India hits 9 terror targets in Pakistan, PoK in 25-minute precision strike

New Delhi, May 7: India's armed forces destroyed nine terrorist infrastructure including that of Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) and Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK) in a 25-minute-long measured and non-escalatory missile and drone strike early Wednesday in retaliation to the dastardly terror attack in Pahalgam.

Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri said India decided to carry out the proportionate strikes to bring the perpetrators and planners of the April 22 Pahalgam attack to justice as there was no demonstrable step from Pakistan to act against terrorist infrastructure on territories under its control.

Misri said India's actions were in line with the UN Security Council's statement about holding perpetrators, organisers, financiers and sponsors of the Pahalgam terror attack accountable.

Under 'Operation Sindoor', the Indian military targeted Markaz Taiba of Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) in Muridke, Markaz Subhan Allah of Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) in Bahawalpur and Hizbul Mujahideen's Mehmoona Joya Facility in Sialkot and LeT's base in Markaz Ahle Hadith in Barnala and its camp in Muzaffarabad's Shawai Nalla, military officials said.

The operation was conducted from 1.05am to 1.30am and all the targets were neutralised with clinical efficiency, two women officers - Col Sophia Qureshi of the Army's Corps of Signals and Wing Commander Vyomika Singh, a helicopter pilot of the IAF - said at a media briefing alongside Misri.

Around 15 minutes after the operation ended, the Defence Ministry said, "A little while ago, the Indian Armed forces launched 'Operation Sindoor' hitting terrorist infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir from where terrorist attacks against India have been planned and directed.

It said the actions by the Indian Armed forces have been

Over 300 flights cancelled; 25 airports shut temporarily

More than 300 flights have been cancelled and at least 25 airports, including Srinagar, have been temporarily shut for operations amid restrictions in the wake of the armed forces launching missile attacks on terror targets in Pakistan Wednesday morning. Air India, IndiGo, SpiceJet, Air India Express, Akasa Air, and a few foreign airlines have cancelled their services to and from various airports. Sources said that at least 25 airports in the northern and western parts of the country have been temporarily shut. These airports include Srinagar, Leh, Jammu, Amritsar, Pathankot, Chandigarh, Jodhpur, Jaisalmer, Shimla, Dharamshala and Jamnagar, they added.

'Nari Shakti' takes centre stage

India's 'Nari Shakti' was veritably on display during a press briefing here on 'Operation Sindoor' Wednesday, as two accomplished woman military officers joined Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri in giving details about the precision strikes by the armed forces on nine terror targets in Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir. At the briefing held at the National Media Centre, Misri was flanked by Col Sofiya Qureshi and Wing Commander Vyomika Singh, presenting a striking image of a combination of India's prowess in military and diplomacy. Col Qureshi from the Army's Corps of Signals, and Wg Cdr Singh, a helicopter pilot, shared the names and details of the sites targeted in the early hours Wednesday.

13 civilians killed in Pak shelling

As many as 13 people, including four children, two women and a soldier, were killed and over 50 injured when the Pakistan army pounded forward villages in Poonch and Rajouri in Jammu region and Baramulla and Kupwara in north Kashmir with artillery and mortar shelling. The shelling from across the border started shortly after Indian armed forces carried out missile attacks on nine terror targets in Pakistan and PoK to avenge the April 22 terror attack. Hundreds of residents along the Line of Control (LoC) and the International Border (IB) here were evacuated to safer zones Wednesday as authorities chalked out countermeasures to safeguard civilians from Pakistani shelling.

focused, measured and non-escalatory in nature and that no Pakistani military facilities have been targeted. India has demonstrated considerable restraint in selection of targets and method of execution, the ministry said.

Military sources said Prime Minister Narendra Modi was monitoring 'Operation Sindoor' closely. Following the operation, he held a meeting of the Union Cabinet and hailed the Indian armed forces for successful strikes.

In his remarks, Misri said the Indian military carried out the measured, non-escalatory, proportionate, and responsible

standoff weapons.

The Pakistan army said at least 26 people were killed and 46 injured in these strikes.

JeM chief Maulana Masood Azhar acknowledged that 10 members of his family and four close associates were killed in India's missile attack on the outfit's headquarters in Bahawalpur.

Indian officials said the strikes on all nine targets including Bahawalpur and Muridke were successful.

Muridke, located a short distance from Lahore, is home to a sprawling markaz or base of LeT. Bahawalpur is the main stronghold of the JeM.

In Washington, US President

"Our intelligence monitoring of Pakistan-based terrorist modules indicated that further attacks against India were impending."

Earlier this morning as you would be aware India exercised its right to respond and pre-empt as well as deter more such cross-border attacks, he said.

These actions were measured, non-escalatory, proportionate, and responsible. They focused on dismantling the terrorist infrastructure and disabling terrorists likely to be sent across to India, Misri said.

The attack in Pahalgam was marked by extreme barbarity,

Security forces gun down 22 Naxalites

The gunfight broke out in the morning in the Karregutta hills forest along the interstate border, he said.

Cash row: Trouble mounts for Justice Varma

New Delhi, May 7: The Supreme Court-appointed panel has confirmed the cash discovery allegations against Allahabad High Court's Justice Yashwant Varma in its inquiry report, sources have said. Chief Justice of India Sanjiv Khanna is also learnt to have nudged the judge to step down in view of the critical findings in the report.

The CJI has forwarded the panel's report to Justice Varma and sought his reply following the principle of natural justice, the sources said.

The report was submitted to the CJI by the three-member panel comprising Punjab and Haryana High Court Chief Justice Sheel Nagu, Himachal Pradesh High Court Chief Justice GS Sandhawalia and Justice Anu Sivaraman of the Karnataka High Court. It was finalised May 3.

The panel analysed evidence and recorded the statements of over 50 people, including Delhi Police Commissioner Sanjay Arora and Delhi Fire Service chief who were among the first responders to the fire

Sources said the panel found clear evidence to confirm the allegations that a huge stash of cash was found in the store room of Justice Varma's official residence at the time of fire incident. The allegation was repeatedly denied by the judge in his reply to the Delhi High Court chief justice.

The sources said CJI Khanna, who is set to superannuate May 13, is likely to take the issue to its logical conclusion and has informally discussed the findings of the report with senior collegium members of the apex court.

# Russian Embassy unveils special plaque honouring Biju Patnaik

Bhubaneswar, May 7: Russia Wednesday paid tribute to freedom fighter and former Odisha Chief Minister Biju Patnaik by unveiling a memorial plaque in his honour at its embassy in New Delhi.

The event was part of celebrations marking the 80th Anniversary of the Great Victory in World War II.

Biju Janata Dal (BJD) chief Naveen Patnaik, the younger son of Biju Patnaik, attended the ceremony at the Russian Embassy in the national capital.

"Honoured to attend the memorial plaque inauguration ceremony at Russian Embassy in New Delhi to commemorate

the contribution of legendary #BijuPatnaik in Stalingrad Operation during WWII. The Battle of Stalingrad led to success for Russia in the war against Nazi Germany which saved the world from untold horror. People of #Odisha will be immensely pleased with this award for #BijuPatnaik whom they treat with huge respect. Thank @RusEmbIndia for the honour. #RussiaHonoursBijuPatnaik," Patnaik said in a post on X.

Russian Ambassador Danis Alipov had specially invited Patnaik, Leader of the Opposition of Odisha Assembly, to attend the programme. The main function will be held May 9.

Alipov, in a letter to Patnaik, had said, "Among the

heroes who we pay tribute to is your late father, Honourable

Shri Biju Patnaik ji, a towering personality and a valiant

pilot of the Indian National Airways, who had participat-

ed in the Stalingrad Operation, supplying weapons to the besieged Red Army."

The Battle of Stalingrad, which took place from July 1942 to February 1943, marked the successful Soviet defence of the city during World War II.

Russia has plans to honour those who stood together against Nazism in anti-Hitler coalition, and commemorate the heroic deeds of the people of the former Soviet Union and its allies, who bore the brunt of the most brutal conflict in human history.

Biju Patnaik was the chief minister of Odisha for two terms — from 1961 to 1963 and again from 1990 to 1995. He died April 17, 1997.

# CBI chief gets 1-yr extension

New Delhi, May 7: The Centre Wednesday extended the tenure of CBI Director Praveen Sood by one year. Sood took over as the CBI director May 25, 2023 for a two-year term.

The decision to extend his tenure was taken in a meeting of the selection committee headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, and comprising Chief Justice of India Sanjiv Khanna and Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi Monday, officials said.

The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC), based on the recommendations of the selection committee, approved Sood's extension for a period of one year beyond May 24.

# Lauren: Haven't felt typecast

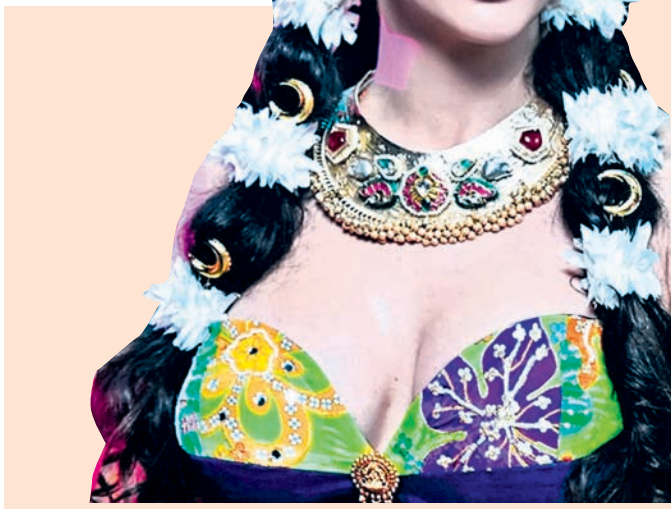

# Made-in-Kerala carpet steals show at Met Gala

**New York:** The 2025 edition of Met Gala gives fashion fans time to dissect every look. Shah Rukh Khan's Sabyasachi ensemble, for instance, had social media divided, while almost all factions of the latter seemed to 'stan' Diljit Dosanjh's modern-day Maharaja tailoring. Instagram, especially, has been flooded with posts celebrating Indian representation — but many overlooked another stand-out from the subcontinent: the striking blue carpet.

Also called the 'Met Gala rug', the striking blue floor covering — sprinkled with yellow and white daffodils — perfectly complimented the various fits sported by celebrities in accordance with this year's theme. It was woven by Extraweave, the parent company of Neytt Homes from Cherthala, Alleppey, Kerala,

ala, and reportedly took 480 people working over 90 days to bring it to life. The company had provided the carpets for the 2022 and 2023 Met Galas as well.

The Indian brand had knitted the wall-to-wall carpet from natural sisal fibre that was im-

ported from Madagascar, and then shipped the white base carpet in 57 rolls (of four metres x 30metres), with its area size sprawling 6,840 square metres, to New York. Once there, it was hand-painted by local artists. "As much as we appreciate all

the love we've been getting, we don't want to take credit for the design of the final rug as that was all done by the Met Gala team. The rug we provided was a blank canvas (white rug) on which the floral design was hand painted," according to an official of the company.

Neytt is an extension of the century-old Travancore Mats and Matting Company, which was established in 1917 by the current co-founder Sivan Santhosh. "Through Neytt we wanted to create an exclusive sustainable space using exotic raw materials such as sisal, lyocell, and linen to name a few. Our aim is to revolutionise how premium lifestyle floor coverings have been explored till now," Santhosh had told Vogue India back in 2023.

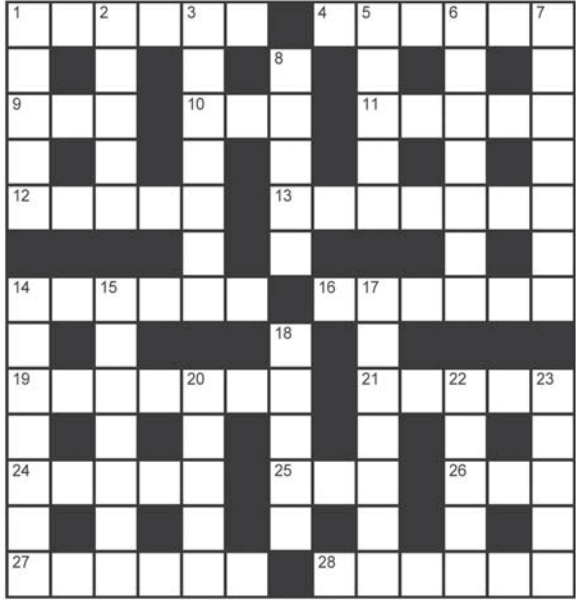

CM proposes digital justice reforms

Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi advocates for e-FIR, e-summons, and mobile forensics to enhance the efficiency of the state's justice system

**Bhubaneswar, May 7:** Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Wednesday called for the integration of technology into Odisha's justice system to enhance efficiency and speed. During a review meeting on the implementation of India's three new criminal laws at Lok Seva Bhawan, Majhi proposed the introduction of e-FIR, e-summons, and e-evidence systems to simplify and expedite legal proceedings. He stressed the importance of making the justice delivery system more accessible and faster by adopting digital tools. "The introduction of electronic systems for FIRs, summons, and evidence will not only ease

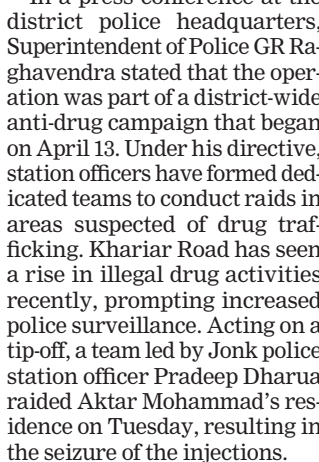
the process but also ensure quicker resolution of cases," Majhi said. In line with his digital vision, the Chief Minister suggested connecting critical institutions like jails, hospitals, forensic labs, and courts through video conferencing. "This would allow witnesses and experts to provide their testimonies from remote locations, eliminating the need for travel and further speeding up the judicial process," he said. Majhi also proposed the deployment of mobile forensic vans to enhance the state's forensic capabilities. Reports from the meeting indicated that 32 such vans would be operational soon, improving crime investigation and evidence collection across the state. To further strengthen the justice system, Majhi directed that cases involving mob lynching, extremism, and organised crime should only be overseen by officers of the rank of Superintendent of Police (SP) or higher.

This move aims to ensure that such serious cases receive the attention and expertise they require, he noted. The review meeting also revealed that over 98 per cent of police personnel and officers have already been trained on the new criminal laws, with additional measures being taken to incorporate modern technology in investigations. Moreover, the forensic labs are being upgraded, and 247 new positions for forensic and cyber forensic experts have been created to improve investigative processes. In the prosecution sector, 267 additional posts have been added, and amendments are being made to Odisha's prosecution rules to align with the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS) Act. The Chief Minister emphasised that the key to an effective justice system lies in the collaboration and efficiency of all institutions involved, which will ultimately lead to quicker and fairer justice for everyone in the state.

Three arrested in Nuapada drug raid

**Nuapada, May 7:** Police in Nuapada district arrested three individuals and seized a significant quantity of narcotic injections during a raid at a house in Ward No. 13, Dhobipada, under Jonk police station limits. The accused were produced in court Wednesday. The arrested individuals have been identified as Aktar Mohammad (55), Soheli Mohammad (23), and Shah Rukh Khan (32), all residents of Dhobipada in Khariar Road's Ward No. 13. Police recovered two mobile phones and 622 vials of Pentazocine Lactate injections (30 mg) from their possession. In a press conference at the district police headquarters, Superintendent of Police GR Raghavendra stated that the operation was part of a district-wide anti-drug campaign that began on April 13. Under his directive, station officers have formed dedicated teams to conduct raids in areas suspected of drug trafficking. Khariar Road has seen a rise in illegal drug activities recently, prompting increased police surveillance. Acting on a tip-off, a team led by Jonk police station officer Pradeep Dharua raided Aktar Mohammad's residence on Tuesday, resulting in the seizure of the injections.



The accused are believed to have sourced the injections from Raipur, Chhattisgarh, and were allegedly distributing them across Khariar Road and nearby areas. Police suspect that the drug racket has a network extending beyond the district. Investigations are ongoing, with further details expected to emerge.

Min Naik calls for rural innovation

The initiative aims to raise awareness about emotional well-being and combat the stigma surrounding mental illness. Speaking at the Illness to Wellness Awareness Summit

on Mental Health & Wellness organised by the Illness to Wellness Foundation (IWF), Parida said, "Good mental health helps individuals overcome challenges and move forward in life." She highlighted that mental illnesses aren't limited to clinically defined disorders and emphasised the need to normalise discussions around them. Parida raised concerns over increasing mental health issues among the youth. Citing a 2025

study by NIMHANS and international researchers, she said one in ten students experienced suicidal thoughts in 2024, with over a third attempting suicide. "We cannot let this situation prevail. Early intervention is key, particularly in addressing stress, anxiety, and behavioural issues among students," she added. Chief Secretary Manoj Ahuja, the guest of honour, noted that mental health concerns, once seen mostly in urban and student populations, are now affecting rural and tribal communities. To promote wellness among school children, the state has introduced 75 traditional and indigenous games into the curriculum. IWF advisory council chairman Anil Rajput praised the Odisha government's proactive steps, expressing hope that such efforts would inspire broader national action on mental health.

Odisha women leaders hail female forces' briefing

Politicians celebrate women empowerment as female officers lead Operation Sindoor briefing, highlighting India's growing gender inclusivity in defense

**Bhubaneswar, May 7:** As the nation hailed the success of Operation Sindoor—India's precision military response to the horrific Pahalgam terrorist attack—Odisha's women politicians joined the chorus of praise, particularly for the historic moment when two female officers led the official media briefing. The nation woke up to a wave of patriotic fervour as news broke of India launching preci-

sion missile strikes on nine key terror targets across Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK). The retaliatory operation came in the wake of the brutal killing of 26 Indian tourists by terrorists in Pahalgam. Among the major targets were strongholds of terror outfits like Lashkar-e-Taiba in Muridke and Jaish-e-Mohammed in Bahawalpur. In a defining moment for India's armed forces and a symbol of women empowerment, two senior women officers—Wing Commander Vyomika Singh from the Indian Air Force and Colonel Sofiya Qureshi from the Indian Army—took the lead in briefing the media about the operation. This unprecedented move was widely applauded across the country and marked a turning point in gender representation within the military.



Reacting to this, Barabati-Cuttack Congress MLA Sofia Firdous said, "It's a proud moment. The women who led the briefing represent all those whose sindoor was taken away by terrorism. This shows that Indian women are not just survivors but leaders in delivering justice and protecting the na-

tion's honour." BJD spokesperson Lekhasri Samantsinghar also praised the development. "It's the first time in Indian history that women officers have led a military operation briefing. This proves how women are excelling in every sector. When given a chance, they don't just participate—they

lead." BJP state secretary Kasturi Mishra called the event symbolic on multiple fronts. "The terrorists told the Pahalgam victims to 'tell Modi'. Today, Modi ji replied through this strike. And to top it off, women officers represented the mission—sending a powerful dual message. This wasn't just a military strike; it was also a social message about the strength and capability of Indian women." The visible presence of women at the forefront of national defense during such a critical moment has become a rallying point for leaders across party lines in Odisha. It has also sent a larger message about the evolving face of India's armed forces—one that now strongly reflects the growing role of women in national security and public life.

FAKE CERTIFICATES ROW

Teachers suppress probe by greasing palms of officials

**Jajpur/Korei, May 7:** Despite repeated directives from the Directorate of Elementary Education for action against teachers who have obtained their jobs with fake certificates, Jajpur district has seen little progress in this regard.

According to sources, the district has over 200 such fake teachers with 70 of them posted in Korei block alone. Orders sent to the District Education Officer (DEO), either from the Chief Minister’s Grievance Cell or the state School and Mass Education department, to identify and act against such individuals have become ineffective.

Sources alleged that these errant teachers have managed to evade action by greasing the palms of some unscrupulous officials to suppress investigation and subsequent measures against them. While other districts have taken action against such fraudulent teachers, those in Jajpur district appear to be enjoying protection.

The Directorate of Elementary Education issued a fresh directive (Letter No. 7820) instructing DEOs to submit detailed reports on fake certificate cases April 23. However, whether this order will yield results in Jajpur remains to be seen.

Lack of action against nine such fake teachers hailing from Ashanajhara village under Korei block is a case in this point. The nine persons have allegedly secured teaching jobs under the Korei education cluster by submitting fake caste certificates showing them as members of Scheduled Tribes (ST). These individuals are posted in government schools at Ashanajhara, SK Gadia, Sheetalgobindpur, Mathurapur, Jaintira, Dhanatri, and Gajendrapur, as well as in MLA High School and Haldigadia Primary School under the block.

Complaints against these fraudulent appointments have surfaced at multiple government levels, but no concrete action has been taken so far.

Earlier, two teachers of same caste hailing from Ashanajha-

ra had been suspended by the then-DEO Ranjan Kumar Giri after allegations surfaced that they had forged caste certificates to secure their jobs.

However, despite the availability of supporting evidence, no action such as suspension of salary or issuance of notice for caste certificate verification has been taken against the nine errant teachers from Ashanajhara.

These teachers are reportedly claiming publicly that financial transactions of ₹2 lakh at the District Education Office and ₹1 lakh at the Block Education Office have been made to suppress an inquiry directed by the Chief Minister’s Grievance Cell.

Block Education Officer (BEO) Sudarshan Mallik said that the suspected teachers had been instructed to submit valid caste certificates by April 30. However, none have complied so far. He added that they will be given an extension of up to three months. If they fail to submit valid caste certificates within the deadline, action will be taken, he added.

When contacted, District Education Officer Nityananda Barik said that the responsibility of acting on the order of the CM’s grievance cell has been assigned to the BEO. He assured that appropriate steps will be taken following further discussions with the BEO.

Slain Pahalgam victim’s wife hails Op Sindoor

**Balasore, May 7:** Hailing Operation Sindoor, Priyadarshani Satpathy of Balasore, who lost her husband in the Pahalgam attack, said terrorists must now live in fear and would understand the value of a human life.

Priyadarshani’s husband, Prashant Satpathy, was among the 26 people killed in the April 22 attack in Pahalgam.

“I thank the government for taking such a bold step. Army personnel had assured me near my husband’s body that action would be taken, and that has happened today,” she told reporters at her home in Ishani village of Balasore district.

“I am elated because the terrorists will now understand the value of a human life and how precious it is. The sacrifice of

my husband has not gone in vain,” she said, adding that terrorists who killed innocent people in front of their families must live in fear — if they have survived India’s strike.

Indian armed forces carried out missile strikes on nine terror targets in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir, including the Jaish-e-Mohammad stronghold in Bahawalpur and Lashkar-e-Taiba’s base in Muridke, under Operation Sindoor. Appreciating the operation’s name, Priyadarshani said the terrorists had erased the sindoor from the foreheads of many women, and were rightly punished.

“My husband will not return, but such an attack should not happen again anywhere in the world,” she said.

An emotionally charged



Priyadarshani said she had confidence the government would act, though she had been anxious about its timing.

“I was confident because I had seen the mood of the government and our soldiers. I am very happy today,” she said.

“Terrorism should be completely rooted out — not just from India, but from across the world. People on this planet should live without fear,” she added. Priyadarshani said the fight against terrorism must

continue until the end.

“Human life must be valued and respected. I know I cannot be happy all my life, but no one else should have to face this situation,” she said.

Satpathy’s younger brother, Jayant, said he had been waiting for revenge.

“We do not need money, but revenge for our brother’s killing. We are relieved today as the government acted as expected. All the terrorists behind the Pahalgam attack must be punished,” he said.

Satpathy, 41, was an employee of the Central Institute of Petrochemicals Engineering and Technology. He had travelled to Pahalgam in Jammu and Kashmir with his wife and son on holiday. His nine-year-old son, Tanuj, performed his last rites April 24.

Couple arrested for murder of grandmother

**Keonjhar, May 7:** Town police Wednesday cracked the murder case of a 70-year old woman as it arrested the granddaughter and grandson-in-law of the victim.

The victim was identified Birma Munda, a native of Gambharia (Mundasahi) village under the Town police limits while the accused were Gangi Munda, 35, and her husband Chhotu Munda, 38, in the area.

The incident occurred late Tuesday night when the couple had a heated brawl with the elderly woman over some issue. Enraged, the couple picked up the elderly woman and hurled her to the ground. The woman sustained critical injuries and lost her sense.

The villagers found the woman lying dead at home and informed the police.

Police personnel rushed to the spot and launched an investigation. A forensic team was also pressed into the service.

A case was registered in this connection and the body was handed over to the family members after a post-mortem. IIC Srikant Sahu of Town police station said. Further investigations were on.



RECURRING FLOODS

Farmers demand embankment to restrict erosion of farmland

**Khandapada, May 7:** With recurring annual flood waters from Kusumi and Kuanria rivers swallowing vast stretches of fertile farmland and converting those into barren sandbars, distressed farmers from basin village have once again urged the Water Resources Department to take immediate and lasting action to safeguard their land and livelihoods.

According to reports, the confluence of the Kusumi and Kuanria rivers near the villages of Kontilo, Duaragaan, and Dhanachangada has become a hotspot of agricultural destruction. Seasonal floods not only erode the riverbanks but also deposit large quantities of sand, rendering the submerged land unfit for paddy cultivation.

A stream, known as the Kamai river, formed at this junction flows through a deep gorge - nearly 150 feet deep - and eventually merges with the Mahanadi river approximately four kilometers downstream.

In an effort to protect nearby settlements and farmland, the Water Resources Department

has constructed embankments on both sides of the Kamai river. A 2.5km-long embankment runs along the southern bank - from Kamai bridge to Dhanachangada - while a 4-km stretch has been built on the left bank - from Kantilo sub-road to Dhabanighai and Bhagabat Mundia.

Despite these interventions, around 1,000 acres of farmland between the Kamai river and its left embankment—including Chanapata, Patakukuta, Bolupata, Kendua, and Mareikana - continue to be submerged during floods. Paddy farming in these areas has become nearly impossible. Instead, farmers are forced to cultivate less water-sensitive crops such as brinjal, green gram, black gram, horse gram, and groundnut—especially pulses, which yield relatively better.

However, reports said, strong flood currents continue to carry silt and sand deep into farmlands. In many cases, the riverbank is eroding significantly each year, consuming more agricultural land into the river’s bed.

Frustrated by years of inac-

tion, farmers have repeatedly appealed to the authorities for stronger protective infrastructure. Their primary demand is the construction of a 150-foot-long and 2-metre-high stone embankment (escape structure) at the confluence of the Kusumi and Kuanri rivers, in the downstream. They believe such a structure would trap incoming flood debris and minimise sand deposits, providing a much-needed shield for their land.

During peak flood season, the Kamai river rises dramatically, often breaching its banks and flowing at heights of 25 to 30 feet. A well-designed embankment, farmers argue, would prevent such overflows and reduce damage to cropland.

However, despite repeated appeals from affected farmers over the years, the authorities have allegedly failed to implement permanent flood control measures. Though the state government spends crores annually on embankment maintenance and new constructions, allegations have surfaced that the funds are being misused or misdirected without addressing urgent needs.

Meanwhile, Assistant Engineer of the Water Resources Department, Ram Mohan Behera, acknowledged the concern and said that if the embankment is deemed necessary, the suggestion will be forwarded to higher departmental authorities. “After an on-site inspection, appropriate measures would be undertaken,” he said.

University hostel inmate found dead

**Chhatrapur, May 7:** A hostel inmate of Centurion University, located near IREL Square under Chamakhnadi police jurisdiction in Ganjam district, has reportedly died Tuesday under suspicious circumstances.

The deceased student, D Purushottam Reddy, was from Lakshampur village in Chhatrapur block. He was undergoing training under the Odisha Skill Development Programme.

Meanwhile, Purushottam’s mother D Tarinamma Reddy demanded a probe claiming that her son was in good health when he left for the hostel. She has also filed a written complaint at Chamakhnadi police station.

Based on the complaint, the police have registered a case and launched an investigation. Tarinamma said she got a call from the university late at night informing her that her son was unwell and experiencing chest pain. He was reportedly taken to Chhatrapur hospital in an auto-rickshaw for treatment, where doctors declared him dead on arrival.

However, the university authorities have yet to offer any clarification regarding the incident. The family also alleges that university officials abandoned the body at the hospital and left.

The post-mortem was conducted Wednesday. The police said the exact cause of death will be known after the autopsy report is received.



Waterman Rajendra Singh joins Baitarani Banchao Yatra

**Keonjhar, May 7:** Indian environmentalist Rajendra Singh, also known as Jal Purush or Waterman for his work in water conservation, joined the ‘Baitarani Banchao Yatra’ in this district Wednesday as part of a two-day visit to raise awareness about the protection of the Baitarani River.

The drive began from Gonasika, the river’s origin point. During his interactions with the locals, the conservationist emphasised the urgent need to safeguard rivers, forests, and land from industrial exploitation.

“The Baitarani belongs to the people, not a commodity for companies,” he said, adding, “Industries are using river water to transport iron ore through slurry pipelines,



which harms tribals, forests, and ecosystems.”

He said the purpose of the campaign is to make people aware of the vital link between water, land, and forests, and to check destructive practices. Sudarshan Das, coordinator of the Mahanadi Banchao Movement, said the sacred Baitarani worshipped like the Ganga is under threat. “It is the lifeline of Keonjhar,

Mayurbhanj, Jajpur, and Bhadrak districts. Its survival is crucial for both people and wildlife,” he said.

Participants alleged that despite government restrictions, companies are drawing water from the river during dry months, leading to shortages downstream.

The group will visit an intake well and slurry pipeline in Basantpur Thursday, followed by a visit to the Kanpur Irrigation Project site to meet displaced and affected farmers.

Activists, including Padma Shri Daitari Naik of Keonjhar and Ashok Thakkar of Barbil, joined the yatra. The group also plans to visit the Sona and Karo rivers in the Joda mining area, where pollution from mining and industrial activities has become a growing concern.



## Two-Pronged Threat

Last month, Islamist gunmen – two of whom have been identified as Pakistani nationals – slaughtered 26 civilians in Kashmir. It was a brutal attack, in which Hindu tourists, including one from Nepal, were singled out for slaughter. And yet, it was not surprising: terrorist groups have long operated freely from Pakistani soil, with the tacit or explicit support of Pakistan’s powerful military.

What might be different this time is that India may have finally found a way to push back, including through military strikes on Pakistani terror camps – strikes that Indian officials claimed were “measured, responsible, and designed to be non-escalatory in nature.” Despite the risks of tit-for-tat retaliation, India, as the stronger side, could escalate or de-escalate the conflict to its advantage.

The threat India faces, however, is not coming from Pakistan alone. China has consistently provided diplomatic and strategic cover for India’s terrorism-sponsoring neighbour. For example, China’s government has repeatedly blocked United Nations sanctions against top Pakistani terrorists. After the latest attack, it praised Pakistan’s counterterrorism efforts, calling the country an “all-weather” strategic partner. The enemy of China’s enemy is its “ironclad friend.”

That leaves India wedged between two closely aligned nuclear powers, both of which claim sizable swaths of Indian territory. Recent crises – from brutal Pakistani terror attacks to brazen Chinese land grabs in the Doklam and Ladakh regions – have highlighted just how acute a threat the Sino-Pakistani strategic axis poses to India.

During his 11 years in power, however, Prime Minister Narendra Modi largely maintained a reactive security posture toward both China and Pakistan, with little strategic deterrence to be seen. The Sino-Indian military standoff that was triggered in 2020 by Chinese encroachments on India’s Ladakh borderlands still has not been fully resolved.

But this time, Modi has offered a calibrated and impactful response, pausing the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT), the world’s most-generous water-sharing pact, which grants downstream Pakistan access to over 80 per cent of the Indus Basin waters. Brokered in 1960 by the World Bank, the IWT has long been hailed as a model of cross-border cooperation – one that China has not emulated. (Though its 1951 annexation of the water-rich Tibetan Plateau gave it control over the headwaters of Asia’s major rivers, China has refused to enter into a water-sharing treaty with any of its 18 downstream neighbours.)

But treaties are built on mutual trust and good faith – or, as the IWT’s preamble puts it, “a spirit of goodwill and friendship.” And while India has steadfastly adhered to the treaty for 65 years – even when it meant compromising development in its water-stressed regions – Pakistan has consistently acted in bad faith. For example, it has used the treaty’s dispute-resolution mechanisms to drag India repeatedly into international arbitration over minor engineering differences and obstruct India’s ability to use its rightful share of water. Last year, when India formally sought to update the IWT – to account for unanticipated factors like climate change, groundwater depletion, and population growth – Pakistan refused to negotiate.

Meanwhile, Pakistan has waged what is effectively a proxy war by terrorism against India. The 2008 Mumbai massacre, in particular, is still etched in India’s national memory. In fact, the latest killings occurred shortly after the United States extradited a key Mumbai plotter to India. Pakistan’s army chief, General Asim Munir, recently fanned the flames of conflict by urging Pakistanis to teach their children that Muslims are “different from Hindus in every possible way.”

International law is clear: when a treaty’s fundamental conditions collapse, or one party persistently violates them, the other party has the right to suspend or withdraw from the agreement. For now, India has stopped short of blowing up the IWT, instead placing the treaty “in abeyance,” a term undefined in international law. Modi has thus retained strategic ambiguity, while sending a resolute message: resource-sharing comes with conditions. This is a warning, not a rupture.

To be sure, Pakistan claims that suspending the IWT amounts to an “act of war,” and has retaliated by suspending all bilateral agreements, including the 1972 Simla treaty, which governs peaceful dispute resolution. But this response not only ignores the reasons for India’s decision; it also misrepresents the impact.

India is halting data sharing, design approvals, and inspections under the IWT, while opening the way for actions that Pakistani objections have obstructed, such as reservoir flushing and the desilting of riverbeds. But it is not disrupting current water flows. In fact, India does not have the infrastructure to divert the major rivers flowing to Pakistan, and its storage capacity on those rivers is negligible. So, while India is imposing costs on Pakistan, in an attempt to hold its leaders accountable for state-sponsored terrorism, it is not punishing the Pakistani people.

The six rivers of the Indus Basin have sustained local civilisations for millennia, and they can continue to do so. But no country can be expected to uphold a peacetime treaty while suffering the consequences of an undeclared war. If Pakistan does not want India to turn off its taps by building new hydrological infrastructure, it must demonstrate a verifiable commitment to peace, arrest terrorist leaders, shut down terrorist-training camps, and end its support for cross-border violence.

# A CORPORATE COUP



The UK-India Free Trade Agreement primarily serves corporate interests, offering substantial gains to businesses while leaving ordinary workers on both sides largely untouched

touched. The UK-India trade deal is a corporate coup.

Corporate leaders are hailing the UK-India Free Trade Agreement as pathbreaking. From Chivas Brothers Ltd. and Diageo to Mark Kent, Chief Executive of the Scotch Whisky Association, many have welcomed the deal as “transformational,” particularly in light of opportunities in India’s whisky market. Across sectors—ranging from biomedical corporations and food corporations to luxury knitwear brands, banking institutions, and even the sports industry led by the Premier League—businesses are celebrating the deal, eyeing India’s 60 million-strong middle class, which is projected to grow to a quarter of a billion by 2050. According to the International Monetary Fund’s (IMF) World Economic Outlook published in April 2025, India is expected to become the world’s third-largest economy within the next three years. Such a lucrative market has compelled British corporate leaders to swallow the pride and set aside colonial-era prejudices, embracing a trade reality though in a racialised capitalist sys-

tem where white supremacy continues to thrive.

Even the section titled “Protecting Our Values” in the trade agreement carries a condescending tone that echoes British colonial attitudes. It reads: “Throughout the negotiations, we have championed our values—securing India’s first-ever chapters on anti-corruption, consumer protections, labour rights, the environment, gender equality, and development. We have protected the NHS, defended the UK’s interests, ensured the points-based immigration system is not affected, upheld our high food standards, and maintained our animal welfare commitments throughout. This deal demonstrates our commitment to both workers and businesses, staying true to our values while driving economic growth.” The language in this paragraph implies as if India lacked principles before this agreement—a patronising assertion that masks deeper, dominant and inherent colonial reminiscences. These lofty declarations serve as rhetorical cover for a deal crafted not by visionary leaders but by shopkeepers—those who focus

on trade margins and tariffs rather than social transformation. True transformational leadership seeks social progress through trade, business, and politics. This agreement, however, is a deal by shopkeepers, for shopkeepers. It offers nothing of substance to the working people of India or Britain, serving instead the entrenched interests of corporate elites in both nations.

In “An Inquiry into the Nature and Causes of the Wealth of Nations,” Scottish economist and moral philosopher Adam Smith defined Britain during his time as “a great empire for the sole purpose of raising up a people of customers, may at first sight, appear a project fit only for a nation of shopkeepers.” It is, however, a project altogether unfit for a nation of shopkeepers, but extremely fit for a nation whose government is influenced by shopkeepers. “Such statesmen, and such statesmen only, are capable of fancying that they will find some advantage in employing the blood and treasure of their fellow-citizens, to found and maintain such an empire.” These words were written in the late 18th century and published on 9 March, 1776, yet they echo unmistakably in the UK-India trade deal of May 2025. The British empire is dead, but its spirit continues to guide its governing elites and their shopkeeper mentality where people are treated as customers and nation-states reduced to mere markets. The celebration of the UK-India trade deal is merely a reflection of this ideological framework, where a corporate coup is presented as mutually beneficial, all while sidelining the interests of working people.

## Amalgamating rural banking

Establishment of Regional Rural Banks (RRBs) was based upon the report of the Working Group Committee headed by M Narasimha dated 30 July, 1975. The committee recommended the establishment of a new type of banking institution to supplement the efforts of commercial and cooperative banking institutions in the rural sector to develop the grassroots level economy. Later RRB Act of 1976 was passed on 9 February, 1976, expanding their network in mostly lead districts, maintaining a lean structure. Central government, state and sponsored banks held the stake in the proportion of 50:15:35. While the onus of management of RRBs rested on the sponsoring banks, the stake is well diversified.

The first RRB Prathama Grameen Bank was opened on 2 October, 1975, in Moradabad, which was sponsored by Syndicate Bank. RRBs since then were supervised by National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD). Initially, 6 RRBs started with 17 branches, and by 1991, the number grew to 196 RRBs with

14,000 branches.

It is pertinent to note that during the last 50 years, RRBs played a critical role in providing banking services to the underserved segments of the economy. RRBs were active in opening bank accounts under PMJDY and used the Jan Dhan, Aadhaar, and Mobile (JAM) trinity to foster financial inclusion. In the recent past, RRBs have posted the highest ever consolidated net profit of ₹4,974 crore during FY23, and their consolidated Capital to Risk Weighted Assets Ratio (CRAR) was at an all-time high of 13.43% as on 31 March 2023. The asset quality measured by GNPA (Gross Non-Performing Assets) at 7.28% was the lowest in the previous 7 years. Credit expansion led to an increase in the consolidated CD ratio to 67.50%, which was the highest in over 15 years.

Though RRBs account for just 2.9% outstanding loans of ₹4.1 lakh crore out of the total bank credit of all banks, they have not only achieved the priority sector lending target of 75% of Net Demand and Time Liabilities (NDTL) but also effectively leveraged

their high priority sector lending portfolio.

In the past, RRBs have initiated phased amalgamations, leading to an expansion in coverage, and increase in branches. By 2005, in phase 1 itself the numbers were reduced from 196 to 67. They were further reduced to 56 banks in March 2016 in phase 2, and in the third phase, the RRBs were merged and the number reduced to 43.

As on 31 March 2023, the 43 RRBs sponsored by 12 Scheduled Commercial Banks have a network of 21,995 branches with operations extending to 30.53 crore deposit accounts and 2.90 crore loan accounts in 26 states and 3 Union Territories.

In the phase 4 amalgamation, under the “One State, One RRB” initiative it is aimed to reduce the number of RRBs to 28 covering 700 districts with more than 22,000 branches. According to the notification of the Finance Ministry, the RRBs present in 11 states - Andhra Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Bengal, Bihar, Gujarat, Jammu and Kashmir, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Odisha and Ra-

jasthan will be merged into one entity each.

One RRB in each state will open up opportunities to operate in the entire state and coordinate with the state-level bankers committee as one of the key stakeholders in the banking ecosystem of the state. The policy to limit one RRB in one state will prevent the overlapping clout of different sponsoring banks in the state. A unitary control of one sponsoring bank will be able to shape the RRBs into a powerful banking institution with technology and manpower support to make it more effective. Structurally, this is also the best combination to have one RRB in each state for integrated involvement in the development of the rural economy.

The merger of multiple RRBs into unified entities will mark a pivotal reform in India’s rural banking structure. By reducing fragmentation and fostering scale, the move is expected to bring long-term benefits to both the banking sector and rural customers.

### Strategic masterstroke

Red alert declared in UP

**Lucknow, May 7:** Uttar Pradesh Wednesday declared Red Alert in the state following 'Operation Sindoor' by the armed forces against terror camps in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK), UP DGP said Wednesday. In retaliation to the Pahalgalam terror attack, Indian armed forces carried out missile strikes early Wednesday on nine terror targets in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir, including the Jaish-e-Mohammad stronghold of Bahawalpur and Lashkar-e-Taiba's base Muridke. "Red alert has been declared in Uttar Pradesh in view of the action taken by the Indian Army on terrorist hideouts under #OperationSindoor. All field units of @UPpolice have been instructed to coordinate with the defense forces and strengthen the security of im-



portant installations," UP DGP Prashant Kumar said from his 'X' handle. "UP Police is alert, equipped with resources, and fully prepared to ensure the safety of every citizen of the state. Jai Hind!" he added. Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath emphasised ensuring public safety and maintaining law and order across Uttar Pradesh, prompting the DGP to order immediate compliance from all district, commissionerate, and police units. The key directives issued include enhancing security at critical installations by strengthening physical security, surveillance systems, and perimeter defenses. Mock drills under internal security protocols are to be conducted with full preparedness, including pre-briefing and post-debriefing sessions. Participation of all relevant security units has been mandated, the directive said. The DGP also asked for an audit of police facilities and resources stating that security audits are to be carried out at police lines, offices, depots,

units, and control rooms. "Deficiencies must be swiftly addressed. Cybersecurity of police servers and websites is also to be reinforced," he said. "Entry protocols at critical establishments must be tightened with proper identification checks and verification procedures," he added. Emphasising on close coordination with agencies, he said it is to be maintained with the Army, Air Force, civil defence, intelligence units, and other relevant agencies, adding that senior police officers will oversee the coordination efforts. About security of strategic movements, he said confidentiality and secure movement of military convoys via highways and railways, ATF/fuel supply for air operations, and protection of railway bridges and tracks are to be ensured. All movements will follow a "need-to-know" confidentiality protocol, he said. Directing for heightened vigilance in communally sensitive areas, the DGP said districts with communal sensitivity are to remain on high alert with increased force deployment.

2 airports closed, schools shut in 3 border districts

**Jaipur, May 7:** A high alert has been sounded in all border areas of Rajasthan after India's airstrikes Pakistan-based terror bases. Also, Bikaner and Jodhpur airports have been closed. At the same time, a holiday has been declared in schools today in border cities, including Bikaner, Barmer and Jaisalmer, on the orders of the District Collector. In Bikaner, government employees' leaves have been cancelled, and they have been ordered not to leave the headquarters. India has carried out airstrikes at nine places in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir. Bahawalpur, Pakistan, was attacked, where hideouts of the terrorist organisation Jaish-e-Mohammed are located. Bahawalpur is about 100 km from the Rajasthan-Pakistan border. Meanwhile Air India in its tweet said, "In view of the prevailing situation, Air India has cancelled all its flights to and from the following stations - Jammu, Srinagar, Leh, Jodhpur, Amritsar, Bhuj, Jamnagar, Chandigarh and Rajkot - till 12 noon 7 May, pending further updates from authorities. Two international flights en route to



Amritsar are being diverted to Delhi. We regret the inconvenience caused due to this unforeseen disruption." Around 2 am, the sounds of fighter jets were heard in many areas of Jaisalmer-Barmer. Eyewitnesses said that at first it seemed that India was doing some exercise, but later it came to light that India had carried out an airstrike. Meanwhile, officials said that four flights, which were going to the states near the Pakistan border, have been cancelled at Jaipur airport. Flight operations from Bikaner airport have also been stopped. Bikaner District Collector Namrata Vishni has cancelled the leaves of all the officers and employees of the district. All employees will have to at-

Mock drills conducted in several Rajasthan cities

**Jaipur:** Acting on the directives of the Ministry of Home Affairs, several cities in Rajasthan, including the state capital Jaipur, conducted large-scale mock drills Wednesday to test wartime civil defence mechanisms. Also, air strike simulation exercises were conducted in Jaipur after over 50 years, while a high alert was issued in border districts as well. These simulated air strike response exercises were carried out in key urban and border areas, including Jaipur, Jodhpur, Udaipur, Bikaner, Dausa, Alwar, Sikar, Sirohi, Kota, Barmer, Jaisalmer, Bharatpur, Rawatbhata, and Sri Ganganagar. In fact, air strike drill was held in Jaipur after five decades. Officials confirmed that for the first time in nearly 50 years, Jaipur witnessed an air strike simulation -- a preparedness effort not seen since the 1971 India-Pakistan War. The mock drill took place at the BSNL office on MI Road, with a warning siren sounding at the Rajasthan Secretariat to alert staff and citizens. The District Collector received a simulated air strike alert via hotline, triggering immediate action to relocate citizens to designated safe zones. Government employees at the Secretariat were also trained on emergency evacuation and rescue protocols. A similar mock drill was conducted at 4 pm in Kota, which, along with Rawatbhata, has been marked as a high-sensitivity zone by the Central government due to its strategic importance. Civil defence teams, police personnel, and fire brigade units participated in the exercise.

BKU extends support, puts protests on hold

Earlier, BKU leader Rakesh Tikait had announced a tractor march to protest against the recent terrorist attack in Kashmir Valley's Pahalgalam that left 26 people, mostly tourists, dead. The date for the march will be decided in the coming days,

he had informed. "We have postponed all our agitations and movements due to the situation after Operation Sindoor. We welcome the action taken and urge the government to continue taking strict steps against terrorism," Tikait said. He also congratulated the authorities on the operation and extended full support to the government in its fight against terrorism. The BKU has been holding protests over various issues related to farmers' interests. Tikait was allegedly heckled at the 'Akrosh' rally organised by some right-wing groups May 2 to protest the Pahalgalam terror attack that killed 26 people, mostly holidayers, April 22. The farmer leader was reportedly asked to

leave. In the commotion, his turban fell, as seen in some purported videos of the incident. "The incident was not spontaneous. It was pre-planned and driven by political motives," Naresh Tikait had said. Rakesh Tikait also denounced the alleged heckling, saying he believed it was a political sabotage. Earlier, Naresh Tikait had also announced that the panchayat would be held at the GIC ground to deliberate on the incident, calling it part of a conspiracy orchestrated by a "political party" to weaken the farmers' movement. The Samyukt Kisan Morcha (SKM) and the All India Kisan Sabha (AIKS) had also condemned the alleged attack on Tikait.

Food biz without licence not allowed in UP

**Lucknow, May 7:** The Uttar Pradesh government Wednesday extended its campaign to help food business operators register themselves and obtain licences till May 31 and said those without valid documents will not be allowed to operate. Initiated in the first week of April by the Food Safety and Drug Administration (FSDA), the campaign aims to bring all food-related businesses -- from street vendors to large restaurants and food manufacturing units -- under mandatory food safety compliance. The objective of the campaign is to ensure that every food business operator (FBO) in both urban and rural areas registers and obtains a licence under the Food Safety and Standards Act. The step seeks to guarantee provision of safe and quality food to the consumers, while also curbing unregulated practices in the food sector, the government



said in a statement. "District-level food safety officers have been instructed to conduct special camps to facilitate on-the-spot registration and licensing for food vendors and restaurant owners. Strict orders have been given to ensure that no food

establishment operates without valid documentation," it said. Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has directed that no food business should function outside the framework of food safety regulations. "Despite legal requirements, many

small and large food operators are yet to comply with licensing norms," it added. FSDA has launched intensive outreach efforts across all districts, holding registration camps and deploying food safety teams to assist businesses. "The campaign is not only about compliance but also public health. Unlicensed food businesses pose risks to consumers and violate legal provisions. Therefore, authorities are ensuring full coverage -- from roadside vendors and dhabas to premium restaurants -- under the drive," the government said. Thousands of new registrations have been completed during the campaign. The food safety department has also warned that from May 31, strict action will be taken against food businesses operating without valid licences. Food safety officers are tasked with enforcing compliance in every district, it added.

Rajasthan to witness prolonged spell of rain, storm for next 3-4 days

**Jaipur:** Rajasthan will witness a spell of rain and storms for the next three to four days, the Met office said Wednesday. Light to moderate rain with thunderstorms is possible in the southern, eastern and western parts of the state for the next three to four days, with wind speed reaching up to 50 km per hour, the forecast reads. May 12 onwards, the temperature is likely to increase by three to five degrees Celsius. However, in a welcome respite, the state will not witness any heatwave for the next five to six days. Western disturbance remains over western parts of Madhya Pradesh and the surrounding areas in the form of a circulation system. As a result, strong thunderstorms are expected in parts of Udaipur and Kota divisions. Heavy rains, with a wind speed of 50-60 km per hour, are also likely to occur. There is a possibility of light to moderate rain and thunderstorms at some places in Jodhpur, Bikaner, Jaipur, Bharatpur, and Ajmer divisions today.

Over 300 flights cancelled

**New Delhi/ Mumbai, May 7:** More than 300 flights have been cancelled and at least 25 airports, including Srinagar, have been temporarily shut for operations amid restrictions in the wake of the armed forces launching missile attacks on terror targets in Pakistan Wednesday morning.

Air India, IndiGo, SpiceJet, Air India Express, Akasa Air, and a few foreign airlines have cancelled their services to and from various airports. Sources said that at least 25 airports in the northern and western parts of the country have been temporarily shut. These airports include Srinagar, Leh, Jammu, Amritsar, Pathankot, Chandigarh, Jodhpur, Jaisalmer, Shimla, Dharamshala and Jamnagar, they added.

According to one of the sources, more than 300 flights to and from various airports have been cancelled by airlines. IndiGo said it has cancelled more than 165 flights from various domestic airports, including Amritsar and Srinagar, till early morning of May 10 due to airspace restrictions.

The sources said that around 140 flights of Air India Group -- Air India and Air India Express -- have been cancelled. "Air India flights to and from the following stations, Jammu, Srinagar, Leh, Jodhpur, Amritsar, Bhuj, Jamnagar, Chandigarh, and Rajkot, are being cancelled till 0529 hrs IST on 10 May following a notification from aviation authorities on the closure of these airports," the airline said.

In a post on X, the airline also said passengers holding valid tickets for travel during

this period will be offered a one-time waiver on rescheduling charges or a full refund for cancellations. "Due to government notification on airspace restrictions, over 165 IndiGo flights from multiple airports (Amritsar, Bikaner, Chandigarh, Dharamshala, Gwalior, Jammu, Jodhpur, Kishangarh, Leh, Rajkot, and Srinagar) are cancelled until 0529 hrs. IST of 10 May 2025," IndiGo said in a statement.

The airline also said that passengers whose flights are affected can reschedule the

booking on the next available flight or opt to cancel their bookings at no additional cost, and a full refund will be processed. IndiGo operates around 2,200 flights daily. In an update on X, SpiceJet said that due to the ongoing situation, flights to and from Leh, Srinagar, Jammu, Dharamshala, Kandla and Amritsar are cancelled till 0529 hours of May 10.

The affected passengers can opt for a full refund or an alternate flight as per availability, it added. Around 140 flights to and from the Delhi airport

were cancelled by various airlines including foreign carriers Wednesday.

As many as 65 arrivals and 66 departures were cancelled. Besides, 2 international departures and 2 international arrivals were cancelled during the day, one of the sources said.

Delhi International Airport Ltd (DIAL) operates the Indira Gandhi International Airport (IGIA). Akasa Air, in a post on X, said that due to the prevailing situation in the region, all its flights to and from Srinagar have been cancelled until May 9.

As per data available on flight tracking website Flightradar24.com, United Airlines cancelled its flight from Newark to Delhi while American Airlines cancelled its flight from New York to Delhi. Regional carrier Star Air said its flights to/from Nanded, Hindon, Adampur, Kishangarh and Bhuj stand cancelled for the day.

Meanwhile, Qatar Airways, in a post on X, said it has temporarily suspended flights to Pakistan due to Pakistani airspace closure. India Wednesday closed about 25 flight routes that allow planes to enter Pakistan through the Indian airspace on a day when the armed forces launched missile attacks on terror targets in Pakistan, according to officials.

In retaliation against the Pahalgam terror attack, Indian armed forces, under Operation Sindoor, on early Wednesday, carried out missile strikes on nine terror targets in Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir, including the Jaish-e-Mohammad stronghold of Bawalpur and Lashkar-e-Taiba's base in Muridke.

MoU signed between Patanjali varsity, IKS Division and Education ministry

**Haridwar, May 7:** A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) has been signed between Patanjali University, Patanjali Research Foundation (PRF), and the Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS) Division under the Ministry of Education, Government of India. This collaboration aims to promote mutual academic cooperation and advance the preservation and dissemination of India's ancient knowledge traditions.

The MoU was formally signed by Acharya Balkrishna, Vice Chancellor of Patanjali University, and Prof Anil Sahasrabudhe, Chairman of the Implementation Committee of the IKS Division and Executive Committee of NAAC.

Acharya Balkrishna highlighted that the MoU will enable Patanjali University to be recognised as an official IKS Center. The university will host research initiatives, training sessions, workshops, and conferences under the aegis of the IKS Division. A key



feature of the agreement is the development of joint projects to publish and share scholarly research on Indian Knowledge Systems carried out by Patanjali University and PRF.

He further added that both institutions will contribute scientific expertise to the collaboration. One major initiative will be the establishment of a museum at Patanjali University in partnership with the IKS Division. This museum will feature archaeological artifacts along with comprehensive exhibits on India's historical, scientific, and cultural legacy.

The university will also support documentation and preservation projects covering areas such as ancient rituals, manu-

scripts, music, languages, traditional medicine, governance systems, and indigenous disaster management practices. Additionally, Patanjali University plans to develop online certification and vocational courses rooted in Indian Knowledge Systems, with approval from the IKS Division.

Prof. Anil Sahasrabudhe noted that this partnership will support evidence-based research in Indian philosophy, history, and related disciplines. A specialised lab will be developed to explore foundational concepts of Indian knowledge using advanced scientific tools. The IKS Division will also assist in facilitating necessary permissions from other government bodies for future research.

Land compensation must reflect equity, justice & fairness: SC

**New Delhi, May 7:** The Supreme Court Wednesday said the compensation for land acquisition cannot be assessed in a mechanical manner but must be guided by considerations of equality, equity, and justice.

A bench of Justices Surya Kant and Ujjal Bhuyan said a fundamental principle in land acquisition jurisprudence was that lands with similar locational and developmental potential must be compensated equitably unless clear, objective distinctions justify otherwise.

The bench said it must caution against an "excessively positivist" approach in matters of land acquisition. "It is

well understood that the very exercise of assessing compensation is antithetical to rigid formalism. Compensation cannot be assessed in a mechanical or formulaic manner but must be guided by considerations of equality, equity, and justice," it said.

The apex court's verdict came on a batch of cross-appeals filed by the Haryana State Industrial and Infrastructure Development Corporation and several landowners challenging the quantum of compensation awarded by the Punjab and Haryana High Court for the land situated in Fazalwas and Kukrola villages in Gurugram district.

The bench observed the acquisition proceedings com-



menced in April 2008 and the public purpose of the acquisition was to build Chaudhary Devi Lal Industrial Model Township.

The determination of compensation for compulsory

acquisitions under the Land Acquisition Act, 1894, was fundamentally an exercise in equity, it added.

The bench said instead of being a "precise science", the law of compulsory acquisition

in India strives to uphold the enduring principles of justice, equality and fairness.

"This ethos is reflected in the procedural framework of the 1894 Act and has been further refined by its successor-statute, i.e., the Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act, 2013," it said.

The bench said the apex court has consistently held that the determination of market value and corresponding compensation must necessarily factor in the escalation of land prices over time. "Given the inherently dynamic nature of real estate markets, any assessment of land value cannot remain static but must reflect prevail-

ing economic conditions, infrastructural developments, and increasing demand," it said.

The bench partly allowed the appeals of the landowners from Kukrola Village and modified the high court's May 2022 verdict.

It upheld the high court order granting compensation for the "outer belt", that is, lands beyond 5 acre from NH-8, at Rs 62.14,121 per acre.

It noted the high court essentially categorised the lands acquired from these two villages into the "inner belt" and the "outer belt". The apex court noted the "inner belt" referred to lands abutting NH-8 up to a depth of 5 acre whereas the "outer belt" comprises lands beyond that limit.



Indo-Pak standoffs



India and Pakistan have shared a turbulent history since their partition in 1947, marked by multiple wars, skirmishes, and cross-border tensions. Here's the timeline of India-Pakistan armed conflicts:

1947 (first Indo-Pak War)

The war, also known as the First Kashmir War, broke out over the then princely state of Jammu and Kashmir between the newly independent nations India and Pakistan. It began in October 1947 when Pakistan-backed tribal militias invaded the princely state. In response, post the accession of Jammu and Kashmir to the Indian Union by Maharaja Hari Singh, India sent its troops to defend the region, leading to full-scale conflict between the two nations.

1965 (second Indo-Pak War)

The armed conflict broke out August 5, 1965 over Kashmir. It was triggered when thousands of Pakistani soldiers, disguised as local insurgents, infiltrated the Indian territory across the LoC in Jammu and Kashmir.

1971 (Bangladesh Liberation War)

The 1971 Indo-Pak War was triggered by Pakistani military's crackdown on East Pakistan (now Bangladesh) and its demand for independence. India entered the war in support of the Bangladeshi independence movement, and after intense fighting on both the eastern and western fronts, Pakistan's forces surrendered December 16, 1971.

1999 (Kargil War)

The 1999 Kargil War was a high-altitude conflict between India and Pakistan, fought from May to July after Pakistani troops and terrorists occupied peaks in the Kargil sector of Jammu and Kashmir. India launched 'Operation Vijay' to reclaim the territory, supported by the Air Force's 'Operation Safed Sagar'. The war ended July 26 with India regaining control, a day now marked as 'Kargil Vijay Diwas'.

2016 (Uri Attack)

Following the terrorist attack on an Indian Army base in Uri, Jammu and Kashmir, on September 18, 2016, which killed 19 soldiers, India conducted a surgical strike on September 28-29 across the LoC. The Indian Army targeted multiple terrorist launch pads in PoK, claiming significant casualties among terrorists preparing to infiltrate.

2019 (Pulwama attack)

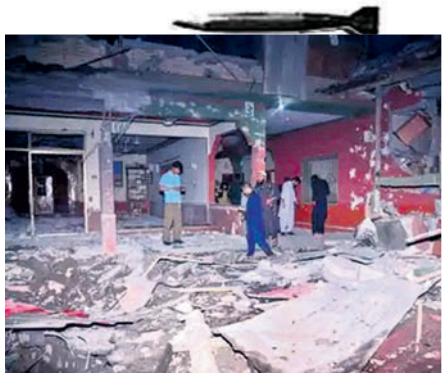
On February 26, 2019, the Indian Air Force carried out airstrikes on a Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) terrorist training camp in Balakot, Pakistan, in response to the Pulwama terror attack that killed 40 CRPF personnel. Using fighter jets, India targeted the camp deep inside Pakistani territory, marking the first such airstrike since the 1971 war.

13 KILLED AS PAK POUNDS VILLAGES ALONG LoC IN J&K

**Jammu/Srinagar, May 7:** At least 13 people, including four children and a soldier, were killed and 57 injured as the Pakistan Army carried out one of the most intense artillery and mortar shelling in years targeting forward villages along the LoC in Jammu and Kashmir, officials said Wednesday.

Hundreds of residents were forced to take refuge in underground bunkers or to safer places as the indiscriminate shelling by Pakistan destroyed houses, vehicles and various buildings, including a Gurudwara, and created panic among the border residents in the worst-hit Poonch district and Rajouri in Jammu region and Baramulla and Kup-

wara in north Kashmir. The officials said the Indian Army is responding to the shelling in a befitting manner, resulting in many casualties on the enemy side after several of their posts engaged in firing were destroyed. Poonch district accounted for all 13 deaths, the officials said, adding 42 people were also injured and the condition of two of them was stated to be serious. The shelling was reported from all along the LoC in Poonch, including Balakote, Mendhar, Mankote, Krishna Ghati, Gulpur, Kerni and even Poonch district headquarters, resulting in damage to dozens of houses and vehicles, they said.

Missile strikes a fitting tribute: Families of Pahalgam victims

**New Delhi, May 7:** A sense of satisfaction and relief was collectively shared by the families of Pahalgam terror attack victims after the Indian armed forces carried out missile strikes.

"Terrorists will think 100 times before acting again," said Rajesh Narwal, father of Lt Vinay Narwal, hailing India's response. "I had said that such a thing (retaliatory strikes) has to be done so that no one dares to do such a cowardly act again... the strikes carried out on the terror targets will resonate in their minds forever," Rajesh said. Married about three weeks ago, Narwal (26), accompanied by his wife Himanshi, was on a honeymoon in Pahalgam when terrorists shot him at point-blank range.

Sumathi, the mother of Manjunath Rao from Shivamogga in Karnataka who was killed in Pahalgam, said she did not want her son's "sacrifice" to go to waste. Rao had travelled to Kashmir with his wife Pallavi

and son Abhijeya. Bharath Bhushan from Bangalore, who was visiting Pahalgam with his wife and three-year-old son, was also shot dead by terrorists. Bhushan's father Channaveerappa hailed the armed forces' response. Jennifer, wife of Sushil Nathaniel, said the four terrorists involved in the Pahalgam attack should be killed. Sushil Nathaniel, an Indore resident, was holidaying with his wife in Pa-

halgam. Arathy, daughter of N Ramachandran from Kochi, expressed hope that the operation would bring some relief to the families of the victims. Sangita Ganbote, wife of Kaustubh, said that they were extremely happy that India avenged the Pahalgam terrorist attack in which she and other women lost their "sindoor". "We were all waiting to see when India would avenge the terrorist attack. Today, the Indian armed

forces gave a befitting reply to the cowardly attack in Pahalgam," she said. Harshal Lele, who lost his father Sanjay Lele and relatives Atul Mone and Hemant Joshi in the terror attack, expressed a sense of closure after Operation Sindoor. The families of Samir Guha and Bitan Adhikary, two victims from West Bengal, called the operation a "step towards justice". Odisha's Priya Darshani Acharya, who lost her husband Prashant Satpathy in the Pahalgam attack, said terrorists must live in fear and would now understand the value of a human life. Kajalben Parmar from Bhavnagar in Gujarat, who lost her husband Yatish Parmar and their son Smit in the terror attack, urged the government to continue action against Pakistan till it is wiped out. Shitalben Kalathiya from Surat, wife of victim Shailesh Kalathiya, told the media that she was "very satisfied" with India's action against Pakistan.

# Pak PM vows to respond

*In retaliation for the Pahalgam terror attack, Indian armed forces carried out missile strikes early Wednesday, hitting terrorist infrastructure in Pakistan and PoK from where terrorist attacks against India have been planned and directed*

**Islamabad, May 7:** Pakistan’s top security body Wednesday said the armed forces have been duly authorised to undertake retaliation “at a time, place, and manner of its choosing” to avenge the loss of lives in the Indian military strikes.

Pakistan Army spokesman Lt Gen Ahmad Sharif Chaudhry said 31 people were killed and 57 others injured in the missile strikes launched shortly after midnight on cities in the Punjab province and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK), and firing on the Line of Control.

Jaish-e-Mohammad chief Maulana Masood Azhar’s 10 family members and four close aides were killed in the attack on the outfit’s headquarters in Bahawalpur.

A hurriedly called National Security Council meeting, chaired by Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and attended by cabinet ministers, chief ministers, all services chiefs and senior officers, described the strikes as “unprovoked” and an “unlawful act of war”.

An NSC statement warned that in consonance with Article 51 of the UN Charter, Pakistan reserves the right to respond, in self-defence, “at a time, place, and manner of its choosing” to avenge the loss of innocent Pakistani lives in the Indian strikes.

“The Armed Forces of Pakistan have duly been authorised to undertake corresponding actions in this regard,” the statement said.

Addressing a session of the Parliament later, Prime Minister Shehbaz claimed that the Pakistan armed forces destroyed five

Indian jets. He, however, did not provide any evidence in support of his claim.

He lauded the Pakistan Air Force and its chief “for the swift response”, saying that the armed

forces had prior intelligence about India’s plans.

Addressing the nation Wednesday night, Shehbaz claimed that India “paid a heavy price” for attacking Pakistan despite its numerical superiority and strength.

India launched Operation Sindoor early Wednesday hitting nine terror targets in PoK and Punjab in retaliation for the terror attack in Pahalgam April 22 that killed 26

people. Citing “cross-border linkages” to the horrific attack, India had promised severe punishment to those involved in the strike.

Defence Minister Khawaja Asif earlier said Pakistan is ready to “wrap up” tensions with India if New Delhi de-escalates the situation.

“We have been saying all along in the last fortnight that we’ll never initiate anything hostile towards India. But if we’re attacked, we’ll respond. If India backs down, we will definitely wrap up this tension,” he was quoted as saying by Bloomberg Television.

The Pakistan Army spokesman said six locations were attacked by India.

He said that 13 people were killed and 37 others injured in Bahawalpur’s Ahmedpur East, where the Subhan Allah mosque was attacked. In Muridke, three men were killed and one was injured.

In Muzaffarabad, three persons were killed and two injured in the attack on the Bilal mosque. In the strike at Kotli, two youths were killed, while two persons were injured.

The army spokesperson also said that five civilians were killed in cross LoC firing by India.

JeM chief Azhar acknowledged that 10 members of his family and four close associates were killed in the missile attack on the outfit’s headquarters in Bahawalpur.

The funeral prayer for Qari Abdul Malik, Khalid and Mudassir was held in Muridke amid high security, said Tabish Qayyum, spokesperson of the Pakistan Markazi Muslim League, a political wing of JuD. Members of the civil bureaucracy were also present at the funeral, said Qayyum, who also attended the event. The funeral prayer was led by Hafiz Abdul Rauf, with prayers offered for the safety and security of the country.

## Pak restores air traffic across major routes

**KARACHI/ISLAMABAD:** Pakistan Wednesday evening restored air traffic across major routes, while a few routes are to remain closed for another 24 hours. The Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) made the announcement as per a revised notice to airmen (NOTAM) it issued. Pakistan earlier Wednesday announced a 48-hour closure of its airspace for all air traffic after India carried out a military strike on terror targets in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir. The CAA in the revised NOTAM said that the airspace in Islamabad, Rawalpindi and Karachi has now been fully restored. In a separate notice, it added that certain parts of the air traffic route in the Lahore Flight Region would remain closed at all altitudes for operational reasons until 12:20 pm May 9.

## Emergency declared in Pak’s Punjab province

**LAHORE:** Emergency was declared Wednesday in Pakistan’s Punjab province even as all educational institutions closed in the wake of the Indian missile attack. “Punjab Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz has declared a state of emergency across the province,” a Punjab government statement said here. All security agencies, including Punjab police, have been placed on high alert. Leaves of all doctors and medical staff across hospitals in Punjab have been cancelled. The statement said all staff have been ordered to report for duty immediately and district administrations in all districts of Punjab have also been placed on high alert. Officers and personnel of all relevant institutions, including Civil Defence, have been summoned, it said. The educational institutions would remain closed Wednesday, the statement said.

## Pak blocks 16 Indian YouTube news channels, 32 websites

**ISLAMABAD:** Pakistani authorities have blocked 16 Indian YouTube news channels, 31 YouTube links, and 32 websites in view of the prevailing regional situation. The move is part of the Pakistan Telecommunication Authority’s continued efforts to ensure the responsible use of digital platforms, officials said. The action of blocking 16 Indian YouTube news channels, 31 YouTube links, and 32 websites “has been taken in the light of the prevailing regional situation to safeguard national security and protect Pakistan’s digital ecosystem,” the officials said.

# Sri Lanka prez’s party continues winning streak

**Colombo, May 7:** The National People’s Power led by President Anura Kumara Dissanayake Wednesday emerged as the largest party in 265 out of 339 local municipal councils across Sri Lanka despite failing to win capital Colombo’s body.

However, the National People’s Power (NPP) party’s ability to form administrations in those 265 bodies is in doubt as the combined opposition groups have more members than NPP in multiple councils, official results issued by the independent election commission has shown.

The election commission data showed that the ruling NPP garnered over 4.5 million votes or 43 per cent of the votes, drastically down from the 68 per cent polled at the parliamentary election held in November last year. It also had a thumping win in the presidential polls prior to that.

The main opposition Samagi Jana Balawegaya (SJB) won just 14 of the 339 councils earning 21 per cent vote.

More than 70 per cent of the registered voters exercised their franchise Tuesday in the local council polls, which were postponed in 2023 following the economic crisis in the island nation.

# ISRAELI STRIKES KILL 38 IN GAZA

**Cairo/Gaza, May 7:** Israeli strikes on a school housing displaced families and by a crowded market and restaurant in Gaza City killed at least 38 people Wednesday, local health authorities said.

Medics said two strikes targeted the Karama School in Tuffah, a suburb of Gaza City, killing 15. Later in the day, an Israeli strike near a restaurant and market in the city killed at least 23 people, including women and children, medics said.

away on the back of pickups and carts. Ambulances sped down shattered streets and a

woman in tears carried a baby away from the scene, with two young children beside her.

An image posted on social media showed what appeared to be a family of three - mother, father and son - lying dead on the street in pools of blood. The young boy was carrying a pink backpack. Reuters could not immediately verify the image that was purportedly from the scene of the Tuffah strike.

There was no immediate Israeli comment. Two Israeli airstrikes on another school, housing displaced people in Bureij camp in central Gaza, killed at least 33 people, includ-

ing women and children, Tuesday, local health authorities said. The Israeli military said it struck “terrorists” operating from a command center in the compound.

The strike smashed classrooms, destroyed furniture and left a large crater in the school campus. Survivors sifted through rubble to look for some of their belongings Wednesday.

“What happened is an earthquake. The Israeli occupation hit a school housing children. They are children,” said eyewitness Ali Al-Shaqra. He said the school housed 300 families.

“Here is the building; it was razed to the ground. We cannot find the gas cylinder, the flour bag we had, the kilo of rice, or the meal we got from the Tukkiyah (community kitchen). Thank God we are left with the clothes we had on,” Shaqra added.

In Rafah in the southern Gaza Strip, near the border with Egypt, residents and Hamas sources said Israeli forces, who have taken control of the city, continued to blow up and demolish houses and buildings.

Al-Qassam Brigades, the military wing of the Palestinian militant group Hamas, said Wednesday their fighters had detonated a pre-planted minefield targeting an Israeli armoured force east of Khan Younis in the south. They said they inflicted casualties, followed by mortar shelling of the area.

# US, China to hold ice-breaker trade talks in Geneva

**Washington/Beijing, May 7:** US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent and chief trade negotiator Jamieson Greer will meet China’s economic tsar He Lifeng in Switzerland this weekend for talks that could be the first step toward resolving a trade war disrupting the global economy.

News of the planned Geneva meeting, first announced by Washington late Tuesday, sent US equity index futures higher. Stock markets in China and Hong Kong followed suit during Asian trading Wednesday.

The talks come after weeks of escalating tensions that have seen duties on goods imports between the world’s two largest economies soar well beyond 100%, amounting to what Bessent Tuesday described as the equivalent of a trade embargo.

The impasse, alongside US President Donald Trump’s decision last month to slap sweeping duties on dozens of other countries, has upended supply chains, roiled financial markets and stoked fears of a sharp downturn in global growth.

The negotiating teams convening in Switzerland, known



for its neutrality, are expected to discuss reductions to the broader tariffs, two sources familiar with the planning said. The talks should also cover duties on specific products, export controls and Trump’s decision to end de minimis exemptions on low-value imports, one of the sources added.

China’s State Council did not immediately reply to a faxed request for comment.

“My sense is this will be about de-escalation,” Bessent told Fox News after the announcement. “We’ve got to de-escalate before we can move forward.”

A Chinese commerce ministry spokesperson later confirmed that China had agreed to meet the US envoys.

“On the basis of fully considering global expectations, China’s interests, and the appeals of US industry and consumers, China has decided to re-engage the US,” the spokesperson said, citing a proverb about actions speaking louder than words.

**Mumbai, May 7:** Benchmark stock indices Sensex and Nifty closed higher in a volatile session on Wednesday as India launched missile strikes on terrorist hideouts in Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir.

After gyrating between gains and losses during the day, the 30-share BSE Sensex ended 105.71 points or 0.13 per cent higher at 80,746.78. The index opened sharply down by 692 points and fell further to hit a day's low of 79,937.48 in early trade. However, buying in private banks and select auto shares such as Tata Motors helped the barometer recover most of the losses and hit a high of 80,844.63 later.

The 50-issue Nifty of NSE advanced by 34.80 points or 0.14 per cent to settle at 24,414.40. Nifty moved between a high of 24,449.60 and a low of 24,220 during the session.

Broader markets also recouped intraday losses and closed higher by more than a per cent. Sectoral indices closed mixed as auto, realty, and metal sectors advanced while pharma and FMCG ended in the red.

"Geopolitical tensions, following India's military response to a terrorist attack, triggered a gap-down opening. However, a swift recovery helped the indices edge higher by the close," Ajit Mishra – SVP, Research, Religare



Broking Ltd said.

From the 30-share Sensex firms, Tata Motors jumped the most by 5.05 per cent as India and the UK sealed a trade deal to reduce duties on most traded goods. The trade deal will make it easier for British firms to export whisky, cars, and other products to India.

Bajaj Finance, Eternal, Adani Ports, Tata Steel, HDFC Bank, Kotak Bank, ICICI Bank, Titan, Mahindra & Mahindra and Power Grid were among the gainers. Asian Paints, Sun Pharma, ITC, Nestle, Reliance Industries and HCL Tech were among the laggards.

Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) bought equities worth ₹3,794.52 crore on Tuesday, according to exchange data.

**Mumbai, May 7:** The rupee depreciated 42 paise to close at 84.77 against the US dollar Wednesday, as heightened cross-border tensions following India's military strikes against terrorist camps in Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir weighed on the domestic currency.

Indian armed forces on early Wednesday carried out missile strikes on nine terror targets in Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir including the Jaish-e-Mohammad stronghold of Bahawalpur and Lashkar-e-Taiba's base in Muridke.

Forex traders said the Indian rupee declined Wednesday after the Indian Army conducted 'Operation Sindoor' and struck terrorist camps in Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir, which weighed on the domestic currency.

At the interbank foreign exchange, the domestic unit opened at 84.65 and moved between an intra-day high of 84.47 and a low of 84.93 against the greenback. The unit ended the session at 84.77, registering a fall of 42 paise over its previous closing level.

On Tuesday, the rupee settled for the day 5 paise lower at 84.35 against the US dollar amid growing uncertainty and a cautious recalibration of risk appetite.

Meta pulls out over 23K Facebook Pages

**New Delhi, May 7:** Meta, in March, removed clusters of scam activity totalling over 23,000 Facebook Pages and accounts that primarily targeted people in Brazil and India, the social media giant said Wednesday.

Explaining the modus operandi, Meta said the scammers used deepfakes, among other techniques, falsely depicting popular personal finance content creators, cricket players and business figures in Brazil and India, endorsing scam investment apps and gambling websites.

The scammers redirected people to messaging apps for 'investment advice' and, in some cases, to a fake website that mimicked the Google Play store to download scam gambling apps. "In March, Meta removed multiple clusters of scam activity totalling over 23,000 Facebook Pages and accounts that primarily targeted people in Brazil and India," Meta said.

India to save ₹1.8L-cr on import bill on easing global oil prices

**New Delhi, May 7:** India as world's third largest oil importing and consuming nation, is likely to save approximately ₹1.8 lakh crore on import of crude oil and LNG shared Investment information and credit rating agency (Icra).

India meets over 85 per cent of its crude oil needs through imports, spent USD 242.4 billion on buying crude from overseas in the fiscal year ended March 31, 2025. With domestic production meeting roughly half of the demand, it also spent USD 15.2 billion on import of liquefied natural gas (LNG) in the fiscal.

Icra expects average crude prices for FY2026 (April 2025 to March 2026 fiscal year) to remain in the USD 60-70 per barrel range, the rating agency said in a note.

This uncertainty related to tariff trade call by US President Donald Trump has clubbed with the recent OPEC+ steadily withdraw their production cuts, starting with 411,000 barrels per day addition from May 2025 and another 411,000 bpd from June 2025, have resulted in oil prices declining from about USD 77 a barrel as on March 31 to about USD 60-62.

This announcement has impacted various major oil giants,



including Brent Crude and US West Texas Intermediate crude oil fell to their lowest since February 2021, have since risen to USD 62.4 on signs of more Europe and China demand and less US output. Still the rates are USD 20 per barrel lower than March 2024 when petrol and diesel prices were cut by ₹2 per litre each ahead of general elections.

As per reports, a sharp decline in the global oil market will lead to boosting the Indian market as it would help in increasing imports and profits simultaneously. Even Indian ports and airbuses companies will see a bullish market trend.

Marketing margins on auto fuels for oil marketing companies (OMCs) would remain above long term average of ₹2.5-4 a litre and under recoveries on LPG are expected to reduce with decline in crude prices.

100% movie tariff menaces Indian filmmakers

US president Donald Trump imposed cent per cent tariff on filmmaking affecting movie makers worldwide, especially Indian film industry as substantial earnings derives from US

**New Delhi, May 7:** Indian film industry, earns roughly 40 per cent of its overseas revenue from the United States, sounded the alarm this week about higher costs after President Donald Trump announced a tariff of 100 per cent on all movies produced beyond American soil. The announcement has disturbed the film makers, producers and distributors globally.

"The real question is how the term 'foreign produced' will be defined, and until that's clear, it's hard to say anything," said film maker Anubhav Sinha, known for his Netflix streaming series, "IC 814: The Kandahar Hijack".

"It's not yet clear whether services like post-production will be affected."

India's film industry em-



loys 272,000 people, with overseas box office takings of about 20 billion rupees (\$237 million) in fiscal 2024, or a tenth of total earnings, Deloitte and studio grouping the Motion Picture Association said in a report.

Key Hollywood films with India scenes are Oscar-winners such as the rags-to-riches tale "Slumdog Millionaire", and the Osama bin Laden manhunt thriller, "Zero Dark Thirty", along with rom-com "Eat, Pray Love", and Batman outing "The Dark Knight Rises".

In the absence of details on the planned levy, film producers worry it could double the cost of exporting their films to the United States, where people of Indian descent are estimated to number 5.2 million.

"The United States is one of the most important overseas markets for Indian cinema, largely due to the substantial diaspora," said producer Madhu Bhojwani, responsible for hits such as "Airlift", on workers evacuated from Kuwait during the Gulf War.

"Any increase in ticket prices resulting from these tariffs would directly affect audience turnout, compounding the challenges posed by evolving consumer behaviour and broader industry headwinds."

The cost-effective South Asian nation has also grown in stature as Hollywood's preferred hub for on-ground production and post-production services, especially in visual effects, since it offers a skilled talent pool.



OPERATION SINDOOR

The Indian armed forces, in the early hours of Wednesday, launched precision missile strikes on nine terror targets in Pakistan and Pakistan Occupied Jammu and Kashmir, including the strongholds of Jaish-e-Mohammed in Bawalpur and Lashkar-e-Taiba in Muridke.

The strikes were in retaliation to the April 22 terror attack in Pahalgam in which 26

people, mostly tourists, were gunned down.

"Fearless in unity. Boundless in strength. India's shield is her people. There's no room for terrorism in this world. We're ONE TEAM! Jai Hind," Tendulkar posted on 'X'.

Former cricketers Virender Sehwag, Irfan Pthan, Suresh Raina and Shikhar Dhawan also took to the social media platform in hailing India's strong response to the barbaric attack.

"Agar koi aap par patthar phenke toh uspar Phool Phenko, Lekin Gamle ke saath (If someone throws stones at you then respond with flowers but not without the pots they are planted in). Jai Hind," Sehwag wrote.

Inter Milan knock out Barca to reach final

**Milan, May 7:** Inter Milan has another Champions League final to look forward to. Once the players catch their breath, that is.

In the end it took extra time, two astonishing comebacks and 13 goals to separate Barcelona and Inter and see the Italian club — which was a mere seconds away from elimination — prevail 7-6 on aggregate after winning another rollercoaster encounter 4-3 Tuesday.

Substitute Davide Frattesi was the extra-time star for Inter, firing home in the 99th minute to leave the Barcelona players slumped to the ground while his Nerazzurri teammates — including those on the bench — were racing to celebrate with him.

"I don't know what happened tonight. I'm lucky I managed to finish the game, I screamed so much (in celebration) that I saw everything black," Frattesi told Italian broadcaster Sky.

Moments earlier, he'd been encouraging the already loud San Siro crowd to make more noise and the atmosphere grew more feverish after Frattesi delivered on his super-sub reputation again.

"That's part of my career," the midfielder said. "I wasn't given so much incredible talent, but I am always the last one to give up and the first one to believe we can do it. At 3-3, I told Marcus (Thuram) that we would go through." Three-time European champion Inter, which lost the 2023 final to Manchester City, will face either Paris Saint-Germain or Arsenal in Munich May 31 for the title. PSG beat Arsenal 1-0 in London last week in their first match. The return leg is Wednesday in Paris.

Inter coach Simone Inzaghi thinks his squad has shown in wins over Barcelona in the semis and Bayern Munich in the quarterfinals that it can compete against the very best.

"My players have been extraordinary, they've put out there two monstrous performances to get to this final," he said.

**New Delhi, May 7:** Rohit Sharma Wednesday announced his retirement from Test cricket with immediate effect ending all speculations about his future in the longest format.

The 38-year-old was India's most prolific Test batter in the second half of his career, scoring 4301 runs in 67 Tests with 12 hundreds and 18 half centuries at an average of 40.57.

Having already retired from T20 Internationals after the World Cup last year, Rohit will now only be seen in the ODI format for India.

"Hello everyone, I would just like to share that I am retiring from Test cricket. It's been an absolute honour to represent my country in whites. "Thank you for all the love and support over the years. I will continue to represent India in the ODI format," he posted on Instagram with a picture of his Test cap after PTI's newscast.

Rohit captained India to the World Test Championship final against Australia and save the last couple of indifferent series against New Zealand at home and the Border-Gavaskar series against Australia.

India will have a new Test captain for the five-Test series in England with possible candidates being Jasprit Bumrah, KL Rahul, Shubman Gill and Rishabh Pant. Rohit endured a particularly difficult run during the Border-Gavaskar Trophy where he had to drop himself from the playing XI owing to poor form but he had ruled out retirement at that stage. There was also widespread speculation about his differences with Head Coach Gautam Gambhir, who had vowed to end the "star culture" in Indian cricket after taking charge last year in July.

The Afghan spinner exploited the turning conditions brilliantly, picking up 4/31, to restrict KKR to 179/6 after Ajinkya Rahane opted to bat first in their must-win clash.

For CSK, their spin trio dominated the middle overs taking a combined 5/84 in 11 overs that proved to be the difference.

Chasing 180 under tricky conditions, CSK were rocked early on, losing half their side for just 60 inside 5.2 overs under the glowing Eden Gardens lights. But it was MS Dhoni who had the final say -- possibly for the last time at this venue -- finishing the chase with



his trademark calm and power, as CSK completed the task with two balls to spare.
