Currency note bundle from Singhvi's seat rocks Rajya Sabha

New Delhi, Dec 6: A wad of ₹500 notes found from the seat allotted to Congress Member of Parliament Abhishek Manu Singhvi in the Rajya Sabha rocked the Upper House Friday with the Opposition and ruling alliance MPs trading charges and the Congress MP demanding a probe into the 'security

Singhvi also suggested that glass enclosures should be erected to prevent anyone from planting 'ganja' on seats in an MP's absence.

The Rajya Sabha was adjourned for the day within minutes of meeting after lunch as treasury benches were on their feet seeking answers from the opposition.

Chairman Deputy Harivansh, who was in Chair, sought to pacify the members of the ruling party and urged them to sit down and allow the House to function. As unrelenting BJP members continued to raise slogans, he adjourned the House for the day.

Soon after the official papers were laid on the table in the morning, Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar said security staff had recovered a wad of ₹500 notes from the seat allotted to Congress MP Singhvi, leading to an uproar in the House.

While Leader of Opposition Mallikarjun Kharge said the chairman should not have named the member without an investigation being completed, Leader of the House JP Nadda accused the opposition of showing eagerness on 'some issues' while wanting to cover up other

The currency was recovered from seat 222, which is allotted to Singhvi, during an anti-sabotage check Thursday. Dhankhar said.

"After the adjournment of the House yesterday, a wad of currency notes was apparently recovered by security officials from seat no 222 presently allotted to Abhishek Manu Singhvi, elected from the state of Telangana," he added.

Indira Gandhi Peace Prize for ex-Chile Prez

New Delhi, Dec 6: The Indira Gandhi Prize for Peace, Disarmament and Development for 2024 will be conferred on former Chile president and prominent human rights voice Michelle Bachelet the international jury for the award chaired by former National Security Advisor Shivshankar Menon announced Friday.

"President Michelle Bachelet is one of the world's most prominent voices for human rights, peace, and equality. In her various roles as the founding director of UN Women, UN High Commissioner for Human Rights, and as President of Chile, she has spoken strongly for gender equality and the rights of the most vulnerable sections of the population at home and across the world," a statement issued by the Indira Gandhi Memorial Trust said.

"Her personal courage and example in standing for peace and the rights of marginalised people continue to inspire men and women around the world," it added. The Indira Gandhi Peace

Prize is awarded to Bachelet for the example and inspiration that she is to women and men around the world for steadfastly striving for peace, gender equality, human rights, democracy and development in difficult circumstances, and her contributions to India's relations with Chile, the statement said.

Growth to slide further ^{₹1cr fine, 5-year jail for exam malpractice}

All eyes were on Reserve Bank of India's Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) meeting Friday, following National Statistical Office data, published last week, that put the country's economic growth at near two-year-low at 5.4 per cent in the July-September quarter, thanks to poor performance of manufacturing and mining sector. Though the MPC appears to have made an attempt to restore the balance between inflation and growth in the overall interest of the economy, the policy statement is far from encouraging. While the gross domestic product (GDP) forecast for 2025 fiscal has now been signifi $cantly\ lowered\ from\ RBI's\ earlier$ prediction, the rate of inflation is also projected to shoot up during the year. The six-member MPC. led by Governor Shaktikanta Das, decided by a 4 to 2 majority to keep the benchmark repo (key lending) rate untouched for the 11th straight time, and maintain the monetary nolicy stance 'neutral' citing concerns over inflation and the uncertain growth outlook. This forecast was in stark contrast to the growth of 8.1 per cent in the corresponding quarter of 2023-24 fiscal. The previous low level of GDP growth at 4.3 per cent was recorded in the third quarter of 2022-23

Mumbai, Dec 6: The Reserve

Bank of India Friday decided to keep the policy rate unchanged for the 11th time in a row but sharply lowered the GDP growth forecast to 6.6 per cent for the current fiscal, as against earlier projection of 7.2 per cent.

The RBI maintained the status quo on interest rate despite July-September quarter GDP growth falling to seven-quarter low of 5.4 per cent, as against its own projection of seven per cent.

The rate increase cycle was paused in April last year after six consecutive rate hikes, aggregating to 250 basis points

Announcing the fifth bi-monthly monetary policy for the current financial vear, RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das said the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) has decided to keep the reporate unchanged at 6.5 per cent while keeping policy stance unchanged at neutral.

He said MPC will remain watchful of incoming macroeconomic data for future action.

The RBI sharply cut the GDP growth projection to 6.6 per cent from the earlier level of 7.2 per cent, while raising inflation target to 4.8 per cent from the previous projection of 4.5 per cent for the current fiscal.

In a bid to make available more money with banks for lending so as to boost economic activity, the RBI slashed Cash Reserve Ratio to 4 per cent from existing 4.5 per cent. This would lead to release of ₹1.16 lakh crore to banks and

improve their lending capacity. This was the second MPC meeting of the reconstituted panel with three newly appointed external members -- Ram Singh, Saugata Bhattacharva and Nagesh Kumar.

"Impersonation, cheating, disruptions and questions leak adversely affect the prospects of millions of youths," he said, adding, the Bill is aimed at effectively and legally deterring individuals, organised groups and institutions that indulge in

232-yr-old cricket painting, India's first, to go under hammer

New Delhi, Dec 6: A rare oil on canvas work by iconic British painter Thomas Daniell, touted to be the first painting of a cricket match in India, will be among the artworks to go under the hammer at an upcoming auction at AstaGuru, the auction house announced

Executed in 1792, the painting titled Cricket Match In India will be part of AstaGuru's upcoming Historic Masterpieces auction from December 14-16 along with a collection of works by iconic modern Indian artists.

Daniell, who was known for documenting landscapes, peo-



ple, and buildings, is believed to have worked on this piece

during his visit to Chennai, then Madras, between 1792 and 1793. The location depicted in the painting is believed to be The Island, the sole cricket

ground in Madras at that time. The work depicts the players engaged in the game in the foreground surrounded by

lush greenery, the fielders are dressed in coloured trousers while the scorer sits on the side, and the tent likely serves as the pavilion. The beautiful sky in subtle shades and clusters of trees represents Dan-

iell's signature style. 'This painting by Thomas Daniell is a monumental piece of art that not only reflects the evolving cultural fabric of India during the 18th century but also celebrates the country's love for cricket, a sport that has become an integral part of its identity. It is a privilege

to present such a rare work at our upcoming auction, and we are confident it will captivate collectors who value historical and artistic significance," Sneha Gautam, senior vice president at AstaGuru Auction House, said.





The petitioner challenged the termination order before the tribunal which while allowing his plea granted liberty to the authority concerned to proceed against the appellant in accordance with law.

Referring to the case, the SC said it is manifestly clear that reasons were heartbeat of every order and every notice must specify the grounds on which the administrative or quasi-judicial authority intended to proceed.

"In the light of the same, we have no hesitation to hold that the order of termination passed against the appellant is arbitrary, illegal and violative of the principles of natural justice and it cannot be sustained," it underlined. In its 'ultimate analysis', the SC found that the tribunal was right in observing that without following the principles of natural justice and without affording any opportunity to explain his case before it, the appellant was terminated.

"Hence, his termination order cannot be sustained in the eve of law; and accordingly, set aside the order of termination," the bench held.

State to curb obscenity in jatra

Bhubaneswar, Dec 6: The state government has been preparing guidelines to curb obscene dance in jatra shows in the state Odia Language, Literature and Culture Minister Suryabanshi Suraj told the state Assembly Friday.

In a written reply to a question of Congress MLA Taraprasad Bahinipati, the minister said the state gov ernment has been thinking seriously to clamp down or obscene dance shows by ja tra parties. Guidelines are being prepared for this purpose, he said.

Last year, the previous BJD government had issued a direction to all District Collectors and SPs to pro hibit obscene dances and dialogues with 'double meaning' that are part of jatra and melody programmes.

MOUNTING UNEMPLOYMENT

Over 12 lakh youths waiting for jobs

Bhubaneswar, Dec 6: The unemployment situation in the state appears to be grim, if the data revealed by a minister in the Assembly is any indication.

Replying to a question posed by BJD MLA Sarada Prasad Nayak in the House Friday, Skill Development and Technical Education Minister Sampad Chandra Swain said that more than 12.13 lakh jobless youths, who registered themselves

exchanges in the state during the last five years, are waiting for jobs.

Swain said 12,13,924 unemployed youths have registered their names in the employment exchanges between 2019-20 and 2023-24.

The job aspirants include 3.19 lakh graduates, 51,956 postgraduates, 4.22 lakh intermediates, 1.80 lakh matriculates, 42,916 diploma pass-outs, 74,827 trained teachers, 33,691 ITI passouts and 14,750 under-ma-



tric students, he said.

Interestingly, 836 medical postgraduates and two medical graduates were also waiting for jobs in the state, the minister added. "During the last five

years, the government has given employment to 2,274 youths through the exchanges," he informed. In another written statement, Swain said, "The state government

has provided training to 36,329 youths through placement linked training programmes from 2019-20 to 2023-24, of which 15,068 got employment.'

"Over 18.42 lakh vouths have been made self-employable by providing training under the Chief Minister's Employment Generation Programme during 2014-15 to 2023-24,

To create employment opportunities, "Odisha Skill Development Au thority (OSDA) has been organising job fairs. Between 2019-20 and 2023-24 226 job fairs were organ ised at a cost of Rs 3.80 crore, and appointment letters were given to 1,05,444 people," he said.

Youth Congress members hurl eggs, tomatoes at cops

Holding posters and banners, the members took out a protest rally, alleging irregularities in the award of tender for the construction of schools for ST/SC students in the state.

As they marched to gherao the Minister's house, youth Congress members clashed with police personnel, who prevented them midway. Police took some of the activists into preventive custody and later released them, officials said.

8 more KVs in state soon

New Delhi/Bhubaneswar, Dec 6: The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs. chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Friday approved establishment of eight new Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) in Odisha.

The eight are among the 85 new KVs to be set up across the country, while another one in Shivamogga district of Karnataka will undergo expansion.

The opening of these new KVs will provide an opportunity for over 82,000 students to receive affordable and high-quality education across the country, Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said.

"Rs 5,872.08 crore will be spent over a period of eight years from 2025-26 towards establishment of the 85 new KVs and expansion of the existing one. It includes capital expenditure com-



ponent of ₹2,862.71 crore and operational expenditure of ₹3,009.37 crore," the Minister said. The eight new KVs are: Railway Titlagarh and Patnagarh, both in Bolangir district, ITBP Khurda in Khurda district, Athmallik and Talcher, both in Angul district, Kuchinda in Sambalpur district, Kamakhyanagar in Dhenkanal and Jeypore in Koraput district.

As of date, there are 1,256 functional KVs, including three abroad – Moscow, Kathmandu and Tehran, and 13.56 lakh students are studying in these schools, an official statement said.

The administrative structure for implementing the project will require creation of posts at par with the norms fixed by the


Sangathan for running of one full-fledged KV with a capacity of approximately 960 students. "Hence, 960 X 86 = 82,560 students would benefit. As per norms, a full-fledged KV provides employment to 63 persons and accordingly, approval of 85 new KVs and the expansion of one existing nearby KV, which will add 33 new posts, a total of 5,388 direct permanent employment opportunities will be created," it said.

Construction and allied activities associated with augmentation of various facilities in all KVs are likely to generate employment opportunities for many skilled and unskilled workers. 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Marketing woes hit cotton farmers President Murmu turns nostalgic

ANDHRA TRADERS MAKE HAY AS ONLY TWO COTTON MANDIS OPERATIONAL IN RAYAGADA

Rayagada, Dec 6: With cotton farming proving to be more profitable than paddy, its cultivation has steadily increased in Rayagada district. This trend is evident in both Rayagada and Gunupur sub-divisions.

Currently, cotton is being cultivated on 49,810 hectares of land with a target to collect 7,20,000 quintals of the fibre this year.

However, farmers have reported significant difficulties in selling off the harvested cotton due to limited market facilities in the district which has only two operational mandis operated by the Regulated Market Committee (RMC) in Rayagada and Gunupur for cotton.

While government records claim there are six cotton mandis in the district, including Chatikana in Bissamcuttack block, Lekapai in Kolnara block, Budaguda in Kalyansinghpur block and another in Ramanaguda block, cotton procurement takes place only in Rayagada and Gunupur.

This forces farmers to travel long distances to sell their produce, creating opportunities for middlemen and traders from neighbouring states like Andhra Pradesh. These intermediaries often purchase cotton directly from farmers



at lower prices, exploiting the situation and forcing farmers to resort to distress sale.

Compounding the issue, recent rains caused by Cyclone Fengal and pest infestations have added to cotton farmers' woes this year. Waterlogging during the harvest season has further impacted crops.

According to details available from the Agriculture department, cotton was cultivated on 45,084 hectares in 2021–22 yielding 90,387 quintals. In 2022–23, 45,967 hectares yielded 97,625 quintals, and in 2023-24, 49,097 hectares yielded 1,03,803 quintals. Cotton acreage has seen a steady increase over recent years, but the operational challenges in selling the produce have cast a shadow

Cotton harvest has started in phases in the last two weeks. However, the Cotton Corporation of India (CCI), which has received approval to procure cotton, is yet to start procurement of the crop.

At a recent Cotton Procurement Committee meeting, it was decided that procurement markets would start November 26 in Gunupur sub-division and December 10 in Rayagada sub-division. However, hundreds of farmers in Gunupur sub-division report that cotton purchases are yet to begin. This has led to harvested cotton ly ing unused in their fields.

Farmers have urged authorities to expand the number of operational markets to alleviate their hardships and ensure fair prices for their produce.

The delay has posed a significant issue for CCI due to the lack of storage facilities. Despite years of cotton collection from Rayagada district, neither CCI nor the RMC has established dedicated warehouses.

As a result, CCI depends annually on private cotton mills for storage. Some mill owners exploit this situation for personal gain as admitted by CCI officials during the November 16 committee meeting.

Rayagada MLA Kadraka Appala Swamy expressed dissatisfaction over the situation during the same meeting. When contacted, District Agriculture Officer Bishnu Prasad Kar stated that there was no complaint of cotton crop damage from the ongoing unseasonal rains.

Meanwhile, mandis operated by the RMCs in Rayagada and Gunupur have been set up for cotton sales, and temporary markets will be arranged by the RMC if needed, according to Cotton Scheme Officer Rahul Kumar Nayak.

While the market in Gunupur has opened from November 26, the Ravagada market would commence operations

Rairangpur, Dec 6: President Droupadi Murmu Friday turned emotional while visiting her birthplace Uparbeda village in Mayurbhanj district and said she has never felt the village as a place but a family.

Murmu, who was born in a Santali family of Uparbeda village under Bamanghati sub-division June 20, 1958, for the first time came to her village and her ancestral house after assuming the country's topmost Constitutional post. She assumed office of the President of India July 25, 2022.


In her speech, Murmu told the students to study sincerely and abide by the advice of teach ers, parents and elderly persons in the village.

Looters' gang busted; 3 minors among 4 held

Rourkela: The Plant Site police Friday busted a gang of looters involved in two consecutive loot incidents that took place Decem ber 2 and 3 and arrested four persons, including three minors. The Great Exodus

ndia's bureaucracy, often seen as the steel frame of governance, is experiencing a curious phenomenon: an increasing number of its officers seem to be trading government desks for greener pastures. Under the Modi regime, hundreds of officers, particularly from the Indian Revenue Service (IRS), are opting for voluntary retirement.

Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary recently informed Parliament that 853 IRS officers have taken Voluntary Retirement Scheme (VRS) since 2014, showing no signs of abating. In 2014, 20 IRS (Income Tax) officers took VRS; by 2024, the number had almost tripled to 57. The Customs and Indirect Taxes cadre saw a similar surge, with 24 officers opting out in 2014, rising to 73 in 2024. And while data on IAS and IPS officers taking VRS is not centrally maintained, anecdotal evidence suggests that they, too, are part of this growing exodus.

What's driving this flight? For starters, the private sector offers better pay, more creative freedom, and fewer bureaucratic shackles. With years of experience and insider knowledge, these officers are hot commodities for corporations eager to navigate India's complex regulatory landscape.

However, there's a deeper malaise. Critics argue that the centralisation of power under the Modi government and an increasingly hostile work environment are pushing officers to the edge. Many find themselves sidelined, their expertise underutilised, or their decision-making curtailed. For some, VRS is not just an escape but a statement.

If this trend continues, who will keep the machinery of governance running? India's civil service is already overstretched, and losing experienced officers in droves doesn't bode well for its future. Perhaps it's time to address the elephant in the room—why the "steel frame" is beginning to buckle.

Retirement goals or Great Escape?

Retirement goals, anyone? Former SIB chief and retired IPS officer T. Prabhakar Rao has rewritten the playbook with a bold, some might say audacious gambit: seeking political asylum in the United States. While officials remain tight-lipped, reports suggest that Rao has pe-

titioned to be recognised as a "political refugee," citing harassment from his former

Now residing with his son in sunny Florida, Rao appears to have traded bureaucratic

files for medical reports as he undergoes cancer treatment. But this isn't just a tale of a quiet retreat to American suburbia. Rao's departure comes under a cloud—he's the prime accused in a phone-tapping case that has Telangana police scrambling to bring him back, Red Corner

Here's the timeline of his Houdini act: the case was filed on 10 March, and by 11 March, Rao was boarding a flight to the US, leaving his alleged co-conspirators to fend off the law. That's precision planning

But Rao's move raises bigger questions. What if this sets a precedent? Could political asylum become the latest escape route for beleaguered IAS and IPS officers? After all, who wouldn't want to swap bureaucratic turf wars for Floridian beaches under the guise

of political persecution? For the Indian civil services, this is more than just a scandal. It's a moment of introspection. What does it say about the state of our bureaucracy when its stalwarts would rather flee than face the music? As Rao basks in Florida's sunshine, one thing is clear: this saga is far from over. Stay tuned.

Jharkhand's DGP drama

Jharkhand's top police post seems to be less about law and order and more about political ping-pong. The tussle between Chief Minister Hemant Soren's government and the Election Commission of India (ECI) over the state's DGP has turned into a spectacle of governance or the lack thereof. The latest move? Anurag Gupta (IPS: 1990 batch) is back as DGP, replacing Ajay Kumar Singh (IPS: 1989 batch), who has been shuffled off to helm the Jharkhand Police Housing Corporation

Gupta was unceremoniously removed by the ECI during the Assembly elections, with the Commission citing "administrative propriety." Ajay Kumar Singh was installed in his place, plucked from a shortlist of three IPS officers, in what seemed like a final word on the matter. Now, Gupta is back in the saddle, with Singh now nudged into a corner office that sounds important but is far removed from the policing frontlines.

Just weeks after the Soren government took charge, the reshuffle seems more than coincidental. Is this a signal from Soren of his intent to assert control? Or simply a redux of the tug-of-war that began under

This merry-go-round of appointments risks turning into a distraction from real policing priorities. Stability in leadership isn't just a bureaucratic nicety or just a buzzword; it should mean something. But in Jharkhand, the DGP's chair seems more like a revolving door than a seat of steady authority.

and a harsh government crackdown - culminated in the military-backed ouster of Bangladeshi Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, who lurched toward authoritarianism. But far from ushering in a democratic transition, the regime change has plunged Bangladesh into deeper turmoil. with mounting human-rights abuses and lawlessness by ascendant Islamist groups threatening to turn the country into yet another global flash point. Hasina may have forsaken her democratic credentials once in power - in 1990, six years before she was first elected prime minister, she led the pro-democracy uprising that toppled Bangladesh's military ruler - but the "iron lady" also kept both the powerful military and Islamist movements in check

As South Asia has seen firsthand, military-backed regimes tend to crush anti-government protests, whereas militaries with unfulfilled ambitions might facilitate violent unrest to create a pretext to swoop in, seize power, and "restore order." Bangladesh's military refused to enforce a lockdown even as protesters rampaged through the streets, and as soon as Hasina was gone, it installed an interim adminis $tration. \ Tellingly, the \ military$ packed her off to India even before she could formally resign.

To be sure, the interim regime is led by Muhammad Yunus, a Nobel Peace Prize laureate, who was selected with the support of the student-led, Islamist-backed protest movement. But the 84-year-old Yunus has become little more than the civilian face of what is effectively military-mullah rule. And despite lacking constitutional legitimacy, the interim regime has offered no time frame for holding national elections.

Instead, the regime has overseen new curbs on press freedom, including "persistent attacks, ill-motivated lawsuits, and widespread harassment. The credentials of 167 journalists have been revoked without explanation, and 129

journalists have been slapped with trumped-up murder, abduction, or assault charges. Scholars, lawyers, and others - anyone viewed as a critic of the regime - have also faced legal harassment. In a single week in October, more than 7,000 individuals were arrested, and political detainees have sometimes suffered physical assaults while in custody.

Last week, the regime trained its sights on a Hindu monk, who was arrested on charges of sedition after leading peaceful protests demanding protections for Bangladesh's Hindu minority. But Hindus are under attack in Bangladesh. They have been the victims of iihadist mobs, which have also targeted other minorities, including Buddhists, Christians, indigenous people, and members of Islamic sects that Islamists consider heretical. At one anti-Hindu protest, Islamist marchers chanted, "Catch them and slaughter them.

It is not difficult to see why Islamist violence is gaining ground. The interim regime has lifted bans on iihadist groups with links to terrorism and freed violence-glorifying Islamist leaders, including one who was convicted for the murder of a secularist blogger. Yunus' administration also seeks to remove the reference to secularism in the constitution. All this appeasement has emboldened the Islamists, who have, at times, sought to enforce their own extreme vision of morality by hounding "immodestly" dressed women.

In the four months since Hasina's ouster, hundreds of Bangladeshis have died as a result of violence. The situation has become so dire that even the secretary general of the Islamist-leaning Bangladesh Nationalist Party - the arch-rival of Hasina's secular Awami League has criticized the regime, lamenting that "people are shed-

ding each other's blood" on the streets and "newspaper offices are being set on fire. Meanwhile, Bangladesh's once-booming economy is in shambles, with growth slow-

ing, stocks sinking to their lowest level since the COVID-19 pandemic, and foreign debt spiraling upward. The ratings agency Moody's recently downgraded its outlook for Bangladesh's economy from "stable" to "negative," and cut the country's credit rating from B1 to B2, sending the country's bonds deeper into junk territory. These problems will not go away, even if Bangladesh is granted the billions of dollars in bailouts it has requested.

Neighbouring India is watching events in Bangladesh with considerable apprehension (and, when it comes to attacks on Hindus, significant anger). Fears are rising that Bangladesh will go the way of the dysfunctional Pakistan, a terrorist hub and key source of regional insecurity. If nothing else, India would face an influx of refugees. With millions of illegally settled Bangladeshis already living within India's

borders, this would present the country with an unpalatable choice between taking on more than it can handle and turning away people fleeing religious or political persecution.

Hasina's ouster has thrown into sharp relief the divergence between India's perspective and that of the US, which has welcomed the regime change. This contrast can also be seen elsewhere in India's immediate neighbourhood. Under President Biden, the US has aided the military-backed regime in Pakistan and provided "non-lethal" military aid to the rebels attempting to overthrow Myanmar's military junta, even as cross-border arms flows fuel ethnic conflict in India's Manipur.

Fortunately, there is rea-

son to think that US President-elect Donald Trump will rethink some of these stances - starting with America's approach to Bangladesh. Trump has a long-standing aversion to America's foreign commitments, and he is probably no fan of Yunus, who maintains close ties with prominent US Democrats and publicly lamented Trump's 2016 victory over Hillary Clinton. Shortly before the recent US election, Trump posted: "I strongly condemn the barbaric violence against Hindus, Christians, and other minorities who are getting attacked and looted by mobs in Bangladesh, which remains in a total state of chaos.'

An unstable Bangladesh mired in radical Islamism and political violence has long been India's geopolitical nightmare. One hopes that the US soon recognises that this is not conducive to its interests either, and puts pressure on Bangladesh's interim regime to protect minorities and restore stability. Beyond strengthening regional security, such a policy shift could go some way toward restoring America's fraying relationship with India.

Such an alliance has destroyed both the objective and subjective foundations of liberalism and its moral calibre. New Delhi, Dec 6: India asked Pakistan Friday to take strong action against Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) chief Masood Azhar, after reports emerged that he delivered a speech recently at a public gathering in the Pakistani city of Bahawalpur.

New Delhi said if the reports of Azhar's location are correct, then Pakistan's "duplicity" has been exposed as it has been maintaining that the JeM chief is not in that country.

Azhar, known to be the mastermind of the 2019 Pulwama terror attack, was designated as a global terrorist by the UN Security Council the same year.

"He is a UN-designated terrorist. We demand that strong action be taken against him, that he is brought to justice,' Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) Spokesperson Randhir

Speedy trial fundamental right: Top court

New Delhi, Dec 6: Speedy conclusion of trial is a fundamental right and an undertrial cannot be subjugated to indefinite incarceration, the Supreme Court said Friday.



A bench of Justices Hrishikesh Roy and Pankaj Mithal therefore granted bail to a man, who was in custody for about 4.2 years in a case lodged in Bihar, observing the case's trial wouldn't be over soon.

The top court's order came on a plea filed by one Raushan Singh, who challenged the Patna High Court's June verdict dismissing his bail application.

"An undertrial cannot be subjugated to indefinite incarceration. Speedy conclusion of trial is a fundamental right, well-recognised in our jurisprudence," the bench said.

Singh's counsel informed the bench that the petitioner was in custody since his arrest in October, 2020, and the case's trial was still inconclusive. The counsel appearing for the state witnesses were to be examined in the case.

The bench noted as per the state's counsel, the delay in trial was attributed to a discharge application filed by one of the accused in the case. "Having considered the period of incarceration and the fact that trial may not be concluded on a near date, we deem it appropriate to allow bail to the petitioner - Raushan Singh," held the bench, adding appropriate bail conditions were to be imposed by the trial court.

While dismissing his bail application previously, the high court directed the trial court to conclude the trial as expeditiously as possible, preferably within six months.



Lucknow, Dec 6: As the 32nd anniversary of the Babri mosque's demolition observed Friday, there are several temple-mosque disputes simmering across Uttar Pradesh --? all with the potential to stoke tensions like in Sambhal, where violence after a court-ordered survey of a Mughal-era mosque has left four people dead. Friday marked the first an-

niversary of the demolition of the Babri masjid after the consecration of the Ram temple in Ayodhya January 22.

Some Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leaders like former Uttar Pradesh minister and Vishva Hindu Parishad's (VHP) Vinay Katiyar have even claimed that Agra's Taj Mahal, one of the seven wonders of the world, was actually built over a "Tejo Mahalaya" or Shiva temple.

Meanwhile, Maulana Taugeer Raza, president of the Ittehad-e-Millat Council (IEMC), said Tuesday that anything can come out from the excavation of religious places and it would be better to abandon such an idea and work towards development. Talking to reporters in Bareilly, Raza said, "For the unity and integrity of the country, the idea of excavation should be abandoned and development prioritised. Skeletons of extinct dinosaurs can also be found."

Violence erupted during a second survey November 24 as protesters gathered near the Shahi Jama Masjid and clashed with security personnel. Four people were killed and several injured in the violence.

LUCKNOW

In Lucknow, the additional district judge February 28 dismissed a revision plea that had challenged a lower court's order rejecting an objection against a civil suit that had sought the right to worship at the Laxman Teela, where the Teelewali Masjid is situated.

According to the civil suit filed by a Hindu side, a temple of Shesh Nagesh Teeleshwar Mahadev is situated in close vicinity of the mosque.

In Budaun, a Hindu outfit has moved a local court seeking permission to offer prayers at the Jama Masjid Shamsi, claiming it to be a temple. The court asked the Muslim side Tuesday to conclude their arguments in the matter by December 10.

when Mukesh Patel, the then convenor of the Akhil Bharat Hindu Mahasabha, claimed that a Neelkanth Mahadev temple existed at the site of the mosque. Patel claimed that a Neelkanth temple in the fort of King Mahipal was demolished by a ruler from the slave dynasty and an invader, Shamsuddin Iltutmish, who converted it into a mosque.

Meanwhile, residents experienced a winter chill during the early hours and evenings with cold winds, while the daytime remained mostly clear and sunny. The temperature at night was recorded at 8.5 degrees Celsius, a notch below normal, similar to that Thursday. The 24-hour average air quality index (AQI) of the city was recorded at 197 at 4 pm, registering a slight increase from 165 Thursday. Experts have said the air quality in Delhi may deteriorate after the weekend, likely slipping into the 'poor' category as wind direction and speed change.

BSF launches special surveillance project on Pak, Bangla borders

Jodhpur: The Border Security Force (BSF) has initiated a special electronic surveillance project to secure over 600 "vulnerable patches" along the India-Pakistan and India-Bangladesh borders, covering areas where physical fencing is not feasible, the force chief said Friday. Speaking at a press conference on the occasion of the 60th Raising Day of the force, BSF director general (DG) Daljit Singh Chawdhary said approximately 800 km of the 4,069 km India-Bangladesh border remains unfenced due to rivers and other geographical challenges. Last year in December during the BSF Raising Day at Hazaribag in Jharkhand, Union Home Minister Amit Shah had said that India's two most important borders with Pakistan and Bangladesh will be completely secured in the next two years.

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

Pak witnessed 61 terror attacks in Nov

Islamabad: Sixty-one terror attacks occurred across Pakistan in November, marking a 27 per cent increase compared to the previous month, according to a think-tank report. According to the monthly security review of Pakistan by the Pak Institute for Peace Studies (PIPS), an Islamabadbased think-tank, 169 people were killed in terror attacks in November. "The number of fatalities rose sharply by 69 per cent, increasing from 100 in October to 169 in November. Another 225 people were injured in these attacks," it stated. As many as 41 attacks occurred in the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, which claimed 114 lives and injured 95 others.

Putin pushes Belarus security quarantees

Moscow: Russian President Vladimir Putin visited Belarus Friday to sign a treaty offering security guarantees to Moscow's closest ally. The planned signing of the document follows the publication of a revised version of Russia's nuclear doctrine, which for the first time placed Belarus under the Russian nuclear umbrella amid the tensions between Moscow and the West over the Ukrainian conflict. Speaking alongside Belarus' President Alexander Lukashenko, Putin emphasised that the new document includes a potential use of Russian tactical nuclear weapons deployed to Belarus in response to an aggression.

Quake triggers tsunami warning

San Francisco: A 7.0 magnitude earthquake shook a large area of Northern California Thursday, knocking items of grocery store shelves, sending children scrambling under desks and prompting a brief tsunami warning for 5.3 million people along the US West Coast. The quake struck at 10:44 am west of Ferndale, a small city in coastal Humboldt County, about 130 miles (209 km) from the Oregon border, the US Geological Survey said. It was felt as far south as San Francisco, some 270 miles (435 km) away, where residents felt a rolling motion for several seconds. It was followed by multiple smaller aftershocks. There were no immediate reports of major damage or injury. The tsunami warning was in effect for roughly an hour. It was issued shortly after the temblor struck and covered nearly 500 miles (805 km) of coastline, from the edge of California's Monterey Bay north into Oregon.

Iran launches heaviest space payload into orbit

Manama (Bahrain), Dec 6: Iran said Friday it conducted a successful space launch, the latest for its programme the West alleges improves Tehran's ballistic missile programme.

The second round of the pres idential contest that had been due to take place Sunday would have pitted Georgescu, a farright, pro-Russian candidate, against pro-EU centrist leader Elena Lasconi.

Far-right parties also performed well in last Sunday's parliamentary election in Romania, though the ruling Social Democrats emerged as the largest grouping and hope to cobble together a pro-EU coalition government.

Washington, Dec 6: The federal Bureau of Prisons is permanently closing its "rape club" women's prison in California and will idle six facilities in a sweeping realignment after years of abuse, decay and mismanagement, The Associated Press has learned.

The agency informed employees and Congress Thursday that it plans to shutter the Federal Correctional Institution in Dublin, California, and its deactivate minimum-security prison camps in Wisconsin, Minnesota, Colorado, Pennsylvania, West Virginia and Florida. Staff and inmates are being moved to other facilities, the agency said.

In a document obtained by the AP, the Bureau of Prisons said it was taking "decisive and strategic action" to address "significant challenges, including a critical staffing shortage, crumbling infrastructure and limited budgetary resources." The agency said it is not downsizing and is committed to finding positions for every affected employee.

The closures are a striking coda to the Biden administration's stewardship of the Justice Department's biggest agency. After repeatedly promising to reform FCI Dublin and other troubled facilities, the

Bureau of Prisons is pivoting to closures and consolidation, citing inadequate staffing and staggering costs to repair aging infrastructure.

The permanent shutdown of FCI Dublin seven months after

it was temporarily closed in the wake of staff-on-inmate abuse is the clearest sign yet that the agency, which has more than 30,000 employees, 158,000 inmates and an annual budget of about \$8 billion, is unable the Bureau of **Prisons is pivoting** to closures and consolidation, citing inadequate staffing and staggering costs to repair aging infrastructure

or unwilling to rehabilitate its most problematic institutions.

The Bureau of Prisons and the union representing correctional officers have repeatedly pushed for additional federal prison funding, highlighting what they say is an inadequate amount of money to address pay increases staff retention and a multibillion-dollar repair backlog.

In a document summarising the closures, the Bureau of Prisons said it decided to close FCI Dublin after a security and infrastructure assessment following its temporary closure in April. At the time, it appeared the agency was set on closing the low-security prison, but officials held out the possibility that it could be repaired and re opened for a different purpose, such as housing male inmates

The assessment identified considerable repairs neces sary to reopen the FCI Dublin, the agency said. Low staffing, exacerbated by the high cost of living in the Bay Area, also contributed to the decision to close the facility, the agency said.

The rupee has largely remained under pressure over the last two months on the back of heightened foreign portfolio outflows and a wave of dollar strength sparked by Donald Trump's victory in the US presidential election.

The RBI's "central tenet" is to maintain orderliness and stability in the exchange rate, without compromising market efficiency, Shaktikanta Das, the central bank's governor, said Friday.

Seeing the wickets falling at the other end, Reddy went for his shots and that included a couple of sensational sixes off Starc and Boland to take the total past 150. He first dispatched a wide ball from Starc over extra cover before reverse scooping Boland for a maximum over the slip cordon. Four balls later, Reddy pulled Boland for another six.

In the first session, it was Starc who landed the timely blows as India squandered a promising start to reach 82 for four at tea. Starc removed opener KL Rahul (37) and Virat Kohli (7) in quick succession to turn the tide in Australia's favour. That was after a 69-run stand between Rahul and Shubman Gill (31) for the second wicket. **Brief scores**

India in final of under-19 Asia Cup with thumping victory

Sharjah, Dec 6: Vaibhav Suryavanshi (67, 36b, 6x4, 5x6) was the star of the show again with a second successive half century as India stormed into the U-19 Asia Cup ODI final with a comprehensive seven-wicket victory over Sri Lanka here Friday. The 13-year-old, who became the youngest cricketer ever to be bought at an IPL auction last month, played a scintillating knock as India chased down a target of 174 with 170 balls to spare.

India will face Bangladesh in the final at the Dubai International Cricket Stadium, Sunday. Bangladesh defeated Pakistan by seven wickets, completing a modest chase of 117 in 22.1 overs in the first semifinal in Dubai.

Opting to bat, Sri Lanka could only manage 173 in 46.2 overs despite a valiant effort from Lakvin Abeysinghe (69, 110b, 3x4, 2x6)) and Sharujan Shanmuganathan (42, 78b, 2x4).

Their innings struggled to gain momentum as Indian bowlers were in full control with Chetan Sharma (3/34), Kiran Chormale (2/32) and

Ayush Mhatre (2/37) wreaking havoc in the middle overs.

India's chase was built on a solid foundation laid by Ayush Mhatre (34) as he put on a stand of 91 with Suryavanshi for the opening wicket. Suryavanshi, the young left-hander from Bihar troubled the Sri Lankan bowlers from the beginning as he started with consecutive sixes and a boundary off Dulnith Sigera, who ended up giving away 31 runs in his opening over.

Mhatre too played his strokes at the other end as the duo raced to 87 for no loss in eight overs before Vihas Thewmika gave Sri Lanka their first breakthrough by removing the batter.

But Suryavanshi showed remarkable maturity as he kept the run-rate ticking despite losing his opening partner, forging another crucial association with C Andre Siddharth (22). He didn't stop there, taking the attack to the opposition bowlers with his aggressive strokes, including hitting two sixes off Aayan Khan.

Skipper Mohamed Amaan (25 n o) and KP Karthikeya (11 n o) then completed the chase.

Singapore, Dec 6: Half a dozen draws and some missed opportunities later, sprightly challenger D Gukesh and resolute defending champion Ding Liren would be desperate for a breakthrough when they clash in the 10th game of the World Chess Championship

here Saturday.

Gukesh has explored several winning lines but the advantage has not translated into victories for the Indian, and with just five more classical games left to be played in the USD 2.5 million prize money championship, the 18-year-old would look to break the deadlock and hope to take a decisive lead after a day's rest Friday.

The draw Thursday, which was the seventh of the match and sixth on the trot, has left



both players on an identical score of 4.5 points each, still three shy of the champion-ship-winning tally.

World No. 1 and five-time World Champion Magnus Carlsen minced no words while doing a recap of the ninth game and said that the time was running out for Gukesh.

"I think we have finally arrived at a moment when Gukesh is not a favourite in this match anymore, it's as pure a 50-50 match as it comes," said Carlsen.

"It is still the same, the approach... we just try to play good chess. In the last few games I have managed to play very good chess and for me the main thing will be go there with the same energy, play the same level of chess and slightly improve on some critical moments," he added.
