

STUDENT COLLAPSES DURING EXAM, DIES

Bonai: A student collapsed while writing the ongoing Plus II examination at Bonaigarh College in Sundargarh and was later declared dead, an official said Tuesday. The deceased was identified as Md Arbaz, a resident of Juniani village under Lahunipara police limits. The incident occurred when Arbaz was about to complete his MIL paper at the college. "With just 15 minutes left for the examination to finish, Arbaz suddenly collapsed in the hall. Arbaz was rushed to Bonai sub-divisional



hospital where doctors declared him brought dead," said an official. While no exact reason for his death was immediately known, doctors suspect it could be due to cardiac arrest, added the official.

Loknath temple servitor shot dead

Puri, May 24: A servitor of Loknath temple was shot dead over suspected previous enmity at Kakudikhai Square near Emar Mutt here Tuesday, an official said.

The deceased was identified as Shivaram Patra, 27, of Harachandi Taluchha Sahi in the Holy City.

According to eyewitnesses, Shivaram was on his way home on a motorcycle around 9pm when two bike-borne miscreants opened two rounds of fire on him, just 10 metres from the Srimandir's Lion Gate, leaving him critically wounded.

A few officials of Town police rushed a profusely bleeding Shivaram to the district headquarters hospital where the servitor was declared 'dead on arrival'. Puri Superintendent of Police

(SP) Kanwar Vishal Singh, who

reached the spot along with a forensic team to assess the situation, said on the basis of a complaint filed by Shivaram's family with Singhadwar police, a case (43/2022) has been registered and a 21-yearold youth has been detained.





OHRC for probe into youth tied to truck

Bhubaneswar, May 24: Taking suo motu cognizance, the Odisha Human Rights Commission (OHRC) Tuesday directed the Jagatsinghpur Superintendent of Police (SP) to investigate the alleged inhuman treatment meted out to a youth after he was caught stealing a mobile phone in Bhutamundai area of the district a few days ago

The OHRC directed the SP to submit the enquiry report within 15 days while posting the next hearing for June 17. The incident came to the fore after a

video purportedly featuring the inhuman treatment went viral on social media

According to sources, the incident



took place in Bhutamundai area along the Chandikhole-Paradip Road in Jagatsinghpur district.

A truck driver caught the youth while he was trying to flee the spot after stealing his mobile phone from the vehicle. In an act of punishment, the truck driver with the help of a few others tied the youth in front of the truck and garlanded him with slippers. Later, he drove

the truck for 15-20 minutes with the youth still tied to it," said a source.

They also beat the accused before setting him free, it was learnt. Locals, meanwhile, filmed the entire episode that was found doing the rounds on social media.

Bhubaneswar: May 24: Altogether 26 children have been diagnosed with the hand, foot and mouth disease (HFMD) in Odisha and their condition is stable, a health official said Tuesday.

Commonly known as 'tomato flu', the infectious disease is caused by intestinal viruses and occurs mostly in children. The illness is rare in adults as they usually have immune systems strong enough to defend them from the virus.

In most cases, the viral illness has symptoms like fever, painful sores in the mouth and rash with blisters on hands, feet and buttocks, according to the World Health Organisation (WHO).

Out of the 36 samples that were collected and tested in the Regional Medical Research Centre in Bhubaneswar, 26 were found to be

Bhubaneswar, May 24: The process for filing nominations for three Rajya Sabha seats in Odisha began Tuesday with the state Assembly secretariat issuing the notification for the poll to be held June 10.

The tenure of three Rajya Sabha MPs from Odisha - Nekkanti Bhaskar Rao. Prasanna Acharya and Sasmit Patra will end July 1 and arrangements have been made to conduct the polling before the expiry of their tenures. As per the notification, polling will be held from 9 am to 4 pm June 10 and counting of votes will take place at 5 pm the same day. The last date of filing nomination is May 31 and June 3 is the date for the withdrawal. The election process will be completed June 13, 2022

According to the notification, the by-election to the Rajya Sabha seat in the state which fell vacant due to the resignation of BJD's Subhas Singh after he becoming mayor of Cuttack Municipal Corporation will be held on June 13. The process of nomination will start from May 26 and continue till June 2.

Singh was elected to the RS in 2020



and quit in April.

The ruling BJD, which has 113 MLAs in the 147-member House, is likely to capture all the four seats. The opposition BJP and Congress have 22 and nine MLAs respectively and may not contest.

The BJD is, however, yet to name its candidates for the RS poll.

"Our party president, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik will take the final decision as to who will be the candidates. It will be done at the appropriate time," BJD spokesman and MLA P K Deb said. Meanwhile, a statement issued by BJD vice-president Usha Devi has sparked

n early phase out of coal plants around the world could help avoid over 14.5 million premature deaths from air pollution over the next three decades delivering an economic benefit of \$16.3 trillion, a new analysis published Tuesday said. This equates to saving around 425 million years of life, or gaining an additional 20 days for each of today's 7.9 billion global population.

The assessment, set out in a blog post and accompanying interactive webtool by researchers in Germany at NewClimate Institute, shows the enormous scale of public health benefits of urgently phasing out operating and planned coal

plants in 24 countries, covering over 90 per cent of the global fleet. The researchers show that existing coal plants around the world are contributing to more than 900 thousand premature deaths per year. One of the study's authors, Harry Fearnehough, stresses the critical importance of the synergies between taking action to combat climate change and driving major improvements in health around the world. "We're all aware how damaging

coal-fired generation is for the climate and that as a global community we need to rapidly wean ourselves off this dependence on coal to meet our energy needs. The tool we're publishing today offers in numbers

Blazing lights bane of jumbo safety Rlys, Forest dept gear up to tackle elephant deaths Lovebirds end lives in Ganjam

Chhatrapur, May 24: In an unfortunate incident, a young couple reportedly committed suicide over an alleged failure in love at Samantarapur village under Jarada police limits in Ganjam district.

The young boy and a girl were found hanging from two trees Tuesday morning. The deceased have been identified as Sonu Behera and Sunita Pradhan

Keonjhar, May 24: Elephants are losing sight of their tracks and straying into human habitats due to installation of blazing lights near the elephant corridors of the state and national highways passing through forested areas of this district, a report said.

The concern regarding the safety of the pachyderms comes close on the heels of the death of a pregnant elephant and two calves in a train accident at Behera hutting under Champua forest range in the district May 19, 2022.

Reports said the Forest department is taking a slew of measures for protection and security of the jumbos. It has put up signage to alert commuters on the highways about the presence of an elephant corridor there. One of the information boards can be found at the elephant corridor Belda ghat road of National Highway-49.



on these corridors for their destinations. Of late, there has been a sharp rise in number of vehicles on these roads. As a result, the animals often get confused and lose sight of their tracks while crossing the highway. They then stray into nearby villages and destroy

lives and properties.

Forest officials have constructed an underpass on the highway for safe movement of the animals. Locals alleged that the animals hardly use the underpass as it is far away from the nearby elephant corridor. The animals have to climb the hilly roads to get closer to the corridor.

Moreover, installation of high illuminating lights on the highway also hinders the safe movement of elephants. Environmentalists Bimbadhar Behera said that this could have been avoided had the authorities paid adequate attention to these factors during the expansion and construction of the highway.

Notably, two major highways, NH-49 and NH-215 pass through the forests and hilly terrains of Keonjhar district. The road expansion work has destroyed the elephant corridors on the highways causing serious problems to the animals.

Environmentalists have alleged that construction of roads and underpasses without adequate consideration and consultation has posed serious threats to the elephants. They said that the Forest department should not rest only on putting up signage but take concrete measures for the protection of the elephants.

Rayagada roads fast turning into deathtraps

Rayagada, May 24: Death of more than 47 persons in 106 road mishaps during the last four months in this district has emerged as a big concern for the administrators as well as residents, a report said.

The sharp spike in road accidents has baffled the district administration, police and health officials as they are pondering over the ways and means to contain the menace. The matter came to the fore at a recent meeting of the district road safety committee held at the conference hall at the Collectorate.

Rayagada Collector Saroj Kumar Mishra presided over the meeting attended by SP Vivekanand Sharma and chief district medical officer (CDMO) Dr Lalmohan

Routray and other senior officials

In the meeting, the officials presented the details of the road accidents and the subsequent death tolls of the last two years. The

data revealed that more than 110 persons died in 271 road accidents in 2020 while 133 persons died in 297 road accidents in 2021. The mishaps have refused to abate despite the district administration and police personnel adopting a host of measures.

What is alarming is that at least 47 persons have died in 106 mishaps within just four months of this year. The report said that most of the accidents are occurring in Rayagada, Sheshkhal, Chandili, Ambadala areas and particularly during December, January, February, June and September: The Collector directed NHAI officials, Works and Rural Works departments to take steps to rectify the errors and asked the police to intensify helmet checking and drunk driving.

Ping-Pong in Tokyo

S President Joe Biden set the tone and tenor of the Quad summit meeting in Tokyo 24 May a day before the top leaders of the four countries of the grouping-US, Japan, Australia and India - could meet. In an apparent change of position on the US' stance over open China-Taiwan conflict, Biden announced the US would intervene militarily should China invade the island country the way Russia has invaded Ukraine. He deliberately drew the parallel to send the message across to China that it would be a mistake for the latter if it gets encouraged by Russian invasion and tries to take over Taiwan by force. The US President warned China not to "flirt with Taiwan" and China countered him by asking the US "not to play with fire.'

The host of the summit, Prime Minister of Japan Fumio Kishida said what remained unstated by Biden. He said, "Attempts to change the status quo by force, like Russia's aggression against Ukraine, should never be tolerated in the Indo-Pacific, above all, in East Asia." He even spelt out the rationale of the Quad grouping by asserting that with the regional security environment becoming "increasingly severe," he concurred with President Biden that they need to speedily strengthen the deterrence and response of the alliance. The American official position on Taiwan is that it has never recognised Beijing's claim to the self-governing island of 23 million. The US provides Taiwan defensive weapons, but had, till Biden's statement, remained intentionally ambiguous on whether it would intervene militarily in the event of a Chinese attack. Biden has, during the past few months, iterated that the US was "committed" to militarily defending Taiwan. But, no sooner had he said so, the US administration rushed to walk back the President's words and insisted there had been no change in the American position on providing support to Taiwan by way of supplying military hardware. But, this time Biden's categorical statement that the US would defend Taiwan has ruffled China's feathers as the assertion is made on its doorstep. It is not difficult to understand Biden's belligerence towards China, apparently reversing America's China-Taiwan policy. His administration has drawn flak from his own countrymen following the hurried pullout from Afghanistan, leaving the population, especially Afghan women, at the mercy of the Taliban with a medieval mindset. His ratings as President among the American public has gone down quite alarmingly. Close on the heels of the Afghan crisis came Russia's invasion of Ukraine. There too, the US and the West cut a rather sorry figure as Russian President Vladimir Putin pulverised parts of Ukraine and NATO watched the mayhem like a mute spectator. In time however, more international sanctions and military assistance in the way of equipment and other hardware was extended to Ukraine. Added to that, the spirited resistance by the people of Ukraine has greatly checked Russian forces as the war enters its third month. This could have given confidence to Biden to take on China through a sort of diplomatic sabre-rattling to salvage some of his lost position. This is why he deviated for the fourth time in the recent past from America's official position vis-a-vis China-Taiwan confrontation. He lapped up the opportunity when a reporter asked him in Tokyo whether he was willing to get involved militarily to defend Taiwan if it came to that especially since the US under him did not want to get involved in the Ukraine conflict militarily "for obvious reasons." He nodded and asserted, "Yes. That is the commitment we made." Doing a fine balancing act and diplomatic wordplay, he said the US has agreed with the "One China" policy and signed several agreements on it, but the idea that China can take Taiwan by force is "just not appropriate." Within hours, China expressed its "strong dissatisfaction and firm opposition" to Biden's comments, saying it will not allow any external force to interfere in its "internal affairs." Wang Wenbin, a spokesman for the Chinese Foreign Ministry, sought to warn the US by reminding the latter that on the issues concerning China's "sovereignty and territorial integrity and other core interests" there is no room for compromise. China urged America not to deviate from the "One China" policy and cautioned it against using indiscreet words and sending "any wrong signal to pro-Taiwan independence and separatist forces." The spokesperson also asked the US not to cause "serious damage to the situation across the Taiwan Strait and China-US relations." What has happened is a sort of ping-pong game between Biden's US and Xi Jinping's China. Biden has apparently sought to assure the Quad allies that America is ready to play hard ball against China at least in words. Xi's officials, in turn, wasted no time to tell the world China would not be cowed down by the US. One positive element of this engagement is that China has been told, in no uncertain terms, that it must think twice before following in Putin's footsteps. If China heeds it, which is in the realm of possibility, Biden will score brownie points in US domestic politics.

nounced a series of steps aimed at providing some relief against the unprecedented commodity price shocks being felt post the geopolitical escalations. Chief amongst these was a ₹8 and ₹6 cut, respectively in excise duties on petrol and diesel prices per litre. Apart from these, a ₹200 subsidy on LPG cylinders has been provided under the Ujjwala scheme. Additionally, customs duties are being cut on some inputs for plastic and steel. Finally, export duties are being hiked on items like pellets, iron ore, and some steel products. All told, these constitute a substantial set of measures and come at just the time when monetary policy was turning quite wary of the developing supply side inflation dynamics. Importantly, this also constitutes a signal that the government is equally committed to the battle against inflation (media reports suggest more measures may be taken later if required). pand fiscal deficit through resisting subsidising parts of the consumer basket should ordinarily be seen as complementing monetary policy action in curbing inflation. This is because monetary policy acts to curb aggregate demand by weighing down on parts of its components (private consumption, investments, government consumption, net exports). As can be seen, an expansion in government spending works at cross-currents to this. Thus by extension, a government unwilling to expand deficit is working in tandem with monetary policy. However, a different approach may have been required in case of fuel items and some other essential inputs owing to the risk of cascade of these prices through the entire manufacturing value chain. It is for this reason, presumably, that RBI/MPC members seem to have been encouraging the government to act. If media reports are to be believed, it is disappointment on this front that may have led monetary policy to come on the front foot on rate adjustments. A theoretical question may be asked to clarify the point: Would the intermeeting hike have occurred if the government had announced these steps ahead of that meeting? We don't really know the an-

swer to the above question. Notwithstanding that, with a government now seemingly also focussed on bearing the burden (and after having made a hefty 'downpayment' on the same with these latest measures) the pressure on monetary policy should lessen, ceteris paribus. Now this statement needs to be interpreted carefully. After the April policy and before the May inter-meeting hike, the market as per the swap curves was pricing in 275 bps hikes over two years from the overnight rate of 3.75 per cent then. Around 75-100 bps of these were expected in year two. Post the inter-meeting hike, however, the market started discounting all these hikes (and a bit more) in year one itself. It is possible, though not immediately observable, that the market unwinds part of the frenzied pace of hikes in year one that has been priced in post the inter-meeting hike.

On the bond curve, post the inter-meeting hike there was flattening between 1 and 4 years and between 4 and 10 years. While this makes sense, the residual spread left between 1 and 4 years was still quite large given that the spread between 4 and 10 years had reduced materially. If market was bringing forward all its tightening expectation to the next 1 year, then the maximum flattening pressure should have been felt on the spread between 1 and 4 years. Instead it is 4 to 10 year spread that reduced aggressively while leaving 1 to 4 years reasonably positive sloping. This implied two things: Market was still pricing in higher forward rates (2 years and 3 years rates 1 year from now versus where they were currently), thereby still expecting year 2 rate hikes unlike the swap curve; If the reason for this steepness was just bond supply premium on yields, then the 10 year and beyond was heavily ig-

noring this supply premium. If some of market's upfronted rate hike expectations were to unwind going forward, then it is logical to expect some giving away also on the 4-10 year flattening that has occurred just over the past month. In fact, the market will likely have to price in a larger bond supply premium as well given the new fiscal uncertainties down the line post these (and later may be more) fiscal measures. This will likely put more pressure for this spread to expand. It is to be noted that basis recent action, this spread is now largely in line with the pre-COVID era and is almost completely ignoring the additional bond supply premium that needs to be built in for the new regime of higher gov-

ernment deficit over multiple years. Our long standing overweight 4-5 year strategy has been stressed heavily over the past month owing to the market dynamics as discussed above. However, basis our view going forward we think this segment should now start to enjoy a relative tailwind as market partly unwinds rate hike fears and builds back bond supply premium. To be clear, there is little change in our underlying expectation about the likely rate hike trajectory ahead.

We continue to think that mone tary policymakers want to achieve a position of relative neutrality soon enough. This they seem to have defined around the pre-COVID repo rate of 5.15%. However, un like the market consensus, we continue to think that the pace of hikes thereafter will be much more measured with the reporate probably peaking out under the 6% mark. The premise of this expectation, as discussed many times before comes from our assessment of India's total fiscal and monetary policy response post COVID and the normalisation already underway for monetary policy; Our underlying growth trajectory and the characterisation of most of the inflation currently in play; Central banks' having to hike in what is a clearly slowing global cycle and the related point that most of them are unlikely to have a multi-year adjustment runway.

Another observation is noteworthy basis the above. We find a lot of favour in the market today for strategies anchored around the 1 year point. While these may sound 'surer' in an otherwise volatile environment, there are nevertheless 2 deficiencies in the argument here in our view: As noted above, 1 to 4 years spread is still very large thus implying quite steep forward curves (3 years 1 year from now, or 2 years 2 years from now if one were to consider 2 years to 4 years spread currently). By focussing on just 1 year (or 2 years) investors are effectively not choosing to 'own' these steep forward curves.

Investors are potentially courting re-investment risks 1-2 years down the line by ignoring 4-5 years in favour of 1-2 years. Even if one were to consider swap pricing (which is excessive in our view) the rate hike cycle will probably be done by year 1. Most likely, given what we think and what we are observing of the global macro cycle, by then the narrative on many central banks would have materially changed. The point about reinvestment risk is especially applicable since, as noted above, the forward curves are so steep. On a related note, tactical products like floating rate bonds may have limited shelf life as well given the nature of this cycle as analysed above. The writer is Head,

Matter of concern

Sir, It is a matter of great concern that precious time of the courts, including the Supreme Court, is wasted in adjudication of cases pertaining to disputes over places of worship. It is worrisome that the courts are forced to deal with such cases when they have to deal with a huge backlog of cases related to the lives of the common people. The Places of Worship Act was legislated by the Parliament to prevent religious organisations from making claims on places of worship of other religions. Religious organisations like the VHP believe that many mosques were built by demolishing Hindu temples. For a long time the courts refused to hear cases questioning the legality of mosques. However, when the courts showed willingness to hear such cases, many litigants started filing petitions on flimsy grounds. In fact, the courts need to reject such cases as they violate the Places of Worship Act. It was unfortunate that a local court in Varanasi accepted a petition claiming that a temple had existed in the place where the mosque stands now. The local court not only accepted the petition but also ordered a videographic survey of the mosque. To make matters worse, the-Allahabad High Court supported the local court's order.

New Delhi, May 24: The Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) Tuesday opposed a plea before a Delhi court seeking restoration of Hindu and Jain deities inside the Qutub Minar complex, saying it is not a place of worship and the existing status of the monument cannot be altered.

The ASI also said that it would be contrary to the law to agree to the contention of any person claiming a fundamental right to worship in this "centrally protected" monument. The ASI, however, said that the architectural materials and images of Hindu and Jain deities were re-used in the con-



struction of the Qutab complex. Additional District Judge Nikhil Chopra reserved the order on the plea for June 9.

"Fundamental right cannot be availed in violation of any status of the land. The basic principle of protection conservation is not to allow starting of any new practice in a monument declared and notified as a protected one under

the Act," the ASI said. It said that revival of worship was not allowed wherever it was not practiced at the time of protection of a monument. "Qutab Minar is not a place of worship and since the time of its protection by the central government, Qutab Minar or any part of Qutab Minar was not under worship by any community," it said.

Gyanvapi dispute: Fresh plea filed in SC

VARANASI: A fresh plea has been filed in the Supreme Court seeking intervention in the Gyanvapi mosque dispute. It contended that Muslims cannot assert any right in respect of any piece of land claiming to be mosque unless it has been constructed on legally owned and occupied virgin land. The petitioner stated that property vested in deity continues to be the deity's property irrespective of the fact that any person has taken illegal possession and offering namaz. The petition, filed by advocate Ashwini Kumar Upadhyay through advocate Ashwani Kumar Dubey, submitted that only those places can be protected, which were erected or constructed in accordance with personal law of the person erected/constructed them, but places erected or constructed in derogation of the personal law, cannot be termed as a 'place of worship'. Meanwhile a district court Tuesday fixed May 26 for hearing on the maintainability of the Gyanvapi-Shringar Gauri complex case.

DGCA warns airlines

New Delhi, May 24: The aviation regulator DGCA Tuesday warned airlines against offering unserviceable seats to passengers on their domestic and international flights.

Earlier this year, the Directorate General of Civil Aviation had conducted an audit of seats and other cabin fittings in aircraft of airlines, and found that many had broken or unserviceable seats

In a communique sent to all Indian carriers Tuesday, the DGCA said that some of the carriers are offering unserviceable seats to passengers on their scheduled international and domestic operations.

'This practice is not only causing inconvenience to the travellers but also inviting a serious safety concern as well," the regulator mentioned.

Arson in AP town over

Amaravati, May 24: Arson broke out in Amalapuram town in Andhra Pradesh Tuesday when police resorted to lathi-charge at people who staged a protest against the proposed renaming of the newly-created Konaseema district as B R Ambedkar Konaseema district, with a number of police personnel left injured and the protestors opposed to the name change allegedly setting the houses of state minister P Viswarupu and a ruling YSR Congress MLA P Satish on fire.

While the ruling party blamed unnamed forces behind the arson, all opposition parties hit out at the Jagan Mohan Reddy government over its "gross failure" in controlling the situation. The opposition parties appealed to people to observe restraint and ensure peace returned to Konaseema.

Kejri flags off 150 electric buses

New Delhi, May 24: Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal flagged off 150 electric buses Tuesday and announced that the national capital will boast of 2,000 more such buses by next year.

The Chief Minister said the Delhi government is planning to spend ₹1,862 crores on procuring electric buses over the next 10 years.

Kejriwal also thanked the Centre for providing ₹150 crore for the e-bus project. Three new EV charging depots built at a cost of around ₹150 crores were also inaugurated. This launch has marked the beginning of a new era in the transport sector, ushering in the age of more and more electric buses on Delhi's roads and curb pollution on a large scale, the chief minister said. "One hundred fifty new buses have been launched today, and next month another 150 will be added to the fleet. "It is our target to have 2,000 electric buses running on the roads in Delhi within the next one year, and our government is dedicating itself to work in this direction," he said.

The induction of 150 electric buses equipped with state-of-art features, including CCTV cameras, panic button and GPS, into the DTC's fleet Tuesday has come after almost 11 years when the public transporter procured buses on such a large number.

In addition, the government also plans to procure 600-700 CNG buses. The DTC board had approved the induction of 785 buses recently.



Cold wave conditions have engulfed the upper reaches of **Chenab Valley** triggering panic among the nomads who have started their bi-annual migration from the plains

Bhaderwah(Jammu), May 24: Unseasonal snowfall in the higher reaches of Chenab Valley has left hundreds of nomadic families in distress as they are compelled to halt their onward journey along with their livestock.

Cold wave conditions have engulfed the upper reaches of Doda, Kishtwar and Ramban districts, triggering panic among the nomads who have started their biannual migration from the plains in the union territory and Punjab.

Officials said fresh snowfall was reported in Kailash Mountain Range, Kainthi, Padri Gali, Bhaal Padri, Seoj, Shankh Padar, Rishi Dal Gau-Peeda, Gan-Thak, Khanni-top, Guldanda, Chattar Galla and Asha Pati Glacier surrounding Bhaderwah Valley since Monday night.

The unseasonal snowfall was

also reported from Braid Bal, Nehyed Chilly, Sharonth Dhar, Katardhar, Kainthi, Laloo Paani, Kaljugasar, Duggan Top, Goha and Sinthan Top besides the high altitude meadows of Gandoh.

These high altitude and vast grazing meadows remain inhabited by the Gujjar and Bakarwal tribes during summers.


Due to unseasonal snowfall and severe cold conditions, hundreds of tribal families have been stuck either on the roadsides or on the lower reaches at different parts of Chenab Valley, an official said. We are stuck with our sheep

and goats in the open on the road sides without food and fodder and are compelled to survive under open sky," Bashir Bau (69), who belongs to the nomadic Gujjar community, said at Guldanda on

Bhaderwah-Pathankot highway. Hailing from Lakhanpur in Kathua district, Bau claimed that he lost nearly 15 lambs and goats

over the past few days due to intense cold. "We are in a fix and unable to decide whether to stay back or go ahead," he said. Sain Mohammad of Kathua's

Basholi said they were heading to-



wards Padri meadow with their cattle when they were caught in the inclement weather and forced to stay back at Sarthal.

"We are finding it extremely difficult to arrange fodder for our animals. If the weather shows no improvement, we will have to face huge losses," he said.

According to the 2011 census, high altitude meadows of Chenab Valley, which spread from Bhaderwah to Jawahar tunnel (Banihal) and Marmat (Doda) to Paddar and Marwah (Kishtwar), house 30,000 nomads and lakhs of their cattle, sheep, goats, buffaloes, horses and mules during summer months.

However, some tribal organisations claim that the number of the nomadic population has increased to more than one lakh.

We are heading for a major crisis and the government agencies need to come forward for our rescue, General Secretary, Anjumane-Taraqqi Gojri Adab," Jan Mohd Hakeem said.

Hakeen said over one lakh Gujjar and Bakarwal tribes move towards the high-altitude meadows and vast grazing fields of Chenab Valley every year during summers from the plains of Jammu, Kathua, Samba in Jamu and Kashmir, and Jalandhar, Ludhiana and Hoshiarpur districts in Punjab.

The meteorological department has predicted improvement in the overall weather conditions from Wednesday morning.

FLOOD FURY IN ASSAM 25 dead, thousands displaced AGENCIES

Guwahati, May 24: The flood situation in Assam has slightly abated even though the death toll rose to 25 as one more person died and over 6.5 lakh people remained affected by the deluge across 22 districts, an official bulletin said. According to the daily flood re-

port of the Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA), one person in Silchar of Cachar district was lost to floodwaters.

With this, the total number of people losing their lives in this year's flood and landslides has gone up to 25 across the state. it said Monday.

ASDMA said more than 6,50,400 people are hit due to floods in Barpeta, Cachar, Darrang, Dhubri, Dibrugarh, Dima Hasao, Goalpara, Golaghat, Hailakandi, Hojai, Jorhat, Kamrup, Kamrup Metropolitan, Karbi Anglong West, Karimganj, Lakhimpur, Majuli, Morigaon, Nagaon, Nalbari, Sonitpur and Udalguri districts.

Nagaon is the worst hit district with over 3.51 lakh people in distress, followed by Cachar (nearly two lakh people) and Hojai (more than 44,500 people). Till Saturday, over 7.2 lakh peo-

ple were affected by the deluge across 22 districts in the state. At present, 1,709 villages are under water and 82,503 hectares of crop areas have been damaged

The authorities have distributed 4,278.45 quintals of rice, dal and salt, 2,555.97 litres of mustard oil, 1,232.41 quintals of cattle feed and other flood relief items.

Massive erosions have been witnessed in Barpeta, Biswanath,

Dhubri, Dibrugarh, Goalpara, Golaghat, Nalbari, Sivasagar, Sonitpur. Tinsukia and Udalguri districts.

Embankments, roads, bridges and other infrastructure have been damaged by floodwaters in Nagaon Barpeta, Cachar, Darrang, Dhubri, Goalpara, Karimganj, Morigaon, Nalbari, Sonitpur, Hojai and Udalguri, ASDMA said.

A total of 2,27,529 domestic animals and poultry have been affected in the deluge across nine districts, ASDMA said.

VISMAYA DOWRY DEATH CASE

Kerala court sentences hubby to 10 yrs in jail

Kollam (Ker), May 24: A Kerala court Tuesday sentenced to 10 years in jail the husband of Vismaya, an Ayurveda medical student who hanged herself in her marital home in June last year, for dowry death.

Additional District and Sessions Judge-1 Sujith K N also sentenced S Kiran Kumar to six years and two years imprisonment for the offences of abetment to suicide and dowry harrasment under the IPC, Special Public Prosecutor G Mohanraj told reporters.

Kumar was also sentenced to six years for the offence of taking dowry and one year for demanding dowry under the Dowry Prohibition Act. The court said the sentences would run concurrently, the SPP told reporters after the sentence was pronounced

A total fine of ₹12,55,000 was also imposed on Kumar, he said adding that out of that ₹2 lakh has been directed to be paid to the parents of the victim.

The SPP said he was satisfied with the sentence awarded to the convict. However, the victim's mother, who appeared disheartened, said she was not happy with the outcome as she had expected the convict would get life term.

Addressing media at her residence, she said the family would appeal against the sentencing and that she does not believe her daughter got justice.

Pb minister sacked on corruption charges, held

The accident occurred at 12.45 a.m. in the outskirts of Hubballi near Tarihal on the Pune-Bengaluru National Highway, police said.




Of the eight victims who were travelling in the bus, six died on the spot and two succumbed to injuries at the hospital.

Nagpur, May 24: Artificial Intelligence (AI) powered solutions, such as collision alert system, may soon make roads in India safer to drive

A unique AI approach that uses the predictive power of AI to identify risks on the road, and a collision alert system to communicate timely alerts to drivers, is being implemented here with an objective of resulting in a significant reduction of accidents.

The project, 'Intelligent Solutions for Road Safety through Technology and Engineering' (iRASTE), will identify potential accident-causing scenarios while driving a vehicle and alert drivers about the same with the help of the Advanced

Driver Assistance System (ADAS). It will also identify 'grey spots', i.e., by data analysis and mobility analysis by continuously monitoring dynamic risks on the entire road network. Grey spots are locations on roads, which left unaddressed, could become black spots (locations with fatal accidents). The system also conducts continuous monitoring of roads and designs engineering fixes to correct existing road black spots for preventive maintenance and im-

proved road infrastructure. The iRASTE project is under the I-Hub Foundation, IIIT Hyderabad, and a Technology Innovation Hub (TIH) set up in the technology vertical - Data Banks &



Data Services - supported by the Department of Science and Technology (DST) under its National Mission on Interdisciplinary Cyber Physical Systems (NM-ICPS) along with INAI (Applied AI Research Institute).

The project consortium includes CSIR-CRRI, and Nagpur Municipal Corporation (NMC), with Mahindra and Intel as the industry partners.







Iran building collapse kills 11

Tehran, May 24: Rescuers dug through debris on Tuesday of a building collapse in southwestern Iran that killed at least 11 people, fearful that many more could still be trapped beneath the rubble as authorities arrested the city's mayor in a widening probe of the disaster.

The collapse on Monday of an under-construction 10-story tower at the Metropol Building exposed its cement blocks and steel beams while also underscoring an ongoing crisis in Iranian construction projects that has seen other disasters in this earthquake-prone nation. Video from the initial collapse showed thick dust rise over Abadan, a crucial oil-producing city in Khuzestan province, near Iran's border with Iraq. The Metropol Building included two towers, one already built and the other under construction, though its bottom commercial floors had finished and already had tenants. On Tuesday, an emergency official interviewed on state television suggested that some 50 people may have been inside of the building at the time of the collapse, including people moving into its basement floors. However, it wasn't clear if that figure included those already pulled from the rubble. At least 39 people were injured, most of them lightly, officials earlier said.

The Quad also vowed to expand cooperation in areas of climate change, cyber security, critical and emerging technologies and the space sector and announced a number of new initiatives for the areas. As part of ongoing work related to critical and emerging technologies, the grouping also launched the Quad's 'Common Statement of Principles on Critical Technology Supply Chains'.

The leaders also announced the establishment of the 'Quad Partnership on Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR) in the Indo-Pacific' that is aimed at further strengthening collaboration to effectively respond to disasters in the region.

Modi also referred to increasing cooperation among the Quad nations, notwithstanding the COVID-19 pandemic. "Despite the adverse conditions of COVID-19, we have increased mutual coordination in many areas like vaccine delivery, climate action, supply chain resilience, disaster response and economic cooperation. This is ensuring peace, prosperity and stability in the Indo-Pacific," he said.

Quad leaders roll out new initiative for Indo-Pacific SL mulling oil exploration in Mannar Basin

Colombo, May 24: The crisis-hit Sri Lankan government is planning to undertake a feasibility study on oil exploration in the Mannar Basin, a shallow bay part of the Laccadive Sea in the Indian Ocean, which has about 5 trillion cubic feet of natural gas, enough to meet the energy needs of the island nation for the next six decades, a media report has said.

A natural gas field was reportedly discovered for the first time here in 2011, but the country has not yet capitalised on this treasure trove, which could potentially solve Sri Lanka's energy requirements, news portal Ada Derana has reported.

During a media briefing Tuesday after a cabinet meeting, Sri Lanka's Power and Energy Minister Kanchana Wijesekera said that the government is "planning to advertise plots for studies on oil exploration in the Mannar Basin following research conducted in the area last year.'

According to the findings of the Committee on Public Accounts held in 2016, the Chief Accounting Officer said there were about 5 billion barrels of fuel and about 5 trillion cubic feet of natural gas in the Mannar Basin, which is enough to meet the needs of about 60 years, the report said.

The Ada Derana report said that deposits could be used to increase the country's power supply to 1,130 kilowatts and the natural gas supply could bring approximately USD 200 billion to the country over the next 25 years.

Lanka hikes fuel prices

Colombo: Crisis-hit Sri Lanka Tuesday raised the petrol price by 24.3 per cent and diesel by 38.4 per cent, a record hike in fuel prices amidst the country's worst economic crisis due to the shortage of foreign exchange reserves. With the second fuel price hike since April 19, now the most-used Octane 92 petrol would cost 420 rupees (USD 1.17) and diesel 400 rupees (USD 1.11) a litre, an all-time high.

lack of staff at the Sri Lanka Petroleum Development Authority were the reasons for the delay in chalking out a formal programme to explore this resource-rich area, it said. So dire has been Sri Lanka's current situation that the country has been witnessing power cuts for up to 12 hours a day due to lack of adequate supply of fuel.

The Sri Lankan Cabinet on Tuesday has approved seeking a USD 500 million loan from the Exim Bank of India for the purchase of petroleum products amid a severe foreign exchange crisis that has crippled the island nation. The country is grappling with an unprecedented economic turmoil, the worst since its independence from Britain in 1948.

It is struggling with a shortage of almost all essentials, due to the lack of dollars to pay for the imports. The economic crisis has also triggered a political crisis in Sri Lanka and a demand for the resignation of President Gotabaya Rajapaksa. The crisis has already forced Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa, the elder brother of the president, to resign on May 9.

Abu Dhabi: Two people were killed and 120 injured in a gas cylinder explosion in a restaurant in the United Arab Emirates capital Abu Dhabi, police said. Initial reports "showed that 64 people sustained minor injuries, 56 others were moderately wounded, and two people died", police tweeted. The blast set off a fire that damaged the facades of six buildings before being brought under control, they added.

11 killed in Mexico

Mexico City: Eleven people, eight of them women, were killed in simultaneous shooting attacks on two bars in northcentral Mexico, authorities said Tuesday. Handwritten signs left at the scenes of the killings suggested the attacks were part of a rivalry between two drug cartels that have been battling for control of Guanaiuato state for several years.

Imran vows to defy ban on rally **200 BODIES FOUND IN MARIUPOL**

Kyiv, May 24: Workers digging through rubble found 200 bodies in Mariupol. Ukrainian authorities said Tuesday, another grim discovery in the ruined port city that has seen some of the worst suffering of the 3-month-old war.

The bodies found in the basement of a collapsed apartment building were in a state of decomposition and a stench permeated the neighbourhood, said Petro Andryushchenko, an adviser to

the city's mayor.

Mariupol, which the Russians recently claimed full control over, has endured some of the worst suffering of the war and became a worldwide symbol of defiance for the diehard defense put up for months by fighters at a steelworks.

The announcement of the discovery of the bodies came shortly after Volodymyr Zelenskyy accused Russia of waging "total war," seeking to inflict as much death and destruction as possible on his country.

Khan, while addressing a press conference in Peshawar, said he will lead the "biggest procession in Pakistan's history" on Wednesday.



The PTI chairman's speech comes after a countrywide police crackdown against members and leaders of the PTI. A policeman also lost his life in one of the raids after which the government said if would not allow the PTI to go ahead with its long march scheduled for Wednesday.

Criticising the PML-N-led government, Khan said that he has been seeing the Sharif family adopting the same tactics that military dictators did since 1985. "They only remember democracy as soon as they leave power," he said, asking how many times these parties have taken to the streets throughout the PTI government's term.

San Pedro de Atacama, May 24: In the middle of Chile's Atacama desert, the driest in the world, Hector Espindola has an unexpected job: he runs a vineyard.

Nearly 2,500 meters (8,000 feet) above sea level, his small Bosque Viejo farm produces muscat grapes - and another of a unique "criollo," or local, variety -- in the shadow of quince, pear and fig trees irrigated by a stream fed by melting Andean snow.

Espindola, 71, farms in an oasis in the Toconao region in Chile's extreme north -- some 1.500 kilometers (932 miles) from the vineyards

at the center of the world's longest country that have made it one of the world's top 10 wine exporters.

But growing grapes in the desert is no easy task. Espindola contends with extreme day-night temperature fluctuations and extreme solar radiation on top of wind and frost. "You have to be dedicated. I water here at night ... at three in the morning, eleven at night," he said while caressing his vines, dry and brown two months after the harvest. "You have to be careful because here the heat, the climate is no joke," he said. "Sometimes it is windy and production is lost, sometimes the frost comes early. It is kind of com-

plicated.'



Espindola sends his crop to the Ayllu cooperative which since 2017 has received grapes from 18 small vineyards around Toconao.

In 2021, the cooperative received 16 tons of grapes for a yield of 12,000 bottles. The harvest was better in 2022 with more than 20 tons of

grapes -- enough for 15,000 bottles but still just a drop, at about one percent, of Chile's annual production. Most contributors to the cooperative are members of indigenous communities who were previously individual, small-scale producers.

One of them, 67-year-old Cecilia Cruz, grows syrah and pinot noir grapes at an altitude of about 3,600 meters outside the village of Socaire -- Chile's highest vinevard. "I feel special... to have this vineyard here and to produce wine at this altitude,' she said amid the vines that still sport a few bunches of wrinkled, dried grapes. But she has a bigger goal: "a future" for her three sons. For Ayllu oenologist Fabian Munoz, 24, the mission is to create a unique wine that captures the characteristics of the volcanic rock in which the grapes grow. "When the consumer tastes an Ayllu wine (they should) think: 'Wow! I'm tasting the Atacama desert'," he said.

Carolina Vicencio, an expert in wine chemistry, said the altitude, low atmospheric pressure and extreme temperature fluctuations make for a thicker-skinned grape. "This generates more tannin molecules in the skin of the grape which gives a certain bitterness in the wine," she said. "There is also higher salinity of the soil ... which makes for a touch of mineralization in the mouth" thatmakes the Atacama desert wine one of a kind.

SAIL Q4 net profit falls 28%

New Delhi: Steel giant SAIL has reported a 28 per cent fall in its consolidated net profit to ₹2.478.82 crore for the fourth guarter ended March 2022. mainly on account of higher expenses. The company had clocked ₹3.469.88 crore net profit during the January-March guarter of 2020-21, Steel Authority of India Ltd (SAIL) said in a regulatory filing Monday. During the guarter under review, the company's total income rose to ₹31.175.25 crore from ₹23,533.19 crore in the year ago period. Total expenses were at ₹28.005.28 crore against ₹18.829.26 crore a vear ago. The company's board has also recommended a final dividend of ₹2.25 per share for FY22. In a separate statement. SAIL said its "borrowings stood below ₹13.400 crore as on March 31, 202

Govt caps sugar exports

New Delhi, May 24: The government Tuesday announced it would restrict sugar exports to 10 million tonnes from June 1 for the first time in six years in order to maintain enough domestic supply and prevent rise in prices.

According to reports, the govt has told traders to secure permission for overseas sale of sugar from June 1 to October 31. The government will allow sugar

exports up to 100 LMT, a notification by the Ministry of Consumer Affairs said.

Mills have contracted for export of 9 million tonnes of sugar so far in the 2021-22 marketing vear (October-September). Out of which, 7.5 million tonnes of the sweetener has been exported.

India is the world's second largest producer and exporter after Brazil. A closing stock of 6



million tonnes is required at the end of September 2022, to meet the domestic demand in the first two months of the new 2022-23 marketing year.

Also, the country's priority is first to meet the domestic requirement, keep prices under check and allow export only if there is surplus quantity.

The Indian Sugar Mills Association, a producers' body, revised its output forecast to 35.5 million tonnes, up from its previous estimate of 31 million tonnes. Indian mills have so far signed contracts to export 8.5 million tonnes of sugar in the current 2021/22 marketing year without government subsidies. Out of the

contracted 8.5 million tonnes, mills have already dispatched around 7.1 million tonnes of the sweetener. Shares in leading sugar mills such as Balrampur Chini, Dalmia Bharat Sugar, Dhampur Sugar Mills, Dwarikesh Sugar Industries and Shree Renuka Sugars fell as much as 8% Tuesday. Traders, however, said the decision to allow mills to export 10 million tonnes would help the country sell a reasonably big quantity of sugar on the world market.

In 2020-21, the country exported 7 million tonnes of sugar. The major importing countries are Indonesia, Afghanistan, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, UAE, Malaysia and African countries.

Centre allows duty-free crude edible oil import

New Delhi, May 24: The government Tuesday scrapped customs duty and agriculture infrastructure development cess on the import of crude soyabean oil and crude sunflower oil for 20 lakh metric tonnes each per year to ease local prices.

The duty-free import of 20 lakh MT per year will be applicable for two fiscals, 2022-23 and 2023-24, for crude soyabean oil and crude sunflower oil, according to a notification by the Finance Ministry.

This would mean till March 31. 2024, a total of 80 lakh MT on crude soyabean oil and crude sunflower oil could be imported duty free.

The exemption will help cool domestic prices and control inflation. "This will provide significant relief to the consumers." the CBIC tweeted. Solvent extractors of India (SEA) Executive Director B V Mehta said the prices of soyabean oil are expected to come down by ₹3 per litre.

The government issued notification regarding tariff rate quota of 20 lakh tonnes each for crude soyabean and sunflower oils. Under the TRQ a customs duty and agri infra development cess of 5.5 per cent



would be removed, Mehta said. Last week to control spiralling prices, the government had cut excise duty on petrol and diesel and also waived import duty on some raw materials used in steel and plastic industry. Besides, export duty was hiked on iron ore and iron pellets.

A rise in price across all items from fuel to vegetables and cooking oil pushed WPI or wholesale price inflation to a record high of 15.08 per cent in April and retail inflation to a near eight-year high of 7.79 per cent.

High inflation prompted the Reserve Bank to hold an unscheduled meeting to raise the benchmark interest rate by 40 basis points to 4.40 per cent earlier this month.

When asked about the likely impact on retail prices, Mehta told PTI that the prices of soyabean oil are expected to come down by ₹3 per litre.

Chitra Ramkrishna PRESS TRUST OF INDIA New Delhi, May 24: Capital markets regulator Sebi Tuesday sent a

notice to NSE's former chief Chitra Ramkrishna asking her to pay ₹3.12 crore in a case related to governance lapses at the stock exchange, and warned of arrest and attachment of assets and bank accounts if she fails to make the payment within 15 days.

The notice came after Ramkrishna failed to pay the fine imposed on her by the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi).



In an order dated February 11 Sebi had slapped a penalty of ₹3 crore on Ramkrishna for alleged governance lapses in a case related to the appointment of Anand Subramanian as the Group **Operating Officer and Advisor** when she was at the helm of NSE as its Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer, as well as for sharing confidential information of the company with an unidentified person.

Apart from penalising Ramkrishna, Sebi had imposed a penalty on Ravi Narain, who was the predecessor of Ramkrishna. and Subramanian and others.

In its fresh notice, Sebi directed Ramkrishna to pay ₹3.12 crore, which includes interest and recovery cost, within 15 days.

In the event of non-payment of dues, the markets regulator will recover the amount by attaching and selling her moveable and immoveable property. Besides, Ramkrishna faces attachment of her bank accounts and arrest.

Ramkrishna is currently lodged in Delhi's Tihar Jail after she was arrested by the CBI on March 6 in the NSE co-location scam case and investigation linked to other governance lapses at the bourse.

Bank of India Q4 net jumps 142 pc at ₹606cr

Bank of India Tuesday reported a 142.31 per cent rise in standalone profit after tax (PAT) at ₹606 crore in the quarter ended March 2022 on higher net interest income (NII) and improvement in asset quality. This compares with a PAT of ₹250 crore in the same period of the preceding fiscal. For the full year 2021-22, the lender reported a 57.60 per cent jump in net profit at ₹3,405 crore from ₹2,160 crore in FY21. Speaking to reporters, the bank's Managing Director and CEO AK Das said, "Asset quality further improved with reduction in gross NPAs both amount wise and percentage wise." Net Interest Income (NII) increased by 35.77 per cent to

₹3,986 crore in Q4 FY22, from ₹2,936 crore in the same period of the previous fiscal. Net Interest Margin (NIM) improved to 2.58 per cent from 2.01 per cent. Gross nonperforming assets (GNPAs) declined

by 19.33 per cent to ₹45,605 crore in March 2022 from ₹56,535 crore in March 2021. GNPA ratio declined to 9.98 per cent from 13.77 per cent. Net NPA ratio stood at 2.34 per cent as against 3.35 per cent.



India drops to 54th place on travel & tourism index Zee Media Q4 net

Davos, May 24: India was Tuesday ranked at the 54th place in a global travel and tourism development index, down from 46th in 2019, but still remained on the top within South Asia.

Japan has topped the global charts, followed by the US, Spain, France, Germany, Switzerland, Austraila, UK, Singapore and Italy in the top ten.

The World Economic Forum's biennial travel and tourism study also showed a recovering sector

following pandemic lows, though the recovery has been uneven and challenges remain.

The Travel and Tourism Development Index assesses 117 economies, identifying key factors in enabling the sustainable and resilient growth of travel and tourism economies.

"COVID-19 shutdowns have reemphasised the important contribution travel and tourism makes to many economies around the world," Lauren Uppink, Head of Aviation, Travel and Tourism at the World Economic Forum, said.

"As the world emerges from the pandemic, economies must invest in building a strong and resilient environment to deliver the travel and tourism experience and services for many decades to come," Uppink added.

While overall international tourism and business travel is still below pre-pandemic levels, the sector recovery has been bolstered by greater vaccination rates, return to more open travel, and growing demand for domestic and naturebased tourism.

Many businesses and destina-

tions have adapted to these shifting demand dynamics.

According to estimates, the difference in international tourist arrivals between January 2021 and January 2022 is greater than arrivals growth in all of 2021.

Other than the US, the top-10 \rightarrow scoring economies are high-income economies in Europe or Asia-Pacific. The Travel and Tourism Development Index 2021 is a direct evolution of the Travel & Tourism Competitiveness Index, which hasbeen published biennially for the past 15 years, WEF said.

For a team which many tipped to finish last because of some outof-the-box picks, turned out to be the most consistent and will now play the final in front of its home crowd at the Narendra Modi Stadium, with more than 1.00.000 people cheering them on.

No praise is enough for Pandya, who always looked in control even when things didn't seem to go his team's way

One of the cleanest hitters, Pandya took the game deep with some well-placed boundaries which allowed Miller to take his time before unleashing five huge sixes three off the last over from Prasidh



Krishna, when the bowler completely lost his nerve.

The best part about Pandya's captaincy was not taking any risks against the opposition's best bowler Yuzvendra Chahal (0/32) but left it to his partner, who hit two huge sixes to ease the pressure.

Once Trent Boult (1/38) and Chahal were done, it was left to the day's worst performer, Obed McCoy (1/40), to bowl a good 19th over with

Titans requiring 23 off 12 balls. McCoy used his back of the hand slower balls to perfection as only seven came off the over, leaving Krishna with 16 runs to defend

Madrid, May 24: Real Madrid wants to quickly forget about Kylian Mbappe and turn its focus back on the Champions League final against Liverpool

Four days before the final in suburban Paris, Madrid coach Carlo Ancelotti and his players tried their best to avoid talking about the France forward and his decision to stay with Paris Saint-Germain.

Mbappe made the surprising announcement on Saturday, dealing a major blow to Madrid and its fans, who were certain he would be playing in the Spanish capital next season.

"It's very clear for us that we have to think about our own things,' Ancelotti said Tuesday. "We've never talked about players from other squads. We respect everyone, every decision, every club. We have to do our own job. It's very clear and obvious what we have to think about, which is to prepare for the final." Madrid as a club had not made

any comments about Mbappe's decision, although some players were quick to post messages praising the club and saying it was a honor to wear its jersey.

Mbappe had said last year he wanted to join Madrid but PSG turned down offers of nearly 200 million euros (USD 214 million) for the player. The France forward was widely expected to complete a move to Madrid after becoming a free agent at the end of this season, but instead opted to sign a three-year

Mbappe's decision to reject Madrid was the most talked-about subject in Spain in recent days, leaving the Champions League final to the side.

Madrid will be trying to win a record-extending 14th European title Saturday at Stade de France in its fifth Champions League final in eight seasons.

Madrid won its 10th European Cup eight years ago with Ancelotti as coach, then clinched three straight titles from 2016-18 with Zinedine

Zidane at the helm. Madrid defeated Liverpool in the 2018 final in Kyiv.

"There was a lot more pressure then (in 2014). It had been several years since Madrid had won the Champions League. It was almost an obsession for everyone," Ancelotti said. "Now Madrid fans are motivated, but not so much obsessed about it, and I think that can give

Ancelotti, who can become the first coach to win four Champions full strength on Saturday. He said veteran left back Marcelo has a small issue but should recover in time for the final. Central defender David Alaba, who missed several matches because of a muscle in-
