CM inaugurates medical college

Keonjhar: Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik Monday inaugurated a new medical college and hospital apart from launching and laying the foundation stone of developmental projects worth ₹4,703 crore in mineral rich Keonjhar district. Patnaik, who attended a function here, also handed over financial assistance of ₹378 crore in the form of interest-free loans to 14,372 women self-help groups (SHGs) under Mission Shakti in the district. Of the 259 projects worth ₹4,703 crore, the chief minister inaugurated 98 projects built at the cost of ₹868 crore and laid the foundation stone of 138 projects estimated to cost around ₹1,103 crore. He also announced 23 other projects worth ₹2,731 crore. **P3**

Athagarh: There is no let-up in elephant deaths in the state as yet another tusker was found dead at Nuaitaila cashew forest near Nuabandh village about 20 metre from the State Highway-65 under Athagarh forest division in Cuttack district, Monday. The tusker was found dead under mysterious circumstances raising serious questions over the safety of jumbos in the area. The animal within 20 years of age was found with deep injury marks on its trunk and right leg with pus and blood oozing from wounds. On being informed, Athagarh DFO Jagnyadatt Pati, forest ranger Rabindranath Nayak rushed to the spot and launched an investigation. **P5**

Bhubaneswar: Prime Minister Narendra Modi has praised the effort of AIIMS Bhubaneswar doctors for doing first ever quadruple joint replacement surgery on a crippled patient. "Compliments to our doctors for always being at the forefront of innovation and embracing new changes in the medical world. Their dexterity makes us proud!" Modi said in a tweet Monday. The surgery was conducted on a 37-year-old female patient from Aul block of Kendrapara district. This is the second case to be reported globally and first of its kind in Odisha where all four joints were replaced in one setting.

Retail inflation back above tolerance level

With the exception of Nov and Dec, retail inflation has remained above the RBI's upper tolerance level of 6 per cent since Jan 2022

New Delhi, Feb 13: Retail inflation again breached the Reserve Bank's upper tolerance limit and touched a three-month high of 6.52 per cent in January, mainly due to higher prices in the food basket, including cereals and protein-rich items.

While the prices of vegetable declined in January, most of the other items, including 'fuel and light' became dearer.

The rate of price rise in the food basket was 5.94 per cent in January, up from 4.19 per cent in the preceding month and 5.43 per cent in the year-ago month, as per data

Cab okays ₹1,400cr for better drainage

A TOTAL OF 15 PROPOSALS HAVE BEEN APPROVED

Bhubaneswar, Feb 13: The state Cabinet led by Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik Monday approved Drainage Improvement Programme (DIP), which will be implemented with an outlay of ₹1,400 crore during next five years.

Briefing mediapersons, Chief Secretary SC Mahapatra said the programme will be executed from financial year 2023-24 to 2027-28 for excavation, improvement and renovation of 6,969 km length of various drainage channels and retrieval of water-logged area of 1,05,868 hectares in coastal areas, he said.

It helps in controlling saline ingress through the drains falling to the sea and its network and proper drainage of excess water in the affected areas in the Doabs and select urban centres through well-defined natural drainage channels, he said.

The Drainage Improvement Programme was launched in 2014-15 for a period of five years (2014-15 to 2018-19) in the ayacut area in 17 Doabs and three Non-Doab areas in nine coastal districts. Later, the programme was extended from 2019-20 to 2022-23 with an outlay of



₹500 crore, Mahapatra said. "So, the Cabinet today approved the revised cost estimate of the scheme from ₹500 crore to ₹800 crore," he added.

Similarly, the Cabinet has approved the proposal for construction of 237 number of 100-bed boys' hostels for Odisha Adarsha Vidyalayas. The boys' hostels will be constructed with an investment of ₹1,000.14 crore.

Following the recommendations of National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) and Orissa High Court, the state government has also decided to provide compensation to the NOK (next of kin) on account of death of prisoners in jails of Odisha.

The Council of Ministers Monday approved the state's annual Budget for the year 2023-24. A Budget outlay was approved by the Council during its meeting held under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik here, Monday evening. According to sources, the total size of the Budget will be around ₹2.30 lakh crore, which is 15 per cent more than last year's full-fledged budget of ₹2 lakh crore. As this will be the last full-fledged Budget of the current government, some new schemes and programmes may be announced during its presentation in the Assembly, sources said.

Thanjavur (TN), Feb 13: Velupillai Pirbhakaran, the leader of Eelam Tamils in Sri Lanka is doing well, a top Tamil nationalist leader claimed here Monday and said a conducive atmosphere prevails for him to appear now. However, Sri Lanka's defence ministry dismissed Nedumaran's claim as a joke.

In a press conference, Pazha Nedumaran, a noted Tamil nationalist leader, prefixed his declaration as a 'true announcement' and said the international (political) atmosphere and fierce opposition to Rajapakas by the Sinhalese people in Sri Lanka has



created the right conditions for the leader of the Eelam Tamils, Pirbhakaran to emerge.

Asserting that the LTTE leader is doing well, Nedumaran said the announcement would end 'planned'

suspicious spread about him. Pirbhakaran is all set to soon announce a plan for the dawn of the Eelam Tamils in Sri Lanka, he said.

He appealed to Tamils in Sri Lanka and the Tamils living in all other parts of the world to stand together and extend him their full support. Till such time the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE) was powerful, they did not allow any forces inimical to India to find a foothold in the regions held by them in Sri Lanka, he said.

It may be recalled that Pirbhakaran was killed in 2009 in the war between Sri Lankan Army and the LTTE.

SMRITI COSTLIEST WITH ₹3.4 CRORE RCB DEAL

Mumbai, Feb 13: India vice-captain Smriti Mandhana bagged a huge deal of ₹3.4 crore with the Royal Challengers Bangalore (RCB) in the first set of Womens Premier League (WPL) Player Auction here Monday. Interestingly, she wears the number 18 jersey, which is the same number which Virat Kohli wears for RCB in the men's Indian Premier League (IPL).

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4TH UFO DOWNED

NOT RULING OUT ALIENS, SAYS US

Washington, Feb 13: A top US military official said he would not rule out aliens or any other explanation as US military fighter jets Sunday shot down an octagonal object over Lake Huron, the Pentagon said.

It is the latest incident since a suspected Chinese surveillance balloon put North American security forces on high alert.

It was the fourth flying object to be shot down over North America by a US missile in a little more than a week. China's foreign ministry said it had no information on the latest three flying objects shot down by the United States.

US Air Force General Glen VanHerck, who is tasked with safeguarding US airspace, told reporters that the military has not been able to identify what the three most recent objects are, how they stay aloft, or where they are coming from.

"We're calling them objects, not balloons, for a reason," VanHerck, head of North American Aerospace Defense Command (NORAD) and Northern Command, said.

VanHerck said he would not rule out aliens or any other explanation.

Another defense official, speaking on condition of anonymity, subsequently said the military had not seen any evidence that the objects were extraterrestrial. **Contd...P4**

Ants show the way to beating traffic jams

THERE ARE AN ESTIMATED 20 QUADRILLION ANTS ON EARTH THAT ARE NEARLY ALWAYS MOVING, YET SOMEHOW NEVER GET STUCK

Sydney, Feb 13: Being stuck in traffic is stressful, wastes time and resources and ends up costing the world's economies trillions of dollars a year. Jams happen daily and authorities have spent decades trying to fix the problem with little success.

Yet a solution may be literally under our feet. Ants.

There are an estimated 20 quadrillion ants on Earth. That's more than the number of stars in the Milky Way and possibly more.

These ants - which can live in colonies that contain billions of individuals and can span thousands of kilometres - are nearly

always moving yet somehow they never get stuck. Like humans, ants have sophisticated transportation

■ As we move towards the adoption of self-driving vehicles, the opportunities for ants to inspire traffic technologies will increase. In essence, our traffic systems may be becoming more ant-like


systems to ensure the efficient movement of individuals, resources and information. Some ant species create systems using chemical signals called pheromones. If an ant finds an attractive food source, she returns to the nest dropping invisible droplets of pheromone behind her as she walks.

■ In the early 1990s, the trail-laying behaviour of ants inspired the incredibly successful 'ant colony optimisation algorithm' which is now used to tackle tough traffic problems

This is the basis of many ant transportation systems and enables ants to quickly gather workers to new food sources, allocate workers based on the quality of the food, and find the shortest path between points. In the early 1990s, the trail-laying behaviour of ants inspired the incredibly successful 'ant colony optimisation algorithm' which is now used to tackle tough traffic problems such as determining the most

efficient route for a fleet of delivery vehicles. Ants excel at managing traffic on their trails.

On human-built roads the average speed of cars decreases as the number of cars on the road increases. You simply can't go fast when the road is crowded. Ants moving on their trails, however, do not slow down even when more ants join the trail. In some cases, traffic congestion is prevented because ants switch from using a single trail when traffic is light, to using two trails when traffic is heavy. By dividing themselves across multiple routes, ants maintain traffic speeds and prevent congestion, effectively stopping traffic jams before they start. **Contd...P4**

Best child artist award went to Mayank for *Ranga Barrsiba Tupur Tupur*.


Earlier, taking strong exceptions to plagiarism in the film business, Orissa High Court directed to declare the 31st Odisha State Film Award, 2019 again in one month as

He said that with the inauguration of Dharanidhar Medical College and Hospital, people of the district will be able to avail advanced healthcare services in the state-run facility and will not have to visit Bhubaneswar or Cuttack for treatment anymore. The CM also inaugurated the Dharanidhar Sports Complex, which has a natural turf football ground, a 400-metre synthetic track equipped with LED floodlights and a 1,000-people gallery. Additionally, an archery arena has also been developed. The complex also has an indoor hall with six badminton courts and a 200-bed residential facility. The campus is spread over nine acres of land and has been developed at a cost of over ₹35 crore.

BJD, BJP to take to streets against each other today



Bhubaneswar, Feb 13: The ruling BJD and Opposition BJP will launch three-day statewide protests against each other from Tuesday. While the BJD will hit the street over reduction of budgetary allocation on paddy procurement and closure of Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana (PMGKAY) programme, the BJP will stage demonstrations over deteriorating law and order situation in the state. Speaking to reporters here, BJD leader Arun Sahoo said that with reduction of funds for procurement of paddy by ₹20,000 crore in Centre's budget for 2023-24, lakhs of farmers especially those in western Odisha will be severely affected. Similarly, with closure of PMGKAY, paddy procurement will drastically go down and the farmers will be deprived of getting the MSP, Sahoo said. BJD will stage a protest in front of the Raj Bhawan February 14 demanding the Centre to procure all food grains from Odisha, Sahoo said. The party will also stage dharna at panchayat offices across the state February 15. On the next day (February 16), the ruling party will stage demonstrations at block offices and submit a memorandum to the Prime Minister through the district collectors, he stated. On the other hand, the BJP will hold demonstrations over deterioration in the law and order situation in the state from February 14 to 16. State BJP leader Bhruu Baxipatra said, "The law and order situation has deteriorated in the last 23 years even though the Chief Minister holds the Home department. Crimes such as dacoity, rape, murder and violence against women are on the rise." Though a powerful Cabinet minister was murdered, no condolence motion was moved in the state Cabinet either, he added. The Saffron party will intensify its attack on the ruling BJD party by staging a demonstration in different parts of the state Tuesday.

'Sun didn't break off its chunk'

EXPERTS SAY A PROMINENCE LIKE THIS HAPPENS AT THE SAME 55-DEGREE LATITUDE EVERY 11 YEARS

The Sun did not shed a chunk of it as being reported and what was spotted was a normal 'solar prominence' activity on its surface. A solar prominence (also known as a filament when viewed against the solar disk) is a large, bright feature extending outward from the Sun's surface. Prominences are anchored to the Sun's surface in the photosphere, and extend outwards into the Sun's hot outer atmosphere, called the corona. Reports last week surfaced that NASA's James Webb Space Telescope (JWST) caught "a piece of Sun being broken off" from its surface. A tweet by astronomer Tamitha Skov, accompanied by footage of the Sun captured by NASA's Solar Dynamics Observatory, claimed: "Talk about Polar Vortex! Material from a northern prominence just broke away from the main filament & is now circulating in a massive polar vortex around the north pole of our Star." However, no part of the Sun "broke off". Solar physicist and deputy director at the National Center for

Skov wrote on her blog. The James Webb Space Telescope is the world's largest, most powerful, and most complex space science telescope ever built. Webb will solve mysteries in our solar system, look beyond distant worlds around other stars, and probe the mysterious structures and origins of our universe and our place in it. Meanwhile, a major solar flare erupted from the Sun over the last weekend, "spawning a radio blackout for parts of Earth and setting the stage for more flares to come," reports Space.com. The huge solar flare was registered as a powerful X1.1-class event on the scale used for such Sun storms.

New Delhi, Feb 13: The Mahanadi Water Dispute Tribunal (MWDT) Monday said that it would begin the site visit of Mahanadi basin in Chhattisgarh and Odisha from March 15 and asked the counsels of both states to sit with assessors and draw a schedule for the visit.

The three-judge bench of the tribunal headed by retired Supreme Court judge Justice AM Khanwilkar noted that it is appropriate to first undertake the site visit before commencing trial of the Mahanadi water dispute and cross-examination as well as tendering of witnesses.

"Technical teams of both states will interact with assessors and draw a schedule for site visit as proposed by the state parties. The visit can commence from March 15. The details regarding the travel plan and other aspects will be worked on by the assessors after interacting with technical teams of the states," the tribunal said, adding that if required then it will also take an aerial survey of the Mahanadi basin.

The tribunal will visit various irrigation and power projects running on Mahanadi river basin in Chhattisgarh and Odisha to inspect ground situation to adjudicate the dispute over water sharing between both the states.

Noting that the tenure of Mahanadi tribunal is ending March 8, the bench also asked the counsels of all states to take up the matter with the respective governments for further extension of the tribunal. The

ENSURE FLOW OF WATER TO ODISHA, CENTRE TOLD

New Delhi: Biju Janata Dal (BJD) MP Bhartruhari Mahtab Monday raised the Mahanadi water dispute between Odisha and Chhattisgarh in the Lok Sabha and requested the Centre to ensure flow water to Odisha as per the guidelines of Ministry of Environment and Forests.

The BJD MP raised the issue under Rule 377 in the Lower House. Citing a letter of Chhattisgarh dated August 2016, Mahtab said Chhattisgarh unilaterally planned illegal abstraction of 24.50 million acre feet (MAF) of Mahanadi water.

"As per the 1947 report of Central Waterway Irrigation and Navigation Commission on the Mahanadi Valley Development: Hirakud Dam Project, the minimum flow of 20.61 MAF of water was apportioned, and Odisha was permitted to use 12.28 MAF of water and the rest for the upstream states. Even after much persuasion, the Union government did not act. Ultimately, Odisha government went to the

apex court, the court asked the Centre to form a tribunal. The tribunal was supposed to give its report within a specified period of time. They have not done it," Mahtab said.

He asked the Centre to find out whether Chhattisgarh, during its project planning, has considered the MoEF guidelines for minimum water flow. He said the water level at Hirakud dam is 622.97 ft and every day 10,000 cusecs of water has to flow to Odisha for irrigation and power generation.

"How many water arresting structures have been constructed by Chhattisgarh across Mahanadi, whether dams inside Mahanadi basin of Chhattisgarh are being operated by any Standard Operating Procedure, and whether Chhattisgarh has kept any provision in their reservoirs to absorb flood waters temporarily for the safety of Hirakud dam in Odisha? The answer is a big no. Should the Centre not intervene?" Mahtab asked.

During the hearing, the state of Chhattisgarh submitted that delineation of Mahanadi basin has been completed up to Mundali bar-

Exempt handlooms from GST: BJD BJP seeks action against sand mafia

New Delhi: BJD MP Aparajita Sarangi Monday demanded action against sand mafia allegedly involved in sand mining under Jayadev constituency. She alleged that the sand mafia are operating in connivance with the state government in the area.

Speaking during the Zero Hour in the Lok Sabha, Sarangi said the people of the area are adversely affected by the sand mining and the roads and bridges are also getting damaged. She requested the Union Ministry of Environment and Forest to send a team and inquire about the matter.

Odias are being exploited in their own state: Patnaik

Bhubaneswar, Feb 13: Days after joining the Congress, bureaucrat-turned politician Bijay Kumar Patnaik Monday alleged that Odias are being exploited in their own state.

After joining the party in New Delhi, Patnaik returned to the state, where Odisha Pradesh Congress Committee (OPCC) leaders gave him a rousing welcome at the Congress Bhawan.

Speaking to media persons, he said, "Odia people are being exploited in their own state. Perhaps it is the only state where conspiracy has been made to exploit its own people." Odia contractors are not getting any contracts, as tenders for even small works are framed in such a way that they are not able to qualify it, he said.

Stating that unemployment is a big problem, he said, professional graduates are moving outside to get a job while daily wage labourers are also migrating in a similar way in search of livelihood.

Refraining from making any direct attack on Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik, he said, "He was my boss. So, I don't want to criticise him. However, I can say that the Naveen Patnaik of now is not

the same one I served under." The former Chief Secretary said he joined politics because he couldn't bear the style of functioning of the current government.

"The people of the state don't know who to approach to get their grievances redressed. Be it a MLA or minister, they claim that they do not have powers and everything is being controlled by the 'third floor' (Chief Minister's Office)," he alleged. Neither common man nor journalists have any access to the 'third floor'.

Commenting on the 5T model of governance, the Congress leader said, "It is just a slogan. Everybody knows how much transparency is there in the system. If each department functions efficiently there is absolutely no need for a separate department like the 5T."

Patnaik also alleged that the senior capable officers are not allowed to function independently in the state. Reacting to the statements made by the Congress leader, BJD spokesperson Lenin Mohanty said Patnaik wanted to go to Rajya Sabha after joining the BJD. As this could not happen, he joined the Congress, but now he is making statements like a BJP spokesperson, Mohanty said.

Ants show the way to beating traffic jams...

Some ants also respond to increased traffic by leaving less pheromone, which decreases the attractiveness of a trail and may encourage ants to find alternate routes. Other ants appear to adjust their walking speed to avoid time-consuming collisions when ant trails become crowded.

Some ants manage traffic by travelling along their trails in small groups called platoons. Platooning is thought to increase the efficiency of ant trail systems by reducing the gaps between individuals. This concept is being investigated for self-driving cars as it reduces the need for sudden braking and helps prevent congestion.

It's clear, ants are masters at managing traffic on their trails but the billion-dollar question is whether we can apply what we learn from ants to our own traffic management systems.

There is one issue -- humans are not ants.

Where ants on a trail share a common goal, human drivers are motivated by individual goals that may conflict with other road users. Ants communicate to one another through their trails systems, whereas communication between human drivers is limited.

However, as we move toward the adoption of self-driving vehicles, the opportunities for ants

to inspire traffic technologies will increase. Self-driving cars can communicate with each other to find the best route and avoid congestion, similar to ants using chemical signals to communicate and navigate their trail systems.

Like ants in a colony, self-driving vehicles may be able to work together to minimise traffic times for everyone. In essence, our traffic systems may be becoming more ant-like. And as our traffic systems continue to adapt, we would be wise to look to the animals whose traffic management prowess has been shaped by millions of years of evolution.

CIPET holds workshop on sustainable plastics

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Poachers have free run in Bhitarkanika

The inability of the Forest department to prove charges against the hunters is harming wildlife, feel environmentalists

Kendrapara, Feb 13: Rampant and unabated poaching is posing severe threats to wildlife in Bhitarkanika National Park (BNP) under Rajnagar forest division in Kendrapara district, sources said Monday. This has happened due to lack of any punitive action against the poachers who had been earlier arrested by Forest department officials. The sources alleged that rules are there to punish the poachers but those are not being implemented. As result there has been a substantial decrease in various species of animals in BNP and this development has affected the forest's bio-diversity. Forest department officials have arrested over 400 poachers in the last two decades but none of them were convicted. It has been alleged that officials after arresting the poachers do not make

proper efforts to prove the charges in courts for which they go scot-free after a brief tenure in prisons. Recently officials arrested four poachers on charges of straying into Bhitarkanika wildlife sanctuary and poaching deer and wild boars. Every year, at an average 30 such cases are registered, but no action is taken against the offenders, sources said. Wildlife expert/lawyer Sushree Kumari Nayak said that these poachers, once released, again continue to kill animals. The inability of the Forest department to prevent witnesses from turning hostile also contributes in the release of poachers from prisons. Sources said that officials are also guilty of not taking fingerprints of the poachers or registering the cases under relevant sections of Arms Act. These deficiencies help the poachers get an early release from jail.

Environmentalists apprehend that if poaching is not stopped then it may threaten the wildlife and bio-diversity in Bhitarkanika sanctuary. Environmentalists Hemant Kumar Rout, secretary of Marine Turtles and Mangrove Conservation Committee, Lakshmi Swain, Subhash Swain and local intelligentsia Ganesh Chandra Samal and Radhakanta Mohanty informed that two poachers were arrested on charges of killing four birds in Bhitarkanika in 2015 and six persons were arrested in the last five years for hunting reptiles and deer.

However, the poachers have been released by the courts as the Forest department failed to prove the charges against them. The environmentalists pointed out that if stringent punishment is handed to the poachers it will create awareness among the people.. Poachers are now having a free run in Bhitarkanika which has over 200 marine and wildlife species. Every year, hundreds of wild boar, rabbit, deer, turtles, snails, horseshoe crabs, crocodiles, monster lizards and snakes are either caught or killed and smuggled outside for money. The poachers use various methods to kill or capture the animals. They use snares, nets and hunting dogs to poach wild boars, deer and rabbit, sources said.

When contacted, DFO Sudarshan Gopinath Yadav said the protection of wildlife is of utmost importance and Forest department officials are working for it.

Tusker found dead in Athagarh

INJURY MARKS ON TRUNK AND LEG POINT AT INVOLVEMENT OF POACHERS

Athagarh, Feb 13: There is no let-up in elephant deaths in the state as yet another tusker was found dead Monday at the Nuataila cashew forest near Nuabandh village about 20 metres from the State Highway-65 under Athagarh forest division in Cuttack district. The death of the tusker has raised serious questions over the safety of jumbos in the area. The animal aged approximately 20 years was found with deep injury marks on its trunk and right leg with blood oozing from those. The animal before its death had defecated as dung was found lying in the area. On being informed, Athagarh DFO Jagnyadatt Pati, ranger Rabindranath Nayak rushed to the spot and launched an investigation. Though the tusks of the elephant were intact, the cause of the death is yet to be ascertained. Later, a team led by Angul RCCF Jogajayanand, experts from Satkosia wildlife sanctuary, a team of veterinarians from Bhubaneswar and Athagarh reached the spot and conducted post-mortem of the carcass and trimmed the animal's tusks.

Preliminary inquiries suggested that the animal might have died after coming in contact with live wires laid by the farmers to ward straying of wild animals to

their farmlands. It is worthwhile to mention here that the Athagarh forest division is in the news for a quite long time due to unabated elephant deaths in the region. Also the forest division recently hogged headlines after a poacher allegedly died while in the custody of Forest department. Notably, in various forest areas of the state, 20 elephants including 10 tuskers have died in the last nine months.

Cash, jewellery looted from Narasingha temple

Bombs seized from ganja-laden vehicle

Sambalpur, Feb 13: In a shocking development, police recovered four country-made bombs from a ganja-laden vehicle at Khinda Square under Thekoli police limits in this district, late Sunday night. An entry pass of Uttar Pradesh state Assembly and several vehicle registration number plates were also seized from the vehicle. However, two occupants of the vehicle managed to escape before the police could catch them. The vehicle was thoroughly searched in the presence of a magistrate and 50kg of ganja was found inside.

Suspecting some foul play, police searched the vehicle and found four bombs, contraband items, entry pass of Uttar Pradesh Assembly and several number plates. Till reports last came in, search and investigation was underway.

Fear of distress sale haunts mustard farmers in Jaleswar



Lack of marketing facilities forces farmers to approach middlemen

Jaleswar, Feb 13: Farmers under this block in Balasore district have grown mustard on 400 hectares of land but the fear of distress sale is haunting them, sources informed Monday. The farmers said that they have cultivated a huge amount of mustard, but now apprehend they will have to sell their yield at dirt cheap rates and all their investments and hard work will go down the drain. Most farmers in the area went for mustard cultivation in the Rabi season as it promises higher returns with lesser investments and labour in comparison to other crops. However, the lack of marketing facilities and cold storages has left them with no other option but to approach middlemen who are ready to exploit the situation. On being informed, district agriculture officials including Pradip Kumar Mohanty, Sanjiv Kumar

Rout, Rajalakshmi Mohanty, Kamal Majhi and Sk Abdul Raj visited various parts of Jaleswar block and took stock of the cultivation in the area Monday. Sources said that Jaleswar block is known as an agriculture-dominated block in Balasore district. Here the farmers in riparian villages like Baiganbadia, Jhadapimpal, Paschimbaria, Paikasida, Gadasahi Baliapala, Rayanramachandrapur, Sikkharpur, Srirampur, Dakhina Praharajpur, Makidia and Olmara panchayats have taken up mustard cultivation. The mustard seeds were sown at the onset of winter because the cold weather helps in the cultivation. Prior to that, the Agriculture department had organised a training session on cultivation of mustard. As part of this initiative, 350 farmers were provided with two kilograms of seeds including those residing in Baiganbadia, Paikasida, Rayanramachandrapur, Srirampur and Dakhina Praharajpur panchayats. They were also provided with financial assistance of ₹1,200 each and subsidy on pesticides.

Hooch trader kills alcoholic youth

Basta, Feb 13: A youth was killed allegedly by a hooch trader over outstanding money at Tikarpada village under this block in Balasore district, police said Monday. The deceased was identified as Ajay Barik, 30, son of Harendra Barik living in Sadanandpur village. Ajay had gone missing Saturday night from his home. He was found dead Monday and police suspected it to be a case of murder. The body was found from the backyard of a villager in Tikarpada village close to the house of hooch trader Akshaya Dalei a resident of the same locality. Police sent the body for post-mortem and are awaiting the report as they feel it will provide vital information which may help them solve the case. A forensic team and sniffer dogs were pressed into the service. Police detained Dalei in this connection and seized two billhooks from his house. He is now being grilled as police consider him to be the main suspect. Locals alleged that Ajay was an alcoholic and often used to visit Dalei's house to drink. They alleged that Ajay owed Dalei a substantial amount. They said Dalei had murdered Ajay when he refused to pay up.

Chorus grows for revival of Gunupur airstrip

Gunupur, Feb 13: With the Centre planning to develop 100 airports by 2024 under the Regional Connectivity Scheme (RCS)-Ude Desh ka Aam Nagrik (UDAN) infrastructure scheme, demand for revival of Ukamba airstrip in Gunupur of Rayagada district has gathered steam. It is claimed that the revival of the airstrip which is situated about 14km from Gunupur town will improve communication as well as trade and commerce facilities in the area and lead to its growth. It will also lead to development and growth of the tourists sites in the district. Locals have time and again demanded for the airstrip's revival but their pleas are yet to be addressed. The nearest airport, which is in Jeypore of Koraput district, is about 194 km away from Ukamba airstrip while the Vishakhapatnam airport in Andhra Pradesh is about 221km away.

The matter came to the fore after Satya Prakash Panda, president of FIET University in Gunupur wrote letters recently to state Commerce, Transport and Water Resources Minister Tukuni Sahu and Union Civil Aviation Secretary Usha Padhi demanding revival of the airstrip. Reports said that Gunupur is a sub-division in Rayagada district and the second largest town after Rayagada. The Vamshadhara river flows by this town and many waterfalls and important tourist sites surround this area.

This town is chiefly tribal dominated and connected with Srikakulam district of neighbouring Andhra Pradesh. Various plants including medium scale industrial plants, educational institutions including GIET, a private university, are situated in Gunupur town. The presence of so many educational institutions as well as GIET University makes the revival of the airstrip a necessity, Panda said. In his letter, Panda said that the airstrip was earlier being used for

landing of aircrafts of VVIPs like the chief minister and other dignitaries. Few years back, some local people had encroached upon the airstrip land and started using it for cultivation. However, the local administration had removed the encroachments and the available land can be used for development and upgrading of the airstrip. Panda said that the aviation sector in the country is expanding at a fast rate for which more pilots will be appointed in future. There is also a need of trained engineers to repair the aircraft for which plans are afoot by the GIET University to train the B.Tech students in aircraft repairing. There is also need of an airstrip to keep the courses running for which there is urgent need for revival of the Ukamba airstrip. Panda said that the airstrip can be made operational by flying small aircraft between Bhubaneswar-Gunupur and Vishakhapatnam under the UDAN scheme.

A CASE FOR ACTION



Businesses that bring reforms a bad name and further reduce the already weak trust that Indians have in the private sector cannot be the future of a resurgent India

It would be a mistake to think that the sudden fall in market cap by as much as USD 100 billion since the Hindenburg allegations brought the Adani stocks tumbling, can be managed with government backing, or the perception that he remains in the good books of the political leadership.

The point to note is that the Adani saga is not of Adani failing but of India failing, even if the stock market holds out in the near term. This is the story of a liberalisation programme that has gone haywire, of a post-1991 era that has hit its limits because the road is hijacked by those who redefine entrepreneurship from risk-taking and gut instinct to safe bets under the patronage of fail-safe deals for the chosen few, marking the crony capitalists of our times.

This is not the India that can sustain economic reforms. Businesses that bring reforms a bad name and further reduce the already weak trust that Indians have in the private sector cannot be the future of a resurgent India. It bears repetition that a good deal of the agitation against farm laws was the inherent lack of faith in the poli-

cymaking institutions and private sector to which the business was being handed. An illustration of this was the way in which the BJP leader and former Governor Satya Pal Malik spoke against the farm laws and raised questions on how Adani came to acquire land for warehouses just when the farm laws arrived.

As it is, India at this stage of development does not appear to believe in the private sector. The Economic Survey of India for 2016-17 pointed out: "The ambivalence in India (about the private sector and property rights) seems to be greater than elsewhere... It appears that India has distinct anti-market beliefs."

In short, whatever Adani has done for the powers that be, the powers that be will have to take the call that this is the time to clean up the mess and dump some of the rogue players. There will be too much of a national price to pay if such passengers are carried for long.

It is true that India is not alone in having its share of scams. The US economy is known for bigger ones - Theranos, Madoff, Enron are

a few from a long list. And just as the Indian media handled Adani, the US media treated Enron - first a red carpet, and then the kitchen sink. In the Adani case, the would-be media baron is now under attack from a media that steered clear of him and even went out of its way to heap praise ("Self-made billionaire Gautam Adani had an exceptional 2022 even by his own standards," according to one cover story) while those who did raise questions paid the price. He obliquely made light of Rahul Gandhi in a friendly TV interview, had a book on himself published and arranged a book tour; the unveiling at no less a space than the venerable IIM-Ahmedabad. Now, the entire national media is engaged in disrobing the man who could do no wrong until very recently. To put it mildly, Adani has many problems and a bad press and an explosive Opposition are just two of the many thorns giving him sleepless nights.

Take the US. In the case of Enron, the biggest bankruptcy of its kind in 2001, the US media before the bankruptcy was among the cheer leaders for a business that was essentially a fraud. But when the fraud came to be known, the Enron biggies were convicted and jailed, never mind that Chairman Ken Lay was known to be very close to and funded the campaign of US President George Bush, and CEO Jeff Skilling was well-connected and a part of the powerful Harvard Business School network. The US regulators acted. Justice was swift. It has been so almost every time businesses have turned scandalous. In India, this has typically not happened and the damage to the system is deep - much more than the damage one Adani family can ever do.

THE POINT TO NOTE IS THAT THE ADANI SAGA IS NOT OF ADANI FAILING BUT OF INDIA FAILING, EVEN IF THE STOCK MARKET HOLDS OUT IN THE NEAR TERM

It has happened before. A business grows, builds connections, grabs political patronage and thinks it can get away with anything. The game works for a while. The swell of false pride, projected numbers and publicity bring with it the feeling of invincibility. Bolder gambles follow. And the world appears to cheer the one who is said to rewrite rules, reframe the very idea of success. Then cometh the fall.

We have had our long list of business scams. Over time, they get bigger, and violations get normalised. This is the downside of poor governance made worse by poor regulatory systems. The results are everywhere, seen as much in non-performing assets that at one time crossed ₹10 lakh crore, as in the weak delivery of public services, delayed projects and a bureaucracy that works less for ordinary people and more for the powerful. The surprise here is not that scams happen, that business breeds greed and worse in some but that the State is unable or unwilling to act even in the eye-popping cases to make an example out of the most spectacular of the fraudsters.

The question therefore today in the Adani case is not how much the political establishment and the State are involved, the answer to which becomes a political ping-pong, but how fast the State can turn from accommodation to action. This is a time to send the signal that whatever be the connections, allegations of humongous violations, at least when they come out in the open, will be probed and met with radical surgery.

That stage has been reached in the Adani case. The government has a choice - it can sit back and do nothing, or it can choose swift regulatory action and full-fledged investigations into what has been alleged to be, in the words of Hindenburg Research, "the world's 3rd richest man... pulling the largest con in corporate history."

Preserving a Palestinian refuge

For nearly 75 years, the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East has been delivering education to refugees in Syria, Lebanon, Jordan, Gaza, and the West Bank, including East Jerusalem. Beyond enabling refugees to continue learning, UNRWA provides them with a safe haven - a place where they can escape the conflict, violence, and deepening economic crises that shape their everyday reality. But our ability to meet refugee children's needs is being increasingly constrained, for a tragically simple reason: lack of money.

The only UN agency running a full-fledged school system, UNRWA offers students a chance to reach their potential. Since 1950, more than two million refugees have graduated from UNRWA schools, which, in the 1960s, were among the first schools in the Middle East to achieve gender parity. And we continue to play a vital role in the region's education system: some 550,000 Palestinian children currently learn in more than 700 UNRWA-run schools.

Refugees are often perceived as a burden. But UNRWA graduates have gone on to make invaluable contributions to their communities and economies, becoming teachers, doctors, engineers, and scientists.

One alumnus controlled a drone helicopter that skimmed the surface of Mars. Moreover, every year, our vocational and training centres provide 8,000 young people with the skills they need to become sought after in the labour market.

Simply put, UNRWA provides quality and inclusive education that enables refugees to live dignified, productive lives. And it does so under the most difficult of circumstances. In Syria, UNRWA schools have remained open, and counsellors have offered psychosocial support to children, even in the most tumultuous periods of the country's civil war.

UNRWA schools also act as refuges. In the West Bank and Lebanon, they are sanctuaries for children enduring harsh living conditions. As Jana, a ten-year-old girl living in the Al-Arroub refugee camp in the West Bank, put it, "School is like a second home. It's the only place where we can have fun, learn, and meet friends." In Gaza, schools are transformed into shelters in times of conflict.

Moreover, UNRWA schools seek to foster respect for human rights, peaceful conflict resolution, tolerance, and critical thinking. For example, in 2001, UNRWA established school parliaments. From helping to resolve conflicts between students to engaging their

community and representing students in discussions with school administration, our 28,000 student parliamentarians - including Jana - are advancing the interests and education of their peers, while gaining firsthand experience in responsible citizenship. Dozens of UNRWA schools connect every year with their counterparts on different continents to collaborate on global challenges like protecting the environment.

UNRWA is also working to modernise its curricula in line with global trends toward digitalisation and connectivity. Our Strategy on Information and Communication Technologies for Education (ICT4E), launched last year, aims to close the technology gap by providing tablets to students, increasing access to the internet, and introducing ICT/computer classes to provide the skills graduates need to compete in local, regional, and global job markets.

The value of UNRWA's work is indisputable. But chronic underfunding is restricting our ability to do it. Already, Palestinian refugee children too often learn in schools with inadequate facilities. Their classrooms are overcrowded, and they learn in double shifts. They lack access to recreational spaces or equipment, and often even to basic needs like food, clean water,

electricity, and the internet. Many cannot afford transportation to and from school. And, though trauma is widespread, the psychosocial support we offer is often insufficient.

Refugee children - one of the world's most underprivileged populations - deserve better. UNRWA needs reliable and sustained funding to cover the monthly salaries of more than 20,000 teachers and other education personnel, and invest in continuous training of teachers. We need funding to make up the learning losses from the COVID-19 pandemic, support children's psychosocial health and well-being, and provide the appropriate resources and facilities, from science labs to playgrounds. And we need funding to adapt our schools to the digital age and pioneer new programmes.

There is perhaps no worthier investment. Funding UNRWA's educational programme is tantamount to investing in a better future - for refugee children, their families, their communities, and a region in turmoil.

Mr Justice-Governor

The office of the Governor has for quite some time become a place for political intrigue and the appointees are often tasked with furthering the interests of the ruling party at the Centre. The Raj Bhavans are more often than not stacked with either ruling party leaders or those seemingly rewarded for their actions that leave no one in doubt about their intent to serve the party in power with an ulterior motive.

It would not be wrong to view the appointment of former Supreme Court judge S Abdul Nazeer as the Governor of Andhra Pradesh February 12 in this light. What strengthens the suspicion that he is but a political appointee is the fact that he got the post within 40 days of his retirement from the apex court. There is no cooling off period for a judge so this intervening period is too short to prompt one to take a charitable view. It is being seen, not without justification, as a quid pro quo for his series of judgements in favour of the BJP government at the Centre in the recent past on some of the most controversial issues involving the entire nation. Starting from 3 Talaq, Ayodhya temple land issue and culminating in the Demonetization judgement, Nazeer has consistently shown his dark side to the observer. He is one of the three apex court judges who have been appointed to the plum posts of Governor or nominated as member of the Rajya Sabha by the current dispensation. This is a record of sorts and a matter of grave concern since the Constitutional distinction between the executive and the judiciary gets blurred in the process. These are two pillars of democracy and the separation of powers embodied in them is essential for the healthy functioning of the system of checks and balances guaranteeing the survival and incorruptibility of democracy.

Technically, there is nothing amiss in the appointment of Justice Nazeer. For, there is no provision in the Constitution that bars retired judges from accepting from the government offers of jobs in which their legal acumen will stand in good stead. But, it is a question of the legal principle of justice being seen to be done. It is this principle which runs the risk of being compromised if a retired judge gets government favours after retirement notably for verdicts he or she had given during their judicial tenure that suited the interests of the government.

This is precisely what a former legal luminary and a key BJP minister Arun Jaitley once stated inside and outside the Parliament condemning in unequivocal terms the practice of appointing retired judges in government positions. His words in the House on September 5, 2013, were emphatic and bear repetition: "The desire of a post-retirement job influences pre-retirement judgements. It is a threat to the independence of the judiciary."

Arun Jaitley was one of the triumvirate that ran the Narendra Modi-government since its installation in 2014 till his death. That his words can be turned upside down by the same government shows the latter's desperation and dire political necessity.

Justice Nazeer was part of the five-judge Bench that decided the disputed Ram Janmabhoomi case in November 2019 handing over the Ayodhya land to the Ramjanambhoomi Trust. The verdict was virtually a reward for criminals belonging to the saffron brigade who had pulled down the historic Babri Masjid. Close to his retirement on January 4 Justice Nazeer headed the Bench that upheld the Centre's Demonetization policy of November 2016. He was also part of a Constitution Bench that held that no further restriction can be added to the right to free speech under Article 19(1)(a) of the Constitution.

Before Justice Nazeer the Modi-government appointed former Chief Justice of India P Sathasivam as Governor of Kerala. Former CJI, Ranjan Gogoi, who presided over the Bench for the Ayodhya Ram Mandir dispute, was made a Rajya Sabha member soon after his retirement.

This action takes further the process of making the judiciary pliant to the executive by dangling carrots so as to foist autocratic rule with impunity. Nazeer exemplifies the real danger to the country's democratic system.

Fugleman

An obituary of Sir Rhodes Boyson, an eccentric and thoroughly conservative former headmaster who was a junior education minister under Margaret Thatcher, described him as an early fugleman for her cause. That's a rare word indeed. It tends these days to be used in the sense intended in the obituary, for a person who is a staunch advocate, a cheerleader or publicist, or - as Chambers Dictionary puts it in an odd intrusion of American slang into a Scots work - a mouthpiece. An older sense is that of a person who leads by example or an exemplar. Two decades ago, Philip Howard, a fine wordsmith and intrepid explorer of the byways of language, wrote of the famous editor of the Oxford English Dictionary: *The importance of Sir James Murray's pioneering work was recognized disgracefully late by his university, but it is now rightly recognized as fugleman for the rest of the world in lexicographical studies (The Times, 17 May 1990).* That meaning derives directly from the original German, Flügelmann, literally "wing man". He was a soldier of long experience, expert in the intensive drill of the old Prussian Army, who stood at the front and side of a company of soldiers to show how it should be done. The same technique was once used in the British Army, though an article in 1867 remarked that it had by then long since been done away with, only retained by a few old-fashioned yeomanry regiments such as the Gloucestershire Hussars. That article spelled it flugelman, but for half a century it had been appearing as fugleman, which has triumphed. Fuliginous

The diarist John Evelyn wrote in 1661 about the dreadful smoke from coal fires in London that was so bad that "Her Inhabitants breathe nothing but an impure and thick Mist, accompanied with a fuliginous and filthy vapour ... corrupting the Lungs, and disordering the entire habit of their bodies, so that Catharrs, Phthisicks1, Coughs and Consumptions rage more in this one City than in the whole Earth besides." Fuliginous usually means sooty but it can also refer to a sooty or dusky colour ("the whole body is of a rather light fuliginous or brownish grey", which is in a description of the bird called Bonaparte's shearwater) or to some noxious vapour said in old medical texts to be formed by combustion within the body and which affected the head in particular ("It is not amiss to bore the skull with an instrument to let out the fuliginous vapours" - The Anatomy of Melancholy by Robert Burton.) The word is from Latin fuligo, soot, which has also been used in English with the same meaning. Fuligo ligni is the Latin for wood soot, a form of charcoal; it was once listed in the British Pharmacopoeia as an antispasmodic, for instance to help with the treatment of whooping cough.

Cop dragged on car's bonnet for 1.50km

Palghar: A traffic police constable was dragged on the bonnet of a car for nearly 1.50 km as its driver suddenly drove the vehicle after being stopped for jumping signal in Vasai town of Maharashtra's Palghar district, an official said Monday. The constable was on duty at a busy junction in Vasai on Mumbai's fringes when he spotted a car having Uttar Pradesh registration jumping traffic signal, and asked its driver to stop, Patil said.

Father-son duo killed in mishap

Jabalpur: A 45-year-old man and his 14-year-old son were killed Monday when a truck hit their motorcycle near a bypass on a national highway in Jabalpur district of Madhya Pradesh, police said. The duo, identified as Suresh Choubey and his son Anash Choubey died on the spot, City Superintendent of Police (CSP) Tushar Singh told PTI. Sub-Divisional Magistrate Rishabh Jain said the people living around the spot of the accident near the Khajri Khiriyia bypass blocked the road demanding measures by local authorities to check frequent road accidents in the area.

Delhi: Gang forging Aadhar, PAN busted

New Delhi: With the arrest of three persons, the Delhi Police's Crime Branch said it has busted a racket involved in forging documents including Aadhaar cards, PAN card, and driving license for obtaining SIM cards, opening bank accounts and taking loans. The accused, who were operating from a cyber cafe in Jahangirpuri area, also used to sell the bank account details to other fraudsters, the official added.

Cold wave sweeps HP

Shimla: A piercing cold wave swept Himachal Pradesh Monday with the mercury plummeting to minus 13.2 degrees Celsius, 5 notches below normal, in Keylong, according to the meteorological department. Night temperatures dropped by two to six degrees despite dry weather in the state and remained below normal. Top court dismisses plea against J&K delimitation

New Delhi, Feb 13: The Supreme Court Monday dismissed a plea challenging the validity of delimitation of constituencies in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, saying there was "nothing illegal" about the exercise.

A bench of Justices S K Kaul and A S Oka, however, said it was not dealing with the validity of the matter concerning the abrogation of Article 370 of the Constitution as it was pending before another bench of the apex court.

Dismissing a plea filed by two Kashmir residents challenging the Centre's decision to constitute the delimitation commission for redrawing the legislative assembly and Lok Sabha constituencies in the UT, the bench referred to Articles 3, 4 and 239A of the Constitution and said Parliament was empowered by law to create a body of legislature for the UTs of Puducherry and J&K. "We have rejected the delimitation commission from the outset. It does not matter to us what the verdict is," Mehbooba told reporters.

The Congress unit of J&K said it was disappointed with the verdict.

The apex court also held there is "no illegality" associated with the establishment of the delimitation commission under the March 6, 2020 order by which the Centre had constituted a delimitation commission for redrawing the constituencies in the UT.

"There is nothing illegal about the exercise of delimitation/readjustment of the constituencies undertaken by the delimitation commission for the purposes of dividing the Union Territory into 90 constituencies on the basis of the 2011



census figures," the bench said in its 54-page verdict.

The plea was filed by Haji Abdul Gani Khan and Mohammad Ayub Mattoo. The bench, however, clarified that the findings rendered in the judgment are on the footing that the exercise of power made in 2019 under clauses

(1) and (3) of Article 370 of the Constitution is valid. "We are aware that the issue of the validity of the exercise of the said powers is the subject matter of petitions pending before this court. Therefore, we have not dealt with the issue of validity. Nothing stated in this judgment shall be construed as giving our imprimatur to the exercise of powers under clauses (1) and (3) of Article 370 of the Constitution," it said.

The top court is seized of separate petitions challenging the constitutional validity of the Centre's decision to abrogate provisions of Article 370 on August 5, 2019. Several petitions have been filed in the apex court challenging the Centre's decision to abrogate provisions of Article 370 and the J&K Reorganisation Act, 2019, which split J&K into two Union Territories — Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh. By abrogating Article 370, the Central government revoked the special status of Jammu and Kashmir. In its verdict delivered Monday, the bench noted that during the hearing, the counsel appearing for the petitioners attempted to assail the validity of certain provisions of the J&K Reorganisation Act. It noted that initially, the counsel said the petitioners did not wish to challenge the provisions but subsequently, he argued that a challenge to relevant provisions of the J&K Reorganisation Act was implicit in this plea.

The bench said there cannot be any doubt that when a party wants to challenge the constitutional validity of a statute, he must plead in detail the grounds on which the validity of the statute is sought to be challenged.

Reacting to the SC verdict, the National Conference said it is not "heartbroken" and was sure of a victory in the petitions challenging the abrogation of Article 370 by the Centre

4 rail trackmen killed as tower wagon hits them

Nashik, Feb 13: Four railway trackmen were killed after a tower wagon hit them in Maharashtra's Nashik district Monday, officials said.

The tower wagon is used for maintenance of overhead equipment in electrified sections. The incident took place at around 5.45 am between Lasalgaon and Ugaon stations of the Central Railway, the officials said. The trackmen were working when the tower wagon came from the wrong side and crushed them to death, a police official said.

After getting information about the incident, a team of Lasalgaon police reached the spot. They took the wagon driver into custody, he said. The four employees were rushed to Lasalgaon rural hospital where doctors declared them dead, the police said.



Later, angry railway employees staged a protest on tracks at Lasalgaon railway station, claiming senior officials did not reach the spot even after three hours of the accident.

The protesters stopped Manmad-Mumbai Lokmanya Tilak Terminus Godavari Express for about 10 minutes. The agitators were pacified by Bhusawal Divisional Railway Manager SS Kedia who announced suspension of three staffers, as well as Rs 50,000 as immediate relief to the kin of the deceased and stipulated compensation of Rs 25 lakh each in a day's time.

Governor-CM ties continue to sour in Punjab

Chandigarh, Feb 13: Punjab Governor Banwarilal Purohit Monday questioned a government appointment and the selection of school principals for a foreign trip, drawing a sharp response from Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann who said his government is only answerable to Punjabis and not a Centre-appointed governor.

The row erupted after Purohit wrote a letter to Mann asking for details on the selection of government school principals sent to Singapore for a training seminar, saying he has received complaints of "malpractices and illegalities".

The governor also questioned the appointment of Gurinderjit Singh Jawanda as the Punjab Information and Communication Technology Corporation Limited chairman and pointed out that his name figured in a kidnapping and property grabbing case.

Claiming that Mann "never cared to reply" to his letters in the past, Purohit told the Chief Minister that people did not elect him to run the state according to his "whims and fancies" and that as per the Constitution, he is "bound to

furnish" any information sought by Raj Bhavan.

He asked Mann to reply to his letter within a fortnight, failing which he would seek legal advice for further action.

Taking to Twitter, Mann said his government is accountable only to 3 crore Punjabis.

"Honourable Governor Sir, your letter was received through the media... All the issues mentioned in the letter are State subjects... According to the Constitution, I and my government are accountable to 3 crore Punjabis and not any governor appointed by the central government. Treat this as my reply," the Chief Minister said in a tweet in Punjab.

The Punjab government had sent 36 government school principals to a professional teacher training seminar in Singapore from February 6 to 10.

"I have received complaints in respect to the selection of principals for sending them to Singapore for training. The complainants point out certain malpractices and illegalities in the selection of these principals. The allegation is that there is no transparency," Purohit said in his letter.

New Delhi, Feb 13: Rajya Sabha, which went into a month-long recess Monday, saw the first half of the Budget session being overshadowed by the Adani issue, with proceedings disrupted on the last day also as protesting opposition MPs, some of whom were named by the Chair, pressed their demand for a Joint Parliamentary Committee probe.

Rajya Sabha Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar named around eight MPs of the Opposition who were shouting slogans in the Well but did not specify the action against them.

Asking the Opposition to maintain decorum and allow the Question Hour to continue, he said,

"Does the public expect us to be like this... It does not". "I am constrained on account of persistent obstruction and I would go to the extent of saying deliberate obstruction..." he said. The Chairman said that precious time had been lost already.

Before adjourning the House till next month, he warned, "Members, I am pleading with you for the last time. If the House is subjected to such kind of disturbance, disruption, violation of rules, I will be constrained to act as per expectations of the people." The House will now meet at 11 am March 13. On Friday, the chairman suspended Congress' Rajani Patil for the remaining part of the budget session for circulating an unauthorised video of House proceedings.

Dalit student death: IIT-B orders probe

Mumbai, Feb 13: The IIT-Bombay Monday condoled the death by suicide of B.Tech First Year Dalit student, Darshan Solanki, terming it as "a great loss to the family and to the IITB community."

In its first reaction, the IIT-B said: "It is unfortunate that such a loss

could not be prevented despite the efforts of the Institute and Student Mentors to support our students. A committee has been constituted to investigate the incident."

The IIT-B held a condolence meeting and observed two minutes of silence in memory of the departed soul, said a spokesperson. In a shocking incident, Solanki,

18, jumped to his death from the 7th floor of his hostel building in the Powai Campus Sunday afternoon, after his first semester exams for the Chemical Engineering course a day earlier. According to certain reports, Solanki reportedly did not heed warning shouts from other co-students who noticed him just before he took the plunge to death.

Earlier Monday a student group, the Ambedkar Periyar Phule Study Circle-IITB had pointed fingers at the IIT-B for alleged discrimination prevalent on the Powai Campus against students from reserved categories, various lapses on the part of the management to address their distress, etc., and sought redressal.

Govt can't act as robber of citizens: K'taka HC

Quoting St Augustine from his 5th century book 'The City of God,' the Court said, "Without justice, what else is the State but a great band of robbers?"

Bangalore, Feb 13: Coming down heavily on the Karnataka Industrial Area Development Board (KIADB), the High Court of Karnataka has said that the government cannot "act as robbers".

Petitioners M V Guruprasad and Nandini Guruprasad approached the HC against the acquisition of their land by KIADB in 2007. Initially, their names were missing from the acquisition notification. It took them seven years to get the government to issue a corrigendum in 2014 and include their names. However, no compensation has been paid to them ever since. "There is no plausible explanation

as to why the payment of compensation is withheld for a decade and half," Justice Krishna S Dixit said in his recent judgment.

Though the challenge to land acquisition was rejected by the Court, it ordered that the compensation should be re-fixed at the rate of 50 per cent computed under the Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act, 2013. The KIADB was also directed to pay a cost of Rs 25,000 per acre to the petitioners.

Coming down heavily on the authorities, the HC in its judgment said, "The government cannot act as a robber of citizens lands; taking away private lands for the pur-



ported public purpose sans compensation militates against the spirit of constitutional guarantee

enacted under Article 300A, the fundamental right to property no longer being on the statute book,

notwithstanding."

Five acres and one gunta of land of Guruprasad and 38 guntas of land in the name of his wife Nandini were acquired by the KIADB. Sites were formed on it and the court noted that after allotment these have fetched Rs 7.5 crore to the KIADB, "that too, with the rebate rate of 50 percent of the market value."

The non-payment of compensation and the "conduct reinforces the shackles of a feudalistic attitude from which the transformative character of our constitution seeks to liberate. Their action in not paying the compensation is not only grossly violative of property rights constitutionally guaranteed under

Article 300A but gnaws at overarching objectives of a Welfare State ordained under the Constitution," the court said.

It directed the authorities to compute and pay the compensation along with an additional interest at 12 per cent per annum.

Quoting a 1904 US case (Justice Oliver Wendell Homes in Davis Vs Mills), the HC said, "Constitutions are intended to preserve practical and substantial rights, not to maintain theories."

The court also expressed "its deep anguish against the culpable action of Respondent-KIADB and its officials in putting the petitioner-land-losers to a great hardship and misery."

Guv seeks to pick holes on DMK's social justice plank

THIS WAS THE GOVERNOR'S FRESH ATTACK ON THE RULING PARTY AFTER A GAP OF ABOUT A MONTH

Chennai, Feb 13: Although there is a lot of talk on social justice, Dalits in Tamil Nadu face atrocities of some kind every other day, Governor RN Ravi has said apparently targeting the ruling DMK after a gap of about a month.

Had the nation listened to Dr BR Ambedkar, partition could have been averted or it would not have been as traumatic as it was since millions died and several millions were displaced, he said.

Atrocities against Scheduled Castes ranged from throwing human feces in the water tank of a Dalit colony, public humiliation, assault, no entry into temples and discrimination at anganwadis, he said seeking to corner the governing party over its avowed ideals of social justice.

In his address at the release of Tamil versions of 'Modi@20: Dreams Meet Delivery' and 'Ambedkar and Modi—Reformer's ideals, performer's implementation' here Sunday, he said the response of the law enforcement and criminal justice system was awful when it came to crimes against Dalits in the state. The conviction rate was just 7 per cent in rape cases vis-a-vis Dalit women.

Referring to a Comptroller and Auditor General of India report, he said 30 per cent of Centre's funds for building houses for Dalits remained unspent and a major component of the rest of the fund got diverted for other purposes.



Earlier, Dr Ambedkar was used for the purpose of political mobilisation and "thanks to Prime Minister Modi we have started talking about him." Some people used to swear on Ambedkar's name either to accuse the other person over some issue or for praising oneself.

Hailing Babasaheb as a great nationalist, Ravi said when the British regime tried to create a 'separate electorate for SC/ST' and there by divide the society further, Ambedkar stood like a rock and did not allow that.

When Muslim League started demanding Pakistan, the Indian National Congress thought that they could manage the matter but Ambedkar forewarned against it.

Citing a book of the architect of the Constitution, 'Pakistan or the partition of India,' written before the nation's partition, the Governor said: "Had we listened to him, perhaps partition could have been

averted or it would not have been as traumatic (as it was), millions died and several millions were displaced and rendered homeless. But, we did not listen to him."

Union Minister of State for Information and Broadcasting, L Murugan, Anna University Vice-Chancellor, R Velraj and Director IIT-Madras V Kamakoti and former Vice-Chancellor, TN Dr MGR Medical University, Sudha Seshayyan took part.

Last month, Ravi walked out from the state assembly following a face-off with Chief Minister MK Stalin over the former's customary address to members of the house in its first session of the year.

In his address, Ravi skipped a few portions of the draft prepared by the government, prompting Stalin to move a resolution to expunge from records all such comments made by the Governor that didn't conform to the draft.

Rahul's BJJ boosts party prospects in Karnataka

landowners.

The leaked findings went on to become sensational news in the state and triggered a huge controversy. Lingayats and Vokkaligas who played an important role solely by the numbers, faced the challenge of politically becoming not so relevant.

The politics in Karnataka is caste-driven and caste groups, caste seers, especially from Lingayat, Vokkaliga and Kuruba communities play an important role in elections. The seers will also wield greater influence on the successive governments.

The Congress government led by Siddaramaiah in Karnataka ordered for Social and Educational

Survey in 2014. The Siddaramaiah government maintained that the findings would enable it to take decisions on reservations and quotas in the Other Backward Communities (OBC) category.

The humongous task of conducting a survey of 1.6 crore households in Karnataka was completed. About 1.6 lakh personnel went door to door across the state and the task was completed with the government spending Rs 169 crore to complete the task. Bharat Electronics limited was given the task of digitising the work.

The Karnataka State Backward Classes Commission Chairperson H. Kantharaj monitored the survey. Somehow, the report is not presented before the Cabinet and sources say it is lying with the member secretary of the commission. Kantharaj's tenure ended in 2019 and presently the commission is headed by Jayaprakash Hegde.

Insiders explain that the politicians belonging to Lingayat and

Vokkaliga communities from all three political parties want to bury the report. Siddaramaiah, who got the survey done for the first time in the country since 1935, was not able to accept and reveal the findings of the report.

After Siddaramaiah, his successor HD Kumaraswamy of JD(S) came to power and the coalition government did not bother to look into the issue. Congress leaders started vehemently demanding for making the findings of caste survey public when BJP grabbed power.

Siddaramaiah, the Leader of Opposition, charged and challenged BJP to make the caste census pub-

lic. He also attacked Kumaraswamy. Former CM BS Yediyurappa, CM Basavaraj Bommai and Kumaraswamy chided Siddaramaiah as to why he did not do the job. Siddaramaiah in turn questioned them that he accepts that he couldn't release the report and why they are not interested?

The heated exchange of words over the issue lasted for a few months. As the state is heading to assembly elections in less than two months, all political parties are tight-lipped on the caste census. No one wants to antagonise any community, especially Lingayats and Vokkaligas in the state, sources explain.

Kota Srinivas Poojari, Minister for Social Welfare, stated that the ball is in the court of Backwards Commission. It has to submit the report first and then the ruling BJP government can decide over it.

Former Chairperson of the Commission CS Dwarakanath has demanded several times that since a huge amount of Rs 168 crore had been spent on the caste census, it should be made public. Siddaramaiah had charged ruling BJP that it is deliberately not accepting the report. BJP has maintained that the issue is being raised only to get political mileage.

Exotic pets trade continues unabated in many TN cities

Chennai, Feb 13: The sale of exotic pets continues unabated in Chennai and other cities like Tiruchi, Madurai and Coimbatore and its outskirts even after the imported pets are being seized at international airports in Tamil Nadu.

In the past fifty days, two consignments of exotic pets were seized at Chennai international airport. They included mangabeys, pythons and marmosets.

Interestingly 171-star tortoises meant for export to far eastern countries were also intercepted at Chennai airport in the last fifty days. In the first seizure of 2023, 45 varieties of ball pythons, three marmosets, and eight corn snakes were caught by customs at Chennai airport.

PR Saravanan, an animal rights activist based out of Chennai told



IANS, "The animals which are classified as exotic species are being smuggled in tight containers and the animals are stressed during travel. The sale of these exotic pets is touching lakhs and crores in Tamil Nadu and the illegal trade has to be curbed by the authorities."

However, sources in the Chennai City police told IANS that there is

a lack of coordination between the Customs department and the police and this has helped several smugglers to go scot-free.

Another issue that is plaguing the law enforcers is the failure to ascertain the exact value of the seized exotic species.

Tiruchi, Madurai and Coimbatore, the cities where international flights land, are also thriving hot spots for the sale of exotic species.

According to animal rights activists, the smuggled exotic species of animals are taken to other states like Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, and Kerala from these airports.

Customs officials told IANS that the seized smuggled species are sent back to their country of origin. The officials were tight-lipped when asked about handing over these cases to the Tamil Nadu police.



Top court refuses CBI challenge to NSE ex-MD's bail

New Delhi, Feb 13: The Supreme Court Monday refused to interfere with a Delhi High Court order granting bail to Chitra Ramkrishna, a former managing director of the National Stock Exchange, in the co-location scam case being probed by the CBI.

It also refused to interfere with the high court's order granting bail to the exchange's former group operating officer (GOO), Anand Subramanian, who was arrested in the case February 24 last year. The CBI had arrested Ramkrishna March 6 last year, a day after her anticipatory bail application was dismissed by a trial court.

She was arrested in the ED case July 14 last year. During the hearing in the apex court, Additional Solicitor General (ASG) Sanjay Jain, representing the CBI, contended that the high court's order was "absolutely misconceived".

OLD BUDGET ROW

Gehlot hits back at Modi

Jaipur, Feb 13: Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot Monday called his state budget a "model" for others to follow and offered to send a copy to the Centre, a day after Prime Minister Narendra Modi poked fun over a goof-up during his Budget presentation.

Gehlot said he rectified his mistake within "34 seconds", and claimed that the BJP is rattled by his government's performance in the Congress-run state that goes to the polls this year-end. "I can send the copy of the Budget to the prime minister and he can send it to Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman. They will realise that our budget is a model budget," the Rajasthan CM told PTI.

Reacting to Modi's charge at the Dausa rally that the Congress did not carry out infrastructure development in border areas fearing that the enemy might use the new roads to advance into Indian territory, the CM accused the prime minister of ignoring the work done in the past. The CM claimed that the BJP in Rajasthan is disturbed due to the performance of the state government in health, education, social security and infrastructure development.

Centre open to setting up panel

New Delhi, Feb 13: The Centre Monday agreed to the Supreme Court's proposal to set up a panel of experts to look into strengthening the regulatory mechanisms for the stock market in the wake of the recent Adani group shares crash triggered by Hindenburg Research's fraud allegations.

The top court Friday said the interests of Indian investors need to be protected against market volatility in the backdrop of the Adani stocks rout and asked the Centre to consider setting up a panel of domain experts headed by a former judge to look into strengthening the regulatory mechanisms.

The court, which was hearing two PILs alleging exploitation of innocent investors and "artificial crashing" of the Adani Group's stock value, was told by Solicitor General Tushar Mehta that the Centre was agreeable to the proposal as it came from the court.

Mehta, however, told the bench also comprising Justices PS Narasimha and JB Pardiwala, that the "remit" of the proposed committee would be relevant because any "unintentional" message to the investors that regulatory bodies here needed a monitoring by a panel may have some adverse impact on flow of money into the country.

"I have instructions that the SEBI and other agencies are fully equipped, not only regime wise, but otherwise also to take care of the situation. However, responding to the suggestion which fell from the court, the government has no objection to con-

It also wanted to be allowed to provide details such as names and the scope of the panel's mandate in a "sealed cover"

stituting a committee."

"But the remit of the committee would be very relevant because any unintentional message to international investors or domestic investors that the regulatory authorities need a monitoring by the committee may have some adverse impact on the flow of money," the top law officer said at the outset of the hearing. He said the Centre may be allowed to suggest names, who are people of "some calibre" and scope of the proposed committee in a sealed cover because it may not be appropriate to discuss these in open court hearings.

The bench then asked the law officer to give the note by Wednesday and listed the two PILs for further hearing February 17. The top court had also sought the views of the SEBI and the Centre as to how to ensure putting a robust mechanism in place since the capital movement now is "seamless" in the country.

The stock market is not the place where only high value investors invest, it had said, adding that with the changing financial and tax regime investments are being made

by "the wide spectrum of middle class." It had noted that as per some reports the total loss suffered by Indian investors due to the recent Adani stocks rout was in the range of several lakh crores of rupees.

On the issue of strengthening the existing regulatory regime, the bench had mooted a committee which can comprise experts from the securities areas, the international banking sector and a "wise guiding figure in the form of a former judge".

One PIL filed by lawyer Vishal Tiwari sought a direction to the Centre to constitute a committee monitored by a retired apex court judge to inquire into the Hindenburg Research report which has made a slew of allegations against the business conglomerate led by industrialist Gautam Adani.

Another PIL filed by advocate M L Sharma sought prosecution of short-seller Nathan Anderson of the US-based Hindenburg Research and his associates in India and the US for allegedly exploiting innocent investors and the "artificial crashing" of the Adani Group's stock value in the market.

Nominated members can't vote: Apex court

Amid a prolonged tussle between the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) and the BJP, there have been three failed attempts to elect the Mayor

New Delhi, Feb 13: Nominated members of the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) cannot vote in the mayoral election and the constitutional provision is "very clear" on that, the Supreme Court observed Monday.

As a bench headed by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud posted for Friday the hearing on a plea filed by AAP mayoral candidate Shelly

Oberoi seeking early holding of the mayoral poll, Additional Solicitor General (ASG) Sanjay Jain, appearing for the office of Delhi lieutenant governor, said the February 16 poll would be postponed to a date after February 17.

"Nominated members cannot go for election. The constitutional provision is very clear," the bench, also comprising Justices P S Narasimha and J B Pardiwala, orally observed. "Nominated mem-

bers should not vote. That is very well settled. It is very clear Mr Jain," the CJI told the ASG.

However, Jain said he would argue on this aspect. Advocate Shadan Farasat, appearing for

Oberoi, told the bench that the petitioner is seeking two directions - nominated members should not be permitted to vote and the elections of mayor, deputy mayor and standing committee be separated.

The apex court had February 8 sought responses of the LG office, pro tem presiding officer Satya Sharma of the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) and others on Oberoi's plea.

Senior advocate A M Singhvi, appearing for the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) leader, had pointed out that the MCD House was convened three times but the election of the mayor was not held. The petitioner had moved the apex court February 7, a day after the MCD House failed to elect a mayor for the third time following a ruckus as the AAP objected to the presiding officer saying that the aldermen nominated by the LG will vote in the election.

Palestinian killed

Ramallah: A Palestinian was killed, and five were injured early Monday by Israeli soldiers during clashes in the northern West Bank city of Nablus, Palestinian medics and eyewitnesses said. The Palestinian Red Crescent Society in Nablus said that Amir Bustami, 21, died in the hospital due to severe injuries after being shot by Israeli soldiers, Xinhua news agency reported. It said in a statement that the five others were moderately injured during clashes between dozens of Palestinian young men and the Israeli armed forces.

Three nabbed

Nairobi: Kenyan police said Monday that they are interrogating three suspects with 12 pieces of elephant tusks with a street value of 5.8 million shillings (46,290 U.S. dollars) in the lakeside town of Naivasha, northwest of Nairobi. National police spokesperson Resila Onyango said security forces recovered 58 kilograms of elephant tusks from the three suspects who were arrested on Sunday in Naivasha, Xinhua news agency reported. Onyango said that going by the number of recovered tusks, it shows six elephants were killed.

Quake hits NZ

Hong Kong: An earthquake with a magnitude of 6.1 jolted Kermadec Islands in New Zealand at 09:18:07 GMT on Monday, the U.S. Geological Survey said. The epicentre, with a depth of 374.033 km, was initially determined to be at 29.5218 degrees south latitude and 177.9727 degrees west longitude.

US sent balloons more than 10 times: China

Beijing, Feb 13: China Monday said more than 10 US high-altitude balloons have flown in its airspace during the past year without its permission, following Washington's accusation that Beijing operates a fleet of surveillance balloons around the world.

The United States denied that it operates any surveillance balloons over China. The Chinese allegation came after the US shot down a suspected Chinese spy balloon that had crossed from Alaska to South Carolina, sparking a new crisis in bilateral relations that have spiralled to their lowest level in decades.

Foreign Ministry spokesperson Wang Wenbin gave no details about the alleged US balloons, how they had been dealt with or whether they had government or military links. "It is also common for US balloons to illegally enter the airspace of other countries," Wang said at a daily briefing.

"Since last year, US high-altitude balloons have illegally flown over China's airspace more than 10 times without the approval of Chinese authorities," Wang said the US should "first reflect on itself and change course, rather

than smear and instigate a confrontation".

China says the balloon shot down by the US was an unmanned airship made for meteorological research that had been blown off course. It has accused the US of overreacting by shooting it down and threatened to take unspecified action in response.

In Washington, National Security Council spokesperson Adrienne Watson said on Monday that any claim that the US government operates surveillance balloons over China is false. "It is China that has a high-altitude surveillance balloon program for intelligence collection, connected

to the People's Liberation Army, that it has used to violate the sovereignty of the United States and over 40 countries across five continents," Watson said.

"This is the latest example of China scrambling to do damage control. It has repeatedly and

wrongly claimed the surveillance balloon it sent over the United States was a weather balloon and to this day has failed to offer any credible explanations for its intrusion into our airspace and the airspace of others."

Following the balloon incident, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken cancelled a visit to Beijing that many had hoped would put the brakes on the sharp decline in relations over Taiwan, trade, human rights and threatening Chinese actions in the disputed South China Sea.

Also Monday, the Philippines accused a Chinese coast guard ship of targeting a Philippine coast guard vessel with a military-grade laser and temporarily blinding some of its crew in the South China Sea, calling it a "blatant" violation of Manila's sovereign rights.

Wang said a Philippine coast guard vessel had trespassed into Chinese waters without permission on February 6 and that Chinese coast guard vessels responded "professionally and with restraint".

China claims virtually all of the strategic waterway and has been steadily building up its maritime forces and island outposts.

Blasphemy killing: 75 arrested in Pak

Lahore, Feb 13: Over 75 suspects, including members of the radical Tehreek Laibbaik Pakistan (TLP) outfit, have been arrested for their alleged role in the lynching of a blasphemy-accused man in Punjab province of Pakistan, police said Monday.

A violent mob Saturday stormed the police station at Warburton in Nankana Sahib, some 80kms from Lahore, took custody of Waris Ali Issa, who was arrested for allegedly desecrating the holy book, stripped him naked, and dragged him into the streets before beating him to death.

An FIR has been registered against over 800 suspects for killing Waris, attacking police personnel, and ransacking the police station under terrorism and different sections of the Pakistan Penal Code. "So far we have arrested over 75 suspects as identification of more suspects is in the process through various mobile video and CCTV clips," Nankana Sahib District Police Officer (DPO) Asim Iftikhar said on Monday.

He said activists of a religious outfit were also involved in the brutal killing of Waris. "The religious extremists incited the people through announcements from mosques to storm the police station and take custody of the blasphemy accused," Iftikhar said, adding that the police had "hidden" Waris in the bathroom of the police station in order to save him from the wrath of the people but to no avail.

Another senior officer said that TLP activists were involved in inciting people and leading the mob. "10 members of the TLP are included in those arrested in the lynching. Raids are underway to arrest the remaining TLP activists involved in the crime," the officer said.

Victims face despair as rescue efforts wane

Adiyaman (Turkey), Feb 13: Thousands left homeless by a massive earthquake that struck Turkey and Syria a week ago packed into crowded tents or lined up in the streets for hot meals on Monday, while the desperate search for anyone still alive likely entered its last hours.

A crew wrested a four-year-old girl from rubble in hard-hit Adiyaman, 177 hours after the 7.8 magnitude earthquake struck. The rescuers were among thousands of local and overseas teams, including Turkish coal miners and experts aided by sniffer dogs and thermal cameras, who scoured pulverized apartment blocks for signs of life.

While stories of near-miraculous rescues have flooded the airwaves in recent days — many broadcast live on Turkish television and beamed around the world — tens of thousands of dead have been found during the same period.

Experts say given the freezing temperatures — and the total col-

lapse of so many buildings — the window for such rescues is nearly shut. The quake and hundreds of aftershocks, some nearly as powerful as the first, struck south-eastern Turkey and northern Syria on February 6, killing more than 35,000 and reducing whole swaths of towns and cities inhabited by millions to fragments of concrete and twisted metal.

Some 100 kilometres (62 miles) from the epicentre, almost no houses were left standing in the village of Polat, where residents salvaged refrigerators, washing machines and other goods from wrecked homes.

Not enough tents have arrived for the homeless, said survivor Zehra Kurukafa, forcing families to share the tents that are available. "We sleep in the mud, all together with two, three, even four families," said Kurukafa.

In the city of Adiyaman, 25-year-old Musa Bozkurt waited for a vehicle to bring him and others to the city of Afyon, in western Turkey. "We're going away, but we have no idea what will happen when we get there," Bozkurt said. "We have no goal. Even if there was (a plan) what good will it be after this hour? I no longer have my father or my uncle. What do I have left?"

Fuat Ekinci, a 55-year-farmer, was reluctant to leave his home for Afyon despite the destruction, saying he didn't have the means to live elsewhere and had fields that need to be tended.

Thousands march in Israel as Netanyahu allies push overhaul

Jerusalem, Feb 13: Tens of thousands of Israelis — hoisting flags, blowing on horns and chanting "democracy" and "no to dictatorship" — protested outside the parliament building on Monday as Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's government formally launched a contentious plan to overhaul the country's legal system.

It was the largest protest outside the Knesset in years and reflected the deep divisions over the plan. The proposed changes have triggered weeks of mass demonstrations, drawn cries of protests from influential business leaders and former military men and even prompted a statement of concern from President Joe Biden.

Despite a plea from the nation's figurehead president to put the legislation on hold, Netanyahu's allies approved a series of legislative changes during a stormy committee meeting on Tuesday. The vote now sends the legislation to the full parliament for a series of votes — an opening salvo in a battle expected to stretch on for weeks.

"They hear our cry. They hear the strong voice of truth," opposition leader Yair Lapid said from the stage outside parliament. "They hear it and they're afraid." Netanyahu and his supporters say the proposed changes are needed to rein in a judiciary that wields too much power. But his critics say the judicial overhaul is tantamount to a coup and will destroy Israeli democracy.

They also say that Netanyahu, who is on trial for a series of corruption charges, has a conflict of interest. The protesters came from across the country.

4,815 victims in Portugal church sex abuse scandal: Report

THE MAJORITY OF THE SEXUAL ABUSES TOOK PLACE WHEN THE CHILDREN WERE AGED 10-14, WITH THE YOUNGEST VICTIM BEING JUST TWO-YEAR-OLD

Lisbon, Feb 13: At least 4,815 children were sexually abused by members of the Portuguese Catholic Church — mostly priests — over the past 70 years, a report by the commission investigating the issue said Monday, adding the findings are the tip of the iceberg.

"(We want) to pay a sincere tribute to those who were abuse victims during their childhood and dared to give a voice to silence," said child psychiatrist Pedro Strecht, who headed the commission. "They are much more than a statistic."

Strecht said the 4,815 cases

were the "absolute minimum" number of victims of sexual abuse by clergy members in Portugal since 1950. Most perpetrators (77%) were priests and most of the victims were men, Strecht said, adding that they were abused in Catholic schools, churches, priests' homes, confessionals, among other locations.

The majority of the sexual abuses took place when the children were aged 10-14, with the youngest victim being just two-year-old. Jose Ornelas, head of the Bishops' Conference, attended the final report's presentation and will respond to it later on Monday. The Church has previously said it was prepared to "take



appropriate measures".

The Portuguese Catholic Church was rocked last year by

cases of alleged cover-up of sexual abuse including by bishops who remain active in church roles.

The commission said it was preparing a list of accused priests still working.

The Portuguese commission started its work in January 2022 after a report in France revealed around 3,000 priests and religious officials sexually abused over 200,000 children. The abuse allegations have come from people from various backgrounds, from every region of the country and also from Portuguese nationals living in other countries in Europe, Africa and the Americas.

The commission spoke with over 500 victims, analysed historical church documents and interviewed bishops and other clergy members. A total of 25 of

the testimonies heard by the commission were sent to the public prosecutors' office for investigation as all others were committed over 20 years ago and legal proceedings can no longer be initiated.

The commission said the law should be changed so legal proceedings can be initiated for historic crimes committed 30 years ago. The commission, which says it is independent, was financed by the Catholic Church. Asked by Reuters in December 2021 if that could be a threat to the commission's independence, Strecht said he would be the first to walk out and denounce it if the church intervened in the process.

Net profit at Rs 97 crore in October-December was a massive 273 per cent higher than Rs 26 crore net profit in the same period a year back, the company said. Revenue soared 54 per cent to Rs 219 crore while EBITDA almost doubled to Rs 171 crore.

RIL, ONGC seek CBM investment

New Delhi: Billionaire Mukesh Ambani's Reliance Industries Ltd and state-owned Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC) are separately auctioning natural gas extracted from coal seams at prices linked to Brent crude oil price. Reliance is seeking a minimum \$12.75 per million British thermal unit for coal bed methane (CBM) from a block in Shahdol district of Madhya Pradesh, while ONGC wants \$9.35 for the same kind of fuel from North Karanpura in Jharkhand.

Renault, Nissan to invest \$600mn

Tokyo: Nissan Motor Co and Renault SA said Monday they would invest \$600 million to make six new models in India. The Japanese and French automakers will work on the projects from their base in Chennai, turning it into an export hub, they said in a statement. The six models, with each automaker making three, will be built on joint platforms and will also be exported, they said. The new models will consist of two electric vehicles, the first EVs to be rolled out by the automakers in India, and four sports utility vehicles (SUVs).

HDFC Bank begins offline payment pilot under RBI sandbox

Mumbai, Feb 13: The country's largest private sector lender HDFC Bank Monday said it is attempting to execute digital payments in an offline mode under a regulatory facility to test innovations.

Apart from executing transactions in no network areas, such a facility will be of help in urban pockets experiencing bad networks and also in aircraft.

It can be noted that there is a facility which helps users with feature phones undertake Unified Payments Interface (UPI) transactions.

HDFC Bank has begun the pilot in a partnership with Crunchfish, IDFC Bank and M2P Fintech under the RBI's regulatory sandbox programme after getting the nod in September 2022, it said.

The lender will roll-out this service as part of a limited pilot for four months in more than 16 cities and towns across the country. The offline transaction amount would be limited to up to ₹200 per transaction.

Digital payment typically requires one either the customer or the merchant to be online to get executed. The pilot is attempting to ensure that a transaction goes even when both customer and merchant are fully offline, the statement said.

As soon as either the merchant or the customer goes online, the transaction gets settled, it said.

"This innovation will accelerate financial inclusion in remote areas by enabling adoption of digital payments as both merchants and customers can do transactions without any network," the bank's country head for payments business Parag Rao, said.

PV sees highest ever sales in Jan

In a first, 3mn sales mark breached in 10 months

New Delhi, Feb 13: Passenger vehicle wholesales rose 17 per cent in January to 2,98,093 units driven by robust off take of utility vehicles, including the fast-growing sports utility vehicles, industry body SIAM said Monday.

The overall passenger vehicle dispatch from companies to dealers was 2,54,287 units in January 2022.

Utility vehicle sales rose to 1,49,328 units last month from 1,16,962 units in January last year. Similarly, passenger car dispatches grew to 1,36,931 units from 1,16,962 units. Wholesales of vans also increased to 11,834 units from 10,632 units in the year-ago period.

Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers (SIAM) President Vinod Aggarwal noted that better consumer sentiment is driving demand for passenger vehicles.

Elaborating further on sales, SIAM Director General Rajesh Menon said: "Passenger vehicles again saw highest ever sales in the month of January and for the first time, it has crossed 3 million sales mark in 10 months, from April to January period."

In the April-January period of this fiscal, the total passenger vehicle dispatches stood at 31,69,788 units, up 32 per cent from 24,03,125 units in the same period of last fiscal.



Total two-wheeler wholesales in January rose 4 per cent to 11,84,379 units from 11,40,888 units in the same month last year. "The rate of growth of two-wheelers in the recent year has not kept pace with the growth in the other segments," Aggarwal stated.

Scooter dispatches grew to 3,76,035 units last month from 3,61,299 units in January 2022. Motorcycle wholesales were higher at 7,71,621 units as compared with 7,43,804 units in the same month last year.

Moped sales rose to 36,723 units from 35,785 units in the year-ago period. Three-wheeler dispatches last month surged over two-fold to 48,903 units from 24,178 units in January 2022.

"Three-wheeler segment has gained traction compared to the past two years, though they are still to reach the pre-Covid levels," Aggarwal said.

The passenger carrier segment witnessed the biggest growth at 37,061 units last month from 16,592 units in the year-ago period. Total wholesales across passenger vehicles, two-wheelers and three-wheelers rose to 15,31,447 units last month from 14,19,354 units in January 2022.

M&A deals jump 40% in 2022, aided by \$57bn HDFC merger

Mumbai, Feb 13: The \$57-billion HDFC-HDFC Bank deal helped the overall merger and acquisition activity in the country rise by 40 per cent to reach \$163 billion in 2022, a report said Monday.

Strategic deals like the one involving the HDFC twins accounted for a bulk \$126 billion of the overall quantum, while transactions involving private equity funds stood at \$37 billion, the report by Deloitte, a consultancy firm, said.

Despite global headwinds like rising interest rates and elevated inflation levels leading to increased margin pressures for companies, the firm expects the overall activity to remain "strong" in the ongoing 2023.

The overall M&A (merger and acquisition) deals were much higher when compared with \$69 billion in 2019, or \$88 billion in 2020 amid

Covid, and \$116 billion in 2021, it said.

Going by the number of deals, the figure rose to 911 in 2022, up from 826 in 2021 and 505 in 2020, the firm said. Mega deals valued at over \$1 billion more than doubled as the financial services, medical and pharma and construction sectors witnessed some of the largest ever M&A transactions in 2022, it said.

Cross-border transactions fell to \$50 billion in the overall deal activity, down from \$74 billion, due to a steep decline in inbound deals. The firm attributed the fall in inbound deals to problems in the US and UK, where investors focused on conserving cash amid the record high inflation.

All-rounders Pooja Vastrakar and Richa Ghosh laughed their way to the bank with ₹1.90 crore deals offered by MI and RCB respectively.

However, Delhi Capitals pulled off a coup by roping in one of contemporary women's cricket's best leaders Meg Lanning of Australia for ₹1.10 crore.

Deepti, who watched the auction with her team cheering each bid, said: "We waited for this opportunity and since I am from UP, it is a great feeling. I want to contribute as much as possible for UP Warriorz."



Eves' cricket set to turn new corner with WPL

New Delhi, Feb 13: India women's cricket team vice-captain Smriti Mandhana becoming ecstatic after being picked by Royal Challengers Bangalore for ₹3.40 crore during the WPL auction was a moment that exemplified the excitement among players for the big day.

After all, the women were seeing the occasion as the beginning of a new dawn where they would also be able to call themselves millionaires like their male counterparts in the IPL.

For long, there had been talk about a T20 league for women in India, with several veterans like Mithali Raj, Jhulan Goswami and Harmanpreet Kaur, among others, waiting for this seminal moment in country's cricketing landscape.

But all that will change March 4 this year when the inaugural match of the five-franchise tournament begins. While it will most likely continue to be the precursor to the 'big event', the IPL, women cricketers will finally have a niche window, which they will be able to call their own in a milieu overcrowded with men's



T20 leagues.

While in terms of money and clout, the WPL and IPL, will never be comparable, the new baby of Indian cricket will at least add a lot of glamour to women's cricket, which was so far lacking, and also bring in hordes of fresh Indian and foreign faces, hoping to make big bucks through WPL.

As India women cricketer set foot into hitherto uncharted territory, it would be fair to say the auction has gone way beyond expectation for several of them if one compares it with the IPL.

Players getting big deals certainly bodes well for the woman cricketer in the country, given that the salary cap for each of the five WPL franchises was just ₹12 crore compared to the IPL mega auction last year where the total budget per franchise was increased from ₹90 crore to ₹95 crore.

Comparing the inaugural WPL auction to the first IPL auction ahead of the 2008 season, there is just a three-fold difference between what CSK dished out for MS Dhoni (Rs 9.5 crore) and what Mandhana got Monday.

Over the years, IPL has become the biggest and best domestic T20 tournament in the world, thanks to the multi-fold increase in telecast, broadcast and online revenue, which has translated into huge monetary gains for the players as well.

When compared to the megabucks being earned by male cricketers, Mandhana's three crore-plus pay packet certainly pales

in front of these celebrated IPL icons.

But, come to think of it, the inaugural IPL auction too had a 'humble' start and gradually over the years, more money started flowing into the environment.

As the WPL brand takes baby steps towards creating a niche for itself, it's just a matter of time before more TV money gets pumped into the league and the salary caps of franchises are revised.

Ten years down the line, who knows, a new woman cricketer could be laughing her way to the bank with a ₹20-plus crore purse. By then, the IPL would be touching astronomical figures.

While not getting into the debate of who gets what, women's cricket was certainly the winner Monday and with WPL, it'll turn a new corner.

Shreyas unlikely to play second Oz Test

New Delhi, Feb 13: Star batter Shreyas Iyer, who was ruled out of the first Test due to a lower back injury is still doing rehabilitation at the National Cricket Academy (NCA) and it is unlikely the team management will risk playing him directly in a Test match.

India and Australia will play the second Test at the Ferrozshah Kotla from Friday and it is to be seen if Iyer is able to join the team. Iyer had posted a few videos of his intense rehab programme at the NCA in Bangalore under trainer S Rajnikanth.

Iyer is doing his strength and conditioning routines but the norm for return to play in international arena is to at least play a domestic game of some form before donning national colours again.

Hence Iyer, who hasn't played any competitive cricket for a month now, might not be directly thrown into a Test match where he might have to field for 90 overs, crouch and stand close-in and then bat for long hours.

It will be interesting to see if the Chetan Sharma-led selection



committee names Iyer in the Rest of India squad for the Irani Cup match against Madhya Pradesh from March 1-5 to prove his fitness just like they asked Ravindra Jadeja to play a Ranji Trophy game against Tamil Nadu.

Jasprit Bumrah's recovery from stress fracture has been a slow one and the Indian team management is unlikely to risk playing him in

the three ODIs against Australia just after the end of the four-match Test series.

Bumrah will be needed for the potential World Test Championship final at the Oval in London from June 7-11 and also for the big ODI World Cup in India at the end of the year.

Therefore, there is a possibility that Bumrah will return to play

during Mumbai Indians' campaign at the IPL this year where his workload will be monitored.

In less than 48 hours after he had won the 'Player of the Match' award in the opening Test, Ravindra Jadeja was back in the nets at the VCA Stadium in Jamtha for an optional training session ahead of the second Test in Delhi starting Friday.

Jadeja did bat and bowl at the nets and was accompanied by senior batter Cheteshwar Pujara, who will play his 100th Test at the Ferrozshah Kotla.

The Australian team, who couldn't train at the centre wicket after the Nagpur Test as the groundsmen had watered the track, had a lengthy session on the match strip on the day. A few social media pictures featured Marnus Labuschagne keeping wickets to the spinners.

While the Australian team will be reaching Delhi Tuesday morning, Mitchell Starc, who missed the first Test due to an injury, is already up and running as he had his first nets session at the Kotla on the day. While he bowled at the nets, he also invited the local net bowlers and had a knock for about 20 minutes.
