

CP Radhakrishnan NDA's VP nominee

New Delhi, August 17: The ruling National Democratic Alliance (NDA) Sunday named Maharashtra Governor Chandrapuram Ponnusamy Radhakrishnan, a seasoned BJP leader belonging to a key OBC caste from Tamil Nadu with an RSS background, as its vice-presidential candidate.

BJP president JP Nadda made the announcement following a meeting of the party's parliamentary board, which included Prime Minister Narendra Modi, and consultation with the party's allies.

Nadda appealed for unanimous election of Radhakrishnan, 67, to the constitutional position, saying BJP leaders had spoken to the opposition parties over the last week and will reach out to them again.

Opposition leaders had

told the BJP interlocutors that they can make up their mind only after being told of the ruling alliance's nominee, Nadda said, adding that his party will speak to them to reach a consensus over Radhakrishnan, whom he lauded as a "statesman".

In Radhakrishnan, the BJP has trusted a leader with a proven organsiational and ideological commitment, a far cry from its choice of his predecessor, Jagdeep Dhankhar.

In his reaction, Modi said on X, "Thiru CP Radhakrishnan Ji has distinguished himself with his dedication, humility and intellect. During the various positions he has held, he has always focused on community service and empowering the marginalised. He has done extensive work at the grassroots in Tamil Nadu.'

Reacting to the announcement of his name as the NDA's $\,$ vice-presidential nominee, Radhakrishnan thanked leaders from the BJP and its allies, including Modi.

Defence Minister jnath Singh will oversee the vice-presidential election, while Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju will be the polling agent.

The last date for filing nomination is August 21.

Gunshots outside Elvish Yadav's home

Gurugram, August 17: Two masked men fired more than two dozen shots outside You-Tuber Elvish Yadav's residence in Sector 57 of Gurugram early Sunday morning, police said.

The incident was captured on CCTV that showed two bike-borne masked men arriving outside the house and opening fire from a distance. After a few seconds, one of them leaned over the main gate and continued to shoot before both fled.

Yaday was not at home when the shooting happened around 5:30am. However, some family members were inside but no one was injured in the incident, they said.

Meanwhile, 'Bhau gang' claimed responsibility for the firing. After getting information, a police team reached the spot and collected forensic evidence, and are scanning CCTV footage from the area.

The attackers shot more than two dozen rounds at the YouTuber's home in Sector 57 and fled from the spot. The bullets struck the ground and first floors of the house, the police said.

In a post on social media, gangsters Neeraj Faridpur and Bhau Ritoliya, members of 'Bhau gang' claimed responsibility for the attack.

The police, however, have not given any confirmation about the claims in the post.

EC, Cong face-off 2 die in Nuapada septic tank

New Delhi, August 17: The Election Commission (EC) and the Opposition came faceto-face Sunday, with the latter stepping up its attack on the apex poll body and accus $ing\ it\ of\ colluding\ with\ BJP$ to "steal elections". Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi, launching the 'Voter Adhikar Yatra' in Bihar, alleged a conspiracy to manipulate the upcoming Bihar Assembly polls through Special Intensive Revision (SIR). He warned that the INDIA bloc would resist any such attempt. Rubbishing the allegations, Chief Election Commissioner Gyanesh Kumar said updating voter rolls is EC's legal duty. "If no declaration under oath is given within seven days, the claims will be considered baseless and invalid," Kumar said.

The Congress leader Sunday claimed the whole country now knows that the EC is "stealing" elections in collusion with BJP and asserted that INDIA bloc will not let their "latest conspiracy" to steal Bihar Assembly polls succeed, as he embarked



on his 1,300-km 'Voter Adhikar Yatra' in Bihar.

Gandhi alleged that Assembly and Lok Sabha polls were being "stolen" across the country and there was a "conspiracy" in Bihar to do the same through the SIR of electoral rolls. Addressing the gathering at Bihar's Sasaram during the launch event. Gandhi said while he was asked to submit an affidavit after his press conference exposing "vote chori", no such demand was made from BJP leaders who made claims in their presser.

"In the whole country, Assembly and Lok Sabha elections are being stolen and their latest conspiracy is to delete and add voters through SIR to steal the elections in Bihar," Gandhi charged. Hitting back at Gandhi, the CEC served a seven-day ultimatum on the Congress leader to submit a signed affidavit to back his claims, else his

allegations will be considered baseless and invalid. "Give an affidavit or apologise to the nation. There is no third option. If an affidavit is not given within seven days, this means that all allegations are baseless," said Kumar. He admitted that there could be discrepancies in the electoral rolls and asserted that SIR was the only way to correct this. He, however, contended that a person being present in multiple voter lists does not automatically mean that he or she also voted multiple times.

Kumar also said the poll panel has already identified and corrected more than three lakh cases of multiple people having the same voter identity card numbers, but the duplicate voter issue of one person being listed as a voter at multiple places can be resolved only through exercises like SIR. To the Oppostion's question on the timing of the roll revision, Kumar said it is EC's legal duty to correct the

voter list before every election. Kumar said the EC cannot discriminate among political parties, and both ruling and Opposition parties are equal before the poll authority. P9

Jammu, August 17: Seven members of four families, including five children, were killed in two separate incidents of cloud burst and landslide in Kathua district of Jammu and Kashmir early Sunday, officials said.

The calamity struck Jodh Ghati village of Rajbagh and Bagra village of Janglote amid heavy overnight rains in the district, leading to increase in the level of water bodies and submerging many low-lying areas, they said.

The cloudburst in Kathua came three days after flash floods triggered by cloudburst struck Chisoti village in Kisht war district of Jammu and Kashmir August 14, leaving 61 people dead and more than 100

injured. Officials said while five persons, including a man and his two minor sons, lost their lives in Jodh Ghati which was hit by the cloudburst, snapping access to the village and caus ing damage to several mud houses, a mother-daughter duo lost their lives in landslide

17: If everything goes as per plan, Chinese scientists are expected to develop a prototype of humanoid robot that can give birth to a human baby by next year. The first-of-its-kind surrogate robot being created under a project led by Dr Zhang Qifeng of Kaiwa Technology in Guangzhou, aims to mimic pregnancy inside an artificial womb, according to a report by 'The Telegraph'.

The report said the baby would grow inside the robot's body in a womb-like space filled with artificial amniotic fluid. Zhang is in talks with Guangand rules for this technology.

The baby would grow for nine months and receive nutrients through a tube before birth. Zhang, a PhD graduate from Singapore's Nanyang Technological University, said the technology has reached a "mature stage

"Now, it needs to be implanted in the robot's abdomen so that a real person and the robot can interact to achieve pregnancy, allowing the fetus to grow inside," the newspaper quoted him as saying.

"A prototype is expected to go on sale next year for around 1,00,000 yuan (more than ₹12 lakh)," it said, adding that the



humanoid can replicate the entire pregnancy journey, from conception to delivery.

However, the details of how fertilisation actually happens remain unclear. Experts have not explained how a foetus will be implanted. But, they claim

experiments where premature lambs survived in "biobags" for weeks, the publication added. The innovation has raised major legal and ethical de-

bates. But, if proven successful. it could change medicine and family life forever. It may provide a solution

for rising infertility in China, which jumped from 11.9 per cent in 2007 to 18 per cent in 2020. Supporters see it as a radical step forward while critics worry about its moral impact.

Supporters believe artificial wombs could protect women from health risks linked to pregnancy and free them from the physical strain of carrying

tinues, the question remains whether such machines can ever truly replace human gestation.

However, critics argue that the technology is "problematic" and unethical because it removes the natural bond between mother and child. Medical experts doubt whether science can copy complex processes like maternal hormones.

Radical feminist Andrea Dworkin once warned that artificial wombs could mean "the end of women", the newspaper reported. Researchers from The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia earlier cautioned that such technology could make pregnancy seem like a disease.



Officers to face salary cut for delay in projects

Bhubaneswar, August 17: Rural Development (RD) Minister Rabi Naravan Naik Sunday directed officers to ensure projects within the stipulated time, saying delays would result in salary deductions.

While reviewing the status of projects in all 60 divisions under the RD department during a state-level meeting here, Naik directed officers to make sure all construction projects must be completed within the stipulated time while maintaining high quality standards. "Delays would result in salary deductions for the officers," the RD Minister said.

ficials for their achievements, especially in districts like Kalahandi, Nabarangpur and Rayagada where projects were implemented in saturation mode.

Discussions were also held on the construction targets for FY2025-26. "Under the MMSY, 5,000 km of roads across 521 projects are set to be constructed during the financial year.' an official statement said.

Expressing satisfaction over the progress made on 400 bridges under the Setu Bandhan Yoiana and the construction of 253 buildings. Naik urged officers to take greater responsibility.

He stated that under the leadership of Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi, the state govern-

ment is giving high importance on rural development, with appropriate budget allocations in place. "The RD department plays a crucial role in improving the lives of people in rural Odisha. Over the next five years, the department aims to construct 30,000 km of roads and 500 bridges," he said, urging officers to achieve with dedication.

Naik emphasised accountability in every project, instructing that monthly construction targets be set and monitored for each division. A dedicated regional team will be formed to review the status of delayed projects. He also made it clear that any negligence leading to delays or poor-quality work will be dealt with strictly — including holding responsible officials accountable, stopping salaries, and initiating

Odisha's seafood sector reels under 50% US tariff

Bhubaneswar, August 17: Odisha's seafood industry has plunged into deep crisis after the US government imposed a steep 50 per cent tariff on all Indian imports. The move, announced by President Donald Trump in retaliation for India's continued oil trade with Russia, has hit the coastal state's shrimp exports the hardest.

With Vannamei shrimp making up 99.5 per cent of Odisha's \$170 million marine exports to the US, this trade has been thrown into disarray. Exporters are reporting suspended orders, price renegotiations, and the looming risk of financial distress. The US remains Odisha's largest seafood market, accounting for more than 45 per cent of its total exports.

The 50 per cent tariff will definitely impact both factories and farmers in Odisha, said Hari Marine General Manager (Marketing) R Venkatesh.

"Among all export destinations including Japan and Viet-

nam, the US remains the most significant for both India and Odisha. Without urgent diplomatic intervention, this situation could become very troubling. Venkatesh pointed out.

Falcon Marine Exports Limited Chairman Tara Ranjan Patnaik noted that Odisha alone exports seafood worth nearly Rs 1,500 crore to the US annually, out of India's Rs 22,000 crore seafood trade with that country.

"While there are alternative countries we can export to, the prices in those markets may be lower or different. This will create additional

pressure on fish farmers, who are already under financial strain," Patnaik warned.

Fish farmers in coastal districts are feeling the tariff heat. Highlighting the tariff impact, Chakradhar Sahoo, a

Paddy farmers can use self-declaration forms for registration

Bhubaneswar, 17: Farmers in Odisha can use self-declaration forms to register themselves and sell their paddy to the government during the Kharif Marketing Season (KMS) 2025-26, Food Supplies and Consumer Welfare (FSCW) Minister Krushna Chandra Patra said here Sunday.

Briefing reporters, Patra said, "We have further simplified the registration process for farmers to participate in the paddy procurement process. They can now register themselves by submitting a self-declaration form, which we have distributed to all districts

The government has also extended the deadline for registration of paddy farmers from August 20 to 25. Now, the entire registration process of the farmers will be completed by August 30, the FSCW Minister said.

The state government has taken this decision after many farmers were seen facing difficulties in completing registration owing to the non-availability or delay in submission of certain documents like consent letter from the legal heirs, co-sharers, and genealogy report from the Revenue Inspector, an officer said.

Meanwhile, the FSCW department has sent the self-declaration forms to all district Collectors to facilitate the smooth conduct of the registration process and to ensure that eligible farmers are not deprived of the benefits of the minimum support price (MSP).

The paddy procurement for the Kharif crop season is scheduled to start from the first week of November.

Naveen hospitalised; condition stable

Bhubaneswar, August 17: BJD chief and Leader of the Opposition in Assembly Naveen Patnaik was admitted to a private hospital here Sunday due to dehvdration.

His health condition is stated to be stable and is improving.



Ignore social media posts on Balanga burn victim: Cops

Bhubaneswar, August 17: The police Sunday appealed to the people not to pay heed to social media posts on the recent death of a 15-year-old girl due to burn injuries in Puri district's Balanga as it is a sensitive matter involving a minor victim.

Puri Superintendent of Police (SP) Pinak Mishra said that their investigation into the case is in the last stage, and they were also probing who recorded a video clip showing the injured girl saying something that went viral Sunday

In the FIR registered at Balanga police station, the victim's mother alleged that her daughter was kidnapped and set ablaze on the banks of the Bhargavi river July 19 by three persons. With 70 per cent burns, the teenager was admitted to AIIMS-Bhubaneswar and the next day airlifted to

AIIMS-Delhi, where she died August 2.

Hours after her death, the police said, in an X post, "According to the investigation conducted so far, it is clear that no other person is involved." Her father also said, without elaborating, that his daughter was 'under mental pressure and took her life'.

Referring to certain social media posts where the minor victim was heard saying something about the incident under which she suffered burn injuries, Mishra said, "Please do not pay attention to such posts. I also appeal to all that one should refrain from forwarding such sensitive content

involving a minor victim." The SP said the investigation into the minor girl's death is almost at the last stage, and the police were waiting for certain reports from the forensic science laboratory before submit-

BJD DEMANDS JUDICIAL PROBE

The BJD Sunday accused the state government involved in the Balanga minor girl burning incident and demanded a judicial probe into the incident. Addressing media at Sankha Bhawan, senior BJD leader Lenin Mohanty said the state government has been shielding the culprits in the

Balanga incident as despite the girl - in her statement - naming the perpetrators, Odisha Police is yet to make any arrest. "We demand a judicial inquiry into the matter and resignation of Deputy Chief Minister Pravati Parida as the incident took place in her Nimapara Assembly constituency. A judicial probe will reveal the truth as the police's role is also suspected," Mohanty said. Senior BJD leaders Ipsita Sahoo and Subrat Chhatoi were also present.

"Initially, there were some

specific allegations, which had also been part of the FIR. On that day when the victim was being shifted to the hospital, she had made a similar statement. I think the video that has gone viral was made that day,'

He said, "We are probing who actually recorded the video and how it went to social media. This was a confidential matter," the SP told reporters.

Mishra said that the police have taken assistance from their cyber team and are investigating the matter.

"Since the victim is a minor, her name or video involving her should not go viral. This is a violation of the Juvenile Justice Act," the SP said, adding that the last statement of the victim was recorded in the presence of a judicial magistrate.

"We have followed complete transparency in the investigation. The family members of the victim were aware of it. Therefore, I appeal again to ignore the social media video on this matter," the SP said.

406 arrested under Operation Garuda

Bhubaneswar, August 17: Several animal welfare organisations, animal rights activists, and concerned citizens gathered at Lower PMG Square, Sunday afternoon here, expressing strong opposition to recent court rulings on stray dogs.

Demonstrators voiced their concerns over recent hearings by the Supreme Court and the Rajasthan High Court, claiming a regressive and unrealistic approach to stray dog management. Holding placards and banners, with slogans promoting compassion and coexistence, the protestors called out that such rulings ignore India's cultural and ecological traditions of living

harmoniously with animals. The event was organised and coordinated by Animal Welfare Trust Ekamra (AW-TE) and Speak for Animals Trust. Participants voiced



for a community-led, humane solutions-particularly the effective implementation of the Animal Birth Control (ABC) programme—rather than mass removal or indefinite sheltering of stray dogs.

"Coexistence with animals is deeply rooted in our culture and represents the most sustainable path forward," said one of the organiser while addressing the gathering.

Activists argued that the ABC programme, which involves sterilising and vac-


cinating stray dogs before releasing them back to their original locations, remains the most practical and ethical method of population control. However, the initiative is poorly implemented across the country.

AWTE founder Purabi Patra pointed out the logistical and financial challenges of long-term sheltering proposals and said, "When we are in a race to become a developed country and we don't want to see dogs on the road, we

should ensure that we have the capacity to match infrastructure and resource need for sheltering. Many countries have successfully implemented the Animal Birth Control programme. We should learn

from them." "Neutered dogs stay healthy and become docile, saving the enormous costs of life time care. Rather than an unfeasible sheltering plan, focusing on successful ABC programmes is a more humane and practical solution," she added.

A joint appeal to both the public and policymakers was made by the protestors to uphold a balanced, compassionate, and ecologically informed approach towards animal welfare. Demonstrators stressed that protecting stray dogs does not come at the cost of public safety—but both goals can be met through science-based. community-supported strategies.

Denied liquor, man beats wife to death

Kalimela, August 17: In a horrific incident at Ginipali village under the jurisdiction of MV-79 police station in Malkangiri district's Kalimela block, a man allegedly killed his wife in a drunken rage after she refused to give him liquor.

The victim, identified as 38-year-old Prabhati Kunja, was beaten to death with a hoe by husband Bhima Kunja, who was arrested and forwarded to court Sunday.

According to police, Bhima, a habitual drinker, frequently abused his wife. On the day of the incident, Prabhati had hired labourers to work on their farmland and, following



local custom, prepared liquor for them but did not allow Bhima to get drunk. Enraged, Bhima attacked Prabhati while she was working on the field. He beat her with a hoe handle and dragged her back home. There, he continued the assault by brutally beating her and went on to insert a stick into her private parts, leading to her death.

Two village girls who witnessed the attack and attempted to intervene were threatened by Bhima, who chased them with a knife. Villagers eventually subdued him and handed him over to the police. Bhima. who has two sons and a daughter, was arrested and sent to court on charges filed under a case (125/25) registered at MV-79 police station. The couple's children are said to be devastated by their mother's death.

A forensic team from Nabarangpur visited the crime scene to collect evidence, and an investigation is ongoing

Leopard population on rise in Mahanadi Wildlife Division

Nayagarh, August 17: The population of leopards is on the rise in Mahanadi wildlife division of Navagarh district. For est officials said. Once counted at 17, the number of leopards has now climbed to 35.

Alongside the growth in numbers, reports suggest the presence of rare melanistic leopards in the division. During the 2023 tiger census in the state, a camera trap in the Mahanadi Wildlife Division captured images of a black leopard, a rare genetic variant. Environmentalists and locals expressed happiness after reports indicated that more than one black tiger may be roaming the forests of Nayagarh.

However, Forest authorities have maintained secrecy over the findings and clarified that presence of only one black leopard has been officially confirmed.

The first recorded sighting of black leopard in Odisha was in 2015. It was again spotted in 2021 through camera traps in the Banigochha (West) forest range of Daspalla. The then Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Wildlife), Sushant Nanda, highlighted the rare occurrence on social media, sparking wider attention in November 2023.

Later that year, the animal was again captured by cam era traps in the Chhamundia forest area under Gania block. In 2015 and 2022, authorities had referred to the animal as a "black cheetah." a description carried in the media. But in 2023, officials confirmed it to be a black-coloured leopard, strengthening reports of a unique and rare lineage thriving in the Nayagarh forests.



According to the 2017-18 tiger census, Nayagarh was home to 17 leopards. The census, conducted every four years, was last held in 2021-22. However, the exact number of the animals was not disclosed.

On the other hand, enumeration of tigers is also carried out in June and December every year. Authorities use trap cameras to track the population of tigers, the rare melanistic tiger, elephants and other wildlife.

The Mahanadi Wildlife Division has now estimated that by 2025, the forest area could house 30-35 leopards, including one melanistic. Yet, from 2017 to 2025, no comprehensive data is available on the total population of the big cats or the number of animal deaths in the division.

"We currently have one black leopard and 30 to 35 regular leopards in our forest," said Amaresh Pradhan, Divisional Forest Officer of the Mahanadi Wildlife Division. "The department is focusing on preventing poaching of tigers and other wildlife. I am new to this post, but priority is being given to ensuring the animals' safety,"

However, repeated seizures of leopard hides from the Daspalla range have raised troubling questions as to which jungle these leopards are being poached in.

Authorities are yet to deter mine whether the poaching is taking place inside the Mahanadi Wildlife Division, Nayagarh Forest Division, or other adjoining forests.

The failure to trace the kingpins behind the poaching net works has further fueled allegations that wildlife protection efforts are being compromised.

Wildlife activists have ac cused the Forest and Wildlife departments of negligence, pointing out that the Odisha Police's Special Task Force (STF) has seized tiger hides in multiple operations from Daspalla forest range without the knowledge of the local forest authorities. The failure to trace the kingpins behind the poaching networks has further fueled allegations that wildlife protection efforts are being compromised.

Over the past five years, the STF has seized more than seven hides of the felines in Navagarh alone. In a recent case about two months ago the STF recovered the hide of a 10-year-old leopard killed in Banigochha and arrested two accused, identified as Gangad har Nayak and Rakesh Nayak

Female police constable found hanging from tree

Bhubaneswar, August 17: The body of a female police constable was found hanging from a tree near the Nuapada railway station, officials said Sunday. Her husband and mother-in-

law were arrested on the charge of abetment to suicide. After spotting the body Satur-

day, locals informed the police, who brought the body down and sent it for post-mortem examination, they said.

The deceased constable sent a purported video message to several people hours before her body was found, stating that she was planning to end her life because of "torture" by her husband and in-laws.

"We have registered a case of abetment to suicide. We are verifying the video," said a police officer. The police arrested the constable's husband and mother in-law and forwarded them

to court, he said. "During investigation, it was found that the constable's husband and mother in-law were harassing her. So we have arrested them," said the police officer of Nuapada police station.

Dairy farmers allege torture, extortion by Chh'garh Police to pay ₹60,000 and the cattle

Sonepur, August 17: Two dairy farmers from Odisha have accused Chhattisgarh Police of harassment and extortion while they were transporting cows under the state government's flagship Mukhyamantri Kamadhenu Yojana.

According to complaints filed by women beneficiaries of the scheme, the incident occurred in Mahasamund district of Chhattisgarh under Balda police limits. The victims were identified as Kalakanhu Navak of Katapali village and Parakhit Dehery of Bagiabahali village in Tarbha police station area of Subarnapur district. Their wives, Kavita Nayak and Deepa Dehery, are registered beneficiaries under the scheme through the Go Sugam portal. As per the government guide-

lines, the farmers had travelled to Mahasamund Monday to buy cross-bred cows. Kalakanhu purchased two cows with a calf, while Parakhit bought one cow with a calf. The animals were certified by local veterinary officials, tagged, and loaded onto a pickup van along with valid health documents for transportation to Odisha.

However, Balda police intercepted the vehicle, alleged the papers were forged and accused the farmers of illegal cattle transport. They allegedly de-



the farmers could not pay the amount, police detained them along with the vehicle and the cattle at the station from 1pm, without providing them any

The farmers said that police threatened to frame them in false cases unless they paid. Ultimately, the two farmers and the vehicle owner were forced

and the van were released late at night. The police reportedly withheld the farmers' ATM cards and other documents.

The incident has been brought to the notice of Subarnapur Collector Nriparaj Sahu and senior veterinary officials, but no action has been taken so far.

The farmers alleged that the prolonged detention caused the cows and calves to fall sick due to hunger and exhaustion. They said harassment by police and cattle mafia in neighbouring states has become common whenever Odisha farmers try to bring improved breeds from outside. Similar incidents were earlier reported from Bargarh and Dunguripali areas.

Kalakanhu, a differently-abled farmer from Katapali, said he had pinned hopes on the government scheme, which provides 70 per cent subsidy for cross-bred cows to sustain his family through milk production. "We followed all procedures and bought cows legally. Still, we were tortured physically, mentally and financially," he said.

Confirming the development, Tarbha Block Development Officer Shyam Sundar Panda said both farmers have lodged written complaints. The matter has been reported to the Chief District Veterinary Officer for

showing Buguda ranger Pradip Kumar Mishra allegedly receiv ing bribe from timber mafia has gone viral, sparking widespread discussion.

The video, shot inside the Buguda forest division office purportedly shows the time ber mafia handing over ₹5,000 bribe to Mishra in order to release his seized vehicle. However, the identity of the mafia, the exact timing of the payment, and the reasons be hind it remain unclear. When questioned about the viral clip, Mishra said the video appeared to be one and a half to two years old. He claimed the money was collected as compound fees and suggested that someone who recorded the clip back then may have released it now to serve personal interests after their demands were not met.

Ghumusar South forest divi sion Assistant Conservator of Forests (ACF) Pradip Behera confirmed that an inquiry has been initiated following the viral video. Since the video is old a thorough investigation will be carried out to uncover the facts and appropriate action will be taken accordingly, he added.

Fraud slur against BJD leader Ankit Jena

Kendrapara: A major fraud case has been registered in Kendrapara Town police station against BJD leader Ankit Jena of Mahanga, police said Saturday, According to the complaint filed August 13, Aishwarya Pratap Jena, managing director of Bhubaneswar-based Emporia Works Pvt Ltd. former managing director Ankit Pratap Jena; Kendrapara manager Debasish Das and Hitesh Mishra allegedly defrauded the complainants of ₹48 lakh. A case (164/25) was registered at the Town police station in this connection. The complaint was lodged by Arabind Tripathy and Ganesh Kumar Swain. proprietors of SSB Flectrical at Chandi Chhak in Cuttack, They alleged that Emporia Works was executing an underground 33 KV cable-laying project in Kendrapara district since 2023 and their firm was working for it. Despite dues reaching ₹48 lakh, the company has failed to make payments to them, they said. The project manager Debasish Das reportedly assured them that the pending payment would be cleared May 14 but it has not been released so far, the complainants added. They also claimed that nonpayment of the amount has made it impossible to disburse labour wages. In a counter-complaint, project manager Das lodged a case against the two proprietors of SSB Electrical at the same police station accusing them of negligence during project execution, which allegedly caused financial losses to Emporia Works. Police have registered a separate case (165/25) in this connection. Kendrapara Town police officer Dilip Kumar Sahu confirmed the development stating that complaints from both sides have been registered. A preliminary investigation is underway in this connection, he said

Bedridden disabled woman awarded enhanced pension

Rayagada, August 17: A bedridden woman with disability in Rayagada, who was deprived of full pension, has finally received the entitled amount after a report in this connection was published in IMPACT OrissaPOST

Renuka Naik, 20, of Nehru Nagar in Rayagada, has been paralysed since birth due to a neurological condition.

She had been receiving a monthly pension of ₹1,200 based on her 2013 disability certificate, which recorded 80 per cent disability. After the formation of the new BJP government, the pension for persons with 80

per cent or more disability was raised to ₹3,500 per month. However, despite being issued a new certificate March 26 this year showing 90 per cent disability. Renuka continued to receive

only ₹1,200 until this week. She had never received government assistance for her medical treatment.

Her case drew attention after lawyer Gauri Patnaik, for whom Renuka's mother works, provided her with a modern bed and flagged the issue. Odia dailv Dharitri (August 10) and English daily OrissaPOST (August 13) carried reports highlighting how Renuka was denied the higher pension despite possessing the updated certificate.

Following the reports, Rayagada Executive Officer Kuldeep Kumar, acting on instructions from senior officials, visited Renuka's home August 14 and handed over the revised pension of ₹3,500 in the presence of Patnaik. District Social Security Officer Srikant Panigrahi and the executive officer also apprised Sub-Collector Ramesh Jena, who

approved the enhanced pension. Social activists noted that many persons with disabilities in the district face similar issues because welfare schemes fail to reach them. They have demanded a district-wide survey to identify all eligible beneficiaries and ensure they receive government support.

Road To Peace?

S President Donald Trump and his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin's much-anticipated summit in Anchorage, Alaska on 15 August was warm on words but cold on outcome as it concluded without any agreement on ending Moscow's war in Ukraine that has been raging since February 2022. The talks lasted just over two and a half hours, far shorter than the expected six to seven hours of discussions. Also, the scheduled lunch never took place, while journalists were barred from asking questions. The two leaders, nonetheless, showered praises on each other. Admittedly such a long drawn conflict cannot be sorted out in one meeting between two countries alone when multiple other interests are in-

Putin demonstrated a keen ability to say what Trump wants to hear, all the while offering little in terms of actual concessions. He supported Trump's unverified claim that had Trump been president four years ago instead of Democrat Joe Biden, the war in Ukraine would never have happened. "I'm quite sure it would indeed be so," Putin remarked. Putin also echoed another claim close to Trump's heart: that the 2020 election, won by Biden, was rigged.

Trump reciprocated by eulogising "Vladimir," calling him "a strong guy (...) tough as hell." He described the meeting as "very productive," highlighting "many points that we agreed on." However, there was clear change of Trump's stance after the summit. Despite having warned Russia just days earlier of "very severe consequences" if it didn't secure a ceasefire in Ukraine, Trump wrote on his Truth Social as he flew home from Alaska that it had been 'determined by all that the best way to end the horrific war between Russia and Ukraine is to go directly to a Peace Agreement, which would end the war, and not a mere Ceasefire Agreement, which often times do not hold up." Trump also told Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy after the summit that Putin had offered to freeze most front lines if Kyiv ceded all of Donetsk, the industrial region that is one of Moscow's main targets. Russia already controls a fifth of Ukraine, including about three-quarters of Donetsk province, which it first entered in 2014. Trump went on to advise Zelenskyy on Fox News: "Make a deal!" Based on how both Trump and Putin framed the discussions in Anchorage, it seems the "deal" being proposed is unlikely to favour Kyiv. Echoing Trump, Putin expressed hope that the Europeans "won't throw a wrench in the works" or attempt "backroom dealings" that could sabotage any progress.

In Europe, the summit was seen as a major diplomatic breakthrough for Putin, who has been eager to emerge from geopolitical isolation. Indeed, Putin's reputation was rehabilitated on the world stage after the summit. Despite being the aggressor in Ukraine and facing war crime charges from the International Criminal Court, the Russian president was given a spectacular reception by the US. After years of being sidelined by the West, this was Putin's first visit to the US in a decade; and he was greeted by American fighter jets, a red carpet, and a ride in the Beast, the iconic armoured car

All eyes are now on the crucial meeting slated for 18 August in Washington which was initially fixed between Trump and Zelenskyy, but now will also have a group of European and NATO leaders in attendance. The delegation includes European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen, French President Emmanuel Macron, German Chancellor Friedrich Merz, and NATO Secretary General Mark Rutte, among others. The European leaders are joining Zelenskyy in an apparent effort to prevent a repeat of the heated encounter the Ukrainian president faced when he met Trump in the Oval Office in February. European leaders standing with Zelenskyy demonstrates the continent's backing for Ukraine.

As matters stand, the road to peace has been laid. What remains to be seen is how long it will take to reach the destination.





STARVATION IN GAZA

silent unmaking of the body. Deprived of basic sustenance, the body first burns through sugar stores in the liver. Then it melts muscle and fat, breaking down tissue to keep the brain and other vital organs alive. As these reserves are depleted, the heart loses its strength, the immune system surrenders, and the mind begins to fade. The skin tightens over the bones, and breathing grows faint. Organs begin to fail in succession, vision fails, and the body, now empty, slips away. It is a prolonged, agonizing way to die.

We have all seen the images of emaciated Palestinian babies and children withering away from starvation in their mothers' arms. Yet now that Israel is intensifying its war-embarking on a new campaign to "conquer' Gaza City - thousands more Palestinian civilians may be killed, either by bombs or by starvation.

"This is no longer a looming hunger crisis," Ramesh Rajasingham, a senior United Nations humanitarian official, told the UN Security Council on 10 August. "This is starvation, pure and simple." Alex de Waal, an expert on famine, estimates that thousands of Gazan children are now too weak to eat, even if they had access to food. "They have got to that stage of severe acute malnutrition where their bodies just can't digest food."

There is a growing consensus that Israel is committing the most serious of crimes in Gaza. including the use of starvation as a method of warfare. Palestinian and international human-rights groups raised the alarm about this risk within months of the start of the war, and it has since been echoed by states on every continent, as well as by many in Israel. Former Prime Minister Ehud Olmert, for example, has decried what he describes as war crimes in Gaza, and leading Israeli human-rights groups say Israel's actions in the territory amount to genocide

On 9 October, 2023, two days after Hamas killed more than 1,200 Israelis and took more than 200 hostages - itself a serious war crime-then-Israeli Defense Minister Yoav Gallant announced: "I have ordered a complete siege on Gaza. There will be no electricity, no food, no fuel, everything is closed. We are fighting human animals, and we will act accordingly." The population of Gaza was dehumanized, and no distinction was made between civilians and combatants - a violation of international humanitarian law. The siege shut off all supplies into Gaza for 70 days, imposing collective punishment.

This first siege was eased only slightly when Israel allowed supplies to trickle into Gaza in early 2024. By that April, Samantha Power, then head of USAID, was already warning of famine in parts of Gaza. The following month, Cindy McCain, executive director of World Food Programme, announced "a fullblown famine" in northern Gaza. International law prohibits the use of starvation as a weapon of war. As the occupying power in Gaza. Israel must ensure that the civilian population receives adequate food, water, medical supplies, and other essentials. If those supplies cannot be located within Gaza itself, they must be sourced externally.

Over the past 21 months, several governments and aid agencies have pleaded with Israel to let them deliver aid. Granting such permission is also a legal obligation: Israel has a duty to facilitate others' relief schemes "by all means at its disposal." But Israel has continuously thwarted these efforts. In January 2024, the Interna-

tional Court of Justice, through legally binding decisions ordered Israel to take "immediate and effective measures to enable the provision of urgently needed basic services and humanitarian assistance." Two months later, it reaffirmed that order and required that the measures be taken "in full co-operation with the United Nations." The UN-led humanitarian system was the only one capable of preventing widespread famine in Gaza. During the cease-fire between January and March of this year. the UN and other humanitarian organizations were operating as many as 400 relief distribution sites. But after Israel broke the cease-fire in March, these were shut down, and another siege was unlawfully imposed.

Israel justified the new siege by saying that it was cutting off aid to exert greater pressure on Hamas-thus acknowledging its use of starvation as a weapon. When aid resumed in May, the UN was replaced by the Gaza Humanitarian Foundation, a private food-distribution arrangement organized by Israel. But since then, nearly 1,400 Palestinians have been killed by

Israeli forces while attempting to obtain food at the GHF's four distribution sites. Worse, the GHF scheme was never going to work. According to a report from the Famine Review Committee last month, "Our analysis of the food packages supplied by the GHF shows that their distribution plan would lead to mass starvation, even if it was able to function without the appalling levels of violence.

Under international law,

the war crime of starvation begins at the point of deprivation. When it becomes a more expansive policy undertaken with the intent "to destroy, in whole or in part, a national, ethnical, racial or religious group," it becomes genocide. Multiple senior Israeli officials have openly expressed such intent - including Gallant in October 2023, Finance Minister Bezalel Smotrich, who in August 2024 remarked that "it might be justified and moral" to "cause two million civilians to die of hunger," and Itamar Ben-Gvir, the Minister for National Security, who tweeted that "food and aid depots should be bombed."

Palestinians are being intentionally starved to death. Although signs of the coming horrors were clear within months of the war's onset, many governments averted their eves. They rationalized the restrictions on aid by arguing that it was going to Hamas – a claim that Israel now says it has no evidence for – and transferred more tonnage in weapons to Israel than they delivered in aid to Gaza.

History will forever record this moment of global shame. It will archive the images of skeletal children alongside those from past episodes where the world did nothing. One can only hope that the world will act now to salvage at least a measure of our humanity, before even more children die.

t's a complex scenario. Prime Minister Narendra Modi, in his Independence Day speech, announced a ₹1 lakh crore job-generation plan through Employees Provident Fund (EPF) incentivisation. A welcome move-yet not an alternative to the Donald Trumpled assault on the H-1B visa.

This could be an indigenous way to create jobs, but it needs far more ingenuity. The focus must be on revitalising industry, ensuring fair wage policies, and securing longterm employment. India must evolve a system capable of generating enough quality jobs to counter US arm-twisting on the visa issue.

The H-1B debate is now particularly critical for low-paid jobs. Highly skilled applicants at higher wage levels (Level 3 and 4) may still secure better deals, but US corporate preference for low-wage Indian hires over American workers has triggered political pushback. Complaints have mounted over the years, and any US president-Trump or otherwise-

might have acted similarly. India needs to create conditions that keep its IIT graduates, thriving on taxpayers'

money, and other top talent from flocking abroad. The government spends ₹10–15 lakh per student during a four-year IIT BTech programme, with the total IIT budget for FY25 at ₹9,660 crore. Yet 30–36% of IIT graduates migrate each year, according to LinkedIn and Threads data, and a National Bureau of Economic Research (NBER) study. Among those who remain, an estimated 70% work for MNCs

Indian nationals dominate the programme, receiving 72% of H-1B visas, followed by 12% for Chinese citizens. The majority of H-1B visa holders work in STEM fields like data science, AI, machine learning, and cybersecurity, with 65% in computer-related jobs.

The US visa-type problems could crop up anywhere. The UK has also put its foot down on jobs till the free trade agreement with India comes into force. India needs to retain its talent pool not by force or new laws but by making job conditions better than elsewhere. Narayan Murthy of Infosys suggesting 70-hour weekly shifts or SN Subrahmanyan of L&T suggesting a 90-hour work week without a weekly off for Indian professionals have been

doing great disservice to Indian The country needs to restore

48-hour week, 8-hour a day, instead of the amended Industrial Disputes Act's impractical 12-hour shifts. Such draconian moves would promote brain drain and invite ignominy to Indian workers world over.

The US Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) has issued warnings against hiring practices that disproportionately migrant workers—a practice that may amount to national origin discrimination. Tech companies-including Amazon, Google, and Microsofthave reportedly advised H-1B employees to avoid international travel, fearing possible visa denials or re-entry issues. The prolonged green card backlogs. particularly for Indian nationals, further exacerbate stress and impact workforce morale, says The Washington Post.

Despite the stereotype of H-1B workers being "cheap labour," data tells a different story. Average annual salaries for Indian H-1B professionals in tech hover around \$132,000. In some engineering fields, H-1B workers actually earn more

than US-born peers. Additionally, visa sponsorship costs, including government and legal fees, can run up to \$34,900, or even \$50,000 when applying for permanent residency.

The H-1B visa dynamics are shaping a complex battleground—where legal scrutiny, worker vulnerabilities, and economic stakes intersect. The EEOC warnings and past misconduct are harbingers of tougher times. How do we balance US labour protection with fair treatment of Indian H-1B professionals who are highly skilled and contribute significantly to the economy—both in dollars and innovation?

The way out is that India itself should create an economy with high demand and opportunities absorbing talents in an industry that is humane and honours job laws and does not remain tucked to profit-making alone. It needs proper laws that ensure wages and job safety. Once Indians, known for their mettle, are treated better at home, they are expected to be in demand across the world. India needs to revamp its labour laws and not scrap it for petty profits of employers

Unless Trump proves he can deliver more than theatrics, his "deal-making" will remain posturing, not peace-making.

FROM HILLS TO ISLANDS

One man's solar dream lighting up Manipur's remotest corners

Imphal, August 17: As the sun dips behind the remote hills of Manipur, life in many villages once slipped into darkness. Women finished their chores early, children struggled to study under kerosene lamps, and health workers relied on noisy diesel generators to attend to emergencies

But in recent years, the quiet glow of solar lamps has begun to change that story. At the centre of this transformation is Seth Moirangthem, a 38-yearold from Imphal East district.

His startup, SNL Energy Solutions Ltd, has brought clean, affordable electricity to thousands of households scattered across the state's remote hilly areas and to the fishing communities living on the islands in the Loktak lake in Bishnupur district.

"Back in 2015, while travelling to Ukhrul, Tamenglong and Senapati, I realised how people struggled without access to power," Seth recalled.

'That was also when I met people associated with the Selco Foundation in Bengaluru, and the idea of solar energy solutions struck me," he told PTI.

Seth, an Arts graduate from Manipur University, said he was provided technical training by the Selco Foundation.

The challenges, he admitted, have been daunting. Solar equipment is purchased in Guwahati and trucked in through Manipur's highways.



"Periodic blockades, bandhs and now the ethnic violence often disrupt supplies. Installation takes only a few hours, but getting the material there can take days," he said.

Still, by relying on local partners, Seth and his team have managed to continue lighting up homes in places few power

For residents, the change has been dramatic. Luithui, a villager in Ukhrul, said solar energy has given women fresh opportunities. "They can run sewing machines and power looms late into the evening. Children, too, study without straining their eyes.

Health workers echo the sentiment. At Jessami Primary Health Centre in Ukhrul, near the Nagaland border, health worker K Makweiron said life without solar back-up

"Earlier, we used diesel generators. They were expensive and deafening. With solar panels, we finally have a reliable, quiet solution to serve patients," she said.

On the small islands in the Loktak lake, home to thousands of fisherfolk, the arrival of solar energy has been a blessing.

"Candles and kerosene lamps were dangerous for our thatched huts," said fisherman P Keshojit Meitei. "Now our homes are safe, and the nights

Beyond lighting homes, SNL Energy Solutions -- named after the biblical phrase 'Salt and Light' -- has provided street lamps in the remote hilly areas of Tamenglong and Churachandpur districts.

To make the technology affordable, Seth has tied up with NGOs and microfinance institutions, offering families the option of paying in small monthly instalments.

"A 40-watt panel is enough for a few bulbs. For power looms and sewing machines, a 1-kilowatt panel is better. Since those cost more, we spread out payments through EMIs," he

Officials of the Manipur State Power Distribution Company Limited (MSPDCL) admit that solar is bridging a crucial gap.

"Most major villages are connected to the grid, but many remote households and settlements on Loktak lake remain off-grid due to terrain and connectivity issues. In such areas, solar is a lifeline," said an MSP-DCL officer.

With plans to expand into Assam and Nagaland, Seth's enterprise is growing.

From loom-filled courtyards in Ukhrul to the islands in Loktak, his solar panels are rewriting nightly routines.

Anissa Lamare's silent revolution

Hailing from Shillong, Lamare has earned the distinction of being *India's first female* downhill mountain bicyclist, a title she has earned through years of grit, resilience and unwavering passion

Shillong, August 17: In a quiet corner of the northeast. 28-vear-old Anissa Lamare is redefining what it means to go off the beaten track – both literally and metaphorically.

Hailing from Shillong, Lamare has earned the distinction of being India's first female downhill mountain bicyclist, a title she has earned through years of grit, resilience and unwavering passion.

Lamare began her mountain biking journey in December 2015, venturing into a sport that was virtually non-existent for women in the country at that

With no professional infrastructure, female competitors, or national recognition, the odds were stacked high. Yet, the former literature student from Meghalava persisted, becoming a pioneer in one of the most extreme and male-dominated cycling disciplines.

"I wasn't just racing, I was paving the way for others," Lamare told PTI.

Downhill mountain biking, a sport that involves racing down steep, rugged trails at high speed, demands strength, technical skill and mental en-

Lamare had to master these on her own, often training without access to proper trails or

coaching support. She participated in her first competitive event in India with no separate women's category, racing against male riders as the lone female participant.

Her breakthrough on the international stage came in October 2023, when she represented India in the Elite Downhill category at the 28th Asian Continental Mountain Bike Championships held in Ponmudi, Kerala.

Competing against seasoned athletes from across Asia, Lamare finished ninth - a commendable feat for her debut on the continental stage.

She followed it up with a silver medal in the Open Women's category at the Pokhara Enduro Race in Nepal.

Lamare also competed in the EnduroLK race in Sri Lanka and was invited to represent Team Al Waal in Oman – a testament to her growing reputation in the global mountain biking community.

"I have no plans to relax yet. I am preparing for the next race in Nepal again this December,' she said.

Outside the track, Lamare is also making strides as an entrepreneur. In 2021, she co-founded Pedal Compass, an athlete-centric mountain bike shop in Shillong.

It specialises in mountain bikes, authentic cycling gear, precision servicing, and offers rental services of e-bikes and e-scooters to tourists who want to explore the city.

She took full ownership of the business in 2023, transforming it into a hub for local cycling enthusiasts, and a key source of financial independence that enables her to support her sporting ambitions.

Through Pedal Compass, Lamare also seeks to build a community around mountain biking in Meghalaya. She is currently working on a plan to develop dedicated biking trails in the region and promote the sport among young girls.

In 2021, Lamare's inspiring iourney was featured in a national advertisement campaign by Haier India titled 'Perform

The campaign celebrated Indian women achievers across various fields, including moun taineer Arunima Sinha, special forces trainer Dr Seema Rao, and chess Grandmaster Harika

Dronavalli. The advertisement, which aired across digital and television platforms, underscored Lamare's story as a symbol of quiet determination and excel-

Her story was also featured in a documentary film by Kopal Goyal under the 'Project Wild Women' series, which profiled 15 women in India breaking gender norms in adventure

Despite limited financial support and minimal institutional backing, Lamare has carved out a space for herself at the intersection of sport, business and advocacy.

She remains focused on continuing her competitive journey, expanding her business, and building a sustainable ecosystem for mountain biking in the northeast.

Her long-term goal is to es tablish Meghalaya as a premier destination for downhill and enduro mountain biking, while mentoring the next generation of riders, particularly women.

As the lone woman at the starting line becomes a lead er of a movement, Anissa La mare's journey is not just about sport, it's about changing narratives in silence.

Assam govt carries out eviction drive in Biswanath district

Tezpur, August 17: The Assam government Sunday began an eviction drive in Biswanath district, displacing 309 families. officials said.

The eviction drive was started in the morning to clear encroachment on nearly 175 bigha or 23 hectare of land in the Village Grazing Reserve (VGR) in Japariguri, they said.

"The eviction drive is going on peacefully. There were 309 families who had encroached on 175 bigha of land. Notices were issued to them on August 1 to vacate the areas within 15 days," District Commissioner Simanta Kumar Das said.

He said all the families have already left the area, and many of them had dismantled their houses. "We demolished the remaining houses. There was also one big tea garden. That is being dismantled now for the forestation drive later," he said.

The DC said 600 security personnel were deployed, and 20 excavators, along with dozens of tractors, were used during the eviction drive.

The encroachers were mostly from the Bengali-speaking Muslim community, another official said.

Visiting the site, All Assam Minority Students' Union (AAMSU) General Secretary Kuddus Ali Sarkar alleged that the Himanta Biswa Sarma government has been evicting people in an "inhuman manner".

Supporting the state government's steps to evict encroachments on public land, several ethnic organisations have started 'Miya Kheda Andolan' (movement to drive out Miyas) in the state.

'Miya' is originally a pejorative term used for Bengali-speaking Muslims in Assam, and the non-Bengali-speaking people generally identify them as Bangladeshi immigrants. In recent years, activists from the community have started adopting this term as a gesture of defiance.

In his Independence Day speech, Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma said that "aggression" has changed the demography of lower and central Assam, and now efforts are being made for it in upper and north Assam, in an apparent reference to the community.

Radicalised chef remanded to 14-day judicial custody

Dharmavaram (Andhra Pradesh), August 17: A 42-year-old chef from Dharmavaram in Sri Satva Sai district has been remanded in judicial custody for 14 days after being arrested for allegedly being active in WhatsApp groups linked to Pakistan-based terrorist organisations and possessing jihadi propaganda material, police said Sunday.

The accused, identified as Sheik Kothwal Noor Mohammad, was produced before the Kadiri court on Saturday and later shifted to Kadapa Central

District Superintendent of Police (SP) V Ratna said Mohammad was taken into custody after a raid at his residence, following inputs from



the Counter-Intelligence Cell. Police seized a mobile phone and a book containing alleged jihadi literature during the

The phone has been sent to the Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL) for analysis, Ratna added. "In the process of curbing terrorist ideology and keeping surveillance on suspects, we arrested a person who was allegedly participating in WhatsApp groups linked to terrorist organisations and in

possession of jihadi propaganda books," Ratna told reporters.

A case was registered at Dharmavaram I Town Police Station under Sections 152. 196(1)(a), 196(2) r/w 3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) and Sections 13, 38, and 39 of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967.

According to police, Mohammad is an Indian citizen and a native of Dharmavaram. His forefathers were also from the same place, ruling out concerns about foreign origin.

"He was allegedly a member of several WhatsApp groups run by Pakistan-based terrorist organisations where radical ideology and anti-national propaganda were circulated," Dharmavaram in-charge Deputy SP U Narsingappa said.

Guwahati traffic cops switch back to white uniform after 8 years

Guwahati: The Guwahati Traffic Police personnel have resumed wearing white uniform from Saturday, after a gap of eight years to ensure uniformity across the state and enhance operational efficiency, officials said. The city traffic police force's uniform was changed to navy blue trousers and sky blue shirts in 2017 from the white ones that they had been wearing for decades. The decision to move back to the white uniform was taken following a comprehensive review by the police department on functional requirements, field conditions, and feedback from stakeholders. including police personnel, road safety experts and members of the public, an official release said. The white uniform, long associated with traffic management in Guwahati, has historically symbolised approachability.

New Delhi, August 17: Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi will meet Prime Minister Narendra Modi during his two-day

visit to India beginning Monday, according to the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA). The meeting, to be held Tues-

day, assumes significance as it is taking place days before Modi's planned trip to China to attend the annual summit of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO). Before calling on the Prime

Minister, Wang will hold separate talks with External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and National Security Advisor Ajit Doval that could see both sides deliberate on a range of key issues including border situation, trade and resumption of flight services.

The Chinese foreign minister's visit is largely seen as part of ongoing efforts by the two neighbours to rebuild their relationship after it came under severe strain following the deadly Galwan Valley clashes in 2020.

The two sides are expected to discuss new confidence-building measures for durable peace and tranquillity along their contested border during Wang's visit, people familiar with the matter said on Sunday.

Wang's trip is also seen as important as it comes amid increasing tensions in India-US relations following President Donald Trump doubling tariffs on Indian goods to 50 per cent that included an additional penalty of 25 per cent for purchas-



ing Russian crude oil.

According to details released by the MEA, the Chinese foreign minister will land in New Delhi at around 4:15 pm Monday. He will meet Jaishankar for bilateral talks at around 6 pm.

Wang and NSA Doval are scheduled to hold a new edition of Special Representatives (SR) dialogue on the boundary question at 11 am Tuesday.

According to the MEA, Wang will call on PM Modi at his 7 Lok Kalyan Marg residence at 5:30 pm Tuesday. The Chinese foreign minister will be in India primarily to hold the 24th round of SR dialogue with NSA Doval. Wang and Doval are the designated special representatives for the boundary talks.

Both sides are expected to deliberate on new confidence-building measures besides reviewing the overall situation along the Line of Actual Control, the people cited above said.

Though the two sides disengaged troops from the friction points, they are yet to de-escalate the situation by pulling back the frontline forces from the border. Each side currently has around 50,000 to 60,000 troops along the LAC in the eastern Ladakh region.

The Chinese foreign minister will also meet External Affairs Minister Jaishankar. It is learnt that the two sides will also use the opportunity to lay the ground for Prime Minister Modi's visit to China to attend the annual summit of the SCO to be held August 31 and Sep-

As per the plan, the prime minister will embark on a visit to Japan around August 29 and after concluding the trip, he will travel to the northern Chinese city of Tianjin for the SCO summit.

Modi's visit to China is being planned amid efforts by the two sides to repair their bilateral ties which came under severe strain following the deadly clashes between Indian and Chinese troops in Galwan Valley in June 2020.

NSA Doval travelled to China in December last and held the SR talks with Wang, weeks after Prime Minister Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping decided to revive various dialogue mechanisms between the two sides at a meeting in the Russian city of Kazan.

The military standoff in eastern Ladakh began in May 2020 and the clashes at the Galwan Valley in June that year resulted in a severe strain in bilateral ties.

The face-off effectively ended following completion of the disengagement process from the last two friction points of Demchok and Depsang under an agreement finalised October 21 last year.

The decision to revive various dialogue mechanisms was taken at a meeting between Prime Minister Modi and Chinese President Xi in Kazan October 23, 2024.

The Modi-Xi meeting came two days after India and China firmed up a disengagement pact for Depsang and Demchok.

Student found dead in hostel of BITS Pilani Goa campus

According to police, the report of the post-mortem conducted at the district hospital in Margao has remained inconclusive, and the viscera were sent for toxicological tests to ascertain the exact cause of

The student, Kushagra Jain, was found lying unresponsive on his bed in a sideward sleeping position in the hostel room at Vasco in South Goa district at around 11 am Saturday, a senior police official said.

Police said that they have taken into custody various materials, including cans of energy drink, found in the deceased student's hostel room.

A case of unnatural death has been registered, and statements of students and the institute's management have been recorded. Jain, a native of Uttar Pradesh, was a third-year student of economics and computer science.

Quoting students whose statements were recorded, the police official said Jain played table tennis on the campus on Friday night before returning to his room.

The room was locked from inside, and when there was no response from him Saturday morning, the authorities were informed, the official said.

KISHTWAR CLOUDBURST

Search op continues; death toll rises to 61

Chisoti (J&K), August 17: The death toll due to a cloudburst in Jammu and Kashmir's Kishtwar district rose to 61, as rescuers continued operations for the fourth day Sunday, effecting three more blasts to blow up boulders around a major impact spot, officials said.

Army engineers have started working on a bailey bridge to restore connectivity to Chisoti village and the Machail Mata shrine and further intensify the rescue efforts. With the recovery of another body from the debris, the officials Sunday said the death toll has risen to 61.

The cloudburst struck Chisoti, the last motorable village en route the Machail Mata temple, August 14, leaving over 100 injured, other than the fatalities.

The number of missing persons has come down to 50, while the bodies of three persons still remain unidentified. The flash floods triggered by the cloudburst left a trail of destruction, flattening a makeshift market, a langar (community kitchen) site for the Machail Mata Yatra, damaging 16 houses and government buildings, three temples, four water mills, a 30-metre-long bridge, and more than a dozen

rescuers conducted



three more controlled explo sions within a span of 45 min utes to blow up giant boul ders hampering the search operation, especially near the worst-hit langer site, the officials said. Despite overcast conditions, the joint teams of police, Army, National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) State Disaster Response Force (SDRF), Border Roads Organisation (BRO), civil administra tion, and local volunteers are continuing the rescue efforts.

The rescuers are utilising more than a dozen earth-movers and other heavy equipment, while the NDRF has mobilised its resources, includ ing dog squads, to speed up the rescue operation.

General Officer Command ing of the Army's counter-insurgency Delta Force, Major General A P S Bal, said Army engineers conducted a survey of the area after the need for a bridge was felt.

8 charred to death in car-SUV collision

The horrific accident occurred on a highway near Dedadara village in

Wadhwan taluka at around 3:40 pm when the car was headed towards Surendranagar



city from Kadu village Three individuals travelling in the SUV escaped with minor injuries, police said.

Soon after the crash, the car landed in a roadside ditch and turned into a ball of fire, trapping all the occupants even as locals looked on helplessly.

"All eight persons in the car were charred to death. Three others travelling in the SUV escaped with minor injuries and were rushed to a hospital," said DIG, Surendranagar, Girish Pandya.

He said the front portion of the SUV was badly damaged due to the impact of the collision.

A police official said the fire reduced the car

to a burnt shell, and local fire brigade personnel struggled to extricate the bodies.

The deceased individuals included two girls, aged 10 months and 13 years respectively, five women in the age group of 35-55 years, and the driver.

"All eight bodies were taken to the Surendranagar government hospital for postmortem." Pandva said.

Smoking status must be captured in cancer trials: Experts

New Delhi, August 17: A group of experts from AIIMS Delhi, McMaster University in Canada and the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) in France has stressed the need to record smoking status in cancer clinical trials, warning that continued tobacco use can reduce treatment efficacy and patient survival.

In a commentary published in the Lancet Oncology this month, the seven authors, including Dr Abhishek Shankar from AIIMS Delhi, said

clinical decisions.

They argued that addressing barriers to tobacco-use assessment and embedding smoking cessation initiatives into oncology research protocols will improve trial outcomes, enhance therapeutic efficacy and save lives. The researchers cited the

2014 US Surgeon General's report 'The Health Consequences of Smoking -- 50 Years of Progress', which for the first time concluded there was a causal link between cigarette smoking and adverse cancer-related outcomes, including higher all-cause and cancer-specific mortality.



This report underscores the need to systematically capture smoking status in clinical trials, to refine estimates of efficacy of novel therapies and to better understand the im-

across treatment modalities and disease sites.


Since 2014, research has increasingly shown that continued tobacco use negatively impacts patients receiving surtherapies. The mechanisms by which tobacco smoke worsens outcomes remain unclear but may include tumour hypoxia, altered drug metabolism, stimulation of signalling pathways by nicotine and changes to the immune system, including reduced natural killer cells, the authors noted.





Based on the guidelines issued by the Election Commission, Electoral Registration Officers (EROs), who are SDM-level officers, prepare and finalise the Electoral Rolls (ER) with the help of Booth Level Officers (BLOs).

EROs and BLOs undertake the responsibility for the correctness of Electoral Rolls, it said. After the publication of the draft electoral rolls, their

Bolivia heads to polls La Paz: Bolivians headed

EU leaders join Zelenskyy in DC talks

AND ZELENSKYY TO MAKE SURE UKRAINE HAS A SEAT AT THE TABLE TO SHAPE ITS FUTURE

London, August 17: European leaders including from Germany, France and Britain will accompany Volodymyr Zelenskyy to meet Donald Trump in Washington, they said Sunday, seeking to bolster him as the US president presses Ukraine to accept a quick peace.

Ahead of the Washington talks Monday, German Chancellor Friedrich Merz, French President Emmanuel Macron and British Prime Minister Keir Starmer were hosting a meeting of allies Sunday to shore up Zelenskyy's position, hoping in particular to lock down robust security guarantees for Ukraine that would include a US role.

President Trump is leaning on Ukraine to strike an agreement after meeting Vladimir Putin Friday in Alaska. According to sources, the US and Russian leaders discussed proposals for Russia to relinquish tiny pockets of occupied Ukraine in exchange for Ukraine ceding a swathe of fortified land in the east and freezing the front lines elsewhere.

At face value, some of Putin's demands would be hugely difficult for Ukraine to accept, setting the stage for potentially fraught talks about ending Eurone's deadliest war in 80 years, which has killed or wounded more than 1 million people.

European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen will also travel to Washington, as will Finland's President Alexander Stubb, whose access to Trump included rounds of golf in Florida earlier this year. Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni, who is an admirer of



many of Trump's policies, will also go to Washington, her office said.

European allies are keen to avoid a repeat of Zelenskyy's last Oval Office meeting, in February. That went disastrously, with Trump and Vice President JD Vance giving the Ukrainian leader a strong public dressing-down.



SERBIA'S POPULIST LEADER VOWS TOUGH RESPONSE TO PROTESTERS FOLLOWING RIOTS



Belgrade, August 17: Serbia's President Aleksandar Vucic Sunday announced tough measures against anti-government protesters following days of riots in the streets throughout Serbia that have challenged his increasingly autocratic rule in the Balkan country.

In one of his frequent TV addresses to the public, Vucic accused the anti-government demonstrators of "pure terrorism" and reiterated his claims that months of persistent protests against his rule have been orchestrated in the West and aimed at destroying Serbia.

"Our country is in grave danger, they have jeopardized all our values, normal life, each in-

dividual," Vucic said, alleging an elaborate scheme that would eventually install "anarcho-leftist" authorities in the future. He did not offer any concrete evidence for his claims.

Unless we undertake tough er steps it is a question of days when they (protesters) will kill someone," Vucic said. "I am saying this for history."

The stern warnings came after five consecutive nights of clashes between the protesters on one side and police and Vucic's loyalists on the other. Angry protesters on Saturday evening torched Vucic's governing Serbian Progressive Party offices in a town in western Serbia, and of other ruling coalition allies

The demonstrators Saturday evening also clashed with police in Belgrade, the capital. and in the northern city of Novi Sad. Riot officers used tear gas against demonstrators who hurled stun grenades, flares and bottles at them.

The clashes this week marked a major escalation following more than nine months of largely peaceful demonstrations that started after a concrete canopy collapsed at a train station in Serbia's north, killing 16 people.

za's population and left much of the enclave in ruins.

Israeli protesters face arrests, water cannons

Jerusalem: Israeli police blasted crowds with water cannons and made dozens of arrests Sunday as protesters demanding a hostage deal escalated their campaign with a one-day nationwide strike that blocked roads and closed businesses. The "day of stoppage was organised by two groups representing some of the families of hostages and bereaved families, weeks after militant groups released videos of emaciated hostages and Israel announced plans for a new offensive. Protesters fear further fighting could endanger the hostages who were seized by Hamas October 7, 2023 - the attack that triggered the war — and are believed to still be alive in captivity. Israel believes that some 20 are still alive, with Hamas holding the remains of about 30 others. "We don't win a war over the bodies of hostages," protesters chanted. They gathered at dozens of points throughout Israel, including outside politicians' homes, military headquarters and on major highways, where they were sprayed with water cannons as they blocked lanes and lit bonfires. Some restaurants and theatres closed in solidarity. Police said they had arrested 38 people as part of the nationwide demonstration — one of the fiercest since the uproar over six hostages found dead in Gaza last September

FinMin to review Q1 performance of banks

New Delhi: The Finance Ministry has called a meeting of the chiefs of public sector banks (PSBs) Wednesday to review their financial performance for the first quarter of the current financial year. Together, the 12 PSBs reported a record profit of Rs 44,218 crore -- reflecting an 11 per cent growth over the same quarter previous year. In comparison, these banks had earned Rs 39,974 crore in the June quarter of 2024-25 -- marking an increase of Rs 4,244 crore in absolute terms. The State Bank of India (SBI) remained the biggest contributor, accounting for 43 per cent of the total profits. The bank posted a net profit of Rs 19,160 crore in the first guarter of FY26. Among other banks, the Indian Overseas Bank recorded the highest growth in profit in percentage terms, with a 76 per cent jump to Rs 1,111 crore. The Punjab & Sind Bank profit to Rs 269 crore. The Central Bank of India also reported a 32.8 per cent growth in net profit to Rs 1,169 crore, while the Indian Bank posted a 23.7 per cent rise to Rs 2.973 crore. The Bank of Maharashtra registered a 23.2 per cent increase in profit to Rs 1,593 crore. However, the Punjab National Bank (PNB) net profit dropped 48 per cent to Rs 1,675 crore compared with Rs 3,252

SEBI plans to review MTF margin rules

New Delhi, August 17: Security Exchange Board of India (SEBI) is looking to review the margin framework under margin trading funding (MTF) in a bid to streamline risk management at clearing corporations.

In its annual report for 2024-25, SEBI said a "comprehensive review exercise is being undertaken with respect to the currently applicable margining framework Alongside this, a review of

MTF and the scrips eligible under it is also under consideration. Margin trading lets investors buy shares even if they do not have the full amount. They can purchase shares by paying only part of the price, while the rest is covered through a margin deposited in cash or as shares kept as collateral.

In addition to the review of margin rules, SEBI is also considering changes to the regula-



tory framework for angel funds. The review will focus on fundraising processes, investment conditions, and operational aspects, with the objective of facilitating ease of doing business and streamlining regulatory requirements.

Angel funds play a pivotal role in channelizing the capital of angel investors to startups in need of funding.

The board has further proposed to review the classification of REITs and InvITs as hybrid instruments. This move comes in response to representations from various stakeholders, the presence of equity-like features in these instruments. the development of the market ecosystem over the last decade, and global practices.

A review of the regulatory

is also on the cards, aimed at ensuring that the regulations remain effective, adaptable, and aligned with the evolving market landscape. As part of this, SEBI is exam-

ining the restrictions presently prescribed for asset manage ment companies (AMCs), after receiving feedback from the mutual funds industry, including the AMFI. In line with these efforts, SEBI intends to expand the range of permissible investment strategies under Specialised Investment Funds (SIFs).

At present, SIFs allow asset management companies to offer a limited set of strategies across equity, debt, and hybrid categories.

Introduced to bridge the gap between mutual funds and portfolio management services (PMS) in terms of portfolio flexibility, the SIF framework requires investors to commit at least Rs 10 lakh across all SIF

While Samsung is the second largest smartphone player in India both in terms of value and volume share as per a Counterpoint Research report, the company is yet to make its mark in the laptop segment.

Samsung is also the second largest player in the tablet PC segment with a share of 15 per cent, according to the Cyber Media Research report.

FPIs dump ₹21,000cr in equities PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

New Delhi, August 17: Foreign investors offloaded Indian equities worth nearly Rs 21,000 crore in the first half of August, pressured by US-India trade tensions, lacklustre first-quarter corporate earnings, and a weakening rupee.

With this, the total outflow by Foreign Portfolio Investors (FPIs) in equities reached the Rs 1.16 lakh crore mark so far in 2025, according to data with the depositories. The FPI activity will be influ-

enced by the action on the tariff front ahead.

The recent easing of tensions between US and Russia, coupled with the absence of fresh sanctions, suggests that the proposed 25 per cent secondary tariff India is unlikely to take effect after August 27, a clear positive for the market, Vagar javed Khan, CFA - Senior Fundamental Analyst, Angel One, said. Also, S&P has upgraded India's credit rating from BBB- to BBB, a move that could further boost FPIs' sentiment, he added.

According to the depository's data, foreign portfolio investors (FPIs) withdrew a net sum of Rs 20.975 crore from equities this

This came after a net withdrawal of Rs 17,741 crore in July. Before that, FPIs invested Rs 38,673 crore in the preceding three months from March to June.

'The sustained outflows are being driven primarily by a confluence of global uncertainties. Heightened geopolitical tensions and ambiguity surrounding the interest rate trajectory in developed economies, particularly the United States, have contributed to a risk-averse sentiment." Himanshu Srivastava, Associate Director - Manager Research, Morningstar Investment Research India, said.

Adding to this caution is the recent strengthening of US the relative attractiveness of emerging market assets like India's, he noted.

Additionally, tepid earnings growth and elevated valuations have contributed to the outflow VK Vijayakumar, Chief Invest ment Strategist, Geojit Invest ments, said.

On the sectoral front, sustained selling in IT stocks has pulled the IT index down. However, banking and financials continue to be relatively resilient due to fair valuations and institutional buying.

Gold prices may see consolidation next week

New Delhi, August 17: Gold prices are likely to witness a phase of consolidation in the coming week as traders weigh a mix of global economic indicators, cues from central banks and shifting geopolitical dynamics, analysts said.

"In the week ahead the focus will be on US housing data, CPI numbers from the UK and the Euro zone and the provisional data on manufacturing/ services PMI from across regions," Pranav Mer, Vice President,

EBG - Commodity & Currency Research, JM Financial Services, said.

Pranav Mer noted that safe-haven demand has eased after Washington and Beijing agreed to extend trade negotiations for other 90-days.

Meanwhile, US-Russia talks to end war in Ukraine had some progress but ended without any conclusion.

According to Mer, weaker US macroeconomic data have highlighted a slowdown in the economic activity, but a firm producer and import price data have kept inflation concerns alive, leaving Fed officials divided on the timing of interest rate cuts.

Last week, the most trad-

Bhubaneswar, August 17: Unified Payment Interface (UPI) is gaining traction worldwide, but behind the glory of convenience, there is a hidden harsh truth of UPI-led businesses. Digital transformation has transformed various lives from bad to worse. Businesses have seen huge negative impact.

Pratikhya Kanungo, Director of Kalinga Packers Private Limited has said, "Cash has not really disappeared from markets. People prefer cash over digital payments and we are facing challenges in running business since deals are dependent on UPI. Vendors are not used

payments anymore."

Adarsh Khandelwal, owner of a prominent jewelry shop has highlighted the difficulty of doing business in UPI era. He mentioned."Our vendors are not educated enough to understand the digital payment cycle. Sometimes, we need cash, to order on urgent basis, but we wait or deny since there is no way out."

Recently, in Karnataka, thousands of small traders received Goods and Service Tax (GST) notices on cumulative UPI transactions, often inflated by micro-payments crossed statutory limits. A vegetable seller from Haveri, was in shock with Rs 29 lakh GST demand as his business annual sales barely touched subsistence levels. Post such incident many traders have changed the payment



method "to cash only" fearing automated tax triggers and expensive litigation.



The promise of UPI can only be fulfilled if the government and fintech ecosystem address these anxieties otherwise, it could end up alienating the very people it sought to in clude. Current scenarios clear ly point out that the cash has moved up to the rich while the lower and middle class are the ones left to carry the burden of digital India.








































































Bayern reign supreme Pak drop bombshell;

Washington, August 17: World number one Jannik Sinner and hot rival Carlos Alcaraz will face off in a maior final for the fourth time this season after both booked straight-set wins into the title match at the ATP-WTA Cincinnati Open Saturday.

Defending champion Sinner ruthlessly subdued 136thranked qualifier Terence Atmane 7-6 (7/4), 6-2 while Spanish second seed Alcaraz defeated an ailing Alexander Zverev. who was suffering badly from the 32 Celsius heat and humidity, by 6-4, 6-3.

Alcaraz and Sinner have played for trophies this season in Rome, Roland Garros and Wimbledon, with the Italian winning their most recent at the All England Club last



month.Sinner, celebrating his 24th birthday, ended Frenchman Atmane's dream run and will now try to become the first man since Roger Federer in 2014-15 to win back-to-back titles in Cincinnati.

Sinner, tuning up for the $\ensuremath{\mathsf{US}}$ Open in his first tournament since winning Wimbledon, hasn't dropped a set en route to the final. "It's a very, very tough challenge every time you play a new opponent." Sinner said. "In the later stages of the tournament, the pressure is on, they deserve to be there.

Alcaraz will also be playing in his second Cincy final after losing to Novak Djokovic in 2023.

The Spaniard increased his ATP season match win lead to 53 in a year of five titles.

Alcaraz said he is keen to try and take his Wimbledon revenge on Sinner in the unorthodox Monday final.

Kolkata, August 17: A revamped East Bengal, inspired by Greek striker and substitute Dimitrios Diamantakos' double strike, stunned archrivals Mohun Bagan 2-1 in a fierv Kolkata Derby to storm into the semifinals of the 134th IndianOil Durand Cup here Sunday

Diamantakos, brought on as an 18th-minute substitute after Moroccan forward Hamid Ahadad limped off injured, turned out to be the gamechanger. The 32-year-old first convert-

ed from the penalty spot in the 38th minute before doubling East Bengal's lead seven minutes into the second half with a sharp finish that left the ISL

champions' defence flat-footed. Though Anirudh Thapa pulled one back with a stunning long-range strike in the 68th minute, East Bengal's resolute backline, held firm to script their first top-level Derby



win over Mohun Bagan in more than 18 months.

With the victory, East Bengal set up a blockbuster semifinal clash against fellow Kolkata side Diamond Harbour FC here on August 20.

Relentless Chimaev beats du Plessis to win UFC middleweight title

Chicago, August 17: Khamzat Chimaev's total dominance of Dricus du Plessis to win the UFC middleweight title in Chicago Saturday was reflected in some jaw-dropping statistics that paint a stark picture of the challenge faced by any challenger hoping to dethrone him.

Apart from the last couple of minutes of the final round, the Chechen-born Chimaev, who began training in MMA while living in Sweden before moving to Abu Dhabi and fighting under the flag of the United Arab Emirates, utterly smothered his South African opponent.

Despite being the champion. Du Plessis came into the fight as the betting underdog and it quickly became apparent why. Having built his career on his suffocating wrestling, the 31-vear-old Chimaev immediately took the champion down and the punishment began.

In all, Chimaev fired off a whopping 567 strikes over the course of five five-minute rounds, landing a stunning 529 of them. Du Plessis managed a



mere 68, and landed only 45. Nothing the challenger did was either unexpected or fancy. He took the fight to the mat

with a double-leg takedown and then advanced to a crucifix position, trapping the right arm of Du Plessis with his legs and lyto control his other arm. That left Du Plessis almost defenceless as Chimaev fired

short left hands at his head. knowing that one wrong move by the man on the bottom while trying to escape could put him in a worse position, or even see him knocked out.

To his great credit Du Plessis, who is also 31, never quit but by the end of the third round he was so far behind on the scorecards that he needed a finish. He somehow found the energy to go on the offensive in the final two minutes of the fight, but to no avail.
