while expressing deep concern over the perverse nature of some contents being aired on social media and over-the-top (OTT) platforms, issued a notice to Centre on a plea seeking restrictions on the streaming of such contents on these platforms which can harm children and adolescents, potentially encouraging risky sexual behaviours. However, the bench of Justices BR Gavai and Augustine George Masih refused to pass any order, as sought by the petitioner, stating that it is either for the legislature or the executive to come out with measures to deal with the issue. "This is not within our domain. As it is, there is lot of allegation that we are encroaching upon the legislative and executive powers," Justice Gavai said. It is obvious that the learned justice was hinting at the criticisms the top court faced following the judgement in the Tamil Nadu Governor vs MK Stalin government case which was dubbed as judicial excess by some BJP leaders

New Delhi, April 28: The Supreme Court Monday called it an "important concern" and sought responses from the Centre and others on a plea seeking a ban on streaming of sexually explicit content on OTT and social media platforms.

Solicitor general Tushar Mehta, appearing for the Centre. said the government would not take it as an adversarial litigation. "Kindly monitor it here. We will come out with something which balances the freedom of speech while (Article) 19 (2) is taken care of," he said.

tents are not only obscene but also "perverse". Advocate Vishnu Shankar Jain, appearing for the petitioners, said it is not an adversarial litigation and the plea raised a serious concern over such contents on overthe-top (OTT) and social media.

Jain said such content was displayed without any checks or restrictions. "Mr solicitor, vou should do something." Justice Gavai told Mehta.

The law officer said children are more exposed to all this nowadays. "Some of the things which are in regular programmes, the language, the contents... is of such a nature that it is not only vulgar, it is perverse," he said.

Mehta said some of the content is so perverse even two respectable men cannot sit and watch it together.

He said the only condition is that such programmes are for viewers aged over 18 years but cannot be controlled.

The bench referred to the use of cell phones by children.

"They (children) are quite adapt. It is a good thing, provided they reach the correct website," Mehta said.

The bench observed, "On the last date itself, we had told him (Jain) that this is for either the legislature or the executive.

The apparent reference was to the remarks of Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar and BJP MP Nishikant Dubey against the judiciary.

Dhankhar had questioned the judiciary setting a timeline for the president to make decisions and acting as a "super Parliament", saying the Supreme Court cannot fire a "nuclear missile" at democratic forces, Soon after, BJP MP Nishikant Dubey said Parliament and Assemblies should be shut if the apex court had to make laws.

Mehta Monday something is needed to be done to deal with the issue. When the bench offered to issue notice on the plea for responses from the Centre and others, including some OTT and social media platforms, Mehta said it may not be neces sary to issue notice to others.

Titanic survivor's letter fetches over ₹3cr at UK auction

authorities of Veer Surendra Sai University of Technology (VSSUT) at Burla have taken disciplinary action against 100 students on charges of various forms of misconduct, including poor attendance, violation of uni versity rules, and inappropriate behaviour. Among those punished are nine

The crackdown follows the April 10 death of Saswati Bhoi, a final-year Electrical Engineering student, who drowned at the fishery point of Hirakud reservoir during an outing. Six female students - Siddheswari Moharana Aditi Hati, Anushka Ray, Purabi Mohapatra, Adyasha Nayak, and Raseshwari Parida - have been expelled from the hostel in connection with the incident. The university has downgrad-

ed their academic grades to 'F in their courses and imposed a fine of Rs 5,000 each on the students who had violated the rules. The administration tightened discipline rules across campus, including restrictions on leaving hostels or campus premises without permission, enforcing timely hostel return, prohibiting involvement in unethical activities, forbidding mistreatment of juniors, banning damage to university property, and maintaining a zero tolerance policy toward substance abuse.

Incursion by India imminent: Pak Min

Islamabad, April 28: Pakistan's Defence Minister Khawaja Muhammad Asif Monday said a military incursion by neighbouring India is imminent in the aftermath of a deadly terrorist attack on tourists in Kashmir last week, as tensions rise between the two nuclear-armed nations.

The terrorist attack killed 26 people and triggered outrage in India, along with calls for action against Pakistan. India accuses the neighbouring country of backing terrorism in Kash-

Odisha cancels foreign nationals' ration cards

Bhubaneswar, April 28: Following Pahalgam terror attack that claimed 26 lives, including one from Odisha, the state government has decided to cancel ration cards illegally issued to foreign nationals over the years, officials said

Monday. Speaking to reporters, state Food Supplies and Consumer Welfare Minister KC Patra said all District Collectors have been instructed to immediately revoke ration cards issued to Pakistani, Bangladeshi and Burmese nationals residing in

"We have tightened our stance after the terror attack. Foreign nationals staying across the state must not avail the benefits meant for Indian citizens," Patra said.

The minister said ration cards illegally issued to foreign nationals over the years must be cancelled immediately. Patra said the foreign na-

tionals mostly stay in Balasore, Kendrapara and Jagatsinghpur districts located along the state's coastal belt.

He asserted that the administration would soon identify the foreigners availing the benefits. Apart from 12 Pakistanis,

the state government has so far identified 3,738 Bangladeshis staying illegally in the state. However, the government has

no data on the number of Burmese people in the state, home department sources said.

London, April 28: A letter

penned by Titanic survivor Colonel Archibald Gracie fetched \$3,99,000 (Rs 3.4 crore) at an auction by Henry Aldridge & Son in Wiltshire, England. Described as "museum grade", the letter was acquired by a private US collector after intense bidding, the auction house announced recently, according to a report.


The report said Gracie had written the letter from Southampton April 10, 1912, just days before the gigantic Titanic sank into the icy waters of the North Atlantic after colliding with an iceberg.

Gracie, a first-class passenger, mailed it while the ship was on its way to Queenstown (now Cork), Ireland, one of its

Gracie survived by jumping into the freezing ocean and reaching an overturned collapsible lifeboat, later being rescued by another lifeboat

two scheduled stops before the catastrophic disaster struck, killing around 1,500 people.

In the letter, Gracie, then 54, expressed his cautious optimism about the ship: "It is a fine ship but I shall await my journey's end before I pass judgement on her," according to a report by 'The New York Post'. Those words would take on a haunting significance just days later, as the Titanic struck an iceberg and sank in the early



hours of April 15, 1912.

A man of notable heritage, Gracie's father had served as a Confederate officer during the Civil War, and his great-grand father had built Gracie Mansion, which is still the official residence of New York City's mayor today.





Army, police hold meet; high alert at City railway station

Bhubaneswar, April 28: Keeping in view the evolving situation across the country following the Pahalgam terror attack, the Indian Army and the Bhubaneswar-Cuttack Commissionerate of Police Monday held a strategic meeting and become familiar with each other so as to jointly face eventuality, if any.

This was stated by top officers of both the Army and the twin city police after the hour-long meeting, said to be crucial for the overall law and order situation. A high alert was sounded at Bhubaneswar railway station and Railway Protection Force (RPF) personnel conducted a flag march there during the day.

However, no specific reason was cited for such heightened security at the railway station and the meeting between the Army and the police.

'These are national issues. This initiative between the armed forces and the police is a landmark event and this kind of structure can also be followed by other states. This will ensure better coordination between armed forces and police

operating on various aspects,' a senior Army officer said.

The Army made a detailed presentation before officers of various police stations in the two cities of Bhubaneswar and Cuttack, the Army officer said.

Talking to reporters, Commissioner of Police S Dev Datta Singh also said that the meeting

was held to establish seamless coordination between the sides.

"The Army briefed us on their presence in Bhubaneswar and Odisha. We have agreed to coordinate with each other during this period when there is a high security alert. It will help maintain law and order situation and deal with emergencies if any," Singh said.

Meanwhile, as part of tightening the security in the state capital, RPF personnel Monday conducted a flag march at Bhu-

baneswar railway station. "High alert is sounded keeping in view the safety of passengers. The RPF personnel carried out thorough checking of luggage of passengers and every part of the premises," a senior Government Railway Police (GRP) officer said.

They have also created safety and security awareness among the passengers using loudspeaker at the platforms.

'The entire Bhubaneswar railway station has been put on high alert following the terror attack at Pahalgam. Regular security checking is being conducted at the railway station, said an RPF officer, adding that suspicious individuals are being interrogated to prevent any potential threat.

Additional security personnel have been deployed at entry and exit points, platforms, and parking areas to maintain a strict vigil on the entire station area, the officer informed

In a related development, stickers resembling a Pakistani flag were found on roads at Rupali Square and Fire Station

Square late Sunday evening. "In protest against the Pahalgam terror attack, some people have put up the stickers. We have removed those,' Bhubaneswar DCP Jagmohan Meena said.

He is also known as 'Kula Brudha', according to Odisha government's website. He took a valiant stand for the unification of scattered Odia tracts.

'Today is the birth anniver sary of Utkal Gourav Madhusudan Das. The Odisha government offers its tributes to him on this occasion. He played a leading role in the formation of Odisha as a separate state. He was the pride of Odisha and played a key role in the industrialisation of the state," Majhi said after paying his tribute to Madhu Babu.

"Our government is working hard to meet the goals set by Madhu Babu. On Utkal Dibasa on April 1, we observed the day at Madhu Babu's birthplace at Satyabhamapur in Cuttack district," Majhi added.

Leader of Opposition and BJD president Naveen Patnaik posted on X, "I pay my tributes to Utkal Gourav Madhusudan Das, a symbol of Odia pride, on his birth anniversary. His unparalleled contribution to the formation of a separate Odisha province, industrialisation of the state, and language protection is always a source of inspiration."

Odisha Pradesh Congress Committee (OPCC) president Bhakta Charan Das also visited Raj Bhavan Square and paid tribute to Das on his birth anniversary. Meanwhile, the OSSC said, "The Commission acknowledges and regrets the error, and is committed to taking remedial measures. The Commission is considering the option of holding another examination covering leftover parts of General English. Odia Language and General Studies." 

Crime Branch arrests several fraudsters in cheating cases

Bhubaneswar, April 28: The Odisha Crime Branch Monday arrested multiple fraudsters in connection with six major cases of cheating involving lakhs of rupees. Crime Branch director General Vinaytosh Mishra said the crackdown targeted individuals involved in cyber frauds, fake websites, and capital investment scams across different regions.

In a significant development, two fraudsters — Anshuman Sharma from Agra and Arvind Kumar from Prayagraj — were arrested for duping devotees through a fake website created in the name of Niladri Bhakta Nivas in Puri.

Based on a complaint filed by the Shri Jagannath Temple Administration, it was found that the accused operated a fraudulent portal and asked devotees to transfer money online for accommodation bookings.



Police seized laptops, mobile phones, SIM cards, fake ID documents, and website details from them. The temple administration has urged devotees to use the official website, www.shreeiagannath.in, for any bookings.

In another case, Akash Ke-

sharwani of Prayagraj was arrested in connection with a cyber fraud case involving former minister Tusharkanti Behera. Fraudsters had siphoned off around ₹1.4 crore under the pretext of stock market investments. Kesharwani's arrest brings the total number of arrests in this case to eight.

Meanwhile, Hiteshbhai Patra, originally from Balasore and

nabbed for defrauding people of ₹1.28 crore through a capital investment scam. Authorities

Odisha's rice fallow mgmt: A quiet force against climate challenge



ith climate change, Climate-smart imperative for ensuring food security for current and future generation that equates to the problem of sustain ably increasing agricultural productivity. CSA has many facets. One CSA that possibly has large effects but misses the recognition it deserves is Comprehensive Rice Fallow Management (CRFM), a flagship program in Odisha with a package of practices in all

30 districts of state since 2022. CRFM is a true climate-smart agriculture involv ing utilizing land traditionally left fallow after rice harvest in the Kharif season to grow other crops, particularly pulses and oilseeds. While CRFM addresses climatic challenges it thus also benefits in the form of better soil health and improving cropping intensity in areas where it has been traditionally low. CRFM initiated by the Department of Agriculture & Farmers' Empowerment (DAFE), targets sizable fallow lands as high as 1.1 million acres, representing significant opportunity to spur productivity, food security and rural livelihoods.

In eastern India, a range of environmental and socioeconomic factors limit the adoption of a second crop after rice comprising limited irrigation. inadequate moisture levels, low soil fertility, input supply problems, and insufficient risk mitigation, most of these com-

CRFM offers climate-resilient practices: drought-tolerant crop varieties, agroforestry, and sustainable water management. Incorporating legumes into crop rotation, for example, improves soil health by fixing nitrogen.

Significant challenges are faced by CRFM inter alia viz. erratic or low, inadequate residual moisture and wideration rice varieties requiring 150 to 165 days to mature, restricting potential for cultivate ing a subsequent Rabi crop. With deep commitments of the government and delicate challenges, it was imperative to evaluate CRFM for planning and implementation.

Government of Odisha along with International Food Policy Research Institute (IFPRI) embarked on an ambitious evaluation of CRFM in Odisha applying impact evaluation methods and administrative and satellite remote sensing data, reliably identified and monitored land use patterns, offering synoptic and repeated coverage at various resolutions, making it suitable for both real-time and historical data analysis. CRFM mandates estimating residual soil moisture after Kharif season for Rabi crops in fallows. Remote sensing analyses utilization of both perennial and ephemeral rice fallows. There definitely are green shoots in fallow to non-fallow conversions at a rate faster than other regions in eastern India which cumulatively comprise 80% of rice fallows in India.Upon utilization of the fallows, there are significant increases in yieldin Bengal gram, black gram, green gram, lentils, sesamum, and mustard for Odisha.

Evaluation shows soil moisture and other land characteristics bear on fallows' utiliza

volve production with higher yields, the overall productivity in Odisha will increase. Odisha currently is surplus in rice but deficit in pulses and

IFPRI evaluation establishes significant yield improvements in Odisha for keycrops: Bengal Gram, Grass Peas, Lentils, and Mustard, To optimize CRFM interventions there may be a need to further adjust or repurpose resource allocation across locations and crops, requiring analyzing regional needs and identi fying crops that require more targeted interventions which like oilseeds-mustard and sesame, may be comparatively under-supported.

Further, identifying high value markets may be essential for maximizing the profitability of CRFM-supported crops mandating market analysis to locate areas with strong demand allowing farm ers to capitalize on value-added opportunities. CRFM could involve an integrated environmental, livelihood, and economic assessment.

Odisha is a pioneering state in digital agriculture and information systems underscores the importance of robust data systems to monitor outcomes, integrating Krushak Odisha and ADAPT portal enabling tracking, and geospatial mapping and remote sensing. With a robust monitoring and evaluation system, both short term and long-term performance of CRFM can be gauged.

o you frequently rely on ready-to-eat or readyto-heat meals? If so, it's time to rethink your choices. A major global study has found that the regular consumption of ultra-processed foods (UPFs) can significantly increase the risk of preventable, premature

The study, published in the American Journal of Preventive Medicine, analysed nationally representative dietary surveys and mortality data



from eight countries: Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Mexico, the United Kingdom, and the United States. It found that premature deaths rise sharply in relation to the proportion of UPFs in individ-

uals' total energy intake. These results strengthen calls for urgent, worldwide

action to reduce UPF consumption through regulatory that promote healthier eating environments.

UPFs are industrially manufactured products, typically made with ingredients extracted from foods or created in laboratories. They contain little

to no whole food and are often loaded with artificial additives such as colourants, flavourings, sweeteners, emulsifiers, and other processing agents. Beyond their unhealthy nutrient profile, researchers stress that the very nature of industrial food processing — and its reliance on synthetic components — poses a serious threat to human health.

"UPFs affect health not only due to their excessive sodium, trans fat, and sugar content but also because of changes introduced during industrial processing and the addition of artificial ingredients," explained lead author Eduardo AF Nilson from the University of São Paulo, Brazil. "Evaluating deaths from all causes associated with UPF consumption gives a clearer picture of the true harm of

The team found that every 10 per cent increase in UPF consumption corresponded to a 3 per cent rise in the risk of death from any cause. Modelling national food consumption patterns, they estimated that UPF-related premature deaths could range from about 4 per cent in countries with lower consumption (like Colombia) to nearly 14 per cent in nations with higher consumption rates

Alarmingly, while UPF consumption has stabilised at high levels in wealthier countries, it is steadily increasing in low- and middle-income nations. Researchers warn that the health burden could soon shift dramatically toward de-

"Our findings show the urgent need for policies that reduce UPF consumption and encourage diets based on fresh, minimally processed local

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Bhitarkanika to be shut for croc breeding season

Rajnagar, April 28: Bhitarkanika National Park will be out of bounds for tourists from May 1 to July 31 during a twomonth closure to accommodate the annual breeding season of saltwater crocodiles.

The park, recognised as one of the premier breeding grounds for the species, enforces the closure each year to minimise human disturbance during this critical period. Female crocodiles typically move inland from tidal zones to prepare nesting sites and lay eggs during these months. Officials said mother crocodiles are known to become highly aggressive while guarding their nests. The restriction on tourist access is intended to prevent potential attacks and ensure a safe, undisturbed environment for the reptiles to nest and hatch their young.

Massive fire breaks out at Paradip refinery pipe yard

Paradip, April 28: Panic gripped residents after a massive fire broke out Monday afternoon at the entry point of the IOCL refinery at Paradip in Jagatsinghpur district.

The blaze started in a stack of plastic-coated pipes belonging to a private consultancy firm Techno Mount, which works within the refinery premises. These pipes were intended for underground installation. The fire erupted near the Dochhaki area, close to the Goa Carbon Company, where hundreds of pipes were stored together. Flames quickly engulfed the area, and dark billowing smoke was visible from up to a distance of two kilometres. The fire created a thick blanket of smoke that spread across

Upon receiving alerts, fire tenders from the refinery, Kujang, and various private companies rushed to the scene and worked to contain the blaze. According to the latest reports, the fire was brought under control by 7pm. Following the incident, the refinery's executive director, along with departmental heads, visited the site for an inspection.

RK Sahu, an officer from Indian Oil Corporation Limited's (IOCL) pipeline division, stated that the affected area was the refinery's dumping yard, where over a thousand iron and rubber-coated pipes had been stored. He added that while the cause of the fire is yet to be ascertained, the pipes were old and had been placed there after being replaced from under the sea and underground pipelines.

Kendrapara chases a 'pipe' dream

The coastal district was the only one selected from state in the Jal Shakti Abhiyan in 2019 to boost groundwater recharge

Kendrapara, April 25: The Central government has identified Kendrapara district as the state's only water stressed district and included it in the Jal Shakti Abhiyan for groundwater recharge initiatives. However, locals allege that

they have seen little improvement as the government's mission to ensure piped water supply to every household by 2024 has fallen flat in this coastal district. With mercury soaring, an exacerbating drinking water crisis gives burning evidence of the mission's failure.

Moreover, seven rivers under the Mahanadi, Brahmani and Baitarani systems have dried up, leaving the district's residents without access to potable water. To top it all off, over 10,000 tube wells are throwing saline water. The above factors are indicative of the severity of the drinking water crisis plaguing the residents of this coastal district.

Complaints of water shortage are rising during public grievance camps with people often resorting to agitations in various areas due to lack of piped water supply.

According to the Rural Water Supply and Sanitation (RWSS) department, Kendrapara district has 17,238 tube wells, 331 drinking water projects and 181 overhead tanks intended to supply drinking water to villagers. Yet, residents say they are not getting the intended benefits with most

of the tube wells discharging saline water. Social activists Pratap Padhi, Bibhuti Bhusan Rout, Pratap Ranjan Tripathy, Debashis Samal and Prakash Chandra Das pointed out that despite the presence of seven rivers, Kendrapara faces a serious drinking water crisis. Due to its coastal location, groundwater in the

district has turned saline. Over-

head tanks are often dry, and

digging a single tube well now

costs at least ₹3 lakh, which is a gamble as it might spew salty water in the end.

Additionally, industries and agricultural activities under the Mahanadi. Brahmani and Baitarani river systems are drawing excessive amounts of water. To make it worse, presence of barrages upstream reduces the water flow, further diminishing groundwater recharge potential.

Reports from both state and Central Water Resource departments indicate that groundwater in areas like Garadpur block is no longer suitable for drinking. Similarly, absence of canal in Aul, Mahakalapara, Rajnagar and

Rajkanika blocks in the district makes groundwater recharge even more difficult. Proximity to the sea has also worsened the water

salinity, especially in

Mahakalapara block. In 2019. Kendrapara was the only district in the state selected in the Jal Shakti Abhiyan to boost groundwater recharge. The campaign focused on installing shocking pipe fittings in tube wells, afforestation, rainwater harvesting, and the revival of water sources. However, due to administrative negligence, the campaign failed to achieve its objectives, and groundwater recharge could not be realised.

Meanwhile, the district also fell short of its target to supply drinking water through pipelines to 2,91,160 families by March 2025. So far, only about 33,000 families have benefited from the initiative. Several mega water supply projects have been launched across the district to improve piped water access, but many started without conducting proper land and environmental assessments.

2 men beat dad to death to save mom

Purushottampur, April 28: A shocking incident unfolded Monday at Kushapur village under this police station limits in Ganjam district, where two youths allegedly beat their father to death following a family

The deceased has been identified as Gopal Krushna Sahu (60). According to reports, due to ongoing family tensions, his two sons, Pintu Sahu (34) and Ranjan Sahu (28), attacked him with an iron rod.

Informed, police recovered the bloodstained body and sent it to MKCG Medical College and Hospital at Berhampur for a post-mortem examination. The two youths were detained after a case was registered and further investigation is ongoing. While police later arrested Ranjan, they released Pintu.

Sources said, Gopal Krushna Sahu's family was financially weak, struggling to make ends meet in Kushapur village under Baghal Panchavat, About 10 years ago, Gopal had married off his elder daughter, and de spite facing severe financial constraint, he conducted the marriage of his younger daughter just two months ago. However, his two sons, Pintu and Ranjan, remain unmarried.

Domestic unrest was constant, mostly due to debts and financial burdens. Gopal, often under stress, frequent ly expressed frustration and allegedly assaulted his wife, Sita. During a dispute Monday, Gopal reportedly tried to assault Sita with a rod. His sons protested, but he refused to listen and continued to attack her.

Unable to bear the contin ued domestic violence, Pintu and Ranjan, in a fit of rage, snatched the rod from their father and hit him profusely, resulting in his death.

Upon receiving information from the villagers, Inspector-in-Charge Rajesh Kumar Nayak and Purushottampur SDPO Deepak Kumar Mishra visited the scene and initiated an investigation.

44 kids from state to undergo surgery at Mumbai hospital under Central scheme

Berhampur, April 28: A total of 44 children suffering from congenital heart disease (CHD) went to Mumbai from Ganjam district Monday for free surgery under a Central scheme. officials said.

These children, aged between 3 months and 15 years, will be treated at the SRCC Children's Hospital under the Rashtriya Bal Swasthya

Karyakram (RBSK), they said. A four-member team of doctors accompanied them to coordinate their treatment in Mumbai, said district manager of RBSK Lopamudra Mishra.

The doctors at the Mumbai hospital will test them first and schedule the surgeries, considering the condition of each patient, she said.

These children were identi-

fied during health screening at anganwadi centres and schools by RBSK teams working at the block level, she added.

After being identified, they were treated at the City Hospital here. They were referred to the SRCC Hospital in Mumbai as doctors felt that they needed early surgery, Mishra said.

Shalachua's struggle for connectivity

Anandapur, April 28: In the remote village of Shalachua, nestled on the edge of Keonjhar's Anandapur block and abutting Mayurbhanj district, residents are stuck in a time warp. While India rapidly expands 5G network and works on cutting-edge telecommunication advancements, villagers here climb trees to catch a fleeting mobile signal, a stark reminder of the digital divide plaguing rural areas.

Surrounded by dense forests and hills, Shalachua, largely home to tribal communities, has no mobile towers in or near the village. The absence of basic network access forces locals to scale tall trees, hoping to connect to a weak and unreliable signal. Even then, success is not guaranteed. "It's frustrating," said Durlabh Nayak, a

local resident. "We climb, but the

network is rarely there. The lack of connectivity disrupts daily life. From accessing government schemes to contacting emergency services, residents face constant hurdles. Surrounded by

wildlife, the village grapples with the fear of animal attacks, and without reliable communication, reaching the Forest department or medical help during crises is nearly impossible. Students too suffer, unable to access online

resources or communicate effectively for their studies. At night, the village falls into what locals call a "mobile blackout," leaving them completely cut off.

Despite the telecom boom in urban centres and along highways, remote rural pockets like Shalachua remain overlooked by companies competing to expand services. Villagers, including Kshirod Nay ak, Muna Nayak, Rabindra Nayak, Kabindra Nayak, and Ballabh Nayak, demanded action. They've called on the administration to install a mobile tower to bring basic communication services and bridge the gap to government programmes.

For now, Shalachua's residents continue their precarious climbs, chasing signals in the treetops. hoping for a future where connectivity is no longer a distant dream.

Historical Vacuum

riting history presupposes painstaking efforts to reconstruct what happened in a remote past in a manner that should ensure, as much as possible, authenticity, accuracy and above all objectivity. Available material needs to be used by the writer without colouring them with his or her own perceptions, imagination, bias and preconceived notions. This is not an easy task and court historians or those commissioned by the powers that be have time and again let their own prejudices and those of their masters, who have paid for and assigned the task to them, influence the tone and tenor of their narratives. It is easy to claim that all these eventually boil down to travesty of truth. Facts and events that took place centuries ago have to be presented as they were, no matter whether they are to the liking of the present generation or not. If this discipline is violated, then the result is a pseudo-history and falsification of facts that do grave injustice to the times gone by. However, in a scenario that existed in the Indian subcontinent during the last thousand years or so, no unbiased, impartial or reliable records of events were ever maintained. Unlike Egypt or China where hieroglyphics existed prior to the birth of formal script, Indian society was deprived of any script of its own till much later in time of human evolution. Also, as education and exposure was limited to certain sections of society, primarily the upper caste, all recorded history glorified the ruling class or those who were close to them through economic or socio-religious standing. On second thought, even the trader or business class was not considered high enough to have access to governance or god. Therefore, Indian history has, sadly, throughout the past has always been trampled upon and disfigured and discoloured.

India is confronted with this problem once again with the National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) making major changes to its Class VII Social Science textbooks, removing all references to the Mughals and the Delhi Sultanate. The latest revision also brings in new chapters that highlight ancient Indian dynasties the Magadha, Mauryas, Shungas, and S tav hanas - with a focus on 'Indian ethos", the Maha Kumbh festival and major initiatives of the government. If the intent is to widen and bring in underplayed parts of history to the forefront, that is a welcome step. If instead it is to whitewash one part of Indian history and disproportionately highlight another, then the whole story gets perverted. The changes are being touted as part of the new National Education Policy (NEP) and the National Curriculum Framework for School Education (NCFSE) 2023. Both focus on promoting Indian traditions, philosophies, knowledge systems, and local heritage within the school curriculum. But then the question arises whether what is considered 'local heritage' in Mathura or Benares, will those same beliefs be considered local or acceptable for Jagannath at Puri or Ayyappan lore of Sabarimala?

The apparent allergy to Indian history during periods when Moslem rulers dominated the scene in Delhi was in evidence during the COVID-19 pandemic when the NCERT "trimmed" content on the Tughlaqs, Khiljis, Mamluks, and Lodis, along with a two-page table about Mughal emperors' achievements. But, this is the first time that all material relating to the Mughals and Delhi Sultanate, an important part of north and west Indian history, has been taken out completely. This decision will certainly create a period of complete vacuum in history when, for future school students, there will be no trace of who governed that portion of this sub continent during those centuries.

Predictably, this syllabus rationalisation by the NCERT in its textbooks has been met with criticism from opposition parties. Whether this would help education or damage the knowledge base is a point

Another new chapter on sacred and pilgrimage sites across India and outside for religions like Islam, Christianity, Judaism, and Zoroastrianism, Hinduism, Buddhism and Sikhism has been named "How the Land Becomes Sacred." This chapter refers to places with 12 Jyotirlingas, the Char Dham yatra, and the "Shakti pithas" with revered river confluences, mountains, and forests have been mentioned as a 'sacred geography." A quote from India's first Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru, which described the country as a land of pilgrimages,

The new textbook claims that the "varna-jati system" initially provided social stability, but became rigid, particularly under British rule, leading to inequalities. A mention about the Maha Kumbh states how 660 million people participated in it, but has no mention of the recent stampedes in which many pilgrims died and several injured.

NCERT Director Dinesh Prasad Saklani showed a lack of understanding the spirit of history when last year he claimed, "teaching about riots can make young children negative citizens." The remark was made in the context of the NCERT's removal of portions referring to the Gujarat communal violence of 2002.

The NCERT should refrain from distorting history and damaging the education of future generations.





IMF'S GRIM FORECAST

he US tariff war resetting the world order of 80 years slows down global growth to 2.8 percent in 2025, down from January forecast of 3.3 percent says the World Economic Outlook (WEO) of International Monetary Fund (IMF)

The IMF seemingly has a grim forecast as it foresees repetition of the Great Depression (GD) or worse, as the US effective tariff rate surged past levels reached during the GD while counter-responses from major trading partners significantly pushed up the global rate. The world may be in turmoil as the US may plunge into severe slowdown with its growth plunging to 1.8 percent, a 90-basis point loss. The problems could surpass the economic trouble to worsening trade tensions, a hint towards a bigger political conflict.

For India, however, the growth outlook is relatively more stable. The IMF projects steady expansion for the Indian economy, supported by firm private consumption, particularly in rural areas.

Despite these revisions, India's robust growth trajectory continues to set it apart on the global stage. The projections could change the global investment pattern. It might create an additional interest for India despite the capital flight witnessed in the country's bourses, falling rupee against the dollar and surging gold and silver prices. The rupee could fall further as the WEO says the US benefits as tariffing country in the dollar appreciating further. This apart global investment scenario could face difficulties adding to the problems in the Indian

However, greater policy uncertainty, dimmer US growth

prospects, and an adjustment in the global demand for dollar assets—that has so far been orderly-can weigh down on the dollar. In the medium term, the dollar may depreciate if the tariffs translate into lower productivity in the US tradable goods sector, relative to its trading partners.

Risks to the global economy have increased, and worsening trade tensions could further depress growth. Financial conditions could tighten further as markets react negatively to the diminished growth prospects and increased uncertainty. While banks remain well capitalized overall, financial markets may face more severe tests.

Tariffs constitute a negative supply shock leading to productivity loss accompanied by higher production prices, increased rent seeking - a word for rising corruption, that could further impact world growth. Monopolisation could increase as competition decreases. In the US, demand was already softening before the recent policy announcements, reflecting greater

policy uncertainty. With one percentage point rise in inflation above 2 percent predicted earlier, it could spur global prices to rise. Growth in the Euro area,

which is subject to relatively lower effective tariffs, is revised down by 0.2 percentage point, to 0.8 percent. Both in the Euro area and China, stronger fiscal stimulus will provide some support this year and next. Many emerging market economies could face significant slowdowns depending on where tariffs settle. The WEO lowers its growth forecast for the group by 0.5 percentage point, to 3.7 percent.

Dense global supply chains, WEO says, can magnify the effects of tariffs and uncertainty. Most traded goods are intermediate inputs that cross borders multiple times before being turned into final products. Disruptions can propagate up and down the global input-output network with potentially large multiplier effects, as we saw during the pandemic. Companies facing uncertain market access will

likely pause in the near term, reduce investment and cut spending. Likewise, financial institutions will reassess borrowers' exposure. The increased uncertainty and tightening of financial conditions could well dominate the short term, weighing on economic activity, as reflected in the sharp decline in oil prices.

Risks to the global economy have increased, and worsening trade tensions could further depress growth. Financial conditions could tighten further as markets react negatively to the diminished growth prospects and increased uncertainty. While banks remain well capitalized overall, financial markets may

face more severe tests. The scenarios are painted with much conditionality. In short, the IMF does not appear optimistic.

Assessing the global financial stability, it says that risks have increased significantly as financial conditions tightened and economic and trade policy uncertainty remain elevated.

Overall, investor concerns about public debt sustainability and other fragilities in the financial sector can worsen in a mutually reinforcing fashion.

As the IMF reaffirms India's economic resilience, the country's role as a key driver of global growth continues to gain prominence. It feels the country can sustain momentum in a complex international environment. Despite that the threat is not diminished. It is witnessed in its volatile bullion, currency market, inflation indicators and manufacturing. India has chances to stand apart but withering the global winds would not be easy.

uman capital formation (HCF), sustained through the universal provision of basic social services like health and education, is the key to economic development. Developed nations like France, Denmark, Belgium, and Finland spent more than 30% of their GDP on social expenditures in 2014. India spends 5% of its GDP on social expenditure, according to the UNDP (2016). Of the total social expenses of the country, states spend around 80%. Social expenditure in Odis-

ha looks promising, ranking third among the 14 undivided major general category states, as reflected by the value of the social expenditure index from 1990-91 to 2016-17. Odisha ranks seventh, third, and ninth in terms of the proportion of social expenditures in total expenditures, Gross State Domestic Product, and per capita, respectively, among the 14 major states of the country. The proportion of capital account social expenditures in total expenditures and GDP is 1.7% and 0.4%, respectively. The situation is dismal in the case of per capita capital account social expenditures (Rs 150). The Odisha government gave the highest priority (41%) to non-developmental expenditures on general services. interest payments, repayment of debt, and pensions.

Compositional analysis of social expenditures presents a gloomy picture of the economic development of the state. Although a significant proportion (71%) of social expenditures is diverted to HCF, Odisha ranks fifth among the 14 major states in the HCF index, measured by the average of education, medical and public health, water supply and sanitation, labor, employment, and nutrition indices. Odisha's HCF index value is two-thirds that of Kerala and even lower than the value of Bihar (0.38).

Values of educational output indicators are relatively lower than those of Middle Income Group (MIG) and High-Income Group (HIG) states. For example, the average literacy rates of HIG and MIG states are 77.9% and 78.6%, respectively, whereas it is 73% in Odisha, according to the 2011 census. The literacy rate of the state is 21% less than the literacy rate

(94%) of Kerala.

Health output indicators signal a dismal picture due to lower health expenditure (1.4% of GSDP). In 2002-06, life expectancy at birth was 59.6 years in Odisha, lower than that of Bihar (61.1 years). In 2010-12, the maternal mortality rate was 16 per 100,000 live births, below the national average of 12.4. In 2012, anemia contributed to 3.15% of deaths and tuberculosis to 1.49%. In total, 78% of households had no access to toilets in 2011. It is argued that the proportion of health expenditures should not be less than 3% of the GDP to provide universal health coverage.

Populist expenditures were given higher priority than education, health, and employment in the state. Populist expenditures constituted 29% of total social expenditures and 2% of the GSDP. The state is recognized as the fifth highest in terms of populist social expenditure (0.46) among the 14 major states. A single majori ty party held political power continuously over time and has used populist measures as a strategy to win elections. Populism is both the cause

and consequence of winning elections by the ruling party in the absence of political competition. With the continuous low political competition among the political parties from the 10th to the 16th Assembly elections in the state, expenditures on populist measures increased tremendously. Proper social policies could not be determined by the political opinions of citizens due to a lack of political competition.

The level, composition, and trends of social expenditures stand as a predicament for the economic development of the state. The budget should be the financial mirror of social and economic expenditures. To enhance economic development, the newly formed government. led by the Bharatiya Janata Party, is expected to emphasize HCF.

UP MADRASSA SURPRISE INSPECTION

No Class X student can write name in English

Alarmed, authorities issued a warning and a notice to the madrassa and asked the seminary to focus on other subjects besides Arabic and Persian

Bahraich (UP), April 28: A surprise inspection at a madrassa in this district has unveiled the sorry state of education there, with officials saying that none of its class 10 students could write their names in English.

Alarmed, authorities issued warning and a notice to the madrassa and asked the seminary to focus on other subjects besides Arabic and Persian.

Qari Irfan, a faculty member at the seminary, said 15 students have been enrolled in class 10 so far, and of them 10 were present during Monday's surprise inspection

"The students asked to write in English are new to this seminary. They are weak in English and could not perform to the satisfaction of the inspecting officials. We will hold separate classes for struggling students," the acting principal (Naib Principal) of the madrassa, Maulana Shamsuddin, told PTI.

District Minority Welfare Officer Sanjay Mishra told reporters Monday that the surprise inspection was conducted at Jamia Gaziya Sayyadul Uloom, a recognised madrassa in the Badi Takiya area.

One of the teachers was found absent though it was not recorded in the attendance register, Mishra said and also noted that students' attendance in Munshi, Maulvi, and Alim classes was significantly lower compared to the registered



class 10 students were asked to write their names and that of the madrassa in English. But none could do it," he claimed and pointed out that the seminary's focus was largely limited to Arabic and Persian studies with little attention to other

This has led to an "alarming" academic situation, the officer said, adding "Neglecting the broader education of students is playing with their

The authorities have warned the madrassa of strict action if immediate steps are not taken towards improving the quality of education. Notices have been sent to the madrassa management and the absent

Shamsuddin pointed out that besides imparting religious education, the madrassa had provisions for teaching English, Hindi, Mathematics, and Science. "Which is why a science teacher had been appointed. But more emphasis was given to Arabic, Persian, and Urdu rather than these subjects.'

'However, since the implementation of the NCERT curriculum... we have now started focusing on all subjects. It is better for the children's future that they are not limited to becoming just Alims (religious scholars) but also have oppor-

tunities in other fields as well. he said. In view of the minority welfare officer's warning, "we have now prepared a timetable for teachers to teach all subjects", the acting principal

About the officer complaining that very few students of Munshi, Maulvi, and Alim classes being in attendance at the seminary, Irfan said the madrassa has enrolled 350 pupils for this academic session so far and the admissions was still in progress.

The student count is expected to increase as admissions continue, the teacher said.

The seminary has a three-tier academic structure. Classes 1 to 5, categorized as the primary level, are referred to as "Darja Tehtania"; classes 6 to 8, the junior level, are known as "Darja Faukania", while classes 9 to 12, comprising the high school and intermediate levels, are termed "Darja Alia.'

Irfan further said that teachers handling classes up to 10 are traditionally titled "Maulvi" or "Munshi," while those teaching Classes 11 and 12 hold the title of "Alim"

Over 400 jobless Bengal school employees block Kolkata road

Protesters demanded to be reinstated or at least allowed to work until December 31, following the court's directive that allowed some teachers to continue temporarily

Kolkata, April 28: Over 400 people, among the 25,753 teaching and non-teaching staff rendered jobless following the Supreme Court order April 3, Monday blocked the Hazra Crossing in south Kolkata demanding an audience with West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee.

Traffic came to a standstill for nearly an hour along the busy Asutosh Mukherjee Road-Hazra Road crossing as protesters voiced their anger at being labelled "tainted" despite qualifying in the 2016 WBSSC Recruitment Test.

They demanded to be reinstated or at least allowed to work until December 31, following the court's directive that allowed some teachers to continue temporarily As police tried to stop them

from moving towards the CM's official residence in Kalighat area, around 1 km away, the protesters scuffled with police and squatted in the middle of the road. Some of them were forced to

board waiting police vehicles, while others were persuaded to move to the side of road.

One protester, a woman ly-



ing in the middle of the road, refused to budge even after a senior police officer folded his hands and pleaded with her to move aside.

Another protester, holding up a photo of her OMR sheet.

accused the SSC of playing a "divisive game" by excluding her name from the list of "not specifically tainted" candidates submitted to the district inspec-

tor of schools in Cooch Behar. "We are facing social humiliation despite clearing the SSC exams fairly before 2016," said one teacher, who did not want

"If the Supreme Court itself said it couldn't distinguish between tainted and untainted candidates due to the corruption in the recruitment process, why is the state government isolating us?'

Bipul Jana, a former non-teaching staff member from a South 24 Parganas school, added, "While the SSC has sent lists of untainted teachers to respective DI offices in every region, no thought has been spared for the Group C and D staff. We earned our jobs in a fair way in 2016, but we are staring at an uncertain future because of the largescale irregularities committed by a section of the ruling party and government officials at that

time.

He also criticised the Chief Minister's announcement of a temporary allowance, saying, "The Rs 25,000 monthly allowance for Group C and Rs 20,000 for Group D employees until December 31 is simply not

The blockade, organised by the United Teaching and Non-Teaching Employees Forum, lasted around 40 minutes before police managed to clear the area.

He highlighted the special rituals for the day, including the application of sandalwood paste and offering 'Sattu' prashad to the deity to protect him from the heat.

'Bankey Bihari Maharaj wears a Peetambari (yellow-coloured dhoti) and Payal (anklets) on this day, a tradition started by Swami Haridas," he

The priest also mentioned that darshan of the lotus feet of the deity on Akshay Tritiya is considered equivalent to visiting the Badrinath Dham in Uttarakhand, which reopens today after the winter closure.

In Vrindavan's Radha Raman Temple, the day marks the start of a tradition where the deity is given a new floral abode daily. Dinesh Chandra Goswami, the temple priest, noted that this practice cools the deity as the sanctum is kept cool. New Delhi, April 28: The Supreme Court Monday allowed the return of passport to podcaster Ranveer Allahbadia to enable him to travel abroad for work.

A bench of Justices Surya Kant and N Kotiswar Singh relaxed the condition after Assam and Maharashtra governments said the investigation against him was complete. The bench asked Allahbadia to approach the Maharashtra cyber police bureau to retrieve his passport.

The top court told Allahbadia's lawyer, senior advocate Abhinay Chandrachud, it would consider his prayer to club the FIRs against his client and bring it in one place on the next hearing. Chandrachud said the Maharashtra FIR was the first one on the issue and the Guwahati FIR could be clubbed with it as it stemmed from the same facts and incident.

INDIA'S GOT LATENT **REMARKS ROW**

Justice Kant, however, told Chandrachud the Guwahati FIR comprised a different set of allegations, specific to people of Assam.

The bench also allowed NGO Cure SMA Foundation of India to implead "India's Got Latent" host Samav Raina and other co-accused through the police of Maharashtra and Assam, as their statements were recorded in the case. Senior advocate Aprajita Singh, representing the NGO, said they were not able to implead Raina and others in the case as respondents for want of their addresses and requested the bench to allow them to be made parties even without their particulars.

J&K Police raids dozens of places in Srinagar, Doda

Srinagar/Jammu, April 28: Police Monday carried out raids at dozens of places in Srinagar. Doda and Kishtwar in Jammu and Kashmir as part of the massive clampdown on terror ecosystem launched after the horrific Pahalgam terror attack that left 26 persons dead.

"The searches were conducted in accordance with proper legal procedures in the presence of executive magistrates and independent witnesses under the supervision of the officers of J-K Police," a spokesman said. He said the searches were carried out across the length and breadth of Srinagar city at 36 locations. Most of the premises belong to terrorists or terrorist sympathisers.

As part of the stepped-up anti-terror operations, security forces have raided more than 600 locations in the Vallev in just six days and grilled hundreds of suspects. Authorities have also demolished nine houses of suspected terrorists and overground workers of terror outfits since the April 22 attack in the lush meadows of Baisaran.

Sources said that police teams conducted searches at the premises of several individuals believed to be connected to terror groups and those operating from Pakistan-occupied

Build facilities, not just highways: SC to Centre

New Delhi, April 28: You are constructing huge highways but people are dying there because of lack of facilities, the Supreme Court Monday said as it pulled up the Centre over the delay in formulating a cashless scheme for treating motor accident victims.

A bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Ujjal Bhuyan observed despite its January 8 order, the Centre neither complied with the direction nor did it ask for an extension of time.

The top court said though Section 164A of Motor Vehicles Act was brought into force April 1, 2022 for a period of three years, the Centre did not implement it by framing the scheme for the interim relief to claimants.

'You are in contempt. You have not bothered to seek extension of time. What is this going on? You tell us when will you frame the scheme? You don't care for your own statutes. This is one of the welfare provisions. Three years (since) this provision has come



into place. Are you really working for the welfare of common man?" the bench asked. "Can you be so casual? Are you not serious about this provision? People are dying in road accidents. You are constructing huge highways but people are dying there because there is no facility. There is no scheme for golden hour treatment. What is the use of constructing so many highways?" the top court questioned the secretary of the Min-

istry of Road Transport further.

The golden hour under Section 2 (12-A) of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 refers to a one-hour window following a traumatic injury under which a timely medical intervention will most likely prevent death. The top court had summoned the official to explain the reasons for the delay in the scheme. The secretary on Monday said a draft scheme was prepared but a roadblock was hit as the General Insurance Council (GIC) raised objections.

"The GIC has not been coop-

erative. It has contended that it should be permitted to check the status of insurance policy of motor vehicle involved in an accident," the secretary said. The top court also recorded the submission that the scheme for golden hour will be brought into force within a week from Monday.

The bench then directed for the notified scheme to be placed on record by May 9 and posted

the matter May 13. On January 8, the top court directed the Centre to formulate the scheme for the cashless medical treatment of motor accident victims in the golden hour period mandated under the law. The bench referred to Section 162(2) of the Act, and ordered the government to provide by March 14 the scheme which could save numerous lives with prompt medical care to accident victims.

His closest competitor -- Shikha Swarai of the Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad (ABVP) -- secured 1,430 votes while Students' Federation of India (SFI)-supported Tayabba Ahmed polled 918 votes.

Manisha of the Democratic Students' Federation (DSF) won the post of vice-president by securing 1,150 votes, ahead of the ABVP's Nittu Goutham who polled 1,116 votes.

The DSF also bagged the general secretary's post, with Munteha Fatima polling 1,520 votes, ahead of the ABVP's Kunal Rai who secured 1,406

The ABVP clinched the post of joint secretary, with Vaibhav Meena polling 1,518 votes, ahead of AISA's Naresh Kumar (1,433 votes) and Progressive Students' Association (PSA) candidate Nigam Kumari (1,256 votes).

Meena's win marked the first time the ABVP has bagged a central panel post since Saurabh Sharma's victory on the same post in 2015-16. The last time the ABVP won the post of president was in 2000-01 when Sandeep Mahapatra had emerged victorious.

ABVP National General Secretary Virendra Solanki said that a new dawn of nationalism has begun in JNU.

NEET-UG plan laid out to prevent cheating

New Delhi, April 28: The Ministry of Education is holding a magistrates and superintendents of police from all states and Union territories to ensure there are no lapses in the upcoming medical entrance exam NEET-UG, sources said Monday.

The May 4 exam will be conducted in more than 550 cities at over 5,000 centres across the country. The ministry has been working on a "fool-proof" plan after the last year's exam was blistered by irregularities, including paper leaks.

"To ensure smooth, fair and secure conduct of NEET-UG, a series of meetings have been held with DMs and SPs of all states and UTs. The district-level coordination committees are being fully activated to manage logistics, security and crisis response," a source told PTI. "There will be multi-layered frisking by district police in addition to NTA-designated security at the centres. The transport of confidential materials like question papers and OMR sheets will be under full police escort. Coaching centres and digital platforms will be monitored to prevent organised cheating networks," the source added.

Duty Magistrates are being deployed for mandatory inspection of all examination centres, while there will be personal visits by DMs and SPs to exam centres to assess preparedness.

Under scrutiny over last year's irregularities in NEET-UG and PhD entrance NET,

the Centre had last year set up a panel to ensure "transparent, smooth and fair" conduct of exams by the National Testing Agency, or NTA. Last vear, the UGC-NET (University Grants Commission - National Eligibility Test) was cancelled as the ministry received input that its integrity had been compromised.

Both matters are being investigated by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) Two other exams -- CSIR-UGO NET, NEET-PG -- were cancelled at the last moment as a preemptive step.

This year, more than 23 lakh candidates are expected to ap pear for the exam which deter mines whether they will it to a medical college in the country "Monitored by the education ministry, 180 central institutions have been entrusted to verify the preparedness of the centres. The Ministry is closely working with the Home Ministry which also conducted meetings with state chief secretaries and DGPs to take stock of the ground situa-

tion," the source said. The NTA had Saturday a opened a platform to report suspicious claims regarding NEET-UG. "Candidates can re port any suspicious activities falling in three categories unauthorised websites or social media accounts claiming access to NEET question paper; indi viduals claiming access to ex am content and impersonators posing as NTA or government officials," NTA Director General Pradeep Singh Kharola said.

"The reporting form is simple and allows users to describe what they observed, where and when it occurred and upload supporting file. The initiative aligns with the Public Exam inations (Prevention of Unfair Means) Act, 2024 which aims to eliminate unfair practices in public examinations and protect the future of aspirants," he said.

here is many a slip between the bolt and the latch. A nation stands numbed, still seeking to come to terms with the pulse of Pahalgam. A laughing, smiling crowd of merrymakers had their reverie disrupted by blood and gore, with 26 people succumbing to terror attacks and numerous others injured. India is a country steamrollered by grief. The pain is palpable as people line up at the Attari border in Amritsar district to scurry back to Pakistan as the deadline for departure ends. Medical visas issued to Pakistani na-

tionals are valid only up to April 29. The neighbours may have denied any role in the attack, but India is holding Pakistan-based terror outfits complicit for the cold-blooded killings and has clamped down with a set of retaliatory measures. These include closure of the main border crossing, suspension of a landmark water-sharing treaty, and the expulsion of some diplomats. Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi has threatened to pursue the aggressors to the ends of the earth, with a resolve that he says should leave

no shred of doubt. Pakistan too has

announced retaliatory moves and sought evidence of Indian claims. It has termed Indian measures as unilateral, unjust, politically motivated, extremely irresponsible, and devoid of legal merit.

An offshoot of a Pakistan-based group has claimed responsibility for the attack, and thus the volley between the two countries goes on. There are numerous questions that nevertheless cry out for answers. The Prime Minister rightly cut short his visit to Saudi Arabia and returned home in the face of such a shocking development, but what followed thereafter was flabbergasting. Instead of visiting the blood-stained valley, his presence at an election rally in Bihar had the Oppositionboth the RJD and Congress-in uproar. The visuals of the rally, involving a conversation between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar on such a sombre occasion, did not inspire confidence in a nation bat-

The Leader of the Opposition, Rahul Gandhi, who was away in the USA, cut short his tour and returned



to India to be present at deliberations that may require his presence. He also visited the injured in hospital. The Union Home Minister, Amit Shah, conducted a full-scale security review of the prevailing situation in the valley. Officialdom, from its high perch, had time and again made it a point to scale up normalcy levels, pointing to the situation being well under control. And yet when shots reverberated in the area, it caught the bulk of the tourist population off guard—and the security agencies as well. "There was no security around in the area," went a common refrain.

Relatives of tourists from Gujarat, who had gone to the valley for a fun-time breather and a respite from the heat, were delirious with grief at their loss. "Our lives are peppered with taxes and tolls at every step, but when my husband needed protection and help there were none. It's the politician whose life only matters," said an angry Shital from Surat, whose husband Shailesh Kalathiya, a banker, paid with his life in the valley. She poured out her anguish before Union Water Resources Minister C. R. Patil, local MP Mukesh Dalal, and Gujarat Minister of State for Home, Harsh Sanghvi.

Kajal, the widow of a father and son from Bhavnagar who lost their lives in the salubrious climes of the valley, is numbstruck. The temple town of Palitana remained closed as a mark of respect for the deceased.

The one voice that emerges loud and clear from this entire episode is the need to refrain from playing cloaks and daggers with national sentiment. Electoral politics has its ifs and buts. It does not work and leaves society needlessly divided. There are those who gave up their lives in a desperate attempt to save the tourists. People in the valley have

voiced their solidarity with the visi-

tors and stood up to be counted. It is time that the ruling party stood up to shun elements who seek to divide

Unity is the need of the hour, and every Indian-Hindu or Muslimneeds to stand united for it. Already, political leaders in the valley have urged authorities to exercise caution to ensure that the rising tide of anger against the perpetrators of terror is not misdirected. There are reports of at least nine houses allegedly linked to militancy being targeted. Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah has pointedly called for restraint: "Punish the guilty mercilessly but ensure that the innocent do not become collateral damage," added the Chief Minister.

The Opposition stands firm with the government on the issue and is reaching out for a special session of Parliament to discuss the Pahalgam attack and measures needed in its wake. The Leader of the Opposition has made it clear that it will support all actions that the government takes on the matter. Worst happenings open the best doors, and it's never too late to make a beginning.



Trump administration's trade policy and the war in Ukraine. Delegates at a convention of Merz's centre-right Christian Democratic Union party approved the agreement that was reached earlier this month. German news agency dpa reported that the exact vote count was not released Monday. The would-be coalition aims to spur economic growth, ramp up defence spending, take a tougher approach to migration and catch up on long-neglected modernisation for the 27-nation European Union's most populous member. The deal still has a bigger hurdle to clear before parliament can meet to elect Merz. The junior partners in the prospective coalition, the centre-left Social Democrats of outgoing Chancellor Olaf Scholz, put the agreement to the ballot of their entire 358,000-plus membership. The results are expected Wednesday.

Power outage hits large parts of Spain, Portugal



Madrid/Lisbon, April 28: A huge power outage hit large parts of Spain and Portugal Monday, paralysing traffic, grounding flights, trapping people in elevators and leaving power operators scrambling to restore power to millions of homes and businesses.

Some hospitals halted routine work and the two countries' governments convened emergency cabinet meetings, with officials initially saying a possible cyber attack could not be ruled out. Outages on such a scale are extremely rare in Europe, and the cause could not immediately be established.

Reuters witnesses said power had started returning to the Basque country and Barcelona areas of Spain in the early afternoon, a few hours after the outage began. It was not clear

when power might be more widely restored.

Hospitals in Madrid and Cataluna in Spain suspended all routine medical work but were still attending to critical patients, using backup generators. Several Spanish oil refineries were shut down and retail businesses shut.

The Bank of Spain said electronic banking was functioning 'adequately' on backup systems. though residents also reported ATM screens had gone blank.

"I'm in a data centre, and everything has gone off. All the alarms popped up, and now we're with the groups, waiting to find out what happened. said Barcelona resident and engineer Jose Maria Espejo, 40.

In Portugal, water supplier EP-AL said water supplies could also be disrupted, and queues formed at stores by people rushing to purchase emergency supplies like gaslights, generators and batteries.

Putin announces May 8-10 ceasefire

Moscow, April 28: Russian Vladimir Putin President Monday declared a three-day ceasefire in May in the war with Ukraine to mark the 80th anniversary of the victory of the Soviet Union and its allies in World War Two.

The Kremlin said the 72-hour ceasefire would run May 8, May 9 - when Putin will host international leaders including Chinese President Xi Jinping for lavish celebrations to commemorate victory over Nazi Germany - and May 10.

Ukrainian Foreign Minister Andrii Sybiha, in response, said, "If Russia truly wants peace, it must cease fire immediately. Why wait until May 8th?

A ceasefire should be "real, not just for a parade," he posted

The White House said President Donald Trump wanted a permanent ceasefire between Russia and Ukraine. Against a background of increasing US impatience, Putin's move appeared aimed at signalling that Russia is still interested in peace - something that Ukraine

"All military actions are suspended for this period. Russia believes that the Ukrainian side should follow this example.' the Kremlin said in a statement on the May 8-10 ceasefire.

Canadians vote in election dominated by concerns about Trump

Ottawa, April 28: Canadians are going to the polls Monday after an election campaign in which US President Donald Trump's tariffs and musings about annexing Canada became the central issue.

Trump's threats ignited a wave of patriotism that swelled support for Liberal Prime Minister Mark Carney, a political newcomer who previously led two G7 central banks.

The campaign ended on a somber note Sunday after a man rammed an SUV through a crowd at a Filipino communitv festival in Vancouver, killing at least 11 people and injuring dozens.

Carney briefly paused his campaign, and both he and Conservative leader Pierre Poilievre mentioned the tragedy in their final campaign

events. Duane Bratt, professor of political science at Calgary's Mount Royal University, said he did not expect the mass casualty event to deter voters.

Carney's Liberals held a 2.7-point lead over Poilievre's Conservatives in national support, according to a CTV News-Globe and Mail-Nanos poll released Sunday. Nanos pegged the Liberals at 42.6% support and the Conservatives at 39.9%, in the poll. An EKOS poll Sunday sug-

gested the Liberals hold a sixpoint lead, and projected the Liberals to win a majority of seats in the 343-seat House of Commons and not need to rely on a smaller party to govern.

Trump re-emerged as a campaign factor last week, declaring that he might raise a 25% tariff on Canadian-made cars because the US does not want them. He said earlier he might

use "economic force" to make Canada the 51st US state.

"This is probably the most consequential election in my lifetime," said Kelly Saunders, a political science professor at Brandon University. "Everything has been so overshadowed by the threats coming out of the United States.

Carney has emphasized his experience handling economic issues makes him the best leader to deal with Trump, while Poilievre has tapped into concerns about the cost of living,



New Delhi, April 28: The government is collating data to figure out the quantum of indirect exports of Indian goods to Pakistan from third countries in a bid to check such rerouting of shipments to the neighbouring country, sources said.

The government is working with the industry to look into alternate routes for shipments of goods through air route in the backdrop of Pakistan closing its air space for Indian carriers, they said.

Goods like flowers, fruits and vegetables are exported through air routes to regions like Middle Eastern countries.

These restrictions have been imposed following the terrorist attack on tourists in Pahalgam last week. 26 people were killed in the horrific incident, evoking a sharp response from the government. The export data is being col-

lected from sources like customs, export promotion councils and other departments, the sources added. According to the econom-

ic think tank GTRI, Indian goods worth over \$10 billion are reaching Pakistan every year indirectly through ports, such as Dubai, Singapore, and Colombo, bypassing trade restrictions.

In 2022-23 and 2021-22, India exported goods worth \$627.1 million and \$513.82 million, and imported products worth \$20.11 million and \$2.54 million, respectively.

In April-January 2024-25, exports of organic chemicals and pharmaceutical products accounted for about 60 per cent of the country's total outbound shipments to Pakistan. It was \$129.55 million and \$110.06 mil-

cline as easing US-China trade tensions boosted investors' risk appetite, reducing demand for safe-haven assets like bullion while a stronger dollar added downward pressure on gold." Abans Financial Services' Chief Executive Officer Chintan Mehta said. On Friday, China announced it would exempt some US imports from its steep 125 per cent tariffs, though it denied that any formal trade talks were underway.

Meanwhile, the US Federal Reserve officials signalled that they see no immediate need to adjust monetary policy, choosing instead to monitor the economic impact of the Trump administration's tariffs.

This hawkish stance suggests that interest rate cuts may not materialise in the near term, further weighing on gold, which typically loses appeal as a non-yielding asset when interest rates stay elevated. Mehta further said, "Rising

Factory output slows to 4-year low in FY25

New Delhi, April 28: India's industrial production growth remains almost flat at 3 per cent in March sequentially, though, on a year-on-year basis, it slipped from 5.5 per cent, mainly due to poor performance of the manufacturing, mining and power sectors.

The government also revised the industrial growth figure downward to 2.7 per cent for February 2025 from the provisional estimate of 2.9 per cent earlier this month, according to the official data released Monday.

In the fiscal 2024-25, the IIP decelerated to a four-year low of 4 per cent. It was 5.9 per cent

in 2023-24 and the previous low was recorded at -8.4 per cent in

The growth was 11.4 per cent in 2021-22 and 5.2 per cent in

The factory output, measured in terms of the Index of Industrial Production (IIP), rose by 5.5 per cent in March 2024, as per the data.

The data released by the National Statistics Office (NSO) also showed that the manufacturing sector's output growth slightly decelerated to 3 per cent in March 2025 from 5.9 per cent in the year-ago month.

Mining production dipped to 0.4 per cent from 1.3 per cent growth a year ago. Power output also slowed

to 6.3 per cent in March 2025 against 8.6 per cent in the yearago period. As per use-based classifica-



tion, the capital goods segment growth decelerated to 2.4 per cent in March 2025 against 7 per cent in the year-ago period.

Consumer durables (or white goods production) grew 6.6 per cent during the reporting month against a growth of 9.5 per cent in March 2024. In March 2025, consumer

non-durables output contracted 4.7 per cent compared to a growth of 5.2 per cent a year

New Delhi, April 28: If India adds 50 gigawatts of renewable energy every year, it could completely stop importing thermal coal by 2029 and save about \$66 billion in foreign exchange between 2025 and 2029, according to a new report published Monday.

The total savings could be at least \$173 billion from 2025 to 2034, the report prepared by think tank Climate Risks Horizon said.

The climate and energy think tank said the country's electricity sector remains heavily dependent on coal imports, with around 20 per cent or 206 million tonnes of thermal coal imported in 2023-24 at a cost of \$21 billion.

Thermal coal imports have risen by 58 per cent between 2013 and 2023, but the value of these imports has increased by 124 per cent due to volatile global prices and a weakening rupee, it added.

The report said imports surge during the summer months, when cooling demand pushes up electricity consumption.

Over the said period (2013 to



2023), India imported around has been increasing steadily at 2,128 million tonnes of coal, 3.7 per cent annually and has mostly thermal coal used for gone up to 40 per cent since 2013. power generation

The think tank said India's dependency on imported coal poses both physical and finan-Physical risks arise with

any disruption in the supply of imported coal, either due to unforeseen political changes or natural disasters. The volatility in energy prices poses a significant financial risk to power companies and consumers dependent on imported coal, the authors of the study said.

The report warned that India's energy demand will continue to grow due to urbanisation, industrial growth and the greater use of electric technologies.

The per capita electricity consumption rose from 957 kilowatt-hour in 2013 to 1,331 kWh in 2022 and heatwaves linked to the climate crisis are further pushing up the power demand, it said. The think tank said ly expand renewable energy could significantly reduce coal imports. "On Monday, we have written to Churchill Brothers to return the I-League trophy," an AIFF source told PTI on condition of anonymity. "We are bound to obey CAS order. Let the CAS decide on the matter and we will hand over the trophy after the decision."

Meanwhile, GFA President Caitano Fernandes Monday wrote a letter to the AIFF Executive Committee members to hold an "urgent inquiry on the potential dis-



...the decision to proceed with the presentation in apparent disregard of a CAS directive brings serious embarrassment to AIFF. Ignoring a CAS order would undoubtedly have severe consequences for the AIFF and the reputation of Indian football on the international stage,' Fernandes wrote in the letter.

'Therefore, I implore the esteemed members of the Executive Committee to treat this matter with utmost seriousness it deserves. A comprehensive and impartial probe must be launched immediately to investigate...the rationale behind proceeding with the event."

He also claimed that he was not provided any communication regarding the I-League trophy presentation after he was initially invited for the formal ceremony Sunday. He said by doing so, the AIFF has shown "unacceptable level of mistreatment towards the GFA"

"On the evening of April 26th... I received an e-mail from

Mr Satvanarvanan inviting me in my capacity as GFA president and member of League Committee to attend the trophy presentation scheduled to take place in Goa on April 27th. The e-mail stated that the venue and specific schedule would be confirmed upon his arrival in Goa," he wrote.

Fernandes said he received no further communication regarding the trophy presentation and later came to know that the ceremony has already taken place "completely bypassing the involvement and presence of GFA"

He demanded a comprehensive and impartial probe on the reasons behind the failure to communicate the presentation details to GFA and the "utter

disregard shown to the GFA". Asked about Fernandes' claim, Satvanaravan said, "It was unintentional (development). The trophy was to be presented on April 26 initially but Churchill said to be done

INDIA BAG 13 GOLD MEDALS AT SOUTH ASIAN YOUTH TT CHAMPIONSHIPS

KATHMANDU: India bagged 13 gold and three silver in an impressive medal haul in the South Asian Youth Table Tennis Championships here. The qualification event for this year's Youth Asian Championships saw the Indian contingent dominate the



competition across various categories Sunday. The Indian teams grabbed three gold medals in the Under-19 girls, Under-15 boys, and Under-15 girls sections and made a clean sweep of all six golds in the U-19 and U-15 doubles, including the mixed doubles events. Additionally, India secured four gold medals in the U-19 boys and girls singles events. However, hosts Nepal claimed the fourth gold in the U-19 boys category. Despite a lone loss to Pakistan in the five-team league phase, Nepal finished on top with seven points, securing three wins and edging out Sri Lanka and Bangladesh, who took second and third place, respectively. India, having qualified for the Youth Asian Youth Championships last year, did not have to field its squad in the competition.

AMMAN: India continued its strong showing at Junior Asian Championships with seven more boxers, including six women, booking their place in the U-17 finals here. India has secured 43 medals so far, with 21 boxers across the U-15 and U-17 categories

set to fight for gold. The U-17 women boxers delivered an overall dominant display, led by Ahaana Sharma (50kg), who stormed into the final with a first-round knockout victory over Kyrgyzstan's Akmaral Amantaieva Sunday. Khushi Chand (44–46kg) edged Ukraine's Oleksandra Cherevata 3-2, while Jannat (54kg), Simranjeet Kaur (60kg), Harsika (63kg), and Anshika (80+kg) also registered commanding wins to confirm their places in the final bouts. In the men's U-17 section, Devansh (80kg) produced a composed performance to defeat Vietnam's Nguyen Trong Tien 4-1 and secure his spot in the final. This is the first event organised by Asian Boxing, endorsed by both the Olympic Council of Asia and the newly-formed World Boxing.

Bloody fingers just part of game in this traditional sport

IT'S THOUGHT THAT FINGER WRESTLING, POPULAR IN GERMANY'S ALPINE REGION AND NEIGHBOURING AUSTRIA, ORIGINATED AS A WAY TO SETTLE DISPUTES

Pang, April 28: Men in short leather pants and embroidered suspenders risked dislocated digits Sunday as they vied for the top prize at Germany's championship in the sport of fingerhakeln, or finger wrestling.

Around 180 competitors took part in Sunday's 64th German championship in Pang, about an hour's drive southwest of Munich.

It's thought that finger wrestling, popular in Germany's Alpine region and neighbouring Austria, originated as a way to settle disputes. The earliest depictions of the sport go back to the 19th century. Participants Sunday wore the traditional Ba-



varian dress known as tracht.

Two competitors sit on opposite sides of a table and each hooks one finger — usually the middle finger — through a

small leather loop. As soon as a referee signals the start, each contestant tries to pull the other across the table swiftly. The whole thing usually lasts a few

seconds, and dislocated fingers are common.

Special attendants sit behind each athlete to catch them should one of them suddenly

lose his grip and fly backwards. The winner moves to the next round. By custom, only men take part. Today fingerhakeln is highly organized and follows strict rules starting with exactly defined measurements for both the table and the leather loop. In Sunday's championship, there were several winners in different weight and age categories.

There are nine clubs in Germany and another four in neighbouring Austria, says Georg Hailer, chairman of Germany's oldest and biggest club,

Fingerhakler Schlierachgau. "It's not dangerous at all," Hailer said. "Of course, there will be open wounds and small injuries on the fingers from time to time. It looks worse than it really is, because there's blood." It's not just brute force but skill too, said Maximilian Woelfl, a wrestler from the Bavarian town of Laufach.

"There are different techniques — how do I sit at the table?" he said. "How do I transfer my power as quickly as possible to the loop? And of course you need a well-trained finger."

Competitors warm up by hoisting heavy blocks or pull ing on cables with their competition finger.

Later this summer, the Bavarian championships in Mittenwald will once again demand all the strength that the athletes can muster - and perhaps a few patches of skin.

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
