Cricket to feature in 2028 LA Olympics

New Delhi, April 10: Cricket will feature six teams battling for top honours when the sport returns to the Olympics at the 2028 Los Angeles Games after a gap of 128 years. This was confirmed by the organisers on Wednesday.

Cricket last featured at the Olympics in the 1900 edition of the Games in Paris, where a one-off two-day match between Great Britain and France was held, which is now recognised as an unofficial Test. At LA 2028, cricket will be played in T20 format, with six teams competing in both the men's and women's competitions.

Every team will be able to name a 15-member squad as a total of 90 athlete quotas have been allocated for each gender.

The International Cricket Council (ICC) consists of 12 full members in Afghanistan, Australia, Bangladesh, England, India, Ireland, New Zealand, Pakistan, South Africa, Sri Lanka, the West Indies and Zimbabwe. Another 94 countries form

the associate members group. Qualification criteria for the 2028 Games are yet to be confirmed for the cricket tournament but USA are likely to earn a direct spot at the quadrennial extravaganza as host nation, meaning only five teams will be allowed to make the cut through the qualification process. It is expected that top five teams in the ICC rankings within a certain cut-off date will qualify apart from the United States of America.

Cricket is one of five new sports which will feature at the next Olympic Games. The International Olympic Committee (IOC) approved cricket's inclusion for LA28 in 2023, along with baseball/softball, flag football, lacrosse (sixes) and squash.

Meanwhile, The Executive Board (EB) of the IOC Wednesday approved the event programme and athlete quotas for

BAIL TO RAPE ACCUSED Woman herself invited trouble: Allahabad HC

Prayagraj, April 10: In a retrograde ruling, the Allahabad High Court has granted bail to a rape accused, observing that the complainant "herself invited trouble" by agreeing to go to the applicant's house after getting drunk, the news coming days after the Supreme Court intervened to stay an "insensitive" order passed by another HC justice in a rape attempt case. The woman is a student of MA and hence she "was competent enough to understand the morality and significance of her act", stated the order passed by Justice

Sanjay Kumar Singh last month. Earlier, it was submitted on behalf of the applicant that it was an admitted case of the woman that she was an adult and resided in PG Hostel. She, of her own volition, went to a restaurant with her female friends and their male friends where all of them drank alcohol together. Due to this, she

became verv intoxicated

The counsel for the applicant argued that the woman, along with her friends, stayed in the bar till 3am. Since she needed support, she herself agreed to go to the house of the applicant and rest. Her allegation that the applicant instead took her to his relative's flat and raped her twice is false and against the evidence on record, the counsel told the court.

It was argued that considering the facts as disclosed by the woman, it is not a case of rape but might be a case of consensual relationship. "This court is of the view that even if the allegation of the victim is accepted as true, then it can also be concluded that she herself invited trouble and was also responsible for the same. Similar stand has been taken by the victim in her statement. In her medical examination, her hymen was found torn but doctor did not give any opinion about the sexual assault," it said.

The US, which promptly arrested Headlev just before the 26/11 investigators got a whiff of his involvement in the Lashkar plot, has turned down possibilities of his extradition so far. Indian agencies have, until now, been able to conduct his questioning in a US prison, partially though, Headly (Daood Sayed Gilani) still remains the main facilitator of the carnage. India had sent an extradition

Los Angeles Thursday evening. ending days of speculation of when and how he will be extradited, officials said.

In a statement late evening, the NIA said Rana was "formal ly arrested immediately after his arrival at Delhi airport".

Rana was escorted to Delhi by teams of NIA and National Security Guard (NSG), the agency said. An NIA team at the airport arrested Rana soon after he emerged from the air

Soil from moon suggests a thirsty far side

That sherbet isn't for taste or thirst, dear. It's to protect dharma

Cape Canaveral, April 10: Soil and rocks returned from the moon's mysterious far side suggest it may be drier than the side constantly facing Earth, Chinese scientists reported Wednesday. They, however, cautioned more samples are needed for a clearer picture.

A better understanding of the abundance of water in the lunar mantle can help explain how the moon evolved, the researchers noted. But it could also be all the more reason for astronauts to stick close to the near side of the moon as currently planned.

China became the first country to land on the moon's far side last year. The Chang'e 6 spacecraft scooped up the



volcanic rock and dirt from the ancient, sprawling South Pole-Aitken basin, one of the largest impact craters in the solar system. The Chinese Academy of Sci-

ences' Sen Hu said he and his team received 5 grams of soil samples, then selected 578 particles for detailed analysis using electron microscopes

They estimated the water

abundance at less than 1.5 micrograms per gram, on the dry end of what's been found in samples gathered over past decades from the moon's near side. Measurements on samples from the near side have ranged between 1 microgram and 200 micrograms per gram.

Given the limited sampling, it's uncertain how widespread this dry condition might be, the scientists noted in their study published in the journal Nature.

"More far side samples are required for testing and further unraveling" how much water there is, Hu said in an email.

It's possible the impact that created this basin may have blasted water elements to the near side, leaving the far side depleted. Another possibility is that the vertical distribution of water could be different between the two hemispheres.

Even if confirmed, the findings shouldn't drastically alter NASA's plans to send astronauts to the moon's south polar region, where permanently shadowed craters are believed

to hold massive amounts of ice. This frozen water could be used for drinking, cooking and making rocket fuel.

NASA aims to send four astronauts around the moon next vear under its Artemis program, the successor to Apollo, which put 12 men on the moon from 1969 through 1972. That would be followed by a landing near the lunar south pole by astronauts no earlier than 2027. China is seeking its own astronaut moon landing by 2030.

"With the active assistance of USDoJ, the US Sky Marshal, NIA worked closely with other Indian intelligence agencies. NSG through the entire extradition process, which also saw India's Ministry of External Affairs and Ministry of Home Affairs coordinating with the other relevant authorities in the United States to take the matter to its successful conclusion," the statement read.

Senior advocate Dayan Krishnan and special public prosecutor Narender Mann. who are representing the NIA, reached the Patiala House court premises shortly after news that Rana had landed in Delhi. Police officials asked mediapersons to leave and said they were ensuring the court

premises were fully vacant. The lawvers, however, refused to comment.

Special NIA judge Chander Jit Singh is hearing the case against Rana. Advocate Pivush Sachdeva from Delhi Legal Services Authority is representing the accused.

Meanwhile, tight security has been ensured outside the NIA headquarters at the CGO complex here and the entire premises has been cordoned off by security personnel of Delhi Police and Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF).

Key roads outside and around the NIA office has been closed for any vehicular traffic. Entry and exit from gate no 2 of Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium metro station, which is opposite the probe agency's office, has been barred.

The announcement that Rana would be finally extradited came when Prime Minister Narendra Modi visited the US capital in February. "We are giving a very violent man back to India immediately to face justice in India." US President Donald Trump said at a joint press conference with Modi February 14.

Trump said his administration has approved the extradition of "very evil people of the world" Rana "to face justice in India". Rana was lodged in Metropolitan Detention Centre in Los Angeles.

He was held in judicial custody in the US following proceedings initiated under the India-US Extradition Treaty for his extradition. The extradition finally came through after Rana exhausted all legal avenues to

stay the move.

The District Court for the Central District of California had ordered his extradition May 16, 2023. Rana then filed multiple litigations in the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals, all of which were rejected.

He subsequently filed a petition for a writ of certiorari, two habeas petitions, and an emergency application before the US Supreme Court, which were also denied.

"The extradition proceedings were initiated between the two countries after India eventuallv secured a surrender warrant for the wanted terrorist from the US government," the NIA said.

Rana is accused of conspiring with David Coleman Headley alias Daood Gilani, and operatives of designated terrorist

organisations Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) and Harkat-ul-Jihadi Islami (HUJI) along with other Pakistan-based co-conspirators, to carry out the the three-day terror siege of India's financial capital. Both LeT and HUJI have been declared terrorist organisations by the Indian government under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967.

Among the 166 killed were US. British and Israeli nationals. Besides, 238 were injured in the mayhem carried out by a group of 10 Pakistani terrorists on a railway station. two luxury hotels and a Jewish centre after they sneaked into Mumbai through the Arabian Sea.

The terrorists had targeted multiple iconic locations in Mumbai, including the Tai Mahal and Oberoi hotels, Leopold Cafe, Chabad House and Chha trapati Shivaji Terminus train station, each of which Headley had scouted in advance.

Rana would be the third person to be sent on trial in India in the case after Aimal Kasab and Zabiuddin Ansari alias Abu Jundal. In November 2012 Ajmal Amir Kasab, the lone surviving terrorist among the Pakistani group, was hanged to death in Yerawada Jail in Pune

Rana had served in the Paki stan Army medical corps before emigrating to Canada in late 1990s and started his immigration consultancy firm. He later moved to the US and set up an office in Chicago.

Through his firm, Rana gave cover to Headley to carry out reconnaissance mission in Mumbai so that the terrorists could launch the attacks.

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

Koraput breaks 7-yr record in finger millet procurement

Koraput/Nandapur, April 10: Finger millet procurement in Koraput district has hit a seven-year high, thanks to the Odisha government's ₹2.10 per kg incentive scheme aimed at encouraging millet cultivation and supporting farmers, a report said.

According to Koraput Collector V Keerthi Vasan, the district has procured 2,39,875 quintals of millets from 14,574 farmers till April 7, nearly achieving 98.2 per cent of the targeted 2,44,200 quintals under the current procurement cycle.

Officials say the re cord-breaking feat is the result of a focused plan prepared for the 2024–25 fiscal year under the government's 'Shree Anna Abhiyan' initiative. The plan was executed jointly by the district administration, Tribal Development Cooperative Corporation of Odisha Ltd (TDCCOL), Millet Mission officials, and farmer producer organisation (FPO).

To ensure direct purchase from farmers, the administration deployed 21 Farmer Producer Organisations (FPOs) and Large Area Multipurpose Societies (LAMPs) across 14 blocks. The procurement was carried out at the minimum

Woman sentenced to life for killing hubby

Bolangir, April 10: The Balangir District and Sessions Court recently sentenced a woman to life imprisonment for killing her husband in 2022.

Presiding Judge Pabitra Mohan Samal Thursday found Jashoda Bhoi, 30, guilty of murdering her husband, Dibyasingh Bhoi, and sentenced her to rigorous life imprisonment along with a fine of ₹10,000. In case of failure to pay the fine, the convict will have to serve an additional one year in prison.




According to case details, 22 October 2022, Rajanikant Bhoi of Mahipur village under Tushura police limits filed a complaint with the local police alleging that his daughter-in-law Jashoda had murdered his son, Dibvasingh.

A case (No. 162/22) was registered at Tushura police station, and then-officer Sanjeeb Pradhan conducted the investigation. Jashoda was subsequently arrested and later produced in a court.

The investigation revealed that the couple had long-standing marital disputes. On the night of October 21, 2022, during a domestic quarrel, Jashoda allegedly hacked her husband with an axe while he was asleep, resulting in his death.

Following a thorough trial, the District Judge declared Jashoda guilty and imposed the sentence.

The case was prosecuted by government advocate Subash Chandra Mahanta.

China's Marriage Crisis

New marriages in China reportedly plummeted by one-fifth last year, implying that the official number of births will likely fall from 9.54 million in 2024 to7.3-7.8 million in 2025. Thus, while China represents17.2% of the global population, it will account for less than 6% of births– comparable to Nigeria.

Moreover, China's fertility rate in 2025 is expected to fall to 0.9births per woman (2.1 is the standard replacement level), just half of what officials predicted in 2016. So alarming is this demographic reality that early this month Chinese Premier Li Qiang announced that the government will be rolling out new policies to boost the birth rate.

But the marriage crisis will greatly undermine these efforts. Marriages already plummeted from 13.47 million couples in 2013 to 6.11 million in 2024 –albeit with some deviation in 2020-24,owing to the zero-COVID policy. Likewise, the overall marriage rate fell from 9.9 per 1,000 people to 4.3 over the same period, compared to 5.4 in Taiwan and 6.1 in the United States (2023).

Why is this happening? Unfortunately for the Chinese leadership, there is no single cause. Salient factors include the steady decline in China's childbearing-age population; changes in lifestyle; the lingering effects of the (now-discarded) one-child policy on attitudes toward marriage and childbearing; the persistent oversupply of men; and high youth unemployment.

According to China's2020 census, 61% of babies are born to women aged 20-30. But the number of women in this cohort dropped from 111 million in 2012 to 73 million in 2024, and is expected to decline further, to 37 million by 2050. Even if the fertility rate were to rise somewhat, births would continue to fall rapidly.

Decades of sex-selective abortion in China have led to a shortage of brides and a soaring "bride price"(the groom's family must, at a minimum, purchase a new apartment). While the typical biological sex ratio at birth is between 102 and 106 males per 100 females, China's 2000 census showed a sex ratio (in 0-4-year-olds) of 120 nationally, 133

in Jiangxi Province, and 197 in Wuxue City, Hubei Province. Yet despite this profound asymmetry, there are still many "leftover women," because many parents with a daughter (almost always an only child) have prioritized her education and economic independence over marriage, and placed excessive expectations on aspiring sonsin-law. The proportion of unmarried women aged 25-29 in China soared from 9% in 2000 to 33% in 2020 and 43% in 2023 – and this trend continues to accelerate.

When China implemented its onechild policy in 1980, it not only raised the barriers to marriage but also made divorce easier, further exacerbating the crisis. The divorce rate soared from 0.3 per 1,000 people in 1980 to 3.4 in 2019. Hence, in 2021, China implemented a new civil code, following the example of the United Kingdom and France, to require a 30-day cooling-off period for divorce. But while this reduced the divorce rate to two per 1,000 people, it had rebounded to 2.6 by 2023 – much higher than Japan's rate (1.5).

The reproductive window for Chinese men and women is very short. A woman typically has 12% of her eggs left by age 30, and only 3% by 40. The risk of miscarriage increases from 10% for women under 30 to 20% at 35, 33-40% at 40, and 57-80% at 45. The chance of conceiving a child with Down syndrome increases with the mother's age, rising from one in 2,000 at age 20 to one in 350 at age 35, and up to one in 30 at age 45. As the age of marriage is postponed, interest in raising children also declines.

That is why about two-thirds of babies worldwide are born to women

A TALE OF TWO CMS

f ever there was an award for political gymnastics, Nitish Kumar would undoubtedly be in line for gold, with Chandrababu Naidu competing for a podium finish. From being staunch adversaries of Narendra Modi to becoming faithful allies, the transformation of these two chief ministers is almost complete. The manner in which the Janata Dal (United) and the Telugu Desam lined up behind the Wakf Amendment Bill in Parliament is further evidence of how quickly the dice has turned in the last ten months. From being in a position to call the shots in June 2024 after a hung parliament verdict, both Nitish and Naidu have now quietly accepted the BJP's dominant position.

Nitish's switch is unarguably the most graphic example of the de-ideologisation of politics in the quest for personal survival. It was, after all, the Bihar chief minister who had raised the flag of revolt against Narendra Modi when the latter was first anointed as the BJP's prime ministerial face in 2013. Withdrawing from the NDA, the aim was to position himself as a secular bulwark against a 'communal' force, an apparently ideological and individual conflict that had simmered since the 2002 Gujarat riots. When Modi refused to wear a skullcap during a 'Sadbhavana Yatra' in 2013, Nitish was quick to strike back by claiming that 'to run the country, you have to take everyone along ... at times you will have to wear a topi (cap), at times a tilak (vermillion mark on forehead).' It was the Bihar chief minister's way of defining his version of 'soft' political secularism and

contrasting it with the Modi brand of muscular Hindutva. Twelve years later, it is apparent that the battle of contrasts has only one winner. The Nitish Kumar who was propped up as challenger number one and the architect of an anti-BJP 'India' alliance just two years ago is today a vassal in the Modi durbar. His declining personal health—a grim reality that can no longer be hidden from public

gaze—has only rendered him even more helpless to offer a semblance of a counter to the Modi juggernaut. His supporters may claim that their leader remains committed to Muslim welfare, but this appears increasingly like lip-service being paid to a constituency that has slowly been marginalised from the JD (U)'s political playbook. For the BJP, Nitish Kumar is a useful mascot who is needed to shore up their wider base ahead of the November Bihar elections. Post the elections, new alignments and fresh leadership possibilities are likely to emerge.

Chandrababu Naidu is a slightly more tricky case study. He presides over a state where the BJP is not a major stakeholder, and he possesses the administrative acumen and political experience to remain in power in Andhra Pradesh without being dependent on the BJP's munificence. And yet, this is the same leader who had raged against Modi in the 2019 election campaign, even calling the prime minister a 'terrorist'. Naidu's politics has always revolved around having a transactional relationship with the Centre: he was, after all, the prop who held up both the United Front government and the Vajpayee-led NDA in a previous coalition era. Now, as chief minister, he has struck a similar 'deal' with the Centre: seeking maximum financial benefit for a cash-strapped Andhra Pradesh while also standing firmly with the Centre on contentious legislation. In a sense, both Nitish and Naidu have made political survival an art form, one where a suitable elasticity in approach ensures longevity in power. Their political choices place a troubling question mark over the secular-communal divide that has underpinned contemporary politics and only expose the underlying hypocrisies of a political system where conviction is replaced by convenience. Their selective viewpoints reaffirm a political truism: 'where you stand on an issue depends on where you sit'. In the process, secular constitutional values have been steadily hollowed out. Is Nitish Kumar a 'secularist' when he stands with the India alliance and does he turn communal only when he switches to the BJP? Ditto the case with Naidu.

What we are left with are only different shades of opportunistic 'secular' politics, all of whom can make their peace with communalists of all hues when required. The Congress perfected the art of running with the secular hare and hunting with the communal hound, one day bowing before Muslim communalists in the Shah Bano case, the next day cosying up to Hindutva flag-bearers while opening the gates of the Babri Masjid. The socialists and the wider Janata parivar, driven by fierce anti-Congressism, also played footloose with secular politics, aligning with the BJP when necessary to keep the Congress out. Regional parties like the Trinamool Congress and the DMK have also aligned with BJP-led governments in the past, if only to share power at the Centre. Only the left parties have called out communal politics without demur, but the Left has shrunk into political irrelevance and hence can scarcely challenge dominant narratives.

This leaves a Modi-led BJP in a seemingly unassailable position. A party without a single Muslim MP in the Lok Sabha can claim that it is now a champion of 'reforming' Islamic practices, ending 'appeasement' and standing by the interests of 'poor' Muslims when all it is really doing is consolidating a Hindutva majoritarian worldview that looks at all other religions with suspicion and often unalloyed hatred. Those who might have challenged the BJP's supremacy are either too enfeebled or too compromised now to mount a significant opposition. Nitish and Naidu supporters will claim that their leaders did push to ensure important amendments in the Wakf Act that addressed concerns of those who feared the bill was being bulldozed through, but the fundamental constitutional issue of freedom of religion has been severely undermined by the new law. What is left are the shattered pieces of a cracked secular mirror that maybe both Nitish and Naidu need to glance at occasionally. The disfigured reflection may remind them of just how far they have come in becoming enablers of discriminatory politics where once they prided themselves on being principled defenders of equality of all faiths.

of equality of all faiths. Post-script: I was the first to interview Nitish Kumar when he left the NDA in 2013. When I asked him why he'd made the move, his instant response was: 'I can't work with a 'tanashah' (dictator).' I wonder how the same Nitish Kumar would explain his pitiful situation today.

All eyes on Indo-US trade pact

When China implemented its one-child policy in 1980, it not only raised the barriers to marriage but also made divorce easier, further exacerbating the crisis

aged 30 and under. In 2021, the mean age of mothers at first birth was 27 in the United States, 27 in Mexico, and only 21 in India. By comparison, the mean age at first birth for Chinese women has risen from 25 in 2000 to 28 in 2020, with an accelerating increase in recent years. In Shanghai, it increased from 30 in 2019 to 32 in 2024. Worse, the overall infertility rate in China has increased from 1-2% in the 1970s to 18% in 2020. More and more people are becoming infertile after marriage or after having their first child.

Traditionally Confucian-influenced regions have the lowest fertility rates in the world, partly because their overemphasis on education translates into an under emphasis on marriage and child bearing. As a result, such regions have a higher proportion of unmarried people overall, and the historical data suggest that it will be virtually impossible to boost their fertility rate even to 1.5 if the mean age of mothers at first birth exceeds 28.

Internationally, the legal minimum age for marriage is usually between 16 and 18. But in China, it was raised to 22 for men and 20 for women in 1980.People have grown so accustomed to marrying and having children later that lowering the age to 18 would do nothing now to boost the fertility rate.

The widespread postponement of marriage and childbearing, like the soaring proportion of unmarried people, is largely attributable to the government's policies in pursuit of a talent dividend and "new quality productive forces." These policies have led to an increase in undergraduate and postgraduate enrollment, from 2.21 million and 129,000, respectively, in 2000, to 10.69 million (much more than this year's births)and 1.36 million in 2024.Meanwhile, China's tertiary education enrollment rate has surpassed Japan's, implying that its fertility rate will struggle to stabilize at Japan's current level of 1.15.

Can China's government resolve the contradiction between its economic ambitions and its demographic reality? Judging by its past efforts, no one should bet on it.

THE TEXTILE SECTOR HOLDS OUT PROMISE AS INDIA IS AT A RELATIVE ADVANTAGE IF COMPARED WITH OTHER COUNTRIES he US has announced reciprocal tariffs on India but these are substantially lower than most countries. This gives India some comparative advantage though estimates suggest around twothirds of India's exports to the United States will bear the impact of the tariffs.

One may point out here that the Trump administration does not club India with countries like China, Mexico and Canada.

Experts feel that US tariffs have created a somewhat chaotic environment and there isn't a consistent strategy visible. Countries at the receiving end of tariff firing have already responded differently. There have been counter retaliatory measures with say the European Union and Canada targeting US political constituencies and daily consumption items to put back pressure through higher domestic prices.

Regarding the farm sector, agriculture will be hit with a decline projected in dairy

However, the textile sector holds out promise as India is at a relative advantage compared with countries such as Bangladesh and Vietnam.

Exemption of pharmaceuticals and semiconductor industries from the ambit of tariffs, at least for the time being, has been of great help to Indian exporters. Indian Pharmaceutical Alliance stated that this decision underscores the critical role of cost-effective, life-saving generic medicines in public health. India exported \$8 billion of pharma products to the US in 2024, which accounted for 40 percent of

the generic drugs consumed in the US and this is expected to increase this year. Though some believe that the pharma sector is not out of the woods and that a tariff is expected to be imposed later, it will not be big enough and the manufacturers and consumers will be in a position to share the burden and India's export to the

US market will not be affected. Similar patterns exist in transport equipment. However, though not automobiles but auto components are a serious matter as India exports are around \$2.2 billion to the US. Tariffs may affect exports of auto components, but the bigger worry is whether US manufacturers may produce more

locally and outprice imports. The tariff has put an extra burden on most Indian products to the US with marine products, dairy, medical equipment, machinery and carpets being the hardest hit. Given that these are all labour-intensive sectors, the government may evolve a strategy to push them aggressively however, much depends on the proposed Indo-US Bilateral Trade Agreement and, according to Niti Aayog's experts, the final such treaty will aim to enhance the potential gains during the next five years or so. Some expect that the agreement may facilitate the possibility of increasing Indo-US trade in the coming years and may strengthen the Indian economy.

Meanwhile, the tariff war will drag down global investments and growth. The OECD has cut down its growth projections, noting that trade disruption will take a significant toll on the global economy, which is expected to slow down this year. Even the WTO has forecast that world trade will shrink as a result of these tariffs while the IMF has termed it sluggish. Obviously, the question before most analysts the world over is whether Trump wants to destroy the global economic order.

Ridge and Ayanagar recorded heatwave conditions Thursday, with the maximum tempera-



ture settling at 40.9 degrees celsius and 40.2 degrees celsius, respectively, according to the IMD. The city's primary weather station at Safdarjung

recorded a high of 39.6 degrees celsius, 4.5 notches above normal, while Palam reported 39.1 degrees Celsius, and Lodhi Road 39.6 degrees Celsius, the

IMD said.

The capital recorded the season's first heatwave Monday, when the mercury touched 40 degrees Celsius, according to the IMD. The minimum temperature Thursday was recorded at 25.9 degrees Celsius, nearly six notches above nor mal and the highest night temperature recorded in the month of April in the past three years, IMD data showed.

In 2022, the highest minimum temperature in April was recorded at 26.2 degrees Celsius In 2024 and 2023, the minimum temperature in April did not touch the 25-degree mark.

The humidity level in the capital Thursday fluctuated between 55 per cent and 30 per cent during the day, according

to the IMD. For Friday, the weather office has forecast thunderstorm with rain, with the maximum temperature likely to settle around 37 degrees Celsius, and the minimum around 24 degrees Celsius.

The Air Quality Index (AQI) in Delhi was recorded in the 'poor' category Thursday with a reading of 256 at 4 pm, as per the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB)

An AQI between 0 and 50 is considered 'good', 51 to 100 'satisfactory', 101 to 200 'moderate', 201 to 300 'poor', 301 to 400 'very poor', and 401 to 500 'severe'.

The chief minister also inspected the ongoing desilting work at supplementary drain in Wazirabad. Barapullah drain, Sunheri Pul drain and Kushak drain. "We are constantly monitoring the Yamuna cleaning process. Work to clean the 22 drains are being desilted so that the treated water from these drains when entering the river is as per prescribed stan dards," she told reporters here

At the supplementary drain at Wazirabad, Gupta inspected 'surface aerators' -- used to increase the dissolved oxyger levels in water necessary for aquatic life. The process in volves creating a disturbance in the surface of water with the help of rotators.

"All are working collabora tively for the benefit of Delhi citizens to prevent any issues related to waterlogging or pollution in the upcoming seasons, thereby enabling Delhi to function as a clean, healthy and safe city," she said. Hitting out at the previous AAP government, Gupta said that it did not pay attention to the untreated waste water flow ing into the Yamuna through the drains. There are 22 large drains, including Najafgarh and Shahdara, where desilting work is currently ongoing.

The Delhi government's Ur ban Development Department had last year directed all concerned agencies to hand over these drains to Irrigation and Flood Department.

Delhi Mayor writes to CM over user charges

A POLITICAL ROW HAS ERUPTED OVER THE IMPOSITION OF USER CHARGES FOR SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT BY THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF DELHI

New Delhi, April 10: Delhi Mayor Mahesh Kumar has written to Chief Minister Rekha Gupta and objected to the decision to impose user charges for solid waste management.

The mayor has called it an undue burden on the public.

A political row has erupted over the imposition of user charges for solid waste management by the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD)

The mayor alleged that the proposal to collect user charges along with house tax was never passed by the MCD.

"The proposal was not brought before the House and was instead implemented behind the scenes by Municipal Commissioner Ashwani Kumar. This decision goes against the interests of Delhi's residents," he said in his letter.

Kumar said the MCD must ensure that door-to-door services are provided to public before imposing user charges.

The work of the concessionaire garbage collection compa-

nies in all 12 zones is unsatisfactory, resulting in heaps of garbage everywhere, he added. The mayor said the situation is currently worse in the western zone, central zone and

southern zone.

tion between the concessionaires and those who collect garbage from homes privately, said Kumar, adding sixty to seventy per cent of the garbage is collected through private services. "Until the Delhi Municipal Corporation is fully capable of

collecting garbage from every house, it will not be appropriate to impose such user charges. he said. The mayor urged Gupta to immediately direct the MCD to withdraw the decision, stating that citizens are already grappling with inflation and deserve relief, not additional

financial pressure. Responding to the development, BJP spokesperson Praveen Shankar Kapoor said that a similar surcharge was proposed in 2021 by the then commissioner of the erstwhile East Delhi Municipal Corporation, but the BJP mayor at that time had halted its implementation.

In contrast, the current Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) Mayor, Mahesh Kumar, is merely issuing statements without taking any concrete action, he added.

The BJP spokesperson said the mayor must answer "why he has neither called a meeting of the municipal house on this issue nor directed the commissioner to stop the collection of the user surcharge".

Referring to a detailed report released by SDC Foundation on the Char Dham Yatra in 2024 that lasted for 192 days, he said it documented the number of daily visitors to each shrine over a 28-week period. It included 14 data-driven graphs highlighting 10 key issues, alongside a special feature analysing media coverage and recommendations to simplify the registration process.

While the government has said all pilgrims would be allowed entry into the shrines. many have found that online registration slots are already full for specific days. Nautiyal noted that the gov-

ernment had previously indicated a 60:40 ratio for online and offline registrations.

If pilgrims arrive in Uttarakhand under the assumption that everyone would be allowed, only to be turned away due to the slots being full, it could damage the state's reputation and create a chaotic situation. he said.

Martyred IAF officer's parents seek change in govt policy

A pilot in the IAF, 33-year-old Squadron Leader Rai died in a plane crash December 4, 2023, near the Air Force Academy in Hyderabad while training a foreign cadet

Dehradun, April 10: The parents of Squadron Leader Abhimanyu Rai, who died in a trainer jet crash. say they were ignored for entitlements and honours that went exclusively to their daughter-in-law and are demanding a change in government policy.

A pilot in the IAF, 33-year-old Squadron Leader Rai died in a plane crash December 4, 2023, near the Air Force Academy in Hyderabad while training a foreign cadet. He was flying a Pilatus PC-7 Mark-II aircraft, a trainer jet, with a foreign cadet under his training when it crashed near the Academy killing both of them.

Group Captain Amitabh Rai (retd) and his wife Chitralekha said they lost their only son Abhimanyu in December, 2023 but they have not received even a word of condolence from the government so far.

They feel the policy for such cases needs to be tweaked to accommodate the parents of the martyred bravehearts apart from their wives.

"We know of at least a dozen parents of martyrs who have been ignored when it came to according entitlements, which went exclusively to their wives," Chitralekha told PTI in an exclusive interview here Wednesday.

"One year and three months have passed since we suffered the worst tragedy of our life, losing our only son in a trainer jet crash near the Air Force Academy in Hyderabad. But we did not receive even a word of condolence to date from either the prime minister or the defence

minister," Amitabh Rai said. 'Why should a word of condolence be the exclusive privilege of only the martyr's wife," he asked. He said in many cases, the wives of slain or martyred soldiers leave or ill-treat their in-laws after getting compensation and half the pension of their husbands. At times, they even drag them to court to

claim their share in their late husband's ancestral property, he claimed.

"The wife of a slain soldier is called a 'veer nari' (brave woman) but not his mother who gave birth to him, brought him up and inculcated in him a love for the country that was strong enough to make him lay down his life for it. Is it fair?"

asks Group Captain Rai.

"We know what it takes to groom your son like that and make him a soldier ready to die for his country. But, unfortunately, no one seems to take notice of the fact," says he.

The awareness that their son is not treated as a "martyr" despite having died in the line of duty only deepens their sense of hurt.

"As his death was not a 'battle casualty', they don't treat our son as a martyr. Our question is didn't he die for the nation?" asks Chitralekha.

"My son had even served for one-and-a-half years in the prime minister's fleet," Group Captain Rai, who retired from the Indian Air Force (IAF) in 2017 after 32 years of service, said.

The plane crashed during a low-level navigation sortie, says the braveheart's father.

'My son was a dedicated soldier. The foreign cadet was admittedly weak in memory and slow in learning things. He also lacked confidence and

was not keen on continuing with his training."

"He had written all this in a letter to Abhimanyu. But as the passing out parade was near after which he was to be commissioned into the air force of his country, Abhimanyu decided to help him complete his training by taking him on the training sortie during which the jet crashed," his father said.

Asked why his son did not bring the foreign cadet's reluctance to complete his training to his superiors, Group Leader Rai said maybe he was under pressure. "He might have been hesitant to take the matter to the higher-ups because diplomatic ties between the two countries are involved. The trainer pilots are under pressure to complete the training process successfully," Rai said.

Training of cadets from friendly countries is done as part of a diplomatic exercise to strengthen ties with them and the resulting pressure comes on the soldiers, he said. It is an inherent flaw in the

system which needs to be addressed, he said.

"An inquiry is underway to ascertain what exactly led to the crash and until that happens, we are assailed by all sorts of doubts about the circumstances at the time of the crash such as whether our son was overworked or under pressure or some error was committed by the weak and ill-confident foreign cadet under training," Rai said.

The Rais visited the crash site in Hyderabad and erected a memorial in the name of their martyred son at their own expense. The couple also visited the foreign cadet's country, met his parents and extended financial assistance to them as a goodwill gesture. However, the loss of a son

has not deterred Group Captain Amitabh Rai (retd) from training bright young boys free of cost to join the armed forces and serve their motherland with valour.

The DPDP Bill, which became the Digital Personal Data Protection Act, 2023, was passed by Lok Sabha August 7, 2023, and by Rajya Sabha August 9, 2023.

The press conference was also attended by Priyanka Chaturvedi (Shiv Sena-UBT). John Brittas (CPI-M), Javed Ali Khan (SP) and Naval Kishor (RJD). The Opposition's petition said that the amendment removes the crucial proviso of Section 8(1) that states "information which cannot be denied to Parliament or a State Legislature shall not be denied to any person".

Elaborating on it, Gogoi gave an example, and said, "So tomorrow, if you want information on collapsing bridges in Bihar, and you ask for the information of the contractor. you may be denied.

"You are taking Right to Information towards 'road to ignorance', so that people do not get to know about any corruption. The DPDP Act in 2019 had no such provision, in 2021, after it went to the JPC, no such provision was there either. In 2023 they brought in these provisions which will make RTI null and void," she said.

S'pore SC quashes ex-CJI Misra's India, Pak armies 'copy-paste' arbitration award AGENCIES

New Delhi, April 10: In a major embarrassment for India's arbitration process, the Singapore Supreme Court has set aside an arbitral award issued by a tribunal headed by former Chief Justice of India Dipak Misra. The court found that Misra

copied 212 out of 451 paragraphs from previous arbitration awards involving the same parties but concerning different issues.

The case involved a dispute between a special purpose vehicle (SPV) managing India's Dedicated

Freight Corridor and a consor tium of three firms awarded the contract in August 2015. The disagreement arose after the Indian government increased labour wages, prompting the consortium to demand more funds-an issue contested by the SPV and taken to arbitration. The tribunal, also comprising former Chief Justices K K Lahoti and Gita Mittal, ruled

in favour of the consortium in November 2023. However, the Singapore SC bench, led by Chief Justice Sundaresh Menon, upheld a lower court's decision to quash the award, citing serious concerns over the integrity of the arbitration process. The court criticised the use of earlier awards as templates,

noting that extensive portions were reused without the parties' knowledge or consent.

It ruled that the award had been drafted without fresh consideration of the facts and issues unique to the present case, thereby breaching the principles of

natural justice and fair hearing. The judgment concluded that such pervasive copying undermined the fairness, transparency, and independence expected in arbitration, thereby invalidating the award. The Singapore SC sided with the SPV, rejecting the consortium's arguments and reaffirming the importance of procedural integrity in arbitration





New Delhi, April 10: Mumbai terror attack accused Tahawwur Hussain Rana, who was extradited to the country from the US Thursday, will now face the law in India. and his interrogation is likely to spill the beans on the role of Pakistani state actors behind the dastardly act that claimed 166 lives in 2008. official sources said.

The investigators also hope to find some important leads on his travels in parts of northern and southern India, days before the carnage in the country's financial capital in November 2008, they said. Rana visited Hapur and Agra in Uttar Pradesh, Delhi, Kochi, Ahmedabad, and Mumbai with his wife Samraz Rana Akhtar between November 13 and November 21, 2008, the sources said. They said there could have

been a larger conspiracy aimed at targeting other places across the country behind his visits to these places, and the exact details would be ascertained only after his interrogation. Rana (64), a Pakistan-origin Canadian national, was brought from the US on a special flight by a multi-agency team comprising officials from the Indian law enforcement agencies and senior government func-

tionaries, the sources said. Rana's extradition came



as the US Supreme Court recently denied his application challenging it. Rana, who was lodged at a metropolitan detention centre in Los Angeles, is known to be associated with Pakistani-American terrorist David Coleman Headley, one of the main conspirators of the 26/11 Mumbai attacks. Rana's interrogation would help the probe agencies expose the role of Pakistani state actors behind the 26/11 attacks, and may shed new light on the investigation, the sources said. On November 26, 2008, a group of 10 Pakistani terrorists went on a rampage, carrying out coordinated attacks on a railway station, two luxury hotels and a Jewish centre after sneaking into Mumbai through the Ara-

Among the 166 people killed were US, British and Israeli nationals. The nearly 60-hour assault sent shockwaves across the country and even brought India and Pakistan to the brink of war. The terrorists targeted multiple iconic locations in Mumbai, including the Taj Mahal and Oberoi hotels, Leopold Cafe, Chabad House and the Chhatrapati Shivaii Terminus train station, each of which Headley had scouted in advance.

In November 2012, Ajmal Amir Kasab, the lone surviving terrorist among the Pakistani attackers, was hanged to death at Yerawada Jail in Pune. Rana was wanted by the National Investigation Agency (NIA), which is probing the 26/11 attacks case.

Who is Narender Mann? The Ministry of Home Affairs appointed Advocate Narender Mann as the Special Public Prosecutor for the trial against 26/11 Mumbai terror attack accused Tahawwur Hussain Rana in Delhi. Mann, a law graduate from Delhi University in 1990, has represented the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) and appeared in several important cases, including attempt on life of former CJI A N Ray by Ananda Margis. He

was the Special Public Prosecutor for the CBI in the Delhi High Court between January, 2011 and April, 2019. As the CBI counsel. Mann handled criminal appeals, writ petitions, criminal revision petitions, quashing petitions, and criminal miscellaneous cases.

During the investigation, the roles of senior functionaries of terror outfits Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) and Harkat-ul Jihadi Islami (HuJI) -- Hafiz Muhammad Saeed alias Tayyaii. Zaki-ur-Rehman Lakhvi. Sajjid Majid alias Wasi, Illyas Kashmiri, and Abdur Rehman Hashim Syed alias Major Abdurrehman alias Pasha had emerged, the sources said.

They worked in active connivance with officials from Pakistan's spy agency Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI), namely Major Iqbal alias Major Ali and Major Sameer Ali alias Major Samir, as per the NIA.

After the completion of its investigation, the NIA filed a chargesheet before a Delhi court December 24, 2011, against all the accused under Section 120 B (criminal con-

spiracy), read with 121, 121A. 302, 468 and 471, of the IPC, and Sections 16,18 and 20 of Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act for providing logistic, financial and other assistance to Headly and the other co-conspirators towards the criminal conspiracy to organise terrorist attacks in India. The NIA also sent extradition requests to the US for the extradition of Headley and Rana, the sources said, Rana is said to have remained in contact with Major Iqbal, the sources said.

During his first visit to India, Headley spoke to Rana over phone for more than 32 times, they said. Subsequently, Headley spoke to Rana 23 times during his second visit, 40 times during the third visit, 37 times during the fifth visit, 33 times during the sixth visit. and 66 times during the eighth visit, they said, highlighting his active involvement in the Mumbai attacks conspiracy. The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) in the US arrested Rana from Chicago a year after the attacks in October 2009 for providing support for an aborted plan to behead employees of a newspaper in Copenhagen (Denmark), and also for providing material support to the Lashkar-e-Taiba, which orchestrated the Mumbai attacks, the sources said, adding that Rana, however, was

acquitted in the 26/11 case.

According to a statement issued by the Chief Minister's Office (CMO), Nalanda reported 18 deaths, followed by two in Siwan, one each in Katihar, Darbhanga, Begusarai, Bhagal pur and Jehanabad.

RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav however, claimed in a post on X that over 50 people died Thursday. "I am deeply saddened by the tragic deaths of more than 50 people in various incidents of storm, rain, lightning, tree and wall collapse in Bihar. I express my deepest condolences. May God provide strength to the families affect ed by the disaster in this hour of grief," he wrote in Hindi.

He also said that the state government should compensate farmers for their crop loss due to the sudden rain and give them proper compensation.

Earlier, Chief Minister Nitish Kumar condoled the deaths and announced an ex gratia of ₹4 lakh each for the next of kin of the deceased. On Wednesday, 13 people had died in lightning strikes in four dis tricts of Bihar.

The India Meteorological Department has issued an 'orange alert' (be prepared) for a number of districts, including Darbhanga, East Champaran, Gopalganj, West Champaran Kishanganj, Araria, Supaul Gaya, Sitamarhi, Sheohar, Nalanda, Nawada and Patna,

22 killed in rain-related incidents in UP

Lucknow, April 10: Rains accompanied by hailstorm and lightning lashed several parts of Uttar Pradesh Thursday, leaving 22 people dead in 15 districts of the state, officials said.

According to a press statement from the Relief Commissioner's office, Fatehpur and Azamgarh districts each reported three fatalities due to rain-related incidents. Two deaths each were recorded in Firozabad, Kanpur Dehat, and Sitapur districts while one person each lost their life in Ghazipur, Gonda, Amethi, Sant Kabir Nagar, Siddharthnagar, Ballia, Kannaui. Barabanki, Jaunpur, and

Unnao districts. Taking note of the situation. Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has directed officials in the affected districts to carry out relief operations with full urgency and preparedness.

The inclement weather also resulted in damage to 15 houses across the affected districts.

The state government has initiated the process of providing financial assistance of 4 Lakh each to the families of the deceased, the statement added. State capital Lucknow also received rains. Firozabad's Additional District Magistrate (ADM) Vishu Raja said two people were killed due to lightning strikes in the district. Lalita Devi, a 30-year-old pregnant woman, died after being struck by lightning in Daulatpur village in the Narkhi area, while Padav Veer Singh (32) was killed in Chinari village in the Jasrana area. The ADM said the family members of the deceased will be given financial assistance. Ghanshyam (40), a labourer, died after being struck by lightning in Siddharthnagar. The incident took place in Gaura Mangua village when Ghanshyam was going for work, the officials said. In Sitapur, two people died in separate incidents due to heavy rain and lightning strikes. Harishchandra (25) died due to a lightning strike in Moch Khurd village when he was working in his field, while 55-year-old

Kusuma Devi died when a wall collapsed on her due to heavy rains in Rasoolpur village. In Sant Kabir Nagar, a 19-year-old woman, Aarti, died after being struck by lightning in Malauli village, located within the Bakh ira police circle. The chief minister has instructed the officials to visit the affected areas, close ly monitor the relief efforts and ensure immediate assistance to those impacted by the adverse weather conditions, according to an official statement issued here

In cases of loss of lives or live stock due to lightning strikes storms, heavy rain or hailstorms immediate distribution of relief funds to the affected families must be ensured, he has said.

Mumbai: India's largest IT services firm Tata Consultancy Services Thursday reported a 1.68 per cent dip in its consolidated net profit to ₹12.224 crore for the March 2025 quarter. Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) whose earnings marked the official start of IT results season - reported a total revenue of ₹64.479 crore in Q4 FY25, up 5.3 per cent over the year-ago period. For the full year FY25, TCS' net profit rose 5.76 per cent year-onyear to ₹48,553 crore. The IT heavyweight wrapped up the fiscal FY25 with a full-year topline growth of 5.99 per cent at ₹2,55,324 crore.

The ratings agency downgrades India's 2025 GDP growth forecast to 6.1% citing US tariff impact

New Delhi, April 10: Moody's Analytics Thursday cut India's GDP growth forecast to 6.1 per cent for 2025 on looming higher US reciprocal tariff threats. It said the US is one of In-

dia's largest trading partners, so a 26 per cent tariff hovering over imports of Indian goods will heavily impede the trade balance.

"We revised India's GDP growth forecast to 6.1 per cent in 2025 from 6.4 per cent in our March baseline," said the Moody's Analytics report titled 'APAC Outlook: US Versus Them'.

It said gems and jewellery, medical devices, and textile industries will be among the worst hit.

Regardless, we expect overall growth to be relatively insulated from the shock since external demand makes up a relatively small portion of GDP. Moody's Analytics said.

Given headline inflation has been easing at a healthy pace, we expect the Reserve Bank of India to lower interest rates, most likely in the form of 25-basis point cuts that take the policy rate to 5.75 per cent by the end of the year.

"This, paired with tax incentives announced earlier this year, should help boost the domestic economy and dampen the shock of the tariffs on overall growth relative to other vulnerable economies,'

on hold for 90 days. Moody's Analytics said uncertainty is palpable, with tumbling and volatile equity markets headlining financial market turbulence.

The negative and pervasive impact of a sustained rise in uncertainty cannot be understated. Household and business sentiment is crumbling, and if the calamity continues, monetary policy easing that was supposed to characterise 2025 will lose some of its potency, it said

Also, households won't want to spend more when the environment is so uncertain, regardless of stronger purchasing power, and businesses will hold back on additional investment as they navigate chaos, Moody's Analytics said.

As tariffs increase the cost and complexity of trade, they weaken global growth prospects. "The 'Liberation Day tariffs declared last week increased the odds of a global recession. Under those tariffs, inflation across Asia would stay subdued amid weaker trade and growth dynamics," it added.

Inflation in the US, how ever, would rise as tariffs increased prices of producer and consumer goods, Moody's Analytics added.



Apple airlifts 600 tons of iPhones from India 'to beat' Trump tariffs

Direct selling sector grows 4% in FY24

New Delhi: The direct selling industry achieved a 4.04 per cent of year-on-year growth in FY24, reaching an estimated value of ₹22,150 crore, according to the latest report released by the industry body IDSA. The direct selling industry, which has the participation of over 470 small and big firms in India, added about 1.86 lakh active direct sellers, bringing the total to about 88 lakh. "Over the past five years (2019-20 to 2023-24), the industry expanded at a CAGR of 7.15 per cent, growing from ₹16,800 crore to ₹22,142 crore," it said. In FY24, Maharashtra, West Bengal, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Karnataka, Odisha, Haryana, New Delhi, Assam, and Gujarat emerged as the top 10 states.

Two other direct sources confirmed the Foxconn plant in Chennai now runs Sundays, which is typically a holiday. The plant turned out 20 million iPhones last year, including the latest iPhone 15 and 16 models. As Apple diversifies its manufacturing beyond China, it has

positioned India for a critical role. Foxconn and Tata. its two main suppliers there, have three factories in all, with two more being built.

Apple spent about eight months to plan and set up the expedited customs clearance in Chennai, and Prime Minister Narendra Modi's government asked officials to support Apple, one senior Indian official said.

Foxconn shipments from In dia to the United States surged in value to \$770 million in January and \$643 million in Feb ruary, compared to the range of \$110 million to \$331 million in the prior four months, com mercially available customs data shows.

More than 85% of the January and February air shipments of Foxconn were off loaded in Chicago, Los Angeles New York and San Francisco.

FIA deputy prez resigns

PARIS: Turmoil at the FIA, the governing body for Formula 1 and other auto racing, has deepened after its deputy president for sport resigned in protest at how it is run. Robert Reid's resignation is the latest sign of discontent with the direction taken by the FIA under President Mohammed Ben Sulayem, whose tenure has seen numerous senior officials leave or be replaced. "I took on this role to help deliver greater transparency, stronger governance, and more collaborative leadership," Reid posted on social media. "Over time, those principles have been increasingly set aside and I can no longer, in good faith, remain part of a system that no longer reflects them.

with Bayern at the San Siro next week. If Inter can maintain or add to its 2-1 first-leg advantage against Bayern, there could be another top center forward to face in the semifinals or final. Then Italy opens World Cup qualifying at Haaland's

Norway in June, although it remains to be seen whether or not Haaland will return from injury in time for that match.

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
