Make no deals with US: China

In a strongly-worded message to countries seeking to strike bilateral deals with US, China has said that it would not hesitate to impose countermeasures on them, if its interests are hampered. The Dragon's tough stand comes in the backdrop of reports that a number of countries against whom US President Donald Trump has imposed varied amounts of tariffs are now seeking to work out bilateral trade deals with Washington to resume their exports to access the lucrative US market. Since a host of countries, including Japan and the ASEAN, have lucrative trade with both China and the US, China's firm stand is very likely to leave these countries in a quandary. Significantly, US has recently imposed 245% tariffs against China but paused tariff hikes against around 70 countries. Observers, meanwhile, said that the move would likely to give advantages to Indian exports to China and the United States vis-a-vis Japan and ASEAN countries.

ners while pressuring them to engage in so-called "reciprocal tariff" negotiations, the spokesperson said.

"This is essentially using the banner of 'reciprocity' as a pretext to pursue hegemonic politics and unilateral bullying in the field of international economy and trade," the spokesperson said.

China's tough stand came against the backdrop of reports that a number of countries against whom US President Donald Trump imposed varied amounts of tariffs are now seeking to work out bilateral trade deals with Washington to resume their exports to access the lucrative US market.

The Wall Street Journal last week reported that the US plans to use tariff negotiations to pressure dozens of countries into imposing new barriers on trade with China.

Countries, including Japan and the ASEAN, have lucrative trade with both China and the US. China's firm stand will leave these countries in a quandary.

The spokesperson emphasised that appeasement does not bring peace, compromise does not lead to respect, and attempts to trade the interests of others for tariff exemptions are doomed to fail and will ultimately harm all the parties.

China respects all parties that seek to resolve their trade disputes with the US through equal consultation, the spokesperson said, calling on all parties to stand on the side of fairness and justice, align with the right side of history, and uphold international economic and trade rules and the multilateral trading system.

In the face of unilateralism and protectionism, no country can remain unaffected, the spokesperson said. "Once international trade reverts to the law of the jungle, where the strong prey on the weak, all countries will suffer," the spokesperson said.

Meanwhile, experts observed that the move would keep India in an advantageous position when it comes to exports to China and US vis-a-vis Japan and ASEAN nations.

Beijing, April 21: China Monday threatened to impose countermeasures on countries seeking to strike trade deals with the US at the expense of Chinese interests.

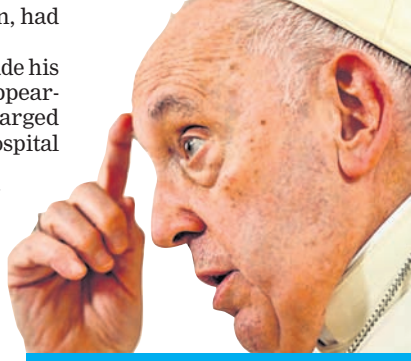
The Chinese Commerce Ministry spokesperson made these remarks while responding to reports that the US is preparing to pressure other countries to restrict trade ties with China in exchange for tariff exemptions, state-run Xinhua news agency reported.

China firmly opposes any deal between the US and its trading partners at the expense of Chinese interests, the spokesperson said in a statement.

"If such a situation arises, China will not accept it and will resolutely take corresponding countermeasures," the statement said, adding that China has the right to resolve and the capability to safeguard its legitimate rights and interests.

Under the guise of so-called "reciprocity", the US has been recently arbitrarily imposing tariffs on all its trading part-

The Vatican said a ceremony planned for Sunday, April 27, when Carlo Acutis was to become the first Catholic saint of the millennial generation, had been postponed.

Francis had Sunday made his first prolonged public appearance since being discharged March 23 from a 38-day hospital stay for pneumonia.

In an Easter Sunday message read aloud by an aide as the pope looked on from the main balcony of St. Peter's Basilica, the pontiff had reiterated his call for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza.

At the Vatican, locals, tourists and pilgrims visiting for Easter expressed their shock and grief.

"This is something that really hits you hard," said Emanuela Tinari, from Rome. "He was a pope who brought so many people closer to the church.

Pope Francis dies at 88

Vatican City, April 21: Pope Francis, the first Latin American leader of the Roman Catholic Church, has died, the Vatican said Monday, ending an often turbulent reign marked by division and tension as he sought to overhaul the hide-bound institution.

He was 88, and had suffered a serious bout of double pneumonia this year, but his death came as a shock after he had been driven around St. Peter's Square in an open-air popemobile to greet cheering crowds on Easter Sunday.

"Dear brothers and sisters, it is with profound sadness I must announce the death of our Holy Father Francis," Cardinal Kevin Farrell announced on the Vatican's TV channel.

"At 7:35 (0535 GMT) this morning the Bishop of Rome, Francis, returned to the house of the Father," it said.

Sambalpur, April 21: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Monday said that 88 per cent of the 9,377 grievance petitions received by the Chief Minister's Grievance Cell have been resolved. The CM said this during a public grievance hearing at Sambalpur in Western Odisha.

This is for the first time that an Odisha chief minister held a public grievance hearing session outside the state capital.

"We will take the government to different regions of the state so that the people can come for redress of their grievances," Majhi told reporters after the session.

He said people from Western Odisha, during the previous BJD government, could not meet the CM and seek justice from the government.

Missing Delang minor found dead; uncle held

Delang, April 21: An 11-year-old boy, who had been missing since April 15 evening, was found dead in a septic tank just 200 metre from his home at Ratanpur under this police limits in Puri district, police said Monday.

Deceased Ashirbad Sahoo's uncle Pravakar Sahoo, 34, alias Bapi has been arrested from Chandanpur late Sunday night on the charge of killing the minor, they added.

Reports said Ashirbad 'disappeared' mysteriously from near his home April 15 evening following which his parents lodged a missing complaint with Delang police.

Police, fire services personnel, dog squad and forensic officials searched for the missing minor the next day, but to no avail.

The mysterious disappearance of the minor and subsequent failure of the police to trace him saw widespread resentment among the villagers.

On Sunday, villagers, led by former MLA Rudra Mahara-

thy and local political activist Ashok Pradhan, staged a dharna in front of Delang police station, demanding that the case be handed over to Crime Branch for a detailed probe.

About cracking the case, police said Pravakar was among those who had been quizzed during the investigation.

"However, we grew suspicious over him when he was called to Delang police station for questioning Sunday evening and immediately he switched off his mobile phone to remain incommunicado," said Additional SP Bishnu Charan Pati.

The official said Pravakar was nabbed from his in-laws' house Sunday night when he confessed to the crime.

"On the basis of his admission, we recovered Ashirbad's mutilated and decomposed body from the septic tank," he said.

The boy's private parts were missing, said the police.

"We suspect Pravakar sodomised the minor before killing him. The boy's body has been sent to Puri district headquarters hospital for an autopsy.

Humanoid workers, drones reshaping daily life in China

Shenzhen, April 21: In Shenzhen's Central Park, a group of teenage girls huddle under a canopy, singing along to Mandopop hits. Their laughter echoes across the lawn, only to be interrupted by a mechanical hum. A drone from Meituan, China's leading food delivery platform, glides into view, delivering char siu pork and a waffle to an "airdrop cabinet."

With over 40 such stations in Shenzhen, hungry park-goers can order everything from noodles to bubble tea, unlocked via a phone number. Meituan's drones, zipping through the skies, aim to outpace human delivery by 10 per cent, though the food arrives slightly chilled in its polystyrene box.

This scene encapsulates China's bold push into "embodied AI," a cornerstone of its strategy to counter a shrinking workforce, bolster military prowess, and assert technological dominance amid a trade war and strained US relations, according to a report by "The



China's leaders see AI as key to upgrading military strength, solving problems created by a shrinking workforce, and a source of national pride

Guardian'. Artificial intelligence is not just a tool but a source of national pride, especially as Chinese firms navigate US sanctions on critical tech. Under Xi Jinping's leadership, Beijing is embracing tech firms once sidelined in favour of state control, now seen as vital to restoring private-sector confidence and driving innovation, the report said.

Guangdong, home to the

tech hub of Shenzhen, is leading this charge. The provincial government recently allocated 60 million yuan (£6.4m) for AI innovation centres. Shenzhen, dubbed China's drone capital, benefits from progressive regulations fostering the "low altitude economy". The Civil Aviation Administration projects this sector's value will soar to 3.5 trillion yuan in a decade, a five-fold increase. Meituan's drones are just one piece of a broader robotics revolution reshaping urban life.

Humanoid robots are stealing the spotlight. At this year's Spring Festival Gala, viewed 17 billion times, Unitree's humanoid robots dazzled with a dance performance.

Meanwhile, Beijing hosted the world's first humanoid-versus-human half marathon, signalling AI's growing integration into daily life.

These advancements reflect China's ambition to lead in embodied AI, where machines mimic human actions, from dancing to racing, the report added.

Flute, tabla sound for vehicle horns likely

New Delhi, April 21: Union Road Transport and Highways minister Nitin Gadkari Monday said he is planning to bring a law under which only the sound of Indian musical instruments can be used as a horn for vehicles.

Addressing the 78th Foundation Year Celebration of 'Navbharat Times', Gadkari said, "I am planning to make a law that horns of all vehicles should be in Indian musical instruments so that it is pleasant to hear. Flute, tabla, violin, harmonium."

The transport sector contributes to 40 per cent of the air pollution in the country, he said, adding that the Modi government is promoting vehicles that run on green and bio-fuel, including methanol, ethanol.

Gadkari noted that India gets maximum revenue from exports of two-wheeler vehicles and cars. The minister said in 2014, Indian automobile sector was valued at ₹14 lakh crore, which has now grown to ₹22 lakh crore.

India has surpassed Japan to become world's third-largest automobile market, following US and China, he added.

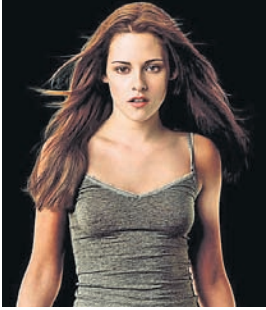

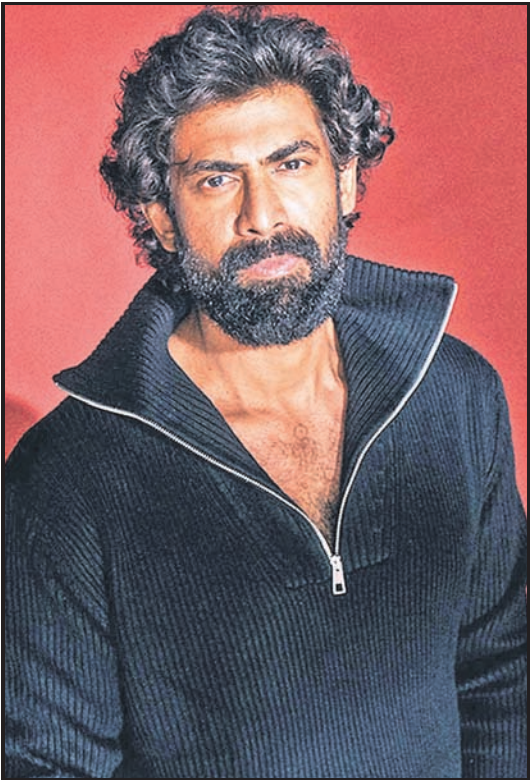
Rakul's aspirations

Mumbai: Television actress Sumbul Touqeer has revealed a long-held dream close to her heart — starring in a dance-based film.

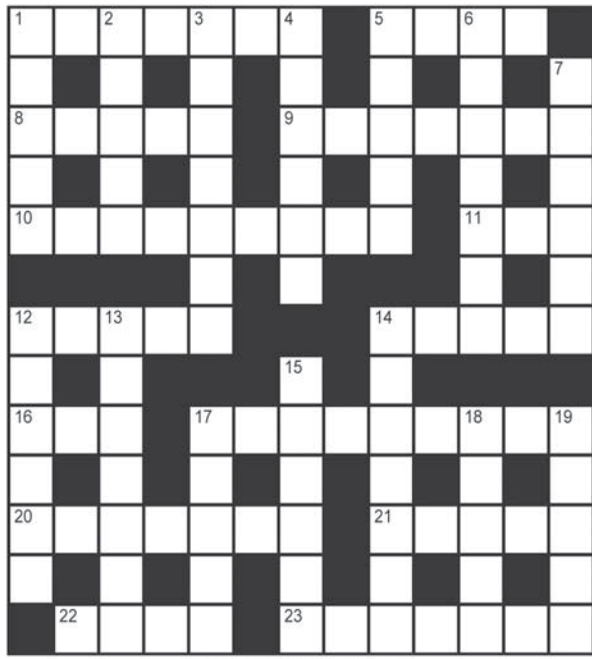

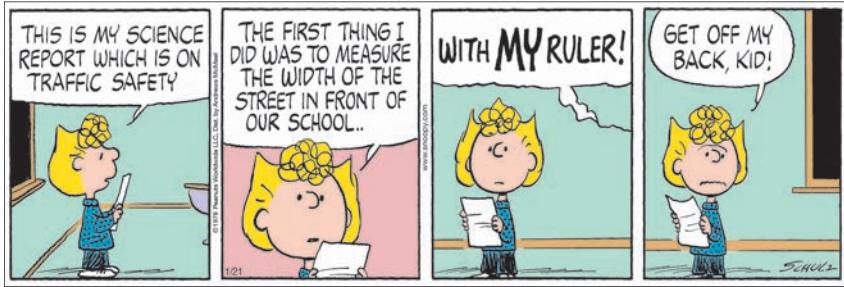

Rourkela route disrupted

Bhubaneswar, April 21: Several train services between Rourkela and Bondamunda railway stations will face temporary or partial cancellations until April 26 as the South Eastern Railway’s (SER) Chakradharpur Division is undertake critical safety-related modernisation work in the sector.

The work involves track linking and non-interlocking operations as part of the commissioning of multi-tracking lines in the Rourkela-Bondamunda section. According to railway officials, the project aims to boost the efficiency, capacity, and safety of train movement in the busy corridor.

The officials said an advisory has already been issued requesting passengers to check train schedules in advance and plan their journeys accordingly during the six days.

They said the cancelled trains include: 18452 Puri-Hatia Tapaswini Express, 18451 Hatia-Puri Tapaswini Express, 18125 Rourkela-Puri Express,

18126 Puri-Rourkela Express and 18118/18117 Gunupur-Rourkela-Gunupur Rajyarani Express

Similarly, some trains have been partially cancelled. Those are: 22862/12872 Kantabanji/ Titilagarh-Howrah Ispat Express which will operate up to Jharsuguda only, and then return to its originating station. The 22861/12871 Howrah-Kantabanji/Titilagarh Ispat Express will run up to Tatanagar only, and return thereafter.

Meanwhile, the 15028/15027 Sambalpur-Gorakhpur-Sambalpur Maurya Express will remain cancelled April 21 and April 25, while 15027 Sambalpur-Chakradharpur Maurya Express will be cancelled April 23 and April 26, they added.

In a 1st, CM hears public grievances away from capital

Sambalpur, April 21: Accompanied by 10 ministers and departmental secretaries, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Monday held a public grievance hearing session at Sambalpur in Western Odisha.

This is for the first time that an Odisha Chief Minister held a public grievance hearing session outside the state capital of Bhubaneswar.

“We will take the government to different regions of the state so that the people can come for redress of their grievances,” Majhi told reporters after the session.

He said the people from western Odisha during the previous BJD government could not meet the Chief Minister and seek justice from the government.

Majhi said, “As it is said that ‘Arakhita Ku Daiba saha’, our government is committed to provide assistance to all distressed people.”

He said the BJP government since July 2024 has held nine such sessions in Bhubaneswar and it was decided to provide such facility to the people in the western region of the state.

He claimed that 88 per cent

of the 9,377 grievance petitions received by the Chief Minister’s Grievance Cell have been addressed and people have got benefits.

On the 10th round of the Chief Minister’s public hearing programme here, as many as 1,000 people had registered their names. Another 1,368 people who could not register on the portal, also submitted their petitions. A total of 6,000 petitions were received. “Action will be taken on all the petitions,” he said.

The Chief Minister said that clear instructions have been given to officials to resolve all the complaints at the earliest.

Majhi said as part of the programme here, 18 individuals suffering from terminal illnesses were provided immediate medical assistance totalling ₹19.5 lakh from the Chief Minister’s Relief Fund through the Single Window System. A medical team was present in the grievance hearing hall and they recommended treatments after which assistance was sanctioned from the CM-RF, he said.

Majhi said the public hearing sessions are being held in different locations as per the guidance of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

People from 10 western Odisha districts — Sambalpur, Bargarh, Sundargarh, Jharsuguda, Bolangir, Boudh, Deogarh, Kalahandi, Nuapada and Subarnapur attended the session. Even the people from Koraput also submitted their petitions, Majhi said, adding that physically challenged and elderly persons were given priority in the hearing.

Panchayati Raj and Drinking Water Minister Rabi Narayan Naik said the initiative will ease people’s hassle of travelling to Bhubaneswar for hearing of their grievances by the CM.

Infiltration from B’desh sparks alarm

Kendrapara, April 21: A growing number of illegal immigrants from Bangladesh have reportedly settled in Kendrapara district by forging identity documents and securing government jobs using fake caste certificates, raising alarm among local authorities and civil society groups.

Despite presence of three dedicated marine police stations, weak coastal surveillance and lax enforcement have reportedly made Kendrapara a haven for Bangladeshi nationals entering the district illegally via the Bay of Bengal. The sea route from Bangladesh to Odisha takes only about eight hours by boat, enabling a steady flow of unauthorised migration into the coastal district.

In March, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi told the state Assembly that 3,738 Bangladeshi nationals were residing illegally in Odisha, with Kendrapara accounting for the largest share — 1,649 individuals. However, these figures have not been updated since 2004, when the district

administration first identified infiltrators.

Although 1,551 individuals were served deportation notices in 2005, little progress has been made in executing these orders. Most continue to reside in the district, said Amarabar Biswal, a local social activist.

Authorities have also flagged cases of illegal immigrants obtaining false caste certificates to secure jobs in public-sector undertakings (PSUs). A formal complaint filed by Mahakalapara resident Amitabh Chand led to an investigation by the state-level SC/ST scrutiny committee.

The panel confirmed that members of one Debanath family, who migrated from Bangladesh in 1972, had illegally acquired caste certificates and used them to gain employment in government-run corporations, including Odisha Hydro Power Corporation Ltd. (OHP-CL) and Mahanadi Coalfields Ltd. (MCL). The committee recommended administrative and criminal action against Nilima Debanath, Subhranshu Sekhar Debanath and other family members.

Voter ID fraud has emerged



as another concern. Ahead of the 2024 general election, the Kendrapara district administration cancelled 137 voter ID cards linked to Bangladeshi nationals. However, no public update has been issued regarding legal proceedings against those involved.

In another notable case, Amit Ray of Barakolikhal village continues to reside in the district despite his ration card, passport and other documents being seized on the grounds of suspected Bangladeshi origin.

Illegal settlers have been reported across several blocks, including Rajkanika, Rajnagar, Mahakalapara and Pattamundai. Civil society groups claim the influx has caused law and order challenges and are calling for the use of 1951 citizenship records and 1974 voter rolls to verify identity and initiate deportation proceedings.

Sub-Divisional Police Officer (SDPO) Jyotishankar Goud said awareness drives are ongoing, and residents are being urged to report unfamiliar individuals to local police, especially in coastal areas.

Additional District Magistrate (ADM) Nilu Mahapatra said most cases involving deportation notices remain sub judice, with courts yet to issue final directives. Meanwhile, social worker Pratap Mohanty called on authorities to take firm action to prevent the misuse of public resources by the illegal immigrants.

3 arrested from Andhra for stabbing contractor

Berhampur, April 21: Police Monday arrested three persons for allegedly stabbing a 46-year-old contractor, an officer said here.

The accused were arrested from Srikakulam in Andhra Pradesh, Superintendent of Police, Berhampur, Saravana Vivek M said.

The injured person was identified as Sonu alias Dheeraj Mohan Choudhury of Gosaninuagaon, who was allegedly stabbed by the accused persons near Ramalingam Park here Sunday evening.

After committing the crime, the accused fled to Andhra Pradesh to evade arrest. A police team arrested the trio near Srikakulam, the SP said.

“Long-standing enmity between them was stated to be the cause of the incident. However, we are still investigating to find out the exact cause of the stabbing,” he said.

The weapons used to commit the crime and the blood-soaked dresses of the victim and accused were seized, the police said.

The injured person is undergoing treatment at MKCG Medical College and Hospital here and his condition was stated to be stable.

The matter came to fore as Rajani approached the district administration after she was reportedly declared dead in official records despite being alive, and thereby, prevented from receiving the second instalment of benefits under the Subhadra Yojana.

Rajani has demanded a thorough investigation into the matter and appropriate corrective action from the administration.

ni had applied for the benefits under Subhadra Yojana and received the first instalment November 24, 2024. However, she faced a delay in receiving the second instalment and after a long wait, finally visited the nearest Jan Seva Kendra to check her status. To her shock, Rajani discovered that she had been marked as ‘dead’ in the official database. Despite being alive, government records showed her as dead, disqualifying her from further benefits under the scheme.

Finally, Rajani submitted a

memorandum to the district administration, alleging that such errors were not limited to her case alone. She claimed that many women in the district had been similarly affected and deprived of Subhadra Yojana benefits due to inaccuracies in government records.

Poor Man’s Pope

With the passing away of Pope Francis on 21 April at the age of 88, a great chapter of the papal history has been closed. Born Jorge Mario Bergoglio to Italian migrants in Buenos Aires in 1936, he made history through his elevation as the first Latin American and member of the Jesuit order to be elected Pope in the church’s existence for over 2000 years. He proved that he was extraordinary when he became the first Pope to call himself Francis, shorn of the pomp and grandeur associated with the title.

After assuming office, the Argentinean pontiff soon attracted global attention as a moderniser, with an outward-looking approach that propelled him to speak out boldly on humanitarian crises, such as migration, war and climate change. While the church was riddled with allegations of corruption and varied forms of malpractices the world over, he sought to reform it by taking head-on the elitist mentalities among the clergy. He exhorted them to display a compassionate approach to divorced and gay Catholics insisting that the church welcome everyone. This was not an easy task, given the fact that there were ultra-conservative elements within the papal establishment that found his new approach abhorrent. But, he could not care less and went on taking a series of measures to clean up financial corruption in the Vatican and fight against the scourge of clerical sexual abuse, introducing laws to hold bishops accountable for cover-ups. Francis also sought an enlarged role for women working in the Vatican and authorised priests to offer blessings to same-sex couples.

In a world fraught with religious conflicts, fanaticism and mindless wars caused by autocrats, Pope Francis tried to build bridges with the Moslems and play the role of peacemaker in the face of global conflicts, including in Ukraine and the Middle East. It is a reflection of his lofty idealism that he never took possession of the ornate papal apartments in the Apostolic Palace used by his predecessors. With a typical remark he explained his position asserting he preferred to live in a community setting for his “psychological health.”

It is a measure of his leadership that he was elected with a clear mandate to cleanse the church that had been under attack over child sexual abuse scandals and torn by infighting in the Vatican bureaucracy. But as in the case of many religious reformers, Francis too had to face fierce criticism from both the conservatives, who accused him of trampling down cherished traditions, and also the progressives, who felt he should have done much more to stem the rot.

But, as he went on with his mission in the teeth of internal dissent, Francis became a virtual global superstar. He drew huge crowds on his many foreign travels as he spared no pains to promote interfaith dialogue and peace and take the side of the marginalised, such as migrants. There is no doubt he should have done more, as progressive Catholics felt, allowing the ordination of married men as priests, shifting official teaching on homosexuality and giving a greater space for women in ministry. Despite taking a series of tough measures, Francis was unable to curb child sexual abuse and other forms of abuse that have plagued the Catholic Church.

However, at a time when the US President Donald Trump has started to rewrite world history with his ideas, including a war against migrants, the Pope tirelessly championed the causes of the underprivileged. He also became a symbol of staunch opposition to the rise of nationalist populism. It is a great tribute to him that he is known as the Pope of the poor. His humble background and work for the poor are seen as a contrast to the perceived opulence of the papacy. He came from a working-class family and throughout his career emphasised his commitment to serve the ordinary people, often speaking out against wealth inequality and advocating social justice.

His absense at this hour of global crisis would be noticeable.

HEADING FOR A SLUMP

THE TIMING

he timing could hardly have been less propitious. Just as the world economy was showing signs of stabilising, the odds of a policy-induced global recession have risen significantly. The latest update to the Brookings-FT Tiger index reveals a mixed picture, with the financial index declining and private-sector confidence crumbling even as macroeconomic data suggest a more benign scenario.

Obviously, the biggest factor is US President Donald Trump’s tariff policy, which has disrupted world trade and fueled turmoil in financial markets, undermining growth prospects that had looked promising at the start of the year. The US economy performed well in the first quarter of 2025: output and employment grew robustly through March, and inflation fell gradually. But that all changed in April with Trump’s announcement of “reciprocal” tariffs aimed at practically all US trading partners.

Since then, financial markets have been reeling, and a subsequent pause on tariffs (except on imports from China) and various carve-outs have done little to quell the whiplash effect. The uncertainty has severely dented consumer confidence and is likely to take a toll on business investment and employment growth. Making matters worse, as the costs of tariffs are passed on to US consumers and drive up inflation, the US Federal Reserve’s ability to support the economy and forestall financial turmoil will be constrained. The tariff bloodbath has already increased the probability of the US economy stalling, and US policymaking will remain fundamentally unpredictable and lacking any clear economic logic.

MEANWHILE

Meanwhile, the eurozone economy continues to operate on two tracks. Core countries such as Austria, France, and Germany are underperforming and facing enormous fiscal pressures, especially now that political turmoil is pushing up borrowing costs. By contrast, Greece, Italy, Portugal, and Spain have held up better. Looking ahead, escalating trade tensions are likely to take a toll on the manufacturing powerhouses. Elsewhere, the Japanese and British economies had been experiencing modest growth, but this may soon end, given their underlying fragilities, lack of room for policy maneuver, and exposure to global trade tensions.

China’s economy, which had been showing signs of stabilizing, now faces a major challenge. Its expanding industrial capacity has not been matched by domestic demand, and now it is facing an all-out trade war with the US. China has confronted Trump’s escalating tariffs with bravado, imposing retaliatory tariffs and other measures meant to inflict pain on the US economy. But there is a limit to this strategy, given China’s weak consumer demand and the

rush by other countries to prevent a flood of Chinese exports from landing on their shores. While China has room to use fiscal and monetary policies to bolster domestic consumption, doing so will only work if supplemented with broader confidence-building reforms.

India’s economy continues to perform well, owing to strong rural consumption and a robust services sector. It has been insulated from the worst effects of the tariffs by its expanding domestic demand, resilient financial markets, and role as an alternative supply-chain base for US corporations shifting out of China. In Brazil, an uptick in consumer spending helped offset declining exports in 2024, but loose fiscal policy resulted in inflation and weaker real (inflation-adjusted) growth. With consumer and business confidence tumbling, this could be quite a challenging year. Similarly, South Africa will continue to struggle, owing to persistent power shortages, sluggish growth, and a weakening currency.

Finally, the twin shocks of US tariffs and rising excess capacity in China will severely crimp growth in emerging-mar-

ket and developing countries, especially those that are heavily reliant on exports (such as in Southeast Asia). At the same time, trade disruptions, growing debt-service burdens, and scaled-back foreign-aid flows will exact an especially high toll on low-income countries in Africa and elsewhere.

As the Trump tariffs trigger a surge of protectionist measures around the world, the era of increasingly free, unfettered trade has come to a crashing end. While a full-scale retreat from free trade is unlikely, global trade patterns will continue to shift, regardless of how the tariffs play out.

Even before Trump wielded his tariff hatchet, international trade was already becoming more fragmented as a result of growing geopolitical fissures. And since finance tends to follow trade, fragmentation of global trade will result in weaker cross-border economic linkages overall. Even if the tariff wars subside as the economic consequences sink in, corporations around the world will be navigating a far more uncertain and volatile global landscape.

Although it is premature to assert that a worldwide recession is around the corner, the breakdown of global trade and elevated policy uncertainty will undoubtedly suppress growth. Each country will need to conserve whatever economic-policy space it has, so that it can deploy these tools to maximum effect if growth slows sharply. Reforms to promote economic flexibility and resilience, along with measures to boost domestic demand, will become crucial for weathering the turbulence.

Foundation laying observance of residential, industrial, scientific, or other structures is deemed to augur well only after Bhumi Pujan at the outset that is known to keep evil spirits at bay.

As Delhi sizzles, govt mulls heatwave action plan

New Delhi, April 21: An early warning system for heatwaves, green roofs at bus stops and special wards for heatstroke patients at all hospitals are part of the Delhi Heat Action Plan 2025 launched Monday.

The plan, aimed at combating the effects of rising temperatures, was launched by Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, who also inaugurated three Cool Roof pilot projects in the city. "Our mission is to make Delhi heat-resilient, protect lives and make every season livable for its residents," the chief minister said.

She said the government has been working extensively to reduce the impact of heatwaves, which have become increasingly frequent and intense, with the temperature



in Delhi going as high as 52.9 degrees Celsius. As part of the plan, the government has

asked hospitals to create dedicated wards equipped with ICU beds and essential medi-

cines for heatstroke patients. Cooling centres will also be set up in densely populated areas,

especially near footpaths and slums. Other initiatives include green roofs, shaded areas at bus stops and an early warning system for heatwaves, Gupta said.

The government will issue heatwave alerts through medical portals and text messages, she said. Government schools will follow stricter routines to ensure regular water intake among children and slums will be equipped with cool shelters and have access to chilled drinking water, she said.

The Chief Minister also virtually inaugurated three Cool Roof pilot projects at Kashmere Gate, Anand Vihar and Delhi Secretariat. The number of such projects will be increased soon, she said. Health Minister Pankaj Singh, PWD and Water Minister Parvesh Rana and senior officials attended the event.

AAP to boycott MCD mayor polls

New Delhi, April 21: The AAP Monday announced that it will not contest the upcoming elections for the posts of mayor and deputy mayor in the Municipal Corporation of Delhi.

The polls are scheduled to be held April 25. Addressing a press conference, former Delhi Chief Minister and Leader of Opposition in the Delhi Assembly, Atishi, said, "The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) will play the role of a strong opposition in the MCD as well. BJP did a lot of rigging during the MCD

elections but still it lost badly. Even after this, it did not stop and all the councillors were poached."

She said her party does not believe in the "politics of sabotage and horse-trading" and has therefore, decided not to participate in the mayoral contest.

"Now the BJP should form its triple engine government and fulfil its promises made to the people of Delhi without any excuses," Atishi said. AAP's Delhi unit chief Saurabh Bharradwaj, who was also present at the press conference, accused the BJP of indulging in malpractice during the delimitation process.

"The BJP had stopped the MCD election earlier too. Wards were shifted during delimitation. There was huge fraud and corruption during the process.

Booze busts, drug hauls surge in national capital

New Delhi, April 21: Delhi witnessed a two-fold increase in drug-related offences in the first three months of 2025 as compared to 2024, while offences under the Excise Act saw a jump of more than 80 per cent, as per the data shared by the police Sunday.

According to the data, between January 1 and March 31, 2025, Delhi registered a total of 2,496 cases under the Excise Act while a total of 1,382 cases were registered in 2024 during the same period. Similarly, Narcotics Drugs &

Psychotropic Substances Act violations climbed from 257 to 544 cases, averaging around six drug-related cases every day, the data read. Cases under the Arms Act also increased, from 957 last year to 1,049 this year, while those under the Gambling Act rose to 1,018 from 677 in 2024.

The spike is attributed to increased enforcement and crackdown operations across Delhi, a senior police officer said. Crimes registered under different acts, including the Arms Act and Gambling, also shot up significantly with 6,836 cases registered in the first

three months of 2025 -- a steep rise from 4,143 cases in 2024 and 4,080 in 2023 for the same period.

"The rise in Excise and NDPS cases reflected proactive policing efforts and targeted operations against bootlegging and drug peddling networks. Police are also using surveillance tools and informant networks to track syndicates across the city," the officer said.

In contrast, overall cases under the Indian Penal Code and Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita crimes saw a slight decline. Delhi recorded 63,898 such cases in the first quarter of 2025. about 710 cases a day, as compared to 64,256 last year and 82,534 in 2023.

Burglaries also dropped to 1,725 from 2,017, house thefts dropped to 3,578 from 3,644. Motor vehicle thefts remained largely unchanged, with 9,070 cases in 2025 compared to 9,080 in 2024, the data revealed. However, "other theft" cases saw an uptick, rising to 27,066 in 2025 from 24,226 last year, nearly 300 cases per day.

Delhi has emerged as a critical hub for drug trafficking, acting as a transit point for shipments across states and internationally. A senior police official explained, "Delhi's connectivity to all states and its access to international flights make it an ideal hub for drug shipments. Most of the drugs that reach Delhi are meant for bulk sale in nearby states or across the nation. Residents of Delhi are not the primary consumers; the drugs are largely transported elsewhere."

Akhilesh flays Dubey's remarks against Quraishi

Lucknow, April 21: Samajwadi Party president Akhilesh Yadav Monday slammed BJP MP Nishikant Dubey for his remarks against former CEC S Y Quraishi, saying he should refrain from commenting on a former constitutional authority who has served the nation with distinction.

In a post on X, Yadav wrote, "One who has already been discredited by his own party for making a 'personal opinion' that is not worthy of endorsement should maintain silence on a retired constitutional officer. That would be more respectful."

Dubey had said Sunday, "You (SY Quraishi) were not an elec-



tion commissioner, you were a Muslim commissioner. The maximum number of Bangladeshi infiltrators were made voters in Santal Pargana in Jharkhand during your tenure". The former Uttar Pradesh chief minister targeted the BJP over alleged electoral malprac-

tices and cited multiple instances that, according to him, raise questions on the party's democratic conduct.

"Before making any statements, BJP leaders should revisit their own long list of electoral misconducts," he said, listing out incidents like alleged manipulation in the 2022 Uttar Pradesh Assembly elections. He also cited alleged intimidation of voters in the Mirapur bypoll using armed policemen, an incident that went viral, coercion and forced withdrawal of nominations in Madhya Pradesh to ensure unopposed wins for BJP candidates and cash-for-votes allegations in Maharashtra involving a senior BJP leader.

Yadav also highlighted "unexplained spikes" in voter turnout in Haryana and Maharashtra during the last hours of voting, use of fake voters in the Milkipur bypoll in UP, where a man claimed on television that he cast six votes in favour of BJP and allegations of bribing a police officer with ₹10 lakh in Maharashtra to ignore EVM tampering.

"BJP's moral compass was never intact, and never will be. Yet, reminders are necessary," Yadav said adding those sidelined in the BJP should not attempt a comeback into the limelight with inflammatory remarks. "BJP leaders are not loyal even to their own," he said.

UP govt plans ₹2,500cr push for natural farming

Lucknow, April 21: The Uttar Pradesh government Monday said it plans to bring over 2.5 lakh farmers into the fold of natural farming across 282 blocks and 2,144 gram panchayats with investments of more than ₹2,500 crore over the next two years.

The alarming rise of heavy metals in agricultural soil has emerged as a major crisis for the farming sector, the state government said in a statement. A global report reveals that around 15 per cent of the world's cultivable land is contaminated with toxic heavy metals, affecting 1.4 billion people. Harmful elements like arsenic, cadmium, cobalt, chromium, copper, nickel, and lead have reached alarming proportions in many regions. According to biologists from the University of York, these metals enter the food chain through soil, water, and air, posing long-term health risks to humans, animals, and aquatic life, the statement said. "In view of the looming threat, the central and Uttar Pradesh governments led by

"The Yogi Adityanath government plans to bring over 2.5 lakh farmers into the fold of natural farming across 282 blocks and 2,144 gram panchayats. The initiative will be implemented through

50-hectare clusters, with an estimated investment of ₹2,500 crore over the next two years," the government said.

The government noted that natural farming is people-friendly, land-friendly, and water-friendly. After successful implementation in Bundelkhand, along the Ganga's coastal areas, natural farming is now being expanded to both banks of its tributaries, it said.

To raise awareness and provide grassroots support, 'Krishi

Sakhis' will be appointed at a monthly honorarium of ₹5,000, it said. Experts from Krishi Vigyan Kendras (KVKs) will train these women farmers in their respective districts. Additionally, two Bio-Input Research Centers (BRCs) will be established in every district to support this initiative, it added.

A unique initiative being run in Bundelkhand's seven districts -- Jhansi, Lalitpur, Jalaun, Hamirpur, Mahoba, Banda, and Chitrakoot -- focussing on cow-based natural farming.

Farmers are being trained to produce organic inputs, such as Jeevamrit, Beejamrit, and Ghanjeevamrit, using cow dung and urine. These bio-formulations are being used as natural fertilisers and pesticides in the fields. So far, 470 clusters have been formed, benefiting 21,934 farmers. A 50-hectare cluster is being developed in every gram panchayat, with financial assistance provided to farmers cultivating up to two hectares, the government said.

Lucknow, April 21: Yogi Adityanath-led Uttar Pradesh government has set an ambitious target of installing eight lakh solar rooftop plants across the state by March 2027, under the Pradhan Mantri Surya Ghar Yojana.

The goal for the current financial year has been set at 2.65 lakh units, with a monthly target of 22,000 installations -- averaging around 300 installations per district.

As of now, more than one lakh rooftop solar systems have been installed in the state. Nearly 11,000 units are being installed every month, with daily average of more than 500.

The scheme is being closely monitored through integration with the Chief Minister's dashboard, enabling real-time progress tracking, said a government official. The Uttar Pradesh New and Renewable Energy Development Agency (UPNEDA) is spearheading the implementation of the scheme,



with a mission to bring solar energy to every household.

To ensure systematic implementation, targets have been set at the district, DISCOM, municipal corporation, and municipality levels.

Of the 10.73 lakh applications received on the portal up to March 2025, the listing of vendors is currently underway, and the installation process is progressing rapidly.

As of April 2025, more than 2,500 vendors had been em-

paneled, and around 1,800 had received formal training to support the rollout.

To enhance their financial capacity, vendors are also being provided access to loans and credit guarantee schemes through banks.

Notably, the PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana is the world's largest domestic rooftop solar initiative. It has achieved a mega milestone of 10 lakh homes getting solar-powered, as March 10, 2025.

New Delhi, April 21: "As it is, we are alleged of encroaching upon the parliamentary and executive functions," Supreme Court's Justice B R Gavai said Monday in an apparent reference to recent attacks on the judiciary while hearing a matter over West Bengal violence. Justice Gavai, who was heading a bench also comprising Justice Augustine George Masih, made a similar observation in another matter. While one matter was over the recent violence in West Bengal during anti-Waqf law protests, the other plea sought a direction to the Centre to take appropriate steps to prohibit streaming of sexually explicit and pornographic content on OTT and social media platforms. While hearing the plea over online content, Justice Gavai

said, "Who can control it? It is for the Union to frame a regulation in that regard." "As it is, we are now criticised that we are interfering with the executive's function, the legislative functions," Justice Gavai told advocate Vishnu Shankar Jain who was appearing in the matter. After Jain said it was a "very serious matter", the bench posted the hearing next week. Earlier in the day, Jain mentioned an application filed in a separate pending PIL of 2021 which sought President's Rule in West Bengal in the wake of violence following Assembly polls, and urged the bench to take it up for hearing Tuesday along with the main petition. Jain said the 2021 plea was listed for hearing Tuesday and the fresh application bringing out more incidents of violence in West Bengal also be heard. "In tomorrow's list, item 42 pertains to imposition of President Rule in the state of West Bengal. That petition is filed

by me. In that petition, I have filed an IA (application) for directions and impleadment bringing out certain more incidents of violence which have happened in the state of West Bengal," he said. Jain said deployment of paramilitary force and immediate action was required. He referred to Article 355 of the Constitution, which pertains to duty of the Union to protect states against external aggression and internal disturbance, and said the apex court can call for a report as to what was happening in the state. Jain said the top court had previously issued notice on the 2021 petition. Justice Gavai then said, "As it is, we are alleged of encroaching upon the parliamentary and executive functions". The fresh plea urged the court to appoint a three-member committee headed by a retired top court judge to inquire into the incidents of violence, human rights violation and crime against

PM Modi holds talks with US Vice President Vance

New Delhi, April 21: India and the US Monday welcomed the "significant progress" in the negotiations for a mutually beneficial bilateral trade pact as Prime Minister Narendra Modi and US Vice President JD Vance held wide-ranging talks to enhance cooperation in areas of defence, energy and technologies.

Modi hosted Vance, Indian-origin US Second Lady Usha Chilukuri and their three children Ewan, Vivek and Mirabel over dinner at his 7 Lok Kalyan Marg residence after the official talks. PM Modi conveyed to Vance his warm greetings for President Donald Trump and said that he looked forward to his visit to India later this year. The Prime Minister and the vice president also exchanged views on various regional and global issues of mutual interest including the Russia-Ukraine conflict, and called for "dialogue and diplomacy" as the way forward. Vance and his family arrived in Delhi this morning on a four-day visit that came weeks after President Trump imposed and then paused a sweeping tariff regime against around 60 countries including India. New Delhi and Washington are now holding negotiations to seal a bilateral trade agreement as agreed during Modi's talks with Trump in Washington DC in February. The trade pact is



expected to address a variety of issues including tariff and market access. Prime Minister Modi and Vice President Vance "reviewed and positively assessed" the progress in various areas of bilateral cooperation, an Indian readout said. "They welcomed the significant progress in the negotiations for a mutually beneficial India-US Bilateral Trade Agreement (BTA) focused on the welfare of the people of the two countries," it said. It is for the first time that the two sides publicly announced that there has been "significant progress" in the negotiations for the BTA first tranche of which is likely to be finalised by this fall. A delegation of Indian negotiators are set to travel to the US Wednesday to hold talks with American officials on the BTA. "The Prime Minister fondly recalled his visit to Washington DC in February and his fruitful discussions with President Trump, which laid down the roadmap for close cooperation between India and the US, leveraging the strengths of Make America Great Again (MAGA) and Viksit Bharat 2047," the Indian readout said.

UP: Woman, lover kill Dubai-returned husband

Gorakhpur (UP): In a stark reminder of the gruesome murder of a former merchant navy officer in Meerut, a woman and her lover killed her husband who returned from Dubai 10 days ago, cut the body in two and stuffed it in a suitcase before dumping it in a field far away from home. Police identified the man from the airline tag that was still attached to the suitcase. Uttar Pradesh has recently witnessed two diabolical spousal murders in Meerut -- one in which the merchant navy officer's body was stuffed in a drum and the other where the husband was strangled and an attempt was made to pass it off as a case of snakebite -- that made the nation shiver in fear. Another man in Auraiya met with the same fate when just 15 days after their wedding, his new bride and her lover hired a contract killer to eliminate him. On Sunday morning, a farmer in Gorakhpur's Patkhali village discovered a trolley bag abandoned in his field.

Mamata Banerjee lays foundation stone of 1,600 MW power plant

Salboni (WB): West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee Monday laid the foundation stone for a 1,600 MW ultra-supercritical thermal power plant at Salboni in Paschim Medinipur district, asserting that the greenfield project marked a significant milestone in the state's industrial and infrastructure development. Addressing an event after laying the foundation stone, Banerjee also slammed the opposition for lambasting her government for alleged non-implementation of investment proposals in Bengal and said, "You can criticise me but you cannot ignore me... We don't say much, we do things in the right way." "I want everyone to love each other... India is a vast country but unique. We have to remember that we have different states, food, languages, cultures, religions and festivals, but we are together. We want to strengthen it, not to divide it," she added. The power plant, to be developed by JSW Energy at an investment of Rs 16,000 crore, will have two units of 800 MW each.

Chandrapur hottest in country at 45.6 degrees Celsius

Chandrapur: Chandrapur recorded a temperature of 45.6 degrees Celsius Monday, becoming the hottest city in the country, an official said. The district administration has issued a heatwave alert for three days, advising citizens to take precautions when they step out. As per the Regional Meteorological Centre (RMC), Nagpur, 11 cities in Vidarbha have recorded temperatures above 40 degrees Celsius, with Chandrapur recording the highest 45.6 degrees Celsius, which was 3.6 degrees Celsius above normal. Amravati recorded 44.6 degrees Celsius, Akola 44.1 degrees Celsius and Nagpur 43.6 degrees Celsius, the IMD said. The district has been facing intense heat waves since last week, and a heatwave alert has been issued in one or two places in Chandrapur district till April 24.

Pressure tactics go by many names

It takes a big heart to light a memorial candle and a small mind to start a bushfire. A surefire formula that involved cleaving to conquer, over two decades ago, is now showing signs of becoming a nation-devouring blaze. Tiny fragments seem flawless from a distance but are, in fact, explosive fuses awaiting ignition. There are numerous instances, documented from time to time, of the selective use of law and justice by an executive dribbling in favour of the ruling party in their unabashed pursuit of majoritarian electoral politics. The latest case is that of the demolition of a dargah in Nashik, Maharashtra, which spiraled into violence. Published reports state that the Maharashtra Waqf Tribunal and the civic body had acknowledged its decades-old existence. The judicial melee that followed saw the dargah panel move the Supreme Court, but before the plea could be heard, the civic body demolished the entire dargah. The top court in the country has undertaken the task of putting the legal aspects under the

scanner. However, the issue of political accountability for outcomes resulting from such actions remains unaddressed. And therein hangs a tale. The 2002 Sabarmati train carnage at Godhra in Gujarat was an unfortunate tragedy, which unleashed a macabre communal holocaust that left over a thousand people—largely belonging to the minority community—dead. The figures remain mired in controversy, and its aftermath, in slander. The country's current Prime Minister was the Chief Minister of Gujarat at the time. In 2012, he was cleared of complicity in the riots by the Supreme Court, a ruling that was upheld in 2022. However, the Gujarat Gaurav Yatra that Chief Minister Modi undertook—covering 5,000 kms, all 25 districts, and 182 Assembly constituencies between September 8 and October 1, 2002—not only helped him reap an electoral bonanza but also consolidated his hold over power in the state. This period of politics delivered two critical takeaways: One, it anointed Narendra Modi as the Hindu Hriday Sam-

rat (Hindu heartthrob). Two, it established majoritarianism as a political shortcut to power in the country. With some tinkering, permutations, and a plethora of combinations, it seemed to work well for him as he cruises into his third term as Prime Minister. In 2014, the BJP won 282 of the 542 Lok Sabha seats compared to a miserable 44 for the Congress. In 2019, the BJP scaled up to 303. But by 2024—after declaring its independence from the RSS—it was down to 240, short of the majority mark of 272, despite boasting of crossing 400 seats. The Congress is now up to a respectable 99 seats, while the BJP is precariously perched on the stilts of Chandrababu Naidu's Telugu Desam Party (TDP) in Andhra Pradesh and Nitish Kumar's Janata Dal (U) in Bihar. The BJP may be adept at dislodging and rolling boulders downhill, but it has scant ability to control them and little intention to guide. These

have acquired a momentum of their own and have become loose cannons swaying at will. And a loose cannon eventually turns your way. The bulldozers that went to work on set minority targets—conveniently termed "illegal"—are now careening toward new attractions. Thousands of Jain community members marched in protest April 19, anguished over the recent demolition of a 90-year-



old Digambar Jain temple in Mumbai. It was the same story: a hurried demolition to avert the length of the legal process. The action has triggered nationwide outrage among Jains. Both Akhilesh Yadav's Samajwadi Party and the Congress see a pattern in it. Lathi-wielding Bajrang Dal activists walked into churches in Odhav, Ahmedabad on Eas-

ter (April 20), shouting "Jai Shri Ram" and terrorising women and children. It was as if no law and order machinery existed. Skirmishes between the Swaminarayan sect and the Sanatanis—both belonging to the Hindu fold—just before the last state Assembly elections had ruling party politicians burning the midnight oil in a bid to settle the row, lest it affect their vote bank. In an Agra village in Uttar Pradesh, a Dalit wedding procession faced a violent attack, allegedly from upper-caste Hindus. The groom was pulled off the mare, abused, thrashed, and his gold chain forcibly taken away. What began as an inter-religious affair is now increasingly turning into an intra-caste one—with more likely to follow. This is not an isolated case. A pattern is discernible in many others. Notably, the targeting of Opposition-ruled states through the office of the Governor. In a landmark verdict, a Supreme Court bench termed the prolonged refusal of the Tamil Nadu Governor to give his assent to ten bills as illegal

and erroneous in law. The governments of many such states, which are a thorn in the Centre's flesh, now have the Apex Court to thank. Over time, a clear pattern has emerged: key constitutional functionaries are targeted by politicians holding eminent positions in the ruling BJP. Mr Nishikant Dubey is a BJP MP, as is Dinesh Sharma, a former Deputy Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh. The two have, in no uncertain terms, attacked the judiciary—and the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court in particular. All that BJP President JP Nadda had to say after such a vicious tirade was that the party disassociated itself from the criticism of the Supreme Court and rejected their comments as personal views. "It neither agrees with them nor does it ever support such remarks," he said. Pressure tactics go by many names. A spiritual guru once recited an interesting folktale. The moral of the story? When you are in deep shit, the least you can do is to keep your mouth shut.

A pontiff who shook up the Catholic Church

Vatican City, April 21: Pope Francis, history's first Latin American pontiff who charmed the world with his humble style and concern for the poor but alienated conservatives with critiques of capitalism and climate change, has died Monday. He was 88.

"At 7:35 this morning, the Bishop of Rome, Francis, returned to the home of the Father. His entire life was dedicated to the service of the Lord and of his Church Cardinal," Kevin Ferrell, the Vatican camerlengo, said in an announcement.

Francis, who suffered from chronic lung disease and had part of one lung removed as a young man, was admitted to Gemelli hospital on February 14, 2025, for a respiratory crisis that developed into double pneumonia.

He spent 38 days there, the longest hospitalisation of his 12-year papacy. From his first greeting as pope — a remarkably normal "Buonasera" ("Good evening") — to his embrace of refugees and the downtrodden, Francis signalled a very different tone for the papacy, stressing humility over hubris for a Catholic Church beset by scandal and accusations of indifference.

After that rainy night March 13, 2013, the Argentine-born Jorge Mario Bergoglio brought a breath of fresh air into a 2,000-year-old institution that had seen its influence wane during the troubled tenure of Pope Benedict XVI, whose surprise resignation led to Francis' election.

But Francis soon invited troubles of his own, and conservatives grew increasingly upset with his progressive bent, outreach to LGBTQ+ Catholics and crack-down on traditionalists. His greatest test came in 2018 when he botched a notorious case of

clergy sexual abuse in Chile, and the scandal that festered under his predecessors erupted anew on his watch.

And then Francis, the crowd-loving, globe-trotting pope of the peripheries, navigated the unprecedented reality of leading a universal religion through the coronavirus pandemic from a locked-down Vatican City.

REFORMING THE VATICAN

Francis was elected on a mandate to reform the Vatican bureaucracy and finances but went further in shaking up the church without changing its core doctrine. "Who am I to judge?" he replied when asked about a purportedly gay priest.

The comment sent a message of welcome to the LGBTQ+ community and those who felt shunned by a church that had stressed sexual propriety over unconditional love. "Being homosexual is not a crime," he told The Associated Press in 2023, urging an end to civil laws that criminalise it.

Stressing mercy, Francis changed the church's position on the death penalty, calling it inadmissible in all circumstances. He also declared the possession of nuclear weapons, not just their use, was "immoral".

In other firsts, he approved an agreement with China over bishop nominations that had vexed the Vatican for decades, met the Russian patriarch and charted new relations with the Muslim world by visiting the Arabian Peninsula and Iraq.

He reaffirmed the all-male, celibate priesthood and upheld the church's opposition to abortion, equating it to "hiring a hitman to solve a problem".

ROLES FOR WOMEN

But he added women to import-

ant decision-making roles and allowed them to serve as lectors and acolytes in parishes. He let women vote alongside bishops in periodic Vatican meetings, following longstanding complaints that women do much of the church's work but are barred from power.

Sister Nathalie Becquart, whom Francis named to one of the highest Vatican jobs, said his legacy was a vision of a church where men and women existed in a relationship of reciprocity and respect.

THE CHURCH AS REFUGE

While Francis did not allow women to be ordained, the voting reform was part of a revolutionary change in emphasizing what the church should be: a refuge for everyone — "todos, todos, todos" ("everyone, everyone, everyone") — not for the privileged few.

Migrants, the poor, prisoners and outcasts were invited to his table far more than presidents or powerful CEOs.

Francis demanded his bishops apply mercy and charity to their flocks, pressed the world to protect God's creation from climate disaster, and challenged countries to welcome those fleeing war, poverty and oppression.

WHAT'S NEXT AFTER POPE FRANCIS' DEATH?

The death of a pope starts a centuries-old ritual involving sacred oaths by the cardinals electing a successor, the piercing of ballots with a needle and thread after they're counted, and then burning them to produce either the white or black smoke to signal if there's a new leader for the world's 1.3 billion Catholics.

The election itself is shrouded in secrecy, with cardinals forbidden from communicating with the outside world what happened during the voting in the conclave behind the frescoed walls of the Sistine Chapel.

St John Paul II rewrote the regulations on papal elections in a 1996 document that remains largely in force, though Pope Benedict XVI amended it twice before he resigned.

Here is what happens when a pope dies, a period known as the "sede vacante", or the "vacant See".

Who's in charge?

If the pope has died, the camerlengo, or chamberlain, must certify the death and seal the papal apartment. He runs administrative and financial duties of the Holy See until a new pope takes over. The largely ceremonial job of camerlengo is currently held by Cardinal Kevin Farrell, the Irish-born American head of the Vatican's laity office. Nearly all prefects of Vatican offices lose their jobs when a pope dies, but a few stay on, including the foreign minister and the master of liturgical ceremonies, who plays a key role in assembling the conclave. The dean of the College of Cardinals summons the cardinals for the funeral, presiding at the Mass before the conclave begins. That position is currently held by Cardinal Giovanni Battista Re, the retired head of the Vatican's office for bishops. In November 2024, Francis reformed the rites to be used for his funeral, simplifying them to emphasize his role as a mere bishop and allowing for burial outside the Vatican. Francis has chosen to be buried in St Mary Major Basilica, where his favourite icon of the Virgin Mary, the Salus Populi Romani, is located.

What's the timing?

The death of a pope begins a precise sequence of events that include the confirmation of death in the pontiff's home, the transfer of the coffin to St. Peter's Basilica for public viewing, a funeral Mass and burial. Interment must take place between the fourth and sixth day after his death. After the funeral, there are nine days of official mourning, known as the "novendial". During this period, the cardinals arrive in Rome. To give everyone time to assemble, the conclave must begin 15-20 days after the "sede vacante" is declared, although it can start sooner if the cardinals agree.

Who can elect a pope?

Only cardinals under age 80 are eligible, and current regulations limit the number of electors to 120. According to the most recently updated Vatican statistics, there were 135 cardinals under age 80 and eligible to vote, though that number may change before the conclave begins. Those over 80 can't vote but can participate in pre-conclave meetings, known as general congregations, in which church problems are discussed. It was in these meetings in 2013 that then-Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio spoke about the need for the church to go to the "existential peripheries" to find those who suffer — an off-the-cuff speech that helped his election.

WHO ARE POSSIBLE CANDIDATES?

- Cardinal Pietro Parolin of Italy, 70, Francis' secretary of state and a veteran Vatican diplomat.
- Cardinal Marc Ouellet of Canada, 80, head of the Vatican's bishops office from 2010 to 2023.
- Cardinal Christoph Schoenborn of Austria, 80, a student of Pope Benedict XVI, and thus ostensibly having appeal for conservatives.
- Cardinal Luis Tagle of the Philippines, 67, brought by Francis to head the Vatican's massive missionary office.
- Cardinal Matteo Zuppi of Italy, 69, a Francis protégé who headed the Italian bishops conference.

Hindu temple vandalised

Toronto, April 21: A temple in Canada's Surrey has been defaced by vandals with pro-Khalistan graffiti at its entrance and the pillars, authorities said.

The incident took place April 19 at the Shree Lakshmi Narayana Mandir in Surrey, the temple said in a statement.

"It is with deep sorrow that we inform the community of a disturbing incident that took place in the early hours of April 19, 2025, at approximately 3:00 AM. Two unidentified individuals vandalised the Shree Lakshmi Narayana Mandir in Surrey by defacing the entrance sign and the temple pillars with the word 'Khalistan', the statement said.

Also, the security camera was stolen during this act.

"We strongly condemn this hateful act of vandalism and theft, which is not only a crime



but a direct attack on a sacred space that serves as a spiritual and cultural centre for many families, including elderly members and children," it said.

"An FIR has been officially registered with the Surrey Police, and we are cooperating fully with the authorities in their investigation," the statement added.

"We urge members of the public and leaders at all levels of government to join us in condemning this hate crime. Attacks on places of worship have no place in a respectful and diverse society of Canada," it said.

Russia 'positive' on peace proposals

Moscow, April 21: Fighting in Ukraine has resumed after the Easter ceasefire, Russia's President Vladimir Putin said Monday, adding that Moscow was open to any peace initiatives and expected similar attitude from Kyiv.

Both Ukraine and Russia accused each other of thousands of strikes and violating the Kremlin's unilateral ceasefire during the Easter celebrations.

"We always have a positive attitude towards a truce, which is why we came up with such an initiative, especially since we are talking about the bright Easter days," Putin told a state TV reporter, Pavel Zarubin.

"We have always talked about this, that we have a positive attitude towards any peace initiatives. We hope that



representatives of the Kyiv regime will feel the same way," he added.

Washington has said it would welcome an extension

of the truce, and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy reiterated several times Ukraine's willingness to agree a pause strikes on civilian in-

frastructure for 30 days in the war.

Putin said Russia has to carefully study this and other proposals.

Kremlin pleased with US position on NATO

The Kremlin said Monday that the position of US President Donald Trump's administration on ruling out NATO membership for Ukraine gave Moscow satisfaction, but declined to comment on Trump's hopes for a peace deal this week. Trump, seeking to be remembered as a peacemaker, has repeatedly said he wants to end the "bloodbath" of the three-year conflict in Ukraine - which his administration casts as a proxy war between the United States and Russia. US envoy General Keith Kellogg said Sunday that NATO alliance membership was "off the table" for Ukraine. Trump has said past US support for that was a cause of the war. "We have heard from Washington at various levels that Ukraine's membership in NATO is excluded," Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov told reporters. "Of course, this is something that causes us satisfaction and coincides with our position." Ukrainian membership of the US-led alliance would threaten Russian interests, Peskov added. "And, in fact, this is one of the root causes of this conflict." Trump said Sunday he hopes Russia and Ukraine will make a deal this week to end the conflict. "BOTH WILL THEN START TO DO BIG BUSINESS WITH THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, WHICH IS THRIVING, AND MAKE A FORTUNE!" Trump said in a post on Truth Social.

Sudan's paramilitaries kill over 30 in Darfur

Cairo, April 21: Sudan's notorious paramilitary group attacked a city in the western Darfur region, killing more than 30 people, an activist group said, in the latest deadly offensive on an area that is home to hundreds of thousands of displaced people.

The Rapid Support Forces and allied militias launched an offensive on el-Fasher, the provincial capital of North Darfur province, Sunday, the Resistance Committees in the city said. Dozens of other people were wounded in the attack, said the group, which tracks the war.

El-Fasher, more than 800 kilometres southwest of the capital, Khartoum, is under the control of the military, which has fought the RSF since Sudan descended into civil war more than two years ago, killing more than 24,000 people, according to the UN.

EPFO adds 16.10L net members in Feb

New Delhi: Retirement fund body EPFO added 16.10 lakh net members in February, marking a 3.99 per cent increase compared to the same month last year, according to the latest payroll data released Monday. Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) enrolled around 7.39 lakh new subscribers in February 2025, a labour ministry statement said. This addition of new subscribers can be attributed to growing employment opportunities, increased awareness of employee benefits, and EPFO's successful outreach programs, the ministry stated. The EPFO has released provisional payroll data for February 2025, revealing a net addition of 16.10 lakh members, according to the statement. The year-on-year analysis reveals a growth of 3.99 per cent in net payroll additions compared to February 2024, signifying increased employment opportunities and heightened awareness of employee benefits, bolstered by EPFO's effective outreach initiatives.

DBT helped govt save ₹3.48L-cr

New Delhi: The Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) has helped India achieve cumulative savings of ₹3.48 lakh crore by plugging leakages in welfare delivery, according to a report by BlueKraft Digital Foundation. The report, which was shared by the finance ministry, evaluated data from 2009 to 2024 to examine the impact of DBT on budgetary efficiency, subsidy rationalisation, and social outcomes. "India's DBT system has helped the country achieve cumulative savings of ₹3.48 lakh crore by plugging leakages in welfare delivery. The report also finds that subsidy allocations have been halved from 16 per cent to 9 per cent of total government expenditure since the implementation of DBT, reflecting a major improvement in the efficiency of public spending," the report said. According to the report, the data on subsidy allocations showed a significant shift post-DBT implementation, highlighting improvements in fiscal efficiency despite a surge in beneficiary coverage. In the pre-DBT era (2009-2013), subsidies averaged 16 per cent of the total expenditure, amounting to ₹2.1 lakh crore annually, with considerable leakages in the system.

New Delhi, April 21: Gold prices inched closer to the psychological mark of ₹1 lakh per 10 grams as the bullion rates surged ₹1,650 in the national capital Monday on weak dollar and uncertainties over US-China trade war driving demand. According to the All India Sarafa Association, the yellow metal of 99.9 per cent purity reached ₹99,800 per 10 grams Monday. Its value had declined ₹20 to close at ₹98,150 per 10 grams Friday. Gold of 99.5 per cent purity bounced ₹1,600 to hit a fresh peak of ₹99,300 per 10 grams in the local markets. It had fallen marginally to settle at ₹97,700 per 10 grams in the previous market close. So far this year, the yellow metal prices have risen ₹20,850, or 26.41 per cent, per 10 grams since December 31, last year. Silver prices also appreciated ₹500 to ₹98,500 per kg. The white metal had traded flat at ₹98,000 per kg Friday.



"This year, gold and silver prices have experienced significant movements due to ongoing trade tensions, rate cut expectations, geopolitical uncertainties and weakening dollar. So far, gold has soared over 25 per cent, including a 6 per cent gain since April 2 tariff announcement by the US administration," Satish Dondapati, Fund Manager at Kotak Mahindra AMC, said. On the Multi Commodity Exchange, gold futures for June

delivery jumped ₹1,621, or 1.7 per cent, to touch a fresh high of ₹96,875 per 10 grams. In the international markets, spot gold rose to hit a fresh peak of USD 3,397.18 per ounce. Later, it pared some gains to trade at USD 3,393.49 per ounce. Globally, gold futures breached the psychological USD 3,400-mark for the first time ever, rising USD 80 per ounce, or 2.4 per cent. "Gold prices continued their positive momentum and have

Govt slaps 12% safeguard duty on steel products for 200 days

New Delhi, April 21: India Monday imposed a 12 per cent provisional safeguard duty for 200 days on five steel product categories, including hot rolled coils, sheets and plates, to protect domestic players from surge in imports. The decision follows a recommendation for the same by the Commerce Ministry's investigation arm DGTR. Last month, the DGTR suggested to impose the duty. "...the Central Government after considering the said findings of the Director General (Trade Remedies), hereby imposes...a provisional safeguard duty at the rate of twelve per cent ad valorem," according to a notification of the Department of Revenue. It said that the safeguard duty imposed under this notification shall be effective for a period of 200 days (unless revoked, superseded or amended earlier) from the date of publication of this notification. The government has set the



import prices between USD 675 per tonne to USD 964 per tonne for the five steel product categories. Any shipment imported below these import prices would attract the safeguard duty. The safeguard duty shall not be imposed on the product categories when imported into India at or above the specified import price on CIF (cost insurance freight) basis, according to the notification. The product categories are Hot Rolled coils, sheets and plates; Hot Rolled Plate Mill Plates; Cold Rolled Coils and Sheets; Metallic Coated Steel Coils and Sheets; and Colour

Minors above 10 yrs can operate bank a/c

Mumbai, April 21: The Reserve Bank Monday permitted banks to allow minors above the age of 10 years to open and operate savings/term deposit accounts independently. The Reserve Bank of India has issued revised instructions on opening and operation in the deposit accounts of minors. Minors of any age may be allowed to open and operate savings and term deposit accounts through his/ her natural or legal guardian, the RBI said in a circular addressed to commercial banks and cooperative banks. They may also be allowed to open such accounts with their mother as guardian. "Minors above such an age limit not less than 10 years and up to such amount and such terms as may be fixed by the banks keeping in view their risk management policy, may be allowed to open and operate savings/ term deposit accounts independently, if they so desire, and such terms shall be duly conveyed to the account holder," the circular said. Further, on attaining the age of majority, fresh operating instructions and specimen



signature of the account holder should be obtained and kept on record. "The banks are free to offer additional banking facilities like internet banking, ATM/debit cards, cheque book facility, etc, to the minor account holders basis their risk management policy, product suitability and customer appropriateness," the circular said. The banks will have to ensure that accounts of minors, whether operated independently or through a guardian, are not allowed to be overdrawn and that these always remain in a credit balance. Also, the banks shall perform customer due diligence for opening of deposit accounts of minors and undertake ongoing due diligence, RBI added. The RBI has asked banks to make new or amend existing policies to align them with the revised guidelines, latest by July 1, 2025.

Key infra sectors growth slows to 3.8 pc in March

New Delhi, April 21: The output of eight key infrastructure sectors slowed down to 3.8 per cent in March, as against 6.3 per cent growth registered a year ago, according to official data released Monday. On a monthly basis, the growth rate in the production of these sectors was slightly higher than the 3.4 per cent expansion recorded in February. In March, production of crude oil and natural gas recorded a negative growth. The production growth of coal, refinery products, steel and electricity moderated to 1.6 per cent, 0.2 per cent, 7.1 per cent, and 6.2 per cent, respectively. Fertiliser production rose by 8.8 per cent in March 2025 against 1.3 per cent contraction in the same month last year. Cement production growth rose to 11.6 per cent in March 2025 from 10.6 per cent in the year-ago month. The growth of core sectors -- coal, crude oil, natural gas, refinery products, fertiliser, steel, cement and electricity -- was 4.4 per cent during April-March 2024-25 fiscal.

Google settles Android Smart TV case with CCI

New Delhi, April 21: Technology major Google Monday settled with the Competition Commission a nearly four-year-old case related to alleged unfair business practices with respect to Android Smart TV market and has agreed to modify its agreement with vendors. This is the first case that has been settled under the amended Competition Act, wherein the settlement and commitment provisions were introduced in 2023. In the nearly four-year-old case, Google proposed settlement, including a modified agreement with the vendors that would address anti-competitive concerns and also paid a settlement amount of ₹20.24 crore. The settlement order Monday also came at a time when US Vice President JD Vance started his four-day India visit. Al-

so, India is hoping to reach an agreement with the US within the 90-day pause on steep tariffs announced by President Donald Trump. "The Commission considered the settlement proposal and observed that under the 'New India Agreement', Google will provide a standalone licence for the Play Store and Play Services for Android smart TVs in India, thereby removing the requirement to bundle these services or impose default placement conditions. Additionally, by waiving the need for a valid Android Compatibility Commitments (ACC) for devices shipped into India that do not include Google apps, OEMs can now sell and develop incompatible Android devices without violating the Television App Distribution Agreement (TADA)," the regulator said in a release Monday.

Stock markets rally for 5th day

Mumbai, April 21: Rallying for the fifth day in a row, benchmark Sensex jumped 855 points to close above the 79,000 mark on heavy buying in banking and IT shares following strong quarterly results and foreign fund inflows. The 30-share BSE Sensex jumped 855.30 points or 1.09 per cent to settle at 79,408.50 with 23 of its components ending in green. During the day, it surged 1,081.85 points or 1.37 per cent to 79,635.05. The NSE Nifty climbed 273.90 points or 1.15 per cent to close at 24,125.55 as 39 of its constituents advanced and 11 declined. In the five-day rally, Sensex jumped by 5,561.35 points or over 7 per cent and Nifty surged by 1,726.40 points, recouping all the losses triggered by imposition of reciprocal tariffs by US President Donald Trump tariffs April 2. Among Sensex scrips, Tech Mahindra, IndusInd Bank, Power Grid, Bajaj Finserv, Mahindra & Mahindra, HCL Tech, State Bank of India, Kotak Mahindra Bank, Infosys, HDFC Bank and Reliance Industries were the biggest gainers. Adani Ports, Hindustan



Unilever, ITC, Asian Paints and Nestle were among the laggards. HDFC Bank shares climbed over 1 per cent after the leading private lender reported a 7 per cent growth in its consolidated net profit for the March quarter to ₹18,835 crore. Infosys shares rallied over 2 per cent after the company's March quarter net profit rose by 3.3 per cent sequentially. Reliance Industries shares surged nearly 2 per cent which also boosted the rally in benchmark indices.

The BSE midcap gauge surged 2.20 per cent and the smallcap index jumped 1.67 per cent. On the market rally, Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Investments Ltd, said, "The bulls took over, which led the Nifty to cross 24k in the third attempt over the last 3 months and fuelled Bank Nifty to touch a new high. The possibility of a bilateral trade agreement with the US is adding optimism in the market." The better results from bank stocks owing to improved asset

quality and credit growth attracted investors, analysts said. "A contrarian bet on IT due to its attractive valuation with an expectation of improvement in spending in the latter half of FY26 is keeping the counter busy. While the dollar index slumps to a three-year low, another layer of uncertainty may attract more FII inflows into the domestic market in the near term," Nair added. All BSE sectoral indices ended higher, with oil & gas soaring 2.61 per cent, power (2.49 per cent), BSE Focused IT (2.42 per cent), IT (2.31 per cent), realty (2.27 per cent), auto (2.12 per cent) and metal (2 per cent). As many as 2,918 stocks advanced while 1,168 declined and 161 remained unchanged on the BSE. In the past five days, the BSE benchmark gauge zoomed 5,561.35 points or 7.53 per cent, and the Nifty surged 1,726.4 points or 7.70 per cent. In Asian markets, South Korea's Kospi index and Shanghai SSE Composite settled in the positive territory while Tokyo's Nikkei 225 ended lower. Markets were closed in Hong Kong. Global oil benchmark Brent crude declined 2.71 per cent to USD 66.25 a barrel.

Axed duo makes comeback

IYER AND KEEPER-BATTER KISHAN WERE DROPPED FROM BCCI LIST LAST YEAR FOR ALLEGEDLY IGNORING DOMESTIC CRICKET

New Delhi, April 21: The BCCI Monday retained megastars Rohit Sharma and Virat Kohli in the top bracket of its annual players contract list, less than 24 hours after they played sublime knocks to win IPL games for their respective franchises.

The out-of-favour duo of Shreyas Iyer and Ishan Kishan also returned to the fold in lower brackets in a 34-strong list of centrally-contracted players, which also includes pace spearhead Jasprit Bumrah and Ravindra Jadeja in the high-est-paid A+ category.

Both Rohit and Kohli figure in A+ category but it remains to be seen if the Mumbai batter will be asked to lead the team in England in the upcoming five-Test series when his red ball form has been patchy.

The BCCI mandarins are however tight-lipped on the issue since head coach Gautam Gambhir's view will also matter in taking a final decision.

The BCCI offers contracts in four categories: A+, A, B and C with annual retainership valuation of Rs 7 crore, Rs 5 crore, Rs 3 crore and Rs 1 crore respectively. It is learnt that national selectors after discussion with head coach Gambhir and secretary Devajit Saikia had prepared the contract list at least two weeks back but held back the announcement.

Interestingly, it was announced hours after both veterans hit sparkling knocks -- especially skipper Rohit, who was going through a lean patch. While Kohli hit an unbeaten 73-run knock against Punjab Kings. Rohit came up with an unbeaten 76-run knock against Chennai Super Kings.

Iyer was included in B category while wicketkeeper-batter Ishan Kishan made a comeback in category C.

Rishabh Pant, who was demoted to category B during the 2023-24 season as he didn't play due to his recovery from a life-threatening accident, is back in A category in place of the retired Ravichandran Ashwin.

How central contract are awarded

Central contract is offered based on a player's performance in the year gone by.

The A+ category is meant for all-format automatic choices. The A category is for players, who are Test match certainities and also play the other two formats from time to time. The category B is for players who at

least play two formats regularly and C is for newcomers and one-format specialists.

Many would question how Rohit, Kohli and Jadeja were retained in the A+ grade when the troika has already announced retirement from the shortest format?

A top BCCI official explained the reasoning.

"The period of fresh central contract is from October 1, 2024 to September 30, 2025. But the assessment year is October 1, 2023 to September 30, 2024. Kohli, Rohit and Jadeja played the T20 World Cup final in June, 2024 and hence at

that time, they were all-format regulars. Going by that technicality, they are supposed to be in A+ category," the official PTI on condition of anonymity. "Similarly, Ishan (2 World Cup matches) and Shreyas played 15 ODIs and a handful Tests in the 2023-24 season and hence got their respective categories."

Rishabh Pant was downgraded to 'B' from A in last contract because he hadn't played any cricket during the year due to a life-threatening car accident.

After he returned to action in 2024, Pant played regularly in at least two of the three formats and hence is back in category 'A' in place of retired Ravichandran Ashwin.

Suryakumar Yadav has been retained in grade B because in last year's list he was a two-for-all-format regular having played most games of ODI World Cup in 2023 and also regular T20 skipper.

While there is not much change in terms of contracts offered in the top three categories,

Grade C now has 19 players compared to 17 in the last list following the inclusion of Sarfaraz Khan and Dhruv Jurel.

Newcomers in Grade C

The category C features new players such as Nitish Kumar Reddy and Harshit Rana, both of whom made their debuts between October and December 2024.

A player has to play three Tests or 8 ODIs or 10 T20Is in a calendar year to qualify for a central contract.

The lowest category has five new entrants in Harshit Rana, Varun Chakravarthy, Abhishek Sharma, Nitish Kumar Reddy and Akash Deep, who earlier had a fast bowling contract.

The only notable name missing in the list is Mumbai all-rounder Shardul Thakur, who last played for India in the 2023 ODI World Cup game against Bangladesh in Pune.

Fast bowler Avesh Khan, keeper-batters Kona Bharat and Jitesh Sharma have also been excluded from the list.

Is it to develop sports or just have an event? Moses' poser to India

Madrid, April 21: Perplexed by India's interest in hosting events like the 2030 Commonwealth Games, American athletics legend Edwin Moses says the country, which is yet to have a consistent supply line of world-class athletes, needs to decide whether such bids are meant to develop sports or simply make a statement.

India has submitted its Expression of Interest (EOI) to host the 2030 Commonwealth Games and is also in the running to bid for the 2036 Olympics after handing a letter of intent to the International Olympic Committee. India is also among the seven bidders to host the 2031 AFC Asian Cup in men's football, a sport that is in shambles both in terms of performance and administration in the country.

"It depends on what the vision is for having a Commonwealth Games. Is it just to have an event in India, or is it to really develop sports? That's going to be the big question," Moses, a Laureus World Sports Academy member, told PTI when asked if hosting mega events like the Commonwealth Games could help find better athletes.

"You can put on the Commonwealth Games or any other event and have all the fanfare and the government involved, and people who have nothing to do with sports-but sit on the front row. That's what you want to avoid. That's generally what happens," the 69-year-old former hurdler added in a blunt assessment of how he perceives India's interest in these events. Moses was at his wit's end to

understand why a country of over billion people can't consistently produce world-class athletes.

"...it's going to depend on the people who have been athletes, who are able to make things happen. That's for the people in India to determine. I don't

keep up with the politics of sports over there or what's gone wrong and why isn't a country with a billion people better than others in sports, which doesn't even make sense," he added.

Moses, who won 107 consecutive finals and set the world record in the 400m hurdles four times between 1977 and 1987, said India needs to spend on coaches and infrastructure.

"There's a lot of other countries in the world, much smaller, with much less financial capabilities than India, that produce good athletes," he said.

"Following the passing of His Holiness, Lega Nazionale Professionisti Serie A can confirm that today's league games in Serie A and Primavera 1 have been postponed. The date of the rearranged fixtures will be announced in due course," the Serie A statement read. Several European football clubs have also mourned the demise of the leader of the Roman Catholic Church.

PIASTRI WINS SAUDI ARABIAN GRAND PRIX

Jeddah (Saudi Arabia), April 21: McLaren's Oscar Piastri won the Saudi Arabian Grand Prix Sunday from Red Bull polesitter Max Verstappen to lead the world championship for the first time in his career.

Charles Leclerc's Ferrari completed the podium for this fifth round of the season under the floodlights at the Jeddah Corniche Circuit.

Piastri's third win this year was in large part decided at the first turn, when Verstappen picked up a five-second penalty for gaining an advantage after going off the track. He becomes the first Australian to lead the drivers' standings since his agent,



Mark Webber, 15 years ago.

"Very happy to have won, made the difference at the start. Great race. "Max was still a bit too close for my liking!" Piastri said, after crossing the line 2.843 seconds clear of the four-time world champion.

VERSTAPPEN KEEPS MUM

Verstappen refused to discuss a time penalty which dropped him out of the lead of the Saudi Arabian Grand Prix, saying after Sunday's race that he fears being punished for any criticism. Verstappen started on pole position and went off the track at the first corner under pressure from McLaren's Oscar Piastri. He kept the lead but received a five-second penalty for gaining an advantage by going off-track. That helped Piastri take his third Formula 1 win this season. Verstappen told his Red Bull team over the radio during the race that he felt Piastri had forced him off the track. The four-time champion repeatedly refused to go into any more detail in a televised interview and a later news conference. "The start happened, turn one happened and suddenly it was lap 50 (the last lap). It just all went super fast," Verstappen said in response to one question. "The problem is that I cannot share my opinion about it because I might get penalized also, you know, so it's better not to speak about it."

All-round display by Titans

Bhubaneswar, April 21: Punjab FC delivered a clinical performance to cruise past Odisha FC 3-0 and book their place in the quarterfinals of the Kalinga Super Cup Round of 16 match which was played here at the Kalinga Stadium.

Goals from Asmir Suljic, Ezequiel Vidal, and Nihal Sudeesh ensured the Shers get the better of the hosts. They will face FC Goa in the quarterfinals on 26th who got the better of I-League side Gokulam Kerala FC in a similar score line.

Punjab FC head coach Panagiotis Dilmpieris opted for an aggressive 4-2-4 formation, trusting his all-Indian defence line of Khaiminthang Lungdim, Suresh Meitei, Paramveer, and Abhishek Singh. With Muheet Shabbir in goal and Ricky Shabong and Nikhil Prabhu anchoring

the midfield, the attacking line was led by Muhammad Suhail, Asmir Suljic, Ezequiel Vidal, and Petros Glakoumakis. On the other side, Odisha FC—last season's runners-up—lined up in a 3-4-3 under Sergio Lobera, with Amrinder Singh in goal and a solid backline featuring Mourtada Fall and Carlos Delgado; their frontline included the likes of Hugo Boumous, Isak Vanlalruatfela, and Dorielton Silva.

Odisha FC dominated possession early on, but it was Punjab FC who fired the first warning shot, Suljic testing Amrinder in the 5th minute. The Shers, pressing high and showing intent, took the lead in the 14th minute. A sharp through ball from Vidal found Suljic, who cleverly dinked it over the onrushing keeper to make it 1-0. Punjab's high press and compact shape kept Odisha frustrated, and they nearly



doubled their lead on multiple occasions. Suhail came close after a deflected effort in the 33rd minute, while Ricky Shabong saw his shot saved after a flowing move involving Suljic.

Odisha's best chance came

in the 36th minute when Dorielton found himself one-on-one with the Shers' Muheet but missed the target. A minute later, Boumous tested Muheet again, only to be denied by a brilliant reflex save. Just be-

fore halftime, Suljic and Shabong combined beautifully, but the final shot lacked sting. The Shers went into the break with a deserved 1-0 lead.

Punjab FC faced an early change in the second half with Ashish Pradhan replacing Nikhil Prabhu. But the change did not slow down their momentum. The Shers continued to threaten Odisha's high line with swift transitions and clever link-ups between Vidal and Suljic. In the 56th minute, Vidal nearly scored with a two-shot attempt, his second going just wide. Odisha, meanwhile, struggled with their finishing despite some promising build-up play. The Shers defense stood tall, with goalkeeper Muheet once again stepping up when required.

In the 69th minute, Vidal turned on the flair, skipping past his marker and unleashing a sublime left-footed shot

from outside the box that nestled into the far corner to double Punjab's lead. From there, the Shers stuck to their game plan, absorbing pressure, staying compact, and waiting for their moment. Odisha's errors in the final third continued, while the Shers maintained their discipline. With the match heading into the final stretch, Odisha pushed hard but were repeatedly shut down by the Sher's all Indian backline.

In the 90th minute, the Shers sealed the match in style. Substitute Manglenthang Kipgen played a perfectly timed ball from half-line to Nihal Sudeesh, who calmly beat the keeper and slotted in Punjab's third of the night. Punjab FC kept pushing even in stoppage time, trying to find their fourth. At the final whistle, it was a complete performance from Dilmpieris' men to sail into the quarter finals.



This led to a shoot-off between Bhaker, Esha and Germany's Doreen Vennekamp.

Esha was the first to bow out. Bhaker then edged out Doreen in another shoot-off to move in to the top four. By now Simranpreet on 23-hits had found herself sandwiched between Sun with 25-hits and Yao with 22.

However, Bhaker's luck ran out in the next series as the one-point difference between the top three remained constant till the end of the contest.

Earlier in the day, the trio of Bhaker, mixed team pistol world champion Esha and Simranpreet, ensured all three Indians made the finals.

Bhaker was second in qualifying with a solid 585 while Simranpreet was fifth with 580.

Esha shot 575 to take the eighth and final qualifying spot. The three Chinese contenders also made the finals as did German ace Doreen Vennekamp and multiple times continental champion Andrea Perez Pena.
