4 Odias among 14 dead in hotel blaze

Kolkata: A massive fire that tore through a budget hotel in the congested Mechuapatti area of Burrabazar in central Kolkata Tuesday night claimed at least 14 lives, including four from Odisha, and left 13 injured. The fire broke out around 7.30pm in the six-storey Rituraj Hotel and quickly engulfed the building, trapping several of the 88 guests staying in 42 rooms at the time. The deceased from Odisha have been identified as Manoj Kumar Patra, Dushmanta Kumar Nayak, Dushmanta Kumar Swain and Rajesh Santuka. **P8**

Centre okays caste census

Government slams Opposition for using it as ‘political tool’

In a surprise shift in policy, the Centre has announced the inclusion of caste enumeration in the long awaited nationwide census amid growing demands for social justice and representation. With the latest move, the ruling alliance hopes to blunt a key plank of the Opposition, especially in poll-bound Bihar, where caste dynamics play a pivotal role. Opposition parties, particularly the Congress and RJD, hailed the announcement as a victory for their decades-long demand, asserting that the government was compelled to concede under public pressure. With caste census emerging as a major electoral issue, the Centre's move is likely to reshape political narratives in Bihar and beyond

New Delhi, April 30: In a major decision, the government Wednesday announced that caste enumeration will be included in the next census exercise in a “transparent” manner and slammed the Opposition parties for using caste survey as a “political tool”.

The Congress and other Opposition parties have been vociferously demanding a nationwide caste census, making it a major

election issue, and some states like Bihar, Telangana and Karnataka have conducted such surveys. The government decision comes ahead of Assembly elections in Bihar, where several parties including some BJP allies have been coming out in support of the caste census.

Announcing the decision taken by the Cabinet Committee on Political Affairs, Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said the census comes under the purview of the Centre, but



some states have done caste enumeration in the name of surveys “non-transparently” which has created doubts in the society. Noting that caste was not included in all census operations conducted since Independence, Vaishnaw alleged that the Congress governments have always opposed caste census and the party had used the issue as a political tool.

“Considering all these facts and to ensure that the social fabric is not disturbed by politics, caste enumeration should

SC for inclusive KYC

Digital access intrinsic to right to life, says top court

New Delhi, April 30: Upholding inclusivity rights, the Supreme Court Wednesday directed changes in the digital KYC process enabling acid attack survivors and persons with visual disabilities to access banking services and welfare schemes, among others.

A bench of Justices JB Pardiwala and R Mahadevan passed 20 crucial directions to the Centre and its departments aside from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) for making the digital KYC process inclusive and accessible for the disabled.

The bench said bridging the digital divide was no longer merely a matter of policy discretion but a constitutional imperative to secure a life of

dignity, autonomy and equal participation in public life.

“The right to digital access therefore, emerges as an intrinsic component of the right to life and liberty, necessitating that the State proactively design and implement inclusive digital ecosystems that serve not only the privileged but also the marginalised, those who have been historically excluded,” the bench said.

In the contemporary era, the bench said, where access to essential services, governance, education, healthcare and economic opportunities was increasingly mediated through digital platforms, the right to life under Article 21 of the Constitution must be reinterpreted in light of these technological realities.

India shuts airspace for Pakistan airlines

New Delhi, April 30: India Wednesday closed its airspace for flights operated by Pakistan airlines in a fresh retaliatory move amid escalating tensions with the neighbouring country following the Pahalgam terror attack.

The Indian airspace will not be available for the aircraft registered in Pakistan as well as for planes operated, owned or leased by Pakistan airlines and operators. Also, the ban will be applicable for the military aircraft of Pakistan, a senior government official said.

A NOTAM (Notice to Airmen) was issued by the Airports Authority of India (AAI) Wednesday evening in this regard and it will be applicable till May 23.

According to the official, the ban will come into force from 12am Thursday. Generally, NOTAM is a notice having essential information for people involved in flight operations.

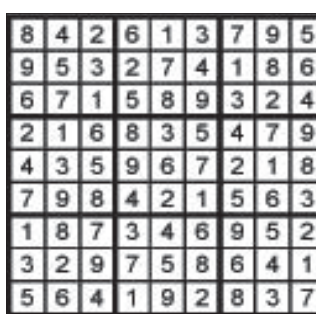

Excise Superintendent held by Vigilance on graft charge

Krishna Nayak caught with ₹3L cash as Vigilance uncovers luxury properties, vehicles, and hidden wealth

Bhubaneswar, April 30: The Vigilance Wednesday arrested the superintendent of excise of Dhenkanal on the charge of corruption, an official said.

“Acting on an intelligence input, our team Tuesday intercepted Krishna Nayak near Deulasahi road in Dhenkanal when she was travelling back home from office with ill-gotten cash of ₹3 lakh,” said Radhakrishna, the Superintendent of Police (Vigilance), Cuttack cell division.

The Vigilance seized the cash and her vehicle, and began search operations at her properties at five locations, he said.

During the raids, one triple-storey building at Jagatpur in Cuttack, a double-storey building in Puri, and eight high-value plots, including four

in Cuttack, two in Puri, and two in Jagatsinghpur, were found, the SP said.

Radhakrishna further said that two four-wheelers and over ₹20 lakh were found in her possession during the search operation.

“After detecting these properties from the excise superintendent, we have registered a corruption case and arrested her,” he stated.

In a related development, Bijay Kumar Mallik, a former godown in-charge, Dehunda additional storage point of MARKFED-Odisha, Balasore,

was convicted in a vigilance case Wednesday.

The officer, now retired, was charge-sheeted by Vigilance under different sections of the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 and IPC for misappropriation of government funds related to pilferage of fertilisers at the storage point.

Special judge, Vigilance, Balasore sentenced him to 3 years of rigorous imprisonment and imposed a fine of ₹50,000, officials said.

The Vigilance said it would move the competent authority to stop his pension.

Govt panel to review RTE admission row

Bhubaneswar, April 30: The School and Mass Education department Wednesday formed a committee to review the online admission process under the Right to Education (RTE) Act via the Paradarshi Portal, following complaints from parents about irregularities.

The committee will oversee admissions, address grievances, and suggest improvements to ensure transparency and fairness. It will be chaired by Additional Secretary Sangram Keshari Mohapatra. Members include Additional Secretaries Durga Prasad Mohapatra and Jadumani Mahala, and Deputy Director of Elementary Education Sushree Sangita Panda. Jadumani Mahala will act as the member convener.

The move comes amid protests by parents who alleged that 8,101 RTE applications were rejected without explanation and 5,239 students were left without school allotments.

₹9,200cr boost for 4 health institutes

Bhubaneswar, April 30: The Odisha government announced an investment of nearly ₹9,200 crore to upgrade healthcare infrastructure by redeveloping four major medical institutions, officials said Wednesday.

The decision was made in a high-level meeting chaired by Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi and attended by Health and Family Welfare Minister Mukesh Mahaling.

Veer Surendra Sai Institute of Medical Sciences

and Research in Burla will receive ₹1,594 crore for redevelopment, increasing its bed capacity from 1,485 to 2,861. MKCG Medical College and Hospital in Berhampur will be redeveloped at a cost of ₹1,014.13 crore, boosting its bed capacity from 1,583 to 2,033.

Rourkela Government Hospital (RGH) will receive ₹627.16 crore to expand its bed count from 437 to 763. Capital Hospital in Bhubaneswar will undergo a comprehensive redevelopment with an investment of ₹5,958 crore, increas-

ing its bed capacity from 750 to 2,582.

Additionally, the Chief Minister reviewed the ongoing redevelopment of Cuttack’s SCB Medical College and Hospital, which is being revamped with a ₹4,474.49 crore investment, aiming to complete the first phase by June 2026, increasing bed capacity to 3,796.

The Acharya Harihar Post Graduate Institute of Cancer is also undergoing redevelopment, with a ₹895.89 crore investment to increase its bed count to 1,127.

Man killed by younger brother

Bhubaneswar, April 30: A man was killed allegedly by his younger brother in Santipalli slum here, police said Wednesday.

The deceased was identified as Hamidul Khan, elder brother of the prime accused Imat Khan, a police officer said.

On a trivial matter, there was a quarrel between two brothers Tuesday, leading to the head injury to the deceased, he said.

Wednesday, the deceased complained of a headache. Then, he was shifted to hospital, where he was declared dead, the police said.

Saheed Nagar police arrested the main accused and further investigation is underway, the officer said.

BJD seeks OHRC action on child abuse

Young, old Indians flourish more than middle-aged

Global study led by Harvard and international partners reveals age-linked wellbeing trends across 22 countries, with India showing a U-shaped pattern

In India, youths and older adults are flourishing more than those middle-aged, a study of over 2 lakh people across 22 countries has suggested.

The ‘Global Flourishing Study’, conducted by researchers from institutes, including the US Harvard University and University of Bremen, Germany, is envisaged to understand factors that govern the well-being of an individual and a community.

Flourishing was defined as a state in which all aspects of a person’s life are good.

In Wave 1 of the study, questionnaire responses from 202,898 people from 22 countries, spanning six continents, were analysed. Findings are published in the journal Nature.

“Flourishing tends to increase with age in many countries, including Argentina, Aus-

tralia, Brazil, Sweden and the United States (US), but not in all. In India, Egypt, Kenya and Japan, patterns are somewhat more U-shaped,” the authors wrote.

The questionnaires surveyed people about aspects of well-being, such as happiness, health, meaning and relationships, along with demographic, social, political, religious factors and childhood experiences.

While men and women globally showed similar flourishing patterns, notable gender gaps emerged in some countries — men in Brazil reported significantly higher levels of flourishing than women, whereas in Japan, women reported flourishing more than men.

Further, those married were found to report a higher flourishing, compared to those single, in most countries.

However, in India and Tan-



zania, married people reported lower flourishing than those single.

The study also found that people employed reported higher flourishing than those not. Self-employment, retirement and being a student related with more satisfaction than

being employed in countries, including India, Japan, Israel and Poland.

The authors also found that young people around the world “are not doing as well as they used to”.

Despite country-wise differences in patterns of satis-

faction with age, “the overall global pattern is troubling”, they said.

They added that more data collected over time will help resolve if these patterns are an ‘age effect’ or a ‘cohort effect’.

The analysis found that India’s strengths lie in housing, government services, political voice, and city satisfaction, while concerns persist around education, low engagement with life, and financial insecurity.

The Global Flourishing Study is expected to help understand ‘flourishing’ in general, especially in non-Western contexts. It is also expected to uncover which patterns are culturally specific and which more universal.

The study is aimed at supporting and expanding upon findings from similar studies such as the World Happiness Report.

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Jumbo tramples woman to death; hubby critical

Keonjhar, April 30: A woman was trampled to death and her husband sustained grievous injuries in elephant attack at a cashew orchard under Telkoi forest range in Keonjhar forest division Wednesday.

The deceased was identified as Labanya Palei, 45, and the injured as Jadu Palei of Udayagiri village under Telkoi police limits in Keonjhar district. The injured man has been admitted to Keonjhar district headquarters hospital after preliminary treatment at Telkoi community health centre (CHC).

The mishap sparked tension in the area as several residents gheraoed the forest range of

fice holding the forest officials responsible for the incident. Range officer Shivaji Mohan Rao said despite conducting a series of awareness programmes and issuing timely alert, people continue to venture into areas visited by the animals. This, in turn, results in man-animal conflicts and subsequent casualties.

The villagers relented after Rao assured them of ₹6 lakh compensation to the bereaved family, as per government norms.

“We are trying to drive away the elephant herd from human habitations to forest areas, he said. Moreover, elephant squads have been deployed to track the movement of the jum-

bos and issue timely alert to the villagers accordingly.

The incident occurred when the couple visited a nearby cashew orchard to collect cashews where a herd of 16 elephants had camped. One of the elephants noticed the couple and attacked them.

The animal lifted Labanya on its trunk and crushed her under its feet, leaving her critically injured. Meanwhile, Jadu, rushed to save his wife but the elephant attacked him as well and left him severely injured.

On being informed, forest officials reached the spot and rushed them to Telkoi CHC. Later, they were shifted to the DHH as their health condition deteriorated. When the woman’s condition worsened further, she was referred to SCB Medical College and Hospital in Cuttack. However, she succumbed on the way to Cuttack. Jadu is now recuperating at Keonjhar DHH.

Sources said around 37 elephants in two herds are roaming around under Telkoi forest range close to Dhenkanal border for the last few days. The villagers are spending sleepless nights as the animals are destroying their crops and properties.

Skeletal remains found; foul play suspected

Baripada, April 30: Skeletal remains of a man in his 50’s were spotted by a few local women in Kusumghati forest in Badagaon panchayat under Bangiriposhi police station in Mayurbhanj district Wednesday, indicating a foul play in the incident.

On being informed, Badagaon Forest Range personnel recovered the skeletal remains and informed the police who reached the spot and sent them to PRM Medical College and Hospital for a post-mortem.

Since the death occurred around 30-40 days ago, the body is beyond recognition. However, Bangiriposhi IIC Virendra Senapati confirmed that the elder brother and sister-in-law of the deceased identified it to be that of Sania Dehuri, a resident of Badagaon village. They recognised him from his clothes



and slippers, the IIC said.

Cops registered a case (12/25) of unnatural death and began an investigation.

The deceased’s family members alleged that Sania had gone into Kusumghati forest—part of Similipal Tiger Reserve (STR)—several days ago to collect forest produce but didn’t return. Despite the family’s efforts to locate her, no missing complaint was filed at the time, said the police.

Based on a written com-

plaint from the Forest department, a scientific team and police personnel collected the samples from the site for further analysis.

Given the advanced decomposition of the remains, officials estimate that the death occurred around 30 to 40 days ago. The identity of the deceased and the cause of death will be ascertained only after the post-mortem and DNA reports are received, the police added.

Meanwhile, speculations are doing the rounds about the circumstances leading to Sania’s death. Locals alleged that some members of the Forest department’s Green Force had previously misbehaved with a few women collecting forest produce, and that Sania had opposed such behaviour. The villagers had reportedly lodged a complaint at the range office, leading to the transfer of two forest personnel, it was alleged.

Some community members suspect that Sania might have been attacked in connection with the incident.

Stating that it would be premature to speculate anything now, Deputy Director of South Division of STR Samrat Gouda said, “There was no formal complaint lodged regarding alleged misbehaviour of women. The transfer orders were issued owing to some other reasons.”

Tractor overturns; 2 killed

Balasure: Two youths died when a tractor in which they were travelling in overturned in Balasure district Wednesday, police said. The incident occurred at Talakurunia village under Gopalpur police station. The deceased were identified as Satyajit Malik, 20, and Dinesh Panigrahi, 18, police said. They were using the tractor to collect paddy from agricultural land. The driver saved his life by jumping off the vehicle before it rolled down a roadside ditch and overturned, police said.

4 Odias among 14 die in Kolkata fire

Bhubaneswar: At least four persons from Jagatsinghpur district were among the 14 killed in the devastating fire at a hotel in central Kolkata, family sources claimed. The deceased have been identified as Manoj Kumar Patra, Dushmanta Kumar Nayak and Dushmanta Kumar Swain from Jagatsinghpur district, and Rajesh Santuka from Cuttack district. BJD president and former chief minister Naven Patnaik in a post on X said: “It is heartbreaking to learn of the untimely death of 14 people, including four from Odisha’s Jagatsinghpur and Cuttack districts in a hotel fire in Kolkata. I pray for the eternal peace of their souls and express my deepest condolences to the bereaved families.” A massive fire that tore through a budget hotel in the congested Mechuapatti area of Burrabazar in central Kolkata Tuesday night claimed at least 14 lives and left 13 injured, officials said. The majority of the victims died due to suffocation, while a few reportedly jumped off upper floors in panic, they said.



Two killed in lightning

Padmapur, April 30: A minor boy and a woman were killed after lightning struck them on a farmland during a thunderstorm at Lakhmara village under Jagdalpur police limits in Bargarh district Wednesday afternoon.

The deceased were identified as Mamata Meher, 40, and her nephew Ashis Meher, 14, of the village. The duo was working on the farmland when heavy rain accompanied by gusty winds lashed the area. They



took shelter in a shanty but lightning struck them, rendering them critical.

Family members rushed them to Padmapur sub-divisional hospital where doctors pronounced them dead. Jagdalpur police registered two cases of unnatural death and sent the bodies for post-mortem.

NGT forms panel to probe ‘illegalities’ at Balasure firm

Balasure, April 30: The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has constituted a four-member high-level fact-finding committee to investigate alleged illegal activities at Gadre Marine Export Private Ltd operating in Balasure district.

The committee has been directed to conduct an on-site investigation at the plant located at Tundura Chhak and submit its report to the tribunal within four weeks.

This was revealed by Bipin Bihari Das, president of Purbanchal Bikas Parishad, a local outfit, during a press conference held at Balasure Station Club Sunday.

Established near Kantia-chara River in 2023, Gadre Marine Export Pvt. Ltd. processes rotten fish to manufacture its products. The company reportedly produces 500 metric tonne fish feed and 10,800 metric tonne surimi annually. According to

the company’s declaration, about 850 cubic metres of groundwater are extracted daily for its operations, raising concerns about excessive groundwater usage.

In addition, the discharge of polluted water from the company has been causing environmental damage, including reduced soil fertility. The company is also alleged to have blocked a catchment area, preventing proper drainage of floodwaters. Recently, a leakage in gas pipeline at the facility resulted in the death of two employees, raising serious concern about workplace safety standards.

Highlighting these issues, Das filed a complaint with the NGT’s Kolkata bench. Responding to the complaint, the environment watchdog issued notices to the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, the State Pollution Control Board (SPCB), the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB), the Central Ground

Water Board (CGWB), the promoters of the fish processing unit, and relevant departments of the state government, directing them to submit their responses within four weeks.

The tribunal has formed a four-member committee comprising representatives from the Central Ground Water Board’s regional director, senior scientists from the pollution control board, the SPCB, and the District Collector of Balasure, who has been appointed as the nodal officer.

The NGT has instructed this committee to submit a comprehensive investigation report within one month.

Advocates Biplab Kumar Yadav and Pratap Chandra Mohanty were also present at the press conference.

Meanwhile, repeated attempts to contact Sachin Sourav, senior official of the company on his mobile number @8668532706 went unanswered.

COPS CRACK BIZMAN'S MURDER, ARREST TWO

Boudh, April 30: Boudh Police Wednesday cracked the murder of a young businessman and arrested two persons in this connection.

Addressing a presser, Boudh Superintendent of Police (SP) Rahul Goel said that businessman K Manoj Patra was murdered by a group of miscreants who attempted to rob him three days ago. When he refused to hand over the money, the assailants fatally stabbed him in the back and chest with sharp weapons.

The incident took place near Jagadishpur Chhak on Boudh-Baghiapada road around 5pm April 27. The attackers fled the scene immediately after committing the crime.

Police swung into action and identified the accused before arresting two of them. The arrested were identified as Ashish Luha alias Kuluhu, 19, of Bapuji Nagar in Boudh and Ashin Deep, 18, of Baghiapada



(Salibanka). The third accused is still at large, efforts are underway to apprehend him soon, said Goel.

Police recovered a knife, a

scooter, and a mobile phone from the arrested persons. Boudh police registered a case (225/25) and produced the duo in the court.

NIT Rourkela to host CSAB for admissions to IITs, NITs

New Delhi, April 30: National Institute of Technology (NIT), Rourkela will be coordinating Central Seat Allocation Board (CSAB) 2025 for the academic year 2025-26, facilitating admissions to undergraduate programmes at IITs, NITs and other institutions, officials said Wednesday.

“CSAB 2025 is designed to offer a seamless, transparent, and inclusive seat allocation process for JEE (Main) qualified candidates across the nation. Simultaneously, Direct Admission of Students Abroad (DASA), 2025 underscores commitment to welcoming international students to India’s leading technical insti-



tutions,” said Umamaheshwar Rao, Director, NIT Rourkela, and Chairperson, CSAB

“With strong digital systems, multilingual assistance, and dedicated accessibility initiatives, we are focused on ensuring a smooth and student-centric admission experience for all aspirants, domestic and international alike,” he said.

The NIT has also confirmed that CSAB-NEUT rounds for candidates from Northeast states

and select Union territories will begin in June 2025, under AICTE’s reservation scheme for regions lacking such facilities.

While NIT Rourkela will lead the NIT System, IIT Kanpur will lead the IIT System, and both these institutes will co-host the 2025 edition of Joint Seat Allocation Authority (JoSAA). Activities of JoSAA 2025 will commence in the first week of June 2025.

There will be six rounds of seat allocation in the 2025 edition of JoSAA, the officials said.

“Like previous years, CSAB shall also organise CSAB-Special rounds of seat allocation to fill the vacant seats resulting after all rounds of JoSAA 2025. This year, CSAB-Special will be

of three rounds,” they added.

just a source of acute danger on India's borders, but more importantly it is also an enemy of the Pakistani people, with its critics, politicians, human rights activists and journalists being vanished, kidnapped, tortured and killed. Currently, it is fighting on two fronts, in Balochistan, against the people who are fighting for their basic rights, and across the Durand Line. Balochistan, the richest province of Pakistan is also the poorest in that country, and any protests against the injustice is put down with no mercy.

It has killed Pakistani patriots striving for democracy, trade unionists, poor peasants in Sindh, Balochs and Pathans and repeatedly seized power to deny that benighted country rule by people. It is mercenary in character, and has offered its services to whoever is ready to pay, including the Americans, Saudis and now the

Chinese, whose CPEC (China-Pakistan Economic Corridor) projects it is guarding. Such is its hireling nature that it killed Palestinians by thousands in Jordan in 1965 in what is known as Black September. It took billions of dollars from Saudis and sophisticated arms from US to fight the Soviets in Russia, and introduced guns and drugs in Afghanistan and Pakistan, unmindful of the damage it would cause to both societies.

Its repeated defeats in wars with India have taught the Pakistani army that it cannot win a conventional war with India. So, it funds and trains radicalised fundamentalist elements which it pushes across the border into Kashmir to visit violence on a state that has suffered for decades.

To deal with such a degenerate force, India will have to act with tact, mounting relentlessly a range of sub-kinetic ops. Taking high-profile actions

in a hurry may satisfy popular anger over the Pahalgam killings, but it is more desirable to exhaust the enemy to a point of collapse. Balochistan is Pakistani army's Achilles' heel. India must give all help to Balochistan Liberation Army (BLA) which has the determination and a newly-developed capacity to hurt the army most. At the same time, the barely-suppressed anger of the people in PoK and Gilgit-Baltistan must be stoked. Sabotage and counter-terrorism ops should be mounted, but all kinetic actions must be cloaked in plausible deniability.

Indian agencies must stoke the simmering discontent against Pakistani army within that country, particularly in the light of its harsh crackdown on Imran Khan's PTI. There is a huge constituency within Pakistan that is aware that the army's rapacious looting of the national resources is what has led the country teetering on the edge of sovereign default, and denied democracy.

New Delhi must take a page out of the US playbook, where CIA's actions are not announced, with the standard comment from the administration being that "it does not comment on operations." India's actions must be governed by Sun Tzu's dictum: "The supreme art of war is to subdue the enemy without fighting."

Treading the Tightrope

The International Monetary Fund and the World Bank are in a difficult position. Established to uphold global rules and support development, they are now caught between an aggressively nationalist America – their largest shareholder – and the rest of the world. If their leaders speak truth to power, they risk US President Donald Trump's wrath. If they don't, they risk their own legitimacy.

The challenge of walking this tightrope was evident at last week's Spring Meetings of the IMF and the World Bank. The IMF's mandate is to stand guard over countries' exchange rates and policies that affect global financial stability. This involves "calling out" those whose actions will impoverish their neighbours. So far, the Fund has not named the United States as its main rule-breaker. But ahead of the Spring Meetings, IMF Managing Director Kristalina Georgieva responded to the Trump administration's unpredictable behaviour by acknowledging the "off the charts" uncertainty caused by US tariffs, reiterating the need for central-bank independence, and urging countries to avoid "self-inflicted injuries."

In early April, World Bank President Ajay Banga emphasized the Bank's focus on its core mandate: driving development and reducing poverty. For several decades, the World Bank has supported efforts – particularly infrastructure investments – to lift millions of people out of poverty. But Trump's dismantling of the US Agency for International Development has decimated programmes that enabled the Bank's work. Instead of addressing this issue at the Spring Meetings, Banga focused on job creation amid rising unemployment worldwide. The Bank has also begun promoting nuclear and technology-agnostic energy solutions to appeal to a US administration that is allergic to climate action.

How the IMF and the World Bank approach the Trump administration will determine their effectiveness. The first 100 days of Trump's second term offer insights into the strategy they should pursue.

First, they could be targeted and should plan accordingly. Trump's takeover of Washington's John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts shows that no organisation is safe – some of America's largest NGOs and philanthropies are already preparing for funding cuts. Moreover, the IMF and the World Bank are mentioned in Project 2025, the conservative blueprint for Trump's second presidency published by the Heritage Foundation, and included in the 180-day review of US involvement in international organisations that Trump ordered on 4 February. True, the team overseeing the review has been dismissed, throwing the process into disarray. But that may not be an obstacle, given the administration's propensity to act without restraint.

Second, policymakers must bat away non-credible threats. When Mark Carney became Canadian prime minister in March, after Justin Trudeau stepped down, he insisted in his first conversation with Trump that the US president recognise Canada's sovereignty (Trump also addressed Carney as "Prime Minister," whereas he had often referred to Trudeau as "Governor"). It helped that Trump's bluster about annexing Canada lacked political backing in Washington, much less a feasible plan.

The situation is somewhat murkier for the IMF and the World Bank. At the Spring Meetings, US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent criticized both institutions, but said the US would maintain its leadership role and expand its global influence.

Other countries must now decide the extent to which they are prepared to let one shareholder unilaterally determine the future of institutions that rely on their financial contributions and participation.

Third, no institution is alone. Whether and how the IMF and the World Bank accede to Trump's demands will affect the ecosystem in which they operate. US law firms that capitulated to Trump, who wielded the threat of illegal executive orders, may have ensured their own survival, but they have eroded the US legal system's legitimacy. The same goes for Columbia University, whose acquiescence to government oversight has undermined academic freedom.

The IMF's ability to achieve its objectives depends on the confidence of central bankers and policymakers worldwide, and maintaining it requires accurate reporting on the global economy. The World Bank, for its part, relies on thousands of firms and community organisations throughout the developing world, and its approach to infrastructure and energy projects sets standards for others to follow.

Fourth, as Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy discovered, Trump puts a premium on personal relationships. But the right response is not capitulation. Both Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni and British Prime Minister Keir Starmer have been able to maintain a working relationship with Trump by employing flattery and avoiding concrete commitments. This is new terrain for the IMF and World Bank, whose leaders are used to working with the US Departments of State and the Treasury, as well as Congress. Now, the IMF's managing director and the Bank's president must take a much more active role in relationship management with the White House.

Beyond the Trump administration, the IMF and the World Bank must remember their other stakeholders in the US: the American people. For example, support by religious organisations for debt relief for the poorest countries in the 1990s enabled the IMF and the World Bank to act on the issue.

The Trump administration shut down USAID despite agency officials' warnings that one million children will go untreated for severe malnutrition, up to 166,000 people will die from malaria, and 200,000 more children will be paralyzed by polio over the next decade. But many Americans support foreign aid, and more than half give to charity each year, often to help the poorest in other countries. Moreover, one-quarter take the time to volunteer, and some 240,000 have served in the Peace Corps since 1961.

As the heads of the IMF and the World Bank steer these institutions into the future, they must strike a delicate balance between confronting and conceding to the White House.

But staying on Trump's good side is not enough to pursue their missions: they must also be mindful of the world within and outside of America.

Workers' rights in jeopardy

The International Labour Day commemorates the untiring efforts and struggles of workers worldwide while acknowledging their hard work, dedication and sacrifices. Labour Day is a poignant reminder of the importance of protecting workers' interests and promoting social justice. It commemorates the historical struggle for an 8-hour workday and a 48-hour workweek. This demand stemmed from the harsh working conditions of the Industrial Revolution, where workers faced long hours and difficult circumstances. The movement for an 8-hour day gained momentum through trade unions and socialist movements, leading to the Haymarket insurrection in Chicago, a pivotal event in the fight for workers' rights. The International Labour Organization (ILO) later endorsed the 8-hour day, solidifying its significance in the global labour movement.

Despite India's labour laws capping working hours at 48 per week under the Factories Act, 1948, many employees, particularly in urban areas, often find themselves working overtime without adequate compensation. Labour laws, though designed to protect workers, are not always effectively enforced, leaving employees vulnerable to exploitation. Unfortunately, there is talk of increasing

working hours from 48 hours to 70 hours to even 90 hours per week to enhance the profits of employers to the detriment of work-life balance. The new Indian Labour Code allows for a 4-day workweek, but with the requirement of longer daily shifts to meet the maximum weekly working hours of 48 hours. This means employees might be working up to 12-hour days to fulfil their weekly obligations.

Wide-ranging research indicates that long work hours lead to increased stress, burnout, and serious health problems. Besides, they can encumber productivity as individuals' capacity to perform effectively reduces after a certain threshold.

Workers' rights are now in jeopardy. The gulf between the rich and the poor has widened, and this is due to a greater level of exploitation of labour by capital. Today, capital exploits labour more than ever due to increased automation, the rise of gig economies, rising unemployment and globalised supply chains. Automation is leading to job displacement, but it is not creating new jobs in tandem with decline of jobs. These changes are leading to lower wages, precarious work conditions, and less worker power. Yet, capital tends not only to exploit labour-power, but also ignores its contribution to the development process. Capitalists seek to

obscure workers' contribution to that process, whereas workers strive to have their contribution fully recognised.

Real wages - nominal wages factoring inflation - are among the most significant economic indicators of labour's welfare. If the real wages don't increase in tandem with the rise of GDP, or there is no substantial increase in real wages with passage of time, then labourers are exploited. That is precisely what seems to be happening in India today. The combination of slow wage growth and back-breaking inflation has triggered an unprecedented decline in real wages. Thus, India's economic boom camouflages the wage crisis.

As per the Economic Survey 2025, despite India's growth, real wages for men have dropped, exacerbating inequality. Inflation is outpacing wage growth, eroding purchasing power and deepening economic inequality. In 2023-24, real monthly wages for male salaried workers were 6.4% lower than in 2017-18, showing a significant loss of purchasing power. For self-employed men, real incomes dropped by 9.1% over the same period. The squeeze is even more apparent in rural India. Both sources point to a virtual stagnation of real wages in the last 10 years or so.

To the detriment of working-class people, India is

poised to formally launch the long-anticipated labour reforms under a new legal framework. The Labour ministry has decided to amalgamate 44 labour laws into four codes—on wages, industrial relations, social security and safety, health and working conditions. The 29 central laws will be streamlined into four consolidated codes. Though, it is propagated that the new labour codes are a transformative step for India's employment landscape, actually, they will adversely affect the interest of workers and will create an ecosystem to instil fear among workers and curb their striking power and democratic rights. The rights of workers, particularly their ability to form trade unions, organise strikes, and bargain collectively will be eroded. The Indian Constitution that protects fundamental rights including freedom of association will be undermined.

Many years ago, Dr Martin Luther King Jr. had famously asserted that the dignity of all work was essential to our health and well-being. He was not just making a moral observation. He was calling for genuine equality through an increase in wages, healthcare, job safety and economic power.

Gurugram gasps for air

Bandhwari landfill fire doused but toxic fumes fill sky

Gurugram, April 30: A fire that broke out at the Bandhwari landfill site in Gurugram two days ago has been doused but the locals are grappling with the effects of toxic fumes that have filled the air. A local resident said the repeated fires in the garbage mountain in Bandhwari landfill site have caused more trouble for the people living nearby. The smoke generated from these fires makes them gasp for air, the resident said. According to officials, over 25 fire tenders were deployed to control the fire that broke out at the landfill site two days ago. It took firefighters 16 hours to completely douse the blaze, they said.



However, it was not the lone incident in the area. In 2024, more than 70 fire incidents were reported in the Bandhwadi landfill site between March and June. Methane gas builds up under garbage in landfills due to the decomposition of organic waste in the absence of oxygen. When it comes in contact with air, it catches fire immediately, according to a Municipal Corporation Gurugram (MCG) official. Due to the intensity of the

fire, it becomes difficult to control it, he added. An official said that during a preliminary investigation, waste littering in the forest area emerged as the reason behind the recent fire at the landfill site. Meanwhile, citizen groups and environmentalists have raised demands for a special force to protect Aravallis. The forest department had announced that a special force would be formed that would patrol the protected Aravallis and

curb illegal encroachments, illegal mining, tree felling etc. But the project has long been shelved. A senior forest officer said that the forest department will establish over 50 security outposts for almost 1 lakh hectares of the Aravallis in south Haryana. At present, hundreds of forest guard posts are lying vacant and they will have written to the government to recruit more forest guards, he added.

Presiding seer of Ayodhya's Hanuman Garhi steps out after centuries to visit Ram Temple

Ayodhya, April 30: Mahant Prem Das Wednesday became the first head priest of Ayodhya's Hanuman Garhi in over 300 years to step outside the revered temple's premises as he led a procession to the Ram temple on Akshaya Tritiya festival. Das visited the newly consecrated Ram Temple in a grand 'Shahi Juloos' (royal procession) in a historic and emotional departure from a centuries-old religious tradition that forbade the head priest from ever leaving the 52-higha premises of Hanuman Garhi during his lifetime. Thousands of Naga Sadhus, devotees and disciples joined the procession, which featured elephants, horses, camels and musical performances by local troupes. The spiritual journey began at the banks of the Saryu River, where Mahant Prem Das and others performed a ritual bath, before proceeding to offer prayers at the Ram Temple. "This tradition has been fol-



lowed for 288 years, since 1737," said Mahant Sanjay Das, a senior seer of Hanuman Garhi. The Mahant's role is to devote himself entirely to Lord Hanuman. Once he is anointed to the seat, he lives and dies within the temple premises. His body can only leave after death. Mahant Ramkumar Das, chief of the Nirvani Akhara, told PTI that due to the presiding seer's deep desire to visit the Ram Temple, he was granted this once-in-a-lifetime permission. According to the constitution of Hanuman Garhi, formalised in 1925, these traditions were recognised and enforced by the Naga Sadhus. "Even in civil matters, the courts have respected this tradition," said Sanjay Das. "If needed, a representative

of the Akhara appears in court. In fact, in the 1980s, the court itself held sessions inside Hanuman Garhi to record statements from the Mahant," he said. However, the recent decision was not taken lightly. It came only after the 'Panch' (governing members) of the Nirvani Akhara -- the esteemed religious body that oversees Hanuman Garhi -- unanimously permitted the Mahant's wish to visit Ram Lalla's temple. Mahant Ramkumar Das, chief of the Nirvani Akhara, said, "The presiding seer's deep desire to visit the Ram Temple was heartfelt. After ritual discussions and overwhelming spiritual consensus, the Akhara granted this once-in-a-lifetime permission." The procession carried the Akhara's 'Nishaan' (insignia) with immense reverence and symbolism. Alongside the Mahant were large groups of temple disciples, local shopkeepers and worshippers who saw the event as a powerful expression of religious unity and devotion.

Akhilesh-Ambedkar poster sparks political storm in UP

Lucknow, April 30: A political storm has erupted in Uttar Pradesh over a controversial poster put up outside the Samajwadi Party office in Lucknow that features half and half faces of party chief Akhilesh Yadav and BR Ambedkar. BSP chief Mayawati took veiled potshots at Yadav while the BJP was staging sit-ins and protests against the poster. The SP has since dissociated itself from the poster, but the controversy has refused to die down with rival parties demanding an apology from Yadav. "We won't relent until the SP chief tenders apology," said BJP cadres who staged a sit-in at the Ambedkar statue at Lucknow's Hazratganj. Similar protests by the BJP were seen in other parts of the state. The SP hit back at its rivals

and suggested that the poster could be the work of the BJP. When asked about the poster, SP chief spokesperson Rajendra Chowdhary told PTI, "This is not the official poster of Samajwadi Party... We are not aware of who has put this up. Anyone can put up a poster anywhere. Maybe it's the work of BJP men." "Samajwadi party is fighting to save the Constitution of Dr BR Ambedkar and getting tremendous response from the people," he added. The SP leadership, buoyed by the party's impressive showing in the 2024 Lok Sabha polls in UP, has been trying to woo the Dalits, once considered loyal to the BSP, and competing with the BJP for support of the OBCs, considered the mainstays of BJP's phenomenal wins in UP since the 2014 Lok Sabha polls. In the 2024 Lok Sabha polls, the SP, in alliance with Congress, managed to check the BJP's growing dominance in the state and dealt an embarrassing blow when SP's Dalit leader Awadhesh Prasad defeated his BJP rival from the

Faizabad Lok Sabha seat. The constituency is part of Ayodhya, where only a few months back the Ram temple was built under BJP governments in the state and Centre. The BJP regained some of its lost momentum when it won the subsequent by-polls in SP bastions of Kundarki, a Muslim-dominated seat, and Katehari, a seat with sizable OBC, Dalit and minority voters. Yet, the SP has continued to pursue more support from these groups and has opened its doors to many Dalit and OBC leaders who were previously with BSP. Mayawati Wednesday named the SP and Congress in a social media post asking them to refrain from "insulting" Ambedkar or her party BSP would be forced to take to the streets in protest. Barely two days before Ambedkar's birth anniversary (April 14), SP chief Yadav unveiled a statue of Ambedkar in Etawah April 12, praising the Dalit icon widely regarded as the architect of the Indian Constitution.

The poster controversy has now given the BJP some ammunition to hit back at the SP, the main Opposition party in the UP, and its attempts to pitch itself as a party for Dalits

Delhi weddings surge on Akshaya Tritiya

New Delhi, April 30: Wedding-related businesses in Delhi are expected to surpass Rs 1,000 crore in one day as the national capital is witnessing around 21,000 marriages to coincide with Akshaya Tritiya -- an auspicious day in the Hindu calendar. Akshaya Tritiya, celebrated annually on the third day of the bright half of Hindu calendar month Vaisakha, falls Wednesday this year. According to the Chamber of Trade and Industry (CTI), this is one of the peak days of the wedding season, benefiting a wide range of businesses including banquet halls, hotels, caterers, salons, decorators, event man-



agers, and orchestras. CTI estimated that the overall wedding-related business in the Delhi Wednesday could exceed Rs 1,000 crore. "Rates of banquet halls and hotels have seen a 10-15 per cent increase due to high demand," CTI Chairman Brijesh Goyal said. CTI General Secretary and gold trader Gurmeet Arora said that the gold and silver trade alone is expected to see a turnover of around Rs 200 crore. However, with gold prices at record

highs, buyers are showing more interest in light-weight jewellery. "The price of gold has risen significantly. Ten grams of gold is currently priced at around Rs 97,000, compared to Rs 73,500 on Akshaya Tritiya last year. As a result, traders are focusing on smaller, lighter gold and diamond jewellery pieces to meet customer demand," Arora said.

Families are estimated to spend around 10 per cent of their wedding budget on clothing, 15 per cent on jewellery, and 5 per cent each on electronics, sweets and dry fruits. Gift items account for around 4 per cent of spending, according to Deepak Garg, Senior Vice President, CTI. In the services category, 5 per cent of the budget typically goes to banquet halls and hotels, 3 per cent to management, 10 per cent to tent and decoration services, and another 10 per cent on other services such as catering, he said. Flower decoration makes up 4 per cent of total expenses, while transportation, photography, and music-related services to gether account for about 15 per cent, he added.

Red-crowned roofed turtle returns to Ganga after 3 decades

New Delhi, April 30: The critically endangered Red-Crowned Roofed Turtle has been reintroduced in the Ganga river as part of the government's flagship programme of cleaning the river and enhancing its biodiversity. In a post on X Wednesday, Union Jal Shakti Minister CR Paatil said, 20 such turtles were released in Uttar Pradesh's Haiderpur Wetland April 26. It is a UNESCO Ramsar site near the Bijnor Ganga Barrage within the Hastinapur Wildlife Sanctuary. This human-made wetland was formed in 1984 with the Madhya Ganga Barrage construction on the river's floodplain. He described it as an important milestone in restoring the ecology of the Ganga river. Ac-

cording to his ministry, there has been no confirmed report of adult Red-Crowned Roofed turtle sighting in the main channel of the Ganga in the past 30 years. To make the reintroduction project a success, each turtle has been fitted with tracking devices so that their movement patterns and progress in adapting to the environment can be monitored. According to officials, the turtles were divided into two groups for the reintroduction process. One group was released in the upstream of the Haiderpur Wetland barrage and the other on the downstream in the main channel of the Ganga to determine which method is more effective for turtle reintroduction, they said. The turtles would be tracked and monitored over the next two years.



The Union ministry said this was the first attempt at reintroducing this species in the Ganga by following a 'soft' versus 'hard' release strategy. The aim is to house the species in the Ganga in a stable manner with the Uttar Pradesh Forest Department's help, the ministry added.

Paatil credited Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his vision that took the shape of the Namami Gange Mission for the turtle reintroduction initiative. Preparing for the reintroduction of the freshwater reptiles, the Turtle Survival Alliance India project team, with support

from the National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG), conducted a detailed assessment of turtle diversity and abundance in the Haiderpur Wetland Complex (HWC) in 2020. This was followed by a 2022 Habitat Evaluation study on the newly formed turtle sanctuary along the Ganga near Prayagraj in Uttar Pradesh. The study along HWC suggested the presence of nine turtle species whereas indirect evidence of five turtle species was found in Prayagraj. One of the findings of the 2020, 2022 and prior studies was that none of the viable populations or individuals of Red-Crowned Roofed turtle were sighted in the stretch of the Ganga, thereby suggesting that it was the most endangered species in entire north India.

PM Modi to skip V-Day celebrations in Moscow

Moscow: Prime Minister Narendra Modi will not attend the 80th anniversary celebrations of Victory Day to be held in Moscow next month, Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov said Wednesday. "India will not be represented at the highest level", Peskov said. According to local media reports Indian Defence Minister Rajnath Singh could represent instead of Modi at the May 9 event. President Vladimir Putin had invited Modi and Xi Jinping of China to attend the V-day celebration here to watch the victory parade at the Red Square. Xi has confirmed that he will attend the event. Preparations are underway to host about 20 foreign leaders in Moscow. May 9 marks the allied nations' victory over Nazi Germany in 1945.

Two Indian students charged over scam

New York: Two Indian citizens on student visas in the US have been arrested for scamming an elderly individual and charged with theft, according to authorities. Mahammadilham Vahora and Hajiali Vahora, both 24 years old, were booked into the El Paso County Jail this month, the El Paso County Sheriff's Office said in a statement Monday. They are subjects of a continued investigation involving victims across the US, it said. The two have been charged with crimes against at-risk persons – including robbery and theft – as well as money laundering involving illegal investments. Both attend the East-West University in Chicago, Illinois.

Russia begins building road bridge to N Korea

Moscow: Russia and North Korea Wednesday began construction of a road bridge between the two countries that will span the Tumen river, part of an effort to strengthen their strategic partnership, Russia's prime minister said. The bridge is being built near the existing "Friendship Bridge", a rail bridge which was commissioned in 1959 after the Korean war. At a ceremony dedicated to the start of the new bridge's construction, Russian Prime Minister Mikhail Mishustin said it was a significant event in Russian-North Korean relations, the TASS state news agency reported. The new road bridge, which has been under discussion for years, will be 850 metres (2789 ft) and link up with the Russian highway system. Its construction was agreed during a visit by President Vladimir Putin to North Korea in 2024.

Israeli strikes kill 12, including kids

Jerusalem, April 30: Israeli airstrikes on homes in central Gaza killed at least 12 people including children, Palestinian hospital workers said Wednesday, including two young brothers whose bodies arrived in pieces.

Israel has been striking homes, shelters and public areas daily since resuming the war with Hamas last month. It has cut off the territory's 2 million Palestinians from all imports, including food and medicine, for nearly two months.

UN food stockpiles have run out and aid groups say thousands of Palestinian children are malnourished.

Israel says its blockade aims to pressure Hamas to release hostages taken on October 7, 2023. However, the UN high commissioner for human rights warned this week that starving civilians as a military tactic constitutes a war crime.

Israel's war against Hamas

in Gaza has killed more than 52,000 Palestinians, according to the territory's Health Ministry, including more than 2,200 in the six weeks since Israel shattered the ceasefire. Some 1,200 people, mostly civilians were killed in the Hamas attacks of October 7, 2023, which started the war.

STARVATION FEARS

Scores of Palestinians gathered at charity kitchens in Deir al-Balah and Nuseirat to get their only meal for the day as food across the territory runs out. On Wednesday, one kitchen served pasta in a thin tomato sauce, another served just lentils.

Crowds of people pushed against each other and yelled as they held their pots and containers up high in the air in a desperate attempt to not leave empty-handed. "There is starvation. There is no food or thing to drink," said Wafaa, a woman displaced in Nuseirat with eight family members.

B'desh HC orders Hindu leader's release on bail

Dhaka, April 30: A bench of Bangladesh High Court Wednesday ordered release of Hindu leader Chinmoy Krishna Das on bail, five months after he was arrested on a charge of defaming the country's national flag, court officials said.

"The two-judge bench declared absolute its earlier rule asking authorities why he should not be granted bail," an official of the High Court said.

The bench comprising Justice Atoar Rahman and Justice Ali Reza granted the bail after the final hearing on their previous rule.

On October 31, a case with Kotwali police station in Chattogram was filed accusing Das and 18 others of disrespecting the Bangladesh national flag.

A former ISKCON leader, Das was arrested at Dhaka's Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport on November 25 last year.

A spokesperson for the Sammilito Sanatani Jagaran Jote, a Hindu organisation, Das was taken to the court at the south-eastern port city of Chattogram, which sent him to jail rejecting his bail petition the next day.

Das' arrest sparked widespread protests with his followers demonstrating in Dhaka and other places. In the port city, the protest turned violent when assistant government prosecutor Saiful Islam Alif was hacked to death, hours after Das was sent to jail.

The development – less than three months after a mass student-led protest ousted prime minister Sheikh Hasina August 5 – also emerged as an issue between Bangladesh and India with New Delhi expressing its concern over his detention. After Hasina fled to India, Muhammad Yunus took over as Chief Adviser of the Interim government on August 8.

"This incident follows the multiple attacks on Hindus and other minorities by extremist elements in Bangladesh. There are several documented cases of arson and looting of minorities' homes and business establishments, as well as theft and vandalism and desecration of deities and temples," the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said in New Delhi on November 26. "It is unfortunate that while the perpetrators of these incidents remain at large, charges should be pressed against a religious leader presenting legitimate demands through peaceful gatherings," MEA said and urged Bangladesh authorities to ensure the safety and security of Hindus and all minorities.

New York/London, April 30: Amid rising tensions between India and Pakistan, the US has called on both countries "not to escalate" the conflict. Secretary of State Marco Rubio will speak to their foreign ministers "as early as today or tomorrow".

US State Department spokesperson Tammy Bruce at a press briefing Tuesday said that Washington is reaching out to both India and Pakistan "regarding the Kashmir situation" and telling "them not to escalate the situation."

Secretary of State Marco Rubio "expects to speak with the foreign ministers of Pakistan and India as early as today or tomorrow. He is encouraging other national leaders and foreign ministers to reach out to the countries on this issue," Bruce said.

"So it is – again, as I've noted, every day action is being taken, in this case the Secretary speaking directly to his counterparts in India and Pakistan, and we'll – we expect certainly the impact he's usually had with the individuals he's spoken with and certainly with President Trump's leadership, India and Pakistan having those conversations. It's very important for them," Bruce said.

Responding to a question on Pakistan's Defence Minister Khawaja Asif's comments that Pakistan has "been doing this dirty work for United States", Bruce added "the only thing I'm really prepared to discuss here is the fact that the Secretary of State is going to be speaking

Ukraine poised to sign mineral resources deal with United States

Kyiv, April 30: Ukraine is prepared to sign a landmark mineral resources agreement with the United States in Washington Wednesday, according to two senior Ukrainian officials who spoke on condition of anonymity because they weren't authorised to discuss the matter publicly.

Economy Minister Yulia Svyrydenko is currently in Washington for the final coordination of the agreement's technical details, the sources said. It wasn't immediately clear whether the Trump administration also was ready to ink the deal.

Trump has said that he wants Ukraine's rare earth elements as a condition of further support in its more than three-year

war with Russia.

The Ukrainian Cabinet is expected to approve the agreement's text before the Washington meeting, after which it will be signed by an authorised government representative.

The deal will then require ratification in the Ukrainian parliament before it can take effect.

According to one of the Ukrainian officials, multiple documents are involved – including a main agreement and at least two technical accords outlining the structure and operations of the joint fund.

The official said that the Ukrainian side is generally satisfied with how the agreement has evolved following negotiations between both teams.

The other senior official expressed hope that there would be no further changes from Washington's side.

Ukraine has introduced new provisions to the agreement, aiming to address earlier concerns that the initial US draft, presented in March, disproportionately favoured American interests. Negotiations between the two sides have continued steadily since then.

Trump's fresh policy terminates international students' legal status

Washington, April 30: The US government has begun shedding new light on a crackdown on international students, spelling out how it targeted thousands of people and laying out the grounds for terminating their legal status.

The new details emerged in lawsuits filed by some of the students who suddenly had their status cancelled in recent weeks with little explanation.

In the past month, foreign students around the US have been rattled to learn their records had been removed from a student database maintained by Immigration and Customs Enforcement. Some went into hiding for fear of being picked up by immigration authorities or abandoned their studies to return home.

On Friday, after mounting court challenges, federal officials said the government was restoring international students' legal status while it developed a framework to guide future terminations. In a court filing Monday, it shared the new policy: a doc-

Pak defence min says chances of conflict with India increasing with passage of time

Islamabad: Pakistan's Defence Minister Khawaja Asif Wednesday said that the chances of conflict with India were increasing with the passage of time despite efforts by different countries to defuse the tensions between the two neighbours. Asif made the remarks while talking to the media outside the parliament, where he was asked about the latest security situation. "Chances (of conflict) are increasing with the passage of time; they are not decreasing. Though many countries have been trying to avert the situation," he said. Asif also vowed to give a suitable response to India in case of any attack on Pakistan but refused to provide the details of the Pakistani response. "If there is a violation by India, we will respond and the nature of our response will be determined by the Indian action," he said. "There should be no doubt about our response." He expressed his desire that "India will see sense" but added that there was no evidence on ground because there was no decrease in the escalation. Replying to a question, he said may God help to avert the situation of conflict. To another question, he said, "I do not want to speculate about the response by Pakistan but it will be bigger than Indian action".

perpetrators to justice.

He also raised concerns over the regional tensions spilling over onto UK streets in the form of protests, characterised by provocative language and gestures, including "what appears to be a throat-slitting motion by an alleged Pakistan official" and "windows being smashed" at Pakistan's High Commission in London.

"The horrific terrorist attack in Pahalgam in Jammu and Kashmir on 22 April was devastating... We call on all sides, all community leaders and all involved to call for calm at a time of tension in the region," said Falconer.

"We are aware of reports of the video that my Honourable Friend refers to; the Metropolitan police are investigating, so I will not provide any further commentary on that particu-

lar incident, but it is obviously concerning," he said, with reference to a Pakistani official caught on camera making a threatening gesture towards Indian protesters last week.

On April 22, terrorists opened fire in Kashmir's Pahalgam, killing 26 people, in the deadliest attack in the Valley since the Pulwama strike in 2019. The Resistance Front (TRF), a proxy of the banned Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), claimed responsibility for the attack.

Meanwhile, in New Delhi, Prime Minister Narendra Modi Tuesday told the top defence brass that the armed forces have "complete operational freedom" to decide on the mode, targets and timing of India's response to the Pahalgam terror attack, according to government sources.

Brad Banias, an immigration attorney representing a student whose status was terminated, said the new guidelines vastly expand ICE's authority beyond previous policy, which did not count visa revocation as grounds for losing legal status.

"This just gave them carte blanche to have the State Department revoke a visa and then deport those students even if they've done nothing wrong,"

Banias said.

Many of the students who had visas revoked or lost their legal status said they had only minor infractions on their record, including driving infractions. Some did not know why they were targeted at all.

Lawyers for the government provided some explanation at a hearing Tuesday in the case of Banias' client Akshar Patel, an international student studying information systems in Texas. Patel's status was terminated – and then reinstated – this month, and he is seeking a preliminary court ruling to keep him from being deported.

Credit growth to farm sector slows

Mumbai: The bank credit growth to the agriculture sector slowed to 10.4 per cent year-on-year for the fortnight ended March 21, while advances to the industry remained flat at 8 per cent, as per the RBI data released Wednesday. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has released the data on sectoral deployment of bank credit collected from 41 select commercial banks, accounting for about 95 per cent of the total non-food credit deployed by all banks taken together. Credit to agriculture and allied activities registered a growth of 10.4 per cent (y-o-y) as of the fortnight ended March 21, 2025, against 20 per cent in the corresponding fortnight of the previous year. "Credit to industry expanded by 8.0 per cent (y-o-y) as on the fortnight ended March 21, 2025, same as in the corresponding fortnight of the previous year," the RBI said. Bank loans to the services sector increased by 13.4 per cent as of the fortnight ended March 21, 2025, (20.8 per cent in the corresponding fortnight of the previous year), primarily due to decelerated growth in credit to NBFCs.

New Delhi, April 30: Gold and silver buying in India -- the world's largest gold consumer -- kicked off positively Wednesday's auspicious Akshaya Tritiya festival despite high prices, with jewellers' body GJC projecting gold sales to jump 35 per cent in value terms over the last year.

Consumer footfalls were higher in south India during the first half of the day and were expected to increase in Maharashtra and northern states later due to extreme weather conditions.

Gold prices are trading between Rs 99,500 and Rs 99,900 per 10 grams across different parts of the country, 37.6 per cent higher than Rs 72,300 on Akshaya Tritiya in 2024.

"Affordability has been impacted due to rise in gold prices. However, there is strong buying sentiment due to Akshaya Tritiya. Consumers will buy," said World Gold Council India CEO Sachin Jain.

Pakistan Stock Exchange plunges 3500 points

US economy contracts in first quarter

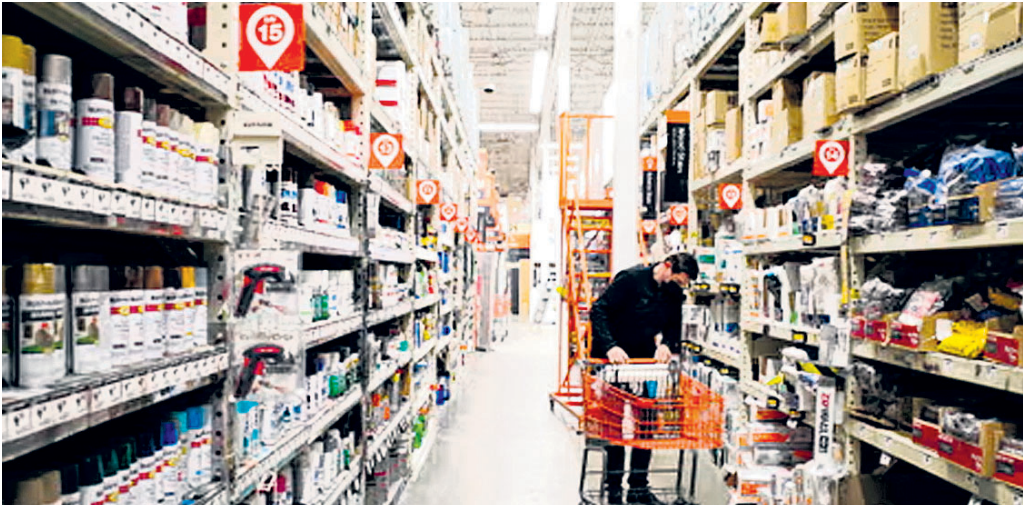

Washington, April 30: The US economy contracted in the first quarter, weighed down by a deluge of goods imported by businesses eager to avoid higher costs, underscoring the disruptive nature of President Donald Trump's often chaotic tariff policy.

Gross domestic product decreased at a 0.3% annualized rate last quarter, the Commerce Department's Bureau of Economic Analysis said in its advance estimate of first-quarter GDP Wednesday.

Economists polled by Reuters had forecast that GDP increased at a 0.3% pace in the January-March period. The survey was, however, concluded before data Tuesday showed the goods trade deficit surged to an all-time high in March amid record imports, which prompted most economists to sharply downgrade their GDP estimates. The economy grew at a 2.4% pace in the fourth quarter.

But the report likely grossly exaggerated the economy's dimming prospects as consumer spending continued to grow, though at a moderate pace. Coinciding with Trump's



first 100 days in office, it nonetheless reinforced Americans' growing disapproval of his handling of the economy so far. Trump swept to victory last November on voter angst over the economy, especially inflation.

Consumer confidence is near five-year lows and business sentiment has tanked. Airlines have pulled their 2025 financial forecasts, citing uncertainty over spending on non-essential travel because of tariffs, which economists have warned will raise costs

for companies and households.

Given that an unusually large amount of non-monetary gold had accounted for some of the jump in imports, some economists warned against placing too much weight on the GDP number. Others argued that the data did not change the narrative of an economy struggling because of uncertainty due to tariffs.

Inflation picked up last quarter and is expected to rise further through the year. Economists expect the Federal Reserve to resume cutting interest

rates at some point this year.

Trump Tuesday softened the blow of his auto tariffs through an executive order mixing credits with relief from other levies on parts and materials.

A 145% tariff on Chinese goods, which unleashed a trade war between Washington and Beijing, remains in place, as does an array of other import duties. Trump sees tariffs as a tool to raise revenue to offset his promised tax cuts and to revive a long-declining U.S. industrial base.

Shreyas' match-winning fifty, Chahal's 19th-over hat-trick help PBKS win over CSK

CSK crash out of playoffs race

Chennai, April 30: In a high-stakes thriller at the MA Chidambaram Stadium, Punjab Kings (PBKS) edged out Chennai Super Kings (CSK) by four wickets in the final over of a chaotic game that ended CSK's playoff hopes in the Indian Premier League (IPL) 2025 here Wednesday.

A combination of Shreyas Iyer's elegant match-winning fifty and Yuzvendra Chahal's stunning 19th-over hat-trick orchestrated a memorable turnaround for PBKS after Sam Curran had set the game up brilliantly for the hosts with a fiery 88.

Put into bat, CSK rode on a stunning 47-ball 88 from Sam Curran — an innings laced with 9 fours, 4 sixes, and just 10 dot balls. Curran weathered a two-paced pitch and draining conditions to build what looked like a match-winning platform. His brutal takedown of part-timer Suryansh Shedge in the 16th over, which went for 26 runs, shifted the momentum in CSK's favour.

However, PBKS captain Shreyas Iyer's brave decision to hold back Chahal for the end turned out to be game-defining.

Chahal was brought back in the 19th over after bowling just two overs earlier. With MS Dhoni at the crease — known for his struggles against leg-spin — Iyer tossed the ball to Chahal. Dhoni hit a six off the first legal delivery he faced, but holed out the next ball. What followed was an astonishing



hat-trick — Deepak Hooda, Anshul Kamboj, and Noor Ahmad all fell in succession, and CSK collapsed from 185/5 to 190 all out, losing five wickets in seven balls for just six runs.

Chasing 192, PBKS began confidently. Prabhsimran Singh showed his full range early — a flat-batted six over long-on, followed by a cheeky scoop past short fine leg- set the tone. Though his partner Priyansh Arya fell to a sharp Khaleel Ahmed bouncer after a brisk start, PBKS reached 44/1 quickly.

Prabhsimran's approach was both aggressive and smart. He punished Noor Ahmad with a paddle sweep for four and

then stepped out for a six in the ninth over. He brought up his second successive fifty in 31 balls, but his momentum was halted when he miscued a big shot off Noor and was caught at deep midwicket for 54. At that stage, PBKS were 116/2 after 13 overs, needing 75 from 42.

At the other end, Shreyas Iyer was quietly building up. He was on 29 off 25 when Prabhsmiran fell, but shifted gears decisively afterwards. A six over long-on off Sam Curran and a flat-batted four through cover showed he had found his timing. He reached his fifty off 32 balls and looked in complete control.

The 17th over by Pathirana

saw Iyer at his creative best — a slot ball launched over long-on, a wristy whip over wide long-on, and a delicate open-faced shot between backward point and short third man demonstrated the full array of his skills. PBKS coasted to 175/3 at the end of that over, needing just 17 off 18 balls.

Shashank Singh played a handy cameo — 23 off 12 — including two sixes. But he gave Dewald Brevis a chance to showcase arguably the best catch of the season. Sprinting along the deep midwicket boundary, Brevis juggled the ball twice, stepped out and back in again multiple times before completing an extraordinary

Chahal's spell — 4 wickets in the 19th over, including a hat-trick — was one of the standout moments of the IPL season, and Shreyas Iyer's composed yet explosive 72 ensured PBKS didn't let the opportunity slip.

Eves to test new combinations vs Oz

Perth: After two matches against the Australia A side, the Indian women's hockey team is set to face the senior team in their next three friendlies at the Perth Hockey Stadium 1 May. India will be looking to improve upon their performance after suffering two defeats in their first two games against Australia A. In the first match, India fought valiantly but fell short and were dealt a 3-5 defeat by the Australia A team. In the second match, India suffered an unfortunate defeat with a narrow scoreline of 2-3. India's 26-member squad, led by captain Salima Tete and vice captain Navneet Kaur, will now face a bigger challenge facing the senior team of Australia over the next three matches. The last time both sides met, India enjoyed a 1-0 victory during the FIH Hockey Pro League 2023-24 and will look to obtain a similar result.

Djokovic withdraws

Rome: Novak Djokovic pulled out of the Italian Open in the midst of a three-match losing streak, shedding doubt on how well he'll be able to play at the upcoming French Open as he continues to seek a record 25th Grand Slam trophy and 100th tournament title overall. The clay-court event in Rome, which will be held next month, posted on social media that Djokovic wouldn't be participating and wrote: "See you next year, Nole," referring to the 37-year-old Serbian star by his nickname. Djokovic has struggled this season, going just 12-6 and dropping his past three contests in a row — at the Miami Open, the Monte Carlos Masters and, Saturday, at the Madrid Open. He has spent more weeks ranked No 1 than any other tennis player but is currently No 5. His only title in 2024 or 2025 was the gold medal he claimed by beating Carlos Alcaraz in the final of the Paris Olympics in August.

B'desh to tour Pak

Islamabad: Pakistan will host Bangladesh for five T20 matches next month with Faisalabad set to stage its first international match after a 17-year hiatus, the Pakistan Cricket Board said Wednesday. The first two games of the series will be played at Faisalabad on May 25 and 27 with Lahore hosting the remaining three games between May 31-June 3. Bangladesh was the last team to play an ODI at Faisalabad in 2008. Bangladesh was due to play three T20s and three ODIs in Pakistan. However, both cricket boards agreed to replace the ODIs with two additional T20s as part of preparations for the T20 World Cup to be co-hosted by India and Sri Lanka in 2026.

Sprinters rewrite men's 4x100m national record

India top Asian U-15 Boxing Championships medal tally with 11 golds

Amman, April 30: India topped the Asian U-15 Boxing Championships medal tally with 25 medals, 11 golds, powered by a stellar showing in the girls' category. The young Indian women secured 10 golds and four bronze medals across the 15 weight appearances, winning every title bout they contested in the finals.

The girls' U-15 bouts started with Komal (30-33 kg) narrowly edging Kazakhstan's Aiara Onggarbek with a 3:2 split decision. Khushi Ahlawat (35 kg) then beat her opponent with

a 4:1 win, while Tamanna (37 kg) sealed hers with a second-round RSC.

Svi (40 kg), Milky Meinam (43 kg), Princi (52 kg), Navya (58 kg), Sunaina (61 kg), Trushana Mohite (67 kg), and Vanshika (70+ kg) all won their respective bouts unanimously, capping a clean sweep in the finals for the girls' U-15 squad.

Speaking on the U-15 contingent's accomplishment from Amman, BFI president-chairman, Interim Committee, Ajay Singh, said, "What an incredible evening for Indian boxing. Hearing the national anthem play eleven times and seeing

India topping the charts filled us all with pride. I heartily congratulate our 25 Under-15 medallists on this outstanding achievement; these are our future Olympic Champions, and they've made the nation proud."

SUPERBET RAPID AND BLITZ

Pragg bounces back to claim second spot

Warsaw (Poland), April 30: Indian Grandmaster R Praggnanandhaa bounced back from a poor start to climb to second in the overall standings at the end of the first half of the blitz section in the Superbet Rapid & Blitz tournament, part of the Grand Chess Tour.

Praggnanandhaa's efforts held him in good stead for a second day running. The Indian had not done well on the first two days of rapid chess but has come back strongly especially showing his expertise in the blitz section.

With just five minutes given for each game and a three seconds increment after every move is made, Praggnanandhaa played his usual brand of complicated games and ended with three straight wins.

He had started with losses to Deac Bogdan-Daniel of Romania and Levon Aronian of United States but then recovered to beat Firouzja Alireza of France and Maxime Vachier-Lagrave.

In the last three rounds, Praggnanandhaa put it across former world champion Veselin Topalov of Bulgaria, Aravindh and David Gavrilescu of Romania to collect score 5.5 points out of allotted nine games.

On a day when Indian GM Aravindh Chithambaram ran a bit out of steam and could only garner 3.5 points from his nine games, Vladimir Fedoseev of Slovenia cruised to a brilliant 8/9 on the penulti-



mate day and took his tally to a massive 19 points out of a possible 27.

Fedoseev's dominance started right from the beginning now enjoys a huge 3.5 points lead over second place Praggnanandhaa.

Unless there is a massive change in the fortunes of other players, the overall first place seems almost decided for which 4.5 points should be enough for Fedoseev in the remaining nine games slated on the final day.

Aravindh started off with 2.5 points from first four games and then could only get one point from the last five.

He will have to fight hard in the second half of blitz in order to finish what he started so well – tying for first place in the rapid section.

FORMER NATIONAL SHOOTING COACH SUNNY THOMAS DIES

Kochi, April 30: Former India shooting coach Sunny Thomas, under whose tutelage the sport achieved some historic highs including multiple Olympic medals, died Wednesday after suffering a cardiac arrest.

He was 84 and breathed his last in Kottayam where he was based. Thomas is survived by his wife KJ Josamma, sons Manoj Sunny, Sanil Sunny and daughter Sonia Sunny.

He was bestowed with the Dronacharya award in 2001 and was part of the coaching staff during the 2004 Athens Olympics where Rajyavardhan Singh Rathore became the first Indian to win a Games medal in shooting with his silver in the men's double trap competition.

The highest point in Thomas' career came in Beijing when Abhinav Bindra became the first Indian to claim an individual gold medal, bagging the yellow metal in the men's 10M air rifle event.
