Thunderstorm, rain hit coastal Odisha; 1 dead

Bhubaneswar, April 18: One person was killed as a thunderstorm, accompanied by heavy rains, struck coastal Odisha Friday morning, officials said.

State capital Bhubaneswar received 26.2 mm rainfall between 10 and 11.30 am, with strong winds uprooting trees in several areas, they said.

Waterlogging was reported from several low-lying areas of Bhubaneswar and Cuttack, they said.

More than 100 trees were uprooted in Cuttack's Banki area, blocking the road to Bhubaneswar, they added.

Trees were also uprooted in Pokhariput, Old Town, Chintamaniswar, Chandrasekharpur, Gajapati Nagar, Behera Dhaba and Balakati Road in Bhubaneswar. Fifteen teams of the Odisha Fire and Emergency Services were working to clear the roads, officials said.

The strong winds uprooted trees and electricity poles in ing power connectivity. Personnel of the Energy Department were working to restore services, they added.

A middle-aged farmer was killed in a lightning strike in Puri district's Satyabadi block while he was working in a field. A total of 26 mm of rain was recorded in the district.

The unseasonal rain has caused widespread crop damage across coastal districts.

The IMD has issued an 'Or ange' alert for remaining prepared for thunderstorms with lightning, and hailstorms with heavy rain in Mayurbhanj, Balasore and Bhadrak till 8.30 am Saturday.

Thunderstorm activities are likely to persist till April 20, after which a rise in temperature is anticipated, it said.

In view of the forecast, Special Relief Commissioner Deoranjan Kumar Singh put all the districts on alert, directing the Collectors to take measures to reduce the impact of the thunderstorm, lightning and

NURSE 'BEATEN TO DEATH' OVER DOWRY

Patnagarh, April 18: In a shocking incident, a 25-yearold woman working as a nurse at a government hospital was allegedly beaten to death by her husband over dowry demands at Nehenabandh village under Patnagarh police limits in Bolangir district, Friday.

The police have registered a murder case after the deceased's father lodged an FIR in connection with the death and detained her husband for

The deceased, identified as Krishna Sahu, was working at the Padmapur sub-divisional hospital in Bargarh district. Originally from Semelmunda village under Gaisilet police limits in Bargarh, Krishna had married Alok Sahu of Nehenabandh in 2022 in a socially-recognised ceremony. The couple has a two-year-old son.

According to the complaint, Krishna had earlier sent a video to her father, showing her husband assaulting her allegedly at the behest of her mother-in-law over additional dowry demands. Krishna was brought to the

Patnagarh sub-divisional hospital after reportedly falling ill Friday morning where doctors declared her dead on arrival.

The deceased's father alleged that she was subjected to protracted torture by her husband. Following the complaint, the police have registered a murder case (117/25) and detained her husband. The body has been sent for post-mortem. "The cause of the death will be confirmed after the autopsy report is received," said investigating officer Haribandhu Gadatia.

RUSSIA-UKRAINE PEACE EFFORTS

UNESCO honour for Gita, Natyashastra

The US may withdraw from mediating Ukraine-Russia peace talks due to stalled progress. Speaking to reporters at the White House Friday, President Donald Trump said US will 'take a pass' on Ukraine peace deal 'if parties make it difficult'. Despite partial ceasefires and talks in Paris and Saudi Arabia, Russia continues to demand Ukraine abandon NATO ambitions and cede occupied territories—terms Ukraine strongly rejects. Kyiv insists on being directly involved in any deal, and urges continued European participation. Frustrated, Trump had threatened to cut military aid to Ukraine or impose harsher sanctions on Russia. He's also floated the idea of pulling the US from NATO, alarming allies. A recent Russian missile strike on Sumv killed 35 civilians, further straining peace efforts. There was no immediate comment from Paris, London, Berlin or Kyiv on the White House development. Nevertheless, if the US exits mediation, peace efforts could collapse, as no other nation holds comparable influence over both Kyiv and Moscow. While other impacts are unclear, the situation remains fluid, with international stakeholders urging continued dialogue to prevent



Paris, April 18: President Donald Trump Friday said negotiations between Ukraine and Russia are 'coming to a head' and insisted that neither side is 'playing' him in his push to end the grinding war.

Trump spoke after Secretary of State Marco Rubio warned earlier in the day that the US may 'move on' from trying to secure a Russia-Ukraine peace deal if there is no progress in the coming days, after months of efforts have failed

to bring an end to the fighting. "Now, if for some reason, one of the two parties makes it very difficult, we're just going to say you're foolish. You are fools, you horrible people," Trump said. "And we're going to just take a pass. But hopefully, we won't have to do that." Rubio's dour assessment about the state of negotiations came after landmark talks in Paris among US, Ukrainian and European officials produced outlines for steps toward peace and appeared to make some long-awaited progress.

Another meeting is expected next week in London, and Rubio suggested it could be decisive in determining whether the Trump administration continues its involvement.

"We are now reaching a point where we need to decide whether this is even possible or not,' Rubio told reporters in Paris. "Because if it's not, then I think we're just going to move on. It's not our war. We have other priorities to focus on."

He said the US administration wants to decide 'in a matter of days.' The State Department said Rubio issued the same warning in a phone call Friday with NATO Secretary-General Mark Rutte. telling him that "if a clear path to peace does not emerge soon, the United States will step back from efforts to broker peace.

Trump said 'Marco is right' that the dynamic of the negotiations must change, but stopped short of saying he's ready to walk away from peace negotiations. "Well, I don't want to say that," Trump said. "But we

want to see it end. Rubio's comments stepped up pressure on both sides to reach a peace deal, even as the US and Ukraine made progress on a minerals agreement that Trump has sought to recoup billions of dollars in military assistance that Washington has sent Kyiv since Russia's invasion in February 2022.

UNESCO honour for

New Delhi, April 18: UNESCO has added 74 new documentary heritage collections to its Memory of the World Register, including manuscripts of the Bhagavad Gita and Bharat Muni's Natyashastra from India.

Announced on World Heritage Day, the register now includes books, manuscripts, and recordings representing humanity's documentary heritage. The additions, spanning 72 countries and four international organisations, cover scientific revolutions, women's history, and multilateralism milestones

The Natyashastra, preserved at the Bhandarkar Oriental Research Institute and codified around the 2nd century BC, is a comprehensive guide to performing arts with 36,000 verses. UNESCO's citation highlights its groundbreaking assertion that 'no meaning can blossom without rasa,' shaping Indian theatre, dance, music, and aesthetics.

The Bhagavad Gita, embedded in the Mahabharata's Bhismaparva, is a 700-verse dialogue between Krishna and Arjuna. A cornerstone of Indian philosophy, it synthesises Vedic, Buddhist, Jain, and Carvaka thought, gaining global readership through translations

UNESCO's additions, increasing the register to 570 collections, were decided by its executive

board after evaluation by an independent advisory committee. Other notable entries include Egypt's Ithaf Al-Mahbub on Arab astronomy, Charles Darwin's archives (UK), Friedrich Nietzsche's works (Germany), Wilhelm Conrad Roentgen's X-ray photographs (Germany), and Carlos Chagas' disease research (Brazil). Collections on international cooperation, like the Geneva Conventions (Switzerland) and the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UN). were also included.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi celebrated the inclusion, stating on X, "The Gita and Natyashastra's recognition in UNESCO's Memory of the World Register reflects global appreciation for India's timeless wisdom and culture. Their insights continue to inspire the world.'

Union Home Minister Amit Shah also hailed the move and said under Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Bharat has made incessant efforts to enshrine its cultural wisdom at the centre of global welfare. "Congratulations to every Indian on the grand occasion of the Gita and Natyashastra being included in the UNESCO's Memory of the World Register," he wrote on 'X'.

Union Culture Minister Gajendra Singh Shekhawat called it a 'historic moment' on X, noting India now has 14 inscriptions in the UNESCO register.

Runway cracks: Flight with PK Mishra on board diverted

Bhubaneswar, April 18: A flight carrying 178 passengers, including Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Principal Secretary PK Mishra, was diverted to Bhubaneswar airport Friday after the aircraft was unable to land at Jharsuguda due to cracks on the runway, officials said.

Mishra, who was on the way to attend the convocation of IIM Sambalpur Saturday, had boarded the Delhi-Jharsuguda flight and was scheduled to reach the western Odisha town around 3.20 pm, they said.

"The flight could not make the landing at the Veer Suren dra Sai Airport in Jharsuguda as the airport authorities had issued a notice to airmen (NO TAM) for cracks on the runway," an official said.

VSS Airport Director Sandeep K Tiwari said, "It is normal during summer as the concrete slab of the runway develops cracks. It is a two-km-long runway, and the cracks were noticed half an hour before the scheduled landing of the Delhi flight. Therefore, we preferred to divert the flight to nearby BPIA in Bhubaneswar." He also said that the same flight landed at the VSS airport with all the passengers, including Mishra, on board around 7.13 pm.

74 killed in US strikes on Yemeni oil port

Dubai, April 18: US airstrikes targetting an oil port held by Yemen's Houthi rebels killed 74 people and wounded 171 others, the group said Friday marking the single-deadliest known attack under President Donald Trump's new campaign targetting the rebels.

Assessing the toll of Trump's campaign, which began March 15, has been incredibly difficult as the US military's Central Command so far has not re leased any information on the campaign, its specific targets and how many people have been killed.

Meanwhile, Yemen's Houthi rebels strictly control access to areas attacked and don't publish complete information on the strikes, many of which likely have targetted military and security sites.

New Delhi, April 18: The crew of India Coast Guard (ICG) ship Vigraha came to the rescue of two endangered Olive Ridley turtles after they were found entangled in nearly 600 kg of ghost nets at sea, officials said

The Olive Ridley turtles turn up in millions for mass nesting along the Odisha coast every year between February and March. A ghost net is a fishing net that has been lost or abandoned in the ocean.

"@IndiaCoastGuard Ship Vigraha saved two #OliveRidlev turtles an #Endangered species under the #IndianWildlifeProtection Act-1972, entangled in nearly 600 kg of ghost nets. Our Maritime guardians are committed towards safeguarding marine biodiversity. #WeProtect #OpOlivia #MarineEnvironment," the ICG wrote in a post on X.

The ICG also shared a photograph and a video clip of the rescue process.

Every year since 1991, the ICG has been providing continuous assistance under 'Operation Oliva' to the Central and state authorities and agencies to protect endangered species under the Wildlife Protection Act. 1972.





Forest land clearance review every Tuesday

Bhubaneswar, April 18: In a bid to ensure expeditious clearance of forest land for various development projects, the state government Friday decided to hold weekly review meetings every Tuesday.

This was revealed during a review meeting chaired by Forest, Environment and Climate Change department additional chief secretary Satyabrata Sahu Friday. The purpose of the meeting was to address the bottlenecks in the forest land

The review meet focused on projects spanning across sectors including railways, oil and gas, power transmission, and water resources

clearance processes.

The state government is taking decisive steps to accelerate the clearance of forest land for various development projects by enhancing inter-departmental coordination, said Sahu.

Issues related to 26 major projects, involving stakeholders like Ministry of Railways, Indian Oil Corporation, Ekalabya Model Residential Schools and Odisha Power Transmission Corporation, were discussed during Friday's meeting.

A timeline for resolving issues and ensuring faster approvals was also set during the meeting. The review meet focused on projects spanning across sectors including railways, oil and gas, power transmission, and water resources. "To ensure timely resolution

of land issues, the state government has decided to hold weekly meetings every Tuesday, where the progress of both ongoing and upcoming projects will be monitored, and hurdles related to forest land clearance will be addressed," said Sahu.

Distribution of new ration cards soon

Bhubaneswar, April 18: In a move aimed at strengthening Public Distribution System (PDS), the state government is set to issue new ration cards to eligible beneficiaries under National Food Security Act (NF-SA) and the State Food Security Scheme (SFSS). The initiative follows a recent drive to weed out ineligible beneficiaries from food security schemes across the state.

According to official sources, Food Supplies and Consumer Welfare department has directed all District Collectors to organise district, block, and urban local body (ULB) level functions for distribution of the newly prepared ration cards. These cards will be handed over to beneficiaries by MPs, MLAs and other dignitaries.

The new ration cards will feature a coloured design, printed on glossy A4-size paper, and laminated for durability. Each card will measure 6 inches in length and 4 inches in width. Officials have been instructed to ensure that the cost of printing and lamination does not exceed ₹10 per card.

As per the schedule outlined by the department, block development officers (BDOs), municipal commissioners, and executive officers are to generate the coloured PDF versions of the ration cards by April 20. The cards must be fully prepared and laminated by April 22.

The move is expected to benefit thousands of newly identified eligible households and individuals who had either applied for fresh ration cards or requested the inclusion of new family members.

Crackdowns fail to rein in Koida mineral smuggling



Tensa, April 18: For the past 21 years, illegal mining and smuggling of manganese and iron ore have reportedly continued unchecked in the Koida mining sector of Sundargarh

Despite multiple enforcement crackdowns and even probes by the Justice MB Shah Commission, no let-up has been achieved in the mineral theft since 2004.

Recently, another enforcement team arrived in the Koida mining region to conduct inspections, supposedly to clamp down on the continuing mineral theft in the area Monday with people terming it as a symbolic gesture. This move follows complaints made by locals to Deputy Speaker Bhawani Shankar Bhoi during his recent visit to Koida, where

residents alleged ongoing illegal extraction and smuggling of manganese and iron ore.

In response, the Deputy Speaker reportedly wrote to Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi, urging him to order a formal investigation. Subsequently, enforcement squads comprising Deputy Director, Mines and officials from multiple departments including Mines and Forest along with police began surprise inspections in an effort to curb the rampant mineral theft.

Despite such high-profile action, residents question why the local officials have failed to arrest those responsible for the mineral theft. Sources said that the responsibility to check mineral smuggling rests upon Koida mining and forest departments. Open theft continues with organised groups using loaders and machines

extract and smuggle minerals to outside markets.

Enforcement teams have made repeated visits to Koida area, but the illegal activity continues unabated, especially in key locations of Koida mining circle like Mutukudar. Vijayee, Gidei, Ganua, Malda, Kalamang, Panposia, Kenabheta, and Patamunda. These areas have been repeatedly flagged for illegal mining operations.

The enforcement teams have inspected unauthorised mines, seized illegally extracted iron and manganese ore, and confiscated heavy equipment. Yet, the culprits are rarely caught and continue to remain at large

When contacted, Deputy Director, Koida mining circle Ashit Behera said that no theft has occurred within lease-holding areas; instead, the activity is concentrated in forest and protected zones, which fall under the jurisdiction of the Forest department. Although officials have seized illegal ore worth over Rs 15 crore, the department lacks the authority to arrest those involved, he said.

Koida forest ranger Prasanna Kumar Pradhan claimed that while theft was prevalent earlier, it has stopped due to regular patrolling. He suggested that if mining and forest officials conduct joint patrolling, the miscreants involved in mineral theft could be apprehended



Class IX student killed after being struck by tractor

Sambalpur: A 14-year-old student died Friday after being struck by a tractor while returning home from school in Sambalpur town, authorities said. The victim, identified as Ayushman Behera, was a Class IX student at Saraswati Sishu Vidya Mandir in Dhanupali. The in cident occurred around 10.45am, shortly after school hours. According to eyewit nesses, the tractor hit Ayushman while he was walking back home, leaving him critically injured at the scene. Local residents rushed him to the Sambalpur District Headquarters Hospital (DHH), where doctors declared him dead on community in shock and raised concerns

Aadhaar KYC drive starts in Kotia amid dispute with AP

Pottangi, April 18: A new round of tensions has surfaced in the disputed Kotia panchayat area of Koraput district as the Pottangi block administration launched an Aadhaar-based Know Your Customer (KYC) update drive, just weeks after a similar initiative by neighbouring Andhra Pradesh.

The KYC drive, which began Thursday and will continue through Saturday, is targeting women in the border villages of Fatucinari, Upara Sembi and Phagun Senari— all within Kotia panchayat. Women were seen lining up outside Odisha-run primary schools and Anganwadi centres, holding Aadhaar cards for verification

Interestingly, officials have limited the drive to women beneficiaries, with no men included in the process. This selective approach has sparked local debate, especially as it closely follows a similar KYC update initiative by officials from Salur block in Andhra Pradesh in the village of Ner ed ibalsa, targeting women residents in areas with mobile network ac



That event drew attention from the Odisha state government and district administrations in Koraput and Pottangi.

The current effort by Odisha appears to be part of its Subhadra Yojana rollout, with 618 women identified for Aadhaar KYC updates, according to Pottangi Block Development Officer Ramakrushna Nayak. He said 324 updates were completed on the first day.

The overlapping drives by both state governments have intensified focus on the longstanding territorial dispute in the Kotia region, raising questions about administrative authority and the political motivations behind citizen outreach programmes in the area.

Kendrapara, April 18: Embankments along seven rivers and 27 branch canals in Kendrapara have been found to be unsafe during a survey of various river embankments in the district conducted by the Water Resources department, last week.

Moreover, the survey - which was carried out to access the present situation and identify vulnerable areas ahead of monsoon - also found that stone packing on several parts of the saltwater embankments has collapsed.

The findings in the survey have prompted locals to demanded immediate repairs before the monsoon. According to farmer leader

Bidhu Bhushan Mahapatra, rivers such as Kani, Kharasrota, and Brahmani surround 10 panchayats in Aul block, including Gobindpur, Dimiripal, Petapada, Sansidha, Eradang, Desahi, Palami, and Ketuapal. The villages of Balakati, Koladiha, and Mahu are facing severe erosion by the Kharasrota

Despite stone packing being carried out along various embankments, such as - from Chunabandha to Sanaanko, Patrapur to Gopalpur, and Tunga to Baulaiodi - their condition remains vulnerable.

The problem is not confined to Aul block alone. Canal embankments across the district are in poor condition, causing anxiety among local residents and damaging crops. Annual flooding in these rivers disrupts the lives of residents in 55 panchayats in the district's coastal areas.

The crumbling stone packing on the saltwater embankments has heightened fears of sea intrusion. Residents are demanding that all river and

canal embankment repairs be completed by May.

Local intellectual Prashant Kumar Nayak stated that Kendrapara district has two divisions of the Water Resources department, along with the Aul Embankment Office that are responsible for managing the district's rivers and canals. "Additionally, the office is accountable for safeguarding the district's 48-km-long coastline,' he said.

However, despite the existence of these departments, water management for agriculture remains a major concern. Every year, the fear of floods haunts the 55 panchayats in the district

"Embankment reinforcement works could be carried monsoon. But officials often resort to patching up weak embankments with soil and sand during the rainy season, wasting resources without solving the problem," he alleged.

Another intellectual, Radhakant Mohanty, also pointed out that river water management is a significant issue for the district. "Riverbeds near estuaries and lower reaches are silting up. Due to a lack of dredging, excess water cannot be drained during floods. Furthermore, rivers begin to dry up from January, affecting both agriculture and mangrove forests. The destruction of mangrove forests has led to severe

coastal erosion," he said. Residents of Satabhava have been relocated 15 kilometres away to Bagapatia due to the situation. Geo-synthetic tubes cannot withstand tidal waves. Mohanty advocated for the construction of barrages and check

Dhenkanal, April 18: Two workers were killed and three others injured in an industrial accident that occurred Friday afternoon at the Rungta Steel Plant premises, located under Balimi police limits in Dhenkanal district.

Police identified the deceased as Jitendra Behera and Purandar Pradhan, both residents of Kantamila village under Balimi police jurisdiction. The injured workers were admitted to a private hospital by the company for treatment.

According to initial reports, the incident took place near Kiln No. 9 during mechanical work being carried out by a contracted agency. While the exact cause of the accident remains under investigation, sources said the mishap triggered protests, with workers staging a sit-in demonstration on the plant premises. Efforts are ongoing by local

police and company officials to pacify the protesting workers and restore normalcy at the site.

3 Keonjhar students meet watery graves

Champua: In two separate incidents in Keonjhar district, three students drowned while bathing in local water bodies, officials said Friday. In the first incident, Ashik Munda, a student residing at his maternal uncle's house in Raghuasahi village under the jurisdiction of Champua police station, drowned in a pond while bathing in the morning. Released after 25 yrs, Hembram vows to serve Sanatan Dharma and society Hembram, a graduate

Keonjhar, April 18: Mahendra Hembram, 48, who spent 25 years in prison for the 1999 killing of Australian missionary Graham Staines and his two sons in Manoharpur village, was released this week and says he will now dedicate his life to social service and the protection of Sanatan Dharma.

Hembram, a graduate of Bhadrak College, was arrested in connection with the high-profile case despite claiming no involvement. He said he was near the site as a judge at a cultural program during the incident and believes he was wrongly implicated. "I did not get justice. My life and future were ruined," he said.

During his time in jail, Hembram said he followed prison rules, fought for inmate rights, and advocated for better conditions. He helped secure access to essentials like toothpaste and soap and was tasked with maintaining discipline. "There was



no system for human rights. We fought and won basic dignity for prisoners," he said.

He added that while in jail, he submitted a demand letter to the President requesting a steel plant and college in border areas of Mayurbhanj and Keonjhar districts.

Hembram expressed his frustration at not receiving compensation or justice post-release. He accused authorities of

ignoring key witnesses during the investigation and called the trial flawed. "I was framed. The system failed me," he said. He also alleged that his

homestead land was illegally acquired during his imprisonment and said he is currently living under a tree. Vowing to continue working

like a "soldier" for Sanatan Dharma, Hembram said he plans to establish a voluntary organization focused on religious and social issues, including opposition to cow slaughter and religious conversion. "I will go to the people's court and serve society for the rest of my life," he said.

Bengal's Power Play

rest Bengal's decision to form its own selection committee to appoint the Director General of Police (DGP) is more than just another bureaucratic tweak—it's a subtle political power play. By sidestepping the Centre's approval (and the UPSC shortlist), Bengal joins Punjab and Uttar Pradesh in asserting that states can pick their police chiefs without Delhi's permission. That's three states across three political spectrums — AAP, BJP, and TMC — all singing a surprisingly similar federalist tune. This didn't happen overnight. Bengal has had an acting DGP for months, and with little movement from Delhi, the Mamata Banerjee government has decided to take matters into its own hands. The new process will involve a state-constituted panel, likely with the Chief Secretary and Home Secretary at the helm.

However, the move potentially clashes with the 2006 Supreme Court judgment in Prakash Singh vs. Union of India, which sought to insulate police appointments from political meddling by involving the UPSC. The states now argue that the meddling is happening from Delhi, not within.

Is this the beginning of true cooperative federalism or a slow drift into Centre-state turf wars? Either way, it's a fascinating test case in state autonomy — and could reshape how India balances power between Raisina Hill and the state capitals.

This isn't just about a DGP. It's about who gets to do the appointing and who gets to push back.

Babu drama: same script, new government

An old turf war is bubbling over in Delhi's babu circles, and this time, it's personal.

The quiet frustration of Delhi Administrative Subordinate Services (DASS) officers has now reached full volume. They've taken their long-standing grievance straight to the top — the Union Home Secretary — hoping someone will finally read the fine print on 217 long-awaited posts that should've been theirs after a Delhi High Court greenlight last year.

Enter Delhi, Andaman and Nicobar Islands Civil Services (DANICS). They've challenged the order in the Central Administrative Tribu-

nal, claiming those posts are meant for them. And just like that, the administrative food chain's pecking order is back in the spotlight.



Sources have noted that DASS officers, who've been running the daily adminis-

tration of Delhi since 1967, are tired. Over five decades of stagnation will do that to you. No restructuring, no promotions, no real roadmap. Around 100 officers are reportedly walking away each year — not out of joy, but sheer professional despair.

It's not just about posts — it's about dignity, progression, and a system that seems fine watching its backbone buckle.

The blame game? DASS blames a few DANICS officers for "deliberate obstruction" — from stalling service rules to blocking post no-

With a new government in Delhi and the matter now parked at North Block's doorstep, this intra-cadre cold war is finally getting national attention. It should be easier to handle for a supposedly 'double engine" sarkar.

Cadre chaos

More than a decade after Andhra Pradesh and Telangana went their separate ways, the Centre still can't seem to split the IAS and IPS cadres without turning it into a tragicomedy. Officers like Siva Sankar Lotheti have become case studies in administrative limbo — tossed between states by duelling CAT orders and an indecisive DoPT.

The Central Administrative Tribunal recently reversed the Centre's October 2024 decision to shift Lotheti to Telangana, ordering his reallocation to Andhra. But weeks later, no action. He's not the only one stuck. Several officers are playing musical chairs — posted in one state, officially belonging to another, and litigating in the meantime.

This isn't just a personnel issue — it's a governance gap. When bureaucrats don't know where they belong, how do they focus on public service delivery? The courts have tried to untangle the mess, but they're working with flawed raw material: a post-bifurcation allocation policy that was ad hoc then and is unworkable now.

The Centre's dithering doesn't help. Officers can't plan careers — or lives — when they're subject to the whims of vague orders and multiple revisions. Telangana and Andhra Pradesh have moved on politically, but the bureaucracy is still stuck in 2014.

A lasting solution demands more than CAT orders and DoPT tweaks. It calls for a political reset — one that recognizes officers as people, not pawns. Until then, the post-bifurcation hangover will continue.

the Supreme Court, which categorically states that the constitutional head of a state should be guided by the values of the Constitution and "not by political expediency," is significant and much needed. The landmark ruling that the governor must respect the will of the people, as reflected by decisions taken by elected representatives in the Assembly, and must refrain from creating roadblocks, is expected to end the stalemate over the powers of governors in various states.

Justice Pardiwala, who penned the judgment, observed that, as per Article 200 of the Constitution, the governor has only three options when a bill is placed before him: grant assent, withhold it and send it back for reconsideration, or reserve it for the President. It was clarified that a bill could be reserved for the President only at the

The impartiality of the governor's role has come under attack, as they have been found to disturb elected governments. Political analysts have alleged that governors have not acted with the necessary objectivity in the exercise of their powers or in their role as a vital link between the Centre and the states.

Notably, states are also not playing a judicious role, as they tend to ignore the governor in various ways. This is especially evident in West Bengal, where the governor was not allowed to choose his nominee as the Vice Chancellor of the universities of which he is the head. However, the well-established dictum of the governor playing the role of a philosopher and guide to the Council of Ministers is no longer valid today. It has been alleged that, in recent years, the appointment of governors has been done with the clear intent of keeping Opposition-led

states at a disadvantage.

The conflict between the governors and the state governments is nothing new but has intensified in recent years. The reasons behind this are twofold: centralization of authority in the hands of the chief minister and increasing politicization and corruption in the administration. All this has raised questions about whether the governor has any role in the state and whether the position should be abolished.

The Sarkaria Commission had recommended that a politician from the ruling party at the Centre should ideally not be appointed as governor of a state governed by an Opposition party or combination of parties. However, in 2021, the BJP appointed the Tamil Nadu party chief as the Telangana Governor, resulting in frequent conflicts with the BRS government. The delay in signing bills has also been evident in the cases of the governors of Tamil Nadu and Puniab, leading to much confusion in the respective states.

There has not been any clear guideline on the appointment of governors; the Centre's choice remains the only criterion. In the past, persons of eminence and retired bureaucrats, who were somewhat neutral, were appointed to the post. The crisis in state administration has highlighted the need to look at a different way of appointing governors. The theory that states may appoint names may not be conducive to overall governance, as the need for creating counterbalances in the power structure may be lost in the process.

While some believe that forming a panel which includes the leader of the Opposition in selecting a governor would help, this will not be effective as the Centre's nominees will be in the majority and will have their way in choosing their nominee. The Leader of the Opposition can only add an additional layer of scrutiny. Thus, the procedure of appointing governors remains a significant problem. However, it must be stated that doing away with the position of governors is not advisable at this juncture, as this role is necessary to keep a check on the governance system and report the same to the Centre periodically.

It is also a fact that governors have not been able to improve the governance of states. However, higher education has, to a certain extent, maintained some form of neutrality due to the proactive role of the governor, who is the chancellor of all universities of the state. One of the major reasons

in this realm, as states always prefer to control universities and have their chosen individuals in pivotal positions. Obviously, this will not improve the quality of education in the country, and the governor should be given a free hand to appoint eminent academic scholars to head universities.

Though one cannot go against the principles laid out in the Constitution, it must be stated that the governor should be bestowed with more powers. For example, in states like West Bengal, which has a notorious reputation for pre- and post-poll violence, the governor should be given some powers. There is a need to form an expert committee at the national level to evolve guidelines on what type of intervention the governor can undertake when there is widespread violence and an increase in crimes across the state.

As for governance, which in most states is deplorable, the question arises: if an elected government fails to run the state properly, being enmeshed with corruption and nepotism, what role should the governor play? Can the governor make recommendations that the states have to follow? While most states are severely stressed due to financial constraints, for which they frequently blame the Centre, the governance of these states is poor due to a lack of transparency and a judicious outlook.

in ensuring good governance and guiding the state, what is the use of having these titular heads? There is a need to re-examine the role of governors by an expert committee and, if necessary, give them adequate powers to play an effective role in ensuring good governance. This is not to belittle elected governments but to give governors their due share in the administrative machinery for effective functioning, provided they are neutral and not tilting towards the Centre.

Development finance needs an entrepreneurial mindset



and Hans Peter Lankes THE POTENTIAL **FOR ACHIEVING** DEVELOPMENT **GOALS THROUGH DFI-SPONSORED VENTURES DOES NOT RECEIVE ENOUGH ATTENTION**

he fourth United Nations International Conference on Financing for Development, to be held in Seville, Spain, from June 30 to July 3 will consider a hotly debated topic: how development-finance institutions (DFIs) can mobilize more socially beneficial private investment in the countries where they operate.

Many have pointed to the shortage of "bankable projects" as the main barrier to mobilizing private-sector capital. They are not wrong: under the traditional demand-led business model, DFIs can invest only in companies that want to raise capital and meet certain financial and impact criteria.

But a new report by ODI Global shows that some DFIs are taking a more proactive approach when a development need is not being met by a suitable business that seeks capital. They are starting commercial ventures of their own.

While some observers lament that blended finance has not scaled as rapidly as hoped, others are concerned that it has sacrificed development impact to mobilize private capital. But impact and scale are not in opposition.

The huge investments needed to decarbonize middle-income economies are certainly effective. And the 12 ventures featured in ODI Global's report have already achieved significant scale, deploying more than \$4 billion of capital from DFIs and raising \$3 billion from private investors.

That said, sponsoring new commercial enterprises is more about impact than mobilizing as much private capital as possible with the fewest public dollars, partly because it is riskier than the standard DFI model. The absence of businesses in a market segment implies that the returns on offer are relatively unappealing. But these investments may only require a longer timeframe. In such cases, DFIs and other development institutions often have the patience to wait for a business to prove itself. The ventures that ODI Global studied are on the path to profitability, but it is admittedly a long, narrow road for some. DFIs should therefore take this route only when they identify an urgent unmet development need and have exhausted other possibilities.

The potential for achieving

DFI-sponsored ventures does not receive enough attention especially from government shareholders, whose support is integral to developing the new mandates and tools that such efforts would require. Tellingly, the organizations responsible for the ventures in ODI Global's report—BII and Norfund (the Norwegian DFI)-are exceptionally flexible and can support long time horizons for risk-taking. BII also has the ability to take a controlling stake in companies, whereas most DFIs can take only a minority stake. To be sure, the leaders of

development goals through

DFIs are often uncomfortable with this idea, arguing that they know how to choose management teams to support, not how to run companies. But they must not undersell themselves. DFIs employ investment professionals who can identify a market opportunity and evaluate a business plan. After deciding to create a new venture, they can hire talent with complementary skillsas BII and Norfund have done. Despite internal concerns

about staffing, it is the organizational constraints pre-

venting DFIs from becoming entrepreneurial that are the more pressing problem. Shareholders must change the rules under which DFIs and development banks operate to allow them to establish companies. They would surely have the support of foundations and other impact investors who want to use catalytic, risk-tolerant financing to promote social good

One of the best ways for DFIs to advance countries' development aspirations is to create investment opportunities in critical sectors that have been, and will likely continue to be, unattractive to private investors. Moving beyond the traditional demand-led model would significantly increase their potential for impact, especially following many governments' massive cuts to foreign aid. Those governments, in particular, should do all they can to support this change. Leslie Maasdorp is CEO

monsoon, Chief Minister Rekha Gupta said Friday. Accompanied by Public Works Department (PWD) Minister Parvesh Verma, the chief minister inspected the waterlogging-prone Minto Bridge underpass to take stock of the preparations for monsoon. "Automatic pumps have been deployed here that will flush out water during heavy rain and a 2.5-kilometre-long pipeline has been laid to carry the accumulated water out. Operators will also be on round-the-clock duty" Gupta said. Vulnerable spots have been identified and corrective measures are being taken. The Delhi government will take every step in a time-bound manner to ensure there is no waterlogging this year, she told reporters. "Last year, 194 waterlogging locations were identified across the city by traffic police. Most of these are on PWD roads. At these points, we are taking several measures such as desilting of drains, installation of more pumps, and deploying pump operators where required," Verma said. Gupta also inspected monsoon preparedness at other major waterlogging points, including Ring Road near the WHO building -among the top 10 waterlogging hotspots for the past several years.

Delhi readies plan to prevent

"Data is being collected and based on it, vehicle owners will be sent automated messages in forming them not to enter Delhi if their vehicle is deemed illegal," he said.

Sirsa also said high-rise buildings will soon be required to instal air water guns. AQI meters will be mandatory at all construction sites, he said.

"Everything will be automated and AI-driven. We are building a monitoring station at the Secretariat so that pollution data can be accessed and tracked live," he said.

The government also plans

to replace all diesel-operated mechanical road sweepers with CNG ones to ensure cleaner road cleaning.

"We are moving towards 100 per cent pollution-free sweeping machines," he said.

Cloud seeding to induce rain is also being considered as part of the action plan to combat pollution, Sirsa said, adding that the government is preparing for the upcoming challenges.

The minister said Chief Minister Rekha Gupta is monitoring the pollution control efforts daily, ensuring coordinated action across departments.

At many places including Kalindi Kunj and ITO, water hyacinths have appeared in the Yamuna water.

Experts stated that the cause of the white foam over the river stretch is a combination of several factors and more concrete efforts towards stopping waste from entering the river and cleaning it have to be taken.

"The frothing problem in the Yamuna appears to have become a perennial issue, largely due to the deficit monsoon in the river's upper basin last year and the lack of rainfall during the winter and pre-monsoon seasons this year," said an environmental activist Bhim Singh Rawat.

With an eye on transforming visitor experience and boosting tourist footfall, these efforts aim to reimagine Delhi as a more inviting and tourist-friendly destination, Kapil Mishra, the minister in charge of art, culture, language and tourism, said.

York/Chandigarh, April 18: Gangster-turned-terrorist Harpreet Singh alias Happy Passia, wanted in connection with multiple terror attacks across Punjab and who is alleged to have collaborated with Pakistan's ISI and Khalistani group BKI, has been arrested in the US, officials said Friday

Passia alias Jora, who had illegally entered the US, was arrested by the FBI and US Immigration and Customs Enforcement's Enforcement and Removal Operations in Sacramento, the US federal law enforcement agency said.

Punjab Police chief Gaurav Yaday said the arrest is a "maior milestone in the success of war against terror", adding the matter has been taken up with the central government and efforts are on to extradite Passia.

He said between 2023-2025, Passia played a "central role in orchestrating targeted killings, grenade attacks on police establishments, and extortion across Punjab and other states"

"Today, Harpreet Singh, an alleged terrorist responsible for terror attacks in Punjab, India, was arrested by the #FBI & #ERO in Sacramento. Linked to two international terrorist groups, he entered the US illegally and used burner phones to evade capture," FBI Sacramento said in a statement on X.

Agents from the FBI's Legal Attache office in New Delhi informed Sacramento that Passi was wanted in connection with multiple terror attacks across Punjab, FBI Sacramento said.

"He had been evading capture by using untraceable burner phones and encrypted applications. This case reinforces the importance of international cooperation in apprehending those who threaten global security," it said. Official sources in Punjab said Passia is wanted for orchestrating 16

terror attacks, including 14 grenade strikes in the state and is also suspected to have collaborated with Khalistani terrorist group Babbar Khalsa

A total of 33 FIRs have been registered at different police stations and 10 look out circulars have been issued against Passia, according to a dossier prepared by Punjab Police. Hailing from village Pashia in Amritsar district, Passia had left for Dubai in April 2018 and returned to India in February 2019. He went to London in October in 2020 and thereafter moved to the US.

Passia was initially aligned with Jaggu Bhagwanpuria gang members including the US- based associates Darmanjot Singh (Darman Kahlon) and Amritpal Singh (Amrit Bal). This affiliation with the Bhagwanpuria gang marks the inception of Passia's involvement in organised crime, laying the foundation for his subsequent collaboration with Rinda.

Rinda, lately, roped in Passia for execution of terror attacks in the state. Between September and October 2023, Passia, in collusion with Rinda, orchestrated a series of extortion and terror activities in Punjab, India, according to the dossier.

They targeted liquor contractors and businessmen by making extortion calls and executing arson and shooting incidents at liquor vends in Batala and Amritsar to instill fear and force compliance

DGCA orders probe into death of AI Express pilot

Your daily rice bowl could be a cancer risk: Study CLIMATE **CHANGE CRISIS**

New Delhi, April 18: Climate change could be resulting in higher levels of arsenic in rice. potentially increasing lifetime cancer and health risks for people in Asian countries by 2050, according to a new study published in The Lancet Planetary Health journal.

Researchers from Columbia University, US, explained that an increase in temperatures above 2 degrees Celsius and rising levels of carbon dioxide could be causing changes in soil chemistry, favouring arsenic, which gets more easily absorbed into a rice grain. Contaminated soil and irrigated water while growing rice are known to increase inorgan-

ic arsenic in rice. An increased exposure to arsenic is known to heighten the risk of cancers of the lung, bladder and skin, among others. Rice can also absorb additional arsenic from water used

for cooking. "Our results suggest that this increase in arsenic levels could significantly elevate the incidence of heart disease, diabetes, and other non-cancer health effects," author Lewis Ziska, associate professor of environ-



Malda/Kolkata, April 18: Teams from the NHRC and NCW Friday visited Malda relief camps to meet Murshidabad riot victims, even as West Bengal Governor CV Ananda Bose defied Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's appeal to defer his visit and interacted with the displaced, prompting the TMC to allege political provocation.

During the Governor's visit, inmates of the Parlalpur High School relief camp in Baishnabnagar, Malda - where few hundreds have taken shelter since the April 11-12 clashes - staged protests alleging "police-imposed censorship, denial of access to visitors and inhumane living conditions". "This camp feels worse than a prison. Police are not allowing us to meet anyone and narrate our ordeal.' a camp resident told reporters.

Bose, who left for Malda this morning despite a request from the CM to postpone his trip "in the interest of maintaining calm," said he wanted to independently verify ground reports. "I am going to the field," Bose told reporters before boarding a train from Kolkata.

"I will meet the victims and verify the reports we have received. I will visit hospitals, residences of victims and the relief camps. Central forces and state police are working together to restore normalcy. After meeting the victims, I will submit my recommendations." At the camp, the Governor was seen interacting with children and patiently listening to the grievances of displaced families.

"The women said miscreants came and attacked their hous-



es, looted their property and were forcible evicted." he said after the meeting. Asked about the complaints about inhume living conditions, he said he will seek a detailed report and talk to the administration

Rai Bhawan officials accompanying him took note of the complaints. Tensions escalated briefly when angry camp residents broke barricades and surrounded district officials. accusing police of not letting them speak to the media or meet visiting relatives.

Several women alleged harassment by police personnel and said they were being threatened at night to not talk to outsiders. In its suo motu cognisance of the violence, the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) dispatched a fact-finding team to the area and has sought a detailed report from the state government within three weeks.

India's concerns shelve Pak-SL naval exercise

New Delhi, April 18: A plan to hold a military exercise between the navies of Pakistan and Sri Lanka in the strategic waters of Trincomalee was shelved weeks back after New Delhi conveyed its concerns to Colombo over the proposed drills, multiple sources have said.

Trincomalee is situated on Sri Lanka's northeastern coast and is considered a significant hub in the Indian Ocean region, especially for India's maritime security interests.

The plan did not go through after India apprised its apprehensions over the planned exercise to the Sri Lankan side, they told PTI.

The navies of Pakistan and Sri Lanka are known to have cordial relations and warships from both countries visit each other's ports regularly, besides carrying out wargames. There was no official word on the plan either from Sri Lanka or from Pakistan.


The Pakistani Navy operates in close cooperation with China's PLA Navy and

New Delhi has reasons to have concerns over any visit by Pakistani warships to Trincomalee, said one of the experts.

The docking of Chinese missile and satellite tracking ship "Yuan Wang" at the Hambantota port in August 2022 had triggered a diplomatic row between India and Sri Lanka. Another Chinese warship docked at the Colombo port in August 2023 had also triggered some concerns in New Delhi.

In the last few years, India has been focusing on extending assistance to Sri Lanka in developing Trincomalee's energy infrastructure. India is especially looking at revitalising oil tank farms in Trincomalee that has one of the finest natural harbours in the world.

During Modi's visit to Colombo this month, India, Sri Lanka and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) firmed up an ambitious agreement to develop Trincomalee as an "energy hub", with a broader aim to help the island nation achieve energy security and fuel its economic growth.

Finally, there should be a way for students to appeal SEVIS terminations that are inaccurate without facing a gap in their employment or requiring the university to be involved, given the sheer numbers of those impacted," it said.

Meanwhile, students attempting to go against US laws will face the consequences, including deportation, the country's state department has warned.

In a virtual interview with PTI, US Department of State spokesperson Margaret MacLeod said the Trump ad ministration was rigorously enforcing immigration laws, including the Immigration and Nationality Act and the Alien

Registration Act. During his weekly press briefing Thursday, Ministry of External Affairs spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said, "We are aware that several Indian students have received communication from the US government regarding their F-1 visa status which happens to be the student visa. We are looking into the matter. Our embassy and consulates, they are in touch with the students to provide support."

Jaiswal was responding to a question on several Indian students receiving communications from US authorities under the Trump administration on possible revocation of their visas.

Singapore defence minister resigns

Students, journalists stand trial in Turkey

Istanbul: Dozens of people including journalists appeared before a court in Istanbul Friday, accused of attending banned demonstrations and disobeying police orders to disperse during antigovernment protests that were triggered by the jailing of the city's opposition mayor, Ekrem Imamoglu. Imamoglu, seen as the main challenger to President Recep Tayyip Erdogan's 22-year rule, was arrested March 19 and jailed days later on corruption charges. His imprisonment has been widely viewed as politically motivated and sparked nationwide protests.

Heatwave warning issued for Karachi

Karachi: The Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD) Friday issued a heatwave warning for Karachi. as temperatures continue to soar across southern Sindh province. The PMD said a severe heatwave has gripped much of Sindh, and Karachi is also expected to experience a significant rise in temperatures in the coming week.

Deadliest US strike in Yemen kills 74



Aden/Washington, April 18: US strikes on Yemen's Ras Isa fuel terminal on the Red Sea coast have killed at least 74 people in the deadliest attack since the US started its bombing campaign against the Houthis last year, according to the Houthirun health ministry.

US President Donald Trump ordered the intensification of strikes last month in the biggest US military operation in the Middle East since he took office in January. Washington has vowed to keep attacking the Iran-aligned Houthis until the group halts attacks on Red Sea shipping.

Health ministry spokesperson Anees al-Asbahi said 171 people were injured in Thursday's strikes, according to preliminary figures, with rescue teams continuing efforts to search for victims

The US military said the strikes aimed to cut off a source of fuel for the Houthi militant group. The port has a heavy military presence in addition to being a primary hub for fuel imports, Yemeni sources said.

Among the dead were employees of Safer Oil Company, which operates the port, and the Yemen Petroleum Company, responsible for overseeing imported fuel shipments and their distribution, the

US Central Command did not comment on the health ministry's casualty figure.

"The objective of these strikes was to degrade the economic source of power of the Houthis, who continue to exploit and bring great pain upon their fellow countrymen," it had said in a post on X.

The US and Israel have previously targeted the port, viewing it as a hub for launching drones, missiles, and attacks

The Iran-aligned Houthis have taken control of swathes of Yemen over the past decade. Since November 2023, the group has launched dozens of drone and missile attacks on vessels in the Red Sea, saying they were targeting ships linked to Israel in solidarity with Palestinians over the war in Gaza.

Ras Isa terminal, about which is about 55 km (35 miles) north of the port city of Hodeidah, has a storage capacity of 3 million barrels.

Fuel import taxes bring in hundreds of millions of dollars annually for the Houthi administration, sources said.

The Houthis halted attacks on shipping lanes during a two-month ceasefire in Gaza. Although they vowed to resume strikes after Israel renewed its assault on the enclave last month, they have not struck targets in the Red Sea since then.

In March, two days of U.S. attacks killed more than 50 peo-

ISRAELI STRIKES KILL GAZA WAR PROTESTS

Jerusalem, April 18: Israeli airstrikes hit about 40 targets across the Gaza Strip over the past day, the military said Friday, hours after Hamas rejected an Israeli ceasefire offer that it said fell short of its demand to agree a full end to the war. Last month the Israeli military broke off a two-month truce that had largely halted fighting in Gaza and has since pushed in from the north and south, seizing almost a third of the enclave as it seeks to pressure Hamas into agreeing to release hostages and disarm.

170 held for attacks on Pak KFC outlets

Karachi/Lahore, April 18: Police have arrested scores of people in Pakistan in recent weeks after more than 10 mob attacks on outlets of US fastfood chain KFC, sparked by anti-United States sentiment and opposition to its ally Israel's war in Gaza, officials said.

Police in major cities in the Islamic nation, including the southern port city of Karachi, the eastern city of Lahore and the capital Islamabad, confirmed at least 11 incidents in which KFC outlets were attacked by protesters armed with sticks and vandalised. At least 178 people were arrested, the officials said this week.

KFC and its parent Yum Brands both US-based, did not respond to requests for comment.

A police official, who spoke on condition of anonymity, said one KFC employee was shot and killed this week in a store on the outskirts of Lahore by unknown gunmen. The official added there was no protest at the time and they were investigating whether the killing was motivated by political sentiment or some other reason. In Lahore, police said they

were ramping up security at 27 KFC outlets around the city after two attacks took place and five others were prevented. "We are investigating the

role of different individuals and groups in these attacks," said Faisal Kamran, a senior Lahore police officer, adding that 11 people, including a member of the Islamist religious party Tehreek-e-Labbaik Pakistan (TLP), were arrested in the city. He added the protests were not officially organised by TLP.

TLP spokesman Rehan Mohsin Khan said the group "has urged Muslims to boycott Israeli products, but it has not given any call for protest outside KFC".

"If any other person claiming to be a TLP leader or activist has indulged in such activity it should be taken as his per sonal act which has nothing to do with the party's policy, said Khan. KFC has long been viewed as a symbol of the Unit ed States in Pakistan and borne the brunt of anti-American sentiment in recent decades with protests and attacks.

MELONI STRENGTHENS

Rome, April 18: The Italian language proved a secret weapon for Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni as she launched a charm offensive with US President Donald Trump and his deputy JD Vance in back-to-back transatlantic meetings.

Meloni met both Trump and Vance at the White House Thursday before heading straight home to Italy. Vance also left Washington after the talks to spend the Easter holidays in Rome.

During a crowded joint press conference in the Oval Office, Trump gushed about Italian when Meloni addressed travelling journalists in her native language.

"That was so beautiful! What the hell did you say?" Trump said after she had answered a question on the war in Ukraine, notably contradicting the US leader, who has suggested Ukraine's president was to blame for the Russian invasion. Following his arrival in Rome



with his family, Vance had lunch with Meloni and listened on as she released a message in Italian, hailing Thursday's talks as "fantastic" and saying there was a "privileged relationship" between their two nations.

"Prime Minister Meloni, it's wonderful to see you again, and I hope that's exactly what you said. Of course she could have called me a jerk and I wouldn't know, but it would be in the most beautiful language imaginable, so I wouldn't even get offended," he said to laughter.

Trump has repeatedly criticised the European Union, saying the bloc was created to "screw" the United States. But he has a warm relationship with the national conservative Meloni, who was the only EU leader he invited to his inau-

The Hague, April 18: A portrait of a young Palestinian boy who lost both arms as a result of an Israeli attack in Gaza was honoured Thursday as World Press Photo of the year.

The photo, taken by Qatar-based Palestinian photographer Samar Abu Elouf for The New York Times shows 9-yearold Mahmoud Ajjour with his arms missing just below each shoulder.

"One of the most difficult things Mahmoud's mother explained to me was how when Mahmoud first came to the realisation that his arms were amputated, the first sentence he said

to her was, 'How will I be able to hug you?" Abu Elouf said in a statement released by the World Press Photo organisation.

The winner of the 68th edition of the prestigious photojournalism contest was selected from 59,320 entries submitted by 3,778 photographers from 141 countries.

"This is a quiet photo that speaks loudly. It tells the story of one boy, but also of a wider war that will have an impact for generations," said World Press Photo Executive Director Joumana El Zein Khoury.

In a statement, the organisation said that Ajjour was injured while fleeing an Israeli attack in March 2024



"After he turned back to urge his family onward, an explosion severed one of his arms and mutilated the other," according to the World Press Photo citation.

"This young boy's life deserves to be understood, and this picture does what great photojournalism can do: provide a layered entry point into a complex story, and the incentive to prolong one's encounter with that story," said jury chair Lucy Conticello, who is Director of Photography for French newspaper Le Monde's weekend magazine.

Winning photographer Abu Elouf was evacuated from Gaza in December 2023 and she now lives in the same apartment complex as Ajjour in Qatar's capital, Doha.

Israel launched its devastating attack on Gaza after Hamas' October 7, 2023 attack, in which thousands of militants stormed into southern Israel from Gaza, killing some 1,200 people, mostly civilians, and abducting 251.

The Palestinian Health Min istry in Gaza says over 51,000 Palestinians have been killed in the Israeli offensive. It does not differentiate between civilians and militants, but says that over half of the dead were women and children, including at least 876 infants under 1. It says over 116,000 people have been wounded.

Israel blames Hamas for the heavy civilian toll because the group carries out attacks and other military activities from residential areas and civilian buildings. Competition organisers also named two World Press Photo finalists that high lighted the issues of migration and climate change.

Govt tweaks city gas policy, moves to advance quarterly allocations

New Delhi, April 18: The government will now allocate natural gas to CNG and piped cooking gas retailers two quarters in advance to give city gas companies greater clarity, the Oil Ministry said Friday.

With city gas retailers like Indraprastha Gas Ltd, Mahanagar Gas Ltd and Adani-Total Gas Ltd reporting pressures on margins after the allocation of cheaper administered price or APM gas to them was cut without giving enough advance notice, the ministry decided to tweak the allocation policy.

"From Q1 (first quarter) of FY 2025-26 (April 2025 to March 2026 financial year), domestic natural gas allocations for CNG (Transport) and piped natural gas (domestic household cooking gas) segments will be done on a two-quarter advance basis," the ministry said in a statement.

Besides the lower-priced APM gas produced from old fields given on a nomination basis, the allocation will also now include gas from new wells drilled on the nomination fields of state-owned Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC) and Oil India Ltd (OIL), it added.

The gas from new wells is slightly more expensive than the APM gas.

While APM gas currently is priced at \$6.75 per million British thermal units, the new



well gas comes to close to \$8 per

"Estimations by GAIL and ONGC will help ensure supply

visibility to CGD entities in advance, enhancing planning and delivery efficiency," it said. GAIL is the state-owned mar-

keter of gas. The ministry said new well gas allocation will be done on a pro-rata basis.

"Auction-based allocation for new well gas has been replaced with a quarterly pro-rata allocation to ensure timely and reliable supply. GAIL will allocate new well gas to city gas distribution (CGD) entities in proportion to their requirements, in accordance with prevailing Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas guidelines," the statement said.

The move comes within days of GAIL intimating the city gas retailers of up to 20 per cent cut in APM gas supplies effective April 16 because of a fall in production at ONGC end. The lost volumes were made good by the supply of new well gas.

"The government has introduced key policy measures aimed at strengthening the allocation framework for domestic natural gas, in alignment with its vision of promoting cleaner energy access, enhancing urban air quality, and bolstering domestic energy security," the ministry said, adding that with a focus on ensuring the sustained availability and affordability of natural gas for key public-facing segments -Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) used in transport and Piped Natural Gas (PNG) used in domestic households for cooking - the ministry has introduced the important enhancements to the Domestic Gas Allocation Policy.
