Storm over remarks on SC 7-year-old tribal girl raped; one arrested

A political storm has erupted over controversial remarks made by BJP MPs Nishikant Dubey and Dinesh Sharma targeting the judiciary and blaming the CJI for "religious wars" in India, placing the ruling party in a tight spot. The comments came following the Centre's assurance to the Supreme Court that it would not implement certain contentious wagf law provisions before the next hearing after the court raised questions over them. Commotion brewed last week after V-P Jagdeep Dhankhar made critical comments about the top court, accusing it of overreach over its recently issued directive setting deadlines for the President to clear passed Bills. While the BJP swiftly distanced itself from the remarks, with party president JP Nadda Saturday calling them "personal opinions" and reaffirming the party's respect for judicial institutions, Congress slammed the move as mere "damage control." The controversy has spotlighted growing tensions between the legislature and the judiciary, and the BJP's apparent struggle to contain internal voices that challenge conPRESS TRUST OF INDIA

New Delhi, April 20: The Congress Sunday described the BJP dissociating itself from the criticism of the Supreme Court by its MPs Nishikant Dubey and Dinesh Sharma as damage control and asserted that the minimum action against them should be their expulsion from the party

Congress MP and senior advocate Abhishek Singhvi also called for contempt of court proceedings against Dubey, saying that hopefully the attorney general will give consent for criminal contempt without delay.

The Opposition party also asked why no action had been taken against the two MPs and why no showcause notices were issued to them.

Congress General Secretary in-Charge, Communications Jairam Ramesh said the distancing of the outgoing BJP president from the atrocious remarks made by two MPs on the Chief Justice of India (CJI) carried little meaning.

Dhenkanal, April 20: In a shocking incident, a sevenyear-old girl was raped by a man under Hindol police limits in this district while the minor girl was watching her elder brother collect ice apples Saturday evening. The accused Shiba Sahu, 32, of Badalo village under Motanga police limits in the district was arrested Sunday and taken into custody for interrogation.

The accused committed the crime when he had been to his aunt's house under Hindol police limits. A case has been registered at Motanga police station in this regard.

The survivor, who belongs to the Scheduled Tribe (ST) community, was rescued by his elder brother and brought back home.

The incident occurred when the survivor accompanied his nine-year-old brother to collect ice apples in the area. Shiba spotted her when she was standing and watching his brother. He picked her up near a tree and raped her. Later, he



dumped her in a critical condition and fled.

The girl, lying under a palm leaf, started crying out of pain. Alarmed, her brother rushed to the spot and brought her back home in critical condition and informed their mother.

Family members admitted her to Hindol Sub-Divisional Hospital first and later shift ed her to the District Head quarters Hospital (DHH) for advanced treatment. A police team accompanied by a scientific team reached the spot and launched an investigation. Later, a police officials led by SDPO Satva Kumar Nanda launched a manhunt and arrested the accused. Balanga, April 20: Two minors were beaten to pulp and made to drink urine after being tied to a nole by a violent mob following a clash between two groups during a religious festival under Balanga police station area in Puri district late Saturday night. Three persons have been arrested in connection with the assault.

Police said a 'Jaman' festival in Kotakusanga village turned violent during a religious procession. The ceremonial parade, carrying the village deity through Pradhan Sahi and Behera Sahi, sparked a clash between young men from both areas, leaving two Kothakusanga residents seriously injured.

north," NASA Solar System moon a bit lower and farther Ambassador Brenda Culbertson told KSNT News in Kansas. "The thin, crescent moon looks like a smile. To some people, the triangle of bright objects may appear as a smiley face."

The best time to view the spectacle is between 5:30-6:30 am, just before sunrise washes the scene away. Both Venus and Saturn will be easily visible with the naked eve. A telescope or binoculars can enhance the view of the moon's craters and the planets' faint glow.

For those with a clear view of the eastern horizon, there's a bonus-Mercury may peek into view just below the smiley formation. However, due to its proximity to the horizon and smaller size, it may be harder to spot without ideal conditions.

The event comes hot on the heels of another sky show: the annual Lyrids meteor shower. The Lyrids peak overnight from April 21 to 22, with up to 15 meteors an hour streak ing across the sky under dark, moonlit conditions.

Triple conjunctions like this are uncommon and fleeting. Culbertson advises anyone hoping to catch the cosmic grin to scout a location with a clear eastern view well before dawn.

"It's a great excuse to get outside and look up," she said.





Bhubaneswar, April 20: Law and Works Minister Prithivirai Harichandan Sunday raised an alarm about the safety of Srimandir's Ratna Bhandar saying that it is at risk of collapse due to "years of neglect and deterioration"

Speaking to media Sunday, Harichandan emphasised an urgent need for restoration of the temple vault to preserve the historically and religiously significant structure.

The Ratna Bhandar, which has stood for nearly two centuries, is home to priceless treasures dedicated to Lord Jagannath. However, recent structural assessments have revealed concerning signs of 'severe damage'. Harichandan said that had the repair work not commenced, the chamber would have collapsed at any moment.

Bhubaneswar, April 20: In a significant step towards strengthening sports infrastructure at grassroots level Sports Minister Suryabanshi Suraj Sunday inaugurated 30 Khelo India centres in all the districts of the state.

Bhubaneswar, April 20: In a bizarre incident, a man shot himself in the early hours of Sunday under Balipatna police station to falsely implicate two relatives of a woman who had filed a sexual assault case against him in 2024. The man, with assistance from two of his associates, who have been arrested, orchestrated the self-inflicted attack, police said.

"Main accused Dipti Ranjan Mohapatra is currently undergoing treatment at Capital Hospital and will be arrested once he recovers," said Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) Jagmohan Meena. Police seized one empty cartridge, three mobile phones, a 9-mm pistol, and four live bullets from the

According to the DCP, Dip-



ti filed a complaint Sunday, claiming Sambit Mohapatra and Rajkishore Behera opened fire at him while he and his associates, Amaresh Pradhan, 36, and Tofan Bisoi, 33, were attending a Ramleela event in Balipatna. Dipti cited prior enmity as the motive.

However, investigations revealed Dipti's criminal history, including a sexual assault case filed against him by Mahila police June 6, 2024. After securing bail, Dipti conspired

Amaresh Pradhan, 36, and Tofan Bisoi, 33, the associates of main accused Dipti **Ranjan Mohapatra** were arrested and produced in court

to frame the victim's relatives. He collaborated with Amaresh, who procured the firearm from Tofan Bisoi. Forensic analysis confirmed Dipti shot himself at a close range, sustaining an arm injury.

Balipatna police charged Dipti under Sections 109 and 3(5) of the BNS, along with Sections 25 and 27 of the Arms Act. Amaresh and Tofan were presented in court Sunday. The police are probing the



CM's nod to new OISF battalion

Bhubaneswar, April 20: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi has approved a proposal for the creation of another battalion of Odisha Industrial Security Force (OISF) in the state, an official said.

Majhi approved the proposal Saturday. A total of 1,040 posts have also been created for this new battalion, the official said.

The state already has one battalion of OISF. Its total number of posts is 1.807. After the creation of the new battalion, the number of posts in the two battalions will be 2,847.

"Keeping in view the growing industrial activities in the state and to maintain law and



order in different industrial hubs, the state government has decided to add another battalion of OISF," a senior police officer said.

During a recent meeting with Union Home Minister Amit Shah, Majhi had said that the state was planning to recruit 3,000 security personnel for the OISF.

Bhubaneswar, April 20: In a society where ageing is often seen as a time to slow down, two remarkable men from Balasore — Manoj Bihari Das (64) and Tarun Kumar Chatterjee (68) — are breaking stereotypes and setting new fitness goals well into their sixties. Their journey into bodybuilding stands as a powerful testament to willpower, discipline, and the idea that it's never too late to chase your dreams.

For Manoj Bihari Das, a retired Block Education Officer, retirement was not a cue to rest, but a chance for reinvention. While many choose leisure post-retirement, Das embraced rigorous training, surprising those around him.

"I trained for three to four hours every day and followed a strict diet for two years. It was difficult, but I was determined to prove that age is no barrier to fitness," he said.

His efforts culminated in a proud moment this March, when he secured third place in the Masters Division — a category for athletes above 45 — at a national-level bodybuilding championship in Bilaspur, Chhattisgarh. Grateful for his

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Ancient Jain idol stolen from Koraput village

Residents claim heritage plunderers are on prowl in the southern district

Koraput/Nandapur, April 20: When people across the globe were celebrating the 'World Heritage Day' Friday, residents of Kecha village under this block of the district found a revered ancient Jain statue stolen from the village temple.

The incident not only sparked concern among the villagers and local authorities, it also made the worst fear of theft and smuggling of ancient artifacts in the state by organised syndicates come true. If sources are to be believed, these prowling syndicates are making a killing from the proceeds of the crime, as these rare and ancient artifacts often find way to international auction houses

found the idol, revered as an 'Ishta Devi, missing from the temple, they lodged a complaint at the Sadar police station in Koraput and submitted a memorandum to district Collector V Keerthi Vasan, demanding immediate action. The Collector assured that police will look into the matter and arrest the culprits.

Locals said that the idol, believed to be of high archae-



Thursday night by unidentified thieves who were suspected to have used a multi-utility vehicle to arrive at the place. This was based on the tyre marks found at the spot where the idol had been kept. They said the heavy stone idol is estimated to be worth more than ₹2 crore in the gray market.

IIC Runu Majhi of Sadar police station said that a case (No. 64/25) has been registered following the receipt of the complaint. He said the police are working on various leads to trace the idol and the lifters.

Locals alleged that despite multiple theft cases reported across various police stations to apprehend any suspect, or recover the stolen artifacts. They claimed that professional lifters are targeting ancient stone carvings and heritage icons in rural parts of Koraput, posing a serious threat to the district's cultural legacy.

Notably, in a similar case reported August 4, 2022, three stone idols were stolen from the revered site of Budha Bhairavi shrine near Raniduduma in

Though a complaint had been filed in that regard at the Nandapur police station, neither the idol nor the culprits have been found so far.

Across Koraput, numerous ancient idols are found lying unprotected in open areas of villages, worshipped by locals without adequate security. The district administration, temple trust boards, endowment and archaeology department have often faced criticism for their failure to safeguard these heritage assets.

This has triggered increasing frustration among the locals who warned that if swift and concrete measures were not taken, historically significant idols meant for research and conservation could slowly vanish from the region. They have urged the police and administration to intensify efforts to nab the culprits and protect

Chh'garh woman's murder mystery solved; lover held

Malkangiri, April 20: Police here Sunday arrested a man in connection with the murder of a 25-year-old woman from Chhattisgarh whose decomposed body was discovered in a forest near Rengabandh village, under Malkangiri block, April12.

The incident, which initially sparked widespread concern. has now been resolved following a joint investigation by Odisha and Chhattisgarh police.

Patil said Mangaladei had been into a relationship with Umesh of Pandum village in Chhattisgarh's Sukma district for over a year. During the course of their relationship, they reportedly had multiple instances of physical intimacy, leading to Mangaladei's pregnancy.

The couple travelled to the Malkangiri District Head-



where an ultrasound confirmed Mangaladei's pregnancy. The couple subsequently requested a medical termination, which was refused by doctors, Patil added.

Facing rejection and unwilling to accept responsibility, Umesh allegedly lured Mangaandh village and murdered her He then allegedly attempted to destroy evidence to conceal

After the body was found, police launched an investigation in collaboration with a forensic team and the Sukma police. The victim's identity was confirmed after officers visited her home and showed personal items found with the body to her family members who recognised those.

₹4L each to kin of 3 kids who drowned

Keonjhar, April 20: Following intervention by the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC), the district administration here paid ₹4 lakh each in compensation to the families of three children who died after falling into a dug up stone quarry near an Anganwadi center under Hatadihi block that lacked basic sanitation facilities.

The district Collector has also initiated departmental action against the responsible officials in this regard

The NHRC intervened in the matter following a petition filed by advocate and human rights activist Radhakanta Tripathy. He said the Commission took cognisance of the matter after receiving a detailed report in this regard from the district Collector, and communicated to him in writing April 17, 2025. Tripathy, in his petition, said

that April 30, 2024, three minor girls Payar Patra, 3, Bharati Patra,4, and Lipsa Patra, 3, of an Anganwadi centre under Hatadihi block drowned in a nearby stone quarry after they went there to relieve themselves. They slipped into the quarry and drowned. He alleged in his petition that the kids were forced to go to the unsafe place as the Anganwadi center didn't have a toilet, resulting in their

tragic death. Tripathy also cited another incident in which an Anganwadi assistant, Surochana Swain, died of snake bite while on duty at Anganwadi Center no-2 in Bilipada under Dampada block in Banki area of Cuttack district September 11, 2024.

The petitioner urged the NHRC to obtain comprehensive reports from the district Collectors of Keonjhar and Cuttack and the state Chief Secretary. He demanded strong action against negligent officials responsible for safety lapses at Anganwadi centers, and adequate compensation for the victims' families as well as ensuring safety at the Anganwadi centres. Following NHRC intervention, the Cuttack administration reported that ₹4 lakh had already been paid to the family of the deceased Anganwadi worker.

The NHRC observed that the three girls drowned while attending to nature's call in the quarry due to the lack of toilet facility at their center.

In response, the Department of Women and Child Development. Odisha, informed the Commission that several initiatives had been taken to address infrastructure gaps at Anganwadi centres. Moreover, toilet construction had been undertaken in 53 per cent of the state's Anganwadi centers by October 31, 2024.

Minor Mayurbhanj girl abducted by 2 fake transgenders, rescued in Jajpur

Jajpur/Jajpur Road, April 20: A four-year-old girl who had been abducted from a fair in Thakurmunda area of Mayurbhanj district three days ago, was rescued safely from a house in Jajpur Road area Sunday morning by the police with the help from local transgender community leaders.

The police have arrested two persons – Lipu Nayak of Telkoi and Niranjan Raul of Ramchandrapur in Keonihar district. who allegedly disguised themselves as transgender women to carry out the abduction. They have been booked under BNS Sections 137 (2) and 326 (2)

According to police, April 17 night, the child had visited the traditional Uda Parba festival in Thakurmunda with her mother, Sipi Patra, of Malatpada village under Karanjia police jurisdiction. Around 10pm, she reportedly wandered away and could not be located despite a frantic search. A formal missing person's complaint was filed the next day at Thakurmunda police station, leading to the registration of a case (No. 38/2025).

Given the sensitive nature of the case, a dedicated police team was formed. CCTV footage from various locations was reviewed, and a kev lead emerged when a camera cap-



Further investigation led police to believe the abductors had taken the child to Jajpur Road. Acting on this lead, Thakurmunda police coordinated with members of Palalahada-based transgender community, who in turn reached out to the Jajpur Road Transgender Association. Inspector-in-Charge Sabitri Dalai worked closely with the association's president, Kajal Nayak, and secretary, Lovely Sahu, to trace the child.

Their collaborative efforts led to the discovery of the girl in Ward No. 8 of Kachhudi Sahi, where she was found in an abandoned house in the custody of two men posing as trans

women. The suspects, Lipu and Niranian, were detained and questioned before being handed over to Thakurmunda police for further legal action. Speaking to reporters,

Kajal Nayak expressed concern over such impostors tarnishing the reputation of the transgender community. She urged authorities to take stringent action against those who commit crimes under false pretences. Nevertheless, the case has

triggered widespread debate in the region, recalling a similar incident in Bhubaneswar where a one-and-a-half-year-old was abducted from the arms of a visually impaired mother outside Ram Mandir, only to be rescued later.

Meanwhile, police are investigating the motive behind the abduction, and the possible existence of a larger child-lifting network in the area.

Water crisis grips Bolangir village as project delayed

Bolangir, April 20: Residents of Kushmel village in Bolangir district are grappling with a worsening water crisis amid scorching temperatures as a key drinking water project remains incomplete. The village, located in Lo-

isingha block and home to nearly 4,000 people, has faced acute water shortage for over three years. Work on a new supply project, intended to source water from the nearby Suktel river, began two years ago but has seen little progress. Only partial infrastructure, including a head tank and a few stand posts, has been completed.

Locals allege the contractor abandoned the project leaving crucial work unfinished. "It's been over two weeks without water. We're forced to collect it from neighbours or travel kilometres to irrigation points,' said Upendra Biswal, a resident of the village.

Sarpanch Kaustubh Sahu admitted to the crisis and expressed frustration with administrative delays. He noted that over ₹10 lakh had been spent on other development work this year, yet the water issue persists owing to inordinate delay in the project work.

Tribals earn pittance from Chironji sale as traders make hay

Keonjhar, April 20: The forests and hills surrounding Keonjhar district are a year-round source of livelihood for the tribal communities living in the district. Throughout the seasons, they

collect and sell various forest produce to sustain their fami-During the summer, demand

for Chironji or Almondette, which is known as Chara Koli in local parlance, has a high demand in village markets and urban centres

Chara Koli is a tangy-sweet forest berry which is available in the district in abundance. Natural treats like Chara Koli as well as ice apple, jackfruit, and mango, are especially popular during hot weather.

While the outer layer of Chara Koli is widely enjoyed, it's the seed of the berry that holds far more commercial value. However, due to a lack



of awareness, tribals collectors often sell a bundle for just ₹20, unaware that the seed alone fetches significantly higher prices in bigger markets.

These berries are usually gathered by hand from forests and hills, before being carried in baskets or bags to local roadsides and markets. Traders, recognising the demand, buy the berry cheaply

and transport it both within and outside the district, making substantial profits. Though tribal sellers typically earn just ₹20 per kilogram, the processed seed is sold for three to four times more.

The seeds are washed, dried, and either hand-processed or machine-processed to extract the edible core. These are then used in sweets, laddus, porridge and snack

Their demand extends not just across India, but internationally as well. At present, these seeds prices rival, or even surpass, those of cashews and pistachios, fetching more than ₹1,000 per kilogram in some markets.

Educationist Ramakanta Swain noted that deforesta-

tion and climate change are major factors behind the declining presence of Chronii trees in backyards of houses and forests. Without greater awareness and protection efforts, he warned, the availability of such natural produce will continue to dwindle.

Retired Forest officer Alekh Chandra Patra added that given the rising demand outside the region, administrative intervention is essential. He stressed the need for awareness programs, sustainable harvesting practices, and value-added processing units to ensure both conservation and income generation.

By protecting trees like chironji, palm, and jackfruits, and creating structured processing systems, tribal communities could significantly boost their income while ensuring broader access to these forest-based products, they opined.

set pattern of attacks on the Supreme Court of India has emerged last week from two sources - one from a Constitutional authority and another from a couple of ruling party MPs. First it was Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar who criticised the Supreme Court over a ruling that established a timeline for the President of India to sign bills passed by state legislatures. He was referencing the landmark 8 April verdict of the top court in the case of Tamil Nadu vs. the Governor, which was perceived as a victory for states throughout India. Calling for the judiciary to be held accountable, Dhankhar referred to Article 142 of the Constitution as a "nuclear missile against democratic forces" that is accessible to the judiciary at all times. Article 142 states that "The Supreme Court in the exercise of its jurisdiction may pass such decree or make such order as is necessary for doing complete justice in any cause or matter pending before it." This indicates that the article grants the Supreme Court the discretion to issue any order or judgement it deems necessary to achieve full justice in any case it reviews. The VP went on to add that the Supreme Court was acting like

Two days after these scathing remarks from the VP, two BJP MPs Nishikant Dubey and Dinesh Sharma also launched an attack on the Supreme Court. While Dinesh Sharma, a former deputy chief minister of Uttar Pradesh, stated that neither the Parliament nor the President can be directed by anyone, Nishikant Dubey, one of the more vocal members of the BJP in the Lok Sabha, launched a broadside against the top court, arguing that if the apex court is responsible for making laws, then the Parliament and the state assemblies should be shut down. He went to the extent of alleging that Chief Justice of India Sanjiv Khanna was responsible for "civil wars" in the country.

In an apparent damage control attempt, the BJP has distanced itself from the comments made by its MPs. However, it remains silent regarding equally unacceptable statements about the judiciary made by VP Dhankhar, one of its prominent appointees to a high constitutional position and who came to public notice while he was Governor of West Bengal. While in that position, as a devoted political party worker, he did not spare any opportunity to hinder the normal functioning of the state government of Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee.

Those attacking the Supreme Court over its perceived "overreach" perhaps fail to understand that for a healthy democracy to function all its three pillars -- the legislature, the executive and the judiciary -- have to perform their duties in tandem and free of each other. Parliament makes laws and the government executes that law but in the absence of checks and balances in the form of the judiciary and in a much more limited manner, the Press and civil society, elected governments generally tend to become autocratic. This has been the practice in all the thriving democracies the world over. Just a day before, the US Supreme Court halted the Donald Trump administration's move to deport Venezuelans from the US under an old unused war time law. This shows that in a proper working democracy, even the world's most powerful man, the PoTUS, is not immune to the judiciary's powers in the system of checks and balances.

History is replete with examples of what absolute power of people's elected representatives, once they take the seat of power in the government, can do to a country and its people. Two of the classic examples are of Germany electing Adolf Hitler as Chancellor only once and the resultant worldwide destruction and the second is of modern day Russia electing Vladimir Putin who has started a war in Europe and has changed that country's Constitution that enables him to remain as President for life. In contemporary era, strongmen leaders like Viktor Orban of Hungary and Benjamin Netanyahu of Israel have been reined in by their judiciary for their acts of omission and commission.

In India, the government has, on several occasions, pushed its limits of power, bypassing all other institutions. The Demonetization of the Rs 1000 and Rs 500 currency carried out by the government in November of 2016 without the Parliament's approval is a landmark example of the political excesses that affected negatively the growing economy of the country.

The critical comments directed at the Supreme Court over the past week suggest that the judiciary is being taught a lesson for its timely interventions. However, one must not forget that when Parliament is bypassed and the executive is weak and incapable to fulfil its responsibilities, it is the judiciary's duty to step in. The independence of the judiciary and all other institutions is sacrosanct for any democracy to flourish. However, the country needs to watch how truly strong the judiciary is in its beliefs and convictions in this instance. Too many times in the recent past the country has seen how judges, looking strong and resolute, later crumble and cower before powerful politicians. Only time will tell.

he increasing attacks on higher educational institutions and universities reflect a deeper malaise within the ruling classes. President Donald Trump's criticisms of American universities and attacks on universities such as Columbia and Harvard, along with the Indian government's actions targeting institutions like Jawaharlal Nehru University and Jadavpur University, are notable examples of growing threats faced by centers of learning and inquiry. These examples are not limited to the US and India; universities across Europe and other regions are facing similar threats from ruling elites. These threats extend beyond funding cuts, political intimidation, bureaucratic harassment, government and legal pressure. Students, teachers, and researchers are increasingly facing physical danger-not only to their lives and livelihoods but also to their passionate commitment to the production and dissemination of knowledge

The Education Under Attack 2024 report, published by the Global Coalition to Protect Education from Attack, revealed that approximately 6,000 attacks on educational institutions occurred in 2022 and 2023—representing a nearly 20% increase compared to the previous two years. More than 10,000 students, teachers. and academics were harmed, injured, or killed in these incidents, many of which took place in regions affected by wars and armed conflict.

Attacks on intellectuals and institutions of higher learning are nothing new. Feudal landlords, monarchs, colonial rulers, reactionary religious forces, and dominant ruling classes have long felt threatened by reason, science, and secular knowledge that challenge prevailing power structures. Universities and insti-

tutions of higher education have traditionally served as spaces for emancipatory, independent, and critical thinking-forms of thought that inherently question and resist hegemonic authority and status quo. These institutions not only produce and disseminate knowledge but also play a vital role in deepening democracy and advancing decolonisation. The scientific ethos and egalitarian culture that define higher education are often deeply unsettling for ruling elites, as they disrupt entrenched hierarchies and systems of control.

The new wave of attacks on universities and higher institutions of learning began with the commodification, commercialisation, marketisation, privatisation, and modularisation of higher education. This was followed by a systematic effort to undermine the humanities, social sciences, and liberal arts-disciplines increasingly devalued under the pretext of employability and the utilitarian logic of skill-based knowledge transfer. These assaults were not accidental but carefully orchestrated to align education with the needs of capitalism and the

ruling classes. The aim was to reshape universities into institutions that produce a compliant workforce stripped of the capacity to critically examine exploitative working conditions or challenge systemic inequalities. Governments and university administrations have, to a large extent, succeeded in this endeavour by closing down departments and programmes in the humanities, social sciences, and liberal arts.

Despite the antagonistic environment shaped by a compliance-driven culture of surveillance over students and faculty. smear campaigns branding university communities as radical leftist, elitist, or anti-national, and the systematic curbing of academic freedom through funding cuts, students and staff have continued to defy these pressures. The students and staff have refused to transform their universities into machineries of compliance. They remain committed to generating knowledge and cultivating consciousness that challenge conformity and promote emancipatory praxis.

So, the renewed intensity in attacks on higher educational institutions, universities, and intellectuals reflects a deeper malaise rooted in insecurity, fear of dissent, and an urgent drive to consolidate ideological control. This broader assault reveals a fundamental truth: the ruling elites no longer trust their ability to maintain legitimacy through democratic consent. Instead, they turn to coercion and control, enforcing a culture of compliance aimed at dismantling critical thought and silencing those who dare to question or challenge the status quo.

What ruling classes fear is not merely academic critique, but education itself as a democratising force capable of awakening political consciousness, empowering people to interrogate systems and conditions of exploitation, and imagine just, alternative futures. By silencing campuses, the ruling classes seek to silence the future-eroding democratic rights and reinforcing a social, political, economic and cultural order grounded in inequality and repression.

History bears witness to the vital role that universities, institutions of higher learning, and intellectuals have played in the revolutionary upsurges of societies against patriarchy, feudalism, monarchy, colonialism, apartheid, capitalism, and imperialism. The more repression is imposed, the more it fuels tireless and enduring resistanceresistance that persists until power is ultimately challenged, overturned and defeated. Therefore, let universities and their campuses stand as territories of resistance—spaces where the struggle for a progressive transformation of society takes root, aiming to build a future free from all forms of inequality and exploitation. True knowledge does not domesticate—it emancipates.

Will Qatari gold sink Netanyahu?

an an Israeli prime minister dismiss the country's internal security chief? The Israeli Supreme Court considered that question on 8 April, when it placed a pause on PM Binyamin Netanyahu's firing of Ronen Bar, the head of Shin Bet since October 2021. Seemingly expecting a different verdict, however, Netanyahu had announced beforehand that he would ignore any adverse ruling.

Typically, such flagrant disregard for the judiciary, whose authority Netanyahu seems determined to undermine, would have triggered a constitutional crisis. It still could, since the court has frozen Bar's dismissal only until 20 April, demanding that the government strike a compromise with the country's independent attorney general, who has opposed Bar's dismissal on the grounds that Netanyahu has a conflict of interest.

The situation is complicated, though, because Shin Bet's disastrous failure to anticipate Hamas' attack on 7 October, 2023, is certainly reason enough to fire Bar. He has even admitted as much, but has also called for a state commission of inquiry into the matter. Netanyahu, keen not to be implicated in the failure himself, adamantly opposes this. Moreover, Bar alleges

that Netanyahu, facing criminal prosecution for corruption. fraud, and abuse of power, tried to pressure him into convincing the court to delay the date of his testimony in the trial. So, while there are valid reasons for Netanyahu to "lose trust" in Bar, there are also valid reasons to suspect a conflict of interest. And here, the most damning and contentious issue of all is Bar's investigation of "Qatargate" - a complicated case of bribery and leaks involving Netanyahu's closest aides. Notably, Netanyahu decided to fire Bar immediately after this investigation began. To summarize the case, two of

Netanvahu's personal aides, Yonatan Urich and Eli Feldstein. were arrested on suspicion of accepting bribes from Qatar in return for leaking statements to Israeli media tailored to burnish the sheikhdom's image. A third aide, who has conveniently departed to Serbia, is wanted for questioning; the editor-in-chief of the Jerusalem Post is suspected of having been the go-between; and a businessman has admitted to transferring funds to Feldstein from a known Qatari lobbyist in the US

Leaks from the prime minister's office are often believed to come from Netanyahu himself, since he is known to have leaked classified information that was damaging to political opponents in the past. Though nothing suggests that he was personally aware of "Qatargate," he admits that some leaks made by Urich reflected his instructions.

Qatar allegedly paid the leakers to present the country as a trustworthy partner in the onand-off indirect negotiations over the fate of the Israeli hostages in Gaza. Qatar has been known to use bribes to advance its interests elsewhere – as became apparent in the 2022 arrests of European Parliament members who were accused of taking Qatari money for this purpose. But in Israel, Qatari money has different associations.

From 2018, and with the explicit approval of Netanyahu's government, the Qatari government transferred \$30 million per month to prop up the Hamas regime in Gaza. The money, transported in suitcases to avoid possible US anti-terror sanctions, was used to pay the salaries of civil servants and welfare benefits, thus freeing up other Hamas funds for terrorism. Qatar's support for Islamists has often made it a pariah in the Arab world. Netanyahu's own rationale for allowing the payments was that Hamas' regime supposedly served Israel's interest. With terrorists in charge of Gaza and corrupt, incompetent Fatah bureaucrats in charge in Ramallah, Israel had a convenient excuse to avoid negotiations on the Palestinian issue. All this would have been exposed by Bar's proposed state commission of inquiry.

Lawyers for the suspects have not responded directly to the allegations, but they stress that Qatar is not an "enemy state," implying that no treason was involved. They also point out that under Israeli law, only civil servants can be bribed. Strictly speaking, the prime minister's aides do not qualify.

The battle lines are drawn According to Justice Minister Yariv Levin, the Netanyahu government is defending "millions whose rights are being trampled on and whose democratic choice they made at the ballot box is being taken from them by a handful of arrogant and detached judges." Yet polls show that 63% of Israelis fear for the future of the country's democracy, and that they trust the Supreme Court, the attorney general, and Shin Bet more than the Netanyahu government by a two-to-one margin.

That transformed China from one of the world's poorest countries to one of the richest. The assertion that the 21st century belongs to China, surpassing the US in both technology and economy, is a complex one with evidence supporting both sides. While China's rapid economic growth and technological advancements are undeniable, its future dominance is still debated. The view that China was the emerging geopolitical power, with developing nations tucked under its wings, is looking similarly shaky. It is now unclear whether China's GDP will ever surpass the US and nations around the world are rethinking their ties to Beijing and the debt trap that is the Belt and Road Initiative. Add to this, with a debt-to-GDP ratio of greater than 300%, and as per energy consumption estimates, the Chinese economy is as much as 30% smaller than what government statistics say, and it's also slowing down. Also, China is showing the inevitable limits of a state directed economy and society, when political diktats begin to trump open-market economic self-interest. One can't grow the economy forever under state-controlled enterprise and subsidised infrastructure, EVs. and real estate, particularly while tightening political control over both the masses and the leading entrepreneurs. Bhopal, April 20: Two South African cheetahs, Prabhash and Pavak, who were translocated to Kuno National Park more than two years ago, found a new home Sunday when Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Mohan Yadav released them into the Gandhi Sagar Sanctuary.

These six-year-old male cheetahs, originally brought from South Africa's Waterberg Biosphere Reserve to Kuno National Park in February 2023, arrived at Gandhi Sagar Sanctuary, which spans Neemuch and Mandsaur districts, after a road journey

CM Yadav released them in the sanctuary at Basigaon Khemla this evening. He said four more cheetahs, proposed to be bought from Botswana in southern Africa, will also be released in Gandhi Sagar

"A new history has been written in Gandhi Sagar in view of cheetah relocation. Prabhas and Pavak were released. I want to congratulate the people



of the state and country," Yaday said on the occasion.

Earlier, Yadav highlighted that Prime Minister Narendra Modi had spearheaded a successful effort to reintroduce cheetahs to Asia in September 2022. The PM made Madhya Pradesh a cheetah state on his birthday, Yadav said. The cheetahs were introduced in KNP September 17, 2022

Due to that experiment, the growth of the cheetah, an extinct species in Asia, is a matter of research for the entire world. Yaday said, adding that the growth rate of cheetahs in Madhya Pradesh is about 80 per cent. "It is our good fortune that the most favourable conditions for the restoration of cheetahs in all of Asia exist in our country, particularly in Madhya Pradesh," he asserted.

The CM said his government will work for air and road connectivity, which will enhance opportunities for employment.

"It was our project to gradually increase the number of

cheetahs, We will be getting four new cheetahs from Botswana in the month of May. We will try to release them here (Gandhi Sagar Sanctuary), which will take the number here to six," Yadav said.

Earlier in the day, the two cheetahs were transported by road to Gandhi Sagar Sanctuary, located over 250 kilometres from Kuno, where the ambitious intercontinental translocation of the big cats was launched nearly three vears ago.

Eight Namibian cheetahs five females and three maleswere released into Kuno National Park on September 17, 2022, marking the first-ever intercontinental translocation of these big cats.

Twelve more cheetahs were translocated from South Africa to Kuno in February 2023. Currently, Kuno National Park houses 24 cheetahs, including 14 India-born cubs, while two have now been relocated to Gandhi Sagar Sanctuary.

Umaria (Madhya Pradesh), April 20: Panic swept through the villages near Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve this week as a 45-year-old man mysteriously vanished, sparking fears of another deadly human-wildlife encounter in the already tense

Munnalal, a resident of the Manpur police station area in Umaria district, had gone missing Tuesday. With the area witnessing a rise in tiger sightings and recent fatal attacks, rumours swirled that he may have fallen victim to a tiger. The local community was shocked by his mysterious disappearance, and when news and rumours went viral on social media Friday that another man was taken away by a tiger, the authorities came into action.

An intensive joint search op-

Tiger panic ends with surprise return of missing man eration was launched by forest officials and police teams. The forest echoed with the sounds of search parties for three days. Vehicles combed the undergrowth, and even two elephants were brought in to help sweep dense areas of the reserve. Local villagers joined in, offering clues and pointing searchers toward possible locations.

'We treated it as a high-priority case," said Mukesh Merskole, the investigating officer. "There were heightened concerns due to recent tiger activity, and the area's history of attacks only intensified the urgency." Adding to the fear was the recent capture of a tigress blamed for a series of violent encounters, including the tragic death of a 14-year-old boy and a serious injury to a woman who had ventured into the buffer zone to collect mahua flowers, a common activity among tribal families. The



same tigress was also responsible for killing livestock and pets in surrounding villages before being tranquillised and captured for observation.

The anxiety over Munnalal's fate, however, came to an unexpected and mysterious end Saturday morning. To everyone's astonishment, Munnalal was found alive in Amadpur village -- disoriented, but physically unharmed. "He is not in a sound mental state," Merskole confirmed to IANS, adding that he is now in police custody for medical evaluation and questioning.

His sudden reappearance, with no visible injuries and no signs of contact with wildlife has deepened the mystery. No tiger tracks, drag marks, or signs of struggle were discovered during the exhaustive search. While the community has breathed a collective sigh of relief, the questions surrounding his disappearance remain unanswered.

"This is a reminder of the complex and sometimes unpredictable nature of life near protected wildlife areas," a senior forest officer noted. "While the fear of tiger attacks is real, not every disappearance is linked to wildlife. We're grateful this one ended safely.

The incident needs to be viewed in a broader context. as it highlights the existing challenges being faced in balancing wildlife conservation with human safety. This happens especially in regions where tigers and humans often cross paths.



New Delhi, April 20: The Staff Selection Commission (SSC) has decided to implement Aadhaar-based biometric authentication in its all forthcoming examinations in order to verify candidates' identity on a voluntary basis, officials said Sunday.

They said the new measure will come into force for recruitment tests conducted from next month onwards. The SSC is one of the largest recruitment agencies of the central government with its main mandate to conduct selections for non-gazetted posts in various central ministries and departments, among others.

"The Commission has decided to implement Aadhar Based Biometric Authentication in its forthcoming examinations. Accordingly, candidates will be able to authenticate themselves using Aadhaar at the time of online registration, while filling up online application form for the examinations and while appearing at the test centre to take examinations conducted by the Commission from May 2025 onwards," a recent public notice issued by the recruitment body said.

Flash floods in J&K's Ramban; 3 dead Volunteers defied fear to reach out to victims

Ramban (J&K), April 20: Amid frightening thunderstorm and cloudbursts, hundreds of village volunteers were the first respondents to reach out to the victims of flash floods and landslide that struck several villages in Jammu and Kashmir's Ramban district early Sunday. leaving two minor brothers and an elderly man dead.

Dozens of houses and a stretch of Jammu-Srinagar National Highway near Panthiyal were damaged, while a number of villages were inaccessible, cutting off from the district headquarters.

Deputy Commissioner Baseer-ul-Haq Chaudhary is closely monitoring the ongoing operations in the affected areas. where educational institutions will remain closed Monday.

"I have never seen such a weather condition in my entire life. I was woken up by the deafening sound of the cloudburst at around 4.30 am and within no time heard cries for help,' Mohammad Hafiz, a Seri Bagna

village resident, told PTI.

Seri Bagna village was hit by flash floods that claimed lives of three people -- Aqib Ahmad (12), his brother Mohd Saqib (10) and their neighbour Muni Ram (65).

"We managed to pull out the two brothers after a portion of their house collapsed due to the flash floods but both of them had dead," Hafiz said, adding that the volunteers defied their fear and continued the rescue operation despite heavy rains.

Former Sarpanch Teerath Singh said all the villagers con-

tinued their efforts and were hopeful of pulling out Muni Ram, who was alive and stuck under the debris. However, the elderly man could not be saved.

"It was a frightening scene as dark clouds were hovering overhead with heavy rains continuing. We lost three precious lives and many houses were damaged," he said.

The scene was no different in Dharam Kund village where police promptly acted and rescued over 100 villagers, including women and children.

New players add to churn in Bihar politics ahead of Assembly polls

New Delhi, April 20: Emergence of a slew of political parties headed by recognised names with unproven credentials in mass politics threatens to disturb the conventional electoral calculations in Bihar as the state prepares for Assembly polls.

If it appeared a couple of months back that the Jan Suraj Party headed by Prashant Kishor, whose high-decibel foray into popular politics remains a work in progress,

will be the only serious new

entrant in the polls, former Congress leader I P Gupta has announced the arrival of his Indian Inquilab Party with an impressive show of strength in Gandhi Maidan around the age-old theme of caste mobilisation.

To add to the churn, amid question marks being raised over the fitness of JD(U) president and Chief Minister Nitish Kumar by his rivals, is the Hind Sena formed by former IPS officer Shivdeep Lande, a Maharashtrian whose flamboyant style at work has rendered him a certain brand recall if not any visible popular sup-

If Lande aspires to make a difference in his 'karmabhoomi' Bihar, there is also RCP Singh, Kumar's closest aide-turned-bete noire who had joined the BJP but was left out in the cold after the party revived its alliance with the

JD(U).

Singh, a former bureaucrat and a Kurmi like Kumar, is flexing his muscles after launching a new party -- Aap Sab Ki Awaz.

Most leaders across estab-

lished political parties like the BJP, RJD and the JD(U) are of the view that Kishor and Gupta will be the ones to watch out for in the coming months, with the memories of Union minister Chirag Paswan-headed Lok Janshakti Party singlehandedly engineering the defeat of the JD(U) in nearly 35 Assembly seats in 2020 still afresh.

An RJD leader claimed that he did not see Kishor or Gupta winning many seats but added that they could draw away just enough votes in several constituencies to ensure the defeat of one of the main parties.

While former well-known political strategist Kishor has been mobilising people around the theme of governance and has shunned the conventional caste identity to build support for his party, Gupta has followed the well-trodden track by seeking to rally Tanti and Tantva castes, which fall in the extremely backward classes

These castes were removed from the Scheduled Castes category after a Supreme Court order, and Gupta guit the Congress to champion their cause.

Though RJD leaders claimed Gupta would cut into Kumar's support, a couple of JD(U) MPs said social equations forged through several elections cannot be undone in one poll and added that their leader remains the chief minister of choice for the numerically smaller castes besides women

Kishor's party, political watchers said, has in the past elections drawn a sizeable share of votes from constituencies where it could field strong candidates, at times those with roots in other parties.

These new parties, they add ed, can be a useful platform for politicians with a certain vote bank who may not get a ticket from the existing major players With questions being asked

about Kumar's health and the ability of the RJD to draw vot ers from outside its core sup port base, the new players may punch above their weight.

Islamabad, April 20: A Pakistani Hindu Minister of State was attacked in Sindh by protestors opposing the federal government's controversial irrigation canal projects on the pretext that it would reduce the downward flow of rivers that are key for irrigation in the southern province.

Russia, Ukraine trade blame game

Moscow, April 20: Russia and Ukraine blamed each other Sunday for breaking a one-day Easter ceasefire announced by President Vladimir Putin, with both sides accusing the other of carrying out hundreds of attacks.

Putin, who ordered thousands of Russian troops into Ukraine in February 2022, ordered Russian forces to "stop all military activity" along the front line in the three-year-old war until midnight Moscow time (2100 GMT) Sunday.

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said Russia was pretending to observe the Easter ceasefire, but had in fact continued hundreds of artillery attacks Saturday night, with more assaults Sunday.

Despite Putin's declaration of an Easter ceasefire Saturday, Zelenskyy said Ukrainian forces had recorded 59 instances of Russian shelling and five assaults by units across various areas along the front line, as well as "dozens" of drone strikes.

"Either Putin does not have full control over his army, or the situation proves that in Russia, they have no intention of making a genuine move toward ending the war, and are only interested in favourable PR coverage," Zelenskyy said.

Earlier he said the Russian army "is trying to create a general impression of a ceasefire", while continuing to inflict losses on Ukraine's front line.

Russia's Defence Ministry said Ukraine had broken the ceasefire more than 1,000 times, inflicting damage to infrastructure and causing some civilian deaths.

The ministry said Ukrainian forces had shot at Russian positions 444 times while it had counted more than 900 Ukrainian drone attacks, including attacks on Crimea and on the Russian border areas of Bryansk, Kursk and Belgorod regions. "As a result, there are deaths and injuries among the civilian population, as well as damage to civilian facilities," the ministry said.

Ukraine's military said earlier Sunday that activity on the front line had decreased. Some Russian military bloggers also said military activity along the frontline has substantially decreased. The apparent failure to observe even an Easter ceasefire shows just how hard it will be for US President Donald Trump to achieve his aim of clinching a lasting deal to end what he calls the "bloodbath" of the war in Ukraine.

The US will walk away from efforts to broker a peace deal unless there are clear signs of progress soon, Trump and his secretary of state, Marco Rubio, said Friday.

Trump, who says he wants to be remembered as a peace-maker, has repeatedly warned of the escalation risk of the war-which his administration now casts as a proxy conflict between the US and Russia, echoing Mescay's atomes

ing Moscow's stance.
Last month, after Ukraine accepted Trump's proposal for a 30-day truce, Putin said crucial issues of verification had not been sorted out. Both Moscow and Kyiv have agreed to a moratorium on attacks on energy targets and at sea, which each accuses the other of breaking.

Zelenskyy reiterated that Kyiv was willing to extend the ceasefire for 30 days but said that if Russia kept fighting on Sunday, so would Ukraine.

Israeli probe into killings of Palestinian medics finds 'professional failures'

The 15 paramedics and emergency responders were shot dead March 23 and buried in a shallow grave where their bodies were found a week later by officials from the UN and the Palestinian Red Crescent

Jerusalem, April 20: An Israeli probe into the killings of 15 Palestinian medics last month in Gaza by Israeli forces said Sunday it has found "professional failures" and a deputy commander will be fired.

Israel at first claimed that the medics' vehicles did not have emergency signals on when troops opened fire but later backtracked. Cellphone video recovered from one of the medics contradicted Israel's initial account.

The military investigation found that the deputy battalion commander, "due to poor night visibility", assessed that the ambulances belonged to Hamas militants. Video footage obtained from the incident shows the ambulances had lights flashing.

Eight Red Crescent personnel, six Civil Defence workers and a UN staffer were killed in the shooting before dawn March 23 by troops conducting operations in Tel al-Sultan, a district of the southern Gaza city of Rafah. Troops then bulldozed over

the bodies along with their mangled vehicles, burying them in a mass grave. UN and rescue workers were only able to reach the site a week later to dig out the bodies.

The head of the Palestinian

Red Crescent Society has said the slain men were "targeted at close range". The Israeli military inves-

tigation said the Palestinians were killed due to an "operational misunderstanding" by Israeli forces, and that a separate incident 15 minutes later, when Israeli soldiers shot at a Palestinian UN vehicle, was a breach of orders.

The investigation found that the decision to crush the ambulances was wrong but denied that there was an attempt to conceal the event.

"The examination found no evidence to support claims of execution or that any of the deceased were bound before or after the shooting," it added.

Israel has accused Hamas of moving and hiding its fighters inside ambulances and emergency vehicles, as well as in hospitals and other civilian infrastructure, arguing that justifies strikes on them.

First wheat shipment since Assad's ouster reaches Syria's Latakia

Cairo, April 20: A ship carrying wheat has arrived in Syria's Latakia port, the first delivery of its kind since former President Bashar al-Assad was ousted by rebels in December, the government said Sunday.

Officials of the new Islamist-led government say that while imports of wheat and other basics are not subject to US and U.N. sanctions, challenges in securing financing for trade deals have deterred global suppliers from selling to Syria.

The Syrian General Authority for Land and Sea Borders said in a statement that the ship carried 6,600 tonnes of wheat. It did not identify the nationality or destination of the boat, but one regional commodity trader told Reuters it was from Russia.

"A step that is considered a clear indication of the start of a new phase of economic recovery in the country," the borders authority said of the shipment, adding that it should pave the way for more arrivals of vital supplies. Traders say Syria has this year been largely relying on overland imports from neighbours.

NSE adds 84L new demat accounts

New Delhi: India's capital markets witnessed remarkable retail participation in FY25, with over 84 lakh new active demat accounts added on the National Stock Exchange (NSE), a 20.5 per cent yearon-year increase, taking the total tally to 4.92 crore. At the forefront of this growth are two digital brokerages -- Groww and Angel One -which together accounted for over 57 per cent of these net additions. Groww emerged as the single-largest contributor, adding 34 lakh new accounts -- a 40 per cent share of NSE's growth. Its active client base rose from 95 lakh in March 2024 to 1.29 crore in March 2025, reflecting a sharp 36 per cent year-on-year increase. Groww's market share rose from 23.28 per cent to 26.26 per cent during the same period, according to NSE data. Angel One added 14.6 lakh accounts during FY25, contributing 17.38 per cent to NSE's overall growth. The platform's active user base climbed to 75.7 lakh, with a market share of 15.38 per

BHEL logs 19% revenue growth

New Delhi: State-owned engineering firm BHEL Sunday posted a 19 per cent on-year growth in revenue at ₹27.350 crore for the fiscal year 2024 25. The company also secured its highest-ever order inflows during the year, amounting to ₹92,534 crore, a company statement said. With this, BHEL's total order book at the end of FY 2024-25 stood at ₹1,95,922 crore, it stated. According to the statement, Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd (BHEL) registered a revenue of ₹27,350 crore (provisional and unaudited) for FY 2024-25, marking a robust growth of around 19 per cent over the previous year. The company stated that in the power sector, BHEL maintained its leadership by winning orders worth ₹81.349 crore. However, renewed investor confidence was supported by India's resilient domestic econglobal trade disruptions, and comparatively attractive value ations given recent correction in the Indian equity markets, Srivastava said. This reversal in FPI activity

Secondly, both the US and China are likely to report subdued growth this year, while India is expected to clock a growth rate of 6 per cent in FY 26 even in an unfavourable global environment. This relative outperformance of India in growth can lead to outperformance in the market, too,

In March, FPIs withdrew ₹3,973 crore and FPIs took out ₹34,574 crore, while in January, the outflow was higher at ₹78,027 crore.

RBI Guv warns of dwindling money market liquidity

Mumbai, April 20: India's call money market faces risks of dwindling liquidity, posing challenges for monetary policy transmission, the nation's central bank chief said in a speech published Saturday

Reserve Bank of India Governor Sanjay Malhotra expressed concern about "asymmetries which arise on occasions between different money market rates the rate at which RBI provides liquidity, the call money rate, the market repo rate and TREPS (tri-party repo dealing system) rate." Banks - the entities with sole access to the RBI's liquidity facilities, the call money market and the repo markets - must be proactive to ensure that the central bank's liquidity measures are "promptly and seamlessly" transmitted to the broader market, Malhotra told a conference in India Friday that was uploaded to the RBI website Saturday.

The call money rate is an overnight interest rate at which banks and other financial institutions lend and borrow from each rates or injects liquidity, it can push down the call money rate, transmitting the central bank's policy move to the system. Sur plus liquidity in India's has av eraged 1.7 trillion rupees (\$20 bil lion) a day this month, reversing a four-month deficit, as the RBI stepped up its liquidity infusions

to support growth. The governor also called for deepening of India's government securities market and improving liquidity and pricing by increasing participation from various stakeholders

There is also a need for more proactive management of risks by different stakeholders in the derivatives market, enhancing market depth, increasing the diversity of views and fostering greater competition and efficien-

SEBI finds no manufacturing at **Gensol's EV plant**

New Delhi, April 20: Mar kets regulator SEBI has said it found "no manufacturing ac tivity" at Gensol Engineering's electric vehicle (EV) plant in Pune with only 2-3 labourers present when a National Stock Exchange (NSE) official visited the site.

These revelations were part of markets regulator SEBI's interim order issued April 15 following a complaint received in June 2024 alleging manipulation of Gensol's share price and misappropriation of

In its order, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) found discrepancies as well as misleading disclosures to investors by Gensol Engi neering, a company promot

ed by brothers Anmol Singh Jaggi and Puneet Singh Jaggi One of the disclosures came

from an investigation conducted by the NSE, which revealed a lack of manufacturing activ ity at Gensol's EV plant -- Gensol Electric Vehicle Private Ltd -- at Chakan in Pune.

During a site visit to the facility on April 9, an NSE of ficial found only 2-3 labourers present. "It was found that there was no manufacturing activity at the plant with only 2-3 labourers present there The NSE official called for details of electricity bills of the unit and it was observed that the maximum amount billed by Mahavitaran during the last 12 months was ₹1,57,037.01 for December 2024. Hence, it can be inferred that there has been no manufacturing activ ity at the plant site which is on a leased property," SEBI revealed in its interim order passed April 15

The visit followed an announcement by Gensol to the stock exchanges on January 28, 2025, claiming it had received pre-orders for 30,000 units of its newly launched EVs showcased at the Bharat Mobility Global Expo 2025.

However, upon reviewing the documents provided by the company, SEBI found that the orders were Memorandum of Understandings (MoUs) en tered with nine entities for 29,000 cars. The MoUs were in the nature of an expression of willingness with no reference to the price of the vehicle or delivery schedules.

Therefore, it prima facie appeared that the company was making misleading disclosures to investors, SEBI stated.

Indian toy makers keen to leverage 'golden opportunity'

New Delhi, April 20: India's toy exporters are aiming to utilise a "golden opportunity" emerging out of the steep tariffs imposed by the US on Chinese imports, and growing enquiries from American buyers eyeing alternative markets to reduce their reliance on Chinese goods.

Toy Association of India has identified about 40 firms with the potential to export to the US market while meeting the compliance requirements.

Currently, about 20 companies export toys in bulk to the American market, President Ajay Aggarwal told PTI.

"We are getting more enquiries from US-based toy buyers in the last one month. Some Indian export houses have also got in touch with us seeking a list of the manufacturers who can make toy products as per US rules and regulations.

They are looking for white labelling and original equipment manufacturers capable of meeting the compliance re-



quirements of the American toy market," Aggarwal said. According to GMI Research,

the United States' toy market size touched USD 42.8 billion in 2024 and is estimated to

reach USD 56.9 billion in 2032, growing at a CAGR of 3.6 per cent from 2025-2032, fuelled by

a shift in consumer preferences towards educational and interactive tovs

"The US is a big market for toys and we will be benefited if China is subjected to high tariffs and India is on a low tariff. Already about 20 companies from India in the toy sector are exporting to the US If we get the benefit of tar-

iff in terms of the rates being lower than other countries, we can increase the presence of Indian toys in the US market," the Toy Association of India President said. The association is organising

a seminar "very soon" with the manufacturers who are ready to export to the US market, he said, adding that this is "a golden opportunity for Indian toy manufacturers as the US is the biggest toy market in the

Aggarwal said with the support of the government, the domestic toy industry will be able to increase its exports which currently stand at less than 1 per cent globally.

Win IPL Clasico RCB exact sweet revenge

Rohit, Suryakumar guide Mumbai Indians to comfortable nine-wicket win over Chennai Super Kings

Mumbai, April 20: Skipper Rohit Sharma (76 not out) and Suryakumar Yaday (68 not out) tore apart Chennai Super Kings to hand Mumbai Indians a commanding nine-wicket win in an one-sided Indian Premier League match here Sunday.

Chasing a below-par target, the hosts faced absolutely no difficulties on a batting-friendly surface in swatting away the challenge as they went over the line making 177 for one to win by more than four overs to spare, and take a leap to sixth spot in the points table.

Rohit capitalised on anything short from the pacers in the powerplay and swept with command against the CSK spinners to notch up his maiden fifty of the season, which came off 33

On a six-hitting spree, Rohit finished at 76 not out off 45 balls with four fours and six hits over the fence.

MI's impact substitute Rohit laid the foundation with a robust 63-run stand for the first wicket in the powerplay -- their

best start undoubtedly in this IPL -- and ensured the hosts remained on track for a big win keeping them at a scoring rate

of 10 per over.

For CSK, it was a challenge stopping the former MI skipper in his tracks especially with their seamers failing to make any impact and seasoned spinners in Ravichandran Ashwin (0/25) and Ravindra Jadeja (1/28) not able to extract anything off the surface either.

Justice (Retd) V Eswaraiah, who serves as the ethics officer for the HCA, made the decision based on a petition submitted by Lords Cricket Club, a member unit of the state association.

The petition accused former HCA president Azharuddin of misusing his position by making arbitrary decisions. Specifically, it alleged that Azharuddin violated HCA rules by participating in an Apex Council meeting as the then-president in December 2019, during which a resolution was passed to name the North Stand after him - just a month after he assumed office. As per the HCA constitution, such a resolution requires ratification by the General Body.

Azharuddin served as the president of the HCA from September 2019 to September 2023.

NADA's anti-doping blitz rocks Indian athletics

Seven athletes suspended for 'evading' test, three coaches for 'complicity' in doping

New Delhi, April 20: A slew of dope cases rocked Indian athletics with junior national team chief coach Ramesh Nagpuri suspended by the NADA for "complicity" in doping while seven athletes were also in dock for "evading" tests .

Two more coaches -- Karamveer Singh and Rakesh -- were also suspended for "complicity" and "administration of prohibited substances" respectively.

The seven athletes suspended for "evasion" in the latest list of dope offenders published by the National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA) were Paras Singhal, Pooja Rani, Nalubo-



thu Shanmuga Sreenivas Chelimi Pratusha, Shubham Mahara, Kiran and Jyoti.

The 19-year-old Singhal had won the boys 2,000m steeple chase for Haryana at the Khe lo India Youth Games in 2024 Sreenivas won a silver each in 200m in the Federation Cup, National Inter-State Championships and National Open in 2024

Nagpuri, based at the Sports Authority of India Centre in Hyderabad and appointed junior chief coach by Athletics Federation of India (AFI) in 2023, is a renowned Dronacha rya Awardee coach.

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
