Indian climber dies while descending from Everest



Kathmandu: A 45-yearold Indian climber died on Mt Everest after showing signs of altitude

sickness while descending from the summit point of the world's highest peak, according to a media report Friday.

The deceased has been identified as Subrata Ghosh from West Bengal. Ghosh is the second foreigner to die on the 8,848.86 metres-high Mt Everest this season, The Himalayan Times newspaper reported. Bodhraj Bhandari, Managing Director at Snowy Horizon Treks, said that Ghosh died just below the Hillary Step, near the summit point of Mt Everest Saturday, according to the paper.

India to divert Indus water Having put the Indus Waters Tractor (INUT) with Packiston in

Treaty (IWT) with Pakistan in abeyance in the wake of the Pahalgam terrorist attack. India is now considering to expand the Ranbir canal on the Chenab and is also weighing other projects to divert the waters of the Indus, Chenab and Jhelum to three northern Indian states. The IWT is regarded as one of the most successful water-sharing agreements globally, having endured four wars. Under this treaty, India is primarily limited to developing low-impact hydropower projects on the three rivers designated to Pakistan: the Indus, Chenab, and Jhelum. In contrast, India has the freedom to use the waters of three other rivers—the Sutlej,

Beas, and Ravi.

New Delhi, May 16: India is considering plans to dramatically increase the water it draws from a major river that feeds Pakistani farms downstream, as part of retaliatory action for the Pahalgam terrorist attack that claimed the lives of 26 tourists. Reuters reported.

New Delhi has 'put in abeyance' its participation in the Indus Waters Treaty of 1960, which governs usage of the Indus river system in the wake of the terrorist attack. After suspending India's participation in the treaty, Prime Minister Narendra Modi ordered officials to expedite planning and execution of projects on the Chenab, Jhelum and Indus

rivers, three bodies of water in the Indus system that are designated primarily for Pakistan's use, six people told Reuters.

One of the key plans under discussion involves doubling to 120km the length of the Ranbir canal on the Chenab, which runs through India to Pakistan's agricultural powerhouse of Punjab, two of the people said. The canal was built in the 19th century, long before the treaty was signed. India is permitted to draw a limited amount of water from the Chenab for irrigation, but an expanded canal would allow it to

divert 150 cubic metres of water per second, up from about 40 cubic metres currently, four people said, citing official discussions and documents they had seen.

Modi said in a fiery speech this week that "water and blood cannot flow together," though he didn't refer to the treaty.

Pakistan has had a preview of the kind of pressure it could face from India: Water at a key receiving point in Pakistan briefly fell by as much as 90% in early May after India started maintenance work on some Indus projects. Alongside the plans to ex-

pand Ranbir canal, India is also considering projects that would likely reduce the flow of water into Pakistan from rivers allocated to that country, according to two government documents seen by Reuters and interviews with five people familiar with the matter.

One document, an undated note prepared by a government company for officials considering irrigation plans, suggests that water from the Indus, Chenab and Jhelum "potentially be distributed into rivers" in three northern Indian states.

Bhubaneswar, May 16: At least nine people, including six women, were killed and some others injured in separate incidents of lightning strikes across the state Friday amid thunderstorms, officials said.

While three persons died in Koraput district, two each died in Jajpur and Ganjam districts, and one each in Dhenkanal and Gajapati districts, they said.

Three women lost their lives and an elderly man was critically injured in a lightning strike at Paridiguda village in Laxmipur police station area in Koraput district Friday afternoon.

According to sources, the victims, who were members of the same family, had taken shelter in a makeshift hut while working in the fields as heavy rain and strong winds swept through the area. A lightning struck the hut, killing three women on the

spot, a police officer said. The deceased have been identified as Brudhi Mandinga (60), her granddaughter Kasa Mandinga (18), and Ambika Kashi (35) of Kumbharguda village. Brudhi and Kasa Mandinga were residents of Paridiguda, he said.

Another 65-year-old man, identified as Hingu Mandinga, sustained serious injuries and was rushed to Lakshmipur Community Health Centre, where he is currently undergoing treatment, the officer added.

In Jajpur district, two boys were killed in lightning strikes as nor'wester rain lashed Dharmasala area. The deceased have been identified as Tare Hembrum (15) and Tukulu Chattar (12) from Burusahi village in Jenapur police station area, he said.

According to the villagers, the duo was standing on the verandah of a kuccha house as thunderstorms lashed the area in the evening. They died on the spot after lightning struck them during rainfall.

Police sent the bodies to a hospital for autopsy. An unnatural death case has been registered in connection with the incident and further investigation is underway, the officer said.

In Ganjam district, a Class VII student, Om Prakash Pradhan was killed when he was struck by lightning in Barida village in Kabisurvanagar tehsil.

A 23-year-old woman died in a similar incident while collect ing mangoes from an orchard in Belaguntha area. In Dhenkanal, Surushi Bishwal (40) died after being struck by lightning at Kusumundia village under Dashi pur panchayat. A woman died after being struck by lightning while she was unloading bricks from a tractor trailer in Mohana area of Gajapati.





CITY MAN HELD FOR DUPING JOB SEEKERS OF ₹60L

The Nayapalli police Friday arrested a man for allegedly duping scores of aspirants from different parts of the state, including the City, to the tune of lakhs of rupees on the pretext of arranging them high-paying jobs. DCP Jagmohan Meena said the police have so far have received four complaints against Jharpada resident Sobhan Ranjan Behera wherein he had defrauded the unsuspecting job-seekers of around ₹60 lakh. "Our investigation is on. We suspect he had duped more people during his con operation in the past two years," Meena said, while appealing the victims to come forward and lodge complaints. Meena said Sobhan, who is in his early 40s, opened a employment consultancy firm, 'Sanjoga Consultancy', in Jharpada area in 2023. His lid was blown off when Boudh native Debabrata Karna lodged a complaint with the Nayapalli police March 23, 2025 alleging that he had paid Sobhan ₹6 lakh in 2023 for a plum job. However, later Sobhan kept avoiding him on flimsy reasons whenever he inquired about the job. DCP Meena said even when the police were investigating the complaint, another job-seeker Biswaranjan Dash approached the Mancheswar police Friday alleging that Sobhan had duped him of ₹15 lakh. "We also received two more similar complaints against Sobhan, totaling a fraud of around ₹39 lakh," Meena said. The DCP said in all these instances, Sobhan had followed the similar modus operandi in cheating the victims. The accused was booked under Sections 318 (4), 38, and 36 (3) of BNS following his arrest and produced before a local court for remand.

Bhubaneswar, May 16: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Friday stated that the Odisha Mining Corporation (OMC) has emerged as a model profit-making public sector undertaking (PSU), not just within the state but across the country.

Speaking at the 70th Foundation Day celebrations of OMC here, Majhi described the corporation as a driving force behind Odisha's development.

He highlighted OMC's significant contribution to the economic prosperity of the state and its vital role in the overall economic growth of the nation.

The chief minister noted that OMC began its journey in the 1960s with a modest turnover of just ₹1 crore.

"Today, it has achieved a turnover of ₹23,600 crore for the financial year 2024–25—generated solely through the production and sale of minerals,' the CM said.

He further emphasised that OMC now ranks among the top five mineral-producing companies in India.

Maihi outlined the state government's vision of transforming Odisha into a mixed economy, with a stronger focus on the manufacturing sector.

He pointed out that while the state

is rich in raw materials required for manufacturing, previous governments failed to capitalise on this industrial potential.

To support industrialisation, Majhi said, over 80 per cent of raw materials are now being supplied to industries operating within the state through a long-term linkage policy.

The chief minister also stressed the importance of labour in the state's progress, stating, "The backbone of our development is our working brothers and sisters. If the workers are empowered, Odisha will be empowered.'

He expressed gratitude to the workforce for their contribution to the state's strength and prosperity and called for the deployment of more manpower alongside machinery at worksites.

As a part of the celebrations, Majhi reopened the Dubuna and Barbil iron ore mines, which have an annual production capacity of 3 million tonnes of iron ore and 0.05 million tonnes of manganese. The Dubuna mine itself holds reserves of 25.77 million tonnes of iron ore and 2.6 million tonnes of manganese.

Additionally, the chief minister inaugurated a 900 kw peak solar plant at OMC's Koida mining area. He also launched four IT modules - Logistics Management System (LMS), OMC Finance Management System (OFMS), OMC Plot Land Utilisation System (OPLUS), and OMC Recruitment Management System (ORMS). "We should think of setting up some pellet plants to generate employment for the local youth. The OMC need not seek loans as it is a fund-rich PSU," Majhi said.

He also presented awards in three categories — Best Mining Area, Best Mine, and Safe Mine for the years 2023–24 and 2024–25, recognising top-performing operational mines of OMC

Highlighting the role of OMC in transforming the industrial sector of Odisha, Steel and Mines Minister Bibhuti Bhushan Jena said, "From today, 18 mines of OMC have become operational. It is not just about producing minerals but is laying the foundation of a strong and self-reliant Odisha. OMC is strengthening the economic growth of Odisha through advanced manufacturing and modern technology.

Development Commissioner Anu Garg said, "By properly utilising our natural resources, we have now come from a weak economy to a middle-income economy. OMC has been performing well for many years. However, we have to engage with new technologies in the process of sustainable development.

On the occasion of 'National Dengue Day', let us raise awareness about the prevention of this disease, keep the environment clean and seek appropriate treatment if symptoms of the disease appear," said Health Minister Mukesh Mahaling.

Health and Family Welfare department observed the day at conference hall of Combined Health Directorate here Friday with an aim to enhance public awareness and promote effective dengue prevention strategies across the state.

Additional director of Vector Borne Diseases Pravakar Sahu welcomed participants and emphasised the importance of continued public health efforts under the National Vector Borne Disease Control Programme (NVBDCP).

Speaking on the occasion,

Director of Public Health Nilakantha Mishra discussed the current epidemiological situation in the state, stressing the need for coordinated source reduction activities to curb the disease. He highlighted the role of widespread awareness in controlling dengue.

AIIMS Bhubaneswar observed the day with a series of public awareness programmes at the OPD foyer, Friday. The initiative was aimed at educating public about dengue and promoting effective and preventive strategies to combat its spread.

The event was spearheaded by the department of General Medicine, with active participation from faculty and healthcare staffers. Informative pamphlets were distributed among patients and visitors, highlighting key facts about symptoms, transmission, and prevention of dengue.

ATIONAL DENGUE DAY TH MAY 2025

As per the data released by the National Centre for Vector Borne Diseases Control (NCVB-DC), Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS), a total of 12,043 dengue cases and six deaths were reported across the country till March 2025, with the highest number of cases in Tamil Nadu.

Speaking on the occasion, AIIMS Bhubaneswar Executive Director Ashutosh Biswas emphasised the urgent need to eliminate mosquito breeding sites, particularly during the monsoon season.

"Larvae can survive for a long time in stagnant or even clean water. It is crucial to eliminate water stagnation and maintain hygienic surroundings to prevent mosquito breeding. During the monsoon, using bed nets, mosquito repellents, and wearing full-sleeve clothing is essential to avoid mosquito bites," said Biswas.

Meanwhile, BMC has launched a comprehensive action plan to tackle dengue under the leadership of Commissioner RP Patil. Key measures include community sensitization through grassroots workers, school awareness campaigns, and meetings with corporators and medical officers. A 100-member volunteer force will conduct house-to-house surveys to identify and eliminate mosquito breeding sites. Intensive

The sterilisation will be conducted at the Dog Sterilisation Centre, Mancheswar which is equipped with 250 kennels and five advanced operation theatres. All procedures will ad here to Animal Welfare Board of India's guidelines and 2023 Animal Birth Control Rules covering ethical practices such as capturing dogs with nets, en suring proper feeding, exclud ing sick animals from surgery conducting sterilisations, and releasing dogs back to their original locations.

The responsibility for sterili sation has been entrusted to the 'Vets Society for Animal Welfare and Rural Development', a Hyder abad-based organisation. The so ciety will sterilise approximately 2,000 stray dogs per month, with the programme planned to continue for three years.

As part of the initiative a new stray dog census will be carried out across all 67 wards of the City, with sup port from 'Swachha Sathi volunteers, overseen by BMC's veterinary officers.

After committing the crime, the accused fabricated a story claiming Rajalaxmi had died of a heart attack.

The next day, April 30, thev cremated her body in Bhubaneswar, where some of her relatives resided.

Due to Rajalaxmi's history of heart disease, her family, including her brother, believed the fabricated story, Gajapati SP Jatindra Kumar Panda said.

The truth came to light when the girl's uncle found her hidden mobile phone in Bhubaneswar, which contained Instagram Messenger chats with the two co-accused detailing their plan to murder Rajalaxmi and loot over 70 grams of gold ornaments along with ₹60,000 in cash.

Following the discovery, Siba Prasad Mishra, the deceased's brother, lodged an FIR at Paralakhemundi police station last Wednesday.

A police investigation led to the arrest of the three accused

temple priest Ganesh Rath (21), Dinesh Sahu (20), both from Paralakhemundi, and the deceased's 13-year-old adopted daughter.

Police said Rajalaxmi had adopted the girl after rescuing her as an abandoned infant in Bhubaneswar.

After the girl got admission at Kendriya Vidyalaya in Paralakhemundi, the two shifted there and were staying in a rented house.

Recently, the girl developed a relationship with Rath and Sahu, which her mother opposed

Rath allegedly instigated the girl to murder Rajalaxmi to seize her property and continue their relationship. On the evening of April

29, the girl reportedly administered sleeping pills to Rajalaxmi.

Once she was unconscious, she summoned her two friends, who smothered the woman with pillows. They later took her to a hospital, where she was declared dead, police added.

Before the murder, the girl had given some of Rajalaxmi's gold ornaments to Rath, who pawned them at a private finance company for around ₹2.4 lakh.

He reportedly used the money to buy a motorcycle and travel across the state.

During investigation, police recovered three mobile phones containing incriminating Instagram chat messages, two pillows used in the murder, and around 30 grams of the looted gold ornaments,

Geo-tagged in Gahirmatha, Olive Ridley turtle reaches Andhra coast via Sri Lanka

Kendrapara, May 16: An Olive Ridley turtle, which was earlier tagged with a satellite-linked tracking device at Gahirmatha beach in Kendrapara district, has travelled around 1,000 kilometres in the sea in 51 days to reach the Andhra Pradesh coast, an official said Friday.

The turtle traversed the waters of Sri Lanka, Puducherry and Tamil Nadu before reaching the coast of the neighbouring Andhra Pradesh, he said.

The turtle navigated through the sea waters of Sri Lanka. Tamil Nadu and Puducherry, and reached the Andhra Pradesh

coast in 51 days. It covered around 1,000 km, the official said. The latest satellite tracking map of the Wildlife Institute of India (WII) has located one of the tagged turtles moving in the sea waters in Andhra Pradesh, and found that it has navigated

around 1,000 km, said Principal Chief Conservator of Forest (PC-CF) Prem Kumar Jha. A turtle, tagged with a tracking

device in Odisha four years back, had earlier covered 3,500 km to lay eggs at a beach in Ratnagiri district of Maharashtra recently.

The Olive Ridley turtles turn up in millions for mass nesting along the Odisha coast every year. Gahirmatha beach off Bay

of Bengal in Kendrapara district is acclaimed as the world's largest known nesting ground of these rare marine species.

The aquatic animals also turn up at the Rushikulya river mouth in Ganjam district and the Devi river mouth in Puri for mass nesting. According to officials, around 3,000 turtles are tagged with a tracking device annually.

Experts believed that at least one lakh turtles are required to be tagged for obtaining better information on their reproductive biology, movements and growth rates, migratory route and areas of foraging. The state Forest department had taken up the tagging exercise in 1999, and at least two tagged turtles then were sighted on the Sri Lanka coast.

Later, the tagging exercise was suspended. However, the Zoological Survey of India (ZSI) resumed the exercise in 2021

Between 2021 and 2024, around 12.000 turtles were tagged in Gahirmatha and Rushikulya river mouth nesting grounds, the officials said.

no-nonsense civilian protection—a rare win for bureaucratic foresight. Though of not much help in the Poonch region, as we discovered during the recent battle, babus say that civilians living along the border now have somewhere to run when the skies turn loud. These aren't luxury basements; they're reinforced, stocked-up life pods. And thanks to early safety drills, folks know exactly what to do when the sirens wail.

According to sources, these bunkers aren't just for conventional shelling. India's also got its own Cold War-style strategic shelters—massive, fortified command bunkers meant to survive the unthinkable: a nuclear strike. Not the kind of infrastructure you brag about at dinner, but exactly the kind you want quietly waiting in the wings.

The takeaway here? Sometimes security doesn't look like fighter jets and high-level talks. Sometimes, it's just a reinforced concrete room with supplies, a lock, and a plan. In a world that feels one bad headline away from chaos, these bunkers are a sobering reminder that real defence starts underground—and it's not just for the military anymore.

IAS power play: A tale of two batches

While civil servants are competitive about reaching top administrative posts, there's also camaraderie among officers from the same batches. And nowhere is this more evident than in the subtle flexing between the 1989 and 1991 IAS batches.

Let's start with the 1989 batch. Not content with just holding high office, they've strategically planted themselves in the country's hot zones—Delhi and Jammu & Kashmir, for starters. Atal



Dulloo manages the sensitive J&K terrain, while Dharmendra navigates the bureaucratic minefield that is Delhi. Add Gujarat, Chhattisgarh, MP, Bihar, and Karnataka to the mix, and you've got a batch that clearly didn't come to play—they came to control.

Now, the 1991 batch may not have Delhi or Srinagar, but they've spread themselves across seven states—an administrative juggernaut. From the polarised politics of Tamil Nadu and West Bengal to the election-bound buzz of Kerala and the strategic edges of Arunachal and Nagaland, the 1991 officers are navigating tough terrain, both politically and geographically.

So, who wins this round? The 1989 batch has a strategic edge, managing key Union Territories and border states with high-stakes implications. But the 1991 lot has gone wide, overseeing a broader slice of India's messy federalism.

Either way, one thing's clear: governance in India isn't just about policy—it's also about positioning. And sometimes, it takes a little batch rivalry to keep the bureaucratic engine humming.

AIS rules vs political will

Kerala's babudom has just served up a case study in how not to inspire public confidence. The state government's decision to extend the suspension of IAS officer N Prasanth till October 31, 2025, isn't just unusual, it's downright opaque.

Here's the twist: there were two meetings of the suspension review committee within two weeks. The first, on April 23, chaired by the outgoing Chief Secretary Sarada Muraleedharan, reportedly recommended lifting the suspension. The second, just days later, chaired by the new CS, A Jayathilak, who, incidentally, is known to be at loggerheads with Prasanth, recommended extending it. Guess which one the final government order conveniently ignored?

Spoiler alert: the one that didn't suit the script.

Now, according to All India Services (AIS) rules, suspensions beyond

razil has announced plans to launch a \$125 billion fund for the protection of tropical forests. It is a key element of the country's plan to ensure the success of the next United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP30), which Brazil will host. But, at a time when some of the world's richest economies are slashing their foreign-aid budgets, and the United States is turning its back on climate action altogether, does the world really need another climate fund?

Over the past three decades, more than 60 multilateral funds have emerged to raise financing for climate action in developing countries. Most are small and obscure, leaving around 19 sizable entities – including the Green Climate Fund (GCF), the Global Envi-

Fund (GCF), the Global Environment Facility (GEF), the Adaptation Fund (AF), and Climate Investment Funds (CIFs) – that publicly report on their activities.

In theory, each entity serves a worthy purpose, and a few have gained some traction. In particular, the GCF has emerged as the second-largest multilateral provider of grant-based climate finance to the most vulnerable countries (after the World Bank). But, overall, their contributions are underwhelming. In 2021-22, the 19 funds tracked by the UN's Standing Committee on Finance delivered a mere \$3.7 billion – roughly \$195 million per fund. That is far less than the \$55.7 billion that multilateral development banks collectively provided for climate action, and nowhere near the trillions of dollars that developing economies need annually to close the climate-finance gap.

A key problem is that donors have not been stepping up to fund these entities. The US – the world's biggest economy and largest historical green-

house-gas emitter – committed to providing a measly \$17.5 million to the much-touted Fund for Responding to Loss and Damage (FRLD), agreed at COP28 in Dubai. At COP29 in Baku, the AF fell well short of its \$300 million funding target, leaving it struggling to bankroll even the projects that are already in its pipeline.

Now, even these modest contributions are set to dry up. President Trump's administration has withdrawn the US from the Paris climate agreement, abandoned the FRLD and other funds, and dismantled the country's foreign-aid apparatus.While not all wealthy economies are following in America's footsteps, many - including Belgium, Canada, Finland, France, Germany, the Netherlands, Sweden, Switzerland, and the United Kingdom, as well as the European Union - are also tightening their purse strings.

Together with the US, these donors accounted for 69% of bilateral climate commitments to developing countries in 2021-22 and supplied 74% of contributions to climate funds since 2003. In other words, raising climate finance – always a difficult task – is becoming a Herculean one, meaning that countries are going to have to figure out how to do more with less. The last thing the world needs is for this limited capital to be funneled into a fragmented, inefficient system composed of dozens of narrow climate funds.

Climate funds were created to address shortcomings of existing multilateral institutions like the World Bank. For example, they offer "direct access" funding to national and regional entities, thereby promoting country ownership and helping to build institutional capacity. Moreover, their smaller scale and larger numbers were supposed to foster healthy competition and give recipient countries more options.

But the fund landscape has become so crowded – with each entity possessing its own accreditation rules, approval processes, and compliance requirements – that recipients must navigate a bureaucratic maze to access any financing at all. All this red tape, which slows disbursements considerably, is especially burdensome for the most climate-vulnerable countries, such as small island developing states, whose institutional capacity is already stretched thin. It does not help that keeping all these funds running costs money. The overhead of the Special Climate Change Fund, for example, represented more than half of its project commitments in 2019-21. This is hardly the best use of limited climate finance.

It is also worth noting that, while climate funds are generally supposed to raise "new and additional" financing, this has seldom happened. Instead, they tend to draw from a fixed pool of public funds for sustainable development, which include different climate-related projects and other critical priorities, such as health, education, and poverty reduction.

Far from creating yet another climate fund, delegates at COP30 should focus on streamlining climate finance. A handful of funds with harmonized standards and processes would be far better equipped to deliver efficient and accessible funding – and ensure that as few dollars as possible are wasted.

Experience suggests that such an effort might run up against considerable resistance. The CIFs were supposed to be a stopgap, to be wound down following the rise of the GCF. But in 2019, their governing committee scrapped the sunset clause, insisting – over the objections of experts and civil-society organizations – on their continued relevance.

Ensuring that future efforts to build a more efficient climate-finance architecture are not similarly thwarted will require powerful actors to bring their influence to bear. This is the kind of climate leadership the world needs from Brazil.

Guwahati, May 16: The Assam government Friday notified a state policy aimed at combating human trafficking and witch-hunting to ensure that all people can live a life of equal worth, free from all forms of abuse.

"The Assam State Policy to Combat Human Trafficking and End Witch-Hunting is now officially notified. A significant move to safeguard human rights and uphold dignity," the Chief Minister's Office (CMO) said in a post on X.

The notification, issued by an order of the governor May 6, stated that the policy will come into effect from the date of its publication in the official gazette.

According to the policy, the vision is to create a state where all individuals are able to attain their full potential by living a life of equal worth, free from all kinds of abuse and participate equally in private and public life.

The policy's mission is to

"provide a safe and equal society wherein all individuals can claim their entitlements and access all services, lead a life free from all kinds of violence, experience an enhancement in their capabilities and exercise control over their life circumstances through convergence and synergies among all departments for promoting safety and security"

The policy acknowledged that human trafficking and witch-hunting are two crimes that disproportionately affect women and girls.

While human trafficking is an organised crime and is considered the fastest growing criminal enterprise, witch-hunting is mostly a social crime rooted in deep-seated regressive cultural practices, it said. The state's geographical loca-

tion, with borders with six other North Eastern states besides boundaries with Bangladesh and Bhutan, makes it a 'critical'

one, the policy added. The Assam Witch Hunting (Prohibition, Prevention and Protection) Act, 2018, deals with witch-hunting, making it a cognisable, non-bailable and non-compoundable offence, it added.

While cases of witch-hunting have visibly dipped after the enactment of this law, it has not been eradicated complete ly, with 32 cases registered between 2022-24 according to Assam Police data.

"In the above context, there is an urgent need to develop a well-designed comprehensive policy to cover all areas of intervention ensuring prevention, protection and rehabilitation of survivors of trafficking and witch-hunting. Apar from ensuring the rights of the survivors, the area of preventing such crime and prosecuting culprits is also an area of urgent interven tion," the policy stated.

Search on to spot tiger at Kalikavu Teams with tranquiliser guns, kumki elephant deployed to spot tiger that killed Malappuram man

Malappuram (Kerala), May 16: Three teams of forest personnel equipped with tranquiliser guns and a kumki elephant were deployed Friday to spot and capture the tiger which has killed a rubber-tapping worker near Kalikavu, an official said.

Camera traps and cages were also set up to assist the teams in the mission. Another kumki elephant will be brought into the operation, he added. Divisional Forest Officer, Nil-

ambur South, Dhanik Lal said that each group of the search team comprises 20 forest personnel and a veterinarian.

"We will first confirm if the tiger is present in the area. Further steps will be taken thereafter. Two cages and cam-



era traps have been set up. The search operations commenced at 7am." the official said. He said that another kumki elephant (trained captive

tuskers) will be brought to the area to assist in the search operations.

Another senior forest official said that thermal drone cameras will also be deployed to look for the tiger.

Thursday, 45-year-old Gafoor was attacked and dragged into the forest by the tiger when he and a friend were going for rubber-tapping work.

Gafoor's badly mauled body was later found around 200 meters inside the forest, according to his friend and forest officials.

The incident had sparked a protest in the area. Protesters initially prevented the body from being removed till certain assurances were given by the authorities regarding compensation and a job to the victim's family and capture of the tiger.

They had also alleged lapses on the part of the forest department, claiming that no action was taken by it despite being informed about the presence of the tiger in the area for the past few months.

Similar allegations were also made by Congress MLA AP Anilkumar after visiting the area.

Subsequently, the forest officials informed that an en hanced compensation of ₹14 lakh would be provided to the family along with a job and said that steps were being taken to tranquilise and capture the tiger.

Convinced by the assurances, protesters allowed the victim's body to be removed from the area.

Later that same day, State Forest Minister AK Saseen dran said that the Chief Conservator of Forests (CCF) has been directed to investigate whether there were any lapses on the part of forest officials as claimed by the locals.

'Pak rebuilding destroyed terror camps with IMF aid'

Bhuj (Gujarat), May 16: India Friday pressed the International Monetary Fund (IMF) to reconsider its \$1 billion assistance to Pakistan, saying Islamabad could use a large part of it to fund the terrorist infrastructure.

In an address to air warriors at Gujarat's Bhuj Air Force station. Singh confirmed use of the 'BrahMos' supersonic missiles in the Operation Sindoor and said the weapon showed Pakistan the "light of day in the darkness of night".

Sending a clear and firm message to Islamabad, the defence minister made it clear that the operation is not yet over as the current ceasefire means that India has kept Pakistan on "probation" on the basis of its behaviour.

Under Operation Sindoor, India early May 7 destroyed nine terror infrastructures in Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied-Kashmir (PoK) in retaliation to the Pahalgam terror attack

All subsequent retaliations by Pakistan were carried out under the operation. The two sides reached an understanding on cessation of hostilities May 10 after four days of confrontations.

Punjab Police busts **ISI-linked Pak-based** drug module; 1 held

Chandigarh, May 16: Punjab Police Friday said it has busted a Pakistan-based and ISI-controlled narco-smuggling module and arrested its Indian operative with 85 kg of heroin.

The module was being operated by a UK-based drug handler, it said. Director General of Punjab Police Gaurav Yadav termed it the "biggest drug seizure of 2025". He said the Indian operative has been identified as Amarjot Singh alias Jota Sandhu, a resident of Bhittewad village in Amritsar.

"In the biggest drug seizure of 2025, @TarnTaranPolice busts a cross-border, #ISI-controlled-#Pakistan based narco-smuggling module operated by #UK-based drug handler Lalli and arrests his #India-based operative, Amarjot Singh @ Jota Sandhu, resident of Vill. Bhittewad, Amritsar Rural and recovers 85 Kg Heroin," Yadav posted on X.

The Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) is Pakistan's military intelligence agency. The DGP said an FIR has been registered and further investigations are ongoing to trace back ward and forward linkages.

"We are actively pursuing leads and expect more arrests and recoveries in the coming davs." he said. Punjab Police remains unwavering in its war against drugs, "and such recoveries reaffirm our resolve to make Punjab drugfree", he said.

Meanwhile, in a statement issued later, Yadav said Amarjot Singh was using his resi dence as a major stash point for the network. He was working at the behest of his UK-based handler Lalli and was receiving drug consignments from cross-border drug smugglers. who used drones to transport the contraband.

6 terrorists killed in 2 major operations

Awantipora (J&K), May 16: Security forces turned the focus of their anti-terror operations to specific south Kashmir areas in the wake of the April 22 Pahalgam attack and eliminated six terrorists in the last three days, officials said Friday.

"The security agencies reviewed their strategy according to the situation in the wake of terror activities in the last one month and our intensified focus was on operations," V K Birdi, Inspector General of Police (IGP), Kashmir, said.

The IGP was addressing a press conference with General Officer Commanding, Victor Force, Major General Dhananjay Joshi and CRPF Inspector General Mitesh Jain at the headquarters of the Victor Force here in south Kashmir's Pulwama district.

Birdi said due to the intensified focus of various security agencies and the coordination between them, two successful operations were conducted and six terrorists killed in the last three days. He termed the elimination of the ultras "significant achievements". "These successful operations were possible because of the coordination and synergy among the security and intelligence agen cies. We are duty-bound to end any terror activity in Kashmir and we are always ready to stop such acts," the IGP said. The encounters took place in the Keller area of Shopian and Nadar ar ea of Tral in Pulwama Tuesday and Thursday, respectively.

Three terrorists each were killed in the two operations. Major Joshi said immediately after the Pahalgam terror at tack, which claimed 26 lives the security forces designated several areas as focus areas.

About the Tral encounter, the GoC said the operation took place on a different terrain. Major Joshi asserted that the success ful conduct of both operations shows that the security forces will find terrorists wherever they are and neutralise them.

Of the six slain terrorists, the most prominent was Shahid Kuttay, who was involved in major attacks, including one on a sarpanch in Shopian's Heerpo ra May 18 last year and a firing incident at the Danish Resort April 8 last year, in which two German tourists and a driver were injured, the officer said.

The neutralisation of both the modules has dealt a blow to terror outfits and will help stop their activities here, Major Joshi said.

New Delhi, May 16: The Supreme Court Friday rapped the petitioners who claimed 43 Rohingya refugees including women and children were dropped in the Andaman sea for deportation to Myanmar and said "when country is passing through a difficult time, you come out with fanciful ideas".

A bench of Justices Surya

Kant and N Kotiswar Singh al-

so questioned the authenticity

of materials placed before it

by petitioner Mohd Ismail and

others and refused to stay any

further deportation of Rohing-

yas saying similar relief was

denied by the court. "When

the country is passing through

a difficult time, you come out with such fanciful ideas," the bench told senior advocate Colin Gonsalves, appearing for the petitioners.

It said the materials placed by petitioners appeared to be taken from social media and termed the averments of torture and deportation of Rohingyas by throwing them into sea as "mere allegations"

"Did anyone verify these phone calls that they originated from Myanmar? Earlier, we heard a case where calls were made from Jamtara in Jharkhand from phone numbers of US, UK and Canada," Justice Kant scoffed.

When Gonsalves tried to refer to the report of the United



Nations Human Rights Office of the High Commissioner saying it had also taken note of the issue and started an inquiry into the matter, the bench said, "People sitting outside cannot dictate our

authorities and sovereignty. The bench, however, asked Gonsalves to serve the copy of the petition to the office of the attorney general and the solicitor general for the purpose of transmitting it to the

authorities concerned in the government and posted the hearing before a three-judge bench July 31.

The top court termed the averments made in the petition as "beautifully crafted story using flowery language" and said it would comment on the report of the UN body while sitting in a combination of three-judge bench.


Gonsalves was further asked, "Every day you come with a new story. What is the basis of this story? Where is the material to substantiate your allegations?

He alleged that after the last hearing May 8, several Rohingyas were deported after being taken to Andaman and they were dropped in the sea He said they are now put in a "war zone" facing the risk of getting killed.

On May 8, the top court said if Rohingya refugees in the country were found to be foreigners under Indian laws they would have to be deported.

The court then referred to its order and remarked the identity cards issued by the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) may not be of any help to them under the law.

The top court was informed that some refugees having UN HCR cards, including women and children, were arrested by police authorities late last night and de ported, despite a hearing May 15.



The exercise is aimed at presenting India's stance against Pakistan on terror comes in the wake of Operation Sindoor -- the Indian offensive against terror camps in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK) following the April 22 terror attack in Pahalgam in which 26 people, mostly tourists, were killed.

Senior leaders, including MPs, of various parties from both the ruling and the opposition, have been sounded out by the government and some parties have also given their goahead to the presence of their members for the diplomatic

exercise. Sources said some former ministers would lead the delegations of MPs from different parties to a cluster of countries across the world.

The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) will brief the MPs before they depart. Among the parties whose MPs will be part of the delegation are the BJP, Congress, TMC, DMK, NCP (SP), JDU, BJD, Shiv Sena (UBT), CPI(M), and some oth-

Former Union minister Anurag Thakur and BJP MP from Odisha, Aparajita Sarangi, are among the ruling party members to be part of the delegations, the sources said.

Former Union ministers Ravi Shankar Prasad and Rajiv Pratap Rudy, BJP MPs Samik Bhattacharya and Brij Lal are also expected to be part of the delegations.

At least four MPs from the Congress, besides members of

other parties, have been tapped by the government about the diplomatic exercise.

Congress MPs included in the government's list are Shashi Tharoor, Manish Tewari, Salman Khurshid and Amar Singh, and the party has confirmed it would be a part of the delegations, the sources said.

The TMC's Sudip Bandyopadhyay, JDU's Sanjay Jha, BJD's Sasmit Patra, John Brittas of the CPI(M), Priyanka Chaturvedi of Shiv Sena (UBT), Supriva Sule of NCP (SP), the DMK's K Kanimozhi, AIMIM's Asaduddin Owaisi and AAP's Vikramjit Sawhney are also being tapped to be part of the delegations, the sources said.

While Khurshid, a former external affairs minister, has been asked to lead a delegation of seven MPs to south and southeast Asia, covering countries such as South Korea. Ja pan and Singapore, Baramati MP Sule is likely to lead a delegation to the Middle East and Africa, including the likes of Oman, Egypt, Kenya and South Africa, the sources said.

A bench comprising Justices Sanjay Karol and Sandeep Mehta, which was hearing a plea of the West Bengal government against the Calcutta High Court order on the issue, asked the state government to pay the DA arrears for 2009 to 2019 within three months.

Around six lakh state employees would benefit from the

apex court's interim order. The state government, represented by senior advocate Abhishek Singhvi, told the bench that the exchequer will have to bear a burden of Rs 10,000 crore.

The total outstanding DA dues, according to lawyers, is around 41,000 crore. The bench

has now fixed the plea for hearing in August.

The controversy began when a section of West Bengal government employees approached the Calcutta High Court, demanding DA at the same rate as their central government counterparts, along

with pending arrears. In May 2022, the high court ruled in favour of the employees and instructed the state to align its DA with central rates.

However, the West Bengal government challenged the high court's verdict by filing an appeal in the Supreme Court in November 2022.

Since then, the state has implemented only marginal increases in DA. which have not kept pace with the central government's rates. As of April 2025, while central government employees receive 55 per cent DA, their West Bengal counterparts get only 18 per cent -- even after a recent 4 per cent hike.

Hare Krishna temple in B'lore belongs to **ISKCON Bangalore: SC**

New Delhi, May 16: The Supreme Court Friday held that the Hare Krishna Temple in Bengaluru belongs to the ISK CON Society in the city.

A bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Augustine George Masih set aside the order of the Karnataka High Court which held the property belonged to ISKCON Society, Mumbai.

The bench said the trial court also recorded a finding that no evidence was produced by ISKCON Mumbai about its possession of the Schedule "A property and there was absolutely no evidence to support its claim.

"As the application for al lotment was made by ISKCON Bangalore and as pursuant to the application, the sale deed was executed in favour of ISKCON Bangalore, the entire discussion by the high court about so-called manip ulations made by Madhu Pan dit, Bhakti Lata Devi Dasi Chanchalapati Dasa, Chamari Devi Dasi was not relevant at all." it said.

The verdict said even if it was assumed that the rubber stamp of ISKCON Bangalore was affixed on certain documents subsequently, it was "crystal clear" that the Sched ule "A" property was allotted by the Bangalore Develop ment Authority to ISKCON Bangalore, and ISKCON Ban galore was an independent society registered under the Karnataka Societies Registration Act.

For the 1st time, 17 remote Naxal-hit villages get electricity

Raipur, May 16: Seventeen villages nestled among nearly inaccessible mountains and dense forests in Naxal-hit Mohla-Manpur-Ambagarh Chowki district of Chhattisgarh have got electricity from the supply grid for the first time, officials said Friday.

About 540 families will benefit from the electrification, which has been done at Rs 3 crore under the Mukhyamantri Majratola Vidyutikaran Yojana. they said.

Due to the difficult terrain, reaching these areas was extremely challenging amid the Naxalite threat. Providing the electricity supply through the grid was no less than a mission in these villages, said an official statement. The villages had ac-

villages - Katuljhora, Kattapar,

Bodra, Bukmarka, Sambalpur, Gattegahan, Pugda, Amakodo, Petemeta, Tatekasa, Kundalkal, Raimanhora, Nainguda, Metatodke, Kohkatola, Edasmeta and Kunjakanhar – after they were connected to the power grid recently, it said.

"In some villages, children danced, while in others, the elderly burst crackers to express their happiness as it was the moment they had waited for decades," it said

Of the 540 families in these 17 villages, 275 have got electricity connections so far. The work to provide the power supply to the remaining households is underway, said an official.

Under the project, a 25 KVA transformer was installed in Tatekasa. For this purpose, a 45-km-long 11 KV line, 87 low-pressure poles and 17 trans-

formers have been installed, a state-run power company official said.

Securing a no objection certificate (NOC) from the forest department and transporting the equipment for laying the 11 KV line to these remote villages were challenging, he said, adding that the dedicated efforts of the technical team made it possible to complete the project.

"The priority of the government is to ensure the development of basic facilities in hyper-sensitive areas. Electricity will soon be provided to other villages in the region," he said.

Manpur-Mohla-Ambagarh Chowki district, located around 150 km from the capital Raipur, shares its borders with the Naxal-hit Bastar region of the state and Gadchiroli district of Maharashtra.



Man who stabbed **Rushdie sentenced** to 25 yrs in prison

Mayville (US), May 16: The man convicted of stabbing Salman Rushdie on a New York lecture stage in 2022, leaving the prizewinning author blind in one eye, was sentenced Fri day to serve 25 years in prison

A jury found Hadi Matar, 27, guilty of attempted murder and assault in February.

Rushdie did not return to court to the western New York courtroom for his assailant's sentencing but submitted a victim impact statement.

During the trial, the 77-year old author was the key witness, describing how he believed he was dying when a masked at tacker plunged a knife into his head and body more than a dozen times as he was being introduced at the Chautauqua Institution to speak about writer safety. Before being sentenced, Matar stood and made a statement about freedom of speech in which he called Rushdie a hypocrite.

"Salman Rushdie wants to disrespect other people," said Matar, clad in white-striped jail clothing and wearing handcuffs. "He wants to be a bully, he wants to bully other people.



Matar received the maximum 25-year sentence for the attempted murder of Rushdie and seven years for wounding a man who was on stage with him The sentences must run con currently because both victims were injured in the same event, Chautauqua County District Attornev Jason Schmidt said.

Rushdie spent 17 days at a Pennsylvania hospital and more than three weeks at a New York City rehabilitation centre. The author of "Midnight's Children,' "The Moor's Last Sigh" and "Victorv City" detailed his recovery in his 2024 memoir, "Knife."

Glacier grandeur meets peril at Argentina's Perito Moreno **CLIMATE CHANGE**

Once a symbol of glacial stability, Argentina's Perito Moreno Glacier is now shedding massive ice blocks at an alarming rate. These powerful collapses reflect a deeper crisis, signaling the growing impact of climate change on Earth's frozen frontiers

Perito Moreno Glacier, May 16: The deep cracking sound bursting from within the ice signals the dramatic fall about to happen. Seconds later, a block of ice some 70 meters (230 ft) tall - the size of a 20-story building - collapses from the face of the Perito Moreno glacier into the

aquamarine water below. The sight has attracted visitors to Argentina's most famous glacier for years. Standing on platforms facing the ice, they wait for the next crack to split the cool Patagonian air. But recently the size of the ice

chunks breaking off - a process called "calving" - has been starting to alarm local guides and glaciologists, already anxious at a prolonged retreat by Perito Moreno, which had bucked the trend in recent decades by maintaining its mass even as warmer climates spurred faster glacial melting worldwide.

"Ice calving events of this size haven't been verv common at the Perito Moreno glacier over the past 20 years," said Pablo Quinteros, an official tourist guide at Los Glaciares National Park in the southern province of Santa Cruz.

"It's only in the last four to

The face of the glacier, which flows down from Andean peaks to end in the waters of Lake Argentina, had for decades held more or less steady, some years advancing and others retreating. But in the last five years, there's been a firmer retreat.

"It had been in more or less the same position for the past 80 years. And that's unusual. said Argentine glaciologist Lucas Ruiz with state science body CONICET, whose research focus is the future of Patagonian glaciers in the face of climate change. "However, since 2020, signs of retreat have begun to be seen in some parts of the Perito Moreno glacier's face.

He said that the glacier could rebound as it has done before. but that for the moment it was

losing between one and two meters of water equivalent per year, which if not reversed could lead to a situation where the loss accelerates

A state-backed 2024 report, co-authored by Ruiz and presented to Argentina's Congress, showed that while Perito Moreno's mass has been overall stable for half a century, the period since 2015 has seen the fastest and most prolonged loss of mass in 47 years, on average losing 0.85 meters per year.

Glaciers around the globe are disappearing faster than ever, with the last three-year period seeing the largest glacial mass loss on record, according to a UNESCO report in March.

Ruiz said instruments his re search team used to monitor the glacier had shown an increase in air temperature in the area of around 0.06 degrees Celsius per decade and precipitation decreasing, meaning less accumulation of snow and ice.

"The thing with Perito More no is that it took a while, so to speak, to feel the effects of climate change," Ruiz said. Now however, the accumulation of ice at the top of the glacier was being outpaced by melting and calving at the bottom.

"It's insane. The most incred ible thing I've ever seen," said Brazilian tourist Giovanna Machado on the deck of one of the boats, which have to be care ful of sudden ice falls. Even in photos, you just can't grasp the immensity of it, and it's perfect It's amazing. I think everyone should come here at least once in their lifetime.

Air India urges govt to shun Indigo-Turkish airline deals



New Delhi, May 16: Air India has lobbied government to halt rival Indigo's leasing tie-up with Turkish Airlines, citing business impact as well as security concerns sparked by Istanbul's support for Pakistan, according to a source and a document seen by Reuters

Petrol sales rise by 10%, diesel goes off the boil

New Delhi, May 16: Petrol consumption spiked by 10 per cent in the first half of May as summer season travel led to a surge in demand for the fuel, according to provisional sales data of state-owned fuel retailers.

Petrol consumption rose to 1.5 million tonne during May 1-15 from 1.37 million tonne sales a vear back. Its demand was up 10.5 per cent over consumption of 1.36 million tonne in May 1-15, 2023 and nearly 46 per cent higher than Covid-marred first fortnight of May 2021.

Diesel sales were up 2 per

cent to 3.36 million tonne, the data of three state-owned fuel retailers, who control about 90 per cent of the fuel market, showed. The consumption of India's most used fuel has rebounded since last month; saw just 2 per cent growth in demand in fiscal year ended March 31, 2025.

In April, diesel consumption rose to 8.23 million tonne, up nearly 4 per cent over demand in the year-ago period. Between May 1 to 15, diesel sales were 2 per cent higher than 3.29 million tonne consumption in the same period last year. It was 1.3 per cent higher than May 1-15, 2023 and

LPG continued to be in the fast lane with 10.4 per cent growth to 1.34 million tonne in the first fortnight of May, driven by Ujjawala connections. Since 2019, volumes equal to almost 5 months have been added in domestic cooking gas consumption.

Cooking gas sales were 10 per cent higher than 1.22 million tonne consumption of May 1-15, 2023 and 33 per cent more than 1.01 million tonne in the first half of May 2021. LPG sales were up 7.3 per cent when compared with 1.25 million tonne of April 1-15.

BARCELONA CLINCH ITS 28TH SPANISH LEAGUE TITLE AS YAMAL'S STUNNING STRIKE SEALS DOMESTIC TREBLE

Barcelona, May 16: This was Lamine Yamal's season. So it just had to be the teen-

age phenom who scored the decisive goal to clinch Barcelona's 28th Spanish league title.

And what a goal it was for the player who still wears dental braces and sports a new dyedblond hairdo.

The 17-year-old struck the winner in Barcelona's 2-0 victory at crosstown rival Espanyol Thursday when he slid past two defenders outside the area and whipped one his now trademark left-footed curlers into the corner of the net.

It was a perfect culmination to Yamal's last 10 months.

After helping Spain win the European Championship last summer, Yamal excelled for Barcelona this campaign with his goals, dribbling and playmaking as he confirmed his status as the next big star of global soccer. Along with Raphinha, Pedri and company, and Barce-

Espanyol was reduced to 10 men in the 80th when Leandro Cabrera received a direct red for hitting Yamal in the stomach while disputing a ball.

Barcelona won the title with two rounds remaining. It com-

pleted a domestic double with the Copa del Rey title — treble if you add the Spanish Super Cup — and reached the Champions League semifinals in a fantastic first season for coach Hansi Flick.

Flick's team virtually ended Madrid's title defense when it beat its top rival 4-3 Sunday, making it four of four clasico victories across all competitions this season.

Madrid's victory over Mallorca Wednesday prevented Barcelona from winning the title without playing. But the Catalan club needed just two points from its final three games of the season. Barcelona's players danced briefly on the field to celebrate while sprinklers doused them with water.

"You don't win a league every day and we have to enjoy this and give it the value it has," said Barcelona midfielder Pe-

dri after completing his 200th game for his club at age 22. Lionel Messi posted a mes-

sage on Instagram sending his "Congratulations" for his old team. Real Madrid also congratulated its fierce rival on X, while thousands of Barcelona fans gathered to celebrate in downtown Barcelona

Flick leads the way Barcelona dominated the domestic competitions, winning 15 and drawing two of its league games in 2025. Toss in the cups, and the only tiny blemish was coming oh-so-close to reaching the Champions League final before it fell in gut-wrenching fashion at Inter Milan. Looking back on his arrival in the summer, Flick said that he had instilled a "positive"

attitude in his team and it had adapted well to his style of play that requires a high defensive line and all-in pressing. "Barcelona has to win titles

and three titles is really great,' Flick said. "I suffered a bit after the game in Milan, but after winning three titles I am very happy and the club is too.'

Doha, May 16: Neeraj Chopra finally breached the elusive 90m mark with a 90.23m throw but finished second behind Julian Weber of Germany in a dramatic men's javelin contest at the Doha leg of the prestigious Diamond League Meeting series here Friday.

Weber turned the tables and took the top spot with his final throw, measuring 91.06m.

The 27-year-old double Olympic medallist Indian sent his spear 90.23m in his third attempt to join a list of javelin throwers. led by his current coach Jan Zelezny of Czechia, who had recorded 90m-plus efforts.

He became the third Asian and 25th overall to achieve the feat. Olympic champion Arshad Nadeem (92.97m) of Pakistan and Chao-Tsun Cheng (91.36m) of Chinese Taipei are the two other Asians to have breached the coveted mark.

The 90m distance wasn't just about numbers. For years, the 90m mark had become a symbolic mountain for Chopra-a distance he came close to sev-



Despite winning Olympic gold at Tokyo, World Championship gold in Budapest, and ruling the Diamond League, one question lingered: When will Neerai breach 90 meters' That question has now been answered—with authority.

In front of a packed crowd and a competitive field that included world-class throwers, Chopra de livered when it mattered most.

The impact of the new coach Jan Zelezny, was apparent as Neeraj finally crossed the finish line that he had attempted sev eral times in the last few years. Chopra has recently appointed three-time Olympic gold medallist Zelezny of the Czech Republic as his coach, replacing Dr Klaus Bartonietz.

After a steady start in the first two attempts, he unleashed the big one in his third—his javelin slicing through the Doha night sky and landing beyond the hallowed mark. A roar erupted, not just from the crowd, but across social media and sports circles in India and beyond.

Hazlewood has a shoulder injury and the franchise has not yet given clarity on his availability.

However, the loudest cheers will be reserved for Kohli, who announced his retirement from Test cricket earlier this week.
