CM approves creation of 2.5K home guard posts

Bhubaneswar: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Tuesday approved a proposal for creation of 2,500 more posts of home guards in the state. The number of home guard posts will increase to 20,175 after creation of the additional ones, an official release said. Majhi had earlier announced an increase in the number of posts in the state police force to strengthen law and order in Odisha. The CM had stated around 12,000 posts would be created in various branches of Odisha Police.

Above-normal rain this monsoon: IMD

New Delhi: India is expected to get above-normal rainfall in the upcoming southwest monsoon season, the India Meteorological Department said Tuesday, raising hopes for a bountiful harvest for the largely agri-based economy. According to the long-range monsoon forecast, the IMD said large parts of Tamil Nadu and the northeastern region were likely to get below-normal rainfall, while the rain-deficient parts of Marathwada and adjoining Telangana are expected to witness above-normal showers. "There is a 30 per cent chance of normal rainfall, a 33 per cent chance of above-normal rainfall, and a 26 per cent chance of excess precipitation during the monsoon season," IMD Director General Mrityunjay Mohapatra said The southwest monsoon lasts from June 1 to September 30.

Watery grave for two minor cousins

Hosp to lose licence if newborn trafficked: SC

New Delhi, April 15: The Supreme Court Tuesday came down heavily on the Uttar Pradesh government over its handling of child trafficking cases and laid down strict guidelines for states to curb

A bench of Justices JB Pardiwala and R Mahadevan ordered the lower courts to complete trials in such cases within six months while directing authorities to suspend licences of hospitals if any newborn is

"High Courts across the country are directed to call for the status of pending trials in child trafficking cases. Then directions shall be issued to complete the trial in 6 months and also conduct a day-to-day

The SC move came while hearing a case where a trafficked baby was delivered to a couple in UP who wanted a son. The accused were granted anticipatory bail by the Allahabad HC, according to a report of India Today. While cancelling the bail of the accused, the SC slammed both the Allahabad HC and the UP government over

"The accused was longing for a son and then got a son for

₹4 lakh. If you desire a son.. you cannot go for a trafficked child. He knew that the baby was stolen," the bench said.

The top court said the High Court dealt with the bail applications 'callously', leading many accused to abscond.

Issuing guidelines to arrest child trafficking cases, the Supreme Court said the licences of hospitals should be cancelled if any newborn is stolen.

"If any newborn is trafficked from a hospital, the first step should be to suspend the licence of such hospitals. If any woman comes to deliver a child to the hospital and the baby is stolen, the first step is suspension of licence," the SC ordered.

In 2023, the National Human **Rights Commission entrusted** the study on Human Traffick ing to the BIRD, which flagged various shortcomings in the mechanism adopted by the states and law enforcement agencies in checking human trafficking, especially child trafficking and suggested re-

medial measures. "All the state governments are directed to study the entire report and start implementing each of the recommendations by working out appropriate modalities in that regard," the bench said in its 95-page verdict.

Kidnapped baby boy of visually impaired rescued

Bhubaneswar, April 15: The Police Tuesday rescued the kidnapped one-and-half-yearold boy of a visually impaired beggar in Bhubaneswar and arrested one person in this connection, an officer said.

The baby boy was handed over to the mother after medical examination at the Capital Hospital here. Commissioner of Police S Dev Datta Singh told reporters The baby was kidnapped Satur day night by an unidentified man when he was playing and his mother and sister were sleeping on the footpath. "Within 48 hours of reporting the incident, the child has been rescued by the police and the kidnapper identified as Kedarsan Panda (27) of Gangadhara pur of Puri district has been arrested and one woman from whom the child was rescued had been detained," Singh told reporters.

Imphal, April 15: An Amur Falcon bird which was radio-tagged in Manipur in November last year has started its return journey to Siberia after staying for 114 days in Southern African countries, a scientist said.

On October 12 last year, two Amur Falcon birds had arrived from Siberia in Manipur's Tamenglong district and were radio-tagged by scientists of the Wildlife Institute of India (WII). The male bird was named 'Chiuluan 2' while the female bird was named 'Guangram' after two roosting villages in Tamenglong district.

WII senior scientist Suresh Kumar, who is monitoring the bird's migratory route. told this agency, "Chiuluan 2 is now on its return journey to Siberia. It has crossed Zimbabwe, and Tanzania and is currently near the Kenva-Somalia border. It started its northward journey from Botswana on

April 8 morning."

Kumar said the bird which previously left Manipur November 8 last year had reached South Africa December 20 last year after an epic flight and then headed to Botswana 🍶 where it stayed for more than a month. "It spent 114 days in

Southern Africa with 46 days in the Central Kalahari Reserve in Botswana from where it startreturn ed its journey,

Kumar said. "I am expecting Chiuluan 2 to

start the oceanic crossing after 10 davs." Kumar added.



Only 15 judges/mn population, says IJR cases, it said, "Barring Karna-

New Delhi, April 15: There are only 15 judges per million population in the country, a far cry from the Law Commission's recommendation of 50 judges per million population, according to India Justice Report (IJR) 2025 released Tuesday.

In contrast, the US has 150 judges per million population, according to a January 2024 'New York Times' news report. and Europe had an average of 220 judges per million in 2022, according to an October 2024 Council of Europe report.

"For 1.4 billion people, India has 21,285 judges, or approximately 15 judges per million population. This continues to be significantly below the 1987 Law Commission's recommendation of 50 judges per million population," said IJR 2025, which ranks states on the delivery of justice in the country.

While High Courts struggled with 33 per cent vacancies of judges, district courts managed proceedings with 21 per cent vacancies - indicating a high workload for the existing judges.

"Nationally, in the district courts, the average workload is 2,200 cases per judge. In the Allahabad and Madhva Pradesh High Courts, the caseload per judge amounts to 15,000," it said.

The overall share of women judges, the report said, increased from 30 per cent in 2017 to 38.3 per cent in 2025 in district judiciary and from 11.4 per cent to 14 per cent in HCs during the period.

"There is a higher share of women judges in district courts as compared to HCs and the Supreme Court (6 per cent). Currently, there is only one woman chief justice across 25 HCs," the report said.

The report said Delhi district courts were among judicial branches with the lowest vacancies in the country (11 per cent), and in which women comprised 45 per cent judges.

"In the district judiciary, only five per cent of judges belong to STs and 14 per cent are from SCs. Of the 698 HC judges appointed since 2018, only 37 judges are from SC and ST categories," it said, adding that the overall representation of OBCs in the

judiciary was 25.6 per cent. The national per capita spend on legal aid was Rs 6.46 per annum whereas the national per capita spend on the judiciary stood at Rs 182, it added. "No state spends more than one per cent of its total annual expenditure on the judiciary," the report claimed.

Underlining the pendency of

taka, Manipur, Meghalaya, Sikkim and Tripura, one in every two cases have been pending for more than three years in all HCs.'

The report added, "At the district courts in Andaman and Nicobar, Arunachal Pradesh. Bihar, Goa, Jharkhand, Maharashtra, Meghalaya, Odisha, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal, over 40 per cent of all cases have been pending for over three years.'

One in every five cases, the report said, were pending for more than five years in Delhi, and two per cent were pending for more than 10 years.

"Each district court judge in Delhi had an average workload of 2,023 cases in 2024, an increase from 1,551 in 2017, and lower than the national average of 2.200. It could achieve a case clearance rate (CCR) of 78 per cent in 2024, one of the lowest in the country. Between 2017 and 2024, Delhi has achieved a

100 per cent CCR only once in 2023," the report said. The report was stated to highlight the need for immediate and foundational corrections while flagging the urgent filling of vacancies and increased representation.

A release said the report was initiated by Tata Trusts in 2019 and the fourth edition of the report was in collaboration with the Centre for Social Justice, Common Cause, Commonwealth Human Rights Initiative, DAKSH, TISS-Prayas, Vidhi Centre for Legal Policy, and How India Lives.

Biju statue burning evokes widespread condemnation

Bhubaneswar, April 15: Leaders across party lines Tuesday condemned the act of setting ablaze a statue of former Chief Minister Biju Patnaik at Patnagarh town in Bolangir district.

Apart from Biju Janata Dal (BJD), Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), Congress, Communist Party of India (CPI), other Left parties also condemned the incident.

Denouncing the act, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi said, "This can only be the handiwork of some lowly person, perhaps suffering from some mental illness," Majhi said, adding that he has direct ed police to take stern action against persons involved in this incident and expose if there is any conspiracy behind it.

The CM said that one person has so far been arrested. He said the state government recognises the contributions of Biju Patnaik and gives due respect to all legendary figures, who made significant contributions to nation building. The Biju Patnaik statue was set on fire early Tuesday morning at Parshuram chhak of Patnagarh town. The statue was installed by former Patnagarh MLA Saroj Kumar Meher during the BJD government.



However, some people had opposed the installation of Biju Patnaik's statue at the place as it is known as Parsuram Chhak. They had demanded the installation of Lord Parsuram's statue instead of Biju Patnaik, an official said.

Members of the Brahmin Samaj had staged a dharna around one month ago and the matter later reached the Orissa High Court, which had ordered for covering of the statue in a polythene sheet.

Visually-impaired woman's kidnapped baby rescued

Bhubaneswar, April 15: The Odisha Police Tuesday rescued the kidnapped 1.5-year-old boy of a visually-impaired beggar in Bhubaneswar and arrested one person in this regard, an officer said.

The baby boy was handed over to the mother after medical examination at the Capital Hospital here. Commissioner of Police S Dev Datta Singh told reporters.

The baby was kidnapped early Sunday by an unidentified man when he was playing and his mother and sister were sleeping on the footpath.

Singh said that one person, identified as Kedarsan Panda, 27, of Gangadharapur area in Puri district, has been arrested and one woman, from whom the child was rescued in Balasore district, has been detained.

"Raids were conducted and the child was rescued from Khantapada police station area in Balasore district." Singh said, adding that Panda kidnapped the boy and took him to

Bhubaneswar railway station, from where he took the child to Balasore by train.

According to their plan, the woman, identified as Jhelam Rani Panda, received the child at Balasore railway station.

Jhelam Rani Panda has two daughters and a nine-year-old son, who is suffering from serious illness. She claimed she was in search of a male child for adoption.

"Her claim is under verification and her role in the case is under investigation," Singh said, while replying to a question on the possible motive of organ theft.

The police said it had formed four teams to look for the child, even outside the state.

"The help of human intelligence, technical intelligence, camera surveillance and mobile forensics was taken," the top cop said.

Assistance was also taken from Railway Protection Force, West Bengal Police and Balasore and Bhadrak district police forces Expressing his satisfaction over the safe return of the baby, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Maihi praised the police.

In post on X, he said, "The news of the return of the baby boy stolen from Bhubaneswar to his visually-impaired mother has given me peace of mind. I am very happy to see the smile on the face of the mother on finding her baby boy. The baby was rescued within 3 days of the incident. The steps taken by the police administration towards providing speedy justice to a poor, helpless woman are certainly commendable.

Majhi said his government has always been sensitive towards people's issues and solves their problems.

"Every resident of Odisha, especially the poor, helpless people who have no one to help them, has the government system at their disposal at all times. Solving their problems is our top priority," the CM said.

After getting back her child, the visually-impaired woman checked the boy by touching him and confirmed that the kid was hers.

Addressing the media after holding discussions with vice-chancellors of state universities at Utkal University here, Suraj said, "A university plays a pivotal role in shaping a student into a responsible citizen. Calling it the cradle of human

The Act also proposes structural reforms, including the creation of construction and finance committees, along with mandatory audits by the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) of India.

"These steps will enhance transparency and strengthen university administration," the minister noted.

Suraj also emphasised the synergy between the Act and the National Education Policy (NEP), 2020. "Together, they will bring a revolutionary transformation in Odisha's higher education sector," he said.

Notably, The Bill was passed April 2 after extensive deliberation in the Odisha Assembly and got the Governor's assent April 12.

Residents reported poor water quality, citing the presence of cement, wood particles, and other impurities. Health department teams have been deployed to provide medical aid, distribute medicines, and raise awareness. Meanwhile, steps are being taken to clean the affected water sources. Officials have advised residents to avoid using water from open sources and to consume only boiled or purified water. Water samples have been sent for lab testing, and the situation is under close watch to prevent further spread. especially due to potential person-to-person transmission.

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Severe irregularities alleged in Suku bridge construction

Soil extracted from nearby hills being used to fill up Kolab reservoir

Nandapur, April 15: Widespread irregularities have been alleged in the construction of the Suku bridge, a ₹81.34 crore worth project over the Kolab Reservoir in Koraput district, a report said.

The bridge, once completed, will connect more than 70 villages across Nandapur, Lamtaput, and Koraput blocks with the district headquarters town. However, the on-going con-

struction of the structure has been embroiled in various controversies. It is alleged that large quan-

tities of soil are being illegally excavated from nearby hills and used for construction. without proper authorisation. Moreover, thousands of truckloads of soil are reportedly being dug from the nearby hills and dumped into the Kolab reservoir for use in the bridge foundation. As a result, the reservoir is slowly getting buried.

This apart, no royalty has allegedly been paid by the contractors for the excavated soil, and authorities from the Mining, Revenue, and Irrigation departments have taken no action despite being aware of the development.

Local ecologists and intellectuals have raised concerns over this environmental violation and the lack of accountability.

two-foot-wide rail track on the Suku railway bridge over the reservoir.

To address this issue, the district administration and the state government had approved a new bridge project under the Biju Setu Yojana in the 2022-23 financial year. The ₹81.34 crore project was sanctioned to be constructed parallel to the ex-

isting railway bridge (No.543). The Rural Development Department in Koraput floated a tender and awarded the contract to Shailabala Constructions, which has since begun work on the bridge.

As per the departmen-tal approval letter (No. 28541600692022/RD), September 28, 2022 no directives were issued to excavate soil and fill the reservoir during construction of the bridge. Local residents alleged that the contractor is proceeding arbitrarily.

According to complaints, the construction agency is illegally bringing down government-owned hills and dumping the excavated soil on both sides of the Kolab reservoir. No royalty has been paid for the extracted soil, which is considered a minor mineral, they alleged.

Local villagers further alleged that agencies including the Koraput Rural Development Department, Mining Department, Revenue Department, and authorities managing the Kolab reservoir have

remained silent despite being aware of the development. When ques-tioned, an official of the Koraput Rural Develop-

Department ment, requesting anonymity. said that excavation and reservoir filling supervision don't fall under

their jurisdiction. He maintained that the bridge construction should follow the DPR (Detailed Project Report) prepared by the department.

Pradeep Kumar Nayak, Deputy Director of the Minor Mineral Department, stated that such actions are illegal and punishable by law. "The issue (materials) in question falls under the list of minor minerals. The consultancy agency is yet issue any formal response,' he said.

Krushnachandra Khuntia, District Mining Officer, said he has been made aware of the complaints. "The department has initiated proceedings to issue a notice, and impose penalties on the contractor,' Khuntia said.

He said Odisha will not cede even an inch of its land to West Bengal, asserting a tough stance in response to what he described as 'encroachment by

"If our patience is mistaken for weakness, we will respond with resolve," Das said. Urging locals to remain vigilant for the protection of 'mother, land, and language,' he called upon border residents to act as sentinels.

Sahi village on the border near Kamarda in Bhograi block of Balasore district, where West Bengal's revenue and administrative officials allegedly encroached on Odisha territory to construct a 40-meter stretch of road using earth moving equipment, under the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana. Balbantaray had alleged the involvement of supporters of local MLA Himanshu Sekhar Sahoo in the attack.

"They had been plotting for the last couple of days to kill me. They had come with swords to attack me," he said. after promising to help her obtain land at a subsidised rate.

4 students serious in honeybee attack

Daringbadi, April 15: As many as 40 students of a Sevashram School at Badabanga panchayat of Daringbadi block in Kandhamal district were injured, including four of them seriously, after being attacked by a swarm of honeybees Monday. Dr Swagat Senapati of Daringba-

di community health centre said that four students who are critical are currently under observation, while the rest were discharged after treatment.

The incident occurred around 11:30 am, shortly after the school had closed for the day, when some students stepped outside the campus to bathe. A swarm of bees from a tree in the vicinity of the school campus became agitated due to some reason and began attacking the children while they were bathing.

Panic broke out as the students ran back inside the school premises to escape the attack. On being informed, Badabanga Sarpanch Prasanna Kumar Pradhan contacted



Headmaster Pranabandu Mahanayak, and rushed the injured students to the Daringbadi community health center in two auto-rickshaws. All the students, except the four seriously injured, were discharged after primary treatment.

Notably a week earlier, the BDO had summoned officials from various Sevashram School

to discuss ongoing issues and problems. Parents are reportedly upset that despite beehives being present on the premises for several years, school authorities have remained clueless about the development. The headmaster is stated to have already flagged the problem in the school's messaging group.

Chaos & Order

S President Donald Trump has created chaos in international trade and economic order through his skewed and short-sighted tariff war. But, out of the chaos a new order is slowly emerging in which China is positioning itself as the pivot. Chinese President Xi Jinping's ongoing tour of the South-Asian countries of Vietnam, Malaysia and Cambodia this week, days after the imposition of new tariffs by the US administration on 2 April point to this realignment of economic forces. The flip flops and contradicting messages emanating from the White House on the quantum of tariffs seem to have only strengthened the Chinese resolve to formulate its new international economic policy that is likely to be far more effective than its Belt and Road Initiative. The crude escalation initiated by the American President has only reinforced China's belief that it must minimize its dependence on the United States and introduce an entirely new dynamic that will lead to a decoupling of the world's two largest economies, which till date seemed impossible.

The world at large, including China, now recognises the risks posed by exposure to the American market. This has already spurred different countries to scout for new markets to replace American consumers.

Xi Jinping's tour of Vietnam, Malaysia and Cambodia close on the heels of Trump's tariff war shows that Beijing is seeking to strengthen its commercial ties with more reliable partners. The European Union and major emerging countries are also part of this strategy. Brazil has already surpassed the US as China's leading supplier of agricultural products and it belongs to this category. China stands to gain as the wall of tariffs erected by Washington is forcing every targeted country to look elsewhere.

A favourite word of Trump is "smart," but he does not seem to be acting smart as he is contributing to the emergence of a world aiming to bypass the US. Ironically, this significant realignment affects not simply trade. Washington's withdrawal from international organisations and its avowed hatred for the established international order, time-tested alliances and American commitments, such as support for Ukraine against Russia, fit into this worldview.

Beijing can only be too pleased with America giving up its soft power that was once an integral part of its foreign policy. From China's perspective an example of this is the abrupt closure of Radio Free Asia, which played a central role in informing the Uyghur community being brutally suppressed in China. By signaling that they are ready to relinquish, for whatever reason – weariness or fatigue –, the US is creating a space China may be too eager to fill.

The world has seen how since the beginning of Trump's second term, Beijing is trying to project itself as a moral successor. However, if China succeeds in achieving its goal, this does not seem to augur well for countries like India, given China's own track record of exploiting the resources in Africa and elsewhere. Beijing's trade policy too aims to offload excess production at any cost because its sluggish domestic demand cannot absorb it. This poses a threat to jobs in Europe and many Asian countries. Xi's disastrous human rights record remains a significant obstacle for many democracies, including European. Compromises with Beijing may appear to be necessary to offset American disorder, but China is a dubious ally and no one knows it better than India.

uro.earth, a self-ap pointed "carbon-removal certifier," is seeking to establish a new accredited means of carbon sequestration: dumping bundled biomass (wood or crop waste) into the ocean. At least two companies are already selling carbon credits based on plans to dump biomass in the Black Sea. But "ocean storage of biomass" (OSB) lacks scientific verification and highlights the risks of commercialising unproven climate interventions.

potent greenhouse gas).

The seabed disturbance, together with the erosion of the chemocline, could cause these gases, in addition to carbon dioxide, to penetrate the oxygen-rich areas of the Black Sea, which support a diverse array of marine life, including dolphins, porpoises, and many species of fish, some of which can be found nowhere else. Any expansion of the anoxic zone or intrusion of toxic gases into this habitat could severely harm its ecosystem, which is already under intensifving pressure from overfishing, pollution (including chemical, plastic, and noise pollution), habitat destruction, and rising temperatures.

But that is not all. The gases released as a result of OSB could ultimately make their way into the atmosphere, with potentially catastrophic consequences. This is not without precedent. When the stratification of Lake Nvos in Cameroon collapsed in 1986, large clouds of CO2 gas were released, killing an estimated 1,700 people. Puro.earth insists that OSB is safe. But these claims are based on modeling and shortterm laboratory experiments, which cannot possibly replicate the unique and complex conditions of the Black Sea's anoxic basin. For one thing, these experiments tend to underestimate rates of organic degradation, by failing to account for the possibility that they will increase over time - for example, as microbial

communities adapt, or due to a breakdown in the structural integrity of the biomass.

Moreover, while Puro.earth promises strict requirements for monitoring, environmental, and social safeguards, it plans to observe the effects of its activities for only 15 years after the last biomass bundle is dumped - a far cry from the 1,000 years of carbon sequestration being claimed. Without long-term observational data, it cannot credibly claim that OSB is a legitimate - let alone benign - means of carbon removal, especially because the carbon permanency and ecological consequences of such activities are difficult to predict and even harder to monitor in such remote and poorly

Land considerations further challenge the logic of OSB. Terrestrial biomass has value in itself, both in terms of the nutrients it contains and because there may be better uses for it, such as in the synthesis of biofuels. A complete life-cycle analysis of the OSB process suggests it involves significant energy consumption in the harvesting, processing, transportation, and monitoring of the biomass. Puro. earth rightly asserts that any biomass used in the process "must be free from harmful impurities and compounds," such as toxins and pesticides Yet that requirement would necessitate chemical testing of entire batches, which would

studied environments

Even if OSB were safe and efficient, with dumped biomass remaining durably sequestered in anoxic waters. its promise as a climate intervention would be dubious. The problem is one of scale. According to the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, we should be removing 6-10 gigatons of CO2 from the atmosphere each year until 2050. Even assuming that only crop waste was used, locking up just one gigaton of CO2 would require around 500 million tons of dry biomass, an amount comparable to the entire annual US corn harvest. This is not the only significant constraint on the proposed method; another is the paucity of anoxic zones on our planet to dispose of the biomass.

likely impose significant costs

Companies that stand to gain financially from such projects should not be the arbiters of carbon-crediting mechanisms, nor are they qualified to make objective judgements about environmental safety. Under the Law of the Sea Convention, the standard has been, and always should be, one of precaution. A genuinely careful and conservative approach would be to conduct smaller-scale, multiyear controlled experiments before any large-scale, commercialised deployment were even to be considered.

The fact that OSB represents a low-tech approach to neutralising CO2 emissions does not exempt it from the precautionary principle and dumping regulations under the London Convention and London Protocol. The burden of proof is on the proponents of the intervention to demonstrate that their actions would not violate these standards. This should be reflected in any permitting decisions about OSB that countries bordering the Black Sea. such as Georgia and Turkey, might have to make in the coming years

here's an old saying that the early bird catches the worm. But what about the early human? What does the early human catch?

If you don't believe me, just look at what happened to the man who recently interviewed to be an office administrator at a gutter-cleaning company in the US city of Atlanta. According to a post on LinkedIn, this candidate arrived 25 minutes early for his interview, which was a "major factor" in why the company's owner, Matthew Prewett, didn't hire him.

"Showing up early is good,' Prewett wrote. "Showing up extremely early can suggest someone isn't good with time or expects to be accommodated. It also made me feel rushed."

Being too early is consid-

uations in life. Airlines expect vou to be three hours early for an international flight. This is for security reasons, of course. Studies show that people who have spent three hours standing and waiting in an airport do not have enough energy to hijack a plane. No, the real reason airlines want you to be early is to make sure you have enough time to go through all the expensive stores at the airport.

Being too early is considered a sign of true fandom. Anybody can show up three hours early for a Taylor Swift concert, but only a true fan can show up three days early. The same is true for sporting events. If the football game begins at 4 pm, some fans are already outside the stadium at 4 am. Guwahati, April 15: Assamese language shall be used compulsorily in all official work across the state barring three districts in the Barak Valley and five districts under the Bodoland Territorial Region (BTR), according to an official notification.

However, issuance of all government notifications, office memoranda, acts, rules, regulations, scheme guidelines, transfer and posting orders shall be both in English and Assamese, it said.

The notification will come into effect from April 15 ('Bohag'-Assamese New Year).

'Beginning this 'Bohag', Assamese will be the compulsory official language for all government notifications. orders, acts etc across Assam. In the districts of Barak Valley and BTRR, Bengali and Bodo languages shall be used, respectively,' Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma said in a post on X.

have operated at over 170 per



cent capacity for more than a decade. "Delhi's prisons have consistently recorded over 170 per cent occupancy rates since 2012. In 2022, 15 per cent of its prisons recorded occupancy rates of over 250 per cent. Occupancy rates in three prisons have consistently been over 250 per cent since 2020," the report

read. It said staff shortages exacerbate the crisis. Delhi recorded a 27 per cent shortfall in overall prison staff, including a staggering 60 per cent vacancy among correctional staff and 34 per cent among officers.



In defense of her now-viral video, Principal Vatsala April 13 said it was part of an ongoing research project conducted in porta cabins.

'It is under process. I will be able to share details of the full research after a week," she had said, stressing that misinformation was being spread without full context.

"There's no harm in touching natural mud," she added.

The principal reportedly shared the video in a teachers' WhatsApp group, noting that the indigenous method was being used to cool classrooms in C Block.

"Those who have classes here will soon get these rooms in a new look. Efforts are being made to make your teaching experience pleasant," she wrote.

The administration maintains that the method is part of scientific inquiry into sustainable practices amid rising temperatures in the capital.

New Delhi, April 15: India is expected to get above-normal rainfall in the upcoming southwest monsoon season, the India Meteorological Department said Tuesday, raising hopes for a bountiful harvest for the largely agri-based economy.

According to the long-range monsoon forecast, the IMD said large parts of Tamil Nadu and the northeastern region were likely to get below-normal rainfall, while the rain-deficient parts of Marathwada and adjoining Telangana are expected to witness above-nor-

mal showers. "India is likely to see above-normal rainfall in the four-month monsoon season (June to September), with cumulative rainfall estimated at 105 per cent (with a model error of 5 per cent) of the long-period average of 87 cm,' M Ravichandran, secretary in the Earth Sciences Ministry.

told a press conference here. The southwest monsoon lasts from June 1 to September 30. He said that of all the global factors that influence monsoon rainfall over India, two will have a neutral impact, and one will have a positive impact on rainfall this year.

There is a 30 per cent chance of normal rainfall, a 33 per cent chance of above-normal rainfall, and a 26 per cent chance of excess precipitation during the monsoon season," IMD Director General Mrityunjay Mohapatra said.

According to the IMD, rainfall between 96 per cent

Parts of Jammu and Kashmir, Ladakh, Tamil Nadu, Bihar and the northeastern states are likely to experience be-

low-normal rainfall during the monsoon season. Normal to above-normal monsoon rainfall is expected in large parts of Madhya Pradesh. Rajasthan. Maharashtra, Odisha, Chhattisgarh,

Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal, which form the core monsoon zone (agriculture primar ily rain-fed) of the country.

Parts of the country are already battling extreme heat, and a significantly high number of heatwave days are expected in the April to June period. This could strain power grids and result in water

shortages. The monsoon is crucial for India's agriculture sector, which supports the livelihood of about 42.3 per cent of the population and contributes 18.2 per cent to the country's GDP. power generation across the country. A prediction of normal rainfall during the monsoon season, therefore, comes as a huge relief.

However, normal cumulative rainfall does not guarantee uniform temporal and spatial distribution of rain across the country, with climate change further increasing the variability of the rain-bearing system.

Climate scientists say the number of rainy days is declining, while heavy rain events (more rain over a short period) are increasing, leading to frequent droughts and floods.

Three large-scale climatic phenomena are considered for forecasting monsoon season rainfall.

The first is ENSO -- a climate pattern characterised by fluctuations in sea surface temperatures in the tropical Pacific Ocean, which in turn affects global weather patterns.

The second is the Indian Ocean Dipole, which occurs due to differential warming of the western and eastern sides of the equatorial Indian Ocean while the third is the snow cover over the northern Himalayas and the Eurasian landmass, which also impacts

Close to 6L people in Meghalaya don't have Aadhaar

Shillong, April 15: The Meghalaya government is working overtime to enrol close to 6 lakh people in the state who are yet to register themselves under the Aadhaar database to avail both development and welfare schemes of the government, officials said Tuesday.

The Aadhaar enrolment was slow in East Khasi Hills and West Garo Hills districts with both registering 75 per cent and 83 per cent respectively which indicates that these two districts have over 3.27 lakh people out of the system, they said. "We are working overtime to get everyone enrolled under the Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) which allots the Aadhaar number. At present close to 28 lakh people are enrolled in the state," a senior official told PTI.

He said there is some kind of apathy among the people to register themselves for the Aadhaar number.

East Khasi Hills district alone has over 2.31 lakh people who are vet to be enrolled due to various reasons while over 96,400 people in West Garo Hills are not registered, according to the figures available till February this year, the official said.

West Khasi Hills and South Garo Hills are among the districts with the least enrolment



New Delhi, April 15: The Supreme Court Tuesday took exception to the Allahabad High Court's recent remarks in a rape case as reportedly saying the complainant "herself invited trouble", and said judges

should be "very careful" "If one wants to grant bail that is okay but why make such observations that she invited trouble and all that... One has to be very careful on this side (bench) also," Justice B R Gavai said, wondering why such

remarks were made while deciding a bail plea. The high court recently granted bail in the rape case, observing the complainant "herself invited trouble" by agreeing to go to the applicant's house after getting drunk

The apex court's observations came when it was hearing a suo motu case over the Allahabad High Court's sepa-



rate order of March 17 in which the high court said grabbing breasts and pulling the drawstring of a woman's "pyjama" or lowers did not amount to the offence of attempt to rape.

'There is another order passed by another judge of the same high court," a bench of Justices Gavai and Augustine George Masih observed.

Solicitor general Tushar Mehta said how a common man perceived such observations was required to be kept in mind.

The bench adjourned the hearing in the suo motu case for four weeks. On March 26. the apex court stayed the high court's March 17 order in the attempt to rape matter which meant the same couldn't be used in any judicial proceeding for seeking reliefs by the present set of accused or others.

The top court had said some of the observations made in the order reflected total "insensitivity" and "inhuman approach".

It took suo motu cognisance of the matter after it was brought to the notice of Chief Justice of India Saniiv Khanna.

The high court's March 17 order held that the attempt to rape offence was not made out against the accused and they were liable to be summoned for the lesser offence of assault or use of criminal force to woman

with intent to disrobe her. The high court's order had come on a petition by the accused challenging the order of a special judge in Kasgani through which they were summoned for the alleged offence under Section 376 (rape) of IPC among other sections.

In the other case, the high court passed an order granting bail to an accused and said, "Having heard counsel for the parties and examined the matter in its entirety, I find that it is not in dispute that victim and applicant both are major. Victim is student of MA, hence she was competent enough to understand the morality and significance of her act as dis-

The court said even after accepting "as true" the allegations of the survivor, it could be said that she "herself invited trouble and was also responsible for the same".

Vendetta politics: Cong on ED's chargesheet in National Herald case

New Delhi, April 15: The Congress Tuesday described the ED's chargesheet against Sonia Gandhi and Rahul Gandhi in the National Herald case as vendetta politics and claimed seizing of assets in the case was a "state-sponsored crime mas-

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has filed a chargesheet against Congress leaders Sonia Gandhi, Rahul Gandhi and others on charges of money laundering in the case. "Filing chargesheets against Sonia Gandhi, Rahul Gandhi, and some others is nothing but politics of vendetta and intimidation by the Prime Minister and the Home Minister gone completely berserk," Congress general secretary in-charge communications Jairam Ra mesh said in a post on X.

"Seizing the assets of the National Herald is a state-sponsored crime masquerading as the rule of law," the Congress leader said. He asserted the Congress and its leadership would not be silenced and the truth shall prevail.

Congress leader Abhishek Singhvi called the case "fake" and said the government was exposing itself and its vendetta politics by indulging in such action.

"As stated years ago when this was initiated, the National Herald case is a one-trick wonder where this government has started a money-laundering investigation without there being any movement of money, any movement of property, any activity which caused a transfer, he said in a video statement.

A mere not-for-profit company was created to manage the National Herald's affairs where no dividends can be paid, no



commercial transactions take place. The mere creation of that company with Sonia Gandhi and other members of the Gandhi family or the late Motilal Vora has been treated as an act of money laundering, he alleged. "Now, there is nothing more except a chargesheet filed in a fake and non-existent case. Anyway, this will be contested fully in all aspects. Earlier, all statements had been recorded in this regard by the persons, including former Congress president Sonia Gandhi." the

"I think the government, by such matters, is only exposing itself and its campaign of political vendetta because there is absolutely nothing in this case in the legal sense," he added.

Congress leader said.

Another Congress leader. Manickam Tagore, said the chargesheet was a clear case of political vendetta and noted the National Herald as the pride of the Congress.

Das criticised the airline in a long post on X, saying he paid ₹50,000 each for two seats in the Air India flight from Mumbai to Delhi Monday evening but faced multiple is sues during the journey.

"Dear @airindia, Please re claim your wheelchair. I'm a lifetime loyalist. I believe vou've got the nicest cabin crew in the sky, this post pains me to write. "My wife and I book Pranaam and a wheelchain because she's got a foot frac ture that's still healing. We're flying to delhi. 50grand a seat Broken table, broken leg rests her seat is stuck reclined, won't straighten fully. Were told the flight is 'newly refurbished'," he began the post.

Das said the flight was delayed by two hours and when it landed, they were asked to get down using a stepladder. "Again wheelchair and en calm pre-booked. I ask the air hostesses at the front of the plane to assist my wife while I carry four bags. Silence and a clueless look at each other. We step off the plane to the top of the ladder. I ask an air India male ground staff member to help us, looks at me, shrugs and ignores me. "My wife with a fracture makes it down the stepladder. I tell an Air India staff member at the bottom near the buses what happened. He says 'sir kya Karein...sorry', he said. In the post, Das also said that they faced difficulty in getting a wheelchair even at the terminal.

The complainant has alleged that "goons" had been on an "attacking spree, targeting men and women of the Hindu community and their properties, and had murdered three people", includ ing the father-son duo, according to the proceedings of NHRC.



MW Eat, the company that owns Veeraswamy, has applied to the court to seek a renewal under its protected tenancy rights as the lease expiry date nears in June. "Veeraswamy is not just an institution, but a living institution and an integral part of the current gastronomic landscape of London," said Ranjit Mathrani, director of MW Eat, the group which has been operating the restaurant since the 1990s.

"Our guests have included her late majesty the Queen (Elizabeth II), the Princess Royale (Princess Anne), and other overseas royals. The Crown Estate have declined



to extend our lease past 24 June, and require us to vacate. ostensibly to enable them to take back and use parts of our restaurant on the ground and first floors for their development plans," he said.

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

EV registrations rise 17% in FY25

New Delhi: Electric vehicle registrations in the country increased 17 per cent to 19.7 lakh units last fiscal driven by various government policy interventions and new model launches, industry body SIAM said Tuesday. Total electric vehicle (EV) registrations in the country reached 1.97 million units in FY25 against 1.68 million units in FY2023-24, posting a growth of 17 per cent. Electric passenger vehicle registrations crossed 1 lakh units last fiscal, registering a growth of 18 per cent compared to the previous year, the Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers (SIAM) said in a statement. Registration of electric-two wheelers grew by 21 per cent to 11.5 lakh units last fiscal, it added. Besides, registration of all types of e-three wheelers grew by 10.5 per cent in FY25 to around 7 lakh units.

Mumbai, April 15: Benchmark equity indices Sensex and Nifty surged over 2 per cent Tuesday, tracking a rally in global markets after US President Donald Trump relaxed some of the tariffs on electronics products and hinted at duty revision for automobiles.

Rallying for the second straight session, the 30-share BSE Sensex jumped 1,577.63 points or 2.10 per cent to settle at 76,734.89. During the day, it zoomed 1,750.37 points or 2.32 per cent to 76,907.63, driven by the across-the-board rally.

The NSE Nifty surged 500 points or 2.19 per cent to 23,328.55. Intra-day, it rallied 539.8 points or 2.36 per cent to 23,368.35. The key indices have recovered almost all the losses induced by Trump's reciprocal tariffs announced on April 2.

All the BSE sectoral indices closed in the green. BSE Realty, Auto, Capital Goods and Industrials were lead gainers, jumping up to 5 per cent.

IndusInd Bank was the lead gainer among Sensex shares, surging by 6.84 per cent. Tata Motors rallied 4.50 per cent. Larsen & Toubro. Axis Bank. Adani Ports, HDFC Bank, ICICI Bank and HCL Tech were also among the gainers. ITC and Hindustan Unilever

were the only laggards. Trump has suggested that he might temporarily exempt the auto industry from tariffs that were imposed earlier.



Sensex recover all losses since tariffs announcement

New Delhi: The BSE benchmark Sensex has recovered all the losses it suffered since the US reciprocal tariffs were announced earlier this month thanks to a remarkable bounce back in the index. Rallying for the second straight session Tuesday, the BSE benchmark gauge jumped 1,577.63 points or 2.10 per cent to settle at 76,734.89. In two days, the benchmark Sensex has surged 2,887.74 points or 3.91 per cent. The reciprocal tariffs were announced April 2 and since then the Sensex has fallen on four trading days. Since April 2 till April 7, the bellwether gauge tumbled 3,479.54 points or 4.54 per cent. The benchmark index bounced back on April 8th trading session but again slipped on April 9. From April 2 till April 15, the BSE barometer climbed 117.45 points or 0.15 per cent.

"The rally is fuelled by the surprise pause in reciprocal tariffs which continued today led by the exemption on electronics goods also. Auto stocks gained on potential tariff relief and banking stocks benefited from deposit rate cuts. Domestically, the focus has shifted to the earnings season which has a weak forecast while global recovery and RBI's accommodative stance are supporting

sentiment," Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Investments Limited, said.

The BSE smallcap gauge jumped 3.21 per cent and midcap index rallied 3.02 per cent. All BSE sectoral indices ended higher. Trade deficit widens to \$21.54bn

New Delhi, April 15: India's exports turned positive after four months recording a marginal 0.7 per cent increase to USD 41.97 billion in March, while the trade deficit widened to USD 21.54 billion, the government data showed Tuesday.

Cumulatively, during the 2024-25 financial year (April-March), the country's exports moved up a tad by 0.08 per cent to USD 437.42 billion, whereas imports climbed by 6.62 per cent to USD 720.24 billion, leaving a trade deficit of USD 282.82 billion. The trade deficit in February this year was USD 14.05 billion. In March last year, the difference between exports and imports stood at USD 15.33 billion. During 2023-24, it was USD 241.14 billion. As regards imports, the growth rose to a four-month high of 11.3 per cent year-onyear to USD 63.51 billion in March. The country's overall exports of goods and services



are estimated to reach a "record" of USD 820.93 billion in 2024-25, an increase of 5.5 per cent over 2023-24 when these outbound shipments stood at USD 778.13 billion.

ta, Commerce Secretary Sunil Barthwal said despite global challenges, the merchandise exports touched the "highest" ever figures in 2024-25. The overall shipments were also "highest" ever, he told reporters here. The major drivers of growth include engineering. electronics, pharma, ready-made garments of all textiles, rice, cotton yarn/fabrics, plastics, coffee, spices, tea and tobacco.

In 2024-25, engineering ex ports touched a maximum of USD 116.67 billion against USD 109.3 billion in 2023-24. It was followed by electronics (USD 38.38 billion against USD 29.12 billion), pharma (USD 30.47 billion against USD 27.85 billion). ready-made garments of all tex tiles (USD 15.99 billion agains USD 14.53 billion), rice (USD 12.47 billion against USD 10.42 billion), cotton yarn/fabrics (USD 12.06 billion against USD 11.68 billion), plastics (USD 8.92 billion against USD 8.09 billion).

Sectors which recorded neg ative growth last fiscal include petroleum products (USD 63.34 billion against USD 84.16 billion). gems and jewellery (USD 29.81 billion against USD 32.17 billion) and chemicals (USD 28.7 billion against USD 29.38 billion). According to the data, gold imports have increased to USD 58.01 billion last fiscal against USD 45.54 billion. In volume terms, the imports dipped to 757.15 tonnes in 2024-25 against 795.32 tonnes in 2023-24.

Services exports are estimated at USD 383.51 billion last fiscal against USD 341.06 billion in 2023-24. The imports stood at USD 194.95 billion in 2024-25 against USD 178.31 billion in 2023-24. Commenting on the da-

India going for trade liberalisation with US

Gems & jewellery exports dip by 11%

Mumbai: India's overall gems and jewellery exports declined by 11.72 per cent to USD 28.5 billion (around Rs 2.41 lakh crore) in 2024-25 compared to the previous financial year on continued geopolitical tensions, according to the Gem & Jewellery Export Promotion Council (GJEPC). The overall gems and jewellery exports stood at USD 32.2 billion (Rs 2.67 lakh crore) in 2023-24, according to GJEPC data. However, in March, the exports improved slightly, witnessing a growth of 1.02 per cent at USD 2,582.97 million (Rs 22,340.89 crore). compared to USD 2,556.97 million (Rs 21,228.71 crore) in the same month of the previous year, it added. "The decline in gems and jewellery exports is mainly due to the continuous dip in demand in China as well as the US, India's key export markets, due to the ongoing geopolitical tensions. Also, the correction in rough diamond prices by 10-15 per cent impacted the value, causing the overall decline in exports," GJEPC Chairman Kirit Bhansali told PTI.

New Delhi, April 15: India has decided to follow the trade liberalisation path with the US, and both countries are negotiating a bilateral trade agreement (BTA) for which in-person talks are expected to begin next month, senior government officials said Tuesday.

India and the US are starting negotiations in virtual mode from this week. They have also finalised and signed the terms of reference (ToRs) for the pact.

India and the US have been engaged in negotiating a bilateral trade agreement (BTA) since March. Both sides have targeted to conclude the first phase of the pact by the fall (September-October) of this year, with an aim to more than double the bilateral trade to USD 500 billion by 2030 from about USD 191 billion current-

ly Negotiations of the various track groups for the pact will start virtually within this week. "We hope to get into physical mode of negotiations may be in the second half of May. So we are on schedule as far as the BTA and its negotiations

are concerned," Additional



Secretary in the Department of Commerce Rajesh Agrawal told reporters here. He is also the chief negotiator of India for this pact

Speaking on the agreement, Commerce Secretary Sunil Barthwal said that the agreement, if finalised, will open huge opportunities for both India and US businesses.

"...There are both concerns as well as opportunities for India in terms of the current tariffs (globally). India has already taken a path, where we will be going for trade liberalisation with the US. There is a clear pathway which we have decided at the leaders' level, and then subsequently meetings have been held. Negotiations are going on and we have taken a path of trade liberalisation and BTA. So if we follow that path, then I think not only India's trade with the US will grow ... that will also open up opportunities for India and for US as well," he said.

Barthwal added that both countries will gain from this BTA and that is the assumption based on which such trade agreements are finalised and negotiated.

Citing examples of India's trade pacts with Australia and the UAE, he said India's trade has improved with the countries

'So, I expect that a lot of opportunities will come, and there will be a higher trade with the US in case this BTA materialises," Barthwal said.

India, he said, is also looking at non-tariff barriers as well as tariff barriers in the agreement. If these barriers are reduced by both sides, it will lead to higher trade growth for the US and India.

He added that "we will try to

see that negotiations close as quickly as possible with the US. That is the path we have taken. So I am very hopeful that we will be able to negotiate a good BTA with the US".

In a trade pact, two countries either significantly reduce or eliminate customs duties on the maximum number of goods traded between them. They also ease norms to promote trade in services and boost investments.

While the US is looking at duty concessions in sectors like certain industrial goods, automobiles (electric vehicles particularly), wines, petrochemical products, dairy, agriculture items such as apples, tree nuts, and alfalfa hay; India may look at duty cuts for labour-intensive sectors like apparels, textiles, gems and jewellery, leather, plastics, chemicals, oil seeds, shrimp, and horticulture products.

From 2021-22 to 2023-24, the US was India's largest trading partner.

The US accounts for about 18 per cent of India's total goods exports, 6.22 per cent in imports, and 10.73 per cent in bilateral trade.

With America, India had a trade surplus (the difference between imports and exports) of USD 35.32 billion in goods in 2023-24. This was USD 27.7 billion in 2022-23, USD 32.85 billion in 2021-22, USD 22.73 billion in 2020-21, and USD 17.26 billion in 2019-20.

In 2024, India's main exports to the US included drug formulations and biologicals (USD 8.1 billion). telecom instruments (USD 6.5 billion), precious and semi-precious stones (USD 5.3 billion), petroleum products (USD 4.1 billion), gold and oth er precious metal jewellery (USD 3.2 billion), ready-made garments of cotton, including accessories (USD 2.8 billion) and products of iron and steel (USD 2.7 billion).

Imports included crude oil (USD 4.5 billion), petroleum products (USD 3.6 billion), coal coke (USD 3.4 billion), cut and polished diamonds (USD 2.6 bil lion), electric machinery (USD 1.4 billion), aircraft, spacecraft and parts (USD 1.3 billion), and gold (USD 1.3 billion).

U.S. President Donald Trump last Wednesday announced a 90day pause on most tariff hikes for major trading partners in cluding India, while raising levies on China, providing tempo rary relief for Indian exporters.

final will hurt him immensely. Bengaluru FC lost 1-2 to Mohun Bagan Super Giant in the ISL summit clash April 12 in Kolkata with the latter lifting the Cup after winning the League Winners' Shield earlier in the season. "I know how all of you are feeling. Losing stinks. And

this one will linger for a while,' the 40-year-old Chhetri wrote on his social media accounts. "I did what everyone does after losing a final. I sat with all the what-ifs and should-haves. The freekick. The header. Every half chance.

It's not that Chhetri and BFC have not won the ISL Cup. They had claimed it in the 2018-19 season with the talismanic striker as the captain. But lifting the Cup as a 40-year-old after retiring and making a comeback for

the national team would have been a fairy-tale story.

He scored 14 goals in 28 matches this ISL season to be the highest scorer among the Indians and second only over all to Moroccan and North East United striker Alaeddine Ajaraie -- 23 goals from 28 matches.

Chhetri had also scored 14 goals from 21 matches in the 2017-18 season. He has scored 75 goals from 183 matches since 2015 in the ISL. He has turned up for BFC since then till now

Foreman even addressed the crowd posthumously at the Wortham Theater Centre, a performing arts centre that hosted the memorial, with audio messages recorded previously

"Winning and losing can never assure a lasting smile. But saying to the face you see daily, I did my best, I can," Foreman said on the recording.

Many of the people who spoke at the memorial, including George Foreman IV, one of five sons of the boxing legend, highlighted the importance of faith in the elder Foreman's life and how God guided his efforts to help others.

"How well do I remember how Jesus brought me through? I prayed, I walked a night or two. I said, Lord, why don't you take and

use me? That's all that I can do. I give my life to Jesus, what about you?' That was a song my grandmother gave to my father. He was going through a hard time. So now I've given it to you," George Foreman IV said as his four brothers

stood behind him. Foreman had 12 children, including five sons who are all famously named George Edward Foreman.

"Rest well, dad. We will carry

your

love with us always," said George Foreman IV, who is also a pastor. Former boxer Michael Moor-

er, who Foreman defeated in 1994 to become the oldest

man at age 45 to win the heavyweight championship, told the crowd that the two went from being competitors to having a relationship "built on respect for over 30

years." "George was a champion in life. His faith transformed the shy country boy from Texas to a successful businessman and a voice for the less fortunate," Moorer said.

Dr Adan Rios, a longtime friend of the boxing great, recalled how Foreman bought land to create a food bank for AIDS patients and donated \$1.7 million to help treat adolescent patients with cancer.

Foreman died March 21 at age 76. Foreman's family has not disclosed his cause of death, only saying on social media that he "peacefully departed ... surrounded by loved ones.²

Born in Marshall, Texas, Foreman was raised in Houston's Fifth Ward, one of the city's historically Black neighborhoods. He began his boxing career as an Olympic gold medalist in 1968, turning pro the next year. Foreman became the

heavyweight champion of the world when he beat Joe Frazier in 1973. But he lost the title the following year when Muham mad Ali beat Foreman in the famous "Rumble in the Jungle' fight in Zaire. Foreman then gave up boxing and after a religious awakening, became an ordained minister in 1978. He began preaching in Houston later founding The Church of the Lord Jesus Christ in 1980.

The middle-aged fighter returned to the ring after a 10-year absence and in 1994 pulled off one of the most spectacular knockouts in boxing history, flooring Moorer — 19 years his junior — with a surgical right hand to claim Moorer's two heavyweight belts.

Foreman retired in 1997 with a 76-5 career record.

He then moved on to the next chapter in his life as a businessman, pitchman and occasional actor.

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
