said Wednesday. Efforts to drive the pachyderms back into the Chandaka forest have so far proved futile.

"We found around 3.00am that two wild elephants have entered the zoo area by breaking the outer boundary wall," informed Sanjeet Kumar, Deputy Director of NZP. "Our staff tried to drive the elephants back to the Chandaka sanctuary. However, the elephants did not budge and remained in a small forest area near the tiger's line," Kumar added.

As a precautionary measure and for the safety of visitors and animals the zoo has been closed for a temporary period. It will be opened once the pachyderms are driven back, he informed.

The official also said that efforts will be made after sunset to drive back the elephants into the sanctuary. "It is tough to drive the elephants away during the day. So we will try to do so in the evening," stated Kumar. He informed that the wild jumbos may have entered the zoo in search of food and water.

# Bridge wall collapse kills 2

CM Naveen Patnaik announces ₹3 lakh ex-gratia to kin of the deceased, orders RDC-level inquiry into the accident

Cuttack, March 9: Two persons were killed and one critically injured after a portion of the wall of the bridge connecting Chhatra Bazaar and Malgodown in this city collapsed Wednesday evening. The toll may rise as many people are believed to be trapped under the debris. The incident happened during the peak hours of the evening.

An ODRAF team with fire brigade personnel rushed to the spot to carry out rescue operations. Cuttack DCP Prateek Singh and District Collector, Bhabani Shankar Chayani also reached the spot to supervise the work. Also present at the spot was CMC Commissioner Ananya Das.

Eyewitnesses said that the rescue team brought out three critically injured people and rushed them to the SCB Medical College and Hospital here. Two of the injured died while undergoing treatment, while the condition of the third is said to be very critical. The deceased were identified as Kartik Dehury and Ajit Dehury.

Singh informed that the deceased were contractual workers engaged in the renovation work of the bridge. "We will continue with the rescue operations to ensure that no one is left under the debris," the DCP said.

The ODRAF team has brought in

excavators to facilitate rescue work. As of now, no one has been able to correctly state the exact number of people trapped under the debris.

A large number of anxious faces were seen at the accident site as the ODRAF team worked at frenetic pace to bring out those, who may still be under the debris. Many

traders and vegetable vendors usually display and sell their wares on the bridge in the evening.

Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik while announcing ex-gratia for the kin of the deceased wished speedy recovery to the injured.

Chayani informed that an inquiry will be launched and action

will be taken against those found responsible behind the mishap. "It is unfortunate that this occurred during the renovation and expansion work of the Taladanda Canal road. All precautionary measures were in place. I will be able to say more only after completion of a probe," said Chayani.

# Engineer under Vigilance scanner

Assets to the tune of ₹7cr have been found in possession of Sethy who tried to prevent the sleuths from entering his house by locking the door

Berhampur, March 9: Different teams of vigilance sleuths conducted raids simultaneously on properties of Jagannath Sethy, working as an engineer in the Rural Works (Electrical) Department here in Ganjam district. The raids came following allegations that he had amassed wealth disproportionate

to his known source of income.

However, when the sleuths tried to enter two residences belonging to the engineer in Bhubaneswar and here, they met with stiff resistance. Sethy and his son locked themselves inside the houses. Despite repeated requests they did not open the door. The sleuths had no option but to break the doors to enter.

The Vigilance officials informed that the two did not facilitate the search after being informed about the warrants. They stated that appropriate legal action will be taken against the two for obstruction in lawful discharge of duties.

Till last reports came in, ₹19.88



lakh in cash was recovered from the house of Sethy. The searches were underway while the total value of his movable and immovable properties is yet to be

assessed, the officials said.

"Simultaneous searches are being conducted by five Vigilance teams led by an ASP four DSPs, 10 inspectors, and several other subordinate staff," SP of the anti-corruption agency Trilochan Swain informed. Raids were being carried out at five different places in Khurda and Ganjam districts, he added.

The five places where searches were conducted include three palatial residences and two offices.

"Raids will continue to detect all the movable and immovable assets of Sethy. Several documents have also been seized which are being scrutinized," said an official.

# Bail for Rajiv Gandhi killer after 30+ years

Perarivalan was arrested June 11, 1991. He was the man who had provided the 9-volt battery used in detonating the bomb which was used to assassinate the former prime minister

New Delhi, March 9: The Supreme Court granted bail Wednesday to AG Perarivalan who has been serving life sentence in the Rajiv Gandhi assassination case. The apex court took note of his long incarceration of over 30 years and no history of complaint when out on parole.

A bench comprising Justices L Nageswara Rao and BR Gavai directed the convict, whose death penalty was commuted into life term in 2014, to report to a local police station near Chennai in the first week of every month. It ordered

that the additional conditions for release would be decided by a local court there.

"There is no dispute regarding the fact that the applicant has undergone the sentence of more than 30 years. We are informed by the counsel for the applicant that he was released on parole thrice earlier and there was no complaint about his conduct during his release," the bench said in its order.

The bench considered the fact that Perarivalan has acquired educational qualifications and has been suffering ill health during incarceration. "Taking into account the fact that the applicant has already spent more than 30 years in prison, we are of the considered view that he is entitled to be released in on bail in spite of the vehement opposition of the ASG (additional solicitor general, who appeared for the Centre), subject to the final disposal of the SLPs (special leave petitions) here," the bench said.



The Supreme Court has been hearing pleas including the one in which Perarivalan sought suspension of his life sentence in the case till the CBI-led Multi-Disciplinary Monitoring Agency (MDMA) probe is completed.

The CBI, in its affidavit of November 20, 2020, had told the apex court that the Tamil Nadu Governor has to take a call on grant of remission to Perarivalan. Later, the governor referred the mercy plea to the President of India say-

ing he does not have the power to decide it.

Gandhi was assassinated on the night of May 21, 1991 at the Sriperumbudur in Tamil Nadu by a woman suicide bomber, identified as Dhanu, at a poll rally. Fourteen others, including Dhanu herself, were also killed.

In its May 1999 order, the top court had upheld the death sentence of four convicts - Perarivalan, Murugan, Santham and Nalini.

In April 2000, the Tamil Nadu Governor had commuted the death sentence of Nalini on the basis of the state government's recommendation and an appeal by former Congress president Sonia Gandhi.

The top court had commuted February 18, 2014 the death sentence of Perarivalan to life imprisonment, along with that of two other prisoners - Santham and Murugan - on the grounds of an 11-year delay in deciding their mercy pleas by the Centre.

Lucknow, March 9: Three officials were barred Wednesday from election duty in Uttar Pradesh, a day after the Samajwadi Party (SP) alleged that electronic voting machines were being shifted in an unauthorised manner. They were replaced on the directions of the Election Commission (EC).

The nodal officer for EVMs in Varanasi, a returning officer (RO) in Sonbhadra district and an election officer in Bareilly district have been pulled out from election duties, a day ahead of the counting of votes in UP, EC officials said.

Varanasi DM Kaushal Raj Sharma said Additional DM Nalini Kant Singh has been removed from election duty for negligence in EVM transportation. She has also been barred from going to the counting spot. Additional DM (Finance and Revenue) Sanjay Kumar has been made the nodal officer for EVMs.




## Five-day state level theatre fest Ranga Sangam kicks off

# We aim to sell at least 100 cars per month: Nanda

After completing his post graduation, he opted for specialised courses at Columbia University in the US. He started his career in a multinational soft drink company and subsequently, made investments in an infrastructure company in Singapore and a software firm in UK. In an interview to **Orissa POST**, Durgesh Motors Pvt Ltd's Managing Director **Debesh Prasad Nanda** speaks about his company's journey, business prospects and future plans. Excerpts:



- **How has been the journey of Durgesh Motors so far?**
- The journey of Durgesh Motors began in 2018. In addition to two Skoda showrooms in Cuttack and Bhubaneswar, we have opened showrooms in Sambalpur and Rourkela. During the initial days, we had Skoda Kushaq and Skoda Slavia models in the market. We were able to sell only 10-12 cars in a month as Odisha was a price sensitive market. Later, Skoda introduced affordable models as per customers' requirements. Skoda Kushaq has been receiving good response in the market. Now, we have a target to sell at least 100 cars per month. It was really challenging to raise our sales from 10 units to 100 units per month in three years. We are satisfied with our business.
- **What about Skoda's portfolio in Indian market?**
- Now, Skoda has five models in its portfolio. Skoda Superb caters to the luxury segment while Skoda Kodiaq is a good model in the SUV segment. Skoda has models for every segment of customers.
- **How did you meet customers' requirements during Covid-19?**
- Like all other businesses, we also faced lots of problems during the pandemic. There were certain problems with regard to semiconductors and chips. We were facing certain issues in the delivery of cars for six to eight months. The pandemic had created a panic among people. They were reluctant to use public transport. This had a positive impact on the auto sector. Many people purchased cars for safe travelling. As a social being, I am not happy with the trend but it has brought good opportunity to the sector.
- **Your advice to entrepreneurs in auto sector?**
- Automobile sector is not the same as mutual fund or stock market. Here, there is no scope for quick profits. This is a capital intensive sector and it also needs good infrastructure. One has to do hard work in auto sector to get success. Besides, he should have patience. You have to shape your business as per customers' requirements. One may take three-four years to get the fruits of

his labour.

- **Your future plans?**
- We are planning to open showrooms in south Odisha, including one at Jaipur.



# POLL PANEL SEEKS FOOLPROOF SECURITY FOR STRONG ROOMS

**Bhubaneswar, March 9:** The State Election Commission (SEC) has asked District Collectors to ensure foolproof security for strong rooms where EVMs will be stored during the ensuing elections to Urban Local Bodies (ULBs). In the SOP issued to all Collectors, the Commission said the strong rooms will have a double lock system with keys of each lock with two separate officers namely election officer & district treasury/sub-treasury. Armed police will be deployed for 24X7 security and CCTV cameras with Digital Video Recorder (DVR) will be installed from date of commissioning till completion of counting. Log books will be maintained for each entry and exit and duty roster and videography will be conducted at the time of the opening and closing of the strong room. Fire extinguishers will be installed both inside and outside of the strong room. Collectors have been instructed to inform candidates in writing, at least 24 hours in advance, about the date and time of opening and closure of strong rooms. Candidates or their authorized agents will be allowed to remain present during opening and closing of the strong room. Conduct of videography is mandatory for all such occasions, said the SEC.

In case of exigencies like natural calamities, if videography is not feasible, video of opening/closing of the strong room shall be made through mobile phones and footage stored for record. Each ULB will have three categories of strong rooms: for councillor/corporator, for chairperson/mayor and for the reserve EVMs. The SEC said strong rooms should be free from flood, water logging risk, cracks, leakage and broken window. "No other material whether election related or not (except the documents/ materials prescribed by the commission to be kept with polled EVMs) will be kept with the EVMs. Before storing the EVMs in the strong room, the district election officer will have to obtain a certificate from the authorities concerned to ensure the quality and physical aspects of the strong

rooms and the certificate is to be kept on record for future reference," said the SOP. The commission also asked the DMs to intimate contesting candidates 24 hours in advance to remain present or depute their agents for watching the security arrangements of the strong room and allow them to stay outside the inner perimeter on the day of counting. After completion of the counting of votes, CUs will be sealed and shifted to strong rooms of treasury, sub-treasury and safe custody. The CUs to be kept safely in strong rooms as above during the election period, 45 days from the date of counting of votes and declaration of results. The ballot units (BUs) will be kept in another room in safe custody. The urban poll will be held March 24 and the result will be out March 26.

## SELF-DEFENSE TRAINING FOR GIRLS RESCHEDULED

**Bhubaneswar, March 9:** After colleges and universities in the state were asked to cancel their examinations from March 22 and 24 due to overlapping of urban local bodies elections, the higher education department has now rescheduled the self defense training programme for girl students. The election coincides with self defense training programme to be held from March 21 to March 27 in Jharsuguda, Sambalpur and Sundargarh districts. In view of the above, the training programme is shifted to May 4 to 10, 2022. The higher education department Tuesday directed all colleges and state public universities to not schedule any examination from March 22, 2022 to March 24, 2022 because of elections to ULBs.

# State gets first human milk bank at City hosp

The facility as part of an initiative by the National Health Mission (NHM) was inaugurated at the paediatric ward of the Capital Hospital. Mothers' milk will be stored in the facility and supplied to hospitals across the state when the need arises, said Capital Hospital Director Dr Laxmidhar Sahu. "Breast milk is an elixir for newborns. However, some mothers are unable to breastfeed their babies in the initial few weeks due to various reasons. In such situations, newborns suffer. This human milk bank will prove to be a boon in such cases," Sahu elaborated. The authorities of the health facility would launch a campaign to encourage mothers to come forward for donating milk. This is the 32nd comprehensive lactation management centre in the country. The state government was considering opening such facilities at SCB Medical College and Hospital in Cuttack and the Capital Hospital here, sources said. Capital Hospital Deputy Superintendent Dr. Dhananjay Das said at least two lactating

# ONLY 7 PC SCHOOLS IN STATE HAVE ACCESS TO NET: REPORT

**New Delhi, March 9:** The Unified District Information System for Education Plus (UDISE+) 2020-21 report on school education released by the Union government Wednesday reveals that only 7 percent schools in Odisha have internet facility. According to the report, there are 64185 government, government aided and private unaided schools in Odisha. Out of them only 4660 schools have internet facility. The condition of government schools is worse in terms of internet facility as hardly 2.84 per cent government schools are equipped with internet facility. The condition is slightly better in private unaided schools in the state as 38.54 percent schools have internet facility. The report stated that there are 50,256

government, 5844 government aided, 6393 private unaided and 1692 other category schools in Odisha. Of them, 1428 government, 380 government aided, 2464 private unaided and 388 other category schools are equipped with internet facility. The report also highlighted another flip side of digital education in the state. It revealed that a meagre 19.74 percent schools in the state have computer facility

Here too the condition of government schools is worse at just 14.41 percent or 7244 schools have computer facility. However the functional computer facility is available in 7162 government schools. The Union Ministry of Education said that 39.7 lakh students of government aided, private school students were shifted to government schools during 2020-21 across the country.

# SC allows state's plea to file additional docs

A three-judge bench of the apex court headed by Justice DY Chandrachud also asked Odisha to file an affidavit within a week stating the reasons behind the delay in producing these documents

New Delhi, March 9: The Supreme Court Wednesday allowed an application of the state government to submit additional documents in the Vamsadhara water dispute which did not form part of the records submitted by the state before the Vamsadhara Water Dispute Tribunal.

A three-judge bench of the apex court headed by Justice DY Chandrachud also asked Odisha to file an affidavit within a week stating the reasons behind the delay in producing these documents. The apex court granted three weeks to Andhra Pradesh to file its response on the application.

"Odisha has filed an application for the submission of additional documents which did not form part of the records before the water dispute tribunal. It has been stated that five out of the six documents pertain to Andhra Pradesh. In conformity with provisions of the

Supreme Court rules, a formal affidavit setting out the reasons why the documents were not produced earlier would be filed in a week," the bench said.

During the hearing, senior advocate CS Vaidyanathan, appearing for Andhra Pradesh, told the court that Odisha has filed an application for submission of additional documents in the water dispute. He argued that the apex court should dispose the application before commencing final hearing in the matter.

Senior advocate Gopal Subramaniam, appearing for Odisha, submitted that he has been instructed to plead the court for the application. He submitted that five of the six documents were written by Andhra Pradesh.

Asserting the significance of the documents, Odisha's counsel submitted that the new papers corroborate sufficiently the points which have been raised before the

water dispute tribunal. "As per the agreement, around 106 acres in Odisha were supposed to get submerged due to the project. The second point is that the computation of distance of 3 km must be from the barrage upstream," submitted Subramaniam.

Notably, Odisha had filed three petitions in the SC challenging the order of Vamsadhara Water Dispute Tribunal and also opposed the joint survey of the Neradi barrage as directed by the tribunal.

In June 2021, the tribunal had permitted Andhra Pradesh to construct the Neradi barrage across the river with ancillary structures. The tribunal had said the barrage can have a Right Head Sluice (RHS) of 8,000 cusec of design capacity for meeting the requirements of AP and have a Left Head Sluice (LHS) to cater to the requirements of Odisha below the Neradi barrage. The cost of LHS is to be borne by Odisha, said the tribunal.

The tribunal had ruled that when there is shortage of water in a particular year, sharing of water should be proportionately reduced. When there is an increase in water availability, it is to be increased proportionately. The distress sharing formula for the river basin is to be applicable for total utilisation by each state.

Aggrieved by this, Odisha had filed another special leave petition in the apex court against the order of the tribunal.

# Bihar mason killed over illicit affair: Cuttack DCP

Cuttack, March 9: Blowing the lid off the sensational murder of a mason on Mahanadi riverbed near Bhuasuni Peetha under Bidanasi police limits here earlier this month, the twin city Commissionerate Police Wednesday claimed that the 28-year-old from Bihar was killed over an extra-marital affair.

Addressing the media, Cuttack deputy commissioner of police (DCP) Prateek Singh said two persons— Munnilal Sharma and Kailash— have been arrested and a search is on to nab Pankaj Yadav.

The DCP said Azad Yadav, the victim, had come to Cuttack to meet Munnilal in Chauhagan area here and collect some dues from him. However, he later went missing and one of his relatives lodged a missing person's complaint with Saheed Nagar police in Bhubaneswar February 26. Later, his blood stained body was recovered from Mahanadi riverbed near Bhuasuni Peetha under Bidanasi police limits.

Since Munnilal was absconding after the incident, police suspected his involvement in the case and launched a manhunt to trace him. Acting on a tip-off, police swung into action and arrested Munnilal from Badambadi bus stand area. During interrogation, he confessed to the crime, the DCP said.

Azad had developed an illicit affair with Pankaj's wife and had even taken her to Bihar last year. After learning their illicit relationship, the village administration there held a meeting and asked the duo to return to Odisha. Pankaj had held a grudge against

Azad. He cracked a deal with Munnilal for killing Azad in exchange for Rs 40,000. Pankaj gave Rs 20,000 in advance and promised to pay the remaining amount after execution of the murder, said the DCP, adding that Munnilal, in turn, hired Kailash to commit the crime.

"Munnilal called Azad and asked him to meet him in Cuttack for clearance of dues. The two later sat at a place near Bhuasuni Peetha to booze. Munnilal attacked him with a broken liquor bottle. Though Azad tried to flee, the accused chased him and later stoned him to death," the DCP added.

# 128 new Covid cases, 1 death

Bhubaneswar, March 9: Odisha recorded 128 new coronavirus cases Wednesday, while another patient succumbed to the pathogen, the Health Department said.

The daily positivity rate was 0.28 per cent and 25 children were among the newly infected, it said, adding that 45,776 samples were tested in the past 24 hours, a bulletin stated.

Out of the total 128 new infections, 75 were reported from quarantine centres while 53 persons contracted the virus locally. The state had logged 108 infections and zero death Tuesday.

With another fatality in Puri, the Covid toll in the state rose to 9,102. Fifty-three other coronavirus patients have died due to comorbidities so far, according to data.

There are 1,110 active COVID-19 cases, while Keonjhar district has no coronavirus patient at present. The tally rose to 12,86,245 including 12,75,900 recoveries as 213 patients recovered in the previous day, it added.

# About 85 crore across globe suffer from kidney disease, say experts

About 85 crore people across the globe have kidney disease. Based on rough estimation, Postgraduate Institute of Medical Education and Research (PGIMER) says about 10 crore people have chronic kidney disease (irreversible kidney failure) in India.

On the eve of World Kidney Day, whose theme is "Bridge the knowledge gap to better kidney care", the hospital says among those with kidney disease, about three lakh patients progress to end-stage kidney disease every year in India, which implies requirement of either dialysis or kidney transplant.

While the government has stepped in recently to provide aid in the form of the Pradhan Mantri National Dialysis Programme, the cost of dialysis or kidney transplant has been prohibitive to most sections of society. Hence, the focus should be on prevention, early detection, and retardation of progression of kidney disease to better kidney care.

PGI's Department of Nephrology has tried to extend public awareness about kidney diseases by addressing some commonly encountered queries.

Should every adult get tested for kidney disease or are there any specific high-risk group who should get tested?

A doctor at the PGI said: "Not



every adult needs to get tested for kidney disease. There are certain high-risk group of people who should get tested on the detection of the risk, such as diabetes mellitus, hypertension and renal stone disease."

Experts told IANS that time-tested ayurvedic herbs like Punarnava, Gokhuru and Varuna can be saviour for patients with chronic kidney disease (CKD) which are on rise due to various reasons.

K.N. Dwivedi, Dean, Faculty of Ayurveda, Banaras Hindu University (BHU), says the herbs are life-saver as they can help rejuvenate the cells of the damaged kidney.

"NEERI-KFT is one such ayurvedic drug based on kidney-friendly medicinal plants like Punarnava, Ashwagandha and Guduchi having anti-oxidants prop-

erties." While the well-known diuretic herbs like Varuna is a good blood purifier that helps maintaining homeostasis, Gokhuru is beneficial in rejuvenating kidney's nephrons, Dwivedi said, adding several patients have found such formulations beneficial.

He said if detected properly and in time, CKD can be cured with the help of extracts from these identified herbs.

More the delay in detection, the longer is the treatment, he warned. "When detected early, the dialysis cycle can be brought down with the help of the poly-herbal formulation which helps in strengthening the kidney," he explained.

Developed by AIMIL Pharmaceuticals after intensive research, benefits of NEERI-KFT in managing CKD, have been mentioned in studies published in journals like Saudi Journal of Biological Sciences.

"If the ayurvedic formulation is prescribed in early stages of the CKD, the kidney can be saved from getting damaged. Its usage has been found to be reducing levels of creatinine, urea and uric acid," Dwivedi said.

# SHGs to distribute PDS items in Kotia

The move will benefit over 1,472 beneficiaries residing in Fatusineri, Doliamba, Harmandangi, Madkar, Barnanapadu, Kanadora and Salpuda villages under the panchayat.

Earlier, the beneficiaries used to trek 13 km on hilly roads every month to collect their rations from the panchayat office. Keeping the difficulties in mind, the block administration decided to enrol the women SHGs in distribution of PDS items which will also help the latter in earning a livelihood. Supplies assistant Reena Khil conducted the meeting, the reports added.

# Heatwave claims 489 in Dhenkanal in 20 yrs

Admin braces for a scorching summer ahead; orders opening of control rooms from April 1 to June 10 this year



### Manual labourers have been advised not to work between 11am and 3pm in view of the likely heatwave conditions

**Dhenkanal, March 9:** As many as 489 persons have died due to extreme heatwave in Dhenkanal district during the last 20 years - from 1999 to 2019, a report said. The deaths are higher than that of Cuttack, Sambalpur, Khurda, Sundargarh, Balasore, Nayagarh, Ganjam and Jajpur districts during the period. The startling facts came to the fore during a meeting of the district-level disaster management committee held Tuesday to tackle possible heatwave conditions ahead of the upcoming summer. As per data, 11 persons have died of heatwave during 2018-19 and 2021-22 in Dhenkanal. Presiding over the meeting, district Collector Saroj Kumar Sethi

directed the departmental officials to bring down the death rate due to heatwave to zero and ensure drinking water facilities in water-starved areas of the district. The Collector stated that control rooms will be opened from April 1 to June 10 in the emergency departments of the district Collectorate, all block offices as well as all the head offices of the district to provide information on heatwave and upcoming natural disasters. All the block development officers (BDOs) have been asked to convene meetings by March 15, 2022 and ensure normalcy in drinking water supply, keep the multi-purpose cyclone shelters ready, carry out awareness drive on heatwave

through public address system, leaflets and posters. Discussions were also held on supply of drinking water through tankers, digging of new tube wells and repairing of defunct ones, establishment of drinking water kiosks in crowded places and prevention of forest fire. Manual labourers have been advised not to work between 11am and 3pm in view of the likely heatwave conditions. The regional transport officers were asked to ensure drinking water facilities in passenger buses. The chief district medical officer (CDMO) and other health officials have been asked to make arrangements for treatment of sunstroke victims.

# Math question paper leaked

**Kendrapara, March 9:** The Mathematics question paper and an answer sheet of summative assessment-4 for Class X students went viral on YouTube Wednesday, hours before the examination started in Kendrapara, a report said. Many guardians have expressed their displeasure over the alleged question paper leak. Former president of Odisha Secondary School Teachers' Association (OSSTA) Tapan Kumar Singh has demanded an investigation into the incident. He said the exam holds much sig-

nificance for students, adding that the Board of Secondary Education will evaluate the papers. Each assessment carries 20 marks out of 100 in each subject. Question paper leak will spoil the career of meritorious students. He demanded a probe into the matter by the district education department. District education officer Sanjib Kumar Singh said, "Question paper leak via YouTube has come to my notice, but it will not affect the examination, because smart phones are not allowed in examination centres." However, the matter will be investigated, he added.

# MAMITA MURDER Gobinda, Radhe produced in court

**Bolangir, March 9:** Prime accused in the sensational murder of Mahaling school teacher Mamita Meher; Gobinda Sahu and his aide Radheshyam Chandi were produced in the court of the additional district judge (ADJ) at Kantabanji in Bolangir, Wednesday. A few days ago, the murder case was shifted from Bangomunda JMFC court to Kantabanji ADJ court. Judicial trial of the case will be started soon. Police will then frame charges against the two accused at the ADJ

court. However, the date of the next hearing has not been fixed. It may be noted here that Mamita was missing since October 8, 2021. After investigation, it was learnt that Gobinda and Radheshyam were involved in the murder of Mamita. Gobinda had called Mamita to Mahaling area and later kidnapped her in his car from Chandotora Chhakh after she came in a bus. Mamita was strangled to death in Gobinda's car. The body was burnt at Mahaling stadium ground and mortal remains were buried there.

# MAN GETS 7-YEAR JAIL FOR RAPE

**Baripada:** A court in Mayurbhanj district Wednesday sentenced a 20-year-old man to seven years of imprisonment for raping a married woman three years ago. Baripada fast-track special court judge Durga Charan Mishra directed the District Legal Services Authority to pay Rs 5 lakh to the 24-year-old rape survivor as compensation. On June 26, 2019, Jagannath Purty raped the woman when she was alone in her house at a village in Bangriposhi block. The victim later disclosed the incident to her husband when he arrived. The judgement was based on the woman's statement, medical report and statements of 19 witnesses, special public prosecutor Manoranjan Pattnaik said.

plant in Bangladesh funded by India environmentally sustainable project? India must demonstrate soon that its funds are for environment-friendly projects.

Over the years, India's development assistance, implemented by the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) in the form of projects, grants and loans, and several training programmes, has reached many countries covering Asia, Africa, and South America. Since its Independence, India has extended USD 107 billion to developing countries, including a USD 22 billion lines of credits in the last eight years. Bangladesh has received nearly USD 7.8 billion lines of credit from its neighbour since 2001.

In the competition for providing funds to establish, endure and enlarge the sphere of influence or elbowing out other sources of funds, the potential funders must not ignore this set of rules of sustainable finance. Meanwhile, India has already pronounced its intent of a progressive development partnership aiming at China during the India-Central Asia dialogue last December.

India cannot match China's (authoritarian regime) heft in development finance, but it has leverage as a democratic partner. India focuses on reliable, mutually agreed and accountable, transparent, sustainable, human-centric, co-created, unconditional developmental projects with partner countries instead of aggressive, unaccountable, infrastructure-led high risk, non-participatory and duping into debt type developmental projects by others.

While India is talking to like-minded bilateral agencies like Germany and Quad partners on a progressive instrument of financing external developmental projects, it's not surprising to see a new MDB as Quad Development Bank in the near future to counter China's basket of money juggernaut. With technological know-how and finance, India can lead a progressive development partnership with like-minded friendly countries to fill in the gaps in trillion-dollar development finance.

During the Munich Security Conference (MSC) 2022 at Munich February 19, the Bangladesh Foreign Minister AK Abdul Momen in the audience asked the panellists on how to choose foreign funding for development. In response, Indian Foreign Minister S. Jaishankar, as a panellist, advised his counterpart to choose wisely sustainable financing. While thanking Japan and India for their help, the minister raised a valid catch 22 question, though not a new query from Bangladesh, as to what to do if China is coming with a "basket of money with aggressive but affordable proposals."

If Bangladesh is trying to put on a theatre of competition, in that case, it seems that India has come forward to set the rules of the international development finance. The Indian Foreign Minister suggested that the country must choose the resources through informed and competitive decisions to avoid commercially unviable, unsustainable and debt-ridden projects.

However, the rules for sustainable development finance are beyond and above these limited but major criteria. Arguably, the set of rules must base on the fundamental premise of an informed decision. Transparency and mutual accountability are the two pillars of informed decision-making. Sharing information related to potential developmental projects in the public domain at the very initial stage is a major transparency requirement. Informed decisions are not confined to concerned ministerial decisions only. Citizens of both recipient and investor countries need to be considered when informed decisions are being made. Are there any such avenues or mechanisms either in India or Bangladesh?

Having said that, neither any World Bank Group's project nor Asian Development Bank's (ADB) project nor any project funded by bilateral agencies has been approved through citizens' participation of investor and recipient countries so far. A new instrument must be placed at both bilateral and multilateral development banks (MDBs) to include citizens' participation while approving projects as a pointer to

raising the bar of global governance. One can take inspiration from the Green Climate Fund (GCF) for approving climate-related projects through civil society participation.

Another set of premises is to avoid commercially nonviable infrastructure projects, unsustainable projects and projects that attract long-term debt or fall into a debt trap. Though, not all commercially viable projects are socially and environmentally sustainable. Most of the privatised urban drinking water projects are unable to fulfil the apprehensions of the urban poor. Millions are campaigning and advocating against the private takeover of public goods in major cities of the world.

However, the Indian Foreign Minister suggested avoiding infrastructure projects like seaports and airports that are neither commercially viable nor economically sustainable. This is a clear but indirect reference to Chinese investment in Hambantota Port in Sri Lanka and the Entebbe International Airport in Uganda. Such investments are affordable but

aggressive as countries draw into a debt trap. Many countries like Kenya, Pakistan, Myanmar, Sri Lanka and Djibouti, in which China is constructing seaports, are already indebted to China. These investments are questioning the indestructibility of the country's sovereignty, as in the case of Sri Lanka.

It must be noted that developmental aid is no charity. Even, the so-called grants are not charity. It is cloaked with investors' inherent interest despite the best intentions of extending assistance in the infrastructure development of recipient countries. Projects will have strings attached to them. If Bangladesh wants easy money without strings attached to it but that questions its sovereignty, impacts the environment and is not accountable to its citizens, this would be an injustice to the aspirations of the youth of Bangladesh.

Last but not least, the projects must be socially and environmentally sustainable. This is a vital criterion that all developmental finance should aim to address post-war mal-development. Is Rampal ultra-supercritical power

## The Lasting Harm

Determining how to balance COVID-19 risks in schools around the world has been tricky. While US school leaders are currently debating whether students should be required to wear face masks, schools in Uganda recently reopened for the first time since the pandemic began. But although students in poorer countries have suffered more severe disruption, with schools closed for twice as long as in rich countries and sparse opportunities for remote learning, the current global cohort of schoolchildren will be adversely affected for decades to come. Without urgent action, the economic cost alone of school closures will be in the trillions of dollars.

Getting students back into the classroom has been critically important, but we still need immediate and targeted action to reduce learning losses. In addition, policymakers need to reflect on the tradeoffs they have made (such as keeping bars and restaurants open while shutting students out of school), account for the cost of these decisions, and establish practices and policies for managing future COVID-19 waves or the next pandemic.

During the past year, we worked with a global group of researchers to gather evidence about the pandemic's impact on children's education, and to identify the best ways to repair the damage. Unusually, our panel comprised researchers working on low-, middle-, and high-income countries, and included economists, psychologists, and education specialists. Despite the diversity of our expertise, the lessons we drew were starkly similar.

We found that, around the world, children returned to school following pandemic-induced closures with learning levels below those typical for their age. Studies show large learning losses, from one-third of a year in Ohio to a full year in Karnataka, India. This is worrisome, because evidence suggests that once students fall behind the curriculum, they find it difficult to catch up without additional support. Moreover, disruptions to learning can lead students to drop out of school altogether. In Sierra Leone in the aftermath of Ebola, 17% of girls never re-enrolled once schools reopened, turning a short-term shock into a permanent one.

Much shorter school closures in the past have been shown to reduce children's learning. In the United States, poorer students tend to slip back each summer when schools close for a couple months. In northern Pakistan, four years after a 2005 earthquake led to temporary school closures, students were one and a half years behind their peers.

Using the relationship between schooling and earnings as a guide, researchers estimate that the COVID-19 school closures thus far could result in \$17 trillion in lost lifetime earnings. Further closures in 2022 would increase this figure.

What can we do? The top priority must be to keep schools open. The cost of school closures is unacceptably high, and it is likely to be much longer-lasting than the cost of shutdowns in other sectors of the economy.

The evidence suggests that COVID-19 mitigation measures – including wearing quality masks, vaccinating teachers and eligible students, and providing as much ventilation as possible – can reduce the risk of transmission in schools. With such measures in place, the chance of catching COVID-19 at school is much lower than in most other environments, especially restaurants and bars, where masking is not possible.

But while schools may have reopened, that does not mean business as usual. COVID-19 disruption has aggravated existing education inequalities, making teaching and learning more difficult. That is why schools must first assess just how badly the disruption has hurt students' learning. School districts then need to allow teachers to adjust instruction to reflect where children are in their learning, not where one might hope they are. This has been one of the main lessons from recent education research. Applying this approach to high-school students in Chicago resulted in a 20% jump in their test scores, and in Uttar Pradesh, India, the number of children who could read a paragraph or story doubled.

To do this, teachers will need support. They now face classrooms with an even wider range of learning outcomes than before, and many must navigate new challenges such as simultaneously juggling remote and in-person teaching. Research shows that providing guided lesson plans can be a cost-effective way to improve learning outcomes. And dozens of studies in high- and low-income countries have shown that individual or small-group tutoring for struggling students boosts scores.

Finally, we should capitalize on some of the innovative education gains that occurred during the pandemic. Across the US, many parents who normally had little interaction with school suddenly had to help their children with online lessons. While this level of involvement is unsustainable over the long term, experiments in France and Chile have shown that children benefit when their parents are more connected to their schools. In Botswana, illiteracy declined by 31% in school districts that stayed in touch with parents and children through text messages and phone calls when schools were closed.

While the pandemic has greatly damaged students' learning, urgent, large-scale, and effective action by governments and education leaders could stem the tide. Without such intervention, the current level of learning loss caused by school disruptions will lead to trillions of dollars of lost productivity. And new crises are bound to arise. Establishing systems now to keep schools open in such circumstances will help protect our children and our future.

**Semordnilap**  
This is a close relative of the palindrome, a string of letters that reads the same backwards as forwards ("Madam, I'm Adam"; "A man, a plan, a canal: Panama!"; "Was it a car or a cat I saw?"). In a semordnilap the text is likewise reversed but it must turn into something different. For example, if you reverse "diaper" you get "repaid", and if you invert "desserts" the word "stressed" appears. A more complicated example is "deliver no evil", but you can probably invent better ones for yourself. As semordnilap is palindromes written backwards, it's a self-referential word, one that encapsulates within itself the thing it represents. You could hardly say that it's common, but many earnest palindromists have accidentally discovered it, and it has some small circulation among word wizards and elsewhere. ## Work from office back as new normal

I wasn't taken in by a recent announcement. The trending news of some top-notch IT companies recalling their employees to offices! Microsoft declared it in one of its company blog posts. Cognizant is planning to throw ajar its office premises, voluntarily for its staff, from April. Infosys, where most of the workforce has been working remotely since the COVID-19 pandemic surfaced, will see a larger proportion of its staff returning to offices. The buzz is that it's back to work from office (WFO) for the IT companies.

In the new normal, offices will be pulsating again, bustling with our colleagues. But this is a phenomenon I have always lived with. I couldn't imagine any other work mode save WFO. It was only for a brief spell after the pandemic struck in 2020 that I took solace in my home office. But I was quick to revert to my office space - that's where I have lived my entrepreneurial journey and turbocharged my cohorts.

Now, let's veer to how WFO will pan out for IT companies. Will it be the same as the pre-pandemic

days? Companies are split on how they will resume full-fledged office work. But there is near unanimity that the hybrid, flexi work mode will be on. WFO will not be wholly the same as the old normal. Companies can't coerce their people to WFO. The Great Resignation isn't an illusion. The spate of resignations and four million adding up to this phenomenon each month in the US are testimony to its impact on employers. The phenomenon of The Great Resignation has caught up with Indian workplaces too. If not a tidal wave, our technology companies are witness to an exodus of people quitting. The drop-out rate for some of the top IT companies has hit the peak over the past few months. That's possibly a prime reason why they are offering the flexi working mode to their workforce even as they recall them to offices.

The counterpoint is the scenario where WFO is anything but avoidable. Say, for example, client-facing employees, projects mandating high security, client demo, high interdependence or Programme

Increment Planning. In each of these roles or portfolios, office presence is critical. The office ecosystem has built a culture of collaboration and bonding which can't be replicated in remote working even with the best of technologies at play. For tech leaders of my ilk who have created this culture, imagining any other mode isn't sustainable. When you are not checking into the office for long, you are divorced from its rituals and ceremonies and you have little or no face-to-face interactions. And, how do you integrate new hires with your existing employees and create the rhythm for synergic growth? In an office-centric work model, employees imbibe culture much like a duck takes to water. However, in a remote-driven culture, this culture transmission is a big challenge.

In the same vein, I have nothing to undermine the merits of work from home (WFH). There are documented results to validate the success of the remote working model. The IT sector performed creditably even though a majoritarian pool of human resources was forced to stay at home because

of recurring waves of COVID. Apologists of the WFH model point out some legit reasons - the dread of the viral infections, long hours in round trip commutes, and of course, work-life harmony. I believe a more realistic model is hybrid work where remote workers synergise with their office counterparts and complement efforts.

As we step on the WFO mode again, we need to realise that flexi work will define the future of our workplaces. The more autonomy an IT firm offers to its employee, the longer they will be able to retain her. The distributed workforce will reset the HR mix of IT companies. Another change that IT companies will have to adapt to is their perception of office space. More than work, offices will be the hub for collaborative spaces for remote workers to meet. Our IT ecosystem will juggle WFO with WFH in the next normal. A lot like what we have been wont to for the last two years.

# IED blast in Udhampur: 1 killed, 14 injured

**Jammu:** In a suspected terrorist act, one person was killed and 14 were injured when a low-intensity IED exploded outside a court complex in Udhampur district of Jammu region Wednesday, officials said. Jammu and Kashmir Director General of Police Dilbag Singh said preliminary investigation suggests it to be "an act of terrorists but we are investigating the case". The improvised explosive device (IED) blast took place around 1 pm in Slatia Chowk where fruit and vegetable vendors put up their carts. DGP Singh said Additional Director General of Police Mukesh Singh had visited the blast site, along with other top police officials, a team of the National Investigation Agency (NIA) and bomb disposal experts. "Preliminary examination suggests a low-intensity IED explosion, but a forensic and minute scrutiny will reveal more accurate facts," he said, adding that the 14 injured were now out of danger.

# Naravane holds talks with Australian counterpart

**New Delhi:** Army Chief Gen MM Naravane Wednesday held wide-ranging talks with his Australian counterpart Lt Gen Rick Burr on ways to further deepen bilateral military cooperation besides pressing global issues. It is learnt that the ongoing crisis in Ukraine figured in the talks. Lt Gen Burr is on a visit to India from March 8 to 11. "Interaction between both the Chiefs of the Army Staff was warm and cordial. Both Chiefs exchanged views on the current global situation and the situation in Indo-Pacific in addition to discussing measures for enhancing defence cooperation between both armies," the Army said. Earlier, the Australian Army chief laid a wreath at the National War Memorial and received a ceremonial guard of honour at the South Block lawns.

# Counting of votes in five states today

**New Delhi/Lucknow/Panaji, March 9:** Political parties were bracing for the assembly election results Thursday in the crucial state of Uttar Pradesh, Punjab and politically volatile Uttarakhand, Goa and Manipur, sending out feelers for possible post-poll tie-ups.

On the eve of the counting of votes, the Election Commission announced the removal of three officials, including the nodal officer for EVMs in Varanasi, after a massive controversy erupted over Samajwadi Party's allegation that electronic voting machines were being shifted in an unauthorised manner. The poll panel also deputed Delhi's Chief Electoral Officer as a special officer in Meerut and

the Bihar CEO in Varanasi, Prime Minister Narendra Modi's parliamentary seat, to supervise the counting of votes.

It is a high-stakes election in Uttar Pradesh for the BJP and the Modi government as the state sends the highest number of 80 MPs to Lok Sabha and the party's performance is expected to have a bearing on the next general election slated for 2024. Several exit polls have forecast a clear majority for the BJP in Uttar Pradesh and for the Aam Aadmi Party in Punjab, while predicting a hung assembly in Goa and a tight race between the BJP and the Congress in Uttarakhand. Except for Punjab, all other states were under the BJP. As the post-poll scenario could throw up surprises due to multi-cornered



contests, the parties have dispatched senior leaders to the states and were also wooing other parties to ensure that they get the better of their rival claimant in case outside support is needed to form a government.

The Congress has sent Karnataka Congress chief D K

Sivakumar as special observer to Goa and party general secretary Mukul Wasnik and Chhattisgarh Health Minister T S Singh Deo besides Vincent Pala to Manipur.

The party had lost the race for government formation in the two states in 2017 despite emerging as the single largest party.


# CABINET NOD TO SPV FOR MONETISATION OF SURPLUS LAND

**New Delhi:** The Union Cabinet Wednesday approved creating a new company to hold and monetise surplus land and buildings of government agencies and PSUs that are being privatised or being shut down. The special purpose vehicle (SPV) called the National Land Monetisation Corporation (NLMC) will be set up as a wholly-owned Government of India company with an initial authorised share capital of Rs 5,000 crore and paid-up share capital of Rs 150 crore, an official statement said. "NLMC will undertake monetization of surplus land and building assets of Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs) and other government agencies," it said.

The genetic fund of our nation is reliably protected. We join the men and the Ukrainian army. We will destroy the enemy on every inch of Ukrainian land in every city, every village, forest and field. For every child, woman, old man, ruined house, street, even barn, we will shoot you like rabid dogs. Glory to Ukraine! Death to enemies!"



## Girl sings 'Let it go' in bomb shelter

A Ukrainian girl is winning the hearts of people across the world with her rendition of "Let It Go" from Disney's 'Frozen'. The girl presented the inspiring song to a group of people in a bomb shelter, who gathered there to save themselves from the Ukraine war. Since being posted Sunday, the song has been viewed more than 15 million times. It has also caught the attention of 'Frozen' star Idina Menzel, who gave voice to Elsa in the 2013 movie. "We see you. We really, really see you," Menzel tweeted in response to the video. The girl starts singing at the encouragement of people in the bomb shelter, who are off-camera. The crowd in the bunker falls silent as she sings the first few lines of the song.



## A 'terrible dream' for Ukrainian women

**Zahony (Hungary), March 9:** On International Women's Day, the global celebration of women, many fleeing Ukraine felt only the stress of finding a new life for their children as husbands, brothers and fathers stayed behind to defend their country from Russia's invasion.

Polina Shulga tried to ease the journey for her 3-year-old daughter by hiding the truth. "Of course it's hard to travel with a child, but I explained to her that we're going on vacation and that we'll definitely come home one day when the war is over," Shulga said.

She didn't know what would come next after arriving in Hungary from Ukraine's capital, Kyiv, but believed the experience would make her stronger. "I feel like I'm responsible for my child, so it was easier for me to take this step and leave," she said, as her little girl tugged at the hem of her coat.

Nataliya Grigoriyovna Levchinka, from Donetsk in eastern Ukraine, felt much the same.

"I'm generally in some kind of a terrible dream which keeps going on," the retired teacher said. "I would be in some kind of abstraction if it wasn't for my daughter. I wouldn't be able to come to my senses."

A decree by Ukraine's government that prohibits men aged 18 to 60 from leaving the country means that most of those fleeing are women and children, though the UN doesn't have exact numbers on gender.

Ukraine's policy is meant to encourage men to sign up to fight against Russia's invasion or to keep them available for military conscription.



That has led to heartbreaking scenes of separation, along

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy spoke of International Women's Day, which is normally a day for celebration in Ukraine, in a video address.

Women normally receive flowers and chocolates and kisses and speeches. But this time, the messages were tinged with sorrow and pleas for peace.

## First Lady condemns Russian 'mass murder'

The First Lady of Ukraine, Olena Zelenska, Tuesday condemned the Kremlin's "mass murder" of civilians, including children, in an open letter to the global media on the Russian invasion. In a passionate statement, Zelenska said that Russia's invasion of Ukraine was impossible to believe. "On February 24th, we all woke up to the announcement of a Russian invasion," she wrote. "Tanks crossed the Ukrainian border, planes entered our airspace, missile launchers surrounded our cities." "Despite assurances from Kremlin-backed propaganda outlets, who call this a 'special operation' -- it is, in fact, the mass murder of Ukrainian civilians." She singled out the child casualties as "perhaps the most terrifying and devastating", naming several of those killed. "When Russia says that it is 'not waging war against civilians', I call out the names of these murdered children first," she said.



## Radiation leak risk after power cut at Chernobyl N-plant

Ukraine said Wednesday there was a danger of a radiation leak at the Chernobyl nuclear power station after electricity was cut off to the plant, but the UN nuclear watchdog IAEA saw "no critical impact on security". State-run nuclear company Energoatom said a high-voltage power line had been damaged during fighting between Ukrainian troops and Russian forces who are occupying the defunct plant, and that it had been cut off from the national power grid. It said "radioactive substances" could eventually be released, threatening other parts of Ukraine and Europe, if there was no power to cool spent nuclear fuel stored at the plant that suffered the world's worst nuclear accident in 1986. Energoatom said there were about 20,000 spent fuel assemblies at Chernobyl that could not be kept cool amid a power outage. The radioactive cloud could be carried by wind to other regions of Ukraine, Belarus, Russia, and Europe.

## EU says reports of biolabs likely disinformation

The European Union said Wednesday it doubted the credibility of Russian government claims it had uncovered a military biological programme in Ukraine, saying that Moscow had a history of spreading disinformation about biological weapons. "The credibility of information provided by Kremlin is in general very doubtful and low," EU foreign affairs spokesman Peter Stano said. "Russian disinformation has a track record of promoting manipulative narratives about biological weapons and alleged 'secret labs'," he said, adding that the EU was not aware of any Ukrainian laboratories not in line with international law. Russia demanded Wednesday that the United States explain to the world why it had supported what Moscow cast as a military biological programme in Ukraine.

## Kremlin tells US to await its response to 'economic war'

**London, March 9:** The Kremlin accused the United States Wednesday of declaring an economic war on Russia that was sowing mayhem through energy markets, and put Washington on notice it was considering its response to a ban on Russian oil and energy.

Russia's economy is facing the gravest crisis since the 1991 fall of the Soviet Union after the West imposed heavy sanctions on almost the entire Russian financial and corporate system following Moscow's invasion of Ukraine.

Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov cast the West's sanctions as a hostile act that had roiled global markets and he said it was unclear how far turbulence on global en-



ergy markets would go.

"You see the bacchanalia, the hostile bacchanalia, which the West has sown - and that of course makes the situation very difficult and forces us to think seriously," Peskov told reporters.

"We see that the situation on energy markets is developing rather turbulently - and we don't know how far

that turbulence will go," Peskov said.

He declined to outline the exact nature of Russia's response. President Vladimir Putin, Russia's paramount leader since 1999, will hold a meeting with the government Thursday to discuss minimising the impact of sanctions, the Kremlin said.

The West's attempt to cut off Russia - one of the world's biggest exporters of oil, gas and metals - has hit commodity markets and raised the spectre of spiralling inflation across the world.

Russian President Vladimir Putin says the "special military operation" is essential to ensure Russian security after the United States enlarged the NATO military alliance to Russia's borders and supported pro-Western leaders in Kyiv.

## Children's hospital bombed: Ukraine

**Lviv:** Ukraine accused Russia Wednesday of bombing a children's hospital in the besieged port of Mariupol during an agreed ceasefire to enable civilians trapped in the city to escape.

Russia had said it would hold fire to let thousands of civilians flee Mariupol and other besieged cities on Wednesday. But the city council said the hospital had been hit several times by an air strike.

"The destruction is colossal," it said in an online post. President Volodymyr Zelenskyy called it an "atrocious". "Direct strike of Russian troops at the maternity hospital. People, children are under the wreckage," he said on Twitter.

Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov, asked by Reuters for comment on the reported bombing, said: "Russian forces do not fire on civilian targets."

The Ukrainian Foreign Ministry posted video footage of what it said was the hospital showing holes where windows should have been in a three-storey building. Huge piles of smouldering rubble littered the scene. The Donetsk region's governor said 17 people were wounded,

"Russia continues holding hostage over 400,000 people in Mariupol, blocks humanitarian aid and evacuation. Indiscriminate shelling continues," he wrote on Twitter. "Almost 3,000 newborn babies lack medicine and food."

Moscow launched what it calls a special military operation in Ukraine Feb 24 to destroy its neighbour's military capabilities and remove what it says are dangerous nationalists in Kyiv.

Ukraine and its allies call Russia's actions a brutal invasion that has killed hundreds of civilians and forced millions to flee abroad.

Kyiv has mostly been spared the heavy shelling that devastated parts of other urban centres including Kharkiv, Mariupol and Sumy, but Ukrainian forces are

bolstering defences in anticipation of a full assault.

Wednesday's concert was held on the vast square where thousands of Ukrainian protesters set up a tent city in 2013 and 2014 to oppose then-President Viktor Yanukovich's shock decision to suspend talks with the EU and revive ties with Moscow.

More than 100 protesters were killed in clashes with security forces, and in 2014 Yanukovich was toppled and forced to flee the country.

A decade earlier, the square had been a major gathering place for participants in the so-called Orange Revolution, which overturned a disputed election won by Yanukovich and led to the pro-Western leader Viktor Yushchenko taking his place.

### Sensex, Nifty soar over 2%

**Mumbai:** Extending the gains for a second day, key stock indices Sensex and Nifty jumped by more than 2 per cent Wednesday as oil and energy, financials and IT stocks advanced amid reports of diplomatic efforts to end Russia's attack on Ukraine. The benchmark BSE Sensex opened in the green and further jumped 1,469.64 points or 2.75 per cent to 54,893.73 during the day. It finally settled at 54,647.33, higher by 1,223.24 points or 2.29 per cent, notching up the biggest single-day gain since February 25. The broader Nifty of the NSE climbed 331.90 points or 2.07 per cent to end at 16,345.35 as 40 of its stocks advanced.

### Feb fuel demand rises 5.4% YoY

**New Delhi:** India's fuel demand rose 5.4% in February, compared with the same month last year, data from the Petroleum Planning and Analysis Cell (PPAC) of the oil ministry showed. Consumption of fuel, a proxy for oil demand, totalled 17.57 million tonne. Sales of gasoline, or petrol, were 3.2% higher from a year earlier at 2.55 million tonne.

### India, Canada CEPA talks from today

**New Delhi:** India and Canada Thursday will hold discussions on ways to strengthen economic ties and proposed free trade agreement between the two countries, the commerce ministry has said. Canadian International Trade Minister will be visiting India from March 10-13 to hold the fifth India-Canada Ministerial Dialogue on Trade and Investment (MDTI). The meeting will be co-chaired by Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal.

# India 2nd in global investment in digital shopping

**London, March 9:** India is the second-largest global venture capital investment hub for digital shopping companies, growing by a whopping 175 per cent from \$8 billion in 2020 to \$22 billion in 2021, according to an official analysis released here Wednesday. On a global scale, India came in second to the US last year, which attracted \$51 billion in investment, followed by China at third with \$14 billion and the UK at fourth with \$7 billion. Within India, Bangalore comes out on top globally with \$14 billion worth of Venture Capital (VC) in-

# FOOD CRISIS GROWS AS RISING PRICES SPARK EXPORT BANS

*The rise in prices comes at a time when affordability of food is a major challenge as economies seek to recover from the coronavirus crisis and is also helping to fuel a broader surge in inflation across the globe*

**London, March 9:** A global food crisis sparked by Russia's invasion of Ukraine escalated Wednesday as Indonesia tightened curbs on palm oil exports, adding to a growing list of key producing countries seeking to keep vital food supplies within their borders. The conflict in Ukraine is threatening global grain production, the supply of edible oils and fertiliser exports, sending basic commodity prices rocketing and mirroring the crisis in energy markets. Palm oil is the world's most widely used vegetable oil and is

used in the manufacture of many products including biscuits, margarine, laundry detergents and chocolate. Palm oil prices have risen by more than 50% this year. Indonesia's Trade Minister Muhammad Lufi said the export curbs aimed to ensure that cooking oil prices at home remain affordable to consumers.



Russia and Ukraine are also important suppliers of edible oils as well as contributing nearly 30% of global wheat exports. The conflict has not only disrupted shipments from the Black Sea region but is also jeopardising prospects for harvests as fertilizer prices soar and supplies shrink in response to a sharp rise in the cost of natural gas - a key component in the manufacturing process for many products. Malaysian palm oil futures rose to an all-time high following Indonesia's announcement while soybean oil prices jumped to a 14-year peak.

## India's wheat exports surge

**New Delhi:** India has signed contracts to export about 500,000 tonne of wheat in recent days, traders said, cashing in on a sharp rally in international prices and signalling a big uptick in overseas sales from the world's second biggest producer of the grain. After five consecutive record annual crops, India has large wheat inventories, and traders are keen to capitalise on any export opportunity. A high domestic price guaranteed by the government tends to deter exports unless world prices are high. India guarantees producers about \$257 a tonne for domestic sales, while benchmark European wheat jumped above 400 euros (\$435) Monday and benchmark wheat

The buyers, who are worried about supply disruptions from Ukraine and Russia, know that only India can be a big, steady supplier of wheat at this point of time, and that's why they have turned to India

prices in Chicago settled at their highest in 14 years. India is set to export a record 7 million tonne of wheat this year. India has sealed deals to export about 500,000 tonnes of wheat in recent days, he said. Two other traders, who also did not wish to be named, confirmed the figure.

## Ukraine bans export of wheat, oats and other food staples

**London:** Ukraine's government has banned the export of wheat, oats and other staples that are crucial for global food supplies as authorities try to ensure they can feed people during Russia's intensifying war. New rules on agricultural exports introduced this week also prohibit the export of millet, buckwheat, sugar, live cattle, and meat and other "byproducts" from cattle, according to a government announcement. The export ban is needed to prevent a "humanitarian crisis in Ukraine," stabilize the market and "meet the needs of the population in critical food products," Roman Leshchenko, Ukraine's minister of agrarian and food policy, said in a statement posted on the government website and his Facebook page. It's the latest sign that the Russia's invasion of Ukraine threatens the food supply and livelihoods of people in Europe, Africa and Asia who rely on the farmlands of the Black Sea region - known as the "breadbasket of the world." The export ban will likely reduce global food supplies just when prices are at their highest level since 2011.

## REPOSING FAITH Feb's equity MFs' net inflows rise

Equity mutual funds saw a net inflow of ₹14,888 crore in January and ₹25,077 crore in December

**New Delhi, March 9:** Equity mutual funds attracted a net sum of ₹19,705 crore in February, making it the 12th consecutive monthly net inflow, amid a highly volatile stock market environment due to the current geopolitical situation, data from the Association of Mutual Funds in India (Amfi) showed Wednesday. Equity schemes have been witnessing net inflow since March 2021 and the segment has received a net inflow of ₹1.45 lakh crore

during the period between March 2021 and February 2022 highlighting the positive sentiments among investors. Prior to this, such schemes had consistently witnessed outflows for eight months from July 2020 to February 2021 losing ₹46,791 crore. "The latest inflow is quite encouraging, amid the expected hardening of interest rates and current geopolitical situation," Ricky Kirpalani, lead sponsor, First Water Capital Fund (AIF), said. However, equity fund flows would have likely slowed down in March, given that the situation in Ukraine has continued to escalate. On the other hand, the postponing of the LIC IPO to the next fiscal year will also likely help limit March redemptions, he added.



Kavitha Krishnan, senior analyst (manager research) of Morningstar India, said that despite witnessing significant outflows from FPIs, domestic investors continue to use the market correction to invest in Indian equities. "Despite concerns over the growing oil prices and the conflicts between Russia and Ukraine, which have in turn impacted the com-

modities markets in India, the markets have been witnessing positive flows. The trend is indicative of the increasing investor interest and awareness around investing," she said. Overall, the mutual fund industry registered a net inflow of ₹31,533 crore in February, compared with a net inflow of ₹35,252 crore in the preceding month. The assets under management (AUM) of the industry slightly went down to ₹37.56 lakh crore at the end of February from ₹38.01 lakh crore at the January-end. Within the equity segment, interestingly all the categories saw net inflows. The flexi-cap fund category saw the highest net inflow of ₹3,873 crore, followed by thematic funds at ₹3,441 crore during the period under review.

## Bitcoin soars after Biden signs order on digital assets

**Washington, March 9:** Bitcoin soared Wednesday after President Joe Biden signed an executive order that requires US government agencies to assess the benefits and risks of creating a central bank digital dollar and other cryptocurrency issues. The executive order potentially expands the adoption of virtual currencies in the US financial system. Biden's order will require the Treasury Department, the Commerce Department and other key agencies to prepare reports on "the future of money" and the role cryptocurrencies will play. "With the recent sanctions regime in place as a result of the war in Ukraine, it is doubly imperative that we have a regulatory framework in place for digital assets that counters illicit finance, and prevent risks to financial stability and national security," said Michael Pierson, managing partner at law firm FisherBroyles. The White House last year said it was considering wide-ranging oversight of the cryptocurrency market - including an executive order - to deal with the growing threat of ransomware and other cyber crime. In midday trading, bitcoin rose 9.1% to \$42,280, on track for its largest percentage gain since Feb 28, while smaller peer ether, the coin linked to the Ethereum blockchain network, added 6.3% to \$2,740, also set for its best day this month. "At 21Shares, we've always believed that the best way to introduce and expose investors to crypto is through a safe and regulated approach," said Hany Rashwan, chief executive officer and co-founder of 21Shares, the world's largest provider of crypto exchange traded products. "Today's action will help the US establish itself as a leader in crypto for years to come." US exchange traded funds (ETFs) tracking bitcoin futures that gained regulatory approval late last year also jumped. US crypto miners that act as a proxy for moves in digital coins also advanced.

# LEWA'S NIGHT OUT

Poland international's record 11-minute hat-trick helps Bayern Munich demolish RB Salzburg 7-1 in the second leg of the Champions League Round of 16 match and seal a quarterfinal berth

**Munich, March 9:** Whatever hope RB Salzburg had of overcoming Bayern Munich was extinguished by Robert Lewandowski scoring a hat-trick in 11 minutes.

It was game over by the time Lewandowski's third hit the net in the 23rd minute Tuesday to make it the quickest treble ever seen at the start of a Champions League match.

A second leg that started at 1-1 was tilted 4-1 in Bayern's favor by the striker's scoring masterclass. An 8-2 aggregate win (7-1 in the second leg) to reach the quarterfinals was completed by further goals from Serge Gnabry, a double from Thomas Müller, and Leroy Sané. At least Salzburg avoided a complete humiliation of not scoring with Maurits Kjaergaard netting for the

Austrian team in Bavaria.

"That was a statement win," Bayern captain Manuel Neuer said. "I think we showed a different side of ourselves today and didn't concede as many chances on the break. We were also more stable in defense, which obviously gives us hope that things can continue in that vein."

It was three weeks ago when Bayern was reliant on a late equalizer from Kingsley Coman to avoid losing the first leg. After failing to score — or even hit the target in Salzburg — Lewandowski has now taken his season tally to 42 goals in all competitions.

It took only 12 minutes to score his first against Salzburg, from the penalty spot after being brought down by Maximilian Wober. The defender fouled him again and Lewandowski converted his penalty

again in the 21st.

The third came from open play, running onto Müller's pass and then knocking a shot past the advancing goalkeeper Philipp Köhn from the edge of the penalty area.

The previous quickest hat-trick from the start of a Champions League match came in 24 minutes from Marco Simone for AC Milan against Rosenborg in 1996.

"Today it was an opponent on a different level," Salzburg defender Rasmus Kristensen said. "We had some chances but if you don't make them count, it is difficult. We gave everything but it wasn't enough. It had nothing to do with attitude, focus or the match plan. They simply have been better in all aspects — that's it."

Coman seized the ball off Mohamed Camara to set up Gnabry

in the 31st to shoot under Kohn. Müller scored nine minutes into the second half before Kjaergaard struck a superb left-footed consolation for the knockout phase newcomer.

But Müller swept in his 52nd Champions League goal in the 83rd after exchanging passes with Lewandowski and Sané in the buildup.

The rout was completed with an assist from the striker who started it. Lewandowski back-heeled the ball for Sané to net the seventh in the 85th.

"Today we had the luck that was completely missing in Salzburg," Müller said. "We could have gone 1-0 down after five minutes. You're always a little dependent on situations like that, but overall we were better."

# Liverpool lose, but advance

**Liverpool, March 9:** Liverpool could cope with its first Anfield loss in a year to still overcome Inter Milan and reach the quarterfinals of the Champions League.

Leading 2-0 from the last-16 first leg in Italy, Lautaro Martinez's swerving shot that reduced the deficit in the 61st minute gave the Italian champions a hope of a comeback.

But within two minutes, Inter's task was made more difficult when Alexis Sanchez was sent off after his follow-through on Fabinho earned him a second booking.

Liverpool held on to lose 1-0 and advance 2-1 on aggregate. The 2019 Champions League winners are in the quarterfinals for the fourth time in five years despite its first loss in the competition this season. Liverpool had chances to level. Mohamed Salah volleyed against the post and Luis Diaz's close-range shot was deflected over by Arturo Vidal.

"We struggled in the beginning," Salah said. "We managed to hold the ball up more in the second half. The most important thing is we qualified. Hopefully we'll be better in the next game."

Inter went out with only the consolation of being the first team to win at Anfield since Fulham 366 days earlier. "The difficulties we had were pretty close to what I expected," Liverpool manager Jürgen Klopp told broadcaster BT Sport. "Inter are a really good side and set up for these kind of games. They are really fighters and I'm happy we don't play this type of team every week." Liverpool is still in contention for a quadruple after winning the League

Cup last month, then reaching the quarterfinals of the FA Cup and closing Manchester City's lead at the top of the Premier League to six points with a game in hand.

Inter's focus now returns to trying to catch AC Milan in Serie A, with two points to make up and a game in hand. "We did our best at Anfield," Inter coach Simone Inzaghi said. "And we come out of these two games as a better side, strengthened."

# JADEJA TOP AMONG ALL-ROUNDERS IN TEST

**Dubai, March 9:** India's Ravindra Jadeja climbed to the top spot in the ICC Test rankings for all-rounders Wednesday after his match-winning performance against Sri Lanka in the opening Test in Mohali.

"Ravindra Jadeja's performance at India's recent Test win against Sri Lanka in Mohali has catapulted him to the No.1 position in the MRF Tyres ICC Men's Test Player Rankings," the ICC said in a statement.

His unbeaten 175 lifted him up to 17 places from 54th to 37th with the bat and he added nine wickets to move up to 17th with the ball. His all-round contribution was enough for him to regain the top all-rounder spot from Jason Holder, who had held

the position since February 2021.

In the same list, Ravichandran Ashwin dropped a rung to third while Axar Patel was next best Indian at 14th, after going down two positions. Patel did not play the Mohali Test due to injury.

Among batters, Virat Kohli rose two spots to be fifth in the latest list, followed by India skipper Rohit Sharma static at sixth. Rishabh Pant, who impressed with an explosive 96-run knock in Mohali, entered the top 10 at 10th after gaining one spot. Australian Marnus Labuschagne occupied the top spot.

In the bowlers' chart, Ashwin was static at second, while Jasprit Bumrah was also unchanged at 10th. Pat Cummins led the pack, continuing his reign at the top.



# New Zealand challenge awaits eves

**Hamilton, March 9:** Having pummeled arch-rivals Pakistan in a lopsided lung-opener, India will face an infinitely tougher challenge in hosts New Zealand and would endeavour to put up an improved batting show in their second ICC Women's World Cup league stage game here Thursday.

The pitch at Hamilton's Seddon Park has been traditionally known as a batting belter and Mithali Raj and her team would like to put up a better show against Sophie Devine's White Ferns, who have had a great run in the recently concluded bilateral series.

More than the margin of the 1-4 defeat, it was the fact that Indians were outplayed in all departments must have been a cause of worry for head coach Ramesh Powar who has been trying out various combinations.

What looked like a cakewalk against a relatively weaker Pakistan side might not be possible against the New Zealanders, who have all bases covered.

In fact, the Indians have already learnt a harsh lesson in the preceding ODI series where they couldn't even defend totals of 270 and 280.

But Shafali Verma's return to form is something that the team management is looking forward to as senior pacer Jhulan Goswami said at the pre-match interaction.

In last seven games, including one practice match, there was only one



fifty and six low scores from her. "Shafali has already proved herself. She is a very exciting cricketer. But these things happen with every cricketer," Goswami said in a virtual press conference ahead of the game against New Zealand here Thursday.

"I am sure she is working hard really well in the nets, she is hitting the ball really well. She is just one big knock away and if she gets an opportunity, I am sure she is going to do well," she added.

Even skipper Mithali got stuck against Pakistan while

Harmanpreet Kaur, save for one half century in the inconsequential dead rubber against New Zealand, has been off the boil.

India's problems have been often compounded by their inability to rotate the strike in the middle overs leaving way too much for the slog overs where often they haven't had power hitters. Smriti Mandhana is the batting mainstay and a big score from her is what the 'Women in Blue' need Thursday.

India's biggest strength is their all-rounders — Deepti Sharma, Sneha Rana and Puja Vastrakar, who can convert a poor show into a bril-

liant final outcome.

However, against New Zealand, who have Devine, Suzie Bates, Amy Satherwaite and Amelia Kerr in their ranks, it won't be an easy job.

Goswami, who has been in terrific form over the past one year, needs support from the other end with a steady show from the likes of Meghna Singh and Vastrakar.

However, it will all boil down to how well the spinners — Rajeshwari Gayakwad, Rana and Deepti bowl against the New Zealanders. A good result will erase the nightmare of the recent ODI series.

# 'MANKADING' NO MORE UNFAIR PLAY

**London, March 9:** Custodian of cricket laws, the Marylebone Cricket Club (MCC), has decided to move the law relating to run-outs at non-striker's end from its "unfair play" section besides completely banning the use of saliva to shine the ball in amendments to its 2022 code that will come into effect in October.

Run-outs at non-striker's end when batters back up too far have often triggered heated debates on spirit of the game and several players like India's premier off-spinner Ravichandran Ashwin have advocated for it as a fair mode of dismissal.

"Law 41.16 — running out the non-striker — has been moved from Law 41 (Unfair play) to Law 38 (Run out). The wording of the Law remains the same," the MCC said in a media statement late on Tuesday.

It was in 1948 when the dismissal first came to be known.

Indian legend Vinoo Mankad ran out Australian wicketkeeper Bill Brown at the non-striker's end after duly warning him for backing up too far.

The Australian media dubbed it as 'Mankading', a name which stuck in popular parlance but was vehemently opposed by legends like Sunil Gavaskar for being "disrespectful" towards Mankad.

The MCC also said that using saliva to shine the ball would be treated as an unfair practice. Saliva application was barred by the ICC in view of the COVID-19 pandemic and MCC said its research found that applying saliva had no impact on the ball's movement.

The changes in the code, which first came into existence in 2017, were suggested by MCC Laws sub-committee "which were subsequently approved at the Club's Main Committee meeting last week." The amendments will not come into force until October.

## OTHER RECOMMENDED CHANGES

**Replacement players (Law 1):** The replacement players will be treated "as if they were the player they replaced, inheriting any sanctions or dismissals that player has done in that match."

**Batters returning when Caught (Law 18):** When a batter is out caught, the "new batter shall come in at the end the striker was at, i.e. To face the next ball (unless it is the end of an over)."

**Dead ball (Law 20.4.2.12):** The amendment suggests that the calling of Dead ball takes into account "if either side is disadvantaged by a person, animal or other object within the field of play."

**Bowler throwing at striker's end before delivery (Law 21.4):** "If a bowler throws the ball in an attempt to run out the striker before entering their delivery stride, it will now be Dead ball. This is an extremely rare scenario, which has until now been called as a No ball."

**Judging a Wide (Law 22.1):** The amendment takes into account movement of a batter before the ball is bowled. "It was felt unfair that a delivery might be

called 'Wide' if it passes where the batter had stood as the bowler entered his/her delivery stride. Therefore, a Wide will apply to where the batter is standing, where the striker has stood at any point since the bowler began their run up, and which would also have passed wide of the striker in a normal batting position."

**Striker's right to play the ball (Law 25.8):** "If the ball should land away from the pitch, the new Law allows the striker to play the ball so long as some part of their bat or person remains within the pitch. Should they venture beyond that, the umpire will call and signal Dead ball. As recompense to the batter, any ball which would force them to leave the pitch will also be called No ball."

**Unfair movement by fielding side (Laws 27.4 and 28.6):** "Until now, any member of the fielding side who moved unfairly, was punished only with a Dead ball... Given the action is both unfair and deliberate, it will now see the batting side awarded 5 Penalty runs."

# Djokovic in draw at Indian Wells

**Indian Wells, March 9:** Novak Djokovic was placed in the men's draw for the BNP Paribas Open, although it remains to be seen whether the second-ranked player will be allowed to enter the United States.

Djokovic isn't vaccinated against

COVID-19. The US requires visitors to be vaccinated to enter the country. Additionally, tournament officials have said everyone at Indian Wells must be fully vaccinated to be on site.

Djokovic's name was on the entry list when the men's draw was made Tuesday, so the five-time tournament champion was included. He

received a first-round bye and would play either David Goffin or Jordan Thompson in the second round.

"We are currently in communication with his team; however, it has not been determined if he will participate in the event by getting (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention) approval to enter the country," tournament officials said in a statement.

Djokovic's photo was included on a 'We Miss You' wall of players who are absent from Indian Wells. He last played at a tournament in Dubai last month, losing in the quarterfinals to Jiri Vesely. He was deported from Australia in January after his visa was canceled on the eve of the Australian Open.

Djokovic said a previous COVID-19 infection meant he was exempt from rules stating that all arriving visitors must be fully vaccinated. He was detained in an immigration facility before being ordered to leave.
