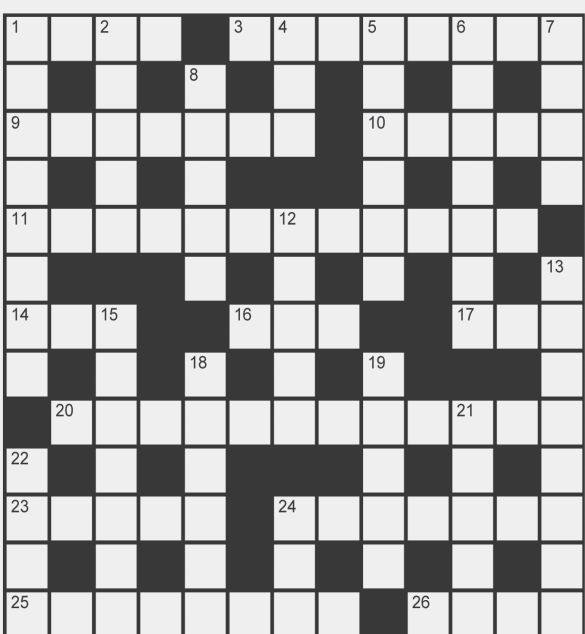

# City gets ₹75 crore badminton academy

**Bhubaneswar, Dec 12:** A Badminton High Performance Centre (HPC) was inaugurated at the iconic Kalinga Stadium in Bhubaneswar Thursday.

Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi and Assam CM Himant Biswa Sarma, also the president of the Badminton Association of India, inaugurated the facility in the presence of India’s chief national coach Pullela Gopichand.

The HPC, a collaboration among the Odisha government, Pullela Gopichand Badminton Foundation (PGBF) and Dalmia Bharat Group, has been built at ₹75 crore.

While the state government has provided 3 acre of land at the Kalinga Stadium, Dalmia Bharat Group built the infrastructure and PGBF will provide technical expertise.

The HPC, named Dalmia Bharat Pullela Gopichand Badminton Academy, has an indoor area of 77,000 sq ft. It has eight badminton courts

and a spectator capacity of 400. It has residential facilities for 50 players, a gymnasium and an amphitheatre for outdoor activities.

Majhi said the centre will offer world-class training and coaching facilities under the direct supervision of Gopichand.

“I hope that the facility will host national and international badminton tournaments and act as a source of inspiration for budding players in the state,” he said.

Sarma said the centre will provide an opportunity for players to equip themselves with the skills required to dominate the global badminton arena.

“My vision is to have centres of excellence in every state to ensure our budding shuttlers get the best possible training,” he said.

Gopichand said the facility with its unique design and state-of-the-art amenities will play a crucial role in shaping the future of Indian

badminton.

Dalmia Bharat MD Puneet Dalmia expressed his gratitude to the chief ministers of Odisha and Assam.

“Himantaji, as the president of the Badminton Association of India, has been a catalyst in our global badminton success and we look forward to reaching even greater heights in the future,” he said.

“Dalmia Bharat has always been an integral part of Odisha’s illustrious journey and we are delighted to present the people of the state with another iconic facility that will nurture the future champions. We hope the venue will become a major part of the competitive circuit and draw international and national professionals,” he added.

Meanwhile, Gopichand also met Leader of Opposition Naveen Patnaik at his residence. Patnaik, the former CM, laid the foundation stone of the HPC in 2018.

In a post on X, Patnaik said, “Glad to meet legendary badminton player #Pullela-Gopichand. Thank him for his appreciation for the robust sports ecosystem in #Odisha and partnership to set up Dalmia Bharat Gopichand Badminton Academy. I am sure, the Badminton HPC will help groom future champions from the soil and bring laurels for the state. #OdishaForSports.”

The academy has a shuttlecock-inspired design, incorporating rainwater harvesting for groundwater recharge, and energy-efficient LED lighting.

## 'Population rise at root of man-jumbo conflict'

*Save Elephant Foundation Trust marks 12th foundation day with workshop on elephant conservation*

**Bhubaneswar, Dec 12:** Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Forest, Environment and Climate Change Ganesh Ram Singh Khuntia Thursday said Human-elephant conflict is escalating due to the growing population and diminishing habitats. He said this while addressing a workshop titled ‘Challenges of Elephant Conservation in Changing Circumstances’ organised by Save Elephant Foundation Trust at Soochana Bhawan here on the occasion of the outfit’s 12th foundation day.

Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Wildlife) Prem Kumar Jha and Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and Chief of Forest Force Debidutta Biswal attended the event as guests of honour. Also present on the occasion were forest rangers, local people and other dignitaries.

Singh Khuntia, who attended the event as the chief guest, praised the foundation’s on-



going efforts, saying, “Save Elephant Foundation has been instrumental in supporting the Forest department for protection and conservation of elephants. Their work is vital in these changing times.”

“Human-elephant conflict is escalating due to the growing population and diminishing habitats. Elephants are invading public spaces, and the consequent violence is devastating for both humans and elephants,” he stated.

Over the past 12 years, more than 1,000 elephants have died in Odisha, while over 1,500 human lives have been lost due to elephant attacks. The situation has raised significant concern about the sustainability of ele-

phant conservation.

During the event, Save Elephant Foundation honoured several individuals, including Chief Conservator of Forests Manoj V Nair and Bonai DFO Lalit Kumar Patra, with Save Elephant Foundation Trust Award 2024 for their efforts towards reducing human-elephant conflicts. An award was also presented to range officer of Narla in Kalahandi, Late Prashant Pal, who sacrificed his life protecting people from elephant attacks.

Biswal stressed the need for local community involvement, stating, “The success of conservation efforts depends on active participation of local people.”

## Prevent middlemen exploitation in paddy procurement: CM

**Bhubaneswar:** Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Thursday directed officials to ensure that the middlemen do not take benefit of the ongoing paddy procurement process in the state. Majhi was reviewing the progress of the paddy procurement that started November 20. “The Chief Minister has directed officials to keep a close watch on the middlemen so that they do not take advantage for farmers under any circumstances,” a statement issued by his office said. At present, the paddy procurement process is underway in nine districts -- Bargarh, Nuapada, Sambalpur, Kalahandi, Bolangir, Jharsuguda, Nabarangpur, Subarnapur and Koraput. So far, 37,079 farmers sold 1,81,196 ton of paddy and were paid ₹323.73 crore as minimum support price and ₹112.61 crore as input assistance. Majhi said paddy procurement at ₹2,300 per quintal along with input assistance of ₹800 per quintal, besides PM-Kisan and CM-Kisan schemes, were ensuring the empowerment of farmers. He said more than 17 lakh farmers would benefit from the initiatives.

## Crab farmers’ meet to strengthen sustainable aquaculture

**Bhubaneswar, Dec 12:** The State Project Management Unit of the Enhancing Climate Resilience of India’s Coastal Communities (ECRICC) initiative organised a crab farmers’ and exporters’ meet at the State Institute for Rural Development (SIRD) campus, Thursday.

The event aimed to bring together crab farmers, exporters, government officials, and technical experts to foster sustainable aquaculture practices and strengthen market linkages for Odisha’s mud crab sector.

Inaugurating the event, Forest, Environment, and Climate Change department’s Environment-cum-Special Secretary director and ECRICC state

project director, Prem Kumar Jha highlighted the importance of mud crab aquaculture in bolstering Odisha’s fisheries sector.

He noted that the initiative offers a sustainable source of income for coastal communities and detailed the project’s progress, challenges, and opportunities in crab export.

Marine Products Export Development Authority (MPEDA) deputy director Archiman Lahiri underscored the rising global demand for high-quality mud crabs and Odisha’s potential to become a leading exporter. Lahiri emphasised that the state could capitalise on international markets by adopting quality-oriented practices.

The ECRICC project, sup-



ported by the Green Climate Fund, aims to enhance the livelihoods of vulnerable coastal populations across three states—Odisha, Maharashtra, and Andhra Pradesh. It focuses on climate-adaptive livelihoods and strengthening communi-

ty resilience to climate change impacts.

In Odisha, the project is being implemented in seven landscapes across four districts—Puri, Ganjam, Kendrapara, and Balasore—by the Forest, Environment, and

Climate Change department under the supervision of the Ministry of Environment, Forest, and Climate Change (MoEFCC), Government of India. The United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), as the Green Climate Fund’s official agency, ensures quality assurance for the initiative.

Discussions at the event included plans for scaling crab aquaculture practices, establishing a crab hatchery in Odisha by 2025, and identifying additional farmers for capacity-building programmes. Officials stressed improving access to international markets through quality checks and streamlined export documentation.

Representatives from MPE-

DA, Fisheries and Animal Resource Development (F&ARD) department, and exporters from West Bengal and Tamil Nadu attended the workshop, sharing insights and best practices. ECRICC state project manager Spandita Kar and her team coordinated the event’s proceedings.

The meet marked a significant step in forging partnerships between government bodies, NGOs, and exporters, with a shared vision of driving transformative changes in Odisha’s coastal communities. By addressing key challenges and leveraging opportunities, the initiative aims to create a sustainable and thriving aquaculture ecosystem in the state.

## NGT orders fresh inquiry into stone quarrying in Rahadpur

**Bhubaneswar, Dec 12:** The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has directed the Odisha Space Applications Centre (ORSAC) and the deputy director of mines, Jajpur, to conduct a fresh inquiry into the stone quarrying activities at the Rahadpur cluster in Jajpur district.

The directive came during a hearing by the Eastern Zone Bench of the tribunal in response to a plea filed by Babuli Jena, represented by advocates Sankar Prasad Pani and Asutosh Padhy.



The NGT has tasked director of mines, Jajpur with examining multiple aspects of the quarrying operations with ORSAC’s assistance, including the quantum of minor minerals excavated, mining activities beyond the lease area, instances of excess mining, and the proximity of quarry sites to minor irrigation projects in the region.

The petitioner raised concerns about violations of environmental norms and regulations governing quarrying activities in the Rahadpur cluster. It was alleged that the operations breached the Odisha State Pollution Control Board’s (OSPCB) siting criteria and the conditions outlined in environmental clearance.

One of the primary grievances highlighted by the petitioner pertains to the Ranibanda and Paikarapur minor irrigation projects, which reportedly lie adjacent to the quarrying area.

# 8 Bengal workers stripped, paraded

Irate locals roughed up the eight masons after one of them allegedly attempted to outrage a woman’s modesty while she was returning home after taking bath Wednesday

**Rourkela, Dec 12:** Eight Bengali-speaking migrant workers were stripped semi-naked and paraded on a road with their hands tied Thursday for allegedly attempting to outrage the modesty of a local woman in Sundargarh town, police said. Police said local residents thrashed and paraded the workers in a semi-nude condition on Mission Road between 8.30am and 9am. The victims hail from West Bengal’s Murshidabad district and were working as masons in the town. Informed by local residents,

Sundargarh Town police arrived at the spot and rescued the eight persons and took them to the police station. “We have registered two cases - one against 10 persons for stripping, thrashing, and parading the eight workers, and another based on the woman’s complaint against one of the workers,” DIG Rourkela Brijesh Rai informed. Rai said police have launched a manhunt to arrest the people who took the law into their own hands and humiliated the workers. Police are investigating both cases, and no arrests have been made so far, Rai said and

added that they have identified 10 people involved in assaulting the workers. In her police complaint, the woman claimed that one of the workers attempted to outrage her modesty while she was returning home after taking bath Wednesday. When news of the incident spread, local residents attacked the house where the workers were staying, stripped them, and tied their hands. They were then paraded in public in a semi-nude condition, police said. When police attempted to rescue the workers, they faced strong protests from the local

people. Eyewitnesses said a journalist covering the incident was also allegedly threatened by the local residents. “The incident flared up to such an extent due to public anger over the atrocities being committed against the Hindus in Bangladesh,” one of the locals said. It is pertinent to mention here that West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee had August 11 called up Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi and requested him to look into alleged incidents of assault on labourers from the neighbouring state. In the wake of political unrest and violent attacks on religious minorities, especially Hindus, in Bangladesh, such incidents had been reported from Jajpur, Kendrapada, Jagatsinghpur, and Sambalpur districts in Odisha, where locals confronted Bengali-speaking workers, demanding proof of their Indian citizenship. The alleged attacks stemmed from fears that Bangladeshi refugees had illegally entered Odisha amidst the upheaval in the neighbouring nation.

## Toll rises to 6 in Mohana accident; probe ordered

**Berhampur, Dec 12:** The toll in the road accident near Mohana in Gajapati district rose to six Thursday with two more women succumbing to their injuries, police said. A pickup van with 36 people onboard overturned at Chiding Ghat near Mohana Wednesday. Four people had died on the spot, they said. The two deceased women were identified as Sita Bhu-

yan (55) and Sanju Bhuyan (54). While Sita died at MKCG Medical College and Hospital in Berhampur, Sanju died at AIIMS-Bhubaneswar. All the victims were residents of Kikisingh village, and were heading to Chandragiri on the pickup van to attend a funeral, police said. Twenty-four people were still undergoing treatment, and the condition of five of them was stated to be critical, police said.

Most of the victims sustained fractures and head injuries and were undergoing treatment in the surgery ward of the MKCG Medical College and Hospital. The driver of the vehicle has been missing since the accident, police said. Transport Minister Bibhuti Bhushan Jena visited the patients at the hospital. He asked the hospital authorities to take proper care of them and ordered an inquiry into the accident.

# Youth arrested for rape of sis-in-law

**Buguda, Dec 12:** Police here in Ganjam district have arrested a youth on charge of raping his sister-in-law on the pretext of marriage and making the video of the intimate moments viral on social media platforms. The accused was identified

as Seemanchal Goud, a native of Tambiri village under Buguda police limits and a migrant worker engaged in Kerala. Police registered a case and produced Seemanchal in the court, Thursday, Buguda police inspector in-charge (IIC) Sitanshu Sekhar Mandhata said. According to the complaint,

Seemanchal lured the woman, his sister-in-law in relation, and coerced her for physical relationship on the pretext of marriage. Subsequently, he raped the woman at various points of time in the last one year threatening to make the video of their intimate moments viral. Later, he promised the wom-

an to take her to Kerala with him and marry there. However, he abandoned her at Bhubaneswar and absconded. The woman waited for long hours but Seemanchal never returned to take her back. The woman returned to the village and lodged a complaint at Buguda police station leading to his arrest.

## Wrong injection for skin ailment claims boy’s life

**Patana, Dec 12:** A 15-year-old boy died after being administered with a wrong injection for a skin ailment at a medicine store in Keonjhar district, Thursday. The deceased was identified as Sukadev Munda, son of Bijay Kumar Munda from Dharapada village under Pandapada police limits in Keonjhar district. A Class-X student at Saraswati Sisshu Vidya Mandir in Saharpada, Sukadev was staying in the school hostel. Sources said Sukadev was

suffering from severe itching problem for which his family members took him to Sarbeswar Medicine Store at Saharpada for a check-up and medicines. The medicine store proprietor said it was an infectious disease and advised them that administering an injection will cure him fast. However, the boy was rendered critical two minutes after the injection was administered. Family members rushed him to the Karanjia Sub-Divisional Hospital where doctors pronounced him dead. Shocked over his son’s death, the boy’s father Bijay

Munda has lodged a complaint at Saharpada police outpost holding the medicine store owner responsible. The medicine store owner has fled the area after reports surfaced. Outpost officer Bhawani Shankar Badi sent the body for post-mortem and launched an investigation. Residents alleged that illegal medicine stores and quacks have mushroomed in the area. They demanded that these stores be

raided and sought a verification of these businesses in Saharpada as well as other areas in the district.

## Kalinga Nagar industry body urges CM to settle transportation dispute

**Jajpur, Dec 12:** An industry body of Kalinga Nagar has written to Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi, urging him to direct the Jajpur district administration to conduct an inquiry into alleged monopoly of local truckers in the price fixation for transportation of goods. Kalinga Nagar Industries Association President PL Kandoi alleged that truckers’ associations in the industrial complex dictate terms in the fixation of prices for transportation of goods. Kandoi, in the letter Wednesday urged the Chief Minister to direct the district authorities and police to take “appropriate measures” after conducting a “comprehensive inquiry into the practice of high-handedness and monopoly by the local truckers’ associations in the Kalinga Nagar industrial complex”. He also accused the local

truckers of insisting that commercial vehicles should only be engaged through them and not through any other third party for the transportation of goods from the Kalinga Nagar industrial complex. “They also insist on charging an extra 50 per cent of the market rate for freight for the trucks engaged by them in the industries,” the letter said, adding that they are “not allowing regular transporters who have been working at fair market rates”. “We would welcome trucks to be engaged locally for the transportation of goods in industries, but that is only possible at prevailing market rates, not at inflated prices,” Kandoi said in his letter. The industry body sought urgent intervention from the Chief Minister to provide necessary support to the industries in Kalinga Nagar and take appropriate action against such illegal associations for the greater interest of the industries.

## Chhatrapur panchayat wins nat'l award; Ganjam dist claims 3

**Chhatrapur:** Chhatrapur block panchayat was awarded the first prize under the Nanaji Deshmukh Sarvottam Panchayat Satat Vikas Puraskar as the Union Ministry of Panchayati Raj presented the National Panchayat Awards-2024 at a ceremony in Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi, Wednesday. President Droupadi Murmu honoured 45 panchayats from across the country for their exemplary contributions to grassroots governance. 

# Rebuilding Syria

The rapid fall of Syrian President Bashar al-Assad reflects the dramatic changes that have swept the strategic landscape of the Middle East in the past year. After civil war erupted in Syria in 2011, Assad clung to power for over a decade, despite facing a coalition of forces backed by the United States and Turkey. But only 11 days after the rebel group Hayat Tahrir al-Sham (HTS) launched its offensive, Assad fled to Russia, ending his family's 50-year rule. That outcome was the result of years of ineffective rule and economic and social hardship, with even the Alawi community that was Assad's base of support defecting without a fight. The end came when his main external backers, Russia and Iran, also abandoned him, reflecting both countries' profound weakening. Russia's war against Ukraine continues to drain its resources and preoccupy the Kremlin, while Israel's post-October 7 campaign against Hamas, Hezbollah (which provided significant support to the Assad regime), and Iran itself has crippled the Iranian-led "axis of resistance."

Syrians will not miss Assad, a brutal ruler who failed his people. Many are celebrating in the streets, and refugees who have been sheltering abroad or in opposition-held pockets of Syria are starting to return to their homes.

The fall of Assad could also bring broader regional benefits. Assad's regime facilitated the flow of arms from Iran to Hezbollah; new leadership in Damascus could further reduce Iranian influence and play a constructive role in shaping a more stable regional order.

But hope must be tempered by caution. Across the Middle East, the removal of strongmen has generally produced violent chaos, not stable and inclusive governance. During the Assad era, the Alawi minority ruled over a Sunni majority; revenge could be in the offing. More generally, Syria's diverse population could easily fall prey to the politics of ethnic and sectarian division.

In fact, since well before Assad's flight, Syria has been a state in name only. Its civil war divided the country into numerous fiefdoms that have been under the effective control of often hostile rival groups. One of those groups – Syria's Kurds – is aligned with the Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK), a terrorist entity, prompting Turkey to take control of a broad swath of Syria's north.

Amid these existing fractures, extremist groups could capitalise on the fall of Assad and the resulting turbulence to strengthen their territorial footprint and power. That is what happened in 2014, when the Islamic State was able to seize control of a significant piece of Iraq and Syria as a result of the political mayhem in both countries. Extremist groups could now run the same play, which is why Israel has spent the last few days building a "security zone" beyond its border with Syria and destroying weapons stocks in the country to prevent them from falling into the wrong hands.

A case in point is HTS itself, which began life as an affiliate of al-Qaeda, and, like the PKK, is still designated by the United States and other countries as a terrorist group. While HTS' leaders have pledged moderation and inclusiveness as they seek to fashion a national government, the group has a track record of repression. More broadly, Syria's contending factions might seek to settle scores, not work together. Iran's influence in Syria has plunged, but the Islamic Republic will try to retain its leverage as its former proxies – particularly the disenfranchised Alawis, a Shia sect – jockey with rivals for position.

In short, there is a great deal that could go wrong. Looking ahead, Syria's trajectory will depend first and foremost on its myriad players' ability to achieve an inclusive political transition. Rebuilding a functioning state will require the restoration of Syria's territorial integrity, which in turn will depend on the willingness of multiple territorial stakeholders to share power and sacrifice their autonomy in the interest of national unity. The other key challenge will be forging a new social contract that provides Syrians adequate levels of security and economic opportunity.

Syrians themselves must do most of the hard work, but the international community has an important role to play. For starters, drawing on the harsh lessons learned in Iraq, where the wholesale dismantling of the Ba'ath regime produced violent chaos, outside powers should press the newly empowered opposition groups to refrain from forcibly sidelining the Alawis, who formed the backbone of the Assad regime.

The prospects of a lasting settlement would significantly improve if the Alawi elite were adequately integrated into a diverse governing coalition. Moreover, Turkey and the US should press their Syrian proxies, the Syrian National Army and the Syrian Democratic Forces, respectively, to be constructive players and work with, not against, the transitional government.

Outside powers can also help prevent the further collapse of the Syrian state and its economy. Achieving a post-conflict settlement will become all the more difficult if the quality of life continues to deteriorate, and basic services like healthcare and education are unavailable. It was under precisely such conditions that regime change in Iraq produced radicalisation and state failure.

The international community should therefore launch a multilateral aid programme that combines humanitarian and financial assistance with capacity-building measures. As hosts to a large number of Syrian refugees, Turkey and the European Union have a keen interest in the early implementation of a multilateral strategy to foster the right social and economic conditions for the safe, voluntary return of the displaced population.

Assad's fall has created an opportunity for the political and economic reconstruction of a key Arab state and the reshaping of its regional role. But the next few months are critical. The record of efforts to stabilise post-conflict societies in the region is littered with failure. Syria for the past 13 years is a case in point, as are Afghanistan, Iraq, and Libya. It is time to get one right.

THE NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY AIMS TO INCREASE THE GER TO 50% BY 2035, WHICH APPEARS TO BE AN AMBITIOUS TARGET

The Gross Enrollment Ratio (GER) is a statistical tool that measures the percentage of a country's population enrolled in higher education, indicating a country's level of participation in education. The GER is calculated by dividing the number of students enrolled in higher education by the total population of the relevant age group, typically 18-23 years old. Developed countries have high GERs, such as the US (88%), Germany (70%), Canada (69%), and the UK (60%).

India's GER in higher education for the 18-23 age group has shown significant growth, from 23.7% in 2014-15 to 27.3% in 2020-21 and 28.4% in 2021-22. The top-performing states in terms of GER are Puducherry (61%), Chandigarh (56.8%), Delhi (48.3%), Tamil Nadu (46.8%), and Uttarakhand (40.1%). In contrast, Odisha lags behind the national average with a GER of 23.5%. The National Education Policy (NEP) aims to increase the GER to 50% by 2035, which appears to be an ambitious target. To achieve this goal, the country may need to rely on Open and Distance Learning (ODL) in addition to regular enrollment, as the latter may not be sufficient to meet the desired objectives. The beginning of ODL in India dates back to 1962, when the UGC recognised the need for distance education to increase access to higher education. The Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Open University, initially known as Andhra Pradesh Open University, was established on 26 August, 1982, through an Act of the AP State Legislature. This marked the beginning of open and distance learning in India.

India's ODL landscape has undergone significant developments since the establishment of the Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) in

1982. The 2000s saw the UGC establish the Distance Education Council to ensure quality assurance in distance education. The NEP 2020 has also emphasised the importance of ODL and online education in expanding access to quality education. Open universities play a significant role in the country's higher education landscape. As of 2021-22, there are 18 open universities in India, comprising 1 Central university, 16 state universities, and 1 state private university.

The enrollment figures for open universities are substantial, with the Central open university accounting for 12,60,841 students, state open universities having 18,00,003 students, and the state private open university having 3,233 students. Remarkably, open universities account for 31.8% of the total university enrollment in India, highlighting the importance of ODL.

ODL has the potential to significantly contribute to increasing GER in India by providing opportunities for students who cannot attend traditional institutions. ODL increases accessibility to higher education, particularly for marginalised and disadvantaged groups, and

offers flexible learning pathways for working professionals, homemakers, and others. Additionally, ODL is scalable, allowing institutions to cater to thousands of students at a time, and cost-effective, reducing expenses associated with traditional institutions, making education more affordable for students from economically weaker backgrounds.

However, to improve GER, several challenges need to be addressed. These challenges include improving digital infrastructure, such as internet connectivity and device availability, ensuring quality assurance of ODL programmes and institutions, providing adequate student support services like counselling and academic guidance, and securing recognition and accreditation of ODL programmes by employers and academic institutions to enhance their credibility.

One of the most pressing, yet invisible, challenges facing ODL systems is the alarming rate of student dropout. Despite impressive enrollment numbers, a significant percentage of students fail to appear for examinations. Several factors contribute to this

issue. Lax attendance policies in contact classes lead to procrastination, causing students to fall behind in assignment submissions. As assignments are a prerequisite for exam eligibility, delays in submission result in postponed exam appearances. Furthermore, many ODL students are working professionals, homemakers, or individuals who have already completed degrees. As a result, they may not prioritise exam preparation, adopting a more relaxed approach. These challenges underscore the need for ODL institutions to implement strategies that foster student engagement, motivation, and timely completion of coursework.

By increasing accessibility, flexibility, scalability, and cost-effectiveness, ODL can help achieve the goal of 50% GER by 2035. However, addressing the challenges of infrastructure, quality assurance, student support, and recognition and accreditation is crucial for the success of ODL in India.

By establishing more open universities, India can increase the GER among disadvantaged groups, address the shortage of skilled workers, and promote lifelong learning and upskilling. To achieve this, the government, policymakers, and educators must collaborate to develop a comprehensive plan, ensure adequate funding and resources, promote awareness about open universities, and foster collaborations between open universities, industries, and communities. By taking these steps, India can harness the potential of open universities to boost GER, promote inclusive education, and drive economic growth.

# Bring urban voters back to polling booths

DURING THE FIRST THREE DECADES OF ELECTIONS, URBAN VOTER PARTICIPATION WAS MUCH BETTER

The results of the Maharashtra and Jharkhand Legislative Assembly elections are now out, and new governments have been formed in both states. In the Maharashtra Assembly elections, over 65% voter turnout was recorded, the highest in 30 years. This is significant for two reasons: first, it shows an almost 4% increase compared to the Lok Sabha elections, and second, it is close to the average national voter turnout of around 65-66%.

But the question arises—can this voter turnout percentage be considered sufficient for a strong democracy? Certainly not! Then, what can be done? This is a serious issue that all responsible citizens of the country need to think about—how can voter turnout be increased in elections?

Maharashtra's data is noteworthy because the state has the largest urban population in the country. Historically, it has lagged behind the national average due to low voter turnout in cities and towns. However, a closer look at Maharashtra's data reveals that voter apathy in urban areas hasn't entirely disappeared. For example, Western Maharashtra's Kolhapur district recorded a high voter turnout of 76.25%, followed by Gadchiroli—a region often in news for Maoist activities—at

73.68%. In contrast, Mumbai City district recorded a low voter turnout of 52.07%. Similar figures were observed in other urban districts like Pune, Thane, and Mumbai Suburban.

On the positive side, voter turnout has improved overall across the state. The credit for this change, though slow and gradual, goes primarily to the Election Commission of India (ECI). This time, the ECI was quite proactive in increasing voter turnout. Its campaign involved social media and local celebrities, from cricketers to film stars. Measures like setting up polling stations in high-rise buildings and residential societies and introducing a token system to reduce waiting time were also implemented. High-voltage campaigns by political parties also helped increase voter participation.

Having said that, urban areas across the country generally see lower voter turnout. From Shimla to Surat, urban voter apathy remains consistent. This trend is not new. During the first three decades of elections, urban voter participation was much better. However, since the 1980s, the gap between urban and rural voter turnout has widened. Urban apathy needs to be understood. Urban India contributes 60% to GDP and a significant share to taxes. However, the condition of

cities continues to deteriorate.

Take Delhi, for instance. The city's pollution levels have become so severe that life has become difficult for residents. Delhi is now the most polluted capital in the world. In recent years, major cities like Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai, and Bangalore have been paralysed by floods during rainy season. Waterlogging on roads caused traffic jams, disrupted rail services, flooded homes, and forced schools and colleges to shut down. These recurring issues highlight the poor state of urban planning and infrastructure.

It's important to understand that urban India is the backbone of the country's economy. Almost the entire service sector is concentrated in cities. According to census data, 31% of population lives in cities, although non-governmental estimates suggest urban population is much higher. Cities provide employment opportunities, and they are where the dreams of the country's youth are realized.

This neglect leads voters to become disillusioned with their representatives. They feel that when their leaders are ineffective, there's no point in voting.

Hence, elected representatives must understand that if voters are to be drawn to polling stations on a large scale again, the responsibility doesn't rest solely

on the ECI. Representatives must also maintain direct contact with the public and show sensitivity toward their issues. You might recall that during the last Lok Sabha elections, the scorching heat gripped almost the entire country. Despite this, voters stepped out of their homes to cast their votes. On election day, temperatures in many places exceeded 42 degrees Celsius. It wasn't easy to campaign or stand in long queues at polling stations in such harsh weather. Yet millions of voters braved the heat and exercised their democratic right. This is encouraging and a positive sign for our democracy.

However, the ECI must make polling stations more accessible and attractive to draw even more voters. Improvements such as sufficient parking, comfortable waiting areas, and voting facilities for differently-abled individuals can make a significant difference. Currently, differently-abled individuals face considerable challenges at polling stations. This needs serious attention.

Increasing voter turnout in panchayat, municipal, Assembly, and Parliamentary elections is not solely the ECI's responsibility. This requires coordinated efforts at multiple levels.

## Landmark judgement

Sir, The Supreme Court's recent directives represent a landmark judgement in the ongoing quest to safeguard women's rights in Indian workplaces. The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act, 2013, or POSH Act, has been in force for over a decade, yet its implementation remains sluggish due to institutional apathy. This legislative vacuum has led to widespread neglect, allowing perpetrators to act with impunity and leaving victims vulnerable. By setting deadlines for compliance, the Court aims to bridge the gap between legislation and implementation. Institutional apathy and lack of accountability have hindered the POSH Act's effectiveness. Many organisations, including accredited sports bodies, have failed to establish Internal Complaints Committees (ICCs), a critical mechanism for addressing sexual harassment complaints. The Court's directive to form ICCs and Local Complaints Committees (LCCs) by January 2025 and ensure complete compliance by March 2025 marks a significant turning point. Regular audits and assessments will monitor compliance, preventing organisations from merely paying lip service to the legislation. Moreover, district-level nodal officers will oversee implementation, promptly addressing complaints.

# Drone mist-spraying project stalls

Officials have deemed the project costly and ineffective, stating it has failed to deliver significant, measurable improvements

**New Delhi, Dec 12:** A pilot project using drones to spray mist at the pollution hotspots in Delhi may come to a halt due to its high costs and lack of measurable results, an official said.

The technology was proposed as part of Delhi's 21-point Winter Action Plan to combat worsening air quality. However, officials have deemed the project costly and ineffective, stating that it has failed to deliver significant, measurable improvements.

"The technology is extremely expensive and does not provide noticeable advancements compared to the existing methods, which are already yielding better results at a fraction of the cost," an official involved

in the evaluation told PTI.

A demonstration of the project was conducted at Anand Vihar, one of Delhi's most polluted areas November 8.

During the demonstration, Delhi Environment Minister Gopal Rai highlighted the challenges posed by the pollution hotspots such as narrow roads or congested areas where

traditional modes of transport, including trucks, cannot reach.

"Pollution levels in these hotspots are higher than the average AQI in the capital. This is where drones can be particularly effective," Rai said.

Stating that the effort aims to reduce particulate matter, Rai said, "Each drone can carry 15

litres of water. After sprinkling water, it will return to refill and then continue sprinkling at the inaccessible sites."

He also said the Delhi Pollution Control Committee (DPCC) has floated a tender for three drones to be deployed at different hotspots.

"If we get promising results

from today's testing, we will move forward with formal tenders to acquire additional drones," he said.

Officials, however, remain sceptical about the practicality of the technology.

"The technology we are currently using is already delivering similar results. The drones, while innovative, only rise a few metres to spray water, which hasn't shown any noticeable impact so far.

In this situation, we are not confident about the technology," an official said.

"Hence, opting for drones doesn't make much sense. The existing methods

are already providing actionable results and can be deployed extensively across the city without incurring the high costs associated with drones," the official added.

# Ladakh, J&K to host Khelo India Winter Games

**Leh/Jammu, Dec 12:** The Union Territory of Ladakh is set to host the Khelo India Winter Games featuring ice sports like ice hockey and ice skating from January 23 next year.

"The Union Territory of Ladakh will host ice sports, including ice hockey and ice skating events from January 23 to 27, 2025," a spokesperson said.

This marks the second consecutive year that Ladakh will host a segment of the Khelo India Winter Games.

Jammu & Kashmir will host the snow events, such as Alpine Skiing, Nordic Skiing, Ski Mountaineering, and Snowboarding, from February 22 to 25, 2025 in Gulmarg.

Earlier in February, Ladakh successfully organized ice skating and ice hockey events for the first time, breaking the tradition of Jammu and Kashmir hosting all events in previous editions.

"The Khelo India Winter Games began in 2020 with nearly 1,000 athletes, including 306 women, participating in the inaugural edition," he said.

The Winter Games have since grown in popularity with over 1,350 athletes competing in 2021 and more than 1,500 in 2022.

In 2024, the Winter Games saw over 1,200 participants, including more than 700 athletes, supported by 141 staff members, 113 technical officials

and over 250 volunteers, he said adding that a total of 136 medals were awarded during the event.

"For the first time, the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, in collaboration with the Sports Authority of India, managed the technical aspects of the Games alongside the National Sports Federations and the Indian Olympic Association," he said.

Union Sports Minister Dr Mansukh Mandaviya emphasized the importance of the Winter Games in preparing India's athletes for international competitions.

# Kashmir plains receive season's first snowfall

**Srinagar, Dec 12:** Srinagar, Dec 12: Many areas in the plains of Kashmir received the season's first snowfall Thursday breaking a long dry spell, even as the minimum temperature improved at most places in the valley, officials said.

However, snowfall in the higher reaches, which began in Wednesday, continued at several places. The plains of Shopian, Pulwama, and Baramulla, as well as the upper areas of Anantnag, Budgam, and Bandipora received light snowfall. However, there was no snowfall in Srinagar, the summer capital of Jammu and Kashmir.

The higher reaches of the valley, including the tourist resorts of Gulmarg, Sonamarg, Tangmarg, Gurez and the Zojila Pass, saw light to moderate snowfall.

Due to accumulation of snow along the Zojila Pass, the Srinagar-Leh highway was closed for traffic, while the Bandipora-Gurez road and Mughal Road were also shut, officials said.



Authorities have deployed men and machinery to clear the snow and restore road traffic, they added.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has forecast an improvement in weather conditions from Thursday afternoon. Mainly dry conditions expected to prevail until December 20.

Meanwhile, night temperatures rose across the valley, including Srinagar, due to cloud cover.

Srinagar recorded a minimum temperature of minus 0.5 degrees Celsius, up from minus 3 degrees Celsius the previous night. Gulmarg recorded a low of minus 5.2 degrees Celsius, while Pahalgam, which serves as the base camp for the annual Amarnath Yatra, saw a minimum of minus 4.6 degrees Celsius.

Qazigund, the gateway town to Kashmir, recorded a low of 0.2 degrees Celsius, while Kupwara in northern Kashmir registered a minimum of 0.5 degrees Celsius, and Kokernag in southern Kashmir recorded minus 1 degree Celsius.

# LEGAL DRINKING NORM Delhi clubs, bars to check hard copy age proof

**New Delhi, Dec 12:** The Delhi government has directed operators of the city's hotels, clubs and restaurants serving liquor to verify the age of their clients through hard copies of government-issued identity proofs after violations of the legal drinking age norm were detected.

In Delhi, liquor is served only to persons aged 25 years and above. The Excise department of the Delhi government, during routine inspections by its teams in recent days, found customers younger than 25 years having alcohol at bars, clubs and restaurants.

The inspections also revealed that some customers were consuming liquor pretending to have completed 25 years. Complaints were also received by the department that some excise licensees were serving liquor to underage persons,



officials said.

Under the Delhi Excise Act, 2009, no person or licensed vendor or his employee or agent will sell or deliver liquor to any person apparently under the age of 25 years for personal or others' consumption.

The violations of the age restriction norms were reviewed by the department.

"All the licence holders of hotels, clubs, restaurants (HCR) are hereby directed to be more careful and to not serve liquor to any person under the age of

25 years without verifying the age through government-issued IDs," stated a circular issued by the department.

Further, the department has advised the HCR licensees to verify customers' age only with physical IDs instead of virtual ones saved by people on their mobile phones (excluding those in Digilocker portal)

to minimise the use of fake or edited digital IDs. The violation of the legal drinking age norm invites action under the Delhi Excise Act, 2009.

# Peanut chaat, ragi ladoos for Delhi's anganwadi kids

**New Delhi, Dec 12:** Children at Delhi's anganwadis are in for healthy and tasty treats this winter with their plates filled with additions like ragi ladoos and crunchy peanut 'chaat' as the Women and Child Development Department rolls out a new food menu with six new items including those made from millets.

"Under the Saksham Anganwadi and Poshan 2.0 scheme, the department revised the food menu in September 2024 to enhance the nutritional value of meals provided to beneficiaries during the colder months by including millets like bajra, jowar and soy flour in their meals," said a WCD official.

He explained that the department has incorporated new food items like ragi besan ladoo, peanut chaat, lobiya chaat, peanut poha and flattened rice snacks. Archana, a nutritionist at the WCD, said that winter-friendly edibles such as spinach have been added to increase the nutritional content of meals. Similarly, sweet bajra has replaced sweet daliya in the

menu, she added.

"Millets, which are considered traditional superfoods, are now a cornerstone ingredient for all categories of beneficiaries. Rich in fiber, protein, and essential micronutrients like iron and calcium, millets improve the overall quality of the meals served at anganwadis," Archana explained.

This ensures that children receive not only sufficient calories, but also nutrients essential for their growth and development, she said.

For pregnant and lactating mothers, millets have also been added to the Take Home Ration scheme, the official said.

Another official said this shift aligns with modern dietary recommendations that prioritise sustainable and nutrient-rich food.

Previously, the Take Home Ration menu included items like whole wheat flour, moong dal, jaggery, skimmed milk powder, edible oil, groundnuts, and vitamin and mineral premixes. To further enhance its nutritional value, soy flour has now been added to the list, he added.



# Delhi records coldest Dec day in 3 years

**New Delhi, Dec 12:** The city recorded its coldest December day in the last three years Thursday as the minimum temperature dropped to 4.5 degrees Celsius.

The forecast predicts cold wave conditions to persist at isolated places until the week-end.

The city recorded a low of 4.5 degrees Celsius Thursday, 0.4 degrees below normal, compared to 4.9 degrees Celsius Wednesday, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said.

The temperature had dropped sharply from 5 degrees Celsius Wednesday.

According to data, the minimum temperature did not drop below 4.9 degrees Celsius in December 2023 and 2022.

The lowest minimum tem-

perature recorded in December last year was 4.9 degrees Celsius

on the 15th, while the lowest in 2022 was 5 degrees Celsius on the 26th.

Cold wave conditions were observed at isolated places in Delhi, including Ayanagar and Pusa, where the temperatures dropped to 3.8 and 3.2 degrees Celsius respectively.

According to the India Meteorological Department, cold wave conditions occur when actual temperatures fall below 4.1 degrees Celsius or when the departure from normal is 4.4 degrees Celsius or more below

According to data, the minimum temperature did not drop below 4.9 degrees Celsius in December 2023 and 2022

The lowest minimum temperature recorded in December last year was 4.9 degrees Celsius on the 15th, while the lowest in 2022 was 5 degrees Celsius on the 26th

average.

Meanwhile, the maximum temperature during the day was recorded at 22.2 degrees Celsius, 0.8 degrees below normal, the IMD said.

The humidity fluctuated between 88 per cent and 52 per cent during the day.

The Weather department has forecast cold wave conditions

at isolated places until December 15.

Smog and mist are likely Friday morning, with a mainly clear sky during the day. Smog and mist are expected again in the evening and night.

Delhi's air quality remained in the "poor" category, with a 24-hour average AQI of 288.

Out of 38 monitoring stations, 20 recorded AQI in the "very poor" category, while the remaining stations reported air quality in the "poor" category, according to data from the Sameer app.

The Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) classifies AQI between 0 and 50 as "good", between 51 and 100 as "satisfactory", between 101 and 200 as "moderate", between 201 and 300 as "poor", between 301 and 400 as "very poor", and above 400 as "severe".

The incident occurred on the intervening night of Wednesday and Thursday when the victim, Ravi Yadav, was warming his hands by a bonfire near his home in the Trilokpuri area, police said.

**5-yr-old boy stuck in borewell rescued**

**Jaipur:** A five-year-old boy who fell into a 150-feet-deep borewell in Rajasthan's Dausa was rescued after an over 55-hour-long operation, an official said. He was taken to a hospital in an ambulance in an unconscious state.

**Soldier shoots himself dead**

**Jammu:** In an apparent case of suicide, an Army personnel allegedly shot himself dead using his service rifle in the Rajouri district of Jammu and Kashmir, officials said. **Rahul meets Hathras rape victim's family; draws BJP's criticism**

**Hathras (UP), Dec 12:** Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi met the family of a Dalit woman here who died allegedly after being gangraped in September 2020, and alleged that the family is being treated like "criminals".

The Congress MP reached Bool Garhi village around 11.15 am, even as police stepped up deployment in and around the hamlet in the Chandpara area of the district in light of his visit.

The family had reached out to Rahul earlier this year, seeking his support in getting "justice", according to the Congress which shared a letter addressed to the LoP by the woman's father.

Rahul spent around 35 minutes with the family at their home and interacted with them. He left without speaking to a waiting group of reporters who had gathered in the village for his visit.

Later, in a post in Hindi on X, Rahul attacked the BJP government alleging that it did not fulfil promises made to the family, which is living "in fear" and being treated like "criminals".

"Today I went to Hathras and met the victim's family of the shameful and unfortunate incident that happened four years ago. The things they told me during the meeting shook me. "The entire family is still living in fear. They are being treated like criminals. They cannot move freely. They are kept under the surveillance of cameras and guns all the time," Gandhi said.

The Congress leader also alleged that the promises made to them by the BJP government have not been fulfilled till date. "Neither have they been given a government job nor has the promise of shifting them to another place been fulfilled," he added.

Rahul said instead of giving justice to the victim's family, the government is "torturing" them in various ways while the accused are roaming freely. Later, the Congress on X shared a letter that, the party said, was written to Gandhi by the victim family earlier this year, seeking his support in getting justice.

**Not allowing mother to meet child is cruelty: HC**

**Mumbai, Dec 12:** The Bombay High Court has held that not letting a child meet her mother amounts to 'cruelty' under the Indian Penal Code, and refused to quash a First Information Report registered against the in-laws of a Jalna-based woman.

A bench of Justices Vibha Kankanwadi and Rohit Joshi at Aurangabad noted in its order of December 11 that the woman's daughter, only four years old, is being kept away from her despite a lower court's order.

"Keeping a young child of four years away from her mother also amounts to mental harassment, amounting to cruelty in as much as it would

certainly cause grave injury to the mental health of the mother," the HC said.

Such behaviour by in-laws amounts to 'cruelty' as defined under section 498-A of the IPC, the court added. "The mental harassment is continuing from day to day till date. It is a continuing wrong," the bench observed. It would not quash the FIR as this was not a fit case for the court to interfere, it added. The woman's father-in-law, mother-in-law and sister-in-law had sought quashing of the 2022 FIR registered against them in Jalna district of Maharashtra for alleged cruelty, harassment and criminal intimidation.

As per the complainant, she got married in 2019 and had a



daughter in 2020. But the husband and his family members started demanding money from her parents and abused her physically and verbally, she claimed. In May 2022, the

woman was allegedly thrown out of the matrimonial house and not allowed to take her daughter with her.

She then filed an application before a magistrate's

court seeking her daughter's custody. In 2023, the court ordered the husband to hand over custody of the child to the mother, but the order was not complied with and the child continues to remain with the husband, the woman stated in the high court.

The bench noted that although the child was with the husband, the applicants (in-laws) were assisting him by keeping his whereabouts secret.

Those who do not have respect for judicial orders are not entitled to relief, the high court remarked. The trio in their petition denied the allegations of cruelty and harassment, and claimed to have been implicated in a false case.

**New Delhi, Dec 12:** Opposition parties raised concerns Thursday over Bills cleared by the government for holding simultaneous elections and said larger consultations are required while ruling NDA leaders asserted the burden on the exchequer will be lessened.

The Union Cabinet approved Bills to implement 'One Nation, One Election', and sources said the draft legislations are likely to be introduced in Parliament in the ongoing Winter session. Opposition MPs questioned if the country is logistically ready to hold simultaneous elections, pointing out that recent polls in Maharashtra and Jharkhand could not be held together with that in Haryana and Jammu and Kashmir. Minister of State for Agriculture Bhagirath Chaudhary welcomed the move and said, "One nation, one election will be good for the nation. It will help in saving people's money."

He also dismissed the reservations expressed by the Opposition, and said, "They are in a habit to oppose everything." Union Minister Chirag Paswan, the leader of BJP's ally Lok Janshakti Party (RV), came out strongly in support of simultaneous polls, saying it is in national interest. "It will boost development," he told reporters.

Congress general secretary in-charge communications Jai Ram Ramesh shared a letter that was written by party president Mallikarjun Kharge earlier this year to Niten Chandra, the secretary of the High-Level Committee on 'One Nation One Election' headed by former president Ram Nath Kovind.

"The Union Cabinet has cleared the bill on 'One Nation

One Election'. The views of the Indian National Congress on this subject were forcefully articulated by its President Mallikarjun Kharge Ji January 17, 2024. Nothing has happened since then to modify them," he said in a statement.

Ramesh shared Kharge's letter where he strongly opposed the idea of holding simultaneous elections in the country and said it goes against the guarantees of federalism and the basic structure of the Constitution.

The Congress chief had also demanded that the idea be abandoned and the high-powered committee formed in this regard be dissolved. Shiv Sena (UBT) MP Anil Desai questioned if the plan can be implemented in reality.

"Congress Lok Sabha member K Suresh said his party has already made its stand clear that it is opposed to simultaneous polls. "The entire Opposition is against it," he said. DMK leader Tiruchi Siva also said his party opposes the bill. Siva questioned what would happen if a government came into minority. "Suppose if Lok Sabha gets dissolved earlier, would they dissolve all state assemblies and hold elections?" he questioned.

BJD Rajya Sabha member Sasmit Patra said greater consultations need to be held. Hitting out the Union government,

Punjab Chief Minister and AAP leader Bhagwant Mann asked, "Why don't they hold 'one nation, one education' and provide health to all in the nation? They just want to go ahead with 'one nation, one election', but the issues of smaller and regional parties will remain buried," he told reporters in the Parliament complex.

Citing the recent assembly elections and bypolls, he said, "Why did they not hold elections in Maharashtra and Jharkhand in one go? Why did they hold Jharkhand elections in two phases when there are only 80 seats?" The Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS), which had supported the concept of simultaneous polls in 2017, said the proposed legislation needs more clarity.

Asserting that discussions about the delimitation of constituencies and the implementation of women's reservation might influence 'one nation, one election', he said the BRS would also like to hold internal consultations before forming an opinion on the issue.

Moving ahead with its 'one nation, one election' plan, the government in September accepted the recommendations of the high-level committee for holding simultaneous polls for the Lok Sabha, state assemblies and local bodies in a phased manner.

**Harassment not sufficient to declare abetment to suicide: SC**

**New Delhi, Dec 12:** Mere harassment is not sufficient to hold someone guilty of the offence of abetting suicide, and there must be clear evidence of direct or indirect incitement, the Supreme Court has said.

The observations came from a bench of Justices Vikram Nath and P B Varale while delivering a verdict on an appeal challenging a Gujarat High Court order refusing to discharge a woman's husband and her in-laws for allegedly harassing her and driving her to suicide.

The top court's observations may come to the aide of Nisha and her family members. Dealing with the plea challenging the high court order, the apex

court noted a case was registered in 2021 for the alleged offences including under Sections 498-A (subjecting a married woman to cruelty) and 306 of the IPC which deals with the offence of abetment of suicide and prescribes a maximum jail term of 10 years and fine.

"For a conviction under Section 306 of the IPC, it is a well-established legal principle that the presence of clear mens rea - the intention to abet the act - is essential. Mere harassment, by itself,

is not sufficient to find an accused guilty of abetting suicide," the bench said in its December 10 judgement. It said the prosecution must demonstrate an active or direct action by the accused that led the deceased to take his or her

Around 1 am, Nisha Singhania and her son Anurag alias Piyush Singhania left their home in the Khowa Mandi area here on a motorcycle and have since not returned, a police official told PTI. Purported video clips on social media also showed them leaving the home around midnight.

voke or contribute to the act of suicide," it said. The bench discharged the three men from the charge under Section 306, even though it upheld the charge against the appellants under Section 498-A of the IPC.

It noted that an FIR was reg-

istered by the woman's father against her husband and two in-laws for the alleged offences including under Sections 306 and 498-A of the IPC.

The bench noted the woman got married in 2009 and for the first five years of the wedlock, no child was born to the couple due to which she was allegedly subjected to physical and mental harassment.

It further noted that in April, 2021, the woman's father received information that she had died by suicide.

The high court had upheld the sessions court's order to frame charges under Sections 306 and 498-A of the IPC against them. The apex court said Section 306 of the IPC penalises those who abet the act of suicide by another.

**Chhatrapati Sambhajnagar, Dec 12:** An uneasy calm prevailed in Parbhani Thursday with police detaining around 50 persons for the violent protests that rocked the central Maharashtra city over vandalising of a replica of the Constitution. Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis said the mentally unstable man who allegedly damaged the replica was arrested immediately, yet violence took place which was unacceptable. Opposition leaders, including Bahujan Samaj Party supremo Mayawati and Samajwadi Party chief Akhilesh Yadav, condemned the 'insult' to the Constitution, while Congress in Maharashtra asked the government not to commit "atrocities" on Dr B R Ambedkar's followers in the aftermath of the violence. Some 20 vehicles were damaged during Wednesday's protests, police said. The situation was under control, Parbhani collector Raghunath Gawade told PTI Videos. "Around 50 people have been detained for vandalism, while a man named Pawar has been arrested for allegedly vandalising the replica of the Constitution. He has mental issues. We have got hold of medical documents confirming his mental condition," the official said.



Police were investigating if there was any political motive behind the violence, he added. A bandh was called on Wednesday after the glass-enclosed replica of the Constitution near Dr B R Ambedkar's statue outside the Parbhani railway station was found damaged the previous evening. But the shut-down took a violent turn when a mob indulged in arson and vandalised shops, vehicles and even the district collector's office. "We are going through the footage from CCTV cameras and action will be taken against all those responsible. The intention of the agitators will also be probed," said Inspector General of Police Shahji Umap. Prohibitory orders banning gathering of more than five persons continue in the city. Speaking to reporters in Delhi, chief minister Fadnavis said the "mentally unstable man" involved in the vandalising of the replica was arrested promptly. "Still, despite action being taken, there was violence. This is not acceptable. Protests can be held by abiding by the Constitution," he said. State Congress president Nana Patole demanded suspension of the Parbhani Superintendent of Police and stringent punishment for those behind the "desecration" of the Constitution replica. "While Parbhani was burning, the CM and two deputy CMs were busy distributing ministries....People who do not respect the Constitution

are in power, it is leading to such incidents," the Congress leader said, asking the government to stop "atrocities" against Ambedkar's followers. Shiv Sena (UBT) spokesperson Sushma Andhare also accused the government of targeting Ambedkar's followers in the name of combing operations for arresting those who took part in the violent protests. Maharashtra does not have a home minister (as cabinet expansion is awaited) and questions have arisen about the law and order situation, she said. "The disrespect shown to the statue of Bharat Ratna Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar and the Constitution in Parbhani, Maharashtra, is highly condemnable and shameful. The party is deeply saddened and concerned by this incident," BSP leader Mayawati posted on X in Hindi. "The state government should immediately take strict legal action against such casteist and anti-social elements, otherwise the situation could deteriorate significantly. I appeal to everyone to maintain peace and order," she added. Akhilesh Yadav targeted the BJP over the incident. "As soon as the BJP government, formed through fraud, came to power in Maharashtra, on whose orders did the audacity of breaking the replica of the Constitution happen? A thorough investigation should be conducted to find out," Yadav posted on X.

## NIA raids 19 locations

**New Delhi:** The National Investigation Agency conducted searches at 19 locations across the country Thursday as part of its probe into a case of terror conspiracy by Pakistan-based Jaish-e-Mohammad. The searches were carried out in Assam, Maharashtra, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, West Bengal, Rajasthan, Gujarat and Jammu and Kashmir, the federal probe agency said. According to a statement by the NIA, the searches were conducted at the premises of suspects/ close aides of Sheikh Sultan Salah Uddin Ayubi, a Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) operative who was arrested on account of his incriminatory role in the case. Ayubi was taken into custody in October this year for disseminating propaganda material associated with JeM, and radicalising and recruiting youth into the Jamaat outfit inspired by JeM, the statement said.

# SC flags absence of Centre's lawyers

**New Delhi, Dec 12:** Displeased over the repeated absence of the Centre's advocates in several cases, the Supreme Court Thursday said it did not take pleasure in summoning government officers before it. A bench of Justices B R Gavai and K V Viswanathan December 11 sought the presence of the director general of the Centre's Directorate General of Health Services while flagging the "casual approach" in a matter concerning admission of a medical aspirant belonging to persons with disability category. "The court does not take pleasure in summoning the officers to the court. However, when in spite of being duly

served, the respondents do not put in appearance, we were compelled to do so," it said. On Thursday, both the officer and Centre's counsel additional solicitor general Vikramjit Banerjee appeared before the bench. "What is this? # Relaxed curbs to continue: SC

**New Delhi, Dec 12:** The Supreme Court Thursday said the direction to relax the stringent GRAP-4 curbs, meant to deal with severe air pollution levels to stage 2, would continue till further orders. A bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Augustine George Masih asked the Centre to consider identifying top experts in the field of environment, agriculture and other related fields for appointment in the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM), may be in the advisory capacity. The Delhi government further informed the bench it had imposed the ban on firecrackers till January but was mulling to implement a round-the-year ban which would soon be notified. The top court then directed the NCR states to place on record their decisions for enforcing the round-the-year firecrackers ban saying it was required not only to curb air pollution but also noise pollution. The bench clarified the ban on firecrackers would include sale, manufacture, storage and use of firecrackers. The top court has been hearing pleas seeking directions for the implementation of curbs to check air pollution

in the Delhi-NCR region. The bench allowed the CAQM to incorporate additional measures like mechanised sweeping of roads, controlled traffic movement, proper disposal of dust and other measures, which were earlier part of stage-3 of GRAP in stage 2. The top court said it did not want any retired judge to be in the CAQM, even in advisory capacity as it may lead to conflict of interest as this court examines the work of the commission. "We want top experts of different fields to be there in the CAQM. We don't want any retired judges to be there," it said, adding the Centre and other parties may suggest some names by the next date of hearing. The bench further directed the Delhi and NCR states to ensure payment of subsistence allowance to construction workers, who were affected due to implementation of restrictions to check air pollution level from November 18 to December 5 (both days inclusive). Senior advocate Shadan Farasat, appearing for Delhi government, said 90,000 workers were paid Rs 8,000 rupees each and additional registration process had been initiated with 20,000-odd construction workers coming forward so far.

## TMC raises B'ladesh issue, demands statement from PM

**New Delhi, Dec 12:** Trinamool Congress Thursday demanded that Prime Minister Narendra Modi speak in Parliament on situation in neighbouring Bangladesh. The issue was raised in the Rajya Sabha in the post-lunch sitting by TMC's Parliamentary Party leader Derek O'Brien, who sought permission to raise a point of order. He quoted Rule 251, and said he wanted the Prime Minister to come and give a statement on Bangladesh issue. Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar however said it is not a point of order, and did not allow O'Brien to continue. The refusal was followed by TMC MPs breaking out into sloganeering in the House. Talking to reporters outside Parliament, TMC's deputy leader in Rajya Sabha Sagari-ka Ghose said a statement on the issue should be given in Parliament by the Prime Minister. "Our party leader Derek O'Brien raised this issue today that we are deeply concerned about people in Bangladesh, particularly the minorities," she said. "The prime Minister should come to parliament and give a full statement and full clarification on what the government of india intends to do with regard to the situation in Bangladesh," she said. TMC Rajya Sabha MP Sushmita Dev said the government should tell it has done for the Hindus in Bangladesh. "The situation that is there in Bangladesh, the PM should speak on the issue in both Houses," Dev told reporters outside Parliament. "The religious minorities there are facing atrocities, he (Prime Minister Modi) should speak on it and the political situation there," she said.

### Biggest single-day act of clemency by Biden

**Washington:** President Joe Biden is commuting the sentences of roughly 1,500 people who were released from prison and placed on home confinement during the coronavirus pandemic and is pardoning 39 Americans convicted of nonviolent crimes. It's the largest single-day act of clemency in modern history. The commutations announced Thursday are for people who have served out home confinement sentences for at least one year after they were released. Biden said he would be taking more steps in the weeks ahead and would continue to review clemency petitions. The second largest single-day act of clemency was by Barack Obama, with 330, shortly before leaving office in 2017.

### Indian student killed in UK road accident

**London:** A 32-year-old Indian student has died in a road accident in eastern England's Leicestershire while four other people were hospitalised with serious injuries, according to police. Chiranjeevi Panguluri died on the spot as a passenger in a car that ended up in a ditch and three co-passengers, one woman and two men, and the driver were all taken to hospital, the Leicestershire Police said of the accident which was reported Tuesday morning. A 27-year-old man, arrested on suspicion of causing death by dangerous driving, has since been released on bail.

### UK gay veterans win compensation

**London:** British military veterans who were discharged or suffered other forms of discrimination because of their sexual orientation or gender identity will receive up to 70,000 pounds (\$89,300) under a government compensation programme announced Thursday. Prior to 2000, service personnel who were discovered to be lesbian, gay or trans were forced to leave the military under policies that designated them as unfit to serve in the armed forces. Many others were subjected to brutal investigations into allegations about their sexual orientation. "The historic treatment of LGBT veterans was a moral stain on our nation," Defence Secretary John Healey said in announcing the compensation. "Our government is determined to right the wrongs of the past and recognise the hurt that too many endured."

### Another plea filed in B'desh to advance bail hearing of Hindu monk

**Dhaka, Dec 12:** The lawyer of Chinmoy Krishna Das Thursday filed a fresh plea in a Bangladesh court seeking to expedite the hearing of the arrested Hindu monk's bail petition in a sedition case, according to media reports.

This comes a day after the court rejected similar petitions by the lawyer, asserting that he did not have the power of attorney from the monk.

Lawyer Rabindra Ghosh once again submitted an application to Chattogram Metropolitan Sessions Judge Saiful Islam to hear a bail application, the bdnews24.com news portal reported. "I came yesterday too. Unfortunately, a hearing was not held yesterday. Today (the judge) accepted (the petition). He will hear me out," the lawyer was quoted as saying by the news portal.

Responding to a question about why Das' lawyers were not coming to court, he said, "I have spoken to them. The cases that have been filed against them... they are not coming out of fear."

Meanwhile, Chattogram District Bar Association President Nazim underscored that Ghosh will face the case "legally".

"Today, he presented an application. His letter of attorney was from the Supreme Court bar. The court said, 'If any lawyer gives me a letter of attorney this time, I will hold a hearing.' That is the situation for now," he said.

On Wednesday, three petitions filed by the lawyer were rejected at the same court. These included permission to represent Das in the case over which he was arrested, the second requested access to records from a case filed November 26, and the third sought to expedite the bail hearing, the report said.

Thirteen new flight routes to Rovaniemi Airport opened this year, bringing passengers from Geneva, Berlin, Bordeaux and more. Most tourists come from European countries like

France, Germany and the UK, but Rovaniemi's appeal has also spread further.

Local critics of mass tourism say many apartment buildings in Rovaniemi's city center are also used for accommodation services during peak season and are thus no longer available for residential use. They say the proliferation of short-term rentals has driven up prices, squeezed out long-term residents, and turned its city centre into a "transient space for tourists."

Finnish law prohibits professional accommodation services in buildings intended for residential use, so campaigners are calling on authorities to act.

### 110 people killed in 7 weeks in Mozambique

**Maputo (Mozambique), Dec 12:** More than 100 people including children have been killed by security forces in post-election protests in Mozambique that have lasted nearly two months, rights and civil society groups said.

The main opposition leader called Thursday for more demonstrations against what he says was a rigged vote by the governing party.

The southern African nation, which endured a 15-year civil war from 1977 to 1992, has been beset by unrest and street protests since two prominent opposition officials were fatally shot in their car by unknown gunmen October 18.

Those killings, which were called political assassinations by their party, increased tensions following a disputed October 9 presidential election.

Thousands of people have taken to the streets in protest against the long-governing Frelimo party, which has held power in Mozambique for nearly a half-century.

Since October 21, 110 people have been killed in the protests, said Plataforma Eleitoral Decide, a Mozambique civil society group that monitors elections. Thirty-four of those were killed between December 4 and December 10 as the protests show no sign of abating, the group said.

International rights group Amnesty International repeated that death toll and said Wednesday that the fatalities were among a total of 357 people who have been shot by security forces during the protests. More than 3,500 people have been arbitrarily arrested, Amnesty said.

Rights groups have criticised Mozambican authorities for what they call a brutal clampdown on what started as peaceful protests against the election, which opposition parties say was rigged. International observers also reported irregularities with the vote.

## India votes in favour of UNGA ceasefire resolution in Gaza

India was among the 158 nations that voted in favour of the resolution while nine member states, including Israel and the US, voted against it. Among the 13 nations that abstained were Albania and Ukraine

Tata Motors to hike trucks, buses prices

Retail inflation eases

Inflation in Nov eases to 5.48% as food prices moderate, creates headroom for rate cut

**New Delhi, Dec 12:** Retail inflation declined in November to 5.48 per cent and came within the Reserve Bank's comfort zone mainly due to easing food prices, creating headroom for a rate cut at the central bank's rate-setting panel meeting under new Governor Sanjay Malhotra in February.

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) based headline inflation was at 6.21 per cent in October and 5.55 per cent in November 2023.

"During the month of November, 2024 significant decline in inflation is observed in vegetables, pulses and products, sugar and confectionary, fruits, eggs, milk and products, spices, transport and communication and personal care and effects subgroups," National Statistics Office (NSO) said in a statement.

According to the CPI data released by the NSO Thursday, inflation in the food basket reduced to 9.04 per cent in November. It was 10.87 per cent in October and 8.70 per cent in November 2023.

The data revealed that the top five items showing highest year-on-year inflation in November 2024 were garlic (85.14), potato (66.65), cauliflower (47.7), cabbage (43.58) and coconut oil (42.13).

The key items having lowest year-on-year inflation were jeera (-35.04), ginger (-16.96), LPG excluding conveyance

The government has tasked the RBI to ensure that the headline inflation remains at 4 per cent with a margin of 2 per cent on either side. The RBI has maintained a short-term lending rate (repo) at 6.5 per cent since February 2023.

Aditi Nayar, Chief Economist, ICRA said led by food inflation, the CPI inflation expectedly eased to 5.5 per cent in November 2024 from 6.2 per cent in October 2024, falling back within the medium-term target range and offering a dose

of relief.

She further said that the cumulative sowing of rabi crops exceeded the year-ago levels by 1.5 per cent year-on-year by December 9, 2024, led by pulses, rice, wheat and coarse cereals, whereas the rabi sowing for oilseeds contracted by 4.3 per cent annually.

Last week, the RBI Governor headed Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) had left the repo unchanged at 6.5 per cent citing concern on the inflation front.

**Mumbai, Dec 12:** Equity market benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty ended lower Thursday due to selling pressure in index majors Reliance Industries, L&T and HUL as investors turned cautious ahead of the inflation data announcement.

Besides, weakness in the rupee and foreign fund outflows hit investors' sentiment, traders said.

The 30-share BSE benchmark Sensex declined 236.18 points or 0.29 per cent to settle at 81,289.96. During the day, it dropped 314.5 points or 0.38 per cent to 81,211.64.

The NSE Nifty dropped 93.10 points or 0.38 per cent to 24,548.70.

"Investors traded with caution ahead of the announcement of inflation and IIP data and steadily cut their equity bets. There is a lack of confidence amongst investors due to global uncertainty, rising US bond yields fuelling fund outflows, and persisting conflicts in the Middle East and West Asia," Prashanth Tapse, Senior VP (Research), Mehta Equities Ltd, said.

Among the 30-share Sensex blue-chip firms, NTPC, Hindustan Unilever, Tata Motors, Maruti, Larsen & Toubro, Reliance Industries, Asian Paints and State Bank of India were the biggest laggards.

IIP growth slows to 3.5% in October

Poor performance of mining, power and manufacturing among reasons behind weak factory output

**New Delhi, Dec 12:** India's industrial production (IIP) growth slowed to 3.5 per cent year-on-year in October 2024, mainly due to poor performance of mining, power and manufacturing, as per official data released Thursday.

The IIP recorded a growth of 11.9 per cent in October 2023, according to a statement by the Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation.

However, on a sequential basis, the factory output in October 2024 rose to 3.5 per cent from 3.1 per cent in September and a contraction of 0.1 per cent in August this year.

The growth in the factory output, measured in terms of the IIP, in April-October worked out to be 4 per cent against 7 per cent in the year-ago period, the data showed.

As per the data, the mining output growth decelerated to 0.9 per cent in October from 13.1 per cent expansion in the year-ago month. The manufacturing sector's growth decelerated to 4.1 per cent in October from 10.6 per cent a year ago.

Similarly, in power generation, the output growth slowed sharply to 2 per cent from a 20.4



per cent growth a year ago. As per use-based classification, the capital goods segment growth decelerated to 3.1 per cent in October 2024 from 21.7 per cent in the year-ago period.

In October this year, consumer non-durables output growth slowed to 2.7 per cent compared to a 9.3 per cent growth in October 2023.

Consumer durable goods production grew by 5.9 per cent during the reporting month against a 15.9 per cent expansion in October 2023.

According to the data, infrastructure/construction goods reported a growth of 4 per cent in October 2024, down from a 12.6 per cent expansion in the year-ago period.

The data also showed that the output of primary goods logged a 2.6 per cent growth in October this year against 11.4 per cent a year earlier.

The expansion in the intermediate goods segment was 3.7 per cent in the month under review, lower than the 9.5 per cent a year ago.

₹ hits fresh all-time low, settles at 84.88

**Mumbai, Dec 12:** The rupee depreciated by 5 paise to settle at an all-time low of 84.88 against the US dollar Thursday, dragged down by negative domestic equity markets, outflow of foreign funds and rise in crude oil prices.

Forex traders said the rupee remains in a weakening mode due to dollar demand from importers and foreign banks.

At the interbank foreign exchange, the rupee opened at 84.85 and touched the lowest-ever level of 84.89 against the greenback during intra-day trade. The unit finally ended the session 5 paise down at a fresh all-time low closing level of 84.88 against the dollar.

On Wednesday, the rupee settled with a gain of 2 paise at 84.83 against the US dollar.

Rupee's previous record low closing level was recorded December 9, when it settled 20 paise lower at 84.86 against the dollar.



Anuj Choudhary, Research Analyst at Mirae Asset Sharekhan, said the rupee touched a fresh all-time low on strong US dollar and weak domestic markets. He further said the US dollar gained on rising inflation in the US. However, it was in line with estimates.

"Surge in global crude oil prices may further pressurise the rupee. However, any intervention by the RBI may support the rupee at lower levels. Traders may take cues from PPI (producer price index) and weekly unemployment claims data from the US. USD-INR spot price is expected to trade in a range of 84.65 to 85.10," he said.

Meanwhile, the dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was trading higher by 0.09 per cent at 106.81.

Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) were net sellers in the capital markets Thursday, as they offloaded shares worth Rs 3,560.01 crore, according to exchange data.

Rosneft, Reliance agree biggest ever India-Russia oil supply deal

**New Delhi, Dec 12:** Russia's state oil firm Rosneft has agreed to supply nearly 500,000 barrels per day (bpd) of crude to Indian private refiner Reliance in the biggest ever energy deal between the two countries, three sources familiar with the deal said.

The 10-year agreement amounts to 0.5% of global supply and is worth roughly \$13 billion a year at today's prices. It would further cement energy relations between India and Russia, which is under heavy Western sanctions over its invasion of Ukraine.

Reliance said it works with international suppliers, includ-

ing from Russia, and deals are based on market conditions. The company declined further comment on commercial matters, citing the confidentiality of supply agreements.

The deal comes ahead of the planned visit by Russian President Vladimir Putin to India and after US President-elect Donald Trump said he wants to push Moscow and Kyiv to stop the war as soon as he takes office in January.

Russian oil accounts for more than a third of India's energy imports. India became the largest importer of Russian crude after the European Union, previously the top buyer, imposed sanctions on Rus-



sian oil imports in response to the 2022 invasion of Ukraine.

India has no sanctions on Russian oil, so refiners there have cashed in on the cheaper crude supply. Sanctions have made Russian oil cheaper than rival grades by at least \$3 to \$4 per barrel.

India's rising Russian imports have come at the expense

of rival Middle Eastern producers. The Reliance-Rosneft deal would represent another challenge for competitors, including Saudi Arabia.

Competition among oil producers for a share of the Indian market is hot because it is one of the fastest-growing energy markets, and is becoming more important as a driver of global

demand as growth in top importer China slows.

Under the deal, Rosneft would deliver 20-21 Aframax-sized cargoes (80,000 to 100,000 metric tons) of various Russian crude grades and three cargoes of about 100,000 tons each of fuel oil each month, the three sources said.

The shipments will be supplied for Reliance's refining complex, the world's biggest, at Jamnagar in the western state of Gujarat.

In 2024, Reliance had a deal with Rosneft to purchase 3 million barrels of crude a month.



# Maverick of 64 squares

I am just living my dream says Gukesh after becoming the youngest chess World Champion

**Singapore, Dec 12:** Many including World No. 1 Magnus Carlsen had predicted Dommaraju Gukesh as the favourite in the final of the world chess championship. However, as he let go off ample winning opportunities, many started doubting whether he had the means and methods to dethrone defending champion Ding Liren. But Gukesh proved that he is a maverick of 64 squares by coming up trumps in the last game of the match when he scripted history by defeating Liren after 58 moves.

“I am just living my dream,” said Gukesh here Thursday, his unassuming persona shining through even after a history-scripting performance that made him the youngest-ever to achieve the triumph. Gukesh dethroned China’s Liren on his way to the historic triumph, sealing it in the 14th and last game of a see-saw battle.

“I was dreaming this moment for last 10 years. Happy I realised this dream,” Gukesh said after his incredible victory. “I got a bit emotional because I was not expecting to win. But then I got a chance to press on. I’ve been dreaming about this and living this moment since I was six or seven years old. Every



chess player wants to live this moment. I’m living my dream. I’d like to thank God from the Candidates (tournament) till the championship,” the 18-year-old added.

Gukesh praised his opponent Liren. “To me Ding is a real world champion. He fought like a true champion and I’m sorry for him and his team. I would like to thank my opponent,” Gukesh said.

The new world champion did not forget to thank his parents. “The dream

of winning the world chess championship is bigger for them than for me. I will never forget the contributions they have made in my life,” Gukesh stated.

In the process of becoming the world champion at 18 years, Gukesh also eclipsed the record of Anatoly Karpov who won the title in 1985 at 22 years. Till

Thursday, Karpov was the youngest-ever to wear the chess world crown. Now Gukesh wears it.

Gukesh secured the requisite 7.5 points as against 6.5 of Liren after winning the last classical time control game of the 14-game match that seemed headed for a draw for most part. As title winner, he will get a major share of the USD 2.5 million prize purse.

The reticent teenager grinned widely and raised his arms in celebration after the triumph, a stark contrast from the poker face he usually sports while playing.

One of the first to congratulate Gukesh on his incredible feat was Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

“Congratulations to Gukesh D on his remarkable achievement. This is the result of his unparalleled talent, hard work and unwavering determination. His triumph has not only etched his name in the annals of chess history, but has also inspired millions,” Modi wrote on ‘X’

Pacer Akash Deep is likely to replace Harshit Rana while Washington Sundar will come in place of Ravichandran Ashwin, sources informed. After the Adelaide debacle where the batters failed miserably, the think-tank is keen to bring back Sundar who is a more technically equipped batter than Ashwin, they informed.

Meanwhile Virat Kohli was once again the centre of attention here Thursday during the training session as he addressed his teammates. The team huddles before the start of the training session has been a constant

feature for years now and Kohli used to do a lot of talking during his days in charge.

With vice-captain Jasprit Bumrah by his side, Kohli was seen speaking animatedly to the group and everyone, including Rohit, listened to him with rapt attention.

Unlike before the pink ball Test, Rohit looked in far better shape during his net session at the Gabba but question marks remain over whether he would be back to opening the innings or stay put at No. 6, which isn’t his preferred slot. However, even though a number of formers including former coach Ravi Shastri have urged Rohit to go back to the top of the order, it looks likely he will bat at No. 5.

The Indian management will go for Akash as he has been the most consistent bowler in the nets. Even though Rana had an impressive debut at Perth, he gave away a lot of runs in Adelaide. It is for this reason only that Akash in all probability will get the nod over Rana.

Sources also stated that Mohammed Shami is unlikely to join the Test team as he is still unsure about his fitness.

#### Jolly-Gayatri keep semis hopes alive

**Hangzhou:** The Indian women’s doubles pair of Treesa Jolly and Gayatri Gopichand defeated the Malaysian combination of Pearly Tan and Thinaah Muralitharan 21-19, 21-19 in their second Group A tie to keep alive their semifinal hopes at the BWF World Tour Finals here Thursday. The Indians are currently placed second behind the Chinese and will need to win against the Japanese pair of Nami Matsuyama and Chiharu Shida on Friday to book their semifinal berth. The sport is not yet confirmed for the 2032 edition in Brisbane. “Very exciting time ahead for cricket’s involvement in the Olympics movement – a meeting with the @Brisbane\_2032 organising committee in Brisbane, Australia today,” Shah posted on X with visuals of the meeting.
